4th Year at LSU · 11th Year as a Head Coach

LSU Coach Matt McMahon has built his program around five core values that define his approach both on and off the court: hard work, unselfishness, toughness, accountability and joy.

Those values were among the first principles he shared when introduced as the 25th head coach in program history on March 22, 2022, and they continue to guide every aspect of LSU Basketball today.

Now entering his fourth season at the helm, Coach McMahon leads a Tigers team energized by a strong recruiting class that blends proven transfers with talented freshmen. The 2025-26 squad is poised to build on the foundation laid in recent years, with an emphasis on chemistry, relentless effort, and steady progress.

This current group thrives on its chemistry, playing for each other with toughness, accountability, and an unselfish spirit. Their joy for the game is evident every time they take the floor, uniting players, coaches, and fans alike.

Guided by those five core principles, the Tigers have continued to strengthen the program's foundation, setting the stage for growth in 2025-26. With added talent and depth at all positions, this year's roster is built to take the next step forward.

Player development remains a cornerstone in the Matt McMahon LSU basketball program.

Robert Miller III enters his sophomore season ready to build on flashes of promise from his freshman year. Over the summer, Miller has committed himself to individual skill development and strength training to add both power and polish his game.

Jalen Reed returns for his redshirt junior season after an early December ACL injury cut short what had been a breakout year. Known for his drive and work ethic, Reed attacked his rehab this summer showing steady progress toward a full return.

The summer has given new players valuable time to work closely with the coaching staff and strength and conditioning coach Mike Chatman, focusing on improving their skills and physical readiness for the long season ahead.

The program has already shown it can take measurable steps forward under Matt McMahon's leadership. In 2024, LSU advanced to postseason play after back-to-back wins over No. 11 South Carolina, 64-63, in Columbia and then a 75-74 win over No. 17 Kentucky in BR.

Last season, LSU showed what it was capable of, beating Florida State in its SEC/ACC Challenge game, winning a triple-overtime win at the Greenbrier over UCF, a road victory at Kansas State, and an amazing rally in the final minute to win at Oklahoma.

McMahon's track record of building winning cultures was firmly established during his seven seasons at Murray State. Coach McMahon led the Racers to a record of 154-67 (.697) including: 93 OVC regular season wins, winning 75 percent of league games.

During his tenure, he has also coached multiple all-Americans and all-conference players. The most notable was Ja Morant, who went on to become the 2020 NBA Rookie of the Year.

Under McMahon the Racers won regular season league titles in 2018, 2019, 2020 and 2022 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2018, 2019 and 2022.

In his final season at Murray State in 2021-22, McMahon coached OVC Player of the Year KJ Williams and two other first-teamers (Tevin Brown, Justice Hill). In addition, McMahon was named the league's Coach of the Year.

McMahon's Racers, in 2021-22, were just the sixth team in league history to go undefeated. Murray State then won the league tournament to advance to the NCAA Tournament where the Racers defeated San Francisco in the opening round.

The 2021-22 team was one of seven teams to win 30 or more games that season and led the nation in win percentage at 91.2 percent.

The 2018-19 team won 28 games and made its mark in the NCAA Tournament when the 12th-seeded Racers won their fourth all-time tourney game over No. 5 seed Marquette.

Morant that year was named the OVC POY, leading Division I in assists and earning first-team All-America honors. In the NCAA Tournament win over Marquette, Morant posted a triple double of 17 points, 11 rebounds and 16 assists as he became the eighth player to record a triple double in the tournament.

He was drafted second overall in the 2019 NBA draft by the Memphis Grizzlies.

Prior to being named head coach, he was a key part of Coach Steve Prohm's staff as assistant at Murray State as the Racers won a pair of Ohio Valley Conference championships, a CollegeInsider.

com Tournament championship and an appearance in the NIT. He was part of a staff that won 104 games from 2011-15.

PRIOR TO MURRAY STATE

Coach McMahon has had success in college basketball since his days as a player at

Appalachian State.

Known as an excellent shooter and tough competitor, he played on three Southern Conference regular season title teams in 1998, 1999 and 2000. He earned All-Tournament honors in 1999. The Mountaineers won the SoCon Tournament in 2000 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

He played in 117 career games under coach Buzz Peterson and made 135 three-pointers, graduating in 2000.

