WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- This is the 114th meeting all-time between Ole Miss and LSU dating back to 1894 . . . LSU is Ole Miss' second-most played opponent behind Mississippi State, who the Rebels will play for the 121st time this November.
- LSU holds a 66-43-4 series lead on the field, including 11-10-1 in Oxford.
- Since the rivals started playing for the Magnolia Bowl trophy in 2008, LSU holds an 11-5 edge.
- This is the 13th ranked meeting between Ole Miss and LSU, with the Tigers leading ranked matchups 8-4 . . . No. 4 is LSU's highest rank in the series since 2019 (No. 1), and 17 is best combined AP rank in the series since 1962 (10).
- Ole Miss has three all-time wins against a top-five LSU team in 1960 (No. 3), 1962 (No. 4) and No. 5 (1965).
- Ole Miss has held at No. 11 in the Coaches poll and No. 13 in the AP poll . . . The Rebels have been ranked for 37 consecutive polls since the beginning of the 2023 season, the longest streak since 2014-16 (41).
- **Lane Kiffin** (109), LSU's **Brian Kelly** (199) and Georgia's **Kirby Smart** (108), are the lone active SEC head coaches with 100 career FBS victories.
- Ole Miss is 4-0 for a second straight season, the first back-to-back since 2014 (9-4) and 2015 (10-3).
- Ole Miss is 30-3 in its last 33 home games and 16-1 at home since the start of the 2023 season . . . In that span, Ole Miss is averaging 43.2 points and 529.1 yards per game at home.
- The Rebels are 43-13 under **Lane Kiffin** since 2021 and rank third among all SEC schools in wins in that span.
- Since the start of 2020, Kiffin's Ole Miss teams lead all FBS schools at 506.5 yards per game.
- Ole Miss has scored 179 points in 2025, tied for third-most through four games in program history.
- The Rebels lead the FBS in 30-yard plays (21) and tie for the lead in 20-yard plays (32).

PRESS CONFERENCES/INTERVIEWS: Ole Miss will hold its weekly fall press conference each Monday of the regular season beginning at 11:45 a.m. CT, beginning with head football coach Lane Kiffin. Players will follow Coach Kiffin at the Monday press conference. Select players will be also available at approximately noon on Tuesday, while Coach Kiffin will be available Wednesday on the SEC teleconference (12:10 p.m. CT). There is no media availability on Thursday or Friday. Times are subject to change.

SEC WEEKLY TELECONFERENCE: Coach Kiffin will be available on the weekly Southeastern Conference teleconference every Wednesday at 12:10 p.m. CT, beginning week one and concluding the final week of the regular season.

WORKING CREDENTIALS: To request game credentials, go to Ole Miss' online credentialing site: www.sportssystem.com/OleMiss. Credential requests must be made as early as possible by the sports director of each media outlet and are limited to those media who will be attending the game in a working capacity. Media must approve the SEC Media Policy before requesting credentials.

PARKING: Gameday media parking will be located in the garage adjacent to The SJB Pavilion. Each pass is for a specific numbered parking spot. Cars parked in the wrong spot will be towed. Parking passes are digital and must be requested during credential application process.

MEDIA GATE/WILL-CALL: Media will enter Gate 35 on the west side of the stadium beginning three hours prior to kickoff. The media will-call table will be located beside the elevators on the concourse level of The SJB Pavilion. Photographers may receive a vest at this location.

PHOTOGRAPHERS/SIDELINE ACCESS: All photographers must wear a photo vest in order to be admitted to the sidelines. This may be received beside the elevators on the concourse level of The SJB Pavilion. Gameday flip cards will be available there or in the photo workroom, which is located next to the visiting team locker room off the southeast corner of the field. Per NCAA rules, images or likeness of current student-athletes may not be sold, distributed or used for commercial purposes without appropriate consent.

SIDELINE ACCESS: Excluding select portions of the game, media sideline access is reserved for photographers/videographers. Credentialed photographers/videographers who arrive at media will-call without proper equipment will not be granted a vest for sideline access. When on the sideline, media must remain outside the bench area and may not shoot behind the benches. During pre-game activities, media must remain in the designated area, as posted in the photo workroom, until the team leaves the field after warm-ups.

VIDEO CONTENT: Press conferences, media opportunities, practices and any form of competition may not be broadcast live, including Facebook Live and related media, without prior consent of Ole Miss Athletics. Use of footage from practices is limited to three minutes per day. This includes content obtained via FTP. Press conferences, practice footage and other content are available for media on the Rebels' official YouTube page: www.youtube.com/OleMissSports/videos. Ole Miss also offers free FTP downloads of this content for television stations to use during regularly scheduled newscasts. All content should be credited to Ole Miss Sports Productions.

RECRUITS: Per NCAA rules, media are not permitted to have contact with a prospect or family members of a prospect during their official visit, including prospects in attendance at practice or games. In addition, media are forbidden from videoing or photographing prospects during their visit. Media are also asked to make every effort to keep distance from prospects on campus, including at practice, during pre-game activities on the sidelines and in the stands.

