4th Year at LSU • 11th Year as a Head Coach

LSU Coach Matt McMahon has built his program around five core values that define his approach both on and off the court: hard work, unselfishness, toughness, accountability and joy.

Those values were among the first principles he shared when introduced as the 25th head coach in program history on March 22, 2022, and they continue to guide every aspect of LSU Basketball today.

Now entering his fourth season at the helm, Coach McMahon leads a Tigers team energized by a strong recruiting class that blends proven transfers with talented freshmen. The 2025-26 squad is poised to build on the foundation laid in recent years, with an emphasis on chemistry, relentless effort, and steady progress.

This current group thrives on its chemistry, playing for each other with toughness, accountability, and an unselfish spirit. Their joy for the game is evident every time they take the floor, uniting players, coaches, and fans alike.

Guided by those five core principles, the Tigers have continued to strengthen the program's foundation, setting the stage for growth in 2025-26. With added talent and depth at all positions, this year's roster is built to take the next step forward.

Player development remains a cornerstone in the Matt McMahon LSU basketball program.

Robert Miller III enters his sophomore season ready to build on flashes of promise from his freshman year. Over the summer, Miller has committed himself to individual skill development and strength training to add both power and polish his game.

Jalen Reed returns for his redshirt junior season after an early December ACL injury cut short what had been a breakout year. Known for his drive and work ethic, Reed attacked his rehab this summer showing steady progress toward a full return.

The summer has given new players valuable time to work closely with the coaching staff and strength and conditioning coach Mike Chatman, focusing on improving their skills and physical readiness for the long season ahead.

The program has already shown it can take measurable steps forward under Matt McMahon's leadership. In 2024, LSU advanced to postseason play after back-to-back wins over No. 11 South Carolina, 64-63, in Columbia and then a 75-74 win over No. 17 Kentucky in BR.

Last season, LSU showed what it was capable of, beating Florida State in its SEC/ACC Challenge game, winning a triple-overtime win at the Greenbrier over UCF, a road victory at Kansas State, and an amazing rally in the final minute to win at Oklahoma.

McMahon's track record of building winning cultures was firmly established during his seven seasons at Murray State. Coach McMahon led the Racers to a record of 154-67 (.697) including: 93 OVC regular season wins, winning 75 percent of league games.

During his tenure, he has also coached multiple all-Americans and all-conference players. The most notable was Ja Morant, who went on to become the 2020 NBA Rookie of the Year.

Under McMahon the Racers won regular season league titles in 2018, 2019, 2020 and 2022 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2018, 2019 and 2022.

In his final season at Murray State in 2021-22, McMahon coached OVC Player of the Year KJ Williams and two other first-teamers (Tevin Brown, Justice Hill). In addition, McMahon was named the league's Coach of the Year.

McMahon's Racers, in 2021-22, were just the sixth team in league history to go undefeated. Murray State then won the league tournament to advance to the NCAA Tournament where the Racers defeated San Francisco in the opening round.

The 2021-22 team was one of seven teams to win 30 or more games that season and led the nation in win percentage at 91.2 percent.

The 2018-19 team won 28 games and made its mark in the NCAA Tournament when the 12th-seeded Racers won their fourth all-time tourney game over No. 5 seed Marquette.

Morant that year was named the OVC POY, leading Division I in assists and earning first-team All-America honors. In the NCAA Tournament win over Marquette, Morant posted a triple double of 17 points, 11 rebounds and 16 assists as he became the eighth player to record a triple double in the tournament.

He was drafted second overall in the 2019 NBA draft by the Memphis Grizzlies.

Prior to being named head coach, he was a key part of Coach Steve Prohm's staff as assistant at Murray State as the Racers won a pair of Ohio Valley Conference championships, a CollegeInsider.

com Tournament championship and an appearance in the NIT. He was part of a staff that won 104 games from 2011-15.

PRIOR TO MURRAY STATE

Coach McMahon has had success in college basketball since his days as a player at

Appalachian State.