His coaching career began immediately at Appalachian State as assistant under Houston Fancher in 2000-01. He would rejoin Peterson's staff as a graduate assistant coach at Tennessee before returning to ASU in 2002 as assistant and later associate head coach, where he stayed until the end of the 2009-10 season. A year at UNC Wilmington (2010-11) as assistant coach set the stage for his journey to Murray State, starting first as an assistant in the 2011-12 season and then as head coach prior to the 2015-16 season.

Coach McMahon and his wife Mary, a former standout for the Furman women's basketball team, have three children – Maris, Mason and Mabry.

UNO SERIES
UNO and LSU have met 18 previous times, including last year when LSU won, 86-70, in the Maravich Center. LSU has a 14-4 lead in the series with the Tigers having a 10-3 advantage in games played in Baton Rouge. The teams first met in 1987 in New Orleans. LSU has won the last seven meetings.

UNO UPDATES
The Privateers opened the season at TCU on Monday and scored a 78-74 win over the Horned Frogs. Coleten Benson scored 22 points with four three-pointers while Jakevion Buckley added 17 points and added nine assists. MJ Thomas was 5-of-5 from the floor for 10 points.
UNO led 44-28 at halftime and had as much as a 21-point lead with 7:24 to play in the contest.
New Orleans held TCU to 38.8 percent shooting and 11.1 percent from three-point range (3-of-27), while outrebounding the Horned Frogs, 39-28. New Orleans shot 49 percent as it recorded its first win over a Power 4 school since defeating Washington State in 2016.
Coach Stacy Hollowell is in his second year as the head coach at New Orleans, after leading the Loyola (NO) club to the 2022 NAIA national championship. Hollowell, a Louisiana native, spent eight years at Loyola before single year stints at Ole Miss and Texas Southern prior to coming to UNO.

PETE MARAVICH ASSEMBLY CENTER
The Tigers opened their 55th season of play in the building in 2025-26 with a win after going 11-7 in the venue last season. LSU is 639-222 in the building. LSU is 348-49 (87.5 percent) in non-conference games. LSU was 9-0 in non-conference games in the Maravich Center in the 2024-25 season.
The building was originally known as the LSU Assembly Center from its opening in late 1971 until August 1988 when the building was renamed by government legislation following the untimely death of star LSU player, "Pistol" Pete Maravich.
The Maravich Center is the fourth oldest continuous use basketball arena in the league having hosted its first game in January

1972. Memorial Gym at Vanderbilt opened in 1952, Stegeman Coliseum at UGA in 1964 and Coleman Coliseum at Alabama opened in 1968.

OPENING NIGHT RECORD

LSU's win on opening night of the 118th season of LSU Basketball marked the 12th straight opening night win for the Tigers. LSU is now 97-21 in opening night games.

Tlgers out rebounds Tarleton State, 39-20, with the Texans grabbing eight boards, the fewest defensive boards a team has had against LSU since the offensive-defensive split statistics began in 1986-87.

Six LSU players scored in double figures with Portland senior transfer Max Mackinnon posted 19 points, 5 assists and Dedan Thomas Jr., had 16 points and eight rebounds. The Tigers posted 21 assists for 33 made baskets (64 percent).

THE SHOOTING RECORDS

After a video review of a late shot that was actually a turnover, the Tigers finished with a shooting percentage of 71.7 percent for the game against Tarleton State on Wednesday, the highest recorded shooting percentage in LSU Basketball history.

LSU was 33-of-46 in the contest, sparked by the 16-of-21 in the first half of the game.

It marked the third time that an LSU basketball team has shot 70 percent or better in a basketball game:

71.7% -- vs. Tarleton State (in Baton Rouge) – 11/5/25

71.4% -- vs. Clemson (in Charlotte) – 12/20/69

70.3% -- vs. Centenary (in Baton Rouge) – 1/15/03xx

It should be noted the game against Centenary was still when the Gents were a Division I program.

