Series Notes: Alabama and LSU are set to square off for the 90th time in history on Saturday evening inside Saban Field at Bryant-Denny Stadium. The Crimson Tide holds a 57-27-5 advantage in the long-standing series, including a 15-10 mark in Tuscaloosa. The Tide has won five of its last six at home against the Tigers, including the last two pairings in 2021 (20-14) and 2023 (42-28). Alabama head coach Kalen DeBoer is 1-0 against the Tigers following last season's dominant 42-13 win at Tiger Stadium. LSU interim head coach Frank Wilson has never faced the Crimson Tide.

TIDE TOOK CARE OF BUSINESS: Alabama produced four consecutive victories over Associated Press Top 25 conference opponents in as many weeks following the Tide's 37-20 win over then-No. 11 Tennessee on Oct. 18. UA's streak of ranked wins over SEC foes also included a 27-24 win at then-No. 14 Missouri on Oct. 11, a 30-14 win over then-No. 16 Vanderbilt on Oct. 4 and a 24-21 victory at then-No. 5 Georgia on Sept. 27. The Crimson Tide is the first team in SEC history to defeat four straight ranked opponents with no open dates. Alabama also became the fourth team in SEC history to defeat four consecutive ranked opponents including open dates, with the Tide also accomplishing the feat in 2016.

BUILDING A RÉSUMÉ: Alabama was ranked No. 4 in the initial College Football Playoff rankings released on Nov. 4 and boasts a superlative résumé entering Week 11. Heading into its matchup against LSU, the Tide is the only program in the nation with four wins against teams ranked in the current CFP Top 25 and is one of only two teams with two wins over opponents currently ranked in the CFP Top 16. Additionally, Alabama is among a list of only three teams in the country with four wins over Power 4 opponents that hold a winning record. UA is also one of just two programs with four victories over bowl-eligible P4 teams and is one of three rosters from around the nation to produce four wins against bowl-eligible opponents overall. The Tide heads into Week 11 on a short list of only four programs with four wins over opponents ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 at the time of the game, and is among six teams with at least two wins over teams in the current AP Top 25.

BETTER IN NOVEMBER: Head coach Kalen DeBoer owns a record of 35-3 (.921) in the month of November across two levels of college football. Since 2022, DeBoer has produced an 11-1 (.916) standing in November contests.

IN SYNC AFTER THE BYE: Head coach Kalen DeBoer has produced exceptional results in his career following a bye week. In 18 career games coming out of the off week, DeBoer has managed a 16-2 (.888) record, including bye weeks prior to postseason play. Since the start of the 2021 season, DeBoer is a perfect 7-0 when coming out of a bye week, including a 5-0 mark against ranked opponents in that span. A season ago, DeBoer led the Tide to a 41-34 win over then-No. 2 Georgia following its first bye week before Alabama's 42-13 win at then-No. 15 LSU after its second off week. Earlier this season, the Tide produced a 24-21 win at then-No. 5 Georgia on Sept. 27 following UA's first bye week of 2025.

THE FRIENDLY CONFINES OF SABAN FIELD AT BRYANT-DENNY STADIUM: Alabama boasts the best all-time home winning percentage in the FBS with an .845 (308-55-3) mark inside Saban Field at Bryant-Denny Stadium since its opening in 1929. Boise State's Albertsons Stadium (299-64), which opened in 1970, is the next closest in second at .823.

STREAKING AT HOME: Alabama is currently riding a 16-game home winning streak dating back to the Tide's Sept. 23 win over Ole Miss during the 2023 season. The Crimson Tide's last loss inside Saban Field at Bryant-Denny Stadium came on Sept. 9 of that '23 campaign when UA fell to 11th-ranked Texas, 34-24. Alabama's 16-game home winning streak is the longest active home winning streak in Division I. The 16-game winning streak is also tied for the ninth-longest winning streak at BDS in the stadium's history.

UNFAZED vs. THE UNRANKED AT HOME: With a 38-14 win over Wisconsin on Sept. 13, Alabama has won 86 consecutive games against unranked opponents at home. The Crimson Tide's last loss to an unranked foe inside Saban Field at Bryant-Denny Stadium came on Nov. 17, 2007, in a 21-14 loss to ULM.

ALABAMA IN THE AP POLL: The Crimson Tide's No. 4 ranking in the Week 11 edition of the Associated Press Poll marked the 289th consecutive week that the Crimson Tide has appeared in the poll. That streak is the longest active streak in college football. The 289 weeks more than doubles second-place Georgia with the Bulldogs appearing in the poll for 143 consecutive weeks. Alabama's 289 straight weeks tops the Crimson Tide's previous program-long streak of 105 consecutive weeks under head coach Gene Stallings in the mid-1990s.

ALABAMA IN THE AP SINCE 2008: Alabama began the 2008 season at No. 24 in the Associated Press Preseason Poll. The Crimson Tide opened the year with a dominant 34-10 win over then-No. 9 Clemson in Atlanta, and since that win over the Tigers, UA has not exited the 288 polls that have followed. According to the College Poll Archive, the Tide is the only team to be represented on all 289 editions of the poll from the start of the 2008 season to the current week. The next closest team is Ohio State with 274 appearances followed by Oklahoma at 255. Alabama has spent 91.7 percent of the 18-plus years ranked in the top 10. A whopping 77.2 percent of that time Alabama has been ranked in the top five. The Crimson Tide has also been ranked No. 1 a total of 110 times since 2008. Only 15 other teams have earned the No. 1 ranking over that time, with the second-most appearances coming from Georgia at 40, while Clemson and Ohio State share the third-most appearances at 23.

ALABAMA HAS THE MOST WINS SINCE 2008: Dating back to the start of the 2008 season, Alabama has won 215 games, which is the most in the Football Bowl Subdivision. That sum is 15 more than Ohio State, who owns the next-closest win total over that stretch at 200.

2025 TEAM CAPTAINS: The Crimson Tide’s 2025 team captains were announced after practice on Aug. 21. As selected by their teammates, Parker Brailsford, Tim Keenan III, Deontae Lawson and Ty Simpson were each named permanent team captains for the season. The honor marks the second year in a row Lawson was voted a team captain, becoming just the 16th player in program history to be named a two-time team captain.

NOT SINCE 1931: Head coach Kalen DeBoer produced a 9-4 record in his inaugural season at the Capstone. DeBoer’s nine wins finished tied for the most by a first-year head coach at Alabama, sharing the feat with Frank Thomas, who won nine games in his initial season leading the Crimson Tide in 1931.

YEAR TWO UNDER KDB: Head coach Kalen DeBoer’s teams have produced significant improvements in the second season of his previous coaching tenures. Following an 11-2 overall record and a berth in the semifinals of the NAIA Championship Series after his inaugural season at Sioux Falls in 2005, DeBoer advanced the Cougars to a perfect 14-0 record in 2006, winning the NAIA National Championship. After managing a 3-3 finish with Fresno State in his debut season in 2020, DeBoer proceeded to win six more games in 2021 with the Bulldogs finishing 9-3 under his watch. Most recently, DeBoer led Washington to a College Football Playoff National Championship berth in his second season with the Huskies in 2023, tallying a 14-1 overall record. Washington was 11-2 in DeBoer’s initial campaign in Seattle the year prior.

