## On The Break

- The 2025-26 season represents the 51st season of LSU Women's Basketball. From reaching the AIAW National Championship in LSU's second season to reaching five straight Final Fours to winning the program's first national championship in 2023, LSU has re-established itself as a premier women's basketball school through its first 50 seasons.
- Coach Kim Mulkey returns for her fifth season leading LSU. In her first four seasons, she has led the Tigers to the NCAA Tournament all four years, including three-straight Elite Eight runs and the Tigers' first national title. Mulkey has won 754 games throughout her head coaching career with 122 coming during her time in Baton Rouge. LSU has become must-watch and the Pete Maravich Assembly Center has seen season-long attendance records set in three of her four seasons. LSU finished the 2024-25 season with 212,144 fans walking through the Maravich Center doors. LSU's attendance numbers have ranked in the Top-10 nationally all four seasons of Coach Mulkey's tenure.
- In 2025-26, LSU returns key contributors in First-Team All-SEC duo Flau'jae Johnson and Mikaylah Williams alongside important role players who logged impactful minutes in Kailyn Gilbert and Jada Richard from the Tigers' third-straight Elite Eight squad.
- LSU brought in eight new players, including a trio of transfer portal additions (MiLaysia Fulwiley, Kate Koval, Amiya Joyner) and the unanimous No. 1 freshman recruiting class (Divine Bourrage, Bella Hines, ZaKiyah Johnson, Grace Knox, and Meghan Yarnevich) across all recruiting services.
- LSU is coming off a 148-46 exhibition victory over Mississippi College in the Maravich Center on October 23. The Tigers shot 68.2 percent from the floor on 58-of-85 shooting, shot nearly 50 percent from 3-point range (10-of-22), and were a solid 22-of-28 at the free throw line. The Tigers outrebounded the Choctaws, 62-12, and the home team was able to grab 20 offensive boards in the process. Freshman guard ZaKiyah Johnson finished with a double-double after leading the team with 25 points (12-of-13) and 10 rebounds, half of them coming on the offensive glass. Seven players finished with double-digit points (5 of the 7 were newcomers).
- In the preseason, LSU was picked to finish third in the league standings for the media poll and coaches poll, which were released on Oct. 14 and Oct. 22, respectively. LSU's Flau'jae Johnson received two nods to the All-SEC First Team by both contingents, while Mikaylah Williams was named to the second team by the media and first team by the SEC coaches. Newcomer MiLaysia Fulwiley, who transferred to Baton Rouge from Dawn Staley's South Carolina program, was named to the All-SEC Second Team in the coaches poll.
- LSU will play 18 nationally televised games this season, including the marquee matchup on Valentine's Day against South Carolina on ABC. LSU will play the Gamecocks on a Saturday in February, marking the first time LSU has played a game on Saturday since 2005 when the Tigers defeated No. 17 Georgia, 76-52, as the top-ranked team in the country.
- Flau'jae Johnson ranks 13th all-time in career points at LSU. She has amassed 1,565 points over three seasons. She eclipsed 1,500 points against San Diego State in the first round of the 2025 NCAA Tournament. LSU legends Joyce Walker (2,906) and Seimone Augustus (2,702) hold the top two spots in program history. Johnson needs just 117 points to jump into LSU's top 10.

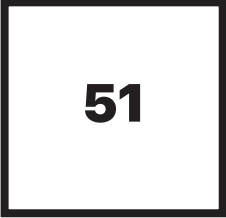

LSU Hosts Langston in the PMAC for Exhibition No. 2

LSU women's basketball will return to the Pete Maravich Assembly Center on Thursday when the Tigers host Langston at 7 p.m. CT for the program's final exhibition game prior to the start of the 2025-26 season. The LSU-Langston exhibition game is free for fans to attend inside the Maravich Center. Fans can listen to the action on the LSU Sports Radio Network with Patrick Wright and Shaeeta Williams on the radio call. The contest can also be streamed on SEC Network + as a simulcast with Wright and Williams calling the game. LSU will host Houston Christian on Tuesday, November 4 for the regular-season opener inside the PMAC. Individual game tickets are available for purchase at LSUtix.net. Coach Kim Mulkey enters her fifth season leading the Tigers' basketball program and is coming off a third consecutive Elite Eight appearance at LSU. Mulkey's fifth-ranked Tigers in the AP Preseason Poll are led by First-Team All-SEC duo from a season ago, Flau'jae Johnson and Mikaylah Williams who are joined by 8 newcomers (5 freshmen, 3 transfers) and three other returners from last year's squad.

