JAY CLARK

HEAD COACH • 5th Season

In only his fourth season as head coach, Jay Clark and the LSU Tigers made history in 2024 as the first team to bring a national championship home to Baton Rouge. The Tigers claimed their first national title on April 20, 2024 with their score of 198.225 in the NCAA Championship Finals to defeat California (197.850), Utah (197.800) and Florida (197.4375).

With the win, LSU became just the eighth program in NCAA history to win the women's gymnastics championship, thanks to the leadership of Clark, who owns over 30 years of experience in college gymnastics.

A native of Roswell, Georgia, Clark was tabbed as the third head coach in program history in August 2021 following the retirement of former coach D-D Breaux. A 33-year veteran of the sport, he continues to lead the LSU Gymnastics program to new heights. He enters his fifth season as the head coach and 14th season overall at LSU in 2025. This past season, he and the Tigers marked multiple milestones, including a program record score (198.475), the program's highest National Qualifying Score (NQS) (198.215), and their second consecutive Final Four appearance under his tenure. Earlier this year, Clark was named the SEC Co-Head Coach of the Year after winning the program's fifth SEC Championship and the Region One Head Coach of the Year after winning the Fayetteville Regional and bringing home the program's 14th NCAA regional title. He was also named the Top Collegiate Coach in Louisiana by Allstate Sugar Bowl, but his accolades don't end there. Clark owns multiple Central Region coaching honors, including National Assistant Coach of the Year in 2006, 2014, 2016 and 2017. He is also a member of the USA Gymnastics Region Eight Hall of Fame.

In 2024, the program saw record attendance numbers thanks to Clark's efforts. The Tigers earned an undefeated home record and welcomed three sold-out crowds, the most in a single season in program history. To top it off, LSU finished the regular season No. 1 in attendance nationally, averaging over 12,500 fans per meet and marking the highest average in school history. A total of over 75,000 Tiger fans showed out to the PMAC across six home meets in 2024.

Clark has seen much success in his career, both in the gym and on the recruiting trail. As the Tigers' associate head coach for eight seasons and co-head coach for one, Clark's leadership and expertise has helped bring unprecedented success on the recruiting trail and in the gym for LSU. In her senior season, he coached one of the most decorated gymnasts in LSU Gymnastics history in Haleigh Bryant, who was the 2024 SEC Gymnast of the Year, NCAA All-Around Champion, AAI Award Winner and Honda Sport Award Winner. He's regarded as one of the best recruiters in the sport, as highlighted by ESPN and ESPN The Magazine when he was named the ninth-best recruiter in college athletics in 2011.

As a coach, LSU has earned some of their best performances in school history since Clark's arrival, including eight appearances in the NCAA Championship Finals, numerous school records, 10 NCAA individual national champions, and four SEC Championships. Under his leadership, he led the Tigers to their first Final Four appearance under his tenure in 2023 before becoming the first gymnastics coach to bring home a national title.

His work with the Fighting Tigers of LSU has not gone unnoticed. Clark has been named the Central Region Co-Assistant Coach of the Year along with former LSU assistant Bob Moore five times.

Clark also earned the 2014 and 2017 National Co-Assistant Coach of the Year award with Moore. It marked the third time in his distinguished coaching career he has garnered the nation's top award. He was inducted into the USA Gymnastics Region 8 Hall of Fame in 2018.

In the gym, Clark is viewed as the top bars coach in collegiate gymnastics history. Under his supervision, LSU has seen 42 All-America honors on bars, four of the five highest bars team scores in school history and the top two bars champions in LSU history. LSU's bars lineup has finished in the top-10 in the nation 11 times, including the No. 1 team in 2018.

Clark tutored Sarah Finnegan, who ended her career in April 2019 as one of the greatest gymnasts in LSU history. Finnegan became the first NCAA bars champion in school history in 2017 and earned the title once again in 2019. Finnegan and Lexie Priessman won SEC bars champions in 2019 and 2017 respectively, scored perfect scores in 2019 and led the squad that finished fourth in the nation.

The 2018 season on bars under Clark marked the best lineup in LSU history and one of the best in the history of the NCAA. The group posted a school record score of 49.725 and once again went on to break the record against Arizona with a 49.750 for the second-highest in all of NCAA Gymnastics since 1988. The lineup, anchored by Finnegan, led the nation on bars for the first time in school history. Finnegan became the first gymnast in school history to finish the season ranked No. 1 on the event and joined Sharene Mamby (2001) and Syreeta Barnett (1997) as the only gymnasts at LSU to score a perfect 10.0 on the event.

In 2017, Clark coached Finnegan to the first NCAA Uneven Bars Championship in school history. Clark set the record for the most individual national champions on the event in NCAA gymnastics history.

The Tigers have posted a Top-10 national ranking on Clark's event for the last 11 consecutive years, including a seven year stretch in the top-5 from 2014-2020, and No. 1 finish in 2018.