According to our content manager Todd Politz, the game also set a record for best two-point field goal percentage (making 25-of-28), topping the mark of a game just the previous season:

89.3% -- vs. Tarleton State (in Baton Rouge) – 11/5/25

87.2% -- vs. Mississippi Valley (in Baton Rouge) – 12/29/24

75.8 – vs. Memphis (in Lake Buena Vista, Florida) – 11/29/13

In terms of effective field goal percentage, LSU also had its best mark in over 20 years:

80.4% -- vs. Tarleton State (in Baton Rouge) – 11/5/25

77.3% -- vs. Centenary (in Baton Rouge) – 1/15/03

75.5% -- vs. Grambling (in Baton Rouge) – 12/13/08

In basketball effective field goal percentage (abbreviated eFG%), is a statistic that adjusts field goal percentage to account for the fact that three-point field goals count more than two-point field goals. Its goal is to show what FG percentage a two-point shooter would have to shoot at to match the output of a player who also shoots three-pointers. The formula is 2FG + (1.5 X 3FG) divided by FGA.

ON THE REBOUND SIDE

The Tigers, although allowing 12 offensive boards, shut down things on the defensive side by making lots of baskets. Tarleton State grabbed just eight LSU misses, the smallest numbers of defensive rebounds pulled down by an opponent in an LSU game since the offensive and defensive rebounds split totals became an official record in 1986-87.

LSU's previous low was nine against Florida on Jan. 27, 1990.

ASSISTING WELL

The Tigers piled up 21 assists on 33 made buckets Wednesday night (63.6 percent). The 21 assists were the fourth most in Matt McMahon's tenure at LSU.

Individually, point guard Dedan Thomas Jr., started off well with eight assists, the first eight assist game at LSU since Trey Hannibal versus Georgia on Feb. 27, 2024 when he had eight against the Bulldogs.

Max Mackinnon had five assists as part of his night and freshman point guard Jalen Reece added three. In all, seven players record assists for the Tigers.

JALEN REED OFFICIALLY BACK

It was at the 17:37 mark of the first half in which redshirt junior Jalen Reed made his return to the basketball floor in his first official basketball game since tearing his ACL in early December 2024 against Florida State and then had subsequent surgery.

Ahead of projections, he has been able to see the floor in a minutes restricted basis, playing 18:29 against Tarleton State, after a similar amount in the exhibition with UCF. As of now, the game minutes that trainer Grant Smith and strength and conditioning coach

Mike Chatman allow Reed are expected to continue to slowly increase.

His first points came at the 14:49 mark of the half on a fast break layup in the paint off a pass from Dedan Thomas Jr. Reed finished with 11 points on 3-of-4 shootings, with one trey, an assist and two steals.

MATT MCMAHON WINS 200TH CAREER GAME

LSU's win over Tarleton State gave Coach Matt McMahon his 200th career win in his 11 years as a head coach.

McMahon served seven years as the head coach at Murray State and is in his fourth season at LSU.

THE LSU COACHING TIES

As Coach Matt McMahon enters his fourth season at LSU, there are a lot of familiar faces on the LSU coaching staff, including some of those who donned the purple and gold during their college careers.

Ronald Dupree -- General Manager -- a first time position for LSU basketball ... Dupree, recently inducted to the LSU Athletics Hall of Fame, was an 11-year pro and longtime NBA scout, executive with the Milwaukee Bucks ... Played at LSU (1999-03), member Sweet 16 team in 2000 and is ninth in career scoring (1,726 points) ... Scouting work contributed to 2021 Bucks NBA title.

Jalen Courtney-Williams -- Assistant Coach -- Second year on the LSU staff ... Three-year letterman at LSU (2010-13); played in 61 games ... Came to LSU from Creighton where he served for three seasons, including a Sweet 16 year in 2024 ... Hosts the popular podcast "No Timeouts" on LSU+ and various podcast locations.

Tasmin Mitchell -- Assistant Coach/Director of Personnel -- In his ninth year as member of the LSU staff; second stint as Assistant Coach beginning in 2025-26 season ... One of the most popular former LSU Basketball stars; member of 2006 NCAA Final Four team ... Third all-time in scoring at LSU with 1,989 points (14.5 ppg average); sixth in rebounds (950), school record 4,692 minutes; 136 career starts ... One of three Tigers with 1,000 points, 500 rebounds, 200 assists and 100 steals.

David Patrick, the associate head coach, is also familiar to Tiger fans in the second year of his second stint in the program. He served as Assistant/Associate Coach from 2012-16 during the Johnny Jones head coaching tenure. **Vince Walden**, who was at Texas A&M last year, and fourth year assistant, **Casey Long**, completes the on floor coaching staff.

