LSU Opens Home Slate Against Louisiana Tech In Death Valley

LSU (1-0, 0-0 SEC) plays its home opener on Saturday when the Tigers host Louisiana Tech at 6:30 p.m. The game will be streamed on ESPN+/SECN+. LSU is coming off a 17-10 road win over No. 4 Clemson last week, while the Bulldogs beat Southeastern Louisiana, 24-0, in Ruston. LSU 16 straight against Tech and is 19-1 all-time against the Bulldogs. The teams last met in 2018 with LSU posting a 38-21 win in Tiger Stadium. LSU enters the contest ranked No. 3 in the AP Poll and No. 4 in the Coaches Poll. LSU is 19-2 in Tiger Stadium under fourth-year head coach Brian Kelly, which ties for the best record in first 21 games of any coach in program history. Dating back to last year, LSU has won four straight overall. LSU has won 18 straight and 67 of its last 68 games against non-conference opponents in Tiger Stadium. Since falling to UAB on Sept. 23, 2000, LSU is 67-1 at home against non-conference opponents with the only loss during that 68-game span coming to Troy (24-21) on Sept. 30, 2017. LSU is coming off an outstanding defensive performance, limiting Clemson to 10 points and 261 total yards (31 rushing, 230 passing). LSU held Clemson scoreless and to only 12 rushing yards in the second half when the Tigers outscored the host team, 14-0, in beating a Top 4 opponent in a true road game for just the fifth time in program history. Offensively, QB Garrett Nussmeier managed an efficient unit, completing 28-of-38 passes for 232 yards and a TD. RB Caden Durham led the run game with 74 yards and a TD, while **Aaron Anderson** caught six passes for 99 yards, 55 coming after the catch.

LSU Coach Brian Kelly: Winningest Active Coach In NCAA Football

Brian Kelly, the winningest active coach in NCAA Football with 314 career victories, enters his fourth season at LSU. He's guided the Tigers to a pair of 10-win seasons and a 30-11 overall mark, which includes three bowl victories. Kelly's on-field coaching record stands at 314-107-2 and includes 12 10-win seasons at the FBS level (7 at Notre Dame, 3 at Cincinnati, 2 at LSU). After inheriting a roster with only 39 scholarship players, Kelly quickly turned LSU into a 10-win team in his first season in 2022 as the Tigers went 10-4 overall, beat Top 10 teams in Ole Miss and Alabama and won the SEC Western Division. Kelly, the most accomplished hire in LSU football history when he was named to the position in December of 2021, took over the program after 12 years and a program-record 113 wins at Notre Dame. His coaching resume includes leading teams to 19 bowl/CFP playoff appearances and three National Coach of the Year honors. He won two Division II National Championships at Grand Valley State.

QUICK NOTES

- **Garrett Nussmeier** earned SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors for the third time in his career for his performance against Clemson. **Nuss** completed 28-of-38 passes for 232 yards and a TD. He also rushed for 3 first downs.
- **C Braelin Moore**, in his first game with the Tigers, earned SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week honors. **Moore** played all 70 snaps and was a catalyst for an offensive line that yielded only one sack to a Clemson defense that was considered among the best in the nation. LSU tallied 25 first downs, rushed for 108 yards and had possession of the ball for 37 minutes, including 22 in the second half.
- LSU's starting offensive line vs. Clemson featured five players who either didn't start or won't on the roster for last year's regular-season finale against Oklahoma. Two of the starters – **C Moore** (Virginia Tech) and **RG Josh Thompson** (Northwestern) – are in their first season with the program. **RT Weston Davis** got his first career start, while **LT Tyree Adams** made his third career start and **LG Paul Mubenga** made his sixth career start.
- LSU enters the Tech game with a 67-1 record against non-conference opponents in Tiger Stadium, a streak that started with a 48-17 win over Tulane to open the 2001 season. Since 2000, LSU's only two non-conference losses in Tiger Stadium have come against UAB (13-10) in 2000 and Troy (24-21) in 2017.

- LSU hasn't lost a home-opener against a non-conference team since 1994 when the Tigers dropped a 18-13 decision to No. 15 Texas A&M.
- LSU is 19-2 overall and 9-0 against non-conference opponents in Tiger Stadium under **Brian Kelly**. LSU's only 2 losses in Death Valley under **Kelly** came against No. 8 Tennessee (40-13) in 2022 and No. 11 Alabama (42-13) last year.
- The starting lineup against Clemson featured 12 first-time LSU starters (6 on offense, 6 on defense).
- Against Clemson, **Garrett Nussmeier** became the first player in program history to throw a pass in five seasons. **Nussmeier** joined the Tigers in 2021 and has thrown at least one pass in each of his five seasons with the program.
- **Nussmeier** has led LSU to an 11-4 mark in his 15 career starts. He's thrown at least one TD pass in 14 of his 15 starts and has topped the 300-yard passing mark nine times. The only start in which **Nuss** didn't throw a TD pass came in a road win over Arkansas last year.
- **Nussmeier** enters the Louisiana Tech game ranked in LSU's career Top 10 in the following passing categories: passing TDs (No. 5 with 41), No. 5 in completions (494), No. 6 in attempts (782) and No. 7 in passing yards (6,004).
- **WR Aaron Anderson** topped the 1,000-yard mark for career receiving yards vs. Clemson with six catches for 99 yards. In three years at LSU, **Anderson** has caught 79 passes for 1,042 yards and five TDs.

When Brian Kelly was hired away from Notre Dame in December of 2021, LSU announced at the time that "the search for LSU Football's next championship head coach is over."

In his three years with the Tigers, Kelly has won 29 games – including back-to-back 10-win seasons in 2022 and 2023 – to go along with 17 SEC victories. The 17 SEC victories since 2022 trail only Georgia (22) and Alabama (19) for most in the league during that span.

Building a roster with elite recruiting at the high school level and then complimenting those players through the transfer portal, Kelly has the Tigers on the path to winning championships. LSU returns 14 players who started against Baylor in the Texas Bowl, a group that includes All-SEC linebacker Whit Weeks and All-America candidate quarterback Garrett Nussmeier.

Recently, LSU added its third straight Top 10 high school signing class to go along with the nation's No. 1 rated transfer portal class to solidify a roster that is poised for a spot in the College Football Playoffs in 2025.

Under Kelly, the Tiger program has improved in all areas – classroom, community, strength and conditioning, nutrition – as he's instilled the traits necessary to be a champion. LSU's 2024 roster had 39 players earn SEC Academic Honor Roll status, the most in school history and the Tigers are consistent participants in community service activities.

In his third season with the Tigers in 2024, Kelly guided LSU to a 9-4 mark capped with a 3-game winning streak to end the season. LSU's win over Baylor in the Texas Bowl marked the third straight bowl victory for the Tigers under Kelly.

After losing Heisman Trophy winner Jayden Daniels along with first round NFL Draft picks in Malik Nabers and Brian Thomas, LSU's offense – with a first-time starter at quarterback in Nussmeier – averaged 30 points per game and ranked No. 7 nationally in passing offense (315.2).

LSU played 20 true freshmen in 2024 with seven of those starting at least one game. All 20 of those true freshmen remain on the roster as Kelly heads into his fourth season leading the program.

In 2024, LSU beat Top 10 Ole Miss in overtime in Tiger Stadium, rallied from a 17-0 first half deficit to beat South Carolina on the road and finished November with wins over Vanderbilt and Oklahoma. The Ole Miss game marked the eighth time under Kelly that LSU overcame a double-digit first half deficit to win.

LSU's roster featured offensive tackle Will Campbell, who became the 11th consensus All-America for Kelly and the third for him at

LSU. Campbell anchored an offensive line that led the SEC in sacks allowed with 15.