In his first season with the Tigers, Clark coached Morrison and Wyrick to First-Team All-America honors on bars, and it marked the first season LSU produced at least two All-Americans on bars since 2010.

Before Clark joined LSU after he spent 20 seasons at the University of Georgia where he helped guide the Gym Dogs to seven NCAA National Titles and 14 Southeastern Conference Championships.

Clark primarily coached bars at Georgia, and he coached the Gym Dogs to 64 All-America honors and seven NCAA individual national titles on bars, including two-time champions Courtney Kupets and Kat Ding.

From 2009-12, Clark served as the head coach at Georgia, and during that time the Gym Dogs captured three NCAA individual national championships, won the 2012 NCAA Auburn Regional, and produced 23 All-America honors. In 2012, his Georgia team won the Bulldog Cup, which recognizes the UGA team that excels academically, supports their peers in athletics and consistently serves the community.

Prior to his stint as head coach, Clark was the recruiting coordinator at Georgia from 1999-2009 while serving as assistant coach from 1999-2004 and associate head coach from 2005-09 when Georgia won an NCAA record five-straight national titles.

Clark also coached at the club level for 13 years from 1992-2005 as the founder, owner and head coach of Classic City Gymnastics in Athens, Georgia. He coached several Classic City gymnasts to state, regional, national championships and to the Junior Olympic National Team, and eight gymnasts went on to compete collegiately at the NCAA Division I level.

A native of Roswell, Georgia, Clark earned his undergraduate degree in exercise science from Georgia.

Clark has two children – a son, Cole, and a daughter, Kinsey.

NOTEBOOK

Last Time On The Floor

- For the third time in program history, the Tigers were named 2025 SEC Regular Season Champions after defeating No. 14 Auburn by a score of 198.200-197.550 in their regular season finale last Friday night inside Neville Arena.
- The Tigers share the regular season title with No. 1 Oklahoma, who own the same 7-1 conference record after defeating No. 9 Georgia tonight. It's the first regular season title for LSU in six years, having previously won in 2017 and 2018.
- LSU's score of 198.200 on the night marked their second highest score on the road in the regular season in program history, only trailing a 198.425 scored in the 2024 Podium Challenge. The highlight of the night came in the second rotation when freshman phenom Kailin Chio scored the first 10.00 of her collegiate career on vault, the second consecutive week that an LSU Tiger posted a perfect score.
- The LSU Tigers swept all five titles on the night. Chio won vault with her perfect score, senior Haleigh Bryant claimed bars with a 9.975, beam with a 9.950 and the all-around with a 39.775 while senior Aleah Finnegan took home the floor title with a 9.975.
- LSU started the meet on bars and led by a margin of 49.600-49.425 after the first rotation. Bryant anchored the rotation with a season-high 9.975 to close out a strong first rotation with a 49.600 team score.
- Chio executed a perfect yurchenko one and half in the fifth spot on vault to earn her first career 10.00. She became the first freshman in the nation to earn a perfect score this season, and it's only the third 10.00 score on vault across the nation this year. Her perfect score was also the second by an LSU Tiger this season, joining Finnegan's 10.00 on beam last weekend against Georgia.
- Bryant wrapped up rotation two on vault for the Tigers with a 9.900, taking the team's score to a 49.575. At the halfway point, LSU led by a score of 99.175-98.825.
- LSU extended their lead to 148.825-147.975 heading into the final rotation in Neville thanks to a season high 9.975 performance on floor from Finnegan.
- The final rotation of the night saw LSU on beam, where Bryant finished the night strong with a solid 9.950 in spot five to clinch the all-around title.
- Finnegan anchored the night with a 9.875 to take LSU's total for beam to a 49.375 and the team's total score to a 198.200.
- Bryant won the meet with her season high 39.775 in the all-around while also taking home the bars and beam titles. The senior moved her career total to 103 titles.
- Chio's perfect 10 on vault won her the title, her 20th this season and sixth on vault. The freshman has won at least one title in all but one competition so far this year.
- Finnegan claimed her first floor title since the Tigers meet against Florida. The title was her 14th this year and 37th in her career.
- The squad's performance in Auburn marked the third consecutive week that the team scored over a 198.000, only the second time in program that such a streak has occurred in the regular season with the previous time coming in the 2024 season.

