4th Year at LSU · 11th Year as a Head Coach

LSU Coach Matt McMahon has built his program around five core values that define his approach both on and off the court: hard work, unselfishness, toughness, accountability and joy.

Those values were among the first principles he shared when introduced as the 25th head coach in program history on March 22, 2022, and they continue to guide every aspect of LSU Basketball today.

Now entering his fourth season at the helm, Coach McMahon leads a Tigers team energized by a strong recruiting class that blends proven transfers with talented freshmen. The 2025-26 squad is poised to build on the foundation laid in recent years, with an emphasis on chemistry, relentless effort, and steady progress.

This current group thrives on its chemistry, playing for each other with toughness, accountability, and an unselfish spirit. Their joy for the game is evident every time they take the floor, uniting players, coaches, and fans alike.

Guided by those five core principles, the Tigers have continued to strengthen the program's foundation, setting the stage for growth in 2025-26. With added talent and depth at all positions, this year's roster is built to take the next step forward.

Player development remains a cornerstone in the Matt McMahon LSU basketball program.

Robert Miller III enters his sophomore season ready to build on flashes of promise from his freshman year. Over the summer, Miller has committed himself to individual skill development and strength training to add both power and polish his game.

Jalen Reed returns for his redshirt junior season after an early December ACL injury cut short what had been a breakout year. Known for his drive and work ethic, Reed attacked his rehab this summer showing steady progress toward a full return.

The summer has given new players valuable time to work closely with the coaching staff and strength and conditioning coach Mike Chatman, focusing on improving their skills and physical readiness for the long season ahead.

The program has already shown it can take measurable steps forward under Matt McMahon's leadership. In 2024, LSU advanced to postseason play after back-to-back wins over No. 11 South Carolina, 64-63, in Columbia and then a 75-74 win over No. 17 Kentucky in BR.

Last season, LSU showed what it was capable of, beating Florida State in its SEC/ACC Challenge game, winning a triple-overtime win at the Greenbrier over UCF, a road victory at Kansas State, and an amazing rally in the final minute to win at Oklahoma.

McMahon's track record of building winning cultures was firmly established during his seven seasons at Murray State. Coach McMahon led the Racers to a record of 154-67 (.697) including: 93 OVC regular season wins, winning 75 percent of league games.

During his tenure, he has also coached multiple all-Americans and all-conference players. The most notable was Ja Morant, who went on to become the 2020 NBA Rookie of the Year.

Under McMahon the Racers won regular season league titles in 2018, 2019, 2020 and 2022 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2018, 2019 and 2022.

In his final season at Murray State in 2021-22, McMahon coached OVC Player of the Year KJ Williams and two other first-teamers (Tevin Brown, Justice Hill). In addition, McMahon was named the league's Coach of the Year.

McMahon's Racers, in 2021-22, were just the sixth team in league history to go undefeated. Murray State then won the league tournament to advance to the NCAA Tournament where the Racers defeated San Francisco in the opening round.

The 2021-22 team was one of seven teams to win 30 or more games that season and led the nation in win percentage at 91.2 percent.

The 2018-19 team won 28 games and made its mark in the NCAA Tournament when the 12th-seeded Racers won their fourth all-time tourney game over No. 5 seed Marquette.

Morant that year was named the OVC POY, leading Division I in assists and earning first-team All-America honors. In the NCAA Tournament win over Marquette, Morant posted a triple double of 17 points, 11 rebounds and 16 assists as he became the eighth player to record a triple double in the tournament.

He was drafted second overall in the 2019 NBA draft by the Memphis Grizzlies.

Prior to being named head coach, he was a key part of Coach Steve Prohm's staff as assistant at Murray State as the Racers won a pair of Ohio Valley Conference championships, a CollegelInsider.

com Tournament championship and an appearance in the NIT. He was part of a staff that won 104 games from 2011-15.

PRIOR TO MURRAY STATE

Coach McMahon has had success in college basketball since his days as a player at

Appalachian State.

Known as an excellent shooter and tough competitor, he played on three Southern Conference regular season title teams in 1998, 1999 and 2000. He earned All-Tournament honors in 1999. The Mountaineers won the SoCon Tournament in 2000 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

He played in 117 career games under coach Buzz Peterson and made 135 three-pointers, graduating in 2000.