In the win over Baylor, LSU had as many as six freshmen (true and redshirt) defenders on the field in the second half, while the Tigers started three redshirt freshmen on the offensive line and didn't allow a sack against the Bears.

The most accomplished hire in program history with 313 career victories now, including 29 at LSU, Kelly wasted little time in making his impact felt, leading the Tigers to a 10-win season and the SEC Western Division title in his first year. Despite inheriting a roster with only 39 scholarship players remaining from the 2021 season, Kelly led the Tigers to Top 10 wins over Ole Miss and Alabama along with road victories over Auburn, Florida and Arkansas in his first year with the Tigers.

LSU capped the 2022 season with a resounding 63-7 win over Purdue in the Citrus Bowl completing one of the biggest turnaround in college football.

Building off of the 2022 season, Kelly again guided the Tigers to a 10-win season capped with a victory over Wisconsin in the ReliaQuest Bowl. In doing so, Kelly joined Les Miles as the only coaches in LSU history to lead the Tigers to 10-win seasons in their first two years with the program.

Behind the play of Heisman Trophy quarterback Daniels, LSU won seven of its final eight games to finish with a 10-3 record. All three of LSU's losses came to teams either in the CFP Playoffs (Alabama) or playing in a New Year's Six Bowl (Florida State, Ole Miss). LSU's signature win came in a 49-39 victory over Missouri – a team that finished ranked No. 9 in the nation.

In 2023, the Tigers featured the top offense in college football, leading the nation in scoring (45.5) and total yards (543.5). LSU was the only FBS team to rank among the Top 10 in both rushing (No. 10 at 204.5) and passing (338.9) yards per game.

Behind an offensive line that was a finalist for the Joe Moore Award, LSU topped 40-points and the 500-yard mark nine times in 2023. Daniels became only the fifth player in SEC history to account for 50 touchdowns (40 passing, 10 rushing) in a season and he led the nation in total offense with a league record 412.2 yards per game. Daniels also set the FBS record for pass efficiency with a 208.0 rating. For the second straight year, Daniels was the top rushing quarterback in college football with 1,134 yards.

In LSU's November win over Florida, the Tigers racked up 701 total yards – the most ever given up by the Gators – with Daniels setting the SEC record for total yards with 606. In that game, Daniels became the first player in FBS history to rush for 200 yards (234) and pass for 350 yards (376) in a game.

A week later, Daniels tied Joe Burrow's LSU record for touchdowns in a game with eight (2 rushing, 6 passing).

Daniels solidified his standing as the Heisman Trophy favorite against Texas A&M when he directed the Tigers to three fourth quarter touchdowns as LSU overcame a 10-point third quarter deficit to beat the Aggies, 42-30. In what was his final game as a Tiger, Daniels accounted for four touchdowns and 355 yards (120 rushing, 235 passing) against Texas A&M.

LSU's 2023 offense ranked No. 2 in program history for points in a season (592), points per game (45.5), total yards (7,065), total yards per game (543.5), passing yards (4,406) and passing yards per game (338.9).

Wide receiver Nabers – a unanimous All-America – became LSU's all-time leader in receptions (189) and receiving yards (3,004). Nabers led the nation in receiving yards per game (120.7), catching an SEC-best 89 passes for 1,569 yard and 14 touchdowns. Teammate Thomas led the nation in receiving TDs with 17. The duo combined for 157 receptions for 2,746 yards and 31 touchdowns making them the most productive tandem in the FBS.

Daniels, Nabers and Thomas were all selected in the first round of the 2024 NFL Draft. Kelly has now coached 15 players who have gone on to be selected in the first round of the NFL Draft. In all, he has seen 100 of his former players picked in the NFL Draft – 64 at Notre Dame, 17 at Cincinnati, 12 at LSU, 6 at Central Michigan and 1 at Grand Valley State.

It also marked the first time in NFL Draft history that a quarterback and wide receiver from the same school were both selected in the Top 10. Daniels went No. 2 overall, while Nabers was selected No. 6. Thomas was the 23rd overall pick in the 2024 draft.

In his first year at LSU, the Tiger offense gave a glimpse into what the 2023 season may hold. After a slow start – LSU completed only eight passes for 80 yards in a win over Auburn on Oct. 1 – the Tigers found their identity beginning with a 45-35 victory over Florida in Gainesville two weeks later.

A week later, Kelly picked up his first Top 10 win at LSU as the Tigers rolled past No. 7 Ole Miss, 45-20, in Tiger Stadium. Following an open date, the Tigers added their second consecutive Top 10 win, knocking off No. 6 Alabama, 32-31, in Death Valley.

Down a touchdown after Alabama's first possession in overtime, Daniels scored on a 25-yard run on LSU's first play pulling the Tigers to within 31-30. Instead of kicking the extra-point to send the game into a second overtime, Kelly opted to go for two setting the stage for one of Tiger Stadium's epic moments. With 102,000 fans on their feet, Daniels found tight end Mason Taylor in the front corner of the endzone for a successful two-point conversion, sending Tiger Stadium into a frenzy.

That call – and that game – are widely considered two of the top moments in the history of Tiger Stadium. The victory over Alabama put LSU in the driver's seat in the SEC Western Division as the Tigers went on to claim a spot in the league's title game with a win over Arkansas in Fayetteville the following week.

Kelly became only the fourth first-year coach in SEC history to lead a team to the league's championship game, joining Miles (LSU in 2005), Gus Malzahn (Auburn in 2013) and Jim McElwain (Florida, 2015).

Kelly and Paul Dietzel are the only coaches in LSU history to lose a season-opener and still go on to win 10 games. Kelly has now done it twice – 2022 and 2023 – while Dietzel did it in 1961.

LSU's 2022 season saw the Tigers rack up some of the top offensive numbers in school history – at the time ranking No. 2 in program record books for total yards (6,344), No. 3 in yards per game (453.1) and total passing yards (3,770). The 2022 set the program mark for rushing touchdowns with 39, breaking the previous record of 37 set in 2013.

Kelly, who has more victories than any active coach in major college football with 313, was named LSU's 34th head football coach on December 1, taking over a program that has won four national championships. He joined the Tigers after 12 seasons at Notre Dame.

In 35 years as a collegiate head coach, Kelly has put together a 313-108-2 overall mark and is the winningest coach in Notre Dame history. He's now won 10 or more games 12 times at the FBS level and he's reached double-digit win 18 times in his 35-year coaching career. He's had teams win nine games on six other occasions.

Other coaching stops for Kelly include 13 seasons at Grand Valley State, three at Central Michigan, four at Cincinnati, and 12 at Notre Dame.

His overall mark of 314-108-2 ranks him first on the list of most victories (no matter division) by an active FBS head coach with Iowa's Kirk Ferentz following at 204 wins. Additionally, Kelly's 196 wins in 21 years at the FBS level rank No. 2 among all current FBS coaches, trailing only Ferentz, who has won 204 games in 26 seasons. Only twice during

Kelly's 34-year coaching career has he had a team finish below .500.

Kelly is also one of only five active FBS coaches who have guided their programs to multiple undefeated regular seasons since 2009 and he's led teams to a berth in the BCS National Championship Game and to a pair of College Football Playoff appearances. Overall, his teams have appeared in bowl games 16 times.

Prior to taking over at LSU in 2022, Kelly spent 12 years as the head coach at Notre Dame where he became the school's winningest coach with 113 victories, moving past legendary Knute Rockne for the top spot on the list. Kelly left Notre Dame with a 113-40 overall mark and his teams averaged 10 wins a season over his last five years – 54-9 during that span – with Irish.