SEC Championship Seeding

- LSU claimed the No. 2 seed in the 2025 SEC Gymnastics Championship, announced by the league on Monday.
- Seeding for the SEC Gymnastics Championships is based on final regular-season Team National Qualifying Scores (NQS). No. 2 LSU owns an NQS of 198.005 entering this weekend.
- The championships consist of a one-day, two session format between the top eight teams in the conference. The ninth-place team does not qualify for the championships, which is Arkansas this year.
- The 2025 SEC Gymnastics Championships will take place on Saturday, March 22 at Legacy Arena in Birmingham. Session I will feature seeds 5-8 at 2:30 p.m. CT, and Session II will feature seeds 1-4 at 7 p.m. CT. Both sessions of the championships will air live on SEC Network.
- No. 5 Kentucky, No. 6 Georgia, No. 7 Auburn and No. 8 Alabama make up the bottom four seeds who will compete in the first session of the day on Saturday.
- The No. 2 Tigers will appear in the night session with No. 1 Oklahoma, No. 3 Florida and No. 4 Missouri. LSU will start the meet on bars and rotate in Olympic order to beam and floor before finishing on vault.
- The Tigers took home a share of the 2025 SEC Regular Season Title for the first time since 2018 as they will look to defend last year's SEC Championship title this weekend. LSU owns five SEC Championship titles in program history, including the inaugural conference title in 1981, three consecutive titles in 2017, 2018 2019, and last year's 2024 title.

SEC Championship History

- Saturday's meet marks the 44th edition of the SEC Championships. For 20 years, SEC campuses hosted the conference championship as the inaugural championship was held at LSU in 1981, but in 2001, the SEC Gymnastics Championship moved to neutral sites.
- Previous host sites include: Birmingham, Ala. (2001, 2002, 2003, 2006, 2011, 2014 and 2022); Duluth, Ga. (2004, 2005, 2008, 2012, 2015 and 2023); North Little Rock, Ark. (2007, 2013 and 2016); Nashville, Tenn. (2009), Jacksonville, Fla. (2010 and 2017); St. Louis, Mo. (2018); New Orleans, La. (2019) and Huntsville, Ala. (2021).
- LSU owns five SEC Championship titles in program history as they will look to defend last year's title this weekend. The Tigers have already claimed a share of the regular season title, their first since 2018 and third overall.
- Here is a breakdown of LSU's finishes at the SEC Championship: 1st Place – 5 times (1981, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2025); 2nd Place – 6 (1990, 1995, 2000, 2005, 2015, 2021); 3rd Place – 11 (1982, 1983, 1991, 1994, 1997, 1998, 2004, 2013, 2014, 2016, 2023); 4th Place – 17 (1984, 1985, 1986, 1987, 1988, 1989, 1993, 1999, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2012); 5th Place – 4 (1992, 1996, 2011, 2022); 6th Place – 0; 7th Place – 0; 8th Place – 0
- All SEC programs in this year's championship enter the weekend ranked amongst the nation's top 20 – No. 1 Oklahoma, No. 2 LSU, No. 3 Florida, No. 7 Missouri, No. 8 Kentucky, No. 10 Georgia, No. 12 Auburn and No. 13 Alabama.

Week 11 Road To Nationals Rankings

- LSU remains the No. 2 team in the country heading into the 2025 SEC Championships in Birmingham this weekend, where they will be the second seed. The Tigers have claimed the second spot for eight out of ten weeks of regular season competition and have not placed lower than three throughout the season so far.
- The Tigers concluded their regular season with a 198.200-197.550 win over No. 14 Auburn, their highest road score this year. The strong road performance improved their NQS (National Qualifying Score) to 198.005 in this week's rankings.
- Oklahoma has placed as the No. 1 team in the country for all 11 weeks of regular season competition and currently owns a NQS of 198.040. No. 3 Florida, No. 4 Utah and No. 5 UCLA round out the top five in this week's rankings.
- LSU's current NQS is made up of the average of their highest scores, three of which must be away scores, and dropping their highest overall score of 198.575 at home. Those five counting scores are now 198.125, 198.050, 198.200, 198.000, 197.650.
- The Tigers ranked in the top five on every event for the second straight week, including the top spot on vault. The squad currently ranks first on vault, third on bars, fifth on beam and second on floor. LSU has ranked in the top 10 across the board during all 11 weeks of regular competition so far and has claimed the top vault spot on seven separate occasions this year.
- Kailin Chio continues to rank amongst the top gymnasts in the nation as only a freshman. She currently ranks No. 5 in the all-around with her NQS of 39.670 and also sits in the top 20 on every event, including the No. 1 spot on vault with her NQS of 9.955.
- The freshman previously claimed the top spot on vault in week seven and hasn't placed lower than two in the last six weeks of competition.
- Other Tigers to earn a spot in the top national event rankings are Haleigh Bryant, Aleah Finnegan, Konnor McClain and Amari Drayton.
- Bryant ranks in the top 20 on vault, beam and floor while Finnegan placed in the vault, beam and all-around rankings.
- McClain has placed in the top 20 on bars for nine weeks and claimed a top in the 25 on beam this week. Drayton ranks No. 16 on floor.