RADIO RIGHTS: The radio rights to Ole Miss Football are provided by Learfield in partnership with TeleSouth Communications Inc. Visiting networks planning to originate from Vaught-Hemingway Stadium/Hollingsworth Field are issued credentials by the Ole Miss Athletics Communications office. Broadcast lines should be ordered through AT&T (1-877-438-0041). Visiting networks may also wish to contact Cabell Philpott with Learfield (cabell.philpott@imgworld.com), concerning the SEC's network agreement.

RADIO/TELEVISION SHOW: The RebTalk radio show gives fans the opportunity to ask Coach Kiffin questions concerning Ole Miss Football. The talk show, hosted by David Kellum, will air every Thursday during the season at 6 p.m. "The Season: Ole Miss Football" is an award-winning, weekly 30-minute show produced by Ole Miss Sports Productions. It debuts Wednesdays at 6 p.m. CT on OleMissSports.com and airs on ESPN.

COREY ADAMS: 2006-2025



This season, the Rebels will wear helmet decals in memory of freshman defensive end **Corey Adams**, who was tragically killed on July 19. Adams, a member of the 2024-25 Ole Miss signing class, enrolled at Ole Miss early and participated in spring drills while earning Dean's Honor Roll accolades in the classroom. Adams, a native of New Orleans, was a unanimous three-star prospect coming out of Edna Karr High School and was rated as high as the No. 16 overall recruit in Louisiana.

LAST FIVE GAMES AGAINST LSU

Oct. 12, 2024 • Baton Rouge, La. • #10 LSU 29, #8 Ole Miss 26
No. 8 Ole Miss football couldn't overcome numerous missed opportunities and miscues as it fell 29-26 in overtime at No. 10 LSU. Ole Miss didn't trail until the final play of the game, but had a sure touchdown dropped, a turnover on downs inside the 5-yard line and a missed short field goal, as well as 12 penalties for 110 yards, including two in overtime, as it fell short of its first win at Tiger Stadium since 2008.

Sept. 30, 2023 • Oxford, Miss. • #20 Ole Miss 55, #12 LSU 49
In came down to the last play of the game, but No. 20 Ole Miss held on for a 55-49 victory over the No. 12 LSU in an offensive showdown. The Rebels and the Tigers combined for a mind-boggling 104 points and 1,343 yards. Ole Miss put up 706 total yards of offense, including 317 yards on the ground en route to a top-15 win.

Oct. 22, 2022 • Baton Rouge, La. • LSU 45, #7 Ole Miss 20
A 20-17 halftime wasn't enough for No. 7 Ole Miss, as the LSU Tigers rode dual-threat quarterback Jayden Daniels and a feisty defense to a 28-0 second half to hand the Rebels their first loss in a 45-20 upset victory. Freshman running back Quinshon Judkins led with 111 yards on 25 carries and two touchdowns.

Oct., 23, 2021 • Oxford, Miss. • #12 Ole Miss 31, LSU 17
In front of 64,523 fans on Eli Manning Day at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium, Ole Miss delivered a dominant 31-17 win over LSU. The Rebel defense created three turnovers and tallied five sacks, while the offense used a balanced attack to mount a 31-7 lead going into the fourth quarter.

Dec. 19, 2020 • Baton Rouge, La. • LSU 53, Ole Miss 48
Facing an early deficit, Ole Miss never gave up at Tiger Stadium. Ole Miss trailed 37-21 in the third quarter but reeled off a 27-3 run to claim a 48-40 advantage. However, six Rebel turnovers proved too much to overcome as LSU found the end zone on its final two drives to steal a 53-48 victory.

OLE MISS HEAD COACH LANE KIFFIN

Lane Kiffin, one of college football's preeminent offensive minds and well-known personalities, is in his sixth season in charge of the Ole Miss football program. Kiffin has led the Rebels to unprecedented heights during his tenure, which has included five consecutive bowl berths, including three wins and two New Year's Six appearances. Kiffin has tallied three 10-win seasons in Oxford, including Ole Miss' first-ever 11-win season. In 13 seasons at the NCAA level, Kiffin owns an all-time record of 109-52, including a 48-18 mark with the Rebels. Kiffin came to Ole Miss from Florida Atlantic, where he turned around an FAU program that won nine games over the previous three seasons with two conference titles and two 10-win seasons. In his head coaching stops at USC, Tennessee and FAU, Kiffin has shown a propensity in helping turn programs around. Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998.

LSU HEAD COACH BRIAN KELLY

Brian Kelly is in his fourth year with the Tigers in 2024 and owns a 317-108-2 career mark and 32-11 record in Baton Rouge. Kelly took over at LSU in 2022 after 12 years and 113 wins at Notre Dame. In his first three years at LSU, Kelly has helped lead the Tigers to at least nine wins every season. Kelly has won at least 10 games in seven of the last eight seasons. Kelly's coaching resume includes a total of 12 seasons with 10 wins at the FBS level (seven at Notre Dame, three at Cincinnati, two at LSU), along with 15 bowl/CFP playoff appearances and three National Coach of the Year honors (2009 at Cincinnati, 2012 and 2018 at Notre Dame). Kelly's record includes a 113-40 mark at Notre Dame, where he's the winningest coach in school history; 34-6 at Cincinnati (4 years), 19-16 at Central Michigan (3 years) and 118-35-2 at Grand Valley State (13 years). He won two Division II National Championships at Grand Valley State and is the winningest active coach in college football.