Kelly surpassed Rockne as the winningest coach in the storied history of Notre Dame when the Irish beat Wisconsin, 41-13, on Sept. 25, 2021 at Soldier Field in Chicago.

During his Notre Dame career, Kelly led the Irish to the 2012 BCS national title game as well as College Football Playoff appearances in 2018 and 2020. He was named National Coach of the Year by numerous outlets in 2012 and 2018. He's the only coach to win the Home Depot Coach of the Year Award more than once, and he's done it three times (2009, 2012, and 2018).

In 12 seasons at Notre Dame, Kelly's teams won at least 10 games seven times, including 2021, as the Irish posted an 11-1 mark and were ranked as high as No. 5 in the nation during his final season in South Bend. Kelly's final five seasons at Notre Dame saw the Irish win at least 10 games each year, including a 12-1 mark in 2018 and 11-2 in 2019.

Individually, Notre Dame players claimed eight consensus All-America honors playing for Kelly, while the Irish had players win nine national awards during that span. Kelly's Notre Dame teams produced 55 NFL Draft picks since 2012, including 10 in the first round.

Academically under Kelly, the Irish had eight players earn the prestigious CoSIDA Academic All-America honor, and three were selected as National Football Foundation Scholar-Athletes. As a team, Notre Dame consistently ranked among the nation's top four in the NCAA's Graduation Success Rate.

Prior to joining the Irish, Kelly transformed Cincinnati into a football powerhouse, winning Big East titles in 2008 and 2009. In three years at Cincinnati, the Bearcats won 34 games and appeared in the Orange and Sugar Bowls.

In 2007, Kelly led Cincinnati to the school's first-ever 10-win season with a 10-3 mark and a win in the PapaJohns.com Bowl. In his final season at Cincinnati, Kelly's team posted a 12-0 regular season mark and earned a berth to the Sugar Bowl.

Kelly's first Division I head coaching position came in 2004 when he took over at Central Michigan. In three years with the Chippewas, Kelly's teams won 19 games, claimed the Mid-American Conference title in 2006 and appeared in a bowl game for the first time in 12 years. The MAC title was the first for Central Michigan since 1994.

Kelly's impact at Central Michigan put the program on a path that saw the school win two more MAC titles over the next three years after his departure.

Prior to Kelly's arrival, Central Michigan had only two 10-win seasons and two bowl appearances since joining the Mid-American Conference in 1975.

Kelly's first head coaching job came at Division II Grand Valley State in 1991, a position he held for 13 years. In 13 years at Grand Valley, Kelly won 118 games, won five straight conference titles and made six Division II playoff appearances. He led the Lakers to back-to-back national titles in 2002 and 2003, going 14-0 and 14-1, respectively. He won 41 games during his final three years in Allendale.

A native of Everett, Mass., Kelly was a four-year letterwinner at linebacker and two-time team captain at Assumption College in Worcester, Mass. He graduated from Assumption in 1983 with a degree in political science.

Kelly and his wife Paqui have three children – Patrick, Grace and Kenzel. The Kellys are active in community outreach and have established the Kelly Cares Foundation which has donated nearly \$8 million to support causes related to the fight against breast cancer since its founding in 2008.

LSU Hosts Louisiana Tech in Home Opener

No. 3/4 LSU (1-0) hosts Louisiana Tech (1-0) in the Tigers' 2025 home-opener on Saturday in Tiger Stadium. The matchup will be streamed on ESPN+ and SECN+ at 6:30 p.m. CT. It's the first meeting between the in-state schools since 2018 when LSU beat the Bulldogs, 38-21, in Tiger Stadium. LSU is 19-1 all-time against Louisiana Tech and brings a 16-game winning streak over the Bulldogs into the contest. Tech's only win over LSU in the 20-game series came in 1904 by a 6-0 count. LSU is coming off a 17-0 win over No. 4 Clemson last week, while Louisiana Tech posted a 24-0 win over Southeastern Louisiana in Ruston. LSU coach Brian Kelly will face a Louisiana Tech team for the first time in his 35-year head coaching career.

LSU In The Polls – Tigers No. 3 in AP and No. 4 in Coaches

LSU jumped inside the Top 5 of both national polls following its 17-10 win over Clemson in the season-opener. The Tigers moved six spots to No. 3 in the AFCA Coaches Poll and they bumped up four positions to No. 4 in the AP Top 25. The win over Clemson marked only the fifth time in program history that LSU beat a team ranked in the Top 4 in a true road game. It was also the highest-ranked win for the Tigers since LSU beat No. 3 Clemson to claim the national championship in January of 2020. The No. 3 ranking in the Coaches poll is the highest ranking for the program since finishing the 2019 season as the No. 1 team in the nation. LSU was ranked No. 1 in the nation by the coaches for the final six polls in 2019 and for the final five AP Top 25s that year. Under Brian Kelly, the Tigers have been ranked as high as No. 6 in-season, which came following a 41-10 win over UAB in November. Overall under Kelly, LSU's highest-ranking came at No. 5, which was in the 2023 preseason poll. LSU is one of 10 SEC teams ranked in the AP Top 25, including four in the Top 10. Six of LSU's remaining opponents are currently ranked in the AP Top 25 – a list that includes No. 10 South Carolina, No. 13 Florida, No. 18 Oklahoma, No. 19 Texas A&M, No. 20 Ole Miss and No. 21 Alabama. Dating back to 2000, LSU has been ranked at some point throughout the year for 26 consecutive seasons.

Nussmeier and Moore Earn SEC Weekly Honors

Quarterback **Garrett Nussmeier** and center **Braelin Moore** picked up SEC Player of the Week honors on Monday for their effort in LSU's 17-10 win over No. 4 Clemson in the season-opener. **Nussmeier** was named SEC Offensive Player of the Week, while **Moore** earned SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week recognition. The honor is the third for **Nussmeier**, who claimed the weekly award last year for his play in wins over UCLA and Ole Miss. Against Clemson, **Nussmeier** completed 28-of-38 passes for 232 yards and a touchdown in leading the Tigers to the comeback road win. **Nussmeier** also rushed for a pair of first downs. **Nussmeier** completed his final 11 passes of the game, including all nine in the fourth quarter as the Tigers rallied from a 10-3 halftime deficit to beat a Top 4-ranked team in a true road game for only the fifth time in program history. With the score tied at 10-10, **Nussmeier** connected with tight end **TreyDez Green** for an 8-yard touchdown pass early in the fourth quarter to put LSU up for good, 17-10. It was the fourth time in **Nussmeier's** career the senior led LSU to a victory after either trailing or with the game tied in the fourth quarter. **Moore**, in his first game at LSU after transferring from Virginia Tech, was the catalyst for an offensive line that limited Clemson's highly-touted defensive front to only one sack. LSU's offensive line, which lost four starters to the NFL Draft last April, featured a new starter at every position from the regular-season finale a year ago. **Moore** played all 70 offensive snaps and helped the Tigers to 354 total yards and 25 first downs. LSU maintained possession of the ball for 37 minutes, including 21 in the second half when the Tigers outscored Clemson, 14-0.

LSU's Won 37 Straight Against Louisiana Schools

The Tigers brings a 37-game winning streak and a 142-25-8 all-time mark against teams from Louisiana into the Tech contest. LSU hasn't dropped a game to a team from Louisiana since 1982 when Tulane posted a 31-28 victory over the Tigers in Tiger Stadium. LSU's record against in-state schools include: 69-22-7 vs. Tulane; 22-0 vs. Louisiana-Lafayette; 19-1 vs. Louisiana Tech; 12-0 vs. Northwestern State; 4-1 vs. Loyola (New Orleans); 4-0 vs. Louisiana-Monroe; 3-1 vs. Centenary; 2-0 vs. Louisiana College, Southeastern and McNeese; and 1-0 against both Southern, Grambling, and Nicholls. The Louisiana Tech contest will mark the fifth straight year in which LSU has faced a team from Louisiana. LSU beat McNeese (34-7) in 2021, followed by a 65-17 win over Southern in 2022, a 72-10 victory over Grambling in 2023, and a 44-21 win vs. Nicholls last year. During his time at LSU, **Brian Kelly** is 3-0 against schools based in Louisiana.