Reaching New Heights

- Jay Clark continues to lead the Tigers to new heights every year, both on the competition floor and outside of the gym. The Tigers surpassed last year's season ticket record with over 8,680 tickets sold ahead of the 2025 season.
- This milestone couldn't have been achieved without the continued support of Tiger Nation, who surpassed last year's season ticket record of 8,055.
- The Tigers went undefeated at home in 2024 and finished the season with the highest average attendance in the nation for only the second time in program history.
- LSU finished the 2024 regular season with an average attendance of 12,590, marking the highest average in school history and the seventh-straight season with an average of 10,000 or better. A total of over 75,000 Tiger fans showed out to the PMAC, including three consecutive sold-out crowds.
- LSU has finished in the top four of average attendance nationally for six consecutive years, claiming the No. 1 spot in 2022.
- The Tigers home season in 2024 was highlighted with three consecutive sold-out crowds, the most that LSU has seen in a single season. Fans filled the PMAC for the squad's competitions against Auburn, Alabama and North Carolina as each of those crowds rank in the top-10 largest in program history.
- LSU welcomed their largest crowd of the year in their final home meet against North Carolina last Friday as 13,283 fans showed out for a senior night victory. The crowd was the fourth largest in school history
- In total, LSU saw four top-15 crowds in PMAC history in 2024 on top of their sold-out crowds.

Program History

- Head Coach Jay Clark enters his fifth season leading the Tigers and 14th season overall as he continues to grow the LSU Gymnastics program. He is joined on staff by Associate Head Coach Courtney McCool Griffith and Assistant Coaches Garrett Griffith and Ashleigh Gnat.
- LSU took home the program's first national title in 2024 as they will look to defend their title this year.
- The Tigers have reached the NCAA Championship Final in Fort Worth for the last two consecutive seasons under Clark. LSU made the program's 10th appearance in the finals in 2024.
- 2024 marked the program's 39th straight appearance in the NCAA postseason and 41st overall appearance for the Tigers. With the team advancing out of regionals, LSU marked their 33rd program appearance in the NCAA Championships.
- LSU has a total of 18 individual national titles across 11 gymnasts in program history, including current seniors Haleigh Bryant and Aleah Finnegan.
- The Tigers now own five SEC Championship titles in program history, winning three consecutive titles from 2017 to 2019 and again in 2024, exactly five year's from their last title and in the same location - The Smoothie King Center in New Orleans.

- The show, which is presented by Baton Rouge Super Chevy Dealers, gives fans behind-the-scenes access to the team like no other. From team meetings to one-on-one interviews with coaches and student-athletes, the docuseries allows viewers to get an inside look at the program and get to know the story behind the team.
- The show - produced by the LSU Athletics team of creatives at South Stadium Productions - will once again take fans through the 2025 season, as the Tigers embark on a new journey to Fort Worth.
- Viewers can find all full-length episodes of all seasons on LSU Plus, the home of "The Climb" and all exclusive LSU sports content.

Tigers On The National Stage

- The defending national champion LSU Gymnastics team will be featured on national television seven times throughout the regular season in 2025.
- As the Tigers gear up to defend their title next year, fans across the country will have multiple opportunities to watch LSU in 2025 as NCAA Gymnastics continues to reach new heights across ESPN platforms. Their seven appearances on national television matches the program's record broadcast time set in 2024.
- Gymnastics will boast the most programming hours in ESPN history in 2025 with nearly 100 hours of flips across their platforms this winter. Collegiate gymnastics will shine in the spotlight once again with the NCAA National Collegiate Women's Gymnastics Championships in Fort Worth on broadcast television for the fifth consecutive season.
- This year's broadcast schedule showcases all top 10 teams in the country from the final 2024 standings and 20 of the Final Top 25.

- ESPN and ESPN2 will host nine regular season matchups in 2025, with LSU being featured in three of those key matchups. The Tigers faced Florida

- and Oklahoma in primetime in the PMAC on Jan. 17 and Feb. 14, while traveling to Tuscaloosa on Feb. 7.
- While broadcast time is at an all-time high, fans are encouraged to pack the PMAC for the Tigers five home meets in 2025. LSU will look to hold onto the nation's attendance record for the second consecutive year.
- The full SEC Gymnastics TV schedule will highlight some of the best conference matchups throughout the season, culminating in the SEC Championship on March 22, with both sessions airing live on SEC Network. Friday Night Heights returns for year 11 as the 2025 season is highlighted by a record-tying nine consecutive weekends of action from around the conference. In total, SEC Network will showcase 18 live meets in the 2025 regular season, excluding conference championship sessions.
- ABC is again the home of the 2025 NCAA National Collegiate Women's Gymnastics Championships, with the Championship Final live in Fort Worth on Saturday, April 19, at 3 p.m. CT. The semifinal rounds are set for Thursday, April 17 on ESPN2, with Semifinal I at 3:30 p.m. and Semifinal II at 8 p.m. CT.
- Surround championship coverage will be live on ESPN+ to bring viewers to each apparatus for every second of the action. Also returning this season is streaming coverage of NCAA Regionals on ESPN+, showcasing real-time action of every gymnast and apparatus from regional rounds in Salt Lake City, Utah, Seattle, Wash., Tuscaloosa, Ala., and University Park, Pa.

