LSU SERIES RECORD VS. SOUTHERN

• LSU leads the all-time series vs. Southern, 59-4, as the squads first met in 1970 ... Southern defeated LSU, 12-7, on April 1 of last season in Alex Box Stadium ... the Jaguars' other wins over LSU came on April 9, 2019, at SU's Lee-Hines Field by score of 7-2; on May 3, 2005 – a 9-5 Southern triumph in Alex Box Stadium – and on March 6, 2001, an 11-6 victory at "The Box" ... LSU is 53-3 all-time against Southern in games played at Alex Box Stadium.

ABOUT THE TIGERS

• LSU has seven national championships (1991, 1993, 1996, 1997, 2000, 2009, 2023), the second-most in NCAA history ... LSU has the second-highest all-time NCAA Tournament winning pct. (.705, 177-74).

• LSU opened the 2025 season last weekend with a three-game sweep of Purdue Fort Wayne in Alex Box Stadium, Skip Bertman Field ... the Tigers' 14-0 win on Friday marked LSU's 24th straight victory in a season-opening game.

• Sophomore left-hander Kade Anderson logged an excellent outing on Friday in LSU's 2025 season opener, working 5.0 shutout innings in a win over Purdue Fort Wayne ... Anderson limited the Mastodons to just four singles, and he recorded one walk and eight strikeouts, firing 83 pitches ... Anderson retired seven of the first eight Purdue Fort Wayne batters he faced in the outing.

• Junior second baseman Daniel Dickinson led LSU to a season-opening sweep of Purdue Fort Wayne last weekend, batting .556 (5-for-9) with one double, one homer, seven RBI and five runs scored ... Dickinson also walked once, was hit by a pitch twice and recorded a stolen base, as he posted a .667 on-base percentage ... he paced the Tigers' 14-hit attack on Friday by going 3-for-4 at the plate with one double and five RBI, and his two-run single in the first inning was the highlight of LSU's five-run outburst ... Dickinson launched LSU's first home run on the season on Saturday, a two-run shot that gave the Tigers a 2-0 lead in the first inning.

• Freshman leftfielder Derek Curiel batted .364 (4-for-11) in last weekend's sweep over Purdue Fort Wayne with one homer, three RBI, two runs scored, two walks, one steal and a .462 on-base percentage ... he launched a two-out, two-run homer – the first dinger of his collegiate career – in the fifth inning on Saturday to expand LSU's lead from 2-1 to 5-1 ... he added an RBI single in Sunday's win to punctuate a five-run LSU fourth inning.

• Redshirt sophomore right-hander Chase Shores defeated Purdue Fort Wayne on Sunday in his first appearances on the mound in nearly two years ... Shores, who suffered a season-ending elbow injury in March 2023 and redshirted last season while recovering from Tommy John surgery, threw 67 pitches in 5.0 innings on Sunday, limiting the Mastodons to one run on three hits with no walks and seven strikeouts.

• The LSU pitching staff posted a 0.67 ERA in last weekend's series versus Purdue Fort Wayne, allowing just two runs on 14 hits in 27.0 innings with two walks and 45 strikeouts ... the Tigers limited the Mastodons to a .156 cumulative batting average and gave up just one extra-base hit, a double ... the 45 Ks represented the most by an LSU staff in a three-game series since at least 1992.

• LSU hit .340 (33-for-97) in the Purdue Fort Wayne series with seven doubles, one triple, four homers, 32 runs and five stolen bases ... the Tigers posted a .488 on-base percentage, walked 23 times and were hit by a pitch on seven occasions ... LSU's five-run, first-inning rally in Friday's game was the largest for the Tigers in the first inning of a season opener since 2012, when they scored five runs in the opening frame against Air Force.

• Coach Jay Johnson, the 2023 National Coach of the Year, is in his fourth season at the helm of the LSU program ... Johnson, who directed LSU to the 2023 NCAA National Championship, has worked 13 seasons as a collegiate head coach, including one season (2005) at Point Loma Nazarene, two seasons (2014-15) at Nevada, six seasons (2016-21) at Arizona and four seasons at LSU ... he directed Arizona to College World Series appearances in 2016 and in 2021, and to the 2021 Pac-12 title ... he has a 457-234 (.661) overall record, including a 140-62 (.693) mark at LSU.