Nothing Like a Night Game in Tiger Stadium

There's not a better setting for college football than a night game in Tiger Stadium. It's not only the best atmosphere in college football, but it also creates a huge home field advantage for the Tigers. LSU has won 17 of the last 18 night games in Death Valley and since the turn of the century (2000-24), LSU is 112-16 in night games in Tiger Stadium. LSU went 49-5 from 2000-09, 43-7 from 2010-19 and is 20-4 in those games since 2020. Of the 16 losses since the start of the 2000 season, eight have come to teams ranked in the Top 10 with five of those coming to teams ranked No. 1. LSU has only two non-conference losses in night games in Tiger Stadium since 2000 (UAB in 2000; Troy in 2017). Here's a look at LSU's night game record in Tiger Stadium by decade since the first game was played under the lights on Oct. 3, 1931 vs. Spring Hill (won, 35-0).

LSU is 15-1 In Night Games Under BK; 19-2 Overall In Death Valley Under Kelly

Under LSU head coach **Brian Kelly**, the Tigers are 15-1 in night games in Tiger Stadium. Overall, LSU has won 17 of the last 18 night games in Death Valley. The Tigers won all four of their night games in 2022, followed by a 6-0 mark in 2023. LSU went 5-1 in 2024 night games. LSU's only night game loss in Tiger Stadium under **Kelly** came last year when No. 11 Alabama beat the Tigers, 42-13. Prior to the loss against the Crimson Tide, LSU last lost a night game in Tiger Stadium on Nov. 13, 2021 when Arkansas kicked a field goal in overtime to win, 16-13. LSU's only other home loss under **Kelly** came during the day when then-No. 8 Tennessee posted a 40-13 win over the Tigers on Oct. 8, 2022.

LSU vs. Louisiana Tech

Since 1901, LSU and Louisiana Tech have met on the gridiron 20 times coming into Saturday's matchup at Death Valley Saturday night. The Tigers lead the overall series record by a wide margin of 19-1 with LSU holding a 14-0 record when these games are played in Baton Rouge. The 2025 matchup will be the first time both teams have played since 2018 when LSU won 38-21. In that game, LSU running backs Clyde Edwards-Helaire and Nick Brossette combined for 214 yards and five touchdowns, as the No. 6-ranked Tigers improved to 4-0. The Tigers and Bulldogs will meet for just the fifth time in the 21st century. Prior to Saturday night, LSU and Louisiana Tech played the previous four matchups in Baton Rouge (2003: W, 49-10; 2007: W, 58-10; 2009: W, 24-16; 2018: W, 38-21). Before the 2003 tilt in Tiger Stadium, both teams had not battled one another for 62 years. All 16 iterations of this series occurred in 1941 and prior.

LSU In Home Openers

Overall, LSU is 104-22-4 in home openers, which includes a 76-20-4 mark in Tiger Stadium. LSU has won 27 of its last 29 home openers dating back to a 35-34 win over Houston in 1996. In that span, the only home opener losses came against SEC foes, falling to Tennessee, 30-27, in overtime on a Monday night in 2005 and a 44-34 setback to Mississippi State in 2020.

LSU vs. Conference USA

LSU is 27-1 all-time against current members of Conference USA. The Tigers are 19-1 against Louisiana Tech, 2-0 against New Mexico State, Middle Tennessee and Western Kentucky and 1-0 against both UTEP and Jacksonville State. LSU hosts Western Kentucky later this year for the second Conference USA matchup for the Tigers in 2025.

LSU's Non-Conference Tiger Stadium Winning Streak Stands at 18 Games

LSU has won 18 straight and 67 of its last 68 games against non-conference opponents in Tiger Stadium. LSU's last loss against a non-conference foe came in 2017 when Troy beat the Tigers, 24-21 on Sept. 30. Prior to that loss, LSU had won 49 straight non-conference games in Tiger Stadium, which ranks as the third-longest streak in college football history, trailing only Harvard (55 from 1890-1895) and Carlisle (54 from 1901-1915). Before the Troy loss in 2017, LSU's last defeat in Tiger Stadium to a nonconference team came in 2000 against UAB.

LSU is 97-14 vs. Non-Conference Teams Dating Back to 2001

Dating back to the 2001 season when LSU captured its first outright SEC title since 1986, the Tigers have done quite well against non-conference opponents, going 97-14 against non-SEC foes during that span. Of the 97 wins, 22 have come against top-25 teams. Of the 14 losses, only seven have come during the regular season (2002 at Virginia Tech, 2016 vs. Wisconsin at Lambeau Field, 2017 vs. Troy, 2021 at UCLA, 2022 vs. FSU, 2023 vs. FSU, and 2024 vs. USC). The other seven losses came in bowl games (2003 Cotton Bowl vs. Texas; 2005 Capital One Bowl vs. Iowa; 2009 Capital One Bowl vs. Penn State; 2012 Chick-Fil-A Bowl vs. Clemson; 2014 Music City Bowl vs. Notre Dame; 2018 Citrus Bowl vs. Notre Dame; 2022 TaxAct Texas Bowl vs. Kansas State).

LSU is 13-3 in Non-Conference Games Under Brian Kelly

LSU ran its record to 13-3 against non-conference opponents under **Brian Kelly** following the 17-10 win over No. 4 Clemson in the season-opener. LSU went 4-1 against non-SEC foes in each of **Kelly's** first three seasons with the Tigers. LSU's three non-conference losses under **Kelly** came to Florida State (2022 and 2023) and Southern Cal (2024).

LSU's Ties To Louisiana Tech

Several members of LSU's coaching staff, including **DC Blake Baker** and **OC Joe Sloan** – have ties to Louisiana Tech. **Baker** spent 5 years with the Bulldogs from 2014-18, while **Sloan** served in multiple roles at Tech over nine seasons in Ruston. LSU **Offensive Analysis Tim Rattay** is a Louisiana Tech Hall of Fame quarterback and spent six years coaching at his alma mater. **Director of Operations JR Belton**, a former Bulldog quarterback and wide receiver, later worked on staff as Tech's recruiting coordinator (2015-20). **Sherman Wilson** also held the same position at Louisiana Tech in 2021 before joining LSU. **Offensive Analyst Trey Holtz** spent two seasons on the Bulldogs' staff (2020-21) under his father, head coach Skip Holtz, who led the program for nine years.

Last Time Out: No. 9 LSU 17, No. 4 Clemson 10

Quarterback **Garrett Nussmeier** passed for 230 yards and 1 TD, and the LSU defense limited Clemson to just 31 yards rushing, as the Bayou Bengals recorded a 17-10 win in Memorial Stadium. **Nussmeier** completed 28 of his 38 passes, including an eight-yard TD strike to tight end **Trey'Dez Green** with 12:18 remaining in the fourth quarter that broke a 10-10 tie. The game-winning score capped an 11-play, 73-yard drive that began at the 3:09 mark of the third period. **Aaron Anderson** led all receivers with six catches for 99 yards, and running back **Caden Durham** posted 74 yards and a touchdown on 17 carries, averaging 4.4 yards per touch. Clemson led 10-3 at halftime, but **Nussmeier** directed LSU on an eight-play, 69-yard game-tying march, with the drive culminating in **Durham's** two-yard TD burst at the 8:59 mark of the third quarter. LSU linebacker **Harold Perkins Jr.** wreaked havoc in the Clemson backfield, finishing with five tackles, two quarterback hurries and one sack. Cornerback **Mansoor Delane** flashed in his LSU debut with an interception and two pass break-ups. The LSU defense held Clemson to 261 yards in total offense, including just 31 yards rushing, an average of 1.6 yards per attempt.