The Squad

- This year's roster is composed of 21 gymnasts with 10 seniors, two juniors, four sophomores and five freshmen. The Tigers welcomed one transfer this year in Kathryn Weilbacher.
- Alyona Shchennikova is a sixth-year senior while Haleigh Bryant, Olivia Dunne, Sierra Ballard and Chase Brock are fifth-year seniors.
- Aleah Finnegan, KJ Johnson, Tori Tatum, Alexis Jeffrey and Kathryn Weilbacher make up the true senior class.
- Ashley Cowan and Bryce Wilson are juniors
- The sophomore class is made up of Konnor McClain, Amari Drayton, Kylie Coen and Leah Miller.
- Kaliya Lincoln, Kailin Chio, Lexi Zeiss, Zoe Miller and Victoria Roberts are this year's freshman class

Key Returners in 2025

- Haleigh Bryant, Olivia Dunne, Sierra Ballard, Chase Brock and Alyona Shchennikova all returned for their final seasons with the Tigers in 2025.
- Bryant, Dunne, Ballard and Brock enter their fifth-year season while Shchennikova is in her sixth-year.
- Shchennikova returns after missing the 2024 season due to injury. She is an All-American on the uneven bars and is ready to go on the event at any call.
- The Evergreen, Colorado native owns career highs of 9.950 on vault and bars, 9.925 on beam, 9.975 on floor and 39.525 in the all-around.
- Bryant, the 2024 NCAA All-Around Champion, AAI Award Winner and SEC Gymnast of the Year, will compete in her final season with the Tigers in 2025 after a historical season last year.
- Bryant owns the program record all-around score (39.925) and owns career highs of perfect 10's across all four events.
- A Louisiana native, Ballard is a veteran to the beam and floor lineup, where she owns a career high of 9.950 on both events.
- Dunne, a native of Hillsdale, New Jersey, played a vital role to the bars and floor lineups for LSU last season as she returned ready to go on three events. She owns career highs of 9.925 on bars and 9.900 on floor.
- Brock was a mainstay in the vault and floor lineups for the Tigers, where she owns career highs of 9.975 on vault and 9.925 on floor, but will be out the remainder of the 2025 season due to injury.
- Other key returners for the 2025 season include Aleah Finnegan, KJ Johnson, Tori Tatum, Alexis Jeffrey, Ashley Cowan, Konnor McClain and Amari Drayton.
- In her final season, Finnegan, the 2024 NCAA Floor Champion, has been pivotal in the all-around for the Tigers this year. She owns career high's of 10's on vault, beam and floor, 9.950 on bars and a 39.800 in the all-around.
- Senior KJ Johnson was pivotal in every meet on vault for the Tigers during their national championship run in 2024 and in all but one meet on floor, and will remain a key piece to those lineups in 2025. She owns career highs of 9.950 on vault and 9.975 on floor.
- Cowan, Tatum and Jeffrey are all mainstays in the bars lineup for the Tigers and all own a career high of 9.950 on the event. Cowan is in her junior season while Tatum and Jeffrey are seniors.
- The duo of McClain and Drayton began their sophomore season after a prominent freshman debut, where the two competed in every meet for the Tigers. McClain is training every event but is currently impacting the bars and beam lineups this year while owning career highs of a perfect 10 on both events.
- Drayton is capable of impacting all four lineups for the Tigers in 2025. She competed in the vault and floor lineups for LSU last year, recording career highs of 9.975 on vault and 9.925 on floor.

Bryant's Historic Senior Season

- Bryant had arguably one of the most historic seasons in NCAA Gymnastics history in 2024, cementing herself as one of the best gymnasts in NCAA and LSU history.
- The Cornelius, North Carolina, native was named the NCAA All-Around Champion, Honda Sport Award Winner, AAI Award Winner, SEC Gymnast of the Year and much more in 2024.
- Bryant won the Honda Sport Award for gymnastics, recognizing her as the top collegiate gymnast in the nation and becoming only the second gymnast to win the award in LSU history. She was also a finalist for

the Honda Cup, which is awarded to the top NCAA athlete in the nation.

- The AAI Award also recognized her as the top senior gymnast in the nation.
- In 2024, she became only the fourth gymnast in NCAA history to achieve the trifecta of NCAA team title, all-around title and the AAI Award, following in similar footsteps of Jackson, who was the first LSU gymnast to secure the AAI Award and the Honda Award in the same season.