DEBOER NAMED TO "BEAR" BRYANT WATCH LIST: Alabama head coach Kalen DeBoer was named to the American Heart Association’s (AHA) 2025 Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year Award Watch List, the AHA announced Oct. 15. DeBoer is among 28 head coaches within college football named to the "Bear" Bryant Award Watch List, an honor given to a coach whose contributions make the sport better for athletes and fans alike by demonstrating grit, integrity and a winning approach to coaching and life – both on and off the field. The winner of the 2025 Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year Award will be announced on Wednesday, Jan. 21, 2026, during the Association’s annual Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year Awards ceremony, in Houston, Texas. The ceremony, presented by Memorial Hermann Health System, will be broadcast on the CBS Sports Network. Alabama has had two previous winners of the Bryant Award, first with Gene Stallings in 1992 followed by Nick Saban in 2020.

ALWAYS IN THE HUNT: Since the 2008 season, Alabama has played in 203 of 209 regular season games that have had national championship implications. The final three games of the 2010 campaign and the final three weeks of the 2022 schedule marked the only six regular season contests without direct national championship implications over the last 17 seasons.

ALABAMA REACHES 1K: With the Oct. 26, 2024 victory over then-No. 21/17 Missouri, Alabama reached 1,000 on-field wins. The Crimson Tide became only the second program in NCAA Division I history to record 1,000 wins (1,003), joining Michigan (1,012). Entering the 2025 season, the Tide’s record, as recognized by the NCAA, stands at 974-341-43 (.733), accounting for vacated and forfeited victories.

ALABAMA IN THE CFP

The College Football Playoff was introduced during the 2014 season with the first ever rankings being released on Oct. 28, 2014. The selection committee members meet weekly on Mondays and Tuesdays to produce rankings. The committee’s rankings are announced on ESPN each Tuesday evening for the final six weeks of the season. Alabama holds the record for the most games played (14) and wins (9) in the history of the CFP and is one of only two teams to have been ranked in all 67 CFP Polls. The Crimson Tide has garnered the CFP Poll’s No. 1 overall ranking in 24 of its 67 total polls, the most of any program. Alabama owns a 9-5 record in 14 overall College Football Playoff matchups. That mark includes 3-3 standing in CFP National Championship Games, claiming titles in 2015, 2017 and 2020.

ALABAMA IN THE AP POLL

Alabama has been ranked in 901 of the 1,261 Associated Press college football polls since 1936, according to the AP Poll Archive. The Crimson Tide owns a 557-140-8 (.796) all-time record in games when ranked in the Associated Press college football poll. Alabama is also ranked in the AP Poll for the 289th consecutive week, topping its previous streak of 105 consecutive polls from 1991-97 under head coach Gene Stallings. The 289 consecutive weeks is the second-longest stretch by any program in the poll's history, trailing only Nebraska's all-time mark of 348 consecutive weeks. Alabama has started nine seasons at No. 1 (2022, 2021, 2018, 2017, 2016, 2013, 2010, 1978, 1966).

OFFENSIVE NOTES

THE DEBOER-GRUBB COMBO: On Feb. 6, 2025, head coach Kalen DeBoer announced the hiring of offensive coordinator Ryan Grubb, a veteran play-caller and one of the top offensive minds in football. DeBoer and Grubb have worked alongside one another at multiple stops over the years, producing potent offenses. Now in their fifth season with DeBoer as head coach and Grubb as the offensive coordinator, the pair have combined to post a 44-10 (.814) record while averaging 35.7 points per game and 469.6 yards of total offense per game.

FIRST YEAR STARTING QBs AT ALABAMA: With the exit of two-year starter Jalen Milroe, the Crimson Tide has tabbed Ty Simpson as its starting quarterback in 2025. Since 2009, a total of nine quarterbacks have maintained their starting role for 10-plus games of a season in which they were named QB1 for the first time. The list of nine includes: Milroe (2023), Bryce Young (2021), Mac Jones (2020), Tua Tagovailoa (2018), Jalen Hurts (2016), Jake Coker (2015), Blake Sims (2014), AJ McCarron (2011) and Greg McElroy (2009). All but McCarron won an SEC Championship in their first season at quarterback while four upperclassmen (redshirt sophomore or above) won national titles - Jones (redshirt junior), Coker (senior), McCarron (redshirt sophomore) and McElroy (junior).

TY TAKES OVER: Ty Simpson was named the starting quarterback by head coach Kalen DeBoer on Aug. 11, replacing two-year starter Jalen Milroe, who was drafted in the third round (92nd overall) by the Seattle Seahawks in the 2025 NFL Draft. Simpson made his first career start at Florida State on Aug. 30, completing 23-of-43 passes for 254 yards and two touchdowns while adding nine carries for 17 yards. Simpson became the first UA quarterback since Bryce Young in 2021 to manage a touchdown pass in the first drive of his first-ever start, finding Josh Cuevas for a two-yard score. Simpson's 254 passing yards were also the fifth-most by a UA quarterback in his first career start in program history.

EPITOME OF EFFICIENCY: Ty Simpson has shined in his new role as the Crimson Tide's starting quarterback. Through his first eight starts, Simpson has completed 177-of-261 passes (67.8 percent) for 2,184 yards and 20 touchdowns while adding 51 carries for 79 yards and two scores. Below is a look at where Simpson stands in the SEC and nationally among signal-callers.

TY TAMES THE TIGERS: Quarterback Ty Simpson was named the SEC Offensive Player of the Week for his efforts in Alabama's 27-24 win at then-No. 14/14 Missouri on Oct. 11. Simpson led the Tide to its third consecutive AP Top 25 win, finishing 23-of-31 through the air with three touchdown passes. He completed at least one pass to nine different targets while also converting all three of the Tide's fourth down attempts. The weekly SEC accolade stands as the second in three weeks for Simpson, who was also named the East-West Shrine Bowl's Monday Morning Quarterback that same morning following the road victory over Mizzou.

WEEKLY HONORS FOR SIMPSON AFTER UGA: Quarterback Ty Simpson garnered numerous weekly honors following Alabama's 24-21 victory at then-No. 5/3 Georgia on Sept. 27. The Tide's starting signal-caller completed 24-of-38 passes for 276 yards and two touchdowns through the air, adding 12 rushing yards and a touchdown on four carries in the road win. Simpson's week began by being named the SEC Co-Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 29. That same day, Simpson earned Panini Senior Bowl Player of the Week honors while also being chosen among eight quarterbacks as one of the Manning Award's 'Stars of the Week'. On Sept. 30, the Martin, Tenn., native picked up additional accolades, including being recognized as the Maxwell Player of the Week as well as the Davey O'Brien National Player of the Week.

PERFECT FROM THE POCKET: Ty Simpson finished a perfect 17-of-17 for 226 yards and three touchdowns in Alabama's 73-0 win over ULM on Sept. 6. Simpson became just the third quarterback in SEC history to manage a perfect 100 percent completion percentage following a minimum of 10 passing attempts, as his 17 completions on as many attempts are the most by a quarterback in league history. Simpson surpassed LSU's Rohan Davey, who completed 11-of-11 passes against Western Carolina in 2000.