TIGERS SCOUTING REPORT

LSU enters the week 4-0 overall and is ranked No. 4 in both the AP Top 25 rankings and AFCA Coaches Poll. The Tigers are averaging 391.8 yards of total offense per game, with 275 yards of that coming through the air. The LSU offense is led by fifth-year quarterback Garrett Nussmeier. Nussmeier is completing 69 percent of his passes for 962 yards and six TDs on the season. Wideout Aaron Anderson leads the LSU receiving corps with 21 catches for 293 yards. The strength of the LSU squad four weeks into the 2025 season has been the Tiger defense. No opponent has scored more than 10 points against LSU this year. LSU ranks top-20 nationally in multiple defensive categories, including total defense (246.3 ypg), scoring defense (9.3 ppg) and passes intercepted (6). Linebackers Davhon Keys and West Weeks anchor the LSU defensive unit. Keys and Weeks rank No. 1 and 2 on the team with 30 and 25 total tackles respectively. Dashawn Spears leads an opportunistic Tiger defense with two interceptions on the season.

OLE MISS-LSU SERIES HISTORY

- This game marks the 114th all-time meeting between the Ole Miss Rebels and LSU Tigers dating back to 1894.
- LSU holds a 66-43-4 advantage in the field, including an 11-10-1 record in Oxford.
- LSU is Ole Miss' second-most played opponent behind Mississippi State, which will reach 121 meetings on Nov. 28.
- Since the rivals started playing for the Magnolia Bowl trophy in 2008, LSU holds a 11-5 edge ... Ole Miss' win in 2013 was vacated due to NCAA ruling.
- The home team has won 11 of the last 13 meetings on the field.
- Each of the last two games have been decided on the final play: 2023 Ole Miss win in Oxford (55-49, Daijahn Anthony PBU in the endzone as time expired), 2024 LSU win in Baton Rouge (29-26 in OT, Kyren Lacy receiving TD).
- This will be the 13th all-time meeting with both the Rebels and Tigers simultaneously ranked, the third in a row and only the third since 2016 ... LSU leads 8-4 in such games.
- No. 4 is the highest rating LSU has had in the series since 2019 (No. 1 LSU won 58-37 in Oxford), and the combined AP ranking (17) is the best in the series since 1962 (10; No. 6 Ole Miss beat No. 4 LSU, 15-7, in Baton Rouge).

INSTANT CLASSIC

The Rebels and Tigers put on an explosive show the last time LSU came to Oxford in 2023, with No. 20 Ole Miss winning a wild 55-49 shootout over No. 12 LSU. In front of a then-record crowd of 66,703 and under a full moon at Vaught-Hemingway, it all came down to the final play, with senior Rebel safety Daijahn Anthony breaking up a potential game-winning touchdown pass from LSU quarterback and eventual Heisman Trophy winner, Jayden Daniels, as time expired. Prior to that moment, though, both Ole Miss and LSU combined for one of the largest offensive outputs in conference history and one of the top overall offensive performances in the Rebel record books:

- Ole Miss' 55 points still rank as most scored against an AP ranked team in program history.
- Ole Miss racked up a season-high 706 total yards, still the sixth-most in Ole Miss history and one of five 700-yard games under head coach **Lane Kiffin** ... Ole Miss only had two such games prior to his arrival in 2020.
- First time in school history with 700 yards of total offense, no sacks allowed and no turnovers in the same game.
- Combined 1,343 yards of offense between the Rebels (706) and Tigers (637) still ranks fifth-most in SEC history, the third-most between SEC schools and the most since Ole Miss and Alabama combined for 1,370 in 2020.
- Combined 104 points ranks tied for eighth-most in SEC history in non-OT games, the third-most between SEC opponents and the most since 2020 (111, Ole Miss vs. Alabama).

BIG OPPORTUNITY

No. 11 Ole Miss will be looking to score a top-five win for the second consecutive season for only the fourth time in program history when No. 4 LSU comes to town this weekend. Last fall, then 12th-ranked Ole Miss took down No. 2 Georgia, 28-10, the highest ranked win overall for the Rebels since a win at No. 2 Alabama in 2015 (43-37), the first top-five win in Oxford since a victory in the 2014 Egg Bowl against No. 4 Mississippi State (31-17; later vacated by the NCAA), and the highest ranked win in Oxford since beating No. 1 Alabama in 2014 (23-17; later vacated by the NCAA). The 2024 Rebels were the first non-Alabama team to best Georgia since Florida in 2020, and the 18-point victory was the largest top-five win by a Rebel team since Archie Manning led the Rebels to a 38-0 triumph over No. 3 Tennessee in 1969. A win against LSU on Saturday would mark the fourth all-time for Ole Miss against a top-five Tigers squad, and its first since 1965 (23-0).

The Rebels are off to a 4-0 start for the second consecutive season under head coach **Lane Kiffin**, the first back-to-back occurrences at Ole Miss since 2014 (9-4) and 2015 (10-3). Ole Miss is also on a five-year run of starting at least 3-0, the first such streak since John Vaught did so in seven straight years from 1956-62. When including ties, that unbeaten streak extends to the 1963 season, when the Rebels started 2-0-1.