Bryant, Finnegan 2024 NCAA Champions

- Haleigh Bryant and Aleah Finnegan were crowned 2024 NCAA Champions after their performances in the NCAA Championship Semifinals on April 19 in Dickies Arena.
- The duo finished as the top performers in the all-around and on floor across both sessions of semifinals. The two individual titles from Bryant and Finnegan marks the second most in a single season. LSU had the most national champions in 2017 with three different gymnasts claiming titles.
- Bryant recorded a 39.7125 in the semifinals to claim the individual all-around title for only the second time in LSU history. This is her second national title in her career, with her first coming on vault in 2021. Susan Jackson is the only other gymnast to win the all-around title in 2010.
- She finished as one of the top 10 performers on every event with her scores of 9.900 on vault, 9.925 on bars, 9.950 on beam and 9.9375 on floor at the meet.
- Finnegan claimed the first individual national title of her career last season and fourth program title on floor. The junior recorded a 9.625 in the semifinals to finish as the top performer on the event and join an elite group of floor national champions in Nicki Arnstad (2002), Ashleigh Clare-Kearney (2009) and Ashleigh Gnat (2017).
- With her floor title, Finnegan joined her sister in the record books and became the first sibling duo to own national titles in program history. Her sister, Sarah Finnegan, is a two-time NCAA bars champion.
- LSU now owns 18 national titles across 11 gymnasts since 1977.

The Freshmen Class

- Kailin Chio, Kaliya Lincoln, Lexi Zeiss, Zoe Miller and Victoria Roberts make up this year's freshman class. Chio has competed in the all-around every meet for the Tigers in her first year, while Lincoln competes on vault and floor and Zeiss on vault and bars. Roberts is training vault while Miller is out for the year.

- Chio is a five-star recruit out of Las Vegas, Nevada. As a former national team member and the vault and bars champion at the 2023 Women's Development Program National Championships, she brings depth across the board with experience on the national and international levels.
- The Nevada native took her skills to the international stage in 2021 as she and Team USA earned gold in the team final at the Junior Pan American Championships. Chio went on to compete in the inaugural Junior Pan American Games in November 2021, where she claimed the floor title and contributed to Team USA's success in the team final.
- Chio competed as a level 10 gymnast in 2024 and owns a first place finish in the all-around in the Nastia Liukin Cup and owns multiple perfect scores on vault in 2023. She trains at Gymcats under the leadership of head coach Cassie Rice and Jill Preston.
- A native of the Bay area, Lincoln has seen success at the national and international levels as a four-time member of Team USA. She is the 2023 U.S. floor exercise silver medalist, Winter Cup floor exercise champion and Pan American Games team & floor exercise champion.
- Lincoln is a five-star rated gymnast as she owns multiple titles in her career, including being a five-time national champion on floor. She trains at WOGA Gymnastics in Texas under Yevgeny and Haiou Sun. As a senior elite level gymnast in 2023, Lincoln placed second on floor at the Xfinity U.S. Gymnastics Championships, second at the Core Hydration Classic, and first on floor and ninth in the all-around at the Winter Cup. She competed alongside future teammate Zoe Miller in the Pan American Games September to bring home two gold medals.
- Zeiss is a two-time U.S. National Team member and 2022 World Champion. A top-rated recruit out of Omaha, Nebraska, she is ranked four stars by College Gym News and five stars by CollegeGymFans.com.
- Her elite gymnastics debut came at the 2021 Winter Cup, where she was the all-around champion three years later in 2023.
- Miller is a three-time national team member and international competitor who owns a combined nine gold medals throughout her individual career at the senior elite level and with Team USA.
- An all-arounder out of Spring, Texas, Miller is rated a four-star recruit by College Gym News and a five-star according to CollegeGymFans.com. She trains at the World Champions Centre under Cecile & Laurent Landi.
- Miller has earned multiple titles in 2024, claiming three national titles with Team USA and four individually. She recorded first place finishes on bars at the 2023 Core Hydration Classic and Winter Cup competitions, as well as first place team finishes in the Pan American Championships and the DTB Pokal Team Challenge.
- Roberts is a native of Belle Chasse, Louisiana, who is a four-time state champion and J.O. Nationals Qualifier.
- She was crowned the floor champion at the 2023 Region Eight Championships during her level 10 career and trained at EDGE Gymnastics under Victoria Gomez, Bob Moore, Hillary Hebert and Randy Scott.

The Chio Files

- Freshman Kailin Chio has been a standout in her first year at LSU, competing in the all-around every meet for the Tigers so far in 2025. She currently owns the third highest all-around score in the nation as only a freshman (39.800).
- The Henderson, Nevada native has had eight meets where she's posted scores of 9.9+ on at least three events
- She became the first freshman in the country to earn a perfect 10 this year in the Tigers regular season finale against No. 14 Auburn
- Chio has put up veteran numbers in her first year, owning career highs of 10.00 on vault, 9.950's on bars and beam, 9.975 on floor and a 39.800 in the all-around.
- The freshman has claimed at least one title in all but one meet this year. She owns 20 career titles on the year already, with six coming on vault, four on bars, five in the AA, three on beam and two on floor
- Chio was named the SEC Freshman of the Week nine out of 11 weeks in the regular season, the most by any freshman in the nation this year and the most honors by any LSU freshman to break the conference record
- She beat Florida's Kayla DiCello's previous record of eight awards in her freshman season set in 2023 and already surpassed Haleigh Bryant's previous LSU record of five in 2021.
- Chio has earned a spot amongst the top five gymnasts in the nation for four straight weeks. She currently ranks No. 5 in the all-around with her NQS of 39.670.
- The freshman sits in the top 20 nationally on every event