CONSECUTIVE COMPLETIONS: After a perfect weekend against ULM, Ty Simpson carried his streak of 17 consecutive completions into the following week's contest against Wisconsin on Sept. 13. Simpson completed his first pass against the Badgers to extend his streak to 18 consecutive completions before an incompletion on his second attempt. Simpson's 18 consecutive completions trail only Mac Jones' program record of 19 consecutive completions that spanned Oct. 17-24, 2020, against Georgia and Tennessee.

QUARTERBACK AND CENTER: Quarterback Ty Simpson and center Parker Brailsford were each named to The Sporting News' Midseason All-America Team, the outlet announced on Oct. 15. At the time of the announcement, Simpson led all SEC quarterbacks in passing touchdowns (16), passing efficiency (172.4) and points responsible for (108), ranking no lower than 11th nationally in all three categories. Brailsford had yet to allow a sack across 245 pass blocking snaps according to Pro Football Focus, in addition to providing key blocks for an offense that was averaging 126.5 rushing yards per game.

MR. RELIABLE: Germie Bernard was one of the most consistent wideouts in college football a season ago and has maintained his form through eight games in 2025. After leading all Tide receivers in receptions (50) and finishing second in receiving yards (794) last season, Bernard currently paces UA wideouts in receptions (38), receiving yards (526) and receiving touchdowns (6). The Nevada native has also produced 94 rushing yards on 15 carries with two rushing scores while completing one pass for four yards on his only attempt. The senior's six receiving touchdowns are tied for third-most in the SEC and are tied for 20th nationally while his eight total touchdowns are tied for seventh among all SEC players. Bernard has found the end zone in five of the past seven games, a streak that includes six receiving scores and two rushing touchdowns.

SOPHOMORE STAR: Ryan Williams was one of the most impressive freshman players in the country a season ago and has continued to create big plays for the Alabama offense this season. In 2024, Williams led the Tide in receiving yards (865) and receiving touchdowns (8) while finishing second in receptions (48). In his seven games this season, the Mobile native is second among all Alabama wideouts in receptions (33) and receiving yards (495) while his three receiving touchdowns are tied for third-most. Williams' 70.7 receiving yards per game mark is tops among Alabama pass-catchers, with his 15.0 yards per reception average sitting as the second-best rate among UA wideouts. Williams' 70.7 receiving yards per game average stands as the ninth-best per game average among all SEC receivers.

BROOKS MOVING THE CHAINS: Freshman wideout Lotzeir Brooks has quickly become a weapon for the Crimson Tide. Brooks has seen time in seven games thus far, recording 16 catches for 255 yards. A big-play threat, Brooks' 15.9 yards per catch average is the top mark among Alabama receivers, and he has converted a UA first down on 13 of his 16 receptions.

A SWISS ARMY KNIFE: Josh Cuevas earned a more prominent role at tight end for the Crimson Tide in 2025 and has delivered in more ways than one. Cuevas has totaled 20 catches for 203 yards and three touchdowns in eight games so far this season, with his three receiving touchdowns tied for third-most among the Tide's receiving corps. Cuevas has also shown his mettle as a pass protector, managing a 79.2 pass blocking grade from Pro Football Focus, the third-highest pass blocking grade among Division I tight ends.

JOE MOORE AWARD MIDSEASON HONOR ROLL: The Alabama offensive line, made up primarily by Parker Brailsford, Kam Dewberry, Wilkin Formby, Kady Proctor and Geno VanDeMark, was named to the Joe Moore Midseason Honor Roll on Oct. 15. The Joe Moore Award is given to the most outstanding offensive line unit in college football each year. Over its first six contests, the UA offensive line helped keep Ty Simpson upright, allowing for the Tide to average an impressive 34.8 points per game and 431.0 yards of total offense per contest. The Tide offensive line has twice received the Joe Moore Award, earning the honor in 2020 and 2015.

ALABAMA IN THE COACHES POLL

The Crimson Tide has enjoyed much success in the coaches' rankings over the past half century. The United Press International debuted the coaches poll in 1950 and ran the poll through the 1990 season. USA TODAY has administered the poll for the past 35 seasons (1991-present) with US LBM coming on the title sponsor of the poll at the start of the 2023 season. Alabama was ranked No. 1 in the 2010 preseason coaches poll after starting out the 2009 preseason poll at No. 5. Alabama remained in the top five the entire season, reaching No. 1 after defeating Florida in the SEC Championship and holding the position to claim the national championship after defeating Texas in Pasadena. The Tide then claimed the No. 1 spot to close out the 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017 and 2020 seasons. The Tide has compiled four UPI (1961, 1964, 1973 and 1979) and seven USA TODAY (1992, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017 and 2020) coaches poll national titles.

BRAILSFORD NAMED SEC O-LINEMAN OF THE WEEK: Parker Brailsford was named the SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week on Oct. 6 following the Tide's 30-14 win over then-No. 16/17 Vanderbilt on Oct. 4. Brailsford played all 69 offensive snaps against the Commodores without surrendering a sack, pressure or quarterback hit in the victory. The weekly honor stands as the first in the collegiate career of the Arizona native.

THE BIG GUY: Alabama left tackle Kadyr Proctor has been among the most impactful offensive lineman in the country so far in 2025. Since Week 2, Proctor has just allowed one quarterback hit over his last 278 passing snaps while manning Ty Simpson's blind side. The intimidating left tackle has amassed an 81.3 overall grade from PFF, the 10th-best grade among all Division I tackles. The lowa product has also managed four carries for 15 yards, with three of the four runs converting a trio of Tide first downs.

PROCTOR NAMED LOMBARDI SEMIFINALIST: Kadyr Proctor was named a semifinalist for the Lombardi Award, the Rotary Club of Houston announced Nov. 4. Proctor is one of 13 semifinalists for the Lombardi, which is presented annually to the college football offensive or defensive lineman who, in addition to outstanding performance and ability, best exemplifies the character and discipline of NFL Hall of Famer Vince Lombardi. Alabama has had three Lombardi winners in program history including Cornelius Bennett (1986), Jonathan Allen (2016) and most recently Will Anderson Jr. (2022).

PROCTOR'S WEEKLY AWARDS AFTER UGA: Kadyr Proctor received conference and national praise for his performance in the Tide's 24-21 win at then-No. 5/3 Georgia on Sept. 27. Proctor did not allow a sack or quarterback pressure across the Tide's 79 offensive snaps, adding a catch-and-run of 11 yards late in the second quarter that eventually led to an Alabama touchdown. The Des Moines, Iowa, product was first recognized as the SEC's Co-Offensive Lineman of the Week on Sept. 29 before being named the Outland Trophy Player of the Week on Sept. 30.

DISTRIBUTING THE WEALTH: The Alabama offense has seen a variety of pass-catchers make an impact through its first eight contests. Entering the matchup against LSU, the Tide has had 18 different players secure at least one reception so far this season, including nine different players with at least eight catches. The same can be said about UA's scoring opportunities, with 10 different pass-catchers having already secured at least one touchdown reception over Alabama's first eight games.

TAKING CARE OF THE FOOTBALL: Over its first eight contests, the Alabama offense has surrendered just five turnovers, standing as one of just four Division I teams responsible for five-or-fewer giveaways.