Known as an excellent shooter and tough competitor, he played on three Southern Conference regular season title teams in 1998, 1999 and 2000. He earned All-Tournament honors in 1999. The Mountaineers won the SoCon Tournament in 2000 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

He played in 117 career games under coach Buzz Peterson and made 135 three-pointers, graduating in 2000.

His coaching career began immediately at Appalachian State as assistant under Houston Fancher in 2000-01. He would rejoin Peterson's staff as a graduate assistant coach at Tennessee before returning to ASU in 2002 as assistant and later associate head coach, where he stayed until the end of the 2009-10 season. A year at UNC Wilmington (2010-11) as assistant coach set the stage for his journey to Murray State, starting first as an assistant in the 2011-12 season and then as head coach prior to the 2015-16 season.

Coach McMahon and his wife Mary, a former standout for the Furman women's basketball team, have three children – Maris, Mason and Mabry.

TARLETON STATE SERIES
The Tigers and the Texans will be meeting for the first time in men's basketball. The Texans are part of the Western Athletic Conference but is expected to join in July 2026 the United Athletic Conference which is pretty much a merger of teams from the Atlantic Sun and the Western Athletic Conference. LSU is previously 1-0 against current WAC teams.

TARLETON UPDATES
The Texans opened the 2025-26 regular season on Monday at SMU, but the Texans played two exhibition games – losing to TCU, 88-54, on Oct. 19 and defeating East Texas A&M, 61-50 on Oct. 25. Both games were played in the EECU Center in Stephenville, Texas.
Against TCU, Dior Johnson led Tarleton State with 17 points, hitting 7-of-11 field goals, including two treys. Tarleton State hit 21-of-54 for the game with four treys and 8-of-15 free throws. The Texans trailed by 10 at the half before TCU outscored Tarleton State, 52-28 in the second half.
In the second exhibition game, Tarleton State outscored East Texas A&M, 35-21, in the opening 20 minutes. Cam McDowell in 33 minutes led the Texans with 18 points, nine rebounds. The team shot 46.2 percent from the field (24-of-52) with four treys and 9-of-15 at the line.
Billy Gillispie is the head coach of Tarleton State. Some fans may remember him from his time in the SEC at Kentucky. He has also served as head coach at UTEP, Texas A&M, Kentucky and Texas Tech. This is his sixth year as the head coach at Tarleton State. In his career he was the WAC Coach of the Year in 2004, the Big 12 Coach of the Year in 2005 and 2007, co-SEC Coach of the Year at 2008 and National JUCO Coach of the Year while at Ranger JC in 2019.

PETE MARAVICH ASSEMBLY CENTER
The Tigers open their 55th season of play in the building in 2025-26 after going 11-7 in the venue last season. LSU is 638-222 in the first 54 seasons. LSU is 347-49 (87.5 percent) in non-conference games. LSU was 9-0 in non-conference games in the Maravich Center

in the 2024-25 season.

The building was originally known as the LSU Assembly Center from its opening in late 1971 until August 1988 when the building was renamed by government legislation following the untimely death of star LSU player, “Pistol” Pete Maravich.

The Maravich Center is the fourth oldest continuous use basketball arena in the league having hosted its first game in January 1972. Memorial Gym at Vanderbilt opened in 1952, Stegeman Coliseum at UGA in 1964 and Coleman Coliseum at Alabama opened in 1968.

EARLIEST SEASON OPENING CONTEST IN LSU HISTORY

After playing on Nov. 6 for the first game each of the past two years, the opening date for the 2025-26 of Nov. 5 is now the earliest opening date the Tigers have ever played. It will mark the third straight year the Tigers have opened on a Wednesday during the opening week of the season.

OPENING NIGHT RECORDS

This is the start of the 118th season of LSU Basketball and the Tigers are 96-21 overall in opening night games. This will be the fifth straight year the Tigers have opened the season in the Maravich Center.

The Tigers have won 11 straight opening games, including a neutral site game against SIUE, 94-81, in an MTE in St. Louis on Nov. 26, 2020.