LSU Earns First Top 10 Non-Conference Road Win Since 2019

For only the second time in program history, LSU beat a Top 10 non-conference opponent in a true road game when the Tigers knocked off No 4 Clemson, 17-10, in the season-opener. The only other Top 10 non-conference true road game win for LSU came in 2019 when the Tigers beat No. 9 Texas, 45-38, in Austin. In the SEC era, LSU is now 2-9 in true road games against AP Top 10 non-conference opponents. LSU was unranked in all games with the exception of Clemson in 2025 (LSU No. 9), Texas in 2019 (LSU No. 6), and Notre Dame in 1970 (LSU No. 6). It was the fifth true-road win over a Top-4 opponent in program history. Here's a look at how LSU has fared in the SEC era in road games against Top 10 non-conference opponents:

Garrett Nussmeier Becomes 7th LSU QB With 6,000 Career Passing Yards

Garrett Nussmeier became the seventh player in LSU history to reach 6,000 passing yards when he hit the milestone in the 17-10 win over Clemson. **Nussmeier** connected on 28-of-38 passes for 232 yards and a TD in the season-opening win. His career numbers stand at 6,004 passing yards and 41 TDs. **Nussmeier** currently ranks No. 7 in LSU history in career passing yards. Tommy Hodson (1986-89) holds the LSU mark with 9,115 yards in four years as the Tiger starting quarterback.

Aaron Anderson Surpasses 1,000 Career Passing Yards

With six receptions for 99 yards against Clemson, **WR Aaron Anderson** joined LSU's 1,000-yard club for career receiving yards. He's the 45th player in LSU history to reach the milestone and his career numbers stand at 79 receptions for 1,042 yards and five TDs. Last year, **Anderson** led the Tigers in receptions (61) and receiving yards (884).

LSU Defense Shines vs. Clemson

LSU's defense, which is led by second-year defensive coordinator **Blake Baker**, played a dominant game against Clemson, holding the Tigers scoreless in the second half of the 17-10 LSU victory. **Baker's** defensive unit held the Clemson offense, led by QB Cade Klubnik, to 261 total yards (230 passing, 31 rushing). LSU limited Clemson to only 12 rushing yards in the second half when the Tigers outscored the host team, 14-0. Here are some of the defensive highlights for LSU in the win over Clemson

- Pitched its 2nd second-half shutout of an AP Top-10 opponent on its home field since 1950. The first second-half shutout occurred against No. 4 Alabama in 2005 when LSU defeated the Crimson Tide, 16-13, in overtime.
- Held Clemson to 12 rushing yards in the second half
- Recorded four tackles for loss (-26) and two sacks (-22)
- Tallied eight QB hurries
- Intercepted a Clemson pass at midfield in the 3Q
- Held Clemson to only 3-of-13 on third-down attempts
- Longest run of game by Clemson was seven yards (3 times)

LSU is 9-3 In One-Score Games Under BK

LSU ran its record in one-score games under **Brian Kelly** to 9-3 with its impressive defensive showcase against Clemson. In 2024, LSU was 3-1 in one-score games this year with wins over South Carolina (36-33), Ole Miss (29-26), and Vanderbilt (24-17). LSU dropped a 27-20 decision to Southern Cal in the season-opener. LSU won three one-score games in 2022 (at Auburn, Alabama, and at Arkansas) and collected two one-score contests in 2023 (Arkansas and vs. Wisconsin). The two losses in 2022 and 2023 came against Florida State (2022 season opener) and Ole Miss (2023 regular season matchup in Oxford). Here's a look at the one-score games for LSU under BK:

Harold Perkins Jr. Sees Action for First Time Since Season-Ending Injury; Recorded First Sack Since 2023

After suffering a season-ending ACL injury against UCLA in 2024, LSU junior linebacker **Harold Perkins Jr.** returned to action in grand fashion for the 2025 season opener vs. Clemson. **Perkins** was one of three top tacklers for LSU against Clemson, recording five tackles, two quarterback hurries, and 1.5 tackles for loss. **Perkins** used his elite speed and athleticism as he has in the past to wreak havoc on the Clemson offense, and it included **Perkins'** first sack since the 2023 regular-season finale against Texas A&M. **Perkins'** ability to stretch the field from sideline to sideline proved to be vital in LSU's 17-10 victory against Clemson. On the final play of the game with just over a minute left in the fourth quarter, **Perkins** chased QB Cade Klubnik down to record a QBH that led to an incomplete pass and the opportunity for the LSU offense to run out the clock.

Weeks Brothers Make Starts vs. Clemson as Linebacker Duo

For the first time in their collegiate careers, linebacker and brother duo **Whit Weeks** and **West Weeks** started a game together. This season, **Whit** and **West** are joined by their little brother **Zach**, who was able to witness the special moment for his family as he made the trip to Clemson, S.C. **Whit** and **West**, along with All-American linebacker **Harold Perkins Jr.**, are leaders of the Tiger defense as **Whit** and **West** combined for seven tackles and three quarterback hurries. **Whit** was making his 15th career start, while **West** started for the first time at LSU and the second time in his collegiate career. **West** made one start at his previous school of Virginia.

Mansoor Delane All Over The Field; Hauled in 7th Career INT vs. Clemson

CB Mansoor Delane, who transferred from Virginia Tech in the offseason, was all over the field against No. 4 Clemson. According to Pro Football Focus, Delane finished with the highest grade (81.3) of any defensive Tiger, as he played 40 coverage snaps and dealt with eight targets, allowing only one reception. In addition, he had two tackles, two pass breakups, and the Tigers' first interception on the year that LSU the ball right back after it scored a rushing TD on the previous offensive possession. The INT he hauled was a huge moment for the defensive back because the momentum had completely shifted at the time. It was the first INT of **Delane's** time at LSU and was the seventh of his collegiate career. The other six came at his previous school, Virginia Tech. **Delane** earned the game ball from head coach **Brian Kelly** for his efforts in the season-opening victory.

Zavion Thomas Is A Swiss Army Knife for the Tigers

WR/RS Zavion Thomas has been a man of many talents for the LSU Tigers since coming over Mississippi State in 2024. The Louisiana native, who has been used in so many different ways since arriving in Baton Rouge, was no different against No. 4 Clemson. In the season-opening win, **Thomas** recorded a rush, pass, and catch. He became the first LSU player to do so since QB Jayden Daniels on Jan. 2, 2023, vs. Purdue in the Cheez-It Citrus Bowl. **Thomas'** Swiss Army knife qualities extends to the special team unit, handling kickoff and punt return duties in 2024. He finished with 993 all-purpose yards (633 kickoff returns, 218 receiving, 76 rushing, 66 punt returns) and was the only LSU player to touch the ball in all four of those areas in 2024. In the final game of the 2024 season, **Thomas** returned a kickoff 95 yards for a TD in the Texas Bowl win over Baylor. The return put the Tigers up 34-14 just before halftime. In 36 career appearances, **Thomas** has accounted for 2,230 all-purpose yards.