51 Seasons of LSU Women's Basketball

The start of the 2025-26 season marks the 51st season of LSU Women's Basketball. Here are some noteworthy points throughout the program's history:

- In just its second season, LSU played for the 1977 AIAW National Championship
- From 2004-2008 LSU reached 5 consecutive Final Fours. LSU and UConn are the only programs in women's basketball history to ever make at least five straight Final Fours.
- When LSU won its first National Championship in 2023, the Tigers did so by scoring a NCAA Championship Game record 102 points
- LSU is the only WBB program in which three of its head coaches are in the Basketball Hall of Fame (also the only program with three in women's basketball HOF): Kim Mulkey, Van Chancellor and Sue Gunter. Former LSU star and first-year assistant coach Seimone Augustus went in to both Halls of Fame most recently on staff and former LSU player Sylvia Fowles was enshrined into both in 2025.

LSU Downs Mississippi College With 100-Plus Point Margin of Victory in Exhibition No. 1

LSU is coming off a 148-46 exhibition victory over Mississippi College in the Maravich Center on October 23. The Tigers shot 68.2 percent from the floor on 58-of-85 shooting, shot nearly 50 percent from 3-point range (10-of-22), and were a solid 22-of-28 at the free throw line. The Tigers outrebounded the Choctaws, 62-12, and the home team was able to grab 20 offensive boards in the process. Freshman guard ZaKiyah Johnson finished with a double-double after leading the team with 25 points (12-of-13) and 10 rebounds, half of them coming on the offensive glass. Johnson also had one block and one steal in the game. In addition to Johnson, six other Tigers scored in double figures, including junior guard MiLaysia Fulwiley (17), junior guard Mikaylah Williams (16), senior forward Amiya Joyner (15), freshman guard Bella Hines (14), freshman forward Kate Koval (14) and senior guard Kailyn Gilbert (13). Five of the seven players who scored in double figures were newcomers in the program. LSU's 148 points in the exhibition game was the most during Coach Kim Mulkey's tenure (exhibition or not), surpassing a 2023 regular-season win against McNeese when the Tigers scored 133 points. The most points scored in an exhibition with Mulkey at the helm came against Langston in the 2023-24 preseason prior to LSU's victory over the Choctaws.

Flau'Jae Johnson's Multifaceted Stardom

Entering her senior season at LSU, Flau'Jae Johnson has seen her profile grow astronomically since she came to Baton Rouge. One of the few players to stay at an institution for all four years in the transfer portal era, Johnson's talent on the basketball court isn't the only facet of her life that is commendable. Along with showing talent in sport, she is also a talented rapper. The 2023 SEC Freshman of the Year, 2023 National Champion, 2024 Second Team All-SEC, and 2025 First-Team All-SEC hooper saw her music brand pop over the summer of 2024, in which she featured Lil Wayne on one of her songs. The video for "Came Out A Beast" has over 3-million views on YouTube and it was featured as one of the NFL's songs of the season which can be heard on Sundays leading games into commercial breaks. She was also named the BET's inaugural Culture Class last year, which features prominent figures across entertainment. Prior to this season, Johnson released a few new singles including "Remember When" and "Courtside" featuring well-known rapper Waka Flaka Flame on the song.