His coaching career began immediately at Appalachian State as assistant under Houston Fancher in 2000-01. He would rejoin Peterson's staff as a graduate assistant coach at Tennessee before returning to ASU in 2002 as assistant and later associate head coach, where he stayed until the end of the 2009-10 season. A year at UNC Wilmington (2010-11) as assistant coach set the stage for his journey to Murray State, starting first as an assistant in the 2011-12 season and then as head coach prior to the 2015-16 season.

Coach McMahon and his wife Mary, a former standout for the Furman women's basketball team, have three children – Maris, Mason and Mabry.

NOTABLES

- * Tigers rally at Boston College in overtime, 78-69, to help the SEC win six on the final night and get a 9-7 decision in the ACC/SEC Challenge.
- * After having 1-of-12 shooting runs from the field on three different occasions, LSU goes 8-of-8 to close the first half; makes the final two field goals in the last minute to force overtime; and, in the extra session the Tigers go an unprecedented 3-of-3 from the field, including one made three-pointer and 10-of-10 at the free throw line.
- * LSU's win came while trailing after 35 minutes of play, the sixth time in 54 games in the Matt McMahon era in which the Tigers rallied to win.
- * For Matt McMahon it makes the Tigers 3-0 in OT under his watch. Sixth straight OT win for LSU, dating back to 2020-21 season.
- * LSU wins the Emerald Coast Classic for the second time (2021, 2025) with 96-63 win over DePaul (11/30). Point guard Dedan Thomas Jr., was the MVP of the event.
- * That was LSU's 16th all-time in-season tournament victory dating back to 1947.
- * LSU has scored 90-plus points in six of eight games this year, including the first five. That streak was the longest for LSU since the Tigers started with nine straight 90-points games in the 1990-91 season when Shaquille O'Neal was a sophomore.
- * The 96 points by LSU against DePaul was the most points the Tigers have scored against a Big East program, topping 91 scored by LSU in a loss to Villanova in the 1990 Tipoff Classic (91-93).
- * The Tigers shooting percentage in the championship game of 68.6 percent (35-51) was LSU's second best of the season. It was the second-best shooting percentage ever in a game away from Baton Rouge dating back to 1956-57 topped only by the 71.4 percent vs. Clemson on Dec. 20, 1969.
- * The 36-point margin of victory was the biggest margin of victory in a non-Baton Rouge game since Feb. 16, 2000, at Ole Miss (97-53, +44).
- * LSU held DePaul to just 19 rebounds, the first team to have less than 20 boards since Nov. 9, 2018 when LSU held UNCG to 18 rebounds.
- * Dedan Thomas Jr., had 11 assists versus Omaha (11/21), the first double digit assist game by a Tiger since 2022.
- * As the weekend starts, LSU is one of 15 undefeated teams left in Division I men's basketball ... Combined with the women's team, the two LSU teams are a combined 17-0 prior to the Sunday game.
- * LSU will be trying to record its first win over an AP Top 25 team since beating Kentucky in Baton Rouge on Feb. 21m 2024. Since then, LSU has lost 10 straight to AP-ranked teams.
- * LSU is 27-0 under Coach McMahon when four different players score in double figures.
- * LSU's 28 days between home games (Nov. 21 to Dec. 19) is the longest in-season time between home games since 30 days (played games Dec. 13 to Jan. 12) in 2005; prior to that, 29 in 1988.

TEXAS TECH SERIES

These teams have played nine previous times since the first meeting in Baton Rouge in 1957 and the series has gone in groups of three – Texas Tech won the first three, LSU the middle three, Texas Tech the last three. So that adds up to a 6-3 advantage for the Red Raiders. The last three came in SEC/Big 12 challenge games in 2017, 2021 and 2023.

This will be the first time the teams have met on a neutral floor.

TEXAS TECH UPDATES

The Red Raiders are 6-2 on the season, having won their last two contests against New Orleans, 82-50 on Nov. 26 and Wyoming, 76-72, one Sunday ago. In the Wyoming game, JT Toppin led the way with 27 points, hitting 11-of-18 field goals with nine boards, while Lejuan Watts had 19 and Christian Anderson 15 and five assists.

