### LSU SERIES RECORD VS. NICHOLLS

• LSU leads the all-time series with Nicholls, 60-25, and the schools' first meeting occurred in 1968 ... LSU posted a 9-0 victory over Nicholls last season (April 23) in Alex Box Stadium.

### ABOUT THE TIGERS

• LSU has seven national championships (1991, 1993, 1996, 1997, 2000, 2009, 2023), the second-most in NCAA history ... LSU has the second-highest all-time NCAA Tournament winning pct. (.705, 177-74).

• The Nicholls game begins a stretch of five games in seven days for the Tigers, who will face Dallas Baptist in Arlington, Texas, on Wednesday before taking on Kansas State, Nebraska and Sam Houston this weekend in the Frisco (Texas) College Baseball Classic ... LSU posted three wins in four games last week, defeating Southern, 13-1 (7 innings), on Tuesday before posting a 2-1 series victory over Omaha over the weekend.

• Redshirt sophomore right-hander **Chase Shores** defeated Omaha on Saturday, firing 5.0 shutout innings with three hits, two walks and six strikeouts ... Shores threw 84 pitches, 55 for strikes ... the outing marked Shores' second appearance since missing the 2024 season while recovering from Tommy John surgery; he was injured in March 2023 and returned to the mound on February 16 of this season versus Purdue Fort Wayne ... Shores is 2-0 this season with a 0.90 ERA in 10.0 innings while logging two walks, 13 strikeouts and a .176 opponent batting average.

• Junior first baseman **Jared Jones** helped lead the Tigers to three wins in four games last week, batting .375 (6-for-16) with one double, six RBI and three runs while recording a .444 on-base percentage ... Jones was 3-for-5 in Saturday's 12-1 win over Omaha with a double, one run scored and five RBI.

• Freshman leftfielder **Derek Curiel** batted .500 (7-for-14) last week in leading LSU to three wins in four games ... he recorded one double, three RBI, five runs and a .611 on-base percentage ... Curiel was 3-for-3 in Tuesday's win over Southern with three RBI and two runs scored ... Curiel is hitting a team-high .440 (11-for-25) this season with one double, one homer, six runs and seven RBI.

• Sophomore left-hander **Kade Anderson** pitched a career-high 5.1 innings in last Friday's win over Omaha, limiting the Mavericks to two runs on three hits with two walks and eight strikeouts ... Anderson is 2-0 this season with a 1.74 ERA, three walks and 16 strikeouts in 10.1 innings.

• Junior right-hander **Anthony Eyanson** delivered an excellent outing versus Omaha on Saturday, working 6.0 shutout innings while allowing just three hits with two walks and seven strikeouts.

• Shortstop **Steven Milam** hit .385 (5-for-13) in LSU's four games last week with one double, one triple, two RBI and four runs.

• **Coach Jay Johnson**, the 2023 National Coach of the Year, is in his fourth season at the helm of the LSU program ... Johnson, who directed LSU to the 2023 NCAA National Championship, has worked 13 seasons as a collegiate head coach, including one season (2005) at Point Loma Nazarene, two seasons (2014-15) at Nevada, six seasons (2016-21) at Arizona and four seasons at LSU ... he directed Arizona to College World Series appearances in 2016 and in 2021, and to the 2021 Pac-12 title ... **he has a 460-235 (.662) overall record, including a 143-63 (.694) mark at LSU.**

• Baseball America magazine has rated LSU's newcomer class of D1 transfers, freshmen signees and JUCO transfers No. 1 in the nation for the 2025 season. LSU's class of newcomers includes 12 NCAA Division I transfers, four JUCO transfers and 10 high school signees. Nine LSU players were ranked in August among Baseball America magazine's Top 100 College Transfers, and 11 LSU newcomers appeared in the Baseball America Top 500 Prospects list for the 2024 MLB Draft that was held in July.

• Junior first baseman **Jared Jones** has been named to the 2025 Golden Spikes Award Watch List. Jones, a native of Marietta, Ga., was ranked No. 1 last week on the D1Baseball.com list of the Top 50 First Basemen in the nation. D1 Baseball also named Jones a 2025 Preseason First-Team All-American. Jones hit .301 (69-for-229) for LSU last season with 14 doubles, two triples, 28 homers, 59 RBI and 56 runs. His 28 home runs marked the fourth-most in LSU history and the most by a Tiger since first baseman Matt Clark also hit 28 in 2008. Jones, a 2023 Freshman All-American, finished the 2024 season No. 2 in the SEC in walks (59), No. 5 in home runs, No. 5 in slugging percentage (.747) and No. 9 in total bases (171).