THIRD DOWN CONVERSIONS: The Alabama offense has been among the most successful units in converting third downs so far in 2025. Through eight games, the Tide has converted 56-of-112 (50.0 percent) third down tries, the fourth-best mark in the SEC and the 16th-best rate in the FBS. The Crimson Tide converted 13-of-19 third down opportunities in its 24-21 win at then-No. 5/3 Georgia on Sept. 27, the most third down conversions allowed by UGA in the last 30 seasons.

CRIMSON COUNTDOWN: The Alabama offense owns an average time of possession of 32:46 over its first eight games, the third-best time of possession average in the SEC and the 13th-best figure in the country.

ON FIRE IN THE RED ZONE: So far in 2025, the Tide has produced points in 33 of its first 34 red zone opportunities (97.1 percent), including 26 touchdowns (19 passing, 7 rushing) and seven made field goals. Alabama's 97.1 percent scoring rate in the red zone sits as the second-best mark in the SEC and ranks fourth nationally.

RAIDING THE AIR: The Alabama quarterback room is averaging 291.6 passing yards per game over its first eight contests, the second-highest average in the SEC and the 14th-best figure in the nation.

AERIAL ASSAULT: Alabama saw three different quarterbacks produce seven touchdown passes in the Tide's 73-0 win over ULM on Sept. 6. The seven touchdowns through the air matched UA's program record for touchdown passes in a single game previously set against Southern Miss on Nov. 11, 1950.

400+ YARDS OF TOTAL OFFENSE: Alabama has gained 400-plus yards of total offense in 76 of its last 104 games, dating back to the start of the 2018 season. The Crimson Tide produced 400-plus yards of offense for the third time this season against then-No.16/17 Vanderbilt on Oct. 4, accruing 486 total yards. Alabama also produced 400-plus yards against Wisconsin on Sept. 13, amassing 454 yards of total offense, as well as finishing with 583 total yards against ULM on Sept. 6. In the 28 instances where the offense did not go over 400 yards, Alabama is 20-8.

500+ YARDS OF OFFENSE: With 583 yards of offense in the 73-0 win over ULM on Sept. 6, Alabama has eclipsed 500 yards of offense in 61 games since the start of the 2015 season. The 61 instances include three games in 2024 when UA went for 500-plus against Western Kentucky (600), Georgia (547) and Mercer (508). The Crimson Tide accumulated 500-plus twice in 2023 along with seven times apiece in both 2022 and 2021. Additionally, the Tide went for 500-or-better eight times in 2020 and nine times in 2019, with the 2018 roster setting the Alabama single-season record with 500-or-more yards in 12 contests.

600+ YARDS OF OFFENSE: Alabama totaled 600 yards of offense in the 63-0 win over Western Kentucky to open the 2024 campaign. The 600-plus yard performance marked the 15th instance in program history that the Tide has been at or above 600 yards.

MOST PPG SINCE 2018: Alabama has produced a scoring average of 40.8 points per game in 104 games since 2018, the highest scoring margin among all Division I teams in that span. Ohio State owns the second-highest points per game mark over that time, managing a 40.4 points per game average.

OPENING DRIVE TOUCHDOWNS: The Crimson Tide has won 62 of its last 64 games when scoring a touchdown on the first offensive possession of the game. The most recent instance came on Oct. 18 when Ty Simpson found Isaiah Horton for a two-yard touchdown pass to open the night's scoring against then-No. 11/11 Tennessee. Alabama's only two losses during the current stretch occurred at Florida State on Aug. 30 earlier this season and at Texas A&M on Oct. 9, 2021.

SCORING STREAK CONTINUES: Alabama extended its school record for consecutive games with a score to 331 thanks to DaShawn Jones' 18-yard interception return for a touchdown at South Carolina on Oct. 25. The Tide was last held off the scoreboard in a 9-0 loss to Auburn on Nov. 18, 2000. Alabama owns a 266-65 (.803) record over the course of the current streak.

BALL PROTECTION: In the last 240 games (dating back to the start of the 2008 season), Alabama has turned the ball over only 257 times (137 fumbles, 120 interceptions) for an average of 1.07 turnovers per game. Since 2009, the Tide has turned the ball over only 239 times in 228 games (1.04/game). The 239 turnovers since 2009 includes 100 interceptions in 6,120 attempts (one interception every 61.2 attempts) by UA starting quarterbacks and 33 lost fumbles in 5,822 carries (one fumble lost every 176.4 carries) by the Tide's top two running backs.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

ALEXANDER AWARD SEMIFINALIST LEE JR.: Dijon Lee Jr. was named a semifinalist for the Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year Award, the Maxwell Football Club announced Nov. 5. Lee Jr. is one of 14 semifinalists for the Alexander, an award presented to the most outstanding freshman player in college football. Finalists for the Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year Award will be announced on Dec. 3 before the 2025 recipient is announced on Dec. 30. A formal presentation of the trophy will be made at the Maxwell Football Club Awards on Saturday, March 14, 2026, in Atlanta, Ga. Alabama has produced two Alexander Award winners in the honor's six-year existence, with Will Anderson Jr. garnering the distinction in 2020 and Caleb Downs in 2023.

LAWSON DUBBED BUTKUS SEMIFINALIST: Deontae Lawson was announced as a semifinalist for the 2025 Dick Butkus Award, the Butkus Foundation announced on Nov. 4. Lawson is among 12 semifinalists vying for the Butkus, which is given annually to the nation's top linebacker. Four Crimson Tide players have won the award previously with Reuben Foster taking home the hardware most recently in 2016. Joining Foster on the list of Alabama linebackers to capture the honors are C.J. Mosley (2013), Rolando McClain (2009) and Derrick Thomas (1988).

WHAT A WEEK FOR ZB: Zabien Brown earned various league and national honors after his game-changing performance against then-No. 11/11 Tennessee on Oct. 18. Highlighted by his 99-yard interception return for a touchdown just before halftime, Brown also contributed a career-high seven tackles while limiting the Volunteers' receiving corps to just 16 yards on six targets, equating to an allowed passer rating of 2.8 per Pro Football Focus. Brown was first named the SEC's Co-Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 20 before garnering national honors including Bronko Nagurski Player of the Week, Jim Thorpe Defensive Back of the Week and the Lott IMPACT Trophy Player of the Week.

BIG PLAY YHONZAE: Yhonzae Pierre was named SEC Co-Defensive Player of the Week along with Zabien Brown on Oct. 18 for his efforts against then-No. 11/11 Tennessee. Pierre matched his career high with six tackles against the Vols, including a career-best three sacks (-31 yards), one of which led to a Tennessee safety. Pierre's three sacks were the most by an Alabama player since 2021 and came against a UT offensive line unit that had only allowed four sacks through six games entering the Third Saturday in October. In addition to earning his first-career SEC weekly honor, the Eufaula native was also named the Chuck Bednarik Player of the Week for his showing against the Vols.