HOME SWEET HOME

Vaught-Hemingway Stadium has been a safe haven for the Rebels historically, owning a 308-116-8 (.722) record all-time in Oxford before vacated wins (286-113-8), and that's been no different in the **Lane Kiffin** era. Ole Miss is 30-3 in its last 33 home games, and since the beginning of Kiffin's tenure in 2020, the Rebels have gone 30-6 overall at Vaught-Hemingway -- which includes a 14-game home winning streak that spanned Nov. 14, 2020 to Oct. 15, 2022. That streak was among the longest home winning streaks nationally when it was snapped by No. 9 Alabama in 2022. Including a tie to LSU in 1960, the Rebels went unbeaten for 34 games over the course of 12 years (1952-64). Under Kiffin, the Rebels have recorded the first two seven-win home seasons in program history in 2021 and 2023.

HOT AT HOME

Ole Miss has only lost at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium three times since the beginning of the 2021 season and only six times total in the **Lane Kiffin** era. That includes only one loss since the start of the 2023 season. In that span, the Rebels have consistently put on a show for the Ole Miss faithful, welcoming in a grand total of 1,114,735 fans through its turnstiles -- good for a capacity crowd per game average of 65,572.

RACKING UP THE YARDS

Lane Kiffin's dynamic Ole Miss offenses have single-handedly dismantled the Rebel record books, recording four of the top-five and six of the top-10 offensive seasons in school history. Kiffin owns 28 games during his Ole Miss tenure with at least 600 yards of total offense, as opposed to just 19 times total from the beginning of the Ole Miss football program in 1893 until Kiffin's arrival in 2020. At the 700-yard plateau, Kiffin's Rebels own five of the seven total 700-yard games in Ole Miss history, as well as eight of the top-10 performances all-time.

HIGH-FLYING OFFENSE

In the **Lane Kiffin** era, the Rebel offense ranks as the most prolific in the nation, leading the FBS in both yards per game since the beginning of the 2020 season (506.5), as well as total yards (33,431) despite playing six fewer games than Alabama (32,782) and Georgia (32,440). ELITE COMPANY

QB **Trinidad Chambliss** etched his name among some of the most prolific signal-callers in Ole Miss history following his performance against Tulane. Chambliss led the Rebels to a dominant 45-10 victory over the Green Wave, charting 419 yards of total offense after passing for 307 yards and two scores while rushing for 112 yards. Chambliss is only the fourth Ole Miss QB to pass for 300 and rush for 100 in the same game, joining Archie Manning vs. Alabama in 1969 (436 passing, 104 rushing), Chad Kelly vs. Arkansas in 2015 (368 passing, 110 rushing) and Jordan Ta'amu vs. Arkansas in 2018 (387 passing, 141 rushing). Chambliss' 112 rushing yards also made him the first Rebel QB to break the century mark since Jaxson Dart notched 136 yards against Georgia Tech in 2023. Chambliss is the first Rebel QB to throw for at least 300 yards in each of their first two starts since Jordan Ta'amu, who did so in each of his first three starts in 2017.

FIRST START HEROICS

QB **Trinidad Chambliss** earned his first Ole Miss start against Arkansas, where he went 21-of-29 passing for 353 yards and a touchdown while adding 62 rushing yards and two scores on 15 carries. Chambliss' 415 yards of total offense are the most by a Rebel signal caller in their first career start since Jordan Ta'amu set the first-start record at 444 yards against Arkansas in 2017. Chambliss' 353 passing yards were also the most by a Rebel QB in their first start since Ta'amu's 368 in the same game, and his two rushing scores puts him in elite company, joining Archie Manning, Chad Kelly and Ta'amu as the lone Ole Miss QBs to ever do so in a single game alongside 350 passing yards. Earlier this season, injured QB **Austin Simmons** had a similarly impressive debut at 358 yards of offense (341 passing, 17 rushing), which at the time was the most by a Rebel QB in their first start since Shea Patterson's 402 at Texas A&M in 2016 (353 passing, 62 rushing).

FERRIS STATE TO OXFORD

QB **Trinidad Chambliss** came to Ole Miss this offseason from Division II Ferris State, where he led the Bulldogs to a 14-1 campaign and a national title in 2024. In his career between Ferris State and now with the Rebels, Chambliss has 5,492 yards of total offense (3,974 passing, 1,518 rushing) and 66 total touchdowns (35 passing, 31 rushing).

NO DROPOFF

Both Chambliss and QB **Austin Simmons** have two starts under their belts, with Simmons taking the first two before an injury at Kentucky forced Chambliss into the starting role the last two weeks. Both Rebel signal-callers rank as the top-two passers in the SEC in both yards per completion and yards per attempt, leading Ole Miss to the SEC's No. 3 passing offense in both yards per game (324.8) and efficiency (172.5).

CALLING IN THE SOUTHPAW

Austin Simmons is the first Rebel lefty to start at quarterback since Brent Schaeffer, who started 12 games under center for the Rebels across the 2006 and 2007 seasons. Other notable lefties at Ole Miss in the last half-century include Paul Head (1993-96) and Bobby Garner (1976-78).