Texas Tech was 27-of-55 for the game from the field (49.1%), making 4-of-17 from distance and 18-of-30 (60%) from the free throw line. The game was tied eight times and there were seven lead changes. Half of Texas Tech's points came in the paint and rebounds were even.

Toppin leads the team in scoring and rebounding at 22.1 points a game and 11.0 rebounds, with Anderson at 18.1 points, Donovan Atwell at 12.4 and Watts scoring at an 11.6 clip.

Grant McCasland is in his third season as the head coach at Texas Tech, after a six-year stint at North Texas.

NEUTRAL SITE GAMES

LSU is 2-0 in neutral court games this season, defeating Drake and Duke in the Emerald Coast Classic in Niceville, Florida over the Thanksgiving weekend. Coach Matt McMahon at LSU is 9-8 in neutral court games, with this being the third of four in the regular season for the Tigers.

Overall, LSU is 172-185 (48.2 percent) all-time on neutral courts.

AGAINST RANKED TEAMS

LSU all-time has 95 wins all-time against AP media poll ranked teams (95-291, 24.6%). The Tigers last win was a wild buzzer beating bucket by Tyrell Ward against No. 17 Kentucky on Feb. 21, 2024. The Tigers won, 75-74.

LSU has lost 10 straight games since then against AP ranked opponents. All-time, LSU is 2-7 against No. 19th ranked teams.

RECAP: The Tigers rallied with two Dedan Thomas Jr., baskets in the final minute to force overtime in its first game on an opponent's home court and then Thomas scored the first four points of overtime as LSU pitched a perfect overtime line of 3-3 FGs, 1-1 3FGs and 10-10 FTs to win going away to help the SEC to a 9-7 decision in the ACC/SEC challenge. LSU made its last eight FGs of the first half to build a 37-26 lead, but BC came back to take a five-point lead with entering the final five minutes before the Tigers rallied.

Thomas had 23 points and seven assists, while Marquel Sutton had 18 points and 13 rebounds. Mike Nwoko and Max Mackinnon each posted 12 points.

POINT GUARD DEDAN THOMAS JR., RALLIES TIGERS AGAINST BC; EARNS EMERALD COAST MVP HONORS

To say the last 10 days have been good for LSU point guard Dedan (DJ) Thomas Jr, may be an understatement.

Against Boston College (12/3), Thomas led the Tigers with 23 points, had seven assists. He made the last two buckets in the final minute to tie the game in regulation, then posted a basket and two free throws to lead off overtime that got LSU the lead for good.

On Nov. 28-29 Thomas averaged 15.0 points per game, making 11-of-21 from the field with three treys, 10 assists and three turnovers to earn MVP honors in the Emerald Coast Classic.

It's just more in the numbers that Thomas has posted as he has become LSU's best true point guard since Tremont Waters (2018-19). Here are some of his other numbers:

11 assists vs. Omaha (11/21) – First double figure assists game for LSU since Feb. 2022 ... First assist game of at least 11 for LSU since Jan. 2019.
17 assists in LSU's last two home games and no turnovers – over 56 minutes against Alcorn (11/18) and Omaha (11/21).
The seven assists against Boston College was the eighth game of five assists or more this season for Thomas.
SEC leader in assists (7.00 assists, no one else higher than 5.44), 5.09 assist-turnover ratio. Sixth in NCAA in assist average; seventh in NCAA in assist-turnover ratio.

THIRD TIME MCMAHON'S TIGERS HOLD OPPONENTS SHOOTING UNDER 30 PERCENT

LSU's defensive ability was on display against New Orleans (11/10) as the Tigers held UNO to just 29.9 percent from the field (20-of-67), the third time in Matt McMahon's tenure at LSU, that the Tiger defense kept a team from reaching the 30.0 percent mark from the field. The three games in the McMahon era:

- 1. 25.4% (15-59) by Texas A&M (at College Station), 1/6/24**
- 2. 25.9% (14-54) by Akron (at Cayman Islands), 11/22/22**
- 3. 29.9% (20-67) by UNO (at Baton Rouge), 11/10/25**

LSU is 29-6 in the McMahon era when opponents shoot under 40 percent.