LSU’s last opening game loss was on the road at Massachusetts, 92-90, on Nov. 12, 2013. The Tigers have won 28-of-its-last-29 season opening games.

RECAP: The Tigers played a strong second half to rally from a seven-point deficit to win going away. LSU scored 46 second half points, highlighted by an 8-0 run that gave the Tigers the lead for good with six minutes to play. LSU was down 62-60 when DJ Thomas Jr. scored on a floater and was fouled to give LSU the advantage, 63-62. On the next possession Thomas found Max Mackinnon for a three-pointer to make it 66-62. The run was completed on the very next possession when Thomas was able to drive the lane for a layup to make it 68-62. UCF never got within four the rest of the game.

LSU shot 53.6 percent from the field in the second half (15-28) and 6-of-10 from distance in the final 20 minutes. Thomas had 16 points, nine assists; Mike Nwoko added 15 points; Marquel Sutton dropped 14 points with 11 rebounds.

THE LSU COACHING TIES

As Coach Matt McMahon enters his fourth season at LSU, there are a lot of familiar faces on the LSU coaching staff, including some of those who donned the purple and gold during their college careers.

Ronald Dupree -- General Manager -- a first time position for LSU basketball ... Dupree, recently inducted to the LSU Athletics Hall of Fame, was an 11-year pro and longtime NBA scout, executive with the Milwaukee Bucks ... Played at LSU (1999-03), member Sweet 16 team in 2000 and is ninth in career scoring (1,726 points) ... Scouting work contributed to 2021 Bucks NBA title.

Jalen Courtney-Williams -- Assistant Coach -- Second year on the LSU staff ... Three-year letterman at LSU (2010-13); played in 61 games ... Came to LSU to coach from Creighton where he served for three seasons, including a Sweet 16 year in 2024 ... Hosts the popular podcast “No Timeouts” on LSU+ and various podcast locations.

Tasmin Mitchell -- Assistant Coach/Director of Personnel -- In his ninth year as member of the LSU staff; second stint as Assistant Coach beginning in 2025-26 season ... One of the most popular former LSU Basketball stars; member of 2006 NCAA Final Four team ... Third all-time in scoring at LSU with 1,989 points (14.5 ppg average); sixth in rebounds (950), school record 4,692 minutes; 136 career starts ... One of three Tigers with 1,000 points, 500 rebounds, 200 assists and 100 steals.

David Patrick, the associate head coach, is also familiar to Tiger fans in the second year of his second stint in the program. He served as Assistant/Associate Coach from 2012-16 during the Johnny Jones head coaching tenure. **Vince Walden,** who was at Texas A&M last year, and fourth year assistant, **Casey Long,** completes the on floor coaching staff.

THE SCHEDULE

LSU’s schedule for the non-conference begins on Wednesday, Nov. 5, as LSU hosts Tarleton State of the Western Athletic Conference at 7 p.m. in a game streamed on SECN+.

The Tigers will play five home games in the first 17 days of the season before leaving the Maravich Center for five games over nearly a month -- four neutral site games and one road game.

After opening with Tarleton State (Nov. 5), the Tigers will host New Orleans, Florida International, Alcorn State and Omaha before leaving Baton Rouge.

The Tigers will finish November in Niceville, Florida (Nov. 28-29) in the Emerald Coast Classic. LSU will play Drake on the opening night (Nov. 28) and either Georgia Tech or DePaul on the second night (Nov. 29). LSU will then travel to Boston College on Dec. 3 for the ACC/SEC Challenge.

LSU will then play back-to-back neutral site games, Dec. 7 in the Coast-to-Coast Classic against Texas Tech in Fort Worth, before a Dec. 13 game with SMU in the Smoothie King Center in New Orleans in the Compete 4 Cause Classic. LSU and SMU met last year in Frisco in the first round of the Classic. This year, the LSU women’s team is also involved playing Louisiana Tech in the opening game of

the doubleheader.

