LSU HISTORY IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

• LSU is in the NCAA Tournament for the 13th straight season and for the 37th time overall LSU has won seven baseball national championships (1991, 1993, 1996, 1997, 2000, 2009, 2023), the second-most in NCAA history ... the Tigers were an NCAA Tournament Top 8 National Seed for an NCAA-record six straight seasons (2012-17) and this season marks LSU's second Top 8 seed in the past three seasons ... LSU was the No. 5 National Seed in 2023 and claimed the school's seventh CWS title ... LSU has the second-highest all-time NCAA Tournament winning percentage (.706, 180-75).

• LSU is participating in its 17th NCAA Super Regional, including its 13th Super Regional at home ... LSU has won nine Super Regional titles - 2000, '03, '04, '08, '09, '13, '15, '17, '23; all of its Super Regional titles have been won at home ... the Tigers have a 20-16 (.555) Super Regional overall record, including a 19-9 mark (.679) in home Super Regional games ... LSU's Super Regional series wins at home have come over UCLA (2000), Baylor (2003), Texas A&M (2004), UC Irvine (2008), Rice (2009), Oklahoma (2013), UL Lafayette (2015), Mississippi State (2017) and Kentucky (2023) ... LSU's Super Regional series losses at home have come to Stony Brook (2012), Coastal Carolina (2016) and Florida State (2019) ... LSU's home record in NCAA Tournament games (Regionals and Super Regionals combined) is 111-27 (.804).

• Last weekend, LSU captured its 27th NCAA Regional title by winning the Baton Rouge Regional ... - LSU has a 114-30 (.792) all-time record in NCAA Regional games, including an 92-18 (.836) mark in home regional games and a 22-12 (.647) record in regional games on the road ... the Tigers have a total of 27 NCAA Regional titles, and LSU has won its home regional on 24 occasions: 1986, '90, '91, '93, '94, '96, '97, '98, '99, 2000, '01, '02, '03, '04, '08, '09, '12, '13, '15, '16, '17, '19, '23, '25 ... the Tigers have won road regionals three times - in 1987 (at New Orleans), in 1989 (at Texas A&M) and in 2021 (at Oregon).

• Saturday's game will mark the first contest on the diamond between LSU and West Virginia.

ABOUT THE TIGERS

• LSU is 46-15 overall and the Tigers are the No. 6 National Seed in the NCAA Tournament ... LSU is ranked No. 1 in the nation by Baseball America, and No. 3 by D1 Baseball and USA Today in their most recent polls ... the Tigers posted a 19-11 SEC regular-season record and finished in third place in the 2025 conference standings ... LSU won at least 19 league games for the 19th time in school history and for the second time in the past three seasons ... LSU is playing host to a Super Regional for the second time in three seasons and for the 13th time overall.

• The LSU pitching staff enters the NCAA Baton Rouge Super Regional ranked in the Top 10 in the nation in three major statistical categories – the Tigers are No. 2 in the nation in strikeouts per nine innings (11.9), No. 6 in hits allowed per nine innings (7.28) and No. 7 in team ERA (3.73).

• LSU enters the NCAA Baton Rouge Super Regional No. 5 in the SEC in team batting average (.300), and the Tigers are No. 3 in the league in on-base percentage (.412), No. 5 in runs scored (483), No. 4 in hits (609) and No. 3 in doubles (125) ... the LSU pitching staff is No. 2 in the SEC in team ERA (3.73), and the Tigers are No. 2 in the league with 691 strikeouts ... LSU is No. 3 in opponent batting average (.220).

• LSU junior first baseman **Jared Jones**, a semifinalist for the 2025 Dick Howser Trophy, has moved into sole possession of third place on the LSU career homers list – he has 62 homers in three seasons, trailing only catcher Brad Cresse (78 HR, 1997-2000) and first baseman Eddy Furniss (80 HR, 1995-98).

• Sophomore left-hander **Kade Anderson**, a 2025 Golden Spikes Award and Dick Howser Trophy semifinalist, is No. 2 in the nation in strikeouts this season with 156. He is also No. 3 in the nation in strikeouts per nine innings (14.63) and No. 12 in strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.00).

• **Kade Anderson's** total of 156 Ks this season is No. 6 on the LSU single-season strikeouts list. He is No. 2 this season in the SEC in strikeouts, No. 1 in the league in innings pitched (96.0) and No. 9 in opponent batting average (.216).

• Junior right-hander **Anthony Eyanson**, a semifinalist for the College Baseball Foundation National Pitcher of the Year Award, is No. 3 in the nation in strikeouts with 135, and he is No. 9 in the nation in strikeouts per nine innings (12.97). He is No. 1 in the SEC in ERA (2.50) and wins (10), No. 3 in the league in strikeouts (135), No. 3 in innings pitched (93.2) and No. 7 in opponent batting average (.209).