Finnegan and Chio Win Week One SEC Gymnastics Awards

- Senior Aleah Finnegan and freshman Kailin Chio took home two out of three of the week one SEC Gymnastics Awards.
- Finnegan was named the SEC Gymnast of the Week while Chio was named the SEC Freshman of the Week for their performances in the all-around in the Tigers season opener last Friday.
- A native of Lee's Summit, Missouri, Finnegan scored a 39.725 in her first all-around appearance since March 15th, 2024, marking the highest all-around score by an LSU Gymnast on opening night. She posted scores of 9.950 on vault, 9.900 on bars, 9.925 on beam and 9.950 on floor to win the titles on all four events and the all-around on the night.
- It was the first time an LSU Gymnast swept every event title since Haleigh Bryant in the Podium Challenge on March 8th last season. Finnegan shared the bars and beam titles with Chio, who claimed the first event victories of her young career.
- Chio was the first LSU freshman to compete in the all-around since Kiya Johnson in 2020 and recorded the school's highest all-around debut score by a freshman with her 39.575. A native of Henderson, Nevada, the freshman posted scores of 9.825 on vault, 9.900 on bars, 9.925 on beam and 9.925 on floor in her collegiate debut.
- They both enter week two ranked amongst the top gymnasts in the nation following their performances on Friday night. Finnegan is ranked first on vault, seventh on bars, fourth on beam, first on floor and first in the all-around while Chio ranks seventh on bars, fourth on beam, second on floor and fourth in the all-around.

Chio, Cowan Earn Week Two SEC Gymnastics Awards

- Freshman Kailin Chio earned her second consecutive SEC Gymnastics Award after her week two performance along with junior Ashley Cowan.
- A native of Henderson, Nevada, Chio was named the SEC Co-Freshman of the Week following her career-high 39.625 all-around performance in the Tigers last meet at the Sprouts Collegiate Quad in Oklahoma City. She posted scores of 9.950 on vault, 9.900 on bars, 9.850 on beam and 9.925 on floor at the meet.
- While Chio shares this week's award with Oklahoma's Lily Pederson, the freshman has earned SEC Freshman honors in back-to-back weeks following her first two collegiate meets at LSU.
- She currently ranks the No. 5 all-arounder in the country and earned a spot in the top 20 on every event following the first two weeks of competition.
- A native of Hillsborough, North Carolina, Cowan tabbed her first conference award of her career as she was named the SEC Co-Specialist of the Week following her 9.950 bars routine in the Sprouts Quad. She shares the week two honor with Danie Ferris from Florida. Cowan ranks tenth on bars in the nation with her average of 9.900.

Chio Claims Third SEC Freshman of the Week Honor

- Freshman Kailin Chio continues to shine in her debut season with the Tigers, earning her third SEC Freshman of the Week honor this year, the most by any freshman in the conference.
- A native of Henderson, Nevada, Chio won her first all-around title in the Tigers last meet against No. 9 Missouri, helping take down the visiting Tigers by a score of 198.000-197.125. She now owns three conference awards this season after being named the top freshman in week one and two.
- No. 3 LSU became only the second team in the nation to notch the 198.000 mark this year. The score was powered by season high performances on vault (49.550) and beam (49.550) as well as tying the team's season-high mark on bars (49.425).
- The freshman contributed to the Tigers victory last Friday with her scores of 9.875 on vault, 9.925 on bars, 9.950 on beam, 9.900 on floor and 39.650 in the all-around. Her night was highlighted by career high performances on bars and beam as well as a new career high in the all-around.
- Chio took home two titles on the night – bars and all-around – moving her career total to six titles this year. She now owns two titles on vault, two on bars, one on beam and one in the all-around.

Chio Earns Back-To-Back SEC Freshman of the Week Honors

- Kailin Chio was named the SEC Freshman of the Week in back-to-back weeks after claiming her second straight all-around title in the Tigers last meet against No. 14 Alabama.
- The freshman from Henderson, Nevada, finished as the top gymnast last Friday after matching her career high 39.650 in the all-around against the Tide, helping lead No. 3 LSU to their first SEC road victory of the year.
- It was the second all-around title for Chio in two straight weeks. The SEC award is her fourth this season as she continues to shine in her debut season at LSU. She has now claimed SEC Freshman of the Week honors in weeks one, two, five and six of regular season competition.
- Chio's performance in Tuscaloosa was highlighted by a nearly flawless yurchenko one and a half on vault that scored her a career-high 9.975. She also posted scores of 9.850 on bars, 9.925 on beam and 9.900 on floor.
- She took home a total of three titles at the meet on vault, beam and the all-around, moving her career total to nine on the season. She now owns three titles on vault, two on bars, two on beam and two in the all-around.