• Sophomore left-hander **Kade Anderson** is rated No. 17 on the D1 Baseball list of the Top 150 Starting Pitchers in the nation. Anderson, a 2025 Baseball America Preseason All-American, recorded an outstanding 2024 freshman season for LSU, making 18 appearances (nine starts) and posting a 4-2 mark with a 3.99 ERA and 59 strikeouts in 38.1 innings. The native of Madisonville, La., was especially effective in the postseason, working 2.1 scoreless innings over two NCAA Chapel Hill Regional appearances on the same day (June 2 vs. Wofford and North Carolina) with two hits, one walk and six strikeouts.

• Junior right-hander **Gavin Guidry** has been named to the 2025 NCBWA Stopper of the Year Preseason Watch List. Guidry, a 2025 Preseason All-America and All-SEC selection, made 22 relief appearances last season for the Tigers, posting a 2-0 mark, a 2.59 ERA and three saves in 24.1 innings with 18 walks and 36 strikeouts. The native of Lake Charles, La., pitched a combined 4.2 innings in LSU's SEC and NCAA postseason games, allowing just one unearned run on three hits with six strikeouts and one save. He developed into one of LSU's top arms out of the bullpen as a true freshman in 2023, making 23 appearances (one start) and posting a 3-0 record with a 3.77 ERA and three saves in 28.2 innings.

• LSU outfielder **Derek Curiel** was named in January the 2025 SEC Preseason Freshman of the Year by D1Baseball.com. Curiel, two-time member of the 18U USA National Team, batted .314 with 33 hits - including 10 doubles - 21 RBI and 19 stolen bases in his senior year at Orange Lutheran High School in West Covina, Calif. He was ranked as the No. 10 overall high school player in the country and as the second-best high school player in the state of California by Perfect Game. Also in January, Perfect Game ranked Curiel No. 1 on its list of the Top 75 Freshmen for the 2025 season.

• Eight LSU freshmen were included in January on the Perfect Game list of the Top 75 Freshmen for the 2025 season, including outfielder **Derek Curiel** (No. 1), right-handed pitcher **William Schmidt** (No. 4), catcher **Cade Arrambide** (No. 15); right-handed pitcher **Casan Evans** (No. 26); first baseman **Ryan Costello** (No. 32); right-handed pitcher **Mavrick Rizy** (No. 36); left-handed pitcher **Cooper Williams** (No. 67); and infielder **Mikey Ryan** (No. 69).

• D1 Baseball in October named **LSU the No. 1 college program in the nation, completing its ranking of the Top 100 College Programs** that began in September. D1 Baseball's ranking of the Top 100 Programs focused upon the establishment of a tradition of consistent winning in the last decade, and especially in the last five years. Its goal was to identify the programs in the best shape right now, with an eye toward the next five to 10 years. LSU was followed in the Top 10 of the ranking by Tennessee, Florida, Vanderbilt, Arkansas, Virginia, Texas A&M, Mississippi State, Texas and Florida State.

• **Jay Johnson** has produced **12 Top 5 round and 16 Top 10 round draft choices at LSU**, including the 2023 No. 1 overall selection, right-handed pitcher Paul Skenes (Pittsburgh), the 2023 No. 2 overall pick, outfielder Dylan Crews (Washington) and the 2022 No. 6 overall selection, infielder Jacob Berry (Miami).

• **LSU in 2023 became the first school in history** to produce the first two selections in a single MLB Draft when Paul Skenes and Dylan Crews were chosen Nos. 1 and 2. Each made his big-league debut in 2024, and Skenes became just the fifth rookie in MLB history to start on the mound in an All-Star Game.

• At LSU, Paul Skenes was the **2023 Dick Howser Award** winner, presented to the nation's best NCAA Division I player, and Dylan Crews was the 2023 recipient of the **Golden Spikes Award**, presented to the most outstanding player in amateur baseball.

• **An SEC-record** 13 LSU players were selected in the 2023 MLB Draft, including five in the first three rounds. A total of nine LSU players were chosen in the 2024 MLB Draft, including eight pitchers, a mark that **tied the SEC record** for most pitchers drafted in a single season.