• Junior first baseman **Jared Jones**, a semifinalist for the 2025 Dick Howser Trophy, is No. 2 in the SEC this season in RBI (69), No. 4 in hits (80), No. 5 in total bases (154) and No. 5 in home runs (20)... freshman outfielder **Derek Curiel** is No. 2 in the SEC in doubles (18), No. 4 in the league in walks (47) and No. 8 in on-base percentage (.463) ... junior second baseman **Daniel Dickinson** is No. 5 in the SEC in on-base percentage (.469).

• LSU freshman right-hander **Casan Evans** has been named by the NCBWA as one of 13 finalists for the 2025 Stopper of the Year award. Evans and left-hander Dylan Volantis of Texas are the only freshmen among the 13 finalists. Evans, a product of Houston, Texas, is 4-1 on the year with a 1.90 ERA and six saves in 47.1 innings (17 appearances). He has logged 19 walks and 65 strikeouts, and opponents are hitting just .225 against him.

• LSU junior centerfielder **Chris Stanfield** has been named one of three finalists for the inaugural Tony Gwynn Trophy, honoring NCAA baseball student-athletes who exemplify the Gwynn legacy of philanthropy. Over his three-year college career, Stanfield has been a fixture in the communities of Auburn and LSU. He launched his "Be The 1" campaign at LSU, where he donates \$100 to the Miracle League in Baton Rouge for every game in which he produces an extra-base hit or stolen base. He is actively involved with the Miracle League in Baton Rouge, which gives children with any type of disability or special needs the opportunity to play baseball as part of a team.

• LSU set single-game and single-series attendance records April 25-27 vs. Tennessee in Alex Box Stadium ... the April 26 paid attendance of **13,376** was the largest in LSU history, as was the actual attendance figure of **11,439** ... the three-game series paid attendance mark of **38,142** was also the highest in LSU baseball annals.

• LSU has **erased deficits of three runs or more to win games on seven occasions this season:** trailed North Dakota State 7-1 (won 11-9 on March 4); trailed Nebraska 5-0 (won 11-6 on March 1); trailed Mississippi State 6-2 (won 8-6 on March 27); trailed Alabama 5-1 (won 11-6 on April 17); trailed Nicholls 3-0 (won 5-3 on April 8); trailed Tennessee 3-0 (won 6-3 on April 25); trailed Little Rock 5-1 (won 10-6).

• Baseball America magazine rated LSU's newcomer class of D1 transfers, freshmen signees and JUCO transfers No. 1 in the nation prior to the 2025 season. LSU's class of newcomers included 12 NCAA Division I transfers, four JUCO transfers and 10 high school signees. Nine LSU players were ranked in August among Baseball America magazine's Top 100 College Transfers, and 11 LSU newcomers appeared in the Baseball America Top 500 Prospects list for the 2024 MLB Draft.

• Junior first baseman **Jared Jones** was named to the 2025 Golden Spikes Award Watch List during the season. Jones, a native of Marietta, Ga., was ranked No. 1 on the D1Baseball.com list of the Top 50 First Basemen in the nation. D1 Baseball also named Jones a 2025 Preseason First-Team All-American. Jones hit .301 (69-for-229) for LSU last season with 14 doubles, two triples, 28 homers, 59 RBI and 56 runs. His 28 home runs marked the fourth-most in LSU history and the most by a Tiger since first baseman Matt Clark also hit 28 in 2008. Jones, a 2023 Freshman All-American, finished the 2024 season No. 2 in the SEC in walks (59), No. 5 in home runs, No. 5 in slugging pct. (.747) and No. 9 in total bases (171).

• Sophomore left-hander **Kade Anderson** was named to the 2025 Golden Spikes Award Watch List during the season, and he was rated before this season No. 17 on the D1 Baseball list of the Top 150 Starting Pitchers in the nation. Anderson, a 2025 Baseball America Preseason All-American, recorded an outstanding 2024 freshman season for LSU, making 18 appearances (nine starts) and posting a 4-2 mark with a 3.99 ERA and 59 strikeouts in 38.1 innings. The native of Madisonville, La., was especially effective in the 2024 postseason, working 2.1 scoreless innings over two NCAA Chapel Hill Regional appearances on the same day (June 2 vs. Wofford and North Carolina) with two hits, one walk and six strikeouts.

• D1 Baseball in October named **LSU the No. 1 college program in the nation, completing its ranking of the Top 100 College Programs** that began in September. D1 Baseball's ranking of the Top 100 Programs focused upon the establishment of a tradition of consistent winning in the last decade, and especially in the last five years. Its goal was to identify the programs in the best shape right now, with an eye toward the next five to 10 years.

• **Jay Johnson** has produced **12 Top 5 round and 16 Top 10 round draft choices at LSU**, including the 2023 No. 1 overall selection, right-handed pitcher Paul Skenes (Pittsburgh), the 2023 No. 2 overall pick, outfielder Dylan Crews (Washington) and the 2022 No. 6 overall selection, infielder Jacob Berry (Miami). **LSU in 2023 became the first school in history** to produce the first two selections in a single MLB Draft when Skenes and Crews were chosen Nos. 1 and 2.

