LSU HISTORY IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

- LSU is in the NCAA Tournament for the 13th straight season and for the 37th time overall LSU has won seven baseball national championships (1991, 1993, 1996, 1997, 2000, 2009, 2023), the second-most in NCAA history ... the Tigers were an NCAA Tournament Top 8 National Seed for an NCAA-record six straight seasons (2012-17) and this season marks LSU's second Top 8 seed in the past three seasons ... LSU was the No. 5 National Seed in 2023 and claimed the school's seventh CWS title ... LSU has the second-highest all-time NCAA Tournament winning percentage (.705, 177-74).
- This weekend marks the 28th NCAA Regional at Alex Box Stadium LSU has a 111-29 (.793) alltime record in NCAA Regional games, including an 89-17 (.840) mark in home regional games and a 22-12 (.647) record in regional games on the road ... the Tigers have a total of 26 NCAA Regional titles, and LSU has won its home regional on 23 occasions: 1986, '90, '91, '93, '94, '96, '97, '98, '99, 2000, '01, '02, '03, '04, '08, '09, '12, '13, '15, '16, '17, '19, '23 ... the Tigers have won road regionals three times - in 1987 (at New Orleans), in 1989 (at Texas A&M) and in 2021 (at Oregon).

LSU SERIES HISTORY VS. NCAA BATON ROUGE REGIONAL TEAMS

- Dallas Baptist LSU and DBU met for the first time earlier this season (Feb. 26) at Globe Life Field in Arlington, Texas, and the Tigers posted a 7-3 victory over the Patriots.
- Rhode Island there have been no prior baseball meetings between LSU and Rhode Island.
- Little Rock LSU and Little Rock played a three-game regular-season series Feb. 18-20, 2025, in the original Alex Box Stadium, and the Tigers won all three games by scores of 4-2, 11-8 and 15-9.

ABOUT THE TIGERS

- LSU is 43-14 overall and ranked No. 1 in the nation this week by Baseball America, and No. 3 by D1 Baseball and USA Today ... the Tigers posted a 19-11 SEC regular-season record and finished in third place in the 2025 conference standings ... LSU won at least 19 league games for the 19th time in school history and for the second time in the past three seasons.
- \bullet The LSU pitching staff enters the NCAA Baton Rouge Regional ranked in the Top 10 in the nation in three major statistical categories - the Tigers are No. 2 in the nation in strikeouts per nine innings (11.9), No. 6 in hits allowed per nine innings (7.34) and No. 7 in team ERA (3.72)
- LSU enters the NCAA Baton Rouge Regional No. 5 in the SEC in team batting average (.301), and the Tigers are No. 3 in the league in on-base percentage (.412), No. 4 in runs scored (450), No. 4 in hits (566) and No. 4 in doubles (116) ... the LSU pitching staff is No. 2 in the SEC in team ERA (3.72), and the Tigers are No. 3 in the league with 641 strikeouts ... LSU is No. 3 in the SEC in opponent batting average (.221).
- LSU junior first baseman Jared Jones, a semifinalist for the 2025 Dick Howser Trophy, has moved into sole possession of third place on the LSU career homers list - he has 61 homers in three seasons, trailing only catcher Brad Cresse (78 HR, 1997-2000) and first baseman Eddy Furniss (80 HR, 1995-98).
- LSU pitchers Kade Anderson and Anthony Eyanson combined for 16 strikeouts last Friday night as the top-ranked Tigers defeated Texas A&M, 4-3, in the quarterfinal round of the SEC Tournament at Hoover Metropolitan Stadium. Anderson (8-1) worked the first six innings Friday night, limiting the Aggies to three runs on four hits with one walk and 12 strikeouts.

Eyanson, making his first relief appearance of the season, blanked Texas A&M over the final three innings to earn his first save. He allowed two hits while recording one walk and four strikeouts.

- LSU designated hitter **Ethan Frey** paced the Tigers' offense last Friday night in the SEC Tournament win over Texas A&M, as he was 2-for-3 with a double, a two-run homer and three RBI. Frey enters the NCAA Regional as LSU's leading hitter, batting .358 (49-for-137) on the year with 10 doubles, 12 homers, 43 RBI and 29 runs.
- Sophomore left-hander **Kade Anderson**, a 2025 Golden Spikes Award and Dick Howser Trophy semifinalist is No. 1 in the nation in strikeouts this season with 145. He is also No. 3 in the nation in strikeouts per nine innings (14.66) and No. 12 in strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.04)
- Kade Anderson's total of 145 Ks this season is No. 10 on the LSU single-season strikeouts list. He is No. 1 in the SEC in strikeouts, No. 2 in the league in innings pitched (89.0) and No. 8 in opponent batting average (.220)
- Junior right-hander **Anthony Eyanson**, a semfinalist for the College Baseball Foundation National Pitcher of the Year Award, is No. 4 in the nation in strikeouts with 125, and he is No. 7 in the nation in strikeouts per nine innings (13.34).He is No. 3 in the SEC in strikeouts, and No. 3 in the league in innings pitched (84.1), No. 4 in ERA (2.77) and No. 7 in opponent batting average (.212).
- Junior first baseman **Jared Jones** is No. 3 in the SEC in RBI (66), No. 3 in total bases (147), No. 4 in home runs (19), No. 5 in hits (76) and No. 8 in slugging percentage (.645) ... freshman outfielder **Derek Curiel** is No. 7 in the SEC in walks (41) and No. 8 in doubles (16) ... junior second baseman **Daniel Dickinson** is No. 5 in the SEC in on-base percentage (.474).
- Sophomore outfielder Jake Brown in LSU's final two SEC regular-season series versus Arkansas and South Carolina, batted a combined .625 (10for-18) with two doubles, three homers, six RBI and eight runs scored.
- Junior second baseman Daniel Dickinson hit a combined .385 (10-for-26) in LSU's final two SEC regular-season series versus Arkansas and South Carolina with one double, two homers, five RBI and nine runs scored.
- LSU established single-game and single-series attendance records April 25-27 versus Tennessee in Alex Box Stadium, Skip Bertman Field ... the April 26 paid attendance figure of 13,376 was the largest in LSU history, as was the actual attendance figure of 11,439 ... the three-game series paid attendance mark of 38,142 was also the highest in LSU baseball annals.
- LSU has erased deficits of three runs or more to win games on six occasions this season: trailed North Dakota State 7-1 (won 11-9 on March 4); trailed Nebraska 5-0 (won 11-6 on March 1); trailed Mississippi State 6-2 (won 8-6 on March 27); trailed Alabama 5-1 (won 11-6 on April 17); trailed Nicholls 3-0 (won 5-3 on April 8); trailed Tennessee 3-0 (won 6-3 on April 25).