MOVIN' ON UP: Linebacker Justin Jefferson has taken on an elevated role at the second level of the Crimson Tide defense in 2025. Jefferson enters the matchup with LSU with a team-leading 53 total tackles, including three tackles for loss (-23 yards) and two sacks (-20 yards). He has also contributed two quarterback hurries, two pass breakups, one interception and a forced fumble in his first eight games. Jefferson's 6.6 total tackles per game average is 11th-best among all SEC defenders.

JEFFERSON GARNERS WEEKLY HONORS: Justin Jefferson was named SEC Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 6 as the result of a career-best outing against then-No. 16/17 Vanderbilt. Jefferson managed a career-high 14 tackles to go with one sack and a forced fumble. He played a key role in limiting the Commodores to zero points after halftime and just 333 yards of total offense for the day. Jefferson was also named the Panini Senior Bowl Defensive Player of the Week as well as the Chuck Bednarik Player of the Week for his play against the 'Dores.

THIS IS THE BRAY: Bray Hubbard has been a force for the Tide defense through eight games so far in 2025. The junior safety owns 44 total tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss (-3 yards), to go with three interceptions, four pass breakups, one forced fumble and a quarterback hurry. Hubbard's 43 tackles are third-most among all Alabama defenders, while he is responsible for three of the Tide's 14 takeaways. The Mississippi native's three interceptions are tied for the most among SEC defenders and are tied for third-most in the country.

HUBBARD NAMED SEC DEFENSIVE POTW: Bray Hubbard was named SEC Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 15 following his standout performance against Wisconsin on Sept. 13. Hubbard collected five total tackles and two interceptions against the Badgers, helping limit Wisconsin to just one offensive score and only 209 yards of total offense. The league honor was the first of Hubbard's Alabama career. Hubbard was also named the Panini Senior Bowl Defensive Player of the Week as well as the Paycom Jim Thorpe Award Defensive Back of the Week for his efforts against Wisconsin.

RETURN TO SENDER: The Alabama defense has recorded interception returns for touchdowns in consecutive games, highlighted by DaShawn Jones' 18-yard pick-six at South Carolina on Oct. 25 and Zabien Brown's 99-yard score against then-No. 11 Tennessee on Oct. 18. The 2025 season marks the first occasion the UA defense has produced interception returns for touchdowns in back-to-back games since 2020. The Tide last managed pick-sixes in three straight games in 2018.

ON THE MARGINS: Alabama has created 14 turnovers over its first eight games, split by eight interceptions and six fumbles. As a result, UA's plus-nine turnover margin currently leads the SEC and is tied for the fourth-best turnover margin in Division I. The Tide's 1.13 turnover margin per game is also the sixth-highest ratio in the country.

MAKING IT TOUGH: The Tide defense has been difficult to maneuver over its first eight outings, allowing just 312.1 total yards per game to begin the 2025 season. The 312.1 yards per game allowed stands as the fifth-best mark in the conference and the 24th-best figure in the country.

YOU SHALL NOT PASS: The Crimson Tide has been stout in its pass defense through eight games so far this season. Alabama has allowed an average of just 163.0 passing yards over its first eight contests, the second-best figure in the SEC and the 12th-best mark in the NCAA.

POINTS AT A PREMIUM: The Alabama defense has been tough to produce points against through eight games. Alabama's defense owns a scoring average of just 18.3 points per game, the fifth-lowest mark in the SEC and the 20th-best average in Division I. The Tide defense has been especially stingy in the red zone over its first eight contests, having allowed points in 14-of-20 red zone opportunities (70.0 percent), the lowest average in the SEC and the eighth-best mark in Division I. As well, Alabama's 20 total red zone opportunities allowed is the fourth-fewest among SEC teams.

GETTING OFF THE FIELD: Alabama has surrendered just 135 first down conversions through eight games, the fourth-fewest allowed in the SEC and the 16th-fewest among all Division I defenses.

HALFTIME ADJUSTMENTS SINCE FSU: The Crimson Tide defense has played its best football in the second half of games this season. Over the last seven games, the Tide has allowed an average of just 9.1 points in the second half of those games, including two second half shutouts. Alabama has also surrendered an average of only 156.7 yards over the final 30 minutes of regulation since Week 2, including an average of just 69.1 rushing yards and 87.8 passing yards during the current stretch.

BACKFIELD BARRAGE: The Alabama defense tallied 12.0 tackles for loss (-31 yards) in the Tide's 73-0 win over ULM on Sept. 6. The 12.0 tackles for loss were the most by a UA defense since Nov. 27, 2021, when Alabama recorded 15.0 tackles for loss (-70 yards) at Auburn in a four-overtime affair. The Tide's 12.0 tackles for loss against the Warhawks are the most recorded in regulation since Nov. 13, 2021 against New Mexico State when Alabama matched the total with 12.0 tackles for loss (-44 yards).

TURNOVERS, TURNOVERS, TURNOVERS: Alabama has forced at least one turnover in 130 of the last 147 contests (dating back to the start of the 2015 season). During the current run, Alabama has forced 237 turnovers (151 interceptions, 86 fumbles) and returned 45 of those miscues for touchdowns.

SHUTOUTS SINCE 2007: Since 2007, Alabama has recorded 29 shutouts, including 13 in Southeastern Conference play. The Crimson Tide most recently kept ULM off the scoreboard in its 73-0 win on Sept. 6, the largest margin of victory in a shutout in program history, surpassing the previous best margin of 66-0 against Cal on Sept. 15, 1973. Alabama produced two shutouts in 2024, including a 34-0 win over then-No. 21/17 Missouri on Oct. 26 and a 63-0 win over Western Kentucky on Aug. 31. The Crimson Tide defense has 12 more shutouts than its nearest competitor, with Ohio State's 17 shutouts the next-closest total in that span.

HARD TO FIND THE END ZONE AGAINST THE TIDE: Since the start of the 2009 season, no team has allowed fewer touchdowns than the Crimson Tide. Alabama has surrendered only 412 touchdowns over the last 229 games. That is 41 fewer than second-place Iowa (453).

TOUGH SLEDDING ON THE GROUND: Alabama's defense has been a force in the run game since 2007. More recently, the Tide has given up just 116 rushing scores in the last 147 games (dating to the start of the 2015 season). Since 2007, UA has allowed the fewest rushing touchdowns in the nation at 172, a total that is 18 fewer than second-place Iowa (190).

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

A FRESH START ON SPECIAL TEAMS: Following the graduations of punter James Burnip, long snapper Kneeland Hibbett and placekicker Graham Nicholson, the Crimson Tide was tasked with replacing all three specialists this season for the first time since 2010.

DOUD PUNTED LOUD: Alabama punter Blake Doud was crucial to the Tide's 29-22 win at South Carolina on Oct. 25. The Colorado native was called on for five punts and accumulated 277 yards, averaging 55.4 yards per punt. Doud's afternoon was highlighted by a 60-yard boot, with all of five his punts exceeding 50-plus yards, including three kicks that pinned USC inside its own 20-yard line. The Gamecocks managed just two returns for a combined 17 yards. SC entered the game with a special teams unit averaged 18.1 yards per return, the second-best mark in the SEC and 11th-best number in the country.

SERIES NOTES

THE ALABAMA-LSU SERIES: Alabama and LSU will meet for the 90th time when the two rivals square off on Saturday evening inside Saban Field at Bryant-Denny Stadium. The Crimson Tide holds a 57-27-5 (.669) all-time advantage in the series which dates back to the 1895 season. That record includes a 15-10 mark in Tuscaloosa.