IMPORTANT WORDS

Coach Matt McMahon has had his five core value words since he arrived at LSU: hard work, unselfishness, toughness, accountability and joy.

All five of those are a vital part of this program's DNA, but this year the players as a team have picked out three words that they want to be the standard for the LSU program. Those words are on a lot of the team shooting shirts and coaching shirts the team wears. Those words are:

Brotherhood
Relentless
Consistency

THINGS TO WATCH

Some points to watch in the non-conference:

TURNOVERS -- LSU averaged 13.1 turnovers a game last season and will be looking to try to lower that number this season ... LSU had just five games with single digit miscues in 2024-25. LSU turned the ball over 419 times compared to 409 assists. The Tigers were 14th in turnover margin at -1.47 and 15th in assist-to-turnover ratio at 0.98. LSU turned the ball over 16 times in the opener.

THREE POINT SHOOTING -- A season ago, LSU made the third most three-point field goals in school history (250), but took 50 more shots than any LSU team had attempted to make those 250 (820) for a percentage of just 30.5 percent. The Tigers were 16th in the league in three-point percentage in 2024-25. LSU made the second most three-pointers in 2023-24 (256), but needed 103 less shots to achieve those makes.

In the UCF exhibition game and the Tarleton State contest, the team is a combined 18-of-41 outside the arc (43.9%).

FREE THROWS -- The Tigers had their first game since 2022 when they failed to convert at least 50 percent of their free throw attempts and that was kind of how the free throw shooting went in 2024-25 as it was up and down, culminating in a 13-of-26 performance in the SEC Tournament game. LSU was 437-of-612 or 71.4 percent.

To open the season, LSU was 22-of-29 at the stroke or 75.9%

WHAT MAKES THIS YEAR'S TEAM DIFFERENT?

There are several factors that offer the potential for this year's team to be a different LSU team in 2025-26:

AGE, MATURITY -- In 2023-24, the average age of the players was just over 19 ... In 2025-26, the average age is right around 22. In fact, as Coach McMahon said to some media, he had never celebrated a player's 24th birthday before. The roster has four freshmen (three from high school, one from the Israeli pro league), one sophomore, three juniors, two seniors, three 5th year seniors and a grad student.

ROSTER MANAGEMENT – The Tigers put together the players that it feels will help them make the necessary strikes during this season. A larger, more physical front-court, wings that can shoot the three and a point guard that can be trusted to run the team, score the ball and distribute the basketball.

CONNECTIVITY AND CHEMISTRY – This group of players that were good at their respective schools has blended together and understood the mission. Do what is necessary to make LSU relevant again in the SEC. They've accepted that mission that they have to work together and the chemistry shown in practice over the summer and preseason is something that coaches and attendees at practice have noticed quite quickly.

SONS OF THE FATHER

Two Tigers have fathers who also did well in the college basketball game in the past.

Jalen Reed's late father, Justin, starred at Ole Miss, where he was an All-America and the SEC Freshman of the Year in 2001. Justin Reed was an All-SEC selection in each of his four years at Ole Miss, guiding the Rebels to two NCAA Tournament wins en route to a first ever "Sweet 16" appearance for the Rebels. He was a second-round pick in the 2004 NBA Draft by the Boston Celtics and played for Boston and Minnesota in his NBA days. He passed away from cancer in 2017.

Point guard DJ Thomas Jr., is the son of UNLV star Dedan Thomas Sr. Senior played from 1991-94 at UNLV. He would earn honorable mention All-America honors and has his name throughout the UNLV record book.

Also, Robert Miller III is the son of a couple of former athletes. His dad, Robert Miller II, was an LSU defensive lineman in college, while his mom, Teana, earned All-America basketball honors at Tulane, also playing four years in the WNBA.

MAX MACKINNON

Two seasons at Elon and last season at Portland led the journey from this Australian to Baton Rouge and the Tigers for the 2025-26 season.

Mackinnon hit four treys and 6-of-7 from the field to score 19 points with 27 minutes of the opener with Tarleton State. He also dished out five assists.

The senior from Brisbane has his best scoring year from distance in the 2023-24 season with 51 three-pointers. Although he hit just 37 a year ago, his percentage was up as he hits 37-of-91 for the season at Portland.