LSU's Eight Newcomers

Amiya Joyner | Senior | Forward

Played three seasons at East Carolina before transferring to LSU ... The 6-2 forward averaged 12.8 points and 9.6 rebounds per game as a First Team All-AAC player ... Comes to LSU with 41 career double-doubles ... Has a versatile interior game that will stretch defenses with her ability to play with her back to the basket as well as facing up ... Has an impressive knack for rebounding ... Owns three of the top five rebounding seasons in ECU history and her 905 career rebounds are the fourth most in program history ... She is one of two players in ECU history with multiple 20-rebound games and ranks No. 4 in program history with 132 blocks.

Grace Knox | Freshman | Forward

Gifted 6-2 forward from Las Vegas, Nev., with a special ability to rebound ... Her tenacity on the boards combined with her all-around skill set creates a tough matchup ... Member of the Tigers' No. 1 recruiting class ... Rated No. 6 by ESPN, No. 13 by On3, No. 15 by Prospects Nation, No. 11 by 247 Sports, and No. 7 by the Collegiate Girls Basketball Report ... Prepped at Spring Valley HS in Las Vegas during her freshman season before transferring to Etiwanda HS in Los Angeles ... As a freshman, she averaged 13.9 points and 9.8 rebounds to help lead her team to the NIAA 5A semifinals ... After missing her sophomore season with an injury, she averaged 17.2 points and 11.9 rebounds as a junior, leading Etiwanda HS to a national championship and the California Open Division So-Cal Region California State Championship ... During her senior season, she averaged a double-double and averaged four blocks a game ... Named a McDonald's All-American and played in the Nike Hoop Summit

Bella Hines | Freshman | Guard

A 5-10 combo guard from Albuquerque, N.M. ... Named Player of the Year in New Mexico for two consecutive years ... Made 84 appearances throughout her entire high school career ... Member of the Tigers' No. 1 recruiting class ... Rated No. 30 by ESPN, No. 24 by On3, No. 26 by Prospects Nation, No. 24 by 247Sports, and No. 35 by Collegiate Girls Basketball Report ... During her junior season at Eldorado HS, she surpassed 2,000 career points, averaging 32.5 points, 6.0 rebounds, and 2.0 assists per game ... Showcased her impressive scoring ability when she scored 50+ points in back-to-back games and broke the Grind Session single-game scoring record with 53 ... Over her entire prep career, she averaged 28.6 points, 6.5 rebounds, and 1.6 assists per game ... In her junior season, she ranked in the top 11 nationally for three-pointers made (138) and points per game (32.5) ... She held the top spot in New Mexico and Division 5A for three-pointers made (138), FG made (321), FT made (208), and points per game (32.5) ... In the 3,000 point club with fellow LSU freshman ZaKiyah Johnson ... Hines finished her prep career with 3,170 points ... MaxPreps' compiled list of top scorers who played in the 2024-25 season places her 10th in the

In her four seasons, the 5-9 guard collected four KHSAA state championships, four Gatorade Player of the Year honors, and earned a gold medal with the Team USA U18 FIBA Women's AmeriCup team ... Member of the Tigers' No. 1 recruiting class ... Rated No. 13 by ESPN, No. 4 by On3, No. 4 by Prospects Nation, No. 12 by 247Sports, and No. 8 by Collegiate Girls Basketball Report ... Johnson was awarded MaxPreps' Kentucky Player of the Year honor four years in a row ... She finished her prep career with 149 games played and averaged 20.1 points, 7.7 rebounds, and 3.7 assists per game ... On Feb. 3, 2025, she recorded her 500th career assist making her the only player in Sacred Heart Academy history to have 2,000 points, 1,000 rebounds and 500 career assists ... On Dec. 17, 2024, Johnson set the career scoring record at SHA surpassing Crystal Kelly ('04) with 2,381 points at SHA ... On Jan. 30, 2024, she had a triple double with 13 points, 11 rebounds, 11 assists ... In the 3,000-point club with fellow LSU freshman Bella Hines ... Johnson finished her prep career with 3,870 points ... MaxPreps' compiled list of top scorers who played in the 2024-25 season places her sixth in the nation