LSU will play its first home game since Nov. 21 on Dec. 19 against Southeastern and will conclude non-conference play against Prairie View (Dec. 22) and Southern Miss on Dec. 29).

SEC play begins on Saturday, Jan. 3 at Texas A&M.

THINGS TO WATCH

Some points to watch as the season gets underway:

TURNOVERS -- LSU averaged 13.1 turnovers a game last season and will be looking to try to lower that number this season ... LSU had just five games with single digit miscues in 2024-25. LSU turned the ball over 419 times compared to 409 assists. The Tigers were 14th in turnover margin at -1.47 and 15th in assist-to-turnover ratio at 0.98. LSU turned the ball over 15 times in the exhibition, but only five in the second half and one in the first 12 minutes of the second half.

THREE POINT SHOOTING -- A season ago, LSU made the third most three-point field goals in school history (250), but took 50 more shots than any LSU team had attempted to make those 250 (820) for a percentage of just 30.5 percent. The Tigers were 16th in the league in three-point percentage in 2024-25. LSU made the second most three-pointers in 2023-24 (256), but needed 103 less shots to achieve those makes. LSU was 10-of-23 in the exhibition win (43.5 percent).

FREE THROWS -- The Tigers had their first game since 2022 when they failed to convert at least 50 percent of their free throw attempts and that was kind of how the free throw shooting went in 2024-25 as it was up and down, culminating in a 13-of-26 performance in the SEC Tournament game. LSU was 437-of-612 or 71.4 percent.

WHAT MAKES THIS YEAR'S TEAM DIFFERENT?

There are several factors that offer the potential for this year's team to be a different LSU team in 2025-26:

AGE, MATURITY -- In 2023-24, the average age of the players was just over 19 ... In 2025-26, the average age is right around 22. In fact, as Coach McMahon said to some media, he had never celebrated a player's 24th birthday before. The roster has four freshmen (three from high school, one from the Israeli pro league), one sophomore, three juniors, two seniors, three 5th year seniors and a grad student.

ROSTER MANAGEMENT -- The Tigers put together the players that it feels will help them make the necessary strikes during this season. A larger, more physical frontcourt, wings that can shoot the three and a point guard that can be trusted to run the team, score the ball and distribute the basketball.

CONNECTIVITY AND CHEMISTRY -- This group of players that were good at their respective schools has blended together and understood the mission. Do what is necessary to make LSU relevant again in the SEC. They've accepted that mission that they have to work together and the chemistry shown in practice over the summer and preseason is something that coaches and attendees at practice have noticed quite quickly.

SONS OF THE FATHER

Two Tigers have fathers who also did well in the college basketball game in the past.

Jalen Reed's late father, Justin, starred at Ole Miss, where he was an All-America and the SEC Freshman of the Year in 2001. Justin Reed was an All-SEC selection in each of his four years at Ole Miss, guiding the Rebels to two NCAA Tournament wins en route to a first ever "Sweet 16" appearance for the Rebels. He was a second-round pick in the 2004 NBA Draft by the Boston Celtics and played for Boston and Minnesota in his NBA days. He passed away from cancer in 2017.

Point guard DJ Thomas Jr., is the son of UNLV star Dedan Thomas Sr. Senior played from 1991-94 at UNLV, He would earn honorable mention All-America honors and has his name throughout the UNLV record book.

Also, Robert Miller III is the son of a couple of former athletes. His dad, Robert Miller II, was an LSU defensive lineman in college, while his mom, Teana, earned All-America basketball honors at Tulane, also playing four years in the WNBA.

A FEW RULE CHANGES FOR THE 2025-26 SEASON

TIMEOUT CLOCKS -- One of the things that will be quite evident are the new timeout clocks which will illuminate and countdown the time of the break when the teams are in the huddle during the game. Most of the times in games televised by the SEC Network or SEC Network+, the clocks will start running at 2:15. The referees will inform the teams verbally when there are 30 seconds left in the timeout. A horn will sound at 15 seconds and the teams are to be ready to play when the clocks hit zero.