McKinnon has played in 96 games with 90 starts, with 115 three-pointers made and total points of 1,222.

A FEW RULE CHANGES FOR THE 2025-26 SEASON

TIMEOUT CLOCKS -- One of the things that will be quite evident are the new timeout clocks which will illuminate and countdown the time of the break when the teams are in the huddle during the game. Most of the times in games televised by the SEC Network or SEC Network+, the clocks will start running at 2:15. The referees will inform the teams verbally when there are 30 seconds left in the timeout. A horn will sound at 15 seconds and the teams are to be ready to play when the clocks hit zero.

CONTINUOUS MOTION -- Another change and term you will hear a lot is "continuous motion." A player with the ball who is fouled after the dribble has ended and believed to be attempting a shot may complete a pivot or the one step the player is on in order to complete the shooting motion. The rationale is that NCAA men's basketball has been the most restrictive with the continuous motion rule. This change brings college basketball more in line with other levels of basketball.

COACH'S CHALLENGE -- The reviews that have been a part of the game in the last two minutes are now a thing of the past on standard out-of-bounds calls. But there are coach's challenges this year.

A coach's challenge can be issues on called out of bounds plays, called basket interference/goaltending plays, and restricted area plays throughout the game. Coaches will be permitted one challenge provided they have at least one legal timeout remaining. If the challenge is successful, the coach will be awarded a second, and final, challenge and will retain their timeout. If the challenge is unsuccessful, the coach will lose their challenge and timeout. In the last two minutes of the game and any overtime period, no challenge is needed on all called basket interference goaltending plays and restricted area plays as officials will review those plays as they currently do now.

Six former members of the LSU men's basketball team were on rosters as the 2025-26 National Basketball Association began play last month.

Veteran Garrett Temple (2006-09 at LSU) returned to the Toronto Raptors, with fan favorite Naz Reid (2019) getting another year with the Minnesota Timberwolves.

First round draft picks Cam Thomas (2021) and Tari Eason (2022) are both back with their teams as Thomas is putting up points for the Brooklyn Nets and Eason continuing his career with the Houston Rockets.

Rounding out the six-pack of LSU players are Trendon Watford (2020-21), who will be a part of a new team in Philadelphia, and Australian Duop Reath (2017-19), who looks for continued success with Portland.

Cam Thomas is averaging 21.4 points a game early for the Brooklyn Nets, while Tari Eason is averaging 12.3 points (5.1 rebounds) and Naz Reid 11.8 points (5.3 rebounds). It should be noted Thomas only played a few minutes last Wednesday for the nets against the Pacers with left hamstring tightness, the same issue which limited his playing time last season.

HE'S A HALL OF FAMER AND A HALL OF FAMER TO BE

I'm not sure how the "Voice of the Tigers" Chris Blair will introduce him each game, but there's more to SEC Legend John Brady in his title this season. The former LSU head coach, who led the Tigers to the NCAA Final Four in 2006, was inducted in September to the LSU Athletics Hall of Fame and come next June, he will become a member of the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame.

This is the ninth season that Blair and Brady have teamed together for LSU Basketball broadcasts on the LSU Sports Radio Network and Blair's 10th season overall as the basketball "Voice of the Tigers."

The Tigers will be right back on the court in a couple of days, hosting Florida International at 7 p.m. on Thursday at the Maravich Center. Tickets are on sale at LSUTix.net. The game will be broadcast on the LSU Sports Radio Network and streamed on SECN+.

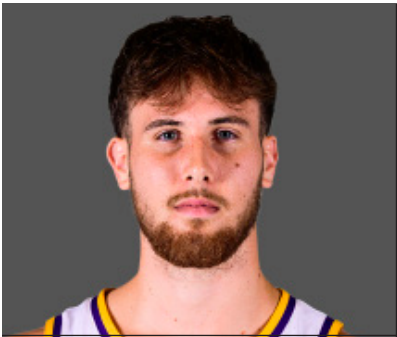

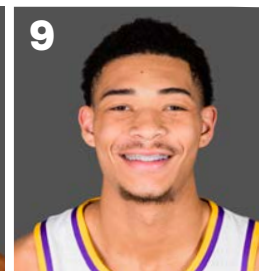