• Baseball America magazine has rated LSU's newcomer class of D1 transfers, freshmen signees and JUCO transfers No. 1 in the nation for the 2025 season. LSU's class of newcomers includes 12 NCAA Division I transfers, four JUCO transfers and 10 high school signees. Nine LSU players were ranked in August among Baseball America magazine's Top 100 College Transfers, and 11 LSU newcomers appeared in the Baseball America Top 500 Prospects list for the 2024 MLB Draft that was held in July.

• Junior first baseman **Jared Jones** has been named to the 2025 Golden Spikes Award Watch List. Jones, a native of Marietta, Ga., was ranked No. 1 last week on the D1Baseball.com list of the Top 50 First Basemen in the nation. D1 Baseball also named Jones a 2025 Preseason First-Team All-American. Jones hit .301 (69-for-229) for LSU last season with 14 doubles, two triples, 28 homers, 59 RBI and 56 runs. His 28 home runs marked the fourth-most in LSU history and the most by a Tiger since first baseman Matt Clark also hit 28 in 2008. Jones, a 2023 Freshman All-American, finished the 2024 season No. 2 in the SEC in walks (59), No. 5 in home runs, No. 5 in slugging percentage (.747) and No. 9 in total bases (171).

• Sophomore left-hander **Kade Anderson** is rated No. 17 on the D1 Baseball list of the Top 150 Starting Pitchers in the nation. Anderson, a 2025 Baseball America Preseason All-American, recorded an outstanding 2024 freshman season for LSU, making 18 appearances (nine starts) and posting a 4-2 mark with a 3.99 ERA and 59 strikeouts in 38.1 innings. The native of Madisonville, La., was especially effective in the postseason, working 2.1 scoreless innings over two NCAA Chapel Hill Regional appearances on the same day (June 2 vs. Wofford and North Carolina) with two hits, one walk and six strikeouts.

• Junior right-hander **Gavin Guidry** has been named to the 2025 NCBWA Stopper of the Year Preseason Watch List. Guidry, a 2025 Preseason All-America and All-SEC selection, made 22 relief appearances last season for the Tigers, posting a 2-0 mark, a 2.59 ERA and three saves in 24.1 innings with 18 walks and 36 strikeouts. The native of Lake Charles, La., pitched a combined 4.2 innings in LSU's SEC and NCAA postseason games, allowing just one unearned run on three hits with six strikeouts and one save. He developed into one of LSU's top arms out of the bullpen as a true freshman in 2023, making 23 appearances (one start) and posting a 3-0 record with a 3.77 ERA and three saves in 28.2 innings.

• D1 Baseball in October named **LSU the No. 1 college program in the nation, completing its ranking of the Top 100 College Programs** that began in September. D1 Baseball's ranking of the Top 100 Programs focused upon the establishment of a tradition of consistent winning in the last decade, and especially in the last five years. Its goal was to identify the programs in the best shape right now, with an eye toward the next five to 10 years. LSU was followed in the Top 10 of the ranking by Tennessee, Florida, Vanderbilt, Arkansas, Virginia, Texas A&M, Mississippi State, Texas and Florida State.

• **Jay Johnson** has produced **12 Top 5 round and 16 Top 10 round draft choices at LSU**, including the 2023 No. 1 overall selection, right-handed pitcher Paul Skenes (Pittsburgh), the 2023 No. 2 overall pick, outfielder Dylan Crews (Washington) and the 2022 No. 6 overall selection, infielder Jacob Berry (Miami).

• **LSU in 2023 became the first school in history** to produce the first two selections in a single MLB Draft when Paul Skenes and Dylan Crews were chosen Nos. 1 and 2. Each made his big-league debut in 2024, and Skenes became just the fifth rookie in MLB history to start on the mound in an All-Star Game.

• At LSU, Paul Skenes was the **2023 Dick Howser Award** winner, presented to the nation's best NCAA Division I player, and Dylan Crews was the 2023 recipient of the **Golden Spikes Award**, presented to the most outstanding player in amateur baseball.

• **An SEC-record** 13 LSU players were selected in the 2023 MLB Draft, including five in the first three rounds. A total of nine LSU players were chosen in the 2024 MLB Draft, including eight pitchers, a mark that **tied the SEC record** for most pitchers drafted in a single season.