CONTINUOUS MOTION -- Another change and term you will hear a lot is "continuous motion." A player with the ball who is fouled after the dribble has ended and believed to be attempting a shot may complete a pivot or the one step the player is on in order to complete the shooting motion. The rationale is that NCAA men's basketball has been the most restrictive with the continuous motion rule. This change brings college basketball more in line with other levels of basketball.

COACH'S CHALLENGE -- The reviews that have been a part of the game in the last two minutes are now a thing of the past on standard out-of-bounds calls. But there are coach's challenges this year.

A coach's challenge can be issues on called out of bounds plays, called basket interference/goaltending plays, and restricted area plays throughout the game. Coaches will be permitted one challenge provided they have at least one legal timeout remaining. If the challenge is successful, the coach will be awarded a second, and final, challenge and will retain their timeout. If the challenge is unsuccessful, the coach will lose their challenge and timeout. In the last two minutes of the game and any overtime period, no challenge is

needed on all called basket interference goaltending plays and restricted area plays as officials will review those plays as they currently do now.

SIX LSU PLAYERS STARTED SEASONS ON NBA ROSTERS

Six former members of the LSU men’s basketball team were on rosters as the 2025-26 National Basketball Association began play last month.

Veteran **Garrett Temple (2006-09 at LSU)** returns to the Toronto Raptors, with fan favorite **Naz Reid (2019)** set to go for another year with the Minnesota Timberwolves.

First round draft picks **Cam Thomas (2021)** and **Tari Eason (2022)** are both back with their teams as Thomas will be putting up points for the Brooklyn Nets and Eason continuing his career with the Houston Rockets.

Rounding out the six-pack of LSU players are **Trendon Watford (2020-21)**, who will be a part of a new team in Philadelphia, and Australian **Duop Reath (2017-19)**, who looks for continued success with Portland.

Temple continues his long NBA career which will be his 16th year in the NBA and his third with Toronto. He has played 771 games in the Association and scored 4,582 points overall. At LSU he was part of two SEC Championship teams and helped LSU to the NCAA Final Four as a freshman in 2006.

Naz Reid has made his mark in Minnesota after signing with the club as an undrafted free agent. Reid, a part of LSU’s Sweet 16 team in 2019, is entering his seventh season with the Timberwolves after averaging a career best 14.2 points and 6.0 rebounds a season ago. He has played 406 games with a scoring average of 11.6 points per contest.

Thomas, the No. 27 pick in the 2021 NBA Draft, enters his fifth season with the Nets, after averaging a career best 24.0 points a game a year ago in an injury shortened season due to a left hamstring strain. He already has a 40-point game this season.

Eason was selected by the Rockets with the 17th pick in the 2022 Draft and he had his best season a year ago averaging 12.1 points in 56 games.

Watford will play for his third NBA team in his fifth season in the league, but his first in Philadelphia after two years in Portland and Brooklyn. In 44 games a season ago, Watford averaged a personal best 10.2 points.

Reath, who played overseas for five years, now enters his third year with Portland. He played in 114 games over two seasons.

HE’S A HALL OF FAMER AND A HALL OF FAMER TO BE

I’m not sure how the “Voice of the Tigers” Chris Blair will introduce him each game, but there’s more to SEC Legend John Brady in his title this season. The former LSU head coach, who led the Tigers to the NCAA Final Four in 2006, was inducted in September to the LSU Athletics Hall of Fame and come next June, he will become a member of the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame.

This is the ninth season that Blair and Brady have teamed together for LSU Basketball broadcasts on the LSU Sports Radio Network and Blair’s 10th season overall as the basketball “Voice of the Tigers.”

HOMESTAND CONTINUES NEXT MONDAY

The Tigers opening five-game homestand continues on Monday, Nov. 10 against the University of New Orleans. Game time is 7 p.m. and the game will be broadcast on the LSU Sports Radio Network and streamed on SECN+.