LSU FIVE TIMES OVER 50 PERCENT FROM FIELD

The Tigers were over 50 percent from the field for the fifth time this year against DePaul (11/30), and for the second time over 65 percent in the tournament win. The Tigers are 254-of-482 or 52.7 percent. LSU is sixth in the nation in field goal percentage.

LSU is 20-4 in the Matt McMahon era when shooting 50 percent or better in a game.

It was a record opener when LSU finished with a shooting percentage school mark of 71.7 percent for the game against Tarleton State (11/5) on Nov. 5.

LSU was 33-of-46 in the contest, sparked by the 16-of-21 in the first half of the game.

It marked the third time that an LSU basketball team has shot 70 percent or better in a basketball game:

71.7% -- vs. Tarleton State (in Baton Rouge) – 11/5/25

71.4% -- vs. Clemson (in Charlotte) – 12/20/69

70.3% -- vs. Centenary (in Baton Rouge) – 1/15/03

The game also set a record for best two-point field goal percentage (making 25-of-28), topping the mark of a game just the previous season:

89.3% -- vs. Tarleton State (in Baton Rouge) – 11/5/25

87.2% -- vs. Mississippi Valley (in Baton Rouge) – 12/29/24

75.8 -- vs. Memphis (in Lake Buena Vista, Florida) – 11/29/13

LSU is 10th in the nation in two-point field goal percentage at 62.7 percent, well up from last year, when the Tigers made 55.2 percent inside the arc.

POINTS IN THE PAINT

LSU has had seven games of 40+ points in the paint and three games of 50+ points in the paint this season:

58 – vs. Alcorn State, 11/18/25

54 – vs. DePaul, 11/30/25

50 – vs. FIU, 11/13/25

LSU GETS WITHIN SITE OF THREE-POINT RECORD AGAINST OMAHA

The Tigers for the second time this season, hit double digits from distance against Omaha (11/21) and this time they were within distance of the school mark.

The Tigers were 15-of-33 from the three-point arc, making nine in the first half and six in the second half. The 15 makes were tied for the fourth most in a single game in LSU history.

17 – vs. Vanderbilt, Dec. 29, 2016

17 – vs. Tennessee, March 1, 2003

16 – vs. Auburn, Feb. 26, 2003

15 – vs. Omaha, Nov. 21, 2025

15 – vs. Arkansas, Feb. 3, 2018

It was the most three-point makes in the Matt McMahon era at LSU, topping three games of 14 makes.

It's been a mixed bag in the first eight games as they have four games shooting better than 37 percent, three games in the 20s and then the lowest percentage of makes against BC (12/3) or 15.8 percent (3-of-19).

For the season, the Tigers are 56-of-116 from distance for 33.7 percent. Opponents are 64-of-206 or 31.1 percent.

FREE THROWS IMPROVED

Other than the Drake game in the semis of the ECC, the Tigers have been good at getting to the line and making free throws in the first eight games, making 78.4 percent from the line. LSU is getting to the line at a good clip, making 174-of-222 from the line, making 25 more free throws than opponents have attempted.

LSU has made 83 more free throws than opponents in the first eight games. Opponents are 91-of-149 overall (61.1 percent).

ON THE REBOUND SIDE

The New Orleans game (11/10) was the third time in the Matt McMahon era that LSU has pulled down 50 plus rebounds:

1 56 – vs. New Orleans, 11/10/25

2 56 – vs. UCF, 11/24/24

3 50 – vs. New Orleans, 12/22/24

Also unusual, was that both Marquel Sutton and Pablo Tamba's double doubles in that 56 rebound New Orleans game (11/10) were unique in that they both each had the same number of points and rebounds – Sutton 15-15, Tamba 10-10. That was the fourth time in the Coach McMahon era that two players had 10 or more rebounds in the same game:

Dec. 13, 2022 – KJ Williams 17, Derek Fountain 14

Dec. 29, 2023 – Derek Fountain 10, Hunter Dean 10

Dec. 22, 2024 – Corey Chest 10, Cam Carter 11

Nov. 10, 2025 – Marquel Sutton 15, Pablo Tamba 10

JALEN REED OUT FOR SEASON AGAIN

Jalen Reed left the Drake game in Niceville, Florida (11/28) just before the eight-minute second half media timeout and this past Tuesday, Coach McMahon issued the following statement on his status:

“Jalen Reed suffered a season-ending (left) Achilles tendon injury during (the Nov. 28) game versus Drake. He underwent successful surgery (Tuesday)

morning in Baton Rouge. We are absolutely heartbroken and devastated for Jalen. His journey back to the court has been inspiring to everyone in our program.