SIMMONS' TIME TO SHINE

After two years of sitting behind Ole Miss' all-time leading passer, sophomore QB **Austin Simmons** earned his first two career starts against Georgia State and Kentucky. On the year, Simmons is 34-of-56 for 580 yards and four touchdowns. A former consensus four-star recruit out of Miami and a former flamethrower for the Ole Miss baseball team, Simmons began 2025 with nine prior games of experience with 282 yards and two touchdowns passing. But no moment so far has been bigger than his first quarter march down the field against No. 2 Georgia in relief of an injured Jaxson Dart. Simmons went 5-of-6 for 64 yards to match the Bulldogs early, helping keep the Rebels afloat in what turned out to be Ole Miss' biggest top-five win since 1969. Simmons already owns a college degree after graduating with his bachelor's in multi-disciplinary studies this past May, another early completion after graduating high school early to reclassify and enroll at Ole Miss in the fall of 2023.

GROUND GAME

Sophomore **Kewan Lacy** is off to a terrific start as Ole Miss' top rusher, currently leading the SEC and ranking second nationally with seven rushing touchdowns. Those seven scores stand tied for the most by any Rebel rusher through four games in available game-by-game records since at least 1985. On the season, Lacy owns 358 rushing yards on 79 carries, and his 89.5 yards per game rank him fifth in the SEC.

THE PRICE IS WRIGHT

In less than two seasons with the Rebels, TE **Dae'Quan Wright** is already beginning to march up several all-time Ole Miss lists among tight ends. With the Rebels, Wright owns a career line of 35 catches for 607 yards and six touchdowns, and in his overall career when including his first two seasons at Virginia Tech he has 82 receptions for 1,181 yards and those six scores with Ole Miss. This season, Wright leads the SEC and ranks second nationally in yards per catch (26.6), and on the year he has eight catches for 213 yards and two scores -- as well as two of Ole Miss' five 50-yard catches.

SEASONED VET

Senior WR **De'Zhaun Stribling** ranks among the most experienced receivers in the FBS, sitting within the top-20 of the NCAA's active career database in receptions (6th, 170), receiving yards per game (8th, 50.8), receiving yards (6th, 2,285), receiving touchdowns (T-7th, 18), receptions per game (T-14th, 3.78) and yards per catch (19th, 13.4). Stribling has been a top target at two prior stops at Washington State from 2021-22 and Oklahoma State from 2023-24, tallying up 1,073 yards and 10 scores with the Cougars while hauling in 1,080 yards and seven TDs while with the Cowboys.

KING OF SWAT

Senior DT **Zxavian Harris** has been a wrecking ball on special teams his entire career, and after another blocked kick against Georgia State in the opener, he stands on the edge of history as one of the best kick blockers in SEC history. Harris, who had a superb game with 1.5 TFL, 1.0 sack, two QB hurries and his first career interception, got a finger on the Panthers' field goal try during the first quarter -- his sixth career blocked kick across PATs and field goals. One more ties him with Kentucky's Lonnell Dewalt (2004) and Matt Roark (2008-11), who each set the SEC record at seven blocks apiece. On the year, Harris leads all Rebels and ranks fourth in the SEC with 5.0 TFL, while adding and 2.0 sacks and ranking third on the team with 21 tackles. Harris also leads the nation in PFF-rated defensive stops -- tackles that constitute a failure for the offense -- with 13 such tackles.

CARNEIRO FROM DOWNTOWN

Lou Groza Award watch list member **Lucas Carneiro** has stood among the more talented place-kickers nationally across his career, thanks in large part to a near-sterling record on field goal attempts from far away. Across his time at WKU and now at Ole Miss, Carneiro owns a career line of 37-of-42 (88.1 percent) and a perfect 100-of-100 mark on PATs -- which makes him one of only six active FBS kickers to have never missed with at least 100 attempts. But it's from distance where Carneiro really shines, holding a career 9-of-10 mark from 40-49 yards and a 7-of-8 line from 50 yards out -- including a 54-yarder vs. Tulane last week that tied his career long and for sixth-longest in Ole Miss history. This season, Carneiro leads the SEC in both field goals per game (2.5) and total points scored (46). Carneiro has also taken over kickoff duties for the first time in his career, and has done so brilliantly, helping Ole Miss rank third nationally in touchbacks by sending 29 of his 30 kickoffs into the endzone.

Junior LB **Sutarine Perkins** put together a superb sophomore campaign in 2024, ending near the top of the national leader boards with 14.0 tackles for loss and 10.5 sacks -- with the latter ranked tied for the second-most in Ole Miss single-season history. For his efforts, Perkins has been rewarded by a number of preseason accolades, including watch lists for the Lombardi, Bednarik and Nagurski, as well as preseason All-America nods by Walter Camp (second-team), The Sporting News (second-team) and Phil Steele (fourth-team). Perkins currently stands on the edge of the all-time top-10 sacks list at Ole Miss, needing 1.0 to tie Dewayne Dotson for 10th at 15.0 career sacks.

HEAD COACH LANE KIFFIN

Lane Kiffin, one of college football's preeminent offensive minds and well-known personalities, is in his sixth season in charge of the Ole Miss football program in 2025.