**Kate Koval | Sophomore | Forward (pronounced coe-vahl)**  
A 6-5 forward that possesses the skill, physicality, and passion to make an immediate impact on the Tigers' program ... Enters her first season at LSU and second season in collegiate women's basketball ... Has played in 32 games and started in 10 ... Through one season, she has averaged 5.3 points, 4.7 rebounds, and 1.7 blocks per game ... Transfer from Notre Dame

**Meghan Yarnevich | Freshman | Forward (pronounced yarr-nuh-vitch)**  
A 6-2 forward with a physical presence and relentless toughness in the frontcourt ... Possesses the ability to be dominant on the inside both offensively and defensively with her size and touch around the rim ... A four-star, top-100 prospect according to Prospects Nation, ASGR and Dan Olson ... Finished her high school career at the Bullis School ... Throughout her prep career, she led teams to multiple state semifinals, including the 2023 Maryland State Championship when she played at Howard High School ... Became the fifth member of the Tigers' No. 1 recruiting class ... In 48 games played at the Bullis School, she averaged a double-double with 12.2 points and 10.3 rebounds a game ... Also recorded 1.8 assists per game.

**MiLaysia Fulwiley | Junior | Guard (pronounced my-LAY-zhu)**  
A game changing 5-10 guard ... One of the nation's most creative offensive players ... Came off the bench in all but three of her 77 appearances with the Gamecocks, averaging 11.7 points, 2.9 rebounds, 2.1 assists and 1.6 steals in her two seasons ... Through her first two seasons in college, Fulwiley has been a key piece on two Final Four teams, including the 2024 NCAA Championship.

**International Success for Preseason All-SEC Trio**  
The Preseason All-SEC trio in Flau'jae Johnson, Mikaylah Williams, and MiLaysia Fulwiley each competed for the United States in international basketball competitions throughout the summer.

Johnson earned her first gold medal on the international stage Sunday as the United States basketball team defeated Brazil, 92-84, at the FIBA Women's AmeriCup in Santiago, Chile. She made her debut in USA Basketball competition and was a part of a squad consisting of 12 collegiate players. Team USA went a perfect 7-0, and Johnson averaged 4.3 points, 3.3 rebounds, and one assist per game. Johnson's top performance occurred in the quarterfinal round against the Dominican Republic on July 4. She finished with 22 points, seven rebounds, and two assists. Johnson became the ninth USA player to record 20-plus points in an AmeriCup game with her defining performance the key to advancing the United States to the semifinal round.

Williams, a mainstay on the summer 3x3 circuit, was announced Wednesday on the USA Basketball 3x3 Women's Series roster which will begin May 23-24 in Marseille, France. Williams helped USA earn three straight FIBA 3x3 U18 gold medals from 2021-23. The 2022 USA Basketball 3x3 Athlete of the Year and 2023 USA Basketball 3x3 Female Athlete of the Year, Williams has continually made an impact for her home country. Last summer, Williams competed in the FIBA 3x3 Nations League Americas Conference, a series of qualifying tournaments for the 2024 FIBA 3x3 U23 World Cup. She and the U23 team also played in a 3x3 exhibition game at the 2024 WNBA All-Star Game against the USA 3x3 Olympic team.

Fulwiley helped Team USA to the FIBA 3x3 Nations League Championship Sunday in Punta Arenas, Chile. Fulwiley, a game-changing 5-10 guard, competed in the 2025 FIBA 3x3 Nations League Americas Conference. Team USA claimed victory in the week-long event on July 27. Fulwiley played in five of the six stops with the United States winning four of the six over the course of the event. She participated in 14 games and averaged 4.1 points per contest.

**Assistant Coach Seimone Augustus**  
In May of 2024, Coach Kim Mulkey announced the addition of Seimone Augustus as an assistant coach at LSU. Augustus led LSU to national relevance as one of the best teams in the nation during her playing days at LSU. She brought the Tigers to three consecutive Final Fours – beginning a stretch of five consecutive LSU Final Four appearances – before becoming the No. 1 overall pick in the 2006 WNBA Draft. She went on to win four WNBA titles and three Olympic Gold Medals with Team USA. In 2010, Augustus became the first female student-athlete in LSU to have her jersey retired and in 2023 she became the first female student-athlete in school history to receive a statue on campus.