Chio Earns Back-To-Back SEC Freshman of the Week Honors

- Kailin Chio continues to be the top freshman in the nation as she claimed her fifth SEC Freshman of the Week honor, announced by the league on Tuesday.
- Chio won the week seven award after another stellar performance in the all-around that helped lead the Tigers to victory over No. 1 Oklahoma last Friday. The freshman posted a career high 39.725 in the all-around to finish as the top gymnast in the meet and claim her third straight all-around title. This week marks her fifth career SEC award and third consecutive, the most by any freshman this year.
- The Henderson, Nevada native put up scores of 9.9+ on every event for the Tigers on Friday, including a career high 9.950 on floor. Her other scores on the night were a 9.950 on vault, 9.900 on bars and 9.925 on beam.
- Chio enters the eighth week of regular season competition with an NQS of 39.435 to place her at No. 9 in the national all-round rankings. She is also ranked No. 1 in the nation on vault with her NQS of 9.930 and No. 8 on beam with an NQS of 9.895.

Chio Named SEC Freshman of the Week for Fourth Consecutive Week

- Kailin Chio won her fourth straight all-around title against No. 9 Kentucky to win her fourth straight conference honor, the most by any freshman this year. She is now tied with Haleigh Bryant for the most SEC Awards during their freshman season with six.
- Chio posted a score of 39.575 in the all-around last Friday to help lead LSU to victory over the Wildcats, marking the program's first win in Lexington since 2017. She posted meet-high scores of 9.925 on vault and 9.875 bars for LSU and finished amongst the top five performers in the meet on beam.
- She took home three titles following her performance at Kentucky on vault, bars and the all-around, moving her career total to 13. She has now taken home at least one event title in all but one meet this year.

Chio Earns Seventh Career SEC Freshman of the Week Honor

- LSU Gymnastics freshman Kailin Chio continues to shine in her debut season as she claimed her seventh career SEC Freshman of the Week honor following her week nine performance.
- This week's award marks Chio's fifth consecutive conference honor, the most by any freshman this season and the most by any LSU freshman. The Henderson, Nevada native continues to prove to be not only the top freshman in the SEC, but in the country.
- In the Tigers last win over George Washington, Chio posted scores of 9.900+ on three events, including first place finishes on bars and beam to take home two titles on the night. She now owns 16 titles on the year, with four of those coming on bars and three on beam.
- The freshman recorded scores of 9.875 on vault, 9.950 on bars and beam and a 9.900 on floor to finish with a 39.675 in the Podium Challenge.

Chio Claims Eighth SEC Freshman of the Week Honor, Ties Conference Record

- Kailin Chio claimed her eighth career SEC Freshman of the Week honor on Tuesday, which ties the conference record for the most by any freshman in a single season.
- Chio matched Florida's Kayla DiCello's record of eight awards in her freshman season set in 2023. Below are the gymnasts with five or more SEC Freshman of the Week awards since it began in 2009:
- The freshman out of Henderson, Nevada, already holds the LSU record for the most SEC awards in their first season. She surpassed Haleigh Bryant's previous record of five in 2021.
- Chio's scores of 9.900+ on every event last Friday helped lead the Tigers to a program record score over No. 10 Georgia last Friday (198.575). She posted a career high 39.800 in the all-around to finish on top of the meet, claiming her fifth all-around title this year.
- She also shared the vault and floor titles on the night with her 9.950 on vault and career high 9.975 on floor, moving her career total to 19 titles this year.
- Chio has earned a spot amongst the top five gymnasts in the nation for three straight weeks, currently ranking No. 5 in the all-around with her NQS of 39.655. She also sits in the top 10 nationally in the vault and beam rankings.

Chio Wins Ninth SEC Freshman of the Week Honor, Breaks Conference Record

- Kailin Chio won her ninth career SEC Freshman of the Week honor on Tuesday, breaking the previous single season record by any freshman in the conference since the award began in 2009.
- Chio shares the week 11 honor with Oklahoma's Addison Fatta after both freshmen put up a 39.650 in the all-around last Friday. Chio now owns the most SEC Freshman of the Week honors in conference history, breaking the previous record of eight set by Florida's Kayla DiCello's in 2023. - The LSU freshman out of Henderson, Nevada recorded her first career perfect 10 in the Tigers regular season finale against No. 14 Auburn last Friday. She became the first freshman in the country to earn a 10 this season after her flawless yurchenko one and a half on vault. Her 10 on vault was only the third in the country by any gymnast so far this season.
- Chio put up strong scores to add to LSU's season high road victory last Friday, recording scores of 9.9000 on bars and 9.925 on floor on top of her perfect 10.0 on vault. She took home the vault title on the night, her 20th title this season and sixth on the event, winning at least one title in all but one competition so far this year.
- Chio has earned a spot amongst the top five gymnasts in the nation for four straight weeks, currently ranking No. 5 in the all-around with her NQS of 39.670. She also sits in the top 10 nationally in the vault and beam rankings, including the No. 1 spot on vault with her NQS of 9.955 on the event.