Kiffin has led the Rebels to unprecedented heights during his tenure, which has included five consecutive bowl berths (including three wins and two New Year's Six appearances), three 10-win seasons (including the first ever 11-win season and the first two 10-win regular seasons in program history), and several of the most statistically significant campaigns in the storied past of Ole Miss football.

Kiffin's Rebel teams have broken into the national top-10 in at least one poll in each of the last four seasons since 2021, the first streak at Ole Miss since John Vaught's hallowed teams from 1961-64. In that same stretch since 2021, Kiffin has won 43 games, which ranks third among all SEC schools behind Georgia and Alabama, and includes a superb 30-3 home record. Since 2023 alone, Kiffin's teams are 16-1 at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

Kiffin's well-renown prowess on the recruiting trail and in the transfer portal has helped transform Ole Miss into perennial contenders and a hot commodity on the transfer market. The "Portal King" has welcomed in four straight top-six transfer classes according to 247Sports -- including the No. 1 ranked class in 2024 -- as well as five-straight top-25 high school classes per On3.

In 14 seasons at the NCAA level, Kiffin owns an all-time record of 109-52 -- including a 48-18 mark with the Rebels. Kiffin's 48 wins has him third in Ole Miss history, and in 2024 he became the fastest in program history to 40 wins -- doing so in 57 games, three fewer than Vaught. Kiffin (.727) and Vaught (.745) rank as the lone Rebel coaches all-time to have a win percentage of at least .700 (in at least 30 games coached).

Kiffin led the Rebels to a 10-3 mark and a dominant 52-20 Gator Bowl victory over Duke in 2024, marking the first consecutive 10-win campaigns at Ole Miss since 1959-60. The Rebels shattered program records in total yards (6,845), yards per play (7.3), passing yards (4,561), passing yards per game (350.8), sacks (52) and tackles for loss (120), as Ole Miss possessed one of the most dynamic passing attacks in the nation in addition to one of the most powerful rush defenses and pass rush capabilities in the FBS.

The 2024 campaign was simultaneously highlighted by the end of the incredible career of eventual first-round NFL Draft pick quarterback Jaxson Dart, who led the nation in total offense while dismantling several all-time Rebel records, and the stifling Ole Miss defense, which led the nation in both sacks and TFL alongside the best Rebel rush defense since 1966. Defensive tackle Walter Nolen led that defense, ending up as the 14th consensus All-American in program history and the first Rebel selected in the 2025 NFL Draft -- one of a seven-round era record eight Ole Miss draftees taken.

Kiffin's marquee win of the 2024 season was a 28-10 victory over No. 2 Georgia, the highest ranked win for the Rebels since 2015 and the first top-five win and highest ranked win in Oxford since 2014. The 2024 Rebels were the first non-Alabama team to best Georgia since Florida in 2020, and it stands as the largest top-five win by an Ole Miss team since Archie Manning led the Rebels to a 38-0 victory over No. 3 Tennessee in 1969.

Kiffin led the 2023 Rebels to the best season in Ole Miss history in terms of wins, notching an 11-2 overall record capped by a 38-25 Peach Bowl victory over Penn State. Kiffin owns the only two 10-win regular seasons in Ole Miss history, and alongside legendary coach John Vaught, is one of two Rebel coaches with multiple 10-win seasons.

Ole Miss succeeded in 2023 with a balanced attack, finishing within the top-15 in the final FBS ranks in yards per completion (10th, 14.5), passing efficiency (12th, 162.9) and total offense (13th, 461.9), while also leading the nation in fewest turnovers (7) and leading the SEC and ranking fifth nationally in turnover margin (+11). The Rebels finished the year ranked No. 9 in both the AP and Coaches polls, only the second final top-10 ranking by an Ole Miss team since 1969.

The Rebels once again ranked among the top of the nation in multiple offensive statistics in 2022. Ole Miss was No. 3 nationally in rushing offense (256.6) and No. 8 in total offense (496.4). Kiffin helped mentor and recruit talented true freshman running back Quinshon Judkins. Judkins set the Ole Miss single-season record in both rushing yards (1,567) and rushing touchdowns (16).

Kiffin guided the Rebels to a 10-3 record in 2021, the first 10-win regular season in school history that included a perfect 7-0 mark at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium. The Rebels finished the season ranked No. 11 in both the AP and AFCA Coaches Poll, their highest final ranking since 2016.

Kiffin's second year at Ole Miss was once again highlighted by one of college football's most exciting offenses. For the second straight season, the Rebels led the SEC in total offense (492.5 ypg). The Rebel defense ranked as one of the top-five most-improved units in the FBS, allowing 13.6 fewer points per game compared to 2020.

Kiffin quickly turned the Rebels into an offensive machine in 2020. Ole Miss ranked top 20 in the FBS in nine different offensive categories, including having the No. 3 team in the country in total offense, shattering the school record with 555.5 yards per game. Wide receiver Elijah Moore and quarterback Matt Corral were two of the main cogs in the Rebels' high-powered offense.

Moore earned first-team consensus All-America accolades after a historic and shortened 2020 junior season. The Fort Lauderdale, Florida, native hauled in a school record 86 receptions for 1,193 yards and eight touchdowns during his last season in a Rebel uniform. Moore, a Biletnikoff finalist, led the country in receiving yards per game (149.1) and receptions per game (10.8).