**Fifth Straight Season LSU Ranked Inside Top-10**  
LSU enters the 2025-26 season ranked No. 5 in the AP Poll. It will mark the fifth consecutive season in which the Tigers have been ranked inside the top-10 at any point. The Tigers' highest ranking a season ago was No. 4 against UL-Lafayette after defeating Stanford in a dramatic OT comeback, 94-88, for the ACC/SEC Challenge. LSU peaked at the No. 1 spot to end the 2022-23 season and to begin the 2023-24 season. In Mulkey's first season leading LSU in 2021-22 the Tigers' best ranking was No. 6. The streak of five consecutive seasons with time spent inside the top-10 is the second longest in program history. LSU had six straight seasons from 2002-08 that LSU spent time in the top-10.

**20 Win Seasons For Kim Mulkey**  
In Coach Mulkey's 25 seasons as a head coach, her teams have won 20+ games every year of her career. Spending 15 seasons as an assistant at LA Tech, she has won 20+ games in all but one season in her 40-year coaching career. Mulkey won 30+ games in all four seasons that she was a player at Louisiana Tech. She has 12 30+ win seasons, including one 40-0 season. She has only lost 10+ games twice in her 25-year head coaching career.

The PMAC Is The Place to Be

In each of Coach Mulkey's first three seasons as LSU's head coach, a season-long attendance record has been set in the PMAC for women's basketball: 2021-22: 112,983 2022-23: 148,468 2023-24: 220,932 The final home regular season game in the 2022-23 season against Mississippi had an attendance of 15,721, setting the record for the largest PMAC crowd ever, regardless of sport. In the 2024-25 season, LSU amassed 212,144 fans in attendance at games in the Maravich Center. LSU ranked second in the country for overall attendance behind South Carolina.

Kim Mulkey Became Quickest Coach To 750 Wins vs. Kentucky Last Season

LSU trailed Kentucky by as many as 16 points in the second quarter and were down by 12 points at halftime, but the Tigers rallied in the second half with a 65-58 win. LSU outscored Kentucky by 17 in the third quarter to surge ahead and claim the lead. The fourth quarter was tight and LSU held a one-point lead with under a minute remaining when Mikaylah Williams knocked down a three that helped clinch the victory. The win marked the 750th victory for Coach Kim Mulkey, doing so in 870 games with a .862 winning percentage at the time. She was the fastest coach in NCAA DI history - men's or women's - to reach both 600 and 700 victories. She is on track to be the quickest to 800 too.

A Position Focused On NIL

As the era of Name, Image, and Likeness continues to evolve within collegiate athletics, head coach Kim Mulkey announced on the one-year anniversary of NIL that Jennifer Roberts would take on a first-of-its-kind role in women's college basketball as LSU Women's Basketball's Director of Player Personnel and Influence. In this role, Roberts helps players within the program develop their personal brands, make informed decisions, and maximize their NIL opportunities. Roberts works closely with the NILSU staff to enhance branding opportunities and to ensure each women's basketball player at LSU has the opportunity to grow their brands to the fullest potential.

A LSU Collection Of Hall of Fame Coaches

LSU is the only women's basketball program with three coaches in the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame. Sue Gunter was inducted in the Class of 2005, Van Chancellor in the Class of 2007 and Kim Mulkey in the Class of 2020. Gunter coached for 22 seasons (1982-2004) at LSU and put together a 442-221 record. She led LSU to 14 NCAA Tournaments, including its first Final Four in her final season. Chancellor coached at LSU from 2007-11 and compiled a 90-40 record. He was also the head coach of the first WNBA Dynasty in the Houston Comets where he earned three WNBA Coach of the Year honors and won the league's first four titles. Although she was a part of the 2020 class, Mulkey was not inducted into the Naismith Hall of Fame until May 2021 (due to COVID), just a month after being named the head coach at LSU. In her first season in Baton Rouge, she led the greatest turnaround by a first-year head coach in SEC history and earned her third AP National Coach of the Year award. Mulkey led her second team at LSU to a national championship, the first in program history. Through four seasons, she has compiled a 122-20 record in Baton Rouge and her career record has ballooned to 754-124 - a winning percentage of 85.9%. Geno Auriemma, Muffet McGraw and Mulkey are the only three coaches with three AP National Coach of the Year honors.