Game Ball

Following each win dating back to the beginning of head coach **Brian Kelly's** tenure in 2022, he and the staff have presented the "game ball" to a player who had the biggest impact on the win. **CB Mansoor Delane**, who transferred to LSU from Virginia Tech in the offseason, earned the first game ball of the 2025 season. **Delane** was the highest-rated defender against Clemson according to PFF's advanced metrics. **Delane's** PFF grade was 81.3, as he recorded 40 coverage snaps and defended eight targets with only one reception. In addition, he had two tackles, two pass breakups, and the Tigers' first interception on the year. The following is a look at LSU's game ball recipients this year:

LSU running backs Clyde Edwards-Helaire and Nick Brossette combined for 214 yards and five touchdowns, as the No. 6-ranked Tigers improved to 4-0 with a 38-21 victory over Louisiana Tech. The Tigers remain at home this week and will face Ole Miss at 8:15 p.m. CT on Sept. 22. The game will be televised by ESPN and broadcast on the LSU Sports Radio Network beginning with the pregame show at 6 p.m. Tickets are available at www.LSUtix.net. After LSU jumped out to a 24-0 lead midway through the second quarter, Louisiana Tech (2-1) gave LSU all it could handle. The Bulldogs scored 21-unanswered points including a 42-yard touchdown pass from J'Mar Smith to Adrian Hardy with 12:57 to play. However, LSU responded with two touchdowns in a six-minute span, which sandwiched a defensive stop and turnover on downs in Bulldogs territory. Sophomore Edwards-Helaire had career-bests of 20 carries, 136 yards and two touchdowns, while Brossette tallied 78 yards on 20 carries and scored on runs of 1, 1 and 2 yards. LSU quarterback Joe Burrow completed 16-of-28 passes for 191 yards, as the Tigers amassed 409 yards of total offense. Burrow's 21-yard pass to freshman wide receiver Ja'Marr Chase setup Brossette's first touchdowns. Cornerback Kristian Fulton forced a fumble and linebacker Devin White returned it to the Louisiana Tech 3, leading to Brossette's second score on the first play of the second quarter. Following a Cole Tracy 24-yard field goal, LSU defensive back Ed Paris intercepted a pass broken up by White at the Bulldogs 28. On the next play, Edwards-Helaire scored to give LSU a 24-0 lead. Linebacker Jacob Phillips had a team-high 13 tackles, while White added 11 including 2.5 behind the line of scrimmage and three pass breakups. Safety Todd Harris Jr., who started in place of John Battle, had nine tackles. Louisiana Tech quarterback J'Mar Smith finished 27-of-50 passing for 330 yards with three touchdowns and one interception. His top target was Adrian Hardy, who had 10 catches for 181 yards with touchdowns of 20 and 42 yards.

Series Notes: LSU will meet Louisiana Tech for the 21st time in program history in Baton Rouge. LSU lead the series 19-1. Brian Kelly is meeting Louisiana Tech for the first time in his coaching career. The last meet-up was September 22, 2018 with the Tigers coming out victorious with a score of 38-21.

12 Tigers Earned Their First Start in an LSU Uniform in Season Opener

Up Next: LSU Opens SEC Play vs. Florida

Following the LSU-Louisiana Tech matchup, the Tigers will return to the friendly confines of Tiger Stadium on Sept. 13 to play the Florida Gators in LSU's first Southeastern Conference game of the 2025 season. The two teams will meet on Saturday night in Death Valley with the game being televised on ABC at 6:30 p.m. CT. It will be the second of three-straight games on the Tigers' home field, as LSU will play Southeastern Louisiana in Week 4. Last year, Florida broke LSU's streak of five-straight wins in the series history with a 27-16 victory in The Swamp. The Tigers have won the last three matchups against the Gators in Baton Rouge dating back to 2019. In the 2023 matchup, Heisman Trophy winner Jayden Daniels led LSU to a 52-35 victory, finishing 17-of-26 passing for 372 yards and three touchdowns, along with 234 yards rushing on 12 carries with two scores on the ground.

Brian Kelly Is College Football's Winningest Active Head Coach With 313 Wins

Brian Kelly, now in his fourth year at LSU and 35th overall, is the winningest active college football coach no matter the division with 314 on-field wins. **Kelly's** overall mark stands at 314-108-2. He's the winningest coach in Notre Dame history (113 wins) in 12 years. He won 118 games and two Division II national titles in 13 years at Grand Valley State. He followed that with 19 wins in 3 years at Central Michigan and 34 victories in 3 seasons at Cincinnati.

NOTEBOOK

LSU's Won 30 Games in 3-Plus Years under BK

LSU has an overall mark of 30-11 under head coach **Brian Kelly** since he took the LSU job prior to the 2022 season. LSU went 10-4 and captured the SEC Western Division title in 2022 followed by a 10-3 mark in 2023. Last year, LSU posted a 9-4 overall mark. LSU has won all three bowl games under **Kelly** and holds a 1-0 record for the first time since 2019.

LSU's 17 SEC Wins In 3 Years Ranks No. 3 Among League Teams

LSU's 17 SEC wins in its first three years under **Brian Kelly** ranks third in the league, trailing only Georgia and Alabama. LSU went 6-2 in both 2022 and 2023 followed by a 5-3 mark last year. Georgia has 22 regular-season SEC wins during the three-year span, while Alabama has 19 victories.

Nuss Back At QB For The Tigers

Senior **Garrett Nussmeier** returns for his fifth season, and second year as LSU's starting quarterback, in 2025. **Nussmeier** is 11-4 as LSU's starting quarterback, winning the ReliaQuest Bowl in his first career start in January of 2024 followed by a 9-4 record a year ago. In 32 career appearances, **Nussmeier** has thrown for 6,004 yards and 41 touchdowns. He has 2 400-yard passing games and nine games with at least 300 passing yards. He has also engineered 3 fourth quarter comebacks in his 14 starts, directing LSU to comeback wins over South Carolina and Ole Miss in 2024 and against Wisconsin in the ReliaQuest Bowl (first career start). **Nussmeier** enters the 2025 season ranked in the LSU Career Top 10 in the following categories:

Last 2 Returning Starters at QB for LSU Went On To Win the Heisman

The last two times LSU's roster featured a returning starter at quarterback, that player went on to win the Heisman Trophy. Joe Burrow, a transfer from Ohio State, was the first to do it in 2019 after starting all 13 games in 2018. Jayden Daniels accomplished the feat in 2023 after starting all 14 games for the Tigers after transferring from Arizona State. Max Johnson started the final 3 games of the 2020 season after a season-ending injury to Myles Brennan in week 3. Brennan was considered LSU's returning starter in 2021 before an arm injury in late summer of 2021 forced him to miss the entire season. Brennan went on to retire from football prior to the start of the 2022 season. This year, **Garrett Nussmeier** returns as LSU's starting quarterback after leading the Tigers to a 9-4 mark in his first season as the starter.

Nuss Only Fourth QB in SEC History To Return For Another Season After Passing For 4,000 Yards

Garrett Nussmeier becomes only the fourth player in SEC history to return for another season of college football coming off a 4,000-yard passing year. Last year in his first season as a starter, **Nussmeier** threw for 4,052 yards and 29 TDs. His 4,052 passing yards rank No. 2 in single-season LSU history and No. 10 in SEC history. Like Father, Like Son

Three Sets of Brothers on LSU Roster

LSU has three sets of brothers on this year's roster – the **Weeks**, the **Stamps** and the **Bordelons**. The trio of **Weeks** brothers – **West, Whit and Zach** – are on the same team for the first time ever. All three are linebackers and give LSU a trio of brothers on the same roster for the first time since the Taylor brothers in 2008. Starting cornerback **Ashton Stamps** and reserve offensive lineman **Christian Stamps** are brothers, while **Bo and Brett Bordelon** are brothers who are the sons of Ben, a former All-SEC offensive lineman for the Tigers in the mid-1990s.