ALABAMA-LSU AT VARIOUS SITES: The Alabama-LSU series has been played at six different sites since the initial meeting in 1895. The city of Baton Rouge has hosted the most games in the series (42), with Alabama posting a 30-10-2 record on the LSU campus. New Orleans is the only other Louisiana city to host the series, with Alabama and LSU playing to a 7-7 tie in New Orleans in 1921 and the Crimson Tide claiming the 2011 national championship inside the Superdome, 21-0, over the Tigers. Four Alabama cities have played host to this rivalry, including Tuscaloosa (15-10), Mobile (1-2-1), Montgomery (2-0) and Birmingham (8-5-1).

ALABAMA-LSU SERIES IS A LONG ONE: The LSU series is tied for the third-longest series in Alabama history. The two teams first met on Nov. 23, 1895, the 15th game in Crimson Tide history, and the 2025 game marks the 90th meeting between the two teams. Only Tennessee and Mississippi State, tied at 108 apiece, have played Alabama more than LSU. The series with the Bayou Bengals is also the fourth-oldest in UA history with a current SEC member, trailing only Auburn (1892), Ole Miss (1894) and Georgia, which played Alabama for the first time on Nov. 2, 1895, three weeks before the Tide's first game with LSU.

GENERAL NOTES

ALABAMA DEGREES: Alabama has seen significant success on the field over the last 17 seasons and that success has coincided with the Tide's efforts in the classroom. The 2025 squad is no exception as the Crimson Tide entered the season with 16 student-athletes who already had their degree in-hand. The list of student-athletes who entered 2025 with an SEC Graduate patch include: Parker Brailsford, Prince Butler, MJ Chirgwin, Josh Cuevas, Blake Doud, Nikhai Hill-Green, Justin Jefferson, Tim Keenan III, Peter Knudson, Jah-Marien Latham, Deontae Lawson, Danny Lewis Jr., Jam Miller, Jaeden Roberts, Ty Simpson and Geno VanDeMark.

CHAMPIONS IN THE CLASSROOM: Alabama's achievements in the classroom have been most impressive during national title seasons. Those six squads (2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017 and 2020) included 139 student-athletes who had earned their degrees prior to game time.

APR SUCCESS: According to the most recent Academic Progress Rate (APR) numbers that were announced by the NCAA in May of 2025, figures that cover the four-year period extending from the 2020-21 through 2023-24 school years, the Crimson Tide continued to score well above the national cutoff standard. The Crimson Tide boasted 10 teams that led their respective sport in the SEC in APR numbers with 12 UA squads setting or tying all-time program-high marks for the four-year average. Altogether, it adds up to an average APR score of 994.9 across the university's 21 sports. In fact, this year's report marks the fourth consecutive year Alabama's overall average score rated over a 992. A total of seven Alabama teams led the nation in APR rankings (men's and women's cross country, men's and women's golf, softball, women's tennis and volleyball), with women's golf earning the honor for the 14th consecutive year.

LEADING BY EXAMPLE: Alabama defensive lineman LT Overton has received national acclaim for his contributions both on and off the field. On Sept. 30, Overton was among 67 student-athletes selected to the Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year Award Watch List, a unique award given to a player that demonstrates a record of leadership by exhibiting exceptional courage, integrity and sportsmanship both on and off the field. Overton was also one of 116 candidates named to the 2025 Allstate Wuerffel Trophy Watch List as announced by the Wuerffel Foundation on July 31. Overton has grown into a consistent volunteer since arriving in Tuscaloosa, using his platform to benefit the community and underprivileged youth. The Georgia native has made frequent stops at the Tuscaloosa Juvenile Detention Center to mentor at-risk children, also appearing at local schools in town to speak to students regarding the importance of academics. His service commitments also include the Boys & Girls Club and the Two Roads Autism Center, with Overton sponsoring a student at his alma mater, Milton (Ga.) High School, providing equipment funds for multiple sports. Former Crimson Tide offensive lineman Barrett Jones stands as the lone recipient of Wuerffel Trophy, earning the honor in 2011.

OVERTON NAMED CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST: Alabama defensive lineman LT Overton was named a 2025 William V. Campbell Trophy semifinalist, the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF) announced Sept. 24. The Campbell Trophy recognizes an individual as the best football scholar-athlete in the nation for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership. Overton is on track to graduate this December with a bachelor's degree in sport management, owning a current a 3.43 undergraduate GPA. The Crimson Tide has had two Campbell Trophy winners in its history, first with Barrett Jones in 2012 followed by Jalen Milroe last season.

LOMBARDI AWARD MIDSEASON WATCH LIST: Alabama placed five players on the Lombardi Award Midseason Watch List, including Parker Brailsford, Tim Keenan III, Deontae Lawson, LT Overton and Kady Proctor, the award's committee announced on Oct. 15. The five Alabama student-athletes are among 65 players up for the Lombardi Award, which is presented annually to the nation's best college offensive or defensive lineman. The winner of the 2025 Lombardi Award will be announced at a ceremony in Houston, Texas, on Dec. 10. Alabama has seen three players in program history earn the award, including Will Anderson Jr. (2022), Jonathan Allen (2016) and Cornelius Bennett (1986).

SABAN TO THE HALL: Former Alabama head coach Nick Saban was selected as part of the 2025 College Football Hall of Fame class, the National Football Foundation announced on Jan. 10. A seven-time national championship coach, Saban is the fifth Alabama coach to be elected to the College Football Hall of Fame and the 27th inductee in program history. He completed his Hall-of-Fame career at the conclusion of the 2023 season, winning six national championships with Alabama and seven overall with his first title coming at LSU in 2003. A nine-time National Coach of the Year, Saban coached collegiate football for 28 seasons, producing a 297-71-1 (.806) record, including a 206-29 (.877) mark in Tuscaloosa. His teams at Alabama won nine SEC Championships while he captured 11 SEC titles in his career (2001 and 2003 at LSU).

226 NATIONAL TV APPEARANCES IN 240 GAMES: The Crimson Tide's matchup at South Carolina on Oct. 25 was the Tide's 226th nationally televised or streamed game since the start of the 2008 season, including every contest since the start of 2014.

BEATING THE BEST: The Crimson Tide is 87-23 (.790) against the Associated Press Top 25 since the start of 2008. That record includes four consecutive wins over AP Top 25 opponents in as many weeks, such as Alabama's 37-20 win over then-No. 11 Tennessee, a 27-24 win at then-No.14 Missouri, a 30-14 victory over then-No. 16 Vanderbilt, and a 24-21 win at then-No. 5 Georgia. Alabama became the first team in SEC history to produce four consecutive wins over AP-ranked opponents in a four-week span. The Tide had three ranked wins in 2024, including Alabama's 42-13 win over then-No. 14 LSU on Nov. 9, a 34-0 win over then-No. 21 Missouri on Oct. 26 and a 41-34 win over then-No. 2 Georgia on Sept. 28. Since 2007, Alabama has 27 wins over AP top-five teams, the most in the country. LSU has produced the next-closest win total with 13.