- Baseball America magazine rated LSU's newcomer class of D1 transfers, freshmen signees and JUCO transfers No. 1 in the nation for the 2025 season. LSU's class of newcomers includes 12 NCAA Division I transfers, four JUCO transfers and 10 high school signees. Nine LSU players were ranked in August among Baseball America magazine's Top 100 College Transfers, and 11 LSU newcomers appeared in the Baseball America Top 500 Prospects list for the 2024 MLB Draft.
- Junior first baseman **Jared Jones** has been named to the 2025 Golden Spikes Award Watch List. Jones, a native of Marietta, Ga., was ranked No. 1 on the D1Baseball.com list of the Top 50 First Basemen in the nation. D1 Baseball also named Jones a 2025 Preseason First-Team All-American. Jones hit .301 (69-for-229) for LSU last season with 14 doubles, two triples, 28 homers, 59 RBI and 56 runs. His 28 home runs marked the fourth-most in LSU history and the most by a Tiger since first baseman Matt Clark also hit 28 in 2008. Jones, a 2023 Freshman All-American, finished the 2024 season No. 2 in the SEC in walks (59), No. 5 in home runs, No. 5 in slugging pct. (.747) and No. 9 in total bases (171).
- Sophomore left-hander Kade Anderson has been named to the 2025 Golden Spikes Award Watch List, and he was rated before this season No. 17 on the D1 Baseball list of the Top 150 Starting Pitchers in the nation, Anderson, a 2025 Baseball America Preseason All-American, recorded an outstanding 2024 freshman season for LSU, making 18 appearances (nine starts) and posting a 4-2 mark with a 3.99 ERA and 59 strikeouts in 38.1 innings. The native of Madisonville, La., was especially effective in the 2024 postseason, working 2.1 scoreless innings over two NCAA Chapel Hill Regional appearances on the same day (June 2 vs. Wofford and North Carolina) with two hits, one walk and six strikeouts.
- LSU outfielder **Derek Curiel** was named in January the 2025 SEC Preseason Freshman of the Year by D1Baseball.com. Curiel, two-time member of the 18U USA National Team, batted .314 with 33 hits including 10 doubles 21 RBI and 19 stolen bases in his senior year at Orange Lutheran High School in West Covina, Calif. He was ranked as the No. 10 overall high school player in the country and as the second-best high school player in the state of California by Perfect Game. Also in January, Perfect Game ranked Curiel No. 1 on its list of the Top 75 Freshmen for the 2025 season.
- Eight LSU freshmen were included in January on the Perfect Game list of the Top 75 Freshmen for the 2025 season, including outfielder **Derek Curiel** (No. 1), right-handed pitcher **William Schmidt** (No. 4), catcher **Cade Arrambide** (No. 15); right-handed pitcher **Casan Evans** (No. 26); first baseman **Ryan Costello** (No. 32); right-handed pitcher **Mavrick Rizy** (No. 36); left-handed pitcher **Cooper Williams** (No. 67); and infielder **Mikey Ryan** (No. 69).
- D1 Baseball in October named **LSU the No. 1 college program in the nation, completing its ranking of the Top 100 College Programs** that began in September. D1 Baseball's ranking of the Top 100 Programs focused upon the establishment of a tradition of consistent winning in the last decade, and especially in the last five years.

Anderson's effort was the first complete-game shutout recorded by an LSU pitcher since April 24, 2018, when AJ Labas blanked Lamar in Baton Rouge ... Anderson's outing was the first nine-inning complete game recorded by an LSU pitcher since June 2, 2023, when Paul Skenes worked 9.0 innings and allowed two runs to defeat Tulane in the NCAA Baton Rouge Regional
- Posted a win over Texas (March 21), working 6.0 innings and limiting the Longhorns to two runs on seven hits with no walks and eight strikeouts ... he threw a career-high 101 pitches in the outing, 71 for strikes ... Anderson retired 10 of the final 13 batters that he faced
- Defeated Missouri (March 14) in his first career SEC start, pitching a career-long 6.1 innings with three runs, four hits, two walks and 11 strikeouts, matching his season high for Ks
- Logged win over North Alabama (March 7), working 6.0 innings with one run on four hits, no walks and 11 strikeouts
- Recorded 10 strikeouts in 5.1 innings vs. Kansas State (Feb. 28), allowing two runs on three hits
- Posted win over Omaha (Feb. 21), limiting the Mavericks to two runs on three hits in 5.1 innings with two walks and eight strikeouts
- Defeated Purdue Fort Wayne in 2025 season opener (Feb. 14), working 5.0 scoreless innings with four hits, one walk and eight strikeouts