Durham Back To Lead The Run Game

Sophomore **Caden Durham** is back as LSU's starting running back after leading the Tigers in rushing with 753 yards and six TDs as a true freshman in 2024. **Durham**, who earned Freshman All-SEC honors a year ago, averaged 5.6 yards on 140 carries. **Durham**, a second-team preseason All-SEC selection, had a pair of 100-yard games last year with a career-best 128 yards and a TD in the win over South Alabama. He rushed for 101 yards and 3 TDs in the road win over Arkansas. His breakout game came in the comeback win over South Carolina, rushing for 98 yards and a pair of scores in the 36-33 victory. **Durham** is also a pass-catching threat, hauling in 28 passes for 260 yards and two scores. **Durham** will be joined in the running back rotation by junior **Kaleb Jackson**, sophomore **Ju'juan Johnson** (who can also play QB), and true freshman **Harlem Berry**. **Durham** led the Tigers' rushing attack in the Clemson game, as he rushed for 74 yards and one TD that tied the game at 10.

LSU's 21-3 Under BK When Rushing For 150-Plus Yards

In 41 games under **Brian Kelly**, LSU has posted a 21-3 mark when rushing for 150 yards or more. LSU only did it twice last year, beating South Alabama (237 yards) and Arkansas (158 yards). In 2023, the Tigers went 9-2 when reaching the 150-yard mark after going 10-1 in 2022. The only three games LSU has lost under **BK** when rushing for 150 yards or more came at Texas A&M in 2022; at Ole Miss and at Alabama in 2023. LSU rushed for 187 yards in a losing effort against A&M and the Tigers had 223 yards and 206 yards in losses to Alabama.

LSU's Return Game In Good Hands – 3 Players on LSU Roster Have Returned Kickoffs For TDs

LSU's return game may be stronger than ever as the Tigers have three players on its roster who have returned kickoffs for touchdowns. Kentucky transfer **Barion Brown** leads the way with five career kickoff returns for TDs, while **Zavion Thomas** has done it twice (as well as a punt return for a TD) and **Aaron Anderson** has one to his credit. Last year, LSU returned kickoffs for touchdowns in back-to-back games, with **Anderson** doing it in the regular-season finale (100 yards vs. Oklahoma) followed by a 95-yard kickoff return for a score by **Thomas** against Baylor in the Texas Bowl.

LSU's Deep at Wide Receiver

LSU's wide receiver room can do as many as eight deep with returning starters **Aaron Anderson, Chris Hilton, and Zavion Thomas** the leaders of the group. **Hilton** and **Jelani Watkins** are arguably two of the fastest players in college football. LSU added to the room with the addition of Kentucky transfer **Barion Brown**, who joined the program after catching 122 passes for 1,528 yards and 11 TDs in three seasons with the Wildcats. LSU also added **Nic Anderson** (Oklahoma) and **Destyn Hill** (Florida State) through the transfer portal. As a unit, LSU's wideouts go into the 2025 season with a combined 157 games played at the FBS level and 64 starts. The unit has combined to catch 331 passes for 4,796 yards and 36 TDs. After one game in 2025 that position group has combined to catch 29 passes for 248 yards and one TD. Nine Tigers hauled in at least one pass against Clemson.

LSU Defensive Coaches Raymond and Williams Both Played for the Tigers

LSU's coaching staff included two coaches who played for the Tigers – secondary coach **Corey Raymond** and first-year interior defensive line coach **Kyle Williams**. **Raymond** played at LSU from 1988-91 and then went on to spend six years in the NFL with the Giants (1992-94) and Lions (1995-97). **Williams** was a team captain for LSU in 2005. He was a starting defensive tackle on LSU's 2003 national championship team. **Williams** later went on to spend 13 years as a starting defensive tackle for the Buffalo Bills (2006-18), playing in the Pro Bowl six times and earning All-Pro honors in 2010.

Transfer Braelin Moore Leads a Re-Tooled LSU Offensive Line

Gone from last year's LSU offensive are a school-record four NFL Draft picks in LT Will Campbell (No. 4 overall in 2025 NFL Draft), OG Miles Frazier (5th round), OG Garrett Dellinger (7th round), and RT Emery Jones (3rd round). **Moore**, a transfer from Virginia Tech, takes over at center, a position that sophomore **DJ Chester** started all 13 games a year ago. **Chester** is the backup center and in battle for the starting left guard position with **Paul Mubenga** and **Coen Echols** (Mubenga made the start at LG against Clemson). **Tyree Adams** takes over at left tackle with Northwestern transfer **Josh Thompson** holding down the right guard spot and **Weston Davis** or true freshman **Carius Curne** starting at right tackle. Damian Ramos Establishes School Record in Consecutive PAT Kicks Made

Senior **PK Damian Ramos** set the school-record for consecutive PATs with 129 consecutive makes before missing late in the second quarter of LSU's win over Baylor in the Texas Bowl. **Ramos'** 129 consecutive PATs surpassed Cade York's mark, who converted 118 straight PATs during his career from 2019-21. **Ramos'** streak started in the second quarter of LSU's week 12 game against Texas A&M in 2022. **Ramos** made all 77 of his PATs in 2023 and then made his first 36 in 2024 before missing against Baylor. Prior to the Baylor game, **Ramos'** last miss of a PAT came in the third quarter against UAB in week 11 of the 2022 season. Following the Clemson game, **Ramos'** streak is three.

LSU's 25-2 Under BK When Scoring 30-Points Or More

LSU is 25-2 under **Brian Kelly** when reaching the 30-point mark. LSU went 7-0 in 2024 when hitting the 30-point mark after going 10-1 in 2023 and 8-1 in 2022. LSU's only two losses under **BK** when scoring 30 points came against Ole Miss in 2023 (55-49) and Georgia in the 2022 SEC Championship Game (50-30). LSU has won 14 straight games when scoring at least 30 points.

BK Coaching Tree

Brian Kelly has seen 16 of his former assistant coaches become head coaches, with two currently serving as head coaches in the SEC – Mike Elko (Texas A&M) and Clark Lea (Vanderbilt). Transfers With Starting Experience

LSU strengthened its 2025 roster with 16 transfers who bring starting experience, combining for 249 career starts across their previous programs. Here's a look at the transfer portal additions:

0 Tamarcus Cooley, DB (NC State/Maryland) - Defensive tackle who started nine games at nickel for NC State in 2024, appearing in all 13 games. Closed the season with a standout performance in the Military Bowl against East Carolina, posting nine tackles and intercepting two passes on consecutive drives in the fourth quarter to secure the Wolfpack's win. Finished his redshirt freshman season with 43 tackles, two interceptions, a forced fumble, and a fumble return of 70 yards against Duke. Enters LSU with 15 career appearances and nine starts in the defensive secondary.

2 Destyn Hill, WR (Florida State) - Appeared in 10 games with two starts at Florida State as a true freshman in 2023, recording six receptions for 87 yards. Logged a season-long 30-yard reception in his first career start vs. Virginia Tech and added a 29-yard catch against Pittsburg. Missed the 2024 season due to

injury, but is expected to be in the Tigers' receiver rotation this fall.

4 Nic Anderson, WR (Oklahoma) - Dynamic wide receiver who transferred to LSU after three seasons at Oklahoma. Broke the Sooner's freshman record with 10 touchdown receptions in 2023, a season in which he totaled 31 catches for 798 yards while starting the final six games. Had three 100-yard outings, highlighted by a 120-yard, three touchdown performance vs. Tulsa, and caught the game winning score with 15 seconds remaining in a victory over No. 5 Texas. Averaging 21.0 yards per catch for his career, Anderson is expected to be a very targeted wide receiver for the Tigers.