ALABAMA vs. No. 1: Alabama owns the NCAA record for the most wins all-time against the Associated Press Poll's No. 1 team since the poll was introduced in 1936. The Crimson Tide has compiled 11 wins against the AP's top-ranked team in program history, most recently against then-No. 1 Georgia in the 2023 Southeastern Conference Championship Game. Prior to that, the Tide downed the top-ranked Bulldogs in the 2021 SEC Championship Game.

AGAINST THE TOP 10: Alabama owns an 87-80-1 (.516) all-time record against teams ranked in the top-10 of the Associated Press Poll, including the Tide's 24-21 win at then-No. 5 Georgia on Sept. 27. Since the start of the 2008 season, the Crimson Tide has posted a 38-14 (.730) overall record against top-10 teams, including a 23-8 (.741) mark versus the top 10 since the inception of the College Football Playoff.

DEBOER AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS: Alabama head coach Kalen DeBoer is 19-3 (.863) across 22 career matchups with teams ranked in the Associated Press Top 25, including an impressive 6-1 (.857) mark against top-10 teams. DeBoer owns a 7-1 (.875) record against AP Top 25 opponents since arriving at Alabama in 2024, including the Tide's 37-20 win over then-No. 11 Tennessee on Oct. 18, a 27-24 win at then-No. 14 Missouri on Oct. 11, a 30-14 win over then-No. 16 Vanderbilt on Oct. 4 and a 24-21 win at then-No. 5 Georgia on Sept. 27. Last season, Alabama produced three AP Top 25 wins including his first with the Crimson Tide, a 41-34 win over then-No. 2 Georgia on Sept. 28. DeBoer's first career matchup against a top-25 foe at the FBS level came at Fresno State on Sept. 4, 2021, with the Bulldogs falling at No. 11 Oregon. Following the loss to the Ducks, DeBoer-led teams at Fresno and Washington proceeded to reel off 12 straight wins against ranked foes, including six victories in 2023. The winning streak was snapped following Washington's 34-13 loss to top-ranked Michigan in the 2025 CFP National Championship Game.

RANKED ON RANKED: Head coach Kalen DeBoer owns a 15-2 (.882) record in 17 career games as a head coach in ranked matchups at the Division I level. DeBoer's .882 winning percentage stands as the best winning percentage among all active head coaches that have appeared in at least 10 ranked matchups.

ALABAMA-U.S. NAVY PARTNERSHIP: The University of Alabama announced on Sept. 3 a significant partnership with the U.S. Navy's Maritime Industrial Base (MIB) Program to expand workforce development opportunities across Alabama and strengthen America's shipbuilding industrial base. As part of the initiative Build Giants Alabama, Crimson Tide fans will notice the program's logo featured on Saban Field at Bryant-Denny Stadium during all home football games this fall as well as in-venue messaging featuring former Alabama head football coach Nick Saban on the importance of the Build Giants Alabama initiative. The visibility highlights a larger effort to connect Alabama's statewide talent with a critical workforce development program for the state and the country.

BAMA IN THE NFL

LEADING THE WAY TO THE NFL: As of the 2025 NFL Draft, Alabama has had more draft picks over the last 17 drafts (140) than any other program in the nation. The list of 140 features 16 Super Bowl champions, 44 Pro Bowl selections and 20 First Team All-Pro members along with one Defensive Player of the Year, one Offensive and one Defensive Rookie of the Year.

2025 NFL DRAFT: The Crimson Tide saw seven former players selected in the 2025 NFL Draft, including two first-rounders in offensive lineman Tyler Booker (No. 12, Dallas Cowboys) and linebacker Jihaad Campbell (No. 31, Philadelphia Eagles). The third round featured quarterback Jalen Milroe (Seattle Seahawks), while the fourth round saw defensive back Malachi Moore (New York Jets) and linebacker Que Robinson (Denver Broncos) selected by their respective franchises. Day three concluded with the Seahawks adding tight end Robbie Ouzts (fifth round) before defensive tackle Tim Smith was picked by the Indianapolis Colts in the sixth round.

QUICK HITS ON ALABAMA'S NFL DRAFT SUCCESS: Below is a look at some of Alabama's recent success in the NFL Draft.

- Over the last 17 NFL Drafts, Alabama has produced 140 total picks which is more than any other program in the nation. Of those 140, an impressive 49 (35.0 percent) have been first-rounders.
- Since 2000, the Crimson Tide has produced an NCAA-leading 51 first-rounders, a number that is nine better than the next closest school Ohio State (42)

- Since 2010, Alabama has had an NCAA-best 48 players selected in the first round, a number that nearly doubles the next closest school in OSU (29).
- With the selection of Tyler Booker in the 2025 NFL Draft, Alabama has had at least one player selected in the first round of 17 straight drafts (2009-present) to set the new NCAA record. The Crimson Tide passed Miami (1995-2008), who owned the old mark of 14 consecutive first-rounders.
- Alabama has produced multiple first round picks in 14 of the last 17 NFL Drafts with single first-round selections in 2009, 2015 and 2016.

CRIMSON TIDE IN THE NFL: Alabama entered Week 10 of the 2025-26 NFL regular season with 67 players on rosters (including reserve/practice squad) and is represented on 26 of the league's 32 teams. Alabama had 69 total players (including reserve/practice squad) overall and 62 on an active 53-man roster in Week 1 of the 2025-26 regular season, the most of any program in college football. The next closest schools for active players were Georgia and Ohio State with 57 followed by Michigan at 44 and LSU and Notre Dame with 39 apiece to round out the top five. Below is a look at where former Crimson Tide standouts are currently playing:

LEADERS IN THE LEAGUE: Every year, the National Football League allows each of its 32 teams to name up to eight team captains. The start of the 2025-26 season featured eight former Crimson Tide players who were selected as one of the permanent captains for their respective squads. The list of captains to start the year included Will Anderson Jr. (Texans), Bradley Bozeman (Chargers), Jalen Hurts (Eagles), Calvin Ridley (Titans), Tua Tagovailoa (Dolphins), Quinnen Williams (Jets), Mack Wilson Sr. (Cardinals) and Bryce Young (Panthers). Despite featuring Alabama players on their rosters, the Commanders, Cowboys, Packers, Ravens and Seahawks all do not name permanent team captains for the season or select captains on a game-by-game basis.

75 IN A SEASON: A total of 75 former Crimson Tide players appeared in a game and recorded at least one snap through all 18 weeks of the 2024-25 regular season, setting a new NFL record. The 75 topped the previous mark of 71, which was also set by UA during the 2023-24 campaign. Prior to that, the Tide became the only program to have 70 former players see game action in any regular season in league history during 2022-23 season. The number of former Alabama players to play in an NFL regular-season contest has now increased each year for eight consecutive seasons starting with 38 in 2016. The 2017 season saw 44 former players earn game action, breaking Alabama's previous record of 40 in 1987, and was followed by 52 in 2018. The total moved to 62 in 2019, followed by 64 in 2020, 68 in 2021, 70 in 2022 and 71 in 2023.