Corral became just the fourth SEC player ever to finish as the NCAA leader in total offense per game (384.9), joining Pat Sullivan (1970), Rex Grossman (2001) and Johnny Manziel (2012). The signal-caller also finished No. 5 in passing yards per game (333.7), No. 7 in passing TDs (29), No. 9 in passing efficiency (177.6) and No. 11 in passing yards per completion (14.5).

The Rebels broke the SEC record for total offense in conference games (562.4 ypg), besting LSU's mark of 550.0 yards per game set last season during the Tigers' run to a national title.

The offensive explosion by the Rebels came as no surprise, as Kiffin has shown a propensity in helping turn programs around. In his first seasons at FAU, USC and Tennessee, Kiffin's team improved in win differential (+3.33), scoring (+10.2), passing (+34.5 ypg) and rushing (+51.3 ypg).

In December 2016, Kiffin took over an FAU program that had won a total of nine combined games over the previous three seasons. Kiffin proceeded to take the Owls to new heights over the last three years, including two conference titles and two 10-win seasons.

Kiffin led the Owls to a 10-3 record in 2019, including a 49-6 win over UAB in the Conference USA Championship Game. The Owls led the nation in interceptions (19) and turnovers gained (29). FAU also led C-USA in scoring offense (34.1), red zone offense (0.911), fumbles lost (3) and turnover margin (1.58).

In his first season in Boca Raton, Kiffin started 1-3 but reeled off a program-high 10 consecutive wins to finish the 2017 campaign at 11-3. The Owls' 11 victories were two more than the previous three seasons combined and earned the program votes in national polls. The seven-game improvement tied for the fifth-best turnaround in FBS history.

The Owls captured their second conference title in program history, the first since joining C-USA and first since 2007. FAU remained a perfect 3-0 in bowl play by defeating Akron in the Boca Raton Bowl, 50-3.

Kiffin joined the FAU Owls after three seasons at the University of Alabama, where he served as the Tide's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He was a finalist for the Frank Broyles Award in 2014, which goes to the country's best assistant coach.

His final season with the Tide, Kiffin mentored Jalen Hurts, the first freshman to start at quarterback in head coach Nick Saban's career. Hurts finished 13-1 as the starting QB and guided Alabama to an SEC title and to the National Championship game. Hurts was a Freshman All-American, the SEC Offensive Player of the Year and the SEC Freshman of the Year.

In 2015, Kiffin oversaw the development of quarterback Jake Coker, who finished his career 14-0 as a starter at Alabama and led the nation in completion percentage over the final 10 games of the season at 72.2 percent. Coker threw for 3,110 yards with 21 touchdowns, which ranked as the second-most passing yards in school history. On the ground, Kiffin fed Heisman Trophy running back Derrick Henry the ball a school-and SEC-record 395 times for a record 2,219 yards and 23 touchdowns.

One of Kiffin's first responsibilities at Alabama was identifying and then developing quarterback Blake Sims in 2014. Kiffin oversaw Sims' rise to the top of the Alabama depth chart en route to a school-record 3,487 passing yards while completing 64.5 percent of his passes. Sims was selected second-team All-SEC, named to the Senior Bowl, tabbed as a finalist for the Manning Award and a semifinalist for the Davey O'Brien Award.

He spent the previous three-plus seasons as the head coach at Southern California, where he compiled a record of 28-15. Kiffin's 2012 USC squad went 7-6 overall and 5-4 in the Pac-12 South, good for second place. Wide receiver Marquise Lee was a unanimous first team All-American and won the Biletnikoff Award while also being named the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year.

Prior to his tenure at Southern California, Kiffin served as the head coach at Tennessee in 2009. He led the Volunteers to a second-place finish in the SEC East and an appearance in the Chick-fil-A Bowl.

Prior to his first head coaching job, Kiffin spent six years as an assistant coach for Pete Carroll at Southern California, including two years as the offensive coordinator (2005-06). Kiffin was promoted to passing game coordinator in 2004 and helped Matt Leinart win the Heisman Trophy as he passed for 3,322 yards with 33 touchdowns and just six interceptions.

Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998.

Kiffin attended Bloomington Jefferson High in Bloomington, Minnesota, where he played football, basketball and baseball. He has two daughters, Landry and Presley, and one son, Knox.

OXFORD, Miss. — No. 15 Ole Miss football overcame a couple of early miscues to turn in a dominant 63-7 victory over Georgia State to open its 2025 season on Saturday night at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

The Georgia State pass rush caused a pair of early interceptions to keep the game close in the opening half, but Ole Miss kept its foot on the gas to come away with a decisive win to start 1-0 for the fifth straight season. The Rebels became the first team in SEC history to score 60-plus points in three consecutive season-openers.

Lane Kiffin's squad outgained Georgia State 695-260, including a 400-69 advantage through the air. Ole Miss totaled 33 first downs in the victory, including an 8-for-13 mark on third downs, while the Rebel defense held Georgia State to 2-for-15 on third downs.