4 Mansoor Delane, CB (Virginia Tech) - Veteran cornerback who started 29 games over three seasons at Virginia Tech. Earned third-team All-ACC honors in 2024 after ranking third in the league in interceptions (4) and sixth in passes defended (11). Comes to LSU with 146 tackles, 7.0 tackles for loss, 22 passes defended and six interceptions.

6 Barion Brown, WR/RS (Kentucky) - Explosive playmaker and proven return specialist after three seasons with Kentucky. Finished his Wildcat career ranked No. 10 on the school's all-time receiving yards list (1,528) and tied for No. 14 in receptions (122). Holds Kentucky's career record for kickoff return touchdowns (5) as well as the single-season record (3 in 2019), while also establishing program marks for kickoff return average both for a season (36.0 in 2023) and a career (30.3). Totaled 3,273 all-purpose yards - 1,528 receiving, 1,465 on kickoff returns, 195 rushing and 85 on punt returns - in 37 games with 22 starts. Earned multiple All-SEC selections as both a returner and all-purpose player. Caught at least one pass in 36 of 37 career appearances and entered 2025 as the SEC's all-time leader and active FBS leader with five career kickoff return touchdowns.

6 Partick Payton, DE (Florida State) - Elite edge rusher who joined LSU in December 2024 after a dominant career at Florida State. Appeared in 40 games with 26 starts, totaling 31.5 career tackles for loss and 16 sacks. Helped Florida State to a 13-1 overall mark, the ACC Championship and an Orange Bowl berth in 2023. Played in both games against LSU in 2022 and 2023, starting the 2023 contest with 4 tackles and a pass breakup. Notable 2024 season included 35 tackles, 11.0 for loss and 4.0 sacks, with a career-best 3.0 sacks and 3.5 tackles for loss against California. Earned ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year honors as a freshman and started all 14 games in 2023, recording 44 tackles, 14.5 for loss, 7.0 sacks and 10 pass breakups.

8 Ja'Keem Jackson, CB (Florida) - Appeared in 13 career games with 2 starts, totaling 11 tackles, 4 pass breakups and a quarterback hurry. Made first career start against Miami (Fla.) in the season opener, followed by 3 tackles vs. Samford. In 2023 as a true freshman, appeared in 11 games with 7 tackles and 3 pass breakups, including a solo stop in his collegiate debut against Utah. Joins former Florida teammate Jack Pyburn on the 2025 LSU roster.

10 Bauer Sharp, TE (Oklahoma/Southeastern) - Versatile tight end who joins LSU after spending the 2024 season at Oklahoma, where he led the Sooners with 42 receptions for 324 yards and 2 TDs. Played three seasons at Southeastern Louisiana before transferring to Oklahoma, totaling 82 career receptions for 690 yards and 6 TDs in 37 games with 22 starts. Started all 12 regular-season games at Oklahoma, catching at least one pass in every contest, including a career-high 8 receptions for 53 yards and a TD at Ole Miss. Joins former Oklahoma teammate Nic Anderson on the 2025 LSU roster.

11 Michael Van Buren Jr., QB (Mississippi State) - Started the final eight games at quarterback for Mississippi State in 2024. Completed 140-of-256 passes for 1,886 yards, 11 TDs and 7 interceptions, adding 5 rushing touchdowns. Named SEC Freshman of the Week after passing for 306 yards and 3 TDs vs. Georgia. Also had a 300-yard passing game vs. Arkansas and tied career highs with 22 completions and 3 TDs vs. Texas A&M. Made first career start at Texas and accounted for 3 total TDs vs. UMass.

12 Jimari Butler, DL (Nebraska) - Veteran defensive lineman who appeared in 36 games with 16 starts over five seasons at Nebraska before transferring to LSU in December of 2024. Totaled 65 tackles, 17.0 tackles for loss and 7.5 sacks with the Cornhuskers, earning honorable mention All-Big Ten honors in 2023. Recorded career highs that season with 34 tackles, 8.5 tackles for loss and 5.5 sacks. In 2024, started 10 games and finished with 22 tackles, 7.0 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks, highlighted by a career-best 3.0 tackles for loss against Ohio State

13 A.J. Haulcy, S (Houston/New Mexico) - Veteran safety who has appeared in 36 career games with 33 starts, establishing himself as one of the most productive defensive backs in college football. Spent two seasons at Houston, where he started every game ranked among the team leaders in tackles, after an impressive freshman year at New Mexico in which he started 11 games and earned Freshman All-America honors.

61 Braelin Moore, OL (Virginia Tech) - Two-year starter on the offensive line at Virginia Tech who appeared in 28 games with 24 starts, including 12 at left guard in 2023 and 12 at center in 2024. Logged 1,422 career snaps with the Hokies, allowing only three sacks last season while helping pave the way for a 1,000-yard rusher. Earned Academic All-ACC honors in 2023.

88 Bernard Gooden, DT (South Florida/Wake Forest) - Physical interior lineman who joined LSU in December of 2024 after two seasons at Wake Forest and two at South Florida. Appeared in 27 career games with 11 starts, recording 42 tackles, 11.5 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks. Started all 13 games for USF in 2024, earning All-AAC honors after tallying 35 tackles, 10.0 tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks and two fumble recoveries.

88 Donovan Green, TE (Texas A&M) - Appeared in 18 career games with 4 starts at Texas A&M, all coming as a true freshman in 2022 when he caught 22 passes for 233 yards and 2 touchdowns. Missed the 2023 season with a knee injury before returning to see action in 8 games in 2024.

90 Grant Chadwick, P (Middle Tennessee State) - Signed with LSU after an impressive freshman season at Middle Tennessee in 2024. Averaged 43.4 yards on 51 punts with a net average of 40.8 yards, ranking No. 29 nationally and No. 4 among FBS freshman punters. Placed 17 punts inside the 20 and had 13 travel at least 50 yards, including a season-long 60-yarder against Duke.
6 Barion Brown, WR/RS (Kentucky) - Explosive playmaker and proven return specialist after three seasons with Kentucky. Finished his Wildcat career ranked No. 10 on the school's all-time receiving yards list (1,528) and tied for No. 14 in receptions (122). Football Victorious in Season Opener, Defeating No. 4 Clemson, 17-10

Quarterback Garrett Nussmeier passed for 230 yards and one touchdown, and the LSU defense limited Clemson to just 31 yards rushing, as the Bayou Bengals recorded a 17-10 win in Memorial Stadium. LSU improved to 1-0 on the season, while Clemson dropped to 0-1 in the first regular-season meeting between the schools. LSU defeated Clemson for the fourth time in the five all-time series matchups. Nussmeier completed 28 of his 38 passes, including an eight-yard TD strike to tight end Trey/Dez Green with 12:18 remaining in the fourth quarter that broke a 10-10 tie. The game-winning score capped an 11-play, 73-yard drive that began at the 3:09 mark of the third period. Aaron Anderson led all receivers with six catches for 99 yards, and running back Caden Durham posted 74 yards and a touchdown on 17 carries, averaging 4.4 yards per touch. Clemson led 10-3 at halftime, but Nussmeier directed LSU on an eight-play, 69-yard game-tying march, with the drive culminating in Durham's two-yard TD burst at the 8:59 mark of the third quarter. LSU linebacker Harold Perkins Jr. wreaked havoc in the Clemson backfield, finishing with five tackles, two quarterback hurries and one sack. Cornerback Mansoor Delane flashed in his LSU debut with an interception and two pass break-ups. The LSU defense held Clemson to 261 yards in total offense, including just 31 yards rushing, an average of 1.6 yards per attempt.