POSTSEASON TIDE: Alabama was well-represented in the 2024-25 NFL Playoffs with a league-high 38 former players spotting 12 of the 14 rosters. The Tide's postseason players were as follows: six apiece on both the Eagles (Dickerson, Hurts, Ricks, D. Smith, Steen, By. Young) and Texans (Anderson Jr., Averett, C. Harris, Metchie III, Smith Jr., To'oTo'o); four apiece on the Chargers (Bozeman, Eboigbe, E. Jackson, Scott), Lions (Arnold, Branch, Gibbs, Ja. Williams) and Ravens (Armour-Davis, Dalcourt, Henry, Humphrey); three apiece on the Commanders (Allen, Payne, Robinson Jr.) and Vikings (Reichard, C. Robinson, Turner); two apiece on the Bills (Cooper, K. Jackson), Packers (Jacobs, McKinney) and Steelers (Fitzpatrick, N. Harris); and one total on the Broncos (Surtain II) and Buccaneers (Braswell).

ALL-PRO DBU: Alabama had three defensive backs selected to the 2024 All-Pro Team, as voted on by the Associated Press. The trio included Patrick Surtain II (cornerback), Xavier McKinney (safety) and Marlon Humphrey (slot corner). Surtain II received the most votes of any defensive player with 49 first-team votes and one second-team selection out of the 50 total voters. Additionally, Derrick Henry was selected to the All-Pro Second Team at running back.

CERTAINLY SURTAIN: Former Alabama defensive back Patrick Surtain II was named the 2024 Associated Press NFL Defensive Player of the Year on Feb. 6, becoming just the second Denver Broncos player in franchise history to earn the honor and the first former UA player to be named Defensive Player of the Year since the award was created in 1971. Surtain is just 10th player in NFL history — joining the likes of Hall of Famers Lawrence Taylor and Reggie White — to earn Defensive Player of the Year and a pair of first team All-Pro selections in his first four NFL seasons. In addition to tying a career high with four interceptions and posting double-digit passes defended, Surtain II ranked at the top of the league in nearly every advanced metric. Among cornerbacks with at least 400 coverage snaps, Surtain II ranked first in fewest yards allowed (306), fewest yards allowed per coverage snap (0.6), lowest target rate (10.9 percent) and fewest air yards per target (7.1), according to Next Gen Stats.

• Kalen DeBoer has produced unprecedented results at every stop of his coaching career. His hard work and dedication to his craft has shaped one of the most impressive resumes in college football after just 10 years as a head coach.

• DeBoer's coaching philosophy stresses the importance of class, integrity and academic success. He has a passion for bringing people together while building the total program. DeBoer believes in creating an environment that allows his players to thrive. He holds a deep commitment to developing the young men in his program and investing in them both on and off the field as they prepare for their next steps in life.

• DeBoer and his staff believe in developing players athletically, academically, socially and spiritually so that they leave the program as better men. Beyond winning football games, it is about building a culture within the program that is contagious and producing a team that loves each other and are willing to play for each other.

• There are three non-negotiables in DeBoer's program that have stood the test of time and resulted in stunning success: family, accountability and toughness.

• During his 27 years in coaching, he has consistently prospered at multiple levels and in different roles, helping to build and revitalize programs while establishing a diverse network of contacts across the country, in both coaching and recruiting. In his first 10 seasons as a head coach, DeBoer accumulated a record of 113-16, which includes a 25-3 record in his previous stop with the Washington Huskies and three NAIA National Championships at Sioux Falls.

• Entering 2025, DeBoer owned a 15-3 record against top-25 teams across his five combined seasons at Fresno State, Washington and Alabama. He also boasted a staggering 26-8 record in one-score contests across his first 10 years as a head coach.

• DeBoer took on an unprecedented challenge in his first season in Tuscaloosa, replacing arguably the greatest coach in the history of college football. The 2025 campaign saw the Crimson Tide finish 9-4, including a 3-1 record against ranked teams. DeBoer's nine victories matched Frank Thomas (1931) for the most wins by a first-year head coach in Alabama history.

• In 2023, he led Washington to the College Football Playoff National Championship Game with a victory over Texas in the Sugar Bowl. DeBoer's '23 group won the Pac-12 Championship and recorded the most wins in a season in program history (14). Additionally, he won the 2023 Associated Press, AFCA, Eddie Robinson, George Munger, Walter Camp, Sporting News and Home Depot Coach of the Year awards.

• DeBoer became the first Washington coach to win 11-or-more games in consecutive seasons after going 11-2 in 2022 and 14-1 in 2023 and the first to win a bowl game in his first season with the Huskies. That success resulted in back-to-back Pac-12 Coach of the Year honors. His Washington squads also went 10-1 against ranked teams, and he is 18-3 in playoff games as a head coach, including his stint at Sioux Falls.

• In his first year at UW, he led the Huskies to an 11-2 overall record after Washington finished 4-8 the previous year. They posted a 3-0 mark against ranked teams and a win over Texas in the Valero Alamo Bowl. His Huskies swept their three Northwest rivals and finished in a tie for second in the Pac-12, while he was named Pac-12 Co-Coach of the Year.

• Prior to his time at UW, DeBoer spent two seasons at Fresno State, which included the pandemic-shortened 2020 season. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs made great strides on both sides of the ball, posting a combined 12-6 record. Fresno was 4-8 in 2019 prior to DeBoer's arrival.

• In 2021, Fresno State went 9-3 under DeBoer. The 2020 season saw the Bulldogs finish at 3-3 overall.

• Prior to Fresno, DeBoer was on staff at Indiana University as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He helped guide the Hoosiers to an 8-5 record and a berth in the Gator Bowl. IU's eight victories in 2019 matched their highest wins total in 26 seasons, and IU ranked No. 3 in the Big Ten in total offense. Indiana averaged 432.8 yards of total offense per game, throwing for 302.4 yards per contest while rushing for 130.4.

• DeBoer joined then-head coach Jeff Tedford as the Fresno State offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2017. In two seasons in that role, DeBoer helped the Bulldogs to overall records of 10-4 (2017) and 12-2 (2018), along with two division titles, two bowl game victories and the Mountain West Conference Championship in 2018.

• After the 2009 season, he took a job at Southern Illinois as offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach from 2010 through 2013. He moved to Eastern Michigan as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 2014 through 2016, helping the Eagles to their third-ever bowl-game berth in 2016. plays (99).

• A school-record setting wide receiver at the University of Sioux Falls (S.D.), DeBoer later led his alma mater to three NAIA National Championships in five seasons as head coach, winning titles in 2006, 2008 and 2009, while also finishing as runner-up in 2007 and making the semifinals in his first season as head coach in 2005. During his five seasons at Sioux Falls, DeBoer compiled a 67-3 overall record, including a 49-1 mark in Great Plains Athletic Conference play. He was NAIA National Coach of the Year in each of his three championship seasons at USF.

• A 1998 graduate of Sioux Falls with a degree in secondary education, DeBoer was a record-setting football and baseball student-athlete. During his football career, he compiled 3,400 yards and 33 touchdowns on 234 career receptions – all school records at the time – and played on the 1996 NAIA Division II National Championship team.

• He also played baseball for the Cougars, batting .520 (still a school record) as a senior in 1998. His career average of .492 is tops in USF history, as are his 37 career homers and .944 slugging percentage.