Austin Simmons finished 20-for-31 for 341 yards with three touchdowns and two interceptions in his first career start. Harrison Wallace III led the receiving corps with 130 yards and a touchdown on five catches, while tight ends Dae'Quan Wright and Caleb Odom each scored, combining for eight catches and 135 yards. Kewan Lacy broke the century mark on the ground and found the end zone three times in his Rebel debut, going 108 yards on 16 carries.

TJ Dottery led the Rebel defense with nine tackles, including a shared tackle for loss, and broke up one pass. Zxavian Harris had a monster day, totaling five tackles, including a sack, with an interception and two pass breakups. Jaden Yates finished second behind Dottery with eight tackles in his Rebel debut.

LEXINGTON, Ky. — No. 14 Ole Miss football had a slow start in its SEC opener at Kentucky, but Lane Kiffin and the Rebels found their way and left Kroger Field with a 30-23 road win to open conference play.

It was the fourth win for the Rebels in the last five meetings vs. Kentucky.

A couple of early interceptions helped Kentucky jump out to a 10-0 lead, but Ole Miss responded with two of its three rushing touchdowns on the afternoon to go on top. The Rebels never trailed from there, fending off the Wildcats thanks to a late rushing score by Austin Simmons and three Lucas Carneiro field goals.

Ole Miss outgained Kentucky 455-354, including a 220-yard day on the ground for the visitors. The Rebels were a perfect 5-for-5 in red zone scoring and logged three sacks, while the Wildcats had zero.

Austin Simmons finished 13-for-24 through the air, with 279 total yards, one rushing touchdown and two interceptions. Kewan Lacy had a monster day, rushing for 138 yards and a score on 28 carries. Both Lacy and Harrison Wallace III had consecutive 100-yard performances to start their Rebel careers. Wallace hauled in four passes for a team-high 117 yards.

TJ Dottery, Jaden Yates and Zxavian Harris tied atop the Rebel tackle sheet with six apiece, with Harris notching a sack for the second straight game. Princewill Umanmielen had a team-high two tackles for loss, including a sack. Will Echoles logged a sack as part of his three total tackles. Ole Miss broke up six passes on the afternoon, including two by Wydett Williams Jr.

OXFORD, Miss. — A game that began with a wild flurry of offense ended with a crucial defensive play as No. 13 Ole Miss football held off an Arkansas comeback attempt to win 41-35 and improve to 2-0 in SEC play just three weeks into the 2025 college football season.

The two SEC rivals combined for nine straight scoring drives in the first half, 997 yards of total offense and 53 first downs. But the shootout came down to a defensive stop in the end as TJ Dottery forced a fumble in the final minutes to halt the Razorback comeback.

Special teams proved to be crucial as well, as Ole Miss kicker Lucas Carneiro finished 2-for-2 on field goal attempts, while Arkansas was 0-for-2, ultimately spelling the difference in a six-point game.

Trinidad Chambliss was outstanding in his first Ole Miss start, going 21-for-29 passing with 415 total yards and three touchdowns. Harrison Wallace III once again led the receiving corps with six catches for 92 yards and a touchdown, just eight yards shy of his third straight 100-yard game to start the season. Kewan Lacy had a strong day out of the backfield with 84 all-purpose yards and a rushing touchdown.

Suntarine Perkins led the Ole Miss defense with nine tackles on the night, including one for a loss, as well as one QB hurry. TJ Dottery tallied eight tackles, broke up one pass and forced a fumble. Wydet Williams Jr. recovered that fumble and broke up a pass in addition to six tackles. Zxavian Harris notched five total tackles, including one for a loss and added a pass breakup. Will Echoles had a team-high two QB hurries to go with four tackles.



GAME FOUR #11 OLE MISS 45, TULANE 10

OXFORD, Miss. — A high-powered offensive attack paired with a stagnate defense guided No. 11 Ole Miss to a dominant 45-10 win on Saturday afternoon to improve to 4-0 for the second year in a row.

The Rebels dropped 548 offensive yards on the Green Wave, who only mustered 282 against a defense on fire. Tulane became the second team this season to not surpass the 300-yard plateau against Ole Miss, joining Georgia State. Two Tulane quarterbacks combined for only 104 yards on 10-for-29 passing as they struggled to find a rhythm with their receivers. Tulane went 0-for-3 on fourth down attempts, all halting momentum for the Green Wave and setting up Ole Miss for good field position.

Trinidad Chambliss once again shined behind center, going 17-for-27 with a pair of touchdowns. He eclipsed 400 yards of total offense for the second week in a row with 307 yards in the air and 112 on the ground. Chambliss became just the fourth Ole Miss QB ever to have 300 yards passing and 100 yards rushing in a single game. Deuce Alexander paced the Rebel receivers with four receptions for 94 yards, an overall career-high for the sophomore. His fourth quarter touchdown was his first in an Ole Miss uniform and effectively put the game away for the Rebels.

Kewan Lacy reached the endzone twice for the Rebels, his second multi-touchdown career game of the season as he increased his season total to seven through four games.

Linebacker Jaden Yates became the first Rebel defender this season to reach double-digit tackles in a game this season. His 11 tackles led Ole Miss' dominant defense, which had five tackles for loss in the game. Will Echoles had a career-high eight tackles and had an impressive pass breakup in the first quarter for the first of his career.