JAY JOHNSON

LSU BASEBALL HEAD COACH

A proven track record of postseason success, explosive lineups and highly-ranked recruiting classes make LSU's Jay Johnson one of the best college baseball coaches in the nation. He has made a significant impact at every program he's led, and he is one of the most energetic, innovative and focused coaches in America.

Now in his fourth season at the helm of one of the nation's most storied college baseball programs, Johnson enhanced LSU's elite legacy by guiding the Tigers to the 2023 College World Series title, marking the seventh National Championship in school history.

He has developed 30 Major Leaguers during his collegiate coaching career, most recently right-hander Paul Skenes of the Pittsburgh Pirates, the starting pitcher for the National League in the 2024 MLB All Star Game, and outfielder Dylan Crews of the Washington Nationals, who made his MLB debut in August 2024.

Skenes and Crews made MLB history by becoming the first players from the same school to be drafted No. 1 and No. 2 overall.

Johnson has produced 70 MLB Draft

selections as a collegiate head coach, including 27 at LSU. Thirty-four of Johnson's players have been chosen in the Top 10 rounds of the MLB Draft, including 16 at LSU.

Johnson has a 500-249 (.668) record in 13 seasons as a college head coach, including a 183-77 (.704) mark in four seasons at LSU. He has a 36-16 record in NCAA Tournament games, including a 19-7 mark with the Tigers.

In just his second season at LSU, Johnson directed the Tigers to the 2023 National Championship as their drive to the title was culminated with an 18-4 win over Florida in Game 3 of the College World Series Finals.

He was voted 2023 National Coach of the Year by D1 Baseball, the American Baseball Coaches Association and by Collegiate Baseball newspaper.

LSU was the nation's consensus No. 1 team for the first 12 weeks of the 2023 regular season, and the Tigers finished the year at the pinnacle of college baseball.

LSU was No. 1 in the nation in runs scored (634) and in shutouts by its pitching staff (12). The Tigers finished No. 2 in the nation in

homers (144), walks received (413), hit-by-pitches (143), on-base percentage (.432) and strikeouts pitched per nine innings (11.7)..

The pitching staff recorded a school-record 798 strikeouts, eclipsing the previous mark of 682 set in 1997.

The 2023 Tigers featured three First-Team All-Americans – centerfielder Dylan Crews, the Golden Spikes Award winner; right-handed pitcher Paul Skenes, the Dick Howser Trophy recipient; and third baseman Tommy White, the nation's leader in RBI (105).

Crews was also voted the SEC Male Athlete of the Year and SEC Player of the Year, and Skenes received National Player of the Year and SEC Pitcher of the Year recognition.

An SEC-record 13 LSU players were selected in the 2023 MLB Draft, including five in the first three rounds.

As the reigning National Champion in 2024, Johnson directed LSU to a 43-23 overall mark and a berth in the championship game of the NCAA Chapel Hill Regional. The LSU pitching staff, paced by MLB second-round draft selections Luke Holman and Gage Jump, led the nation in strikeouts with 733.

The 2024 Tigers also featured All-American third baseman Tommy White, who completed his career No. 8 on the NCAA Division I all-time home runs list with 75. White, a member of the Lou Gehrig Community Impact Team for his exemplary philanthropic endeavors, was the second-round draft selection of the Oakland Athletics.

A total of nine LSU players were chosen in the 2024 MLB Draft, including eight pitchers, a mark that tied the SEC record for most pitchers drafted in a single season.

Johnson was named the head coach at LSU on June 25, 2021, after guiding Arizona to the Pac-12 championship and a berth in the College World Series. His impact at LSU was immediate, as Perfect Game ranked the Tigers' November 2021 signing class No. 1 in the nation. Perfect Game, Collegiate Baseball and Baseball America in the fall of 2022 named LSU's combined class of incoming signees and transfers the best in America.

Johnson led Arizona to two CWS appearances – including a Championship Series berth in 2016 – over five full seasons (2016-21).

He worked two seasons (2014-15) as head coach at Nevada, earning Mountain West Coach of the Year honors in 2015 after leading the Wolfpack to their first-ever conference championship.

Johnson was the associate head coach at the University of San Diego (2006-13), where

he spearheaded recruiting efforts and served as the hitting coach. Johnson helped sign the nation's No. 1 class in 2008 and No. 2 class in 2010.

At USD, Johnson recruited and coached Kris Bryant, who won the Golden Spikes Award and the Dick Howser Award as the nation's top player before the Cubs selected him No. 2 overall in the 2013 MLB Draft.

Johnson's coaching career began at his alma mater, Point Loma Nazarene, where he served as an assistant coach from 2002 to 2004 before accepting the head coaching position in 2005. He finished his playing career at Point Loma in 2001, hitting .326 as a senior and earning a Gold Glove as the team's starting second baseman.

A native of Oroville, Calif., Johnson and his wife, Maureen, a former University of Arizona soccer player, were married in 2016.