The Dream Team

The Dream Team is the LSU Women's Basketball practice team that is comprised of male students at LSU. The Dream Team is designed to go up against the Tigers every day in practice to help push the team while allowing practices to run efficiently.

Fast Break Club

The Fast Break Club is the LSU Women's Basketball Booster Club that is designed to help the Tigers achieve both on and off the court. It gives fans an opportunity to feel like they are a part of the program with monthly luncheons during the season that Coach Mulkey speaks at. The Fast Break Club has had over 500 members at its peak.

Coach Kim Mulkey's 10 Steps to Victory

Coach Kim Mulkey's success throughout her coaching career has not come without a consistency in mindset and performance. At the Tigers' Welcome Back Event, Mulkey revealed to the Fast Break Club, the Official Booster Club of LSU Women's Basketball, the 10 steps to victory. The first 7 have never changed in Mulkey's 25 years coaching, while the last three always apply differently to each Mulkey-coached team.

- 1. When you put on your tennis shoes, perform
- 2. Be on time
- 3. Tell the truth
- 4. You must excel at playing defense
- 5. Emphasize rebounding and defense
- 6. Attend class and perform in class
- 7. Believe in something bigger than yourself to remain grounded
- 8. Become the best conditioned team in the nation
- 9. Practice like champions
- 10. All In, All Year

# Kim Mulkey Is A Champion

In four seasons since returning to Louisiana, Kim Mulkey has brought LSU back to national prominence as one of the premier programs in the country.

Mulkey and the Tigers have recorded three consecutive 30-win seasons and three straight Elite Eight appearances, including the National Championship in 2023. It has become one of the most exciting programs across America, with top notch attendance records, driven by an energetic fan base.

Less than two years after Mulkey returned to Louisiana to do good and be a positive figure in her home state as the head coach for the LSU Women's Basketball team, the Hall-of-Famer Mulkey delivered the program's first National Championship to Baton Rouge in 2023.

The Tigers were dominant en route to their first national championship, compiling a 34-2 record, including a perfect 17-0 record at home in the PMAC. LSU defeated Iowa in Dallas for the national championship, 102-85, setting the record for points in a championship game. The championship game drew 9.9 million viewers across ABC and ESPN networks to set the record for the most watched women's college basketball game of all-time.

The Tigers averaged 82.3 points per game throughout the championship season to rank No. 5 in the nation. Scoring 100 points in each of the first five games of the season, LSU tied the NCAA record. The only other team to score 100+ points in five straight games was the 1981-82 Louisiana Tech team that featured Mulkey leading the team as the point guard. LSU set the program record for 100-point games in a season with their sixth in the final game of the season.

Mulkey, the most successful player-turned-coach in college basketball history, was named head coach of the LSU women's basketball team on April 25, 2021.

It did not take Coach Mulkey long to have success at LSU, winning the AP National Coach of the Year award after leading the greatest turnaround in SEC history by a first-year head coach. Coach Mulkey joined Geno Auriemma and Muffet McGraw as the only coaches to earn the AP Coach of the Year award three times. Taking over a team that had won nine games the previous season, Mulkey's first LSU team finished 26-6, in second place in the SEC and the Tigers hosted first- and second-round games in the NCAA Tournament as a No. 3 seed.

Mulkey, who also won an Olympic Gold Medal in 1984, is the only person in college basketball history – men's or women's – to win national championships as a head coach, assistant coach and a player. She's one of just three coaches (Bobby Knight and Dean Smith) in college basketball history to win national titles as a player and a coach.

A native of Tickfaw, La., Mulkey came to Baton Rouge as the most accomplished head coaching hire in LSU history. She returned to Louisiana as a six-time national champion and nine-time Hall of Famer and most recently was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in May of 2021.