“Jalen is a team captain and leader as well as a soon to be LSU Graduate. He represents everything that is great about college athletics. While I cannot convey the depth of my disappointment for Jalen, I remain in admiration of his spirit and mental toughness. We look forward to supporting him in his recovery and cannot wait to see him back on the basketball court.”

Ironically, it was just over one year ago on Dec. 3, 2024 in the opening minutes of the ACC/SEC Challenge game against Florida State that Reed injured his right ACL and his subsequent surgery ended his 2024-25 season after eight games.

While Reed wasn't expected back until mid-December, he has been able to go on a minutes restriction off the bench through the first six games, scoring in double figures in four games.

He averaged 9.5 points per game, 5.7 rebounds a game in 18.0 minutes per game.

MIKE NWOKO LIVING UP TO WHAT HAS BEEN SEEN IN PRACTICE

He had up and down moments in his single seasons at Miami and Mississippi State, but the junior from Toronto, Canada has so far lived up to the ability and talent that those who watched practice all summer and fall believed to be available for the Tigers.

The point numbers are stacking up after eight games as he is the only Tiger in double figures each game, scoring 134 points (16.8 average).

He has already scored 57 points more than he did in 29 games at Miami as a freshman (77) and he is more than halfway to the points he scored (209) in his 34 games at Mississippi State.

Nwoko has games of 22 against New Orleans (11/10) and 29 against Alcorn (11/18). He is also averaging 5.6 rebounds and shooting 55-of-76 from the field (72.4 percent). He is second in the SEC in FG percentage and fifth in the NCAA.

Against Alcorn, he came very close to a double double with nine rebounds (six offensive). The 12 field goals made against Alcorn tied a league best for November through play on Thursday.

Of Nwoko, Coach Matt McMahon said recently: "Mike has been fantastic on the offensive end ... As we've talked in here in the last couple of months, I've been really pleased with his skill level. He's more skilled down in the post than we had anticipated coming in. He's worked hard in the player development program. You see him scoring jump hooks with each hand. At the end of the day, he's 6-10, 260 (pounds). I think he's using his physicality in a great fashion."

MARQUEL SUTTON

It was a good night for Marquel Sutton who saw many of the coaches and players he played with in 2025 from Omaha (11/21) as the Mavericks with Sutton won the Summit League regular season and tournament titles and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

Prior to the game, Omaha Coach Chris Crutchfield presented Sutton, the Summit Player of the Year, his championship rings and NCAA Tournament watch.

So far in his first eight games with the Tigers, Sutton has posted five double figure scoring games and four double doubles including the 18 points-13 rebounds in the win at BC (12/3).

Three were consecutive doubles and it has been since February-March of 2016 that an LSU player has posted three consecutive double doubles for the Tigers (Ben Simmons).

Sutton is averaging 13.3 points a game and 9.0 rebounds, this despite having just two rebounds in the opening game against Tarleton State (11/5). He is third in the league in rebound average.

Sutton is shooting 38-of-76 from the field (50.0 percent). Included in that are 12 three-pointers.

The Tulsa, Oklahoma product is averaging just under 29 minutes a game.

PABLO TAMBA

The UC-Davis transfer has started all eight games and while he is averaging just 6.0 points, it is totals like his 7.4 rebounds a game that impresses people and his ability to do several things for the Tigers. Against DePaul in the ECC championship game, he was 4-of-4 from the field and 6-of-6 from the line to score 14 points with seven rebounds. He is making 17-of-25 from the field (68.0 percent).

The DePaul game (12/29) was another contest where he had a huge +/- total of 25. Coach McMahon has talked about him on several media opportunities.

"He plays every possession like it's his last, all he cares about is winning, he's an unbelievable teammate, and he can guard every position on the floor. He's just a joy to coach every day because he's going to give you everything he's got."

Tamba had a 10-10 double double in the second game of the season against New Orleans (11/10) and then against Omaha, he pulled down 13 boards in the contest for his second double figure rebound game. He was +25 against Alcorn State and +22 in the Omaha contest.

JALEN REECE

The freshman from Orlando has shown his chops as backup point guard behind Dedan Thomas, averaging 12.1 minutes, 3.8 points and 2.13 assists a game.

Against DePaul (11/29), Reece was given the keys for 20 minutes and he responded with a 6-of-6 night from the field with an additional free throw to score 13 points. More impressively, he posted a game-high six assists with no turnovers.

In seven games he has only turned it over five times with 17 assists.

Reed had eight points against Alcorn (11/18), hitting 3-of-5 from the field with a three-pointer.

MAX MACKINNON

Senior Max Mackinnon has shown his ability to shoot it from deep. Mackinnon hit for four against Tarleton State, six against Omaha and in the ECC finale, three versus DePaul.

He had 19 against Tarleton State, 22 versus Omaha and 13 in the game against DePaul. In all he has had six games in double figures so far this season

Mackinnon, who transferred to LSU after two years at Elon and a season at Portland, is 15-of-34 from distance (41.1 percent). He is also 26-of-28 from the free throw line (92.9 percent).

Against Omaha (11/21), he played 29 minutes, hit 7-of-11 field goals, including 6-of-8 field goals and finished with 22 points, his 11th career game of 22 points or more.

His six three pointers were one off his career mark of seven, last season for Portland against San Diego on Jan. 23, 2025.

Only once in the Matt McMahon era has someone made more three-pointers in a single game and that was seven by K. J. Williams against Wake Forest on Dec. 10, 2022.

Mackinnon has also been good distributing the basketball with 22 assists through eight games (2.75 appg).

Mackinnon is averaging 12.9 points a game, 3.3 rebounds and 2.75 assists.

ROBERT MILLER III MAKING CONTRIBUTIONS AGAIN FOR TIGERS

Sophomore Robert Miller III, one of the two returnees on this team along with Jalen Reed, will probably be asked to do a little more with the absence of Reed and he responded with a 28-minute performance against BC (12/3) as he scored eight points on 4-of-5 shooting with five boards.

Off the bench, he is averaging 19.0 minutes a game, 7.3 points and 3.6 rebounds a contest.

Miller had 12 points in the ECC finals against DePaul (11/29) where he was 3-of-3 from the field and 6-of-7 from the free throw line.

He has made 15-of-23 field goals (65.2 percent), but he has also found himself getting to the free throw line, making 28-of-33 so far. For the entire season a year ago, Miller made 21-of-33 free throw attempts (63.6 percent).

Miller's effort against DePaul was his sixth career double figure scoring game.

PJ CARTER FINDS RANGE IN LAST GAME

PJ Carter, a fifth-year senior transfer from Memphis, found his shooting touch against Omaha (11/21) as he hit 4-of-7 three-pointers in nine minutes of play as he finished with 12 points in the contest.

Carter is averaging 3.6 points a game and he is 10-of-27 from distance this season (37.0%).

RASHAD KING

The senior transfer from Northeastern had his best game as a Tiger, scoring 11 points with three assists in 26 minutes against DePaul.

King is averaging 14.7 minutes a game with five made treys. He is at 4.4 points and 2.6 boards a contest.

THE LSU COACHING TIES

As Coach Matt McMahon enters his fourth season at LSU, there are familiar faces on the LSU coaching staff, including some of those who donned the purple and gold during their college careers.

Ronald Dupree -- General Manager -- a first time position for LSU basketball ... Dupree, recently inducted to the LSU Athletics Hall of Fame, was an 11-year pro and longtime NBA scout, executive with the Milwaukee Bucks ... Played at LSU (1999-03), member Sweet 16 team in 2000 and is ninth in career scoring (1,726 points) ... Scouting work contributed to 2021 Bucks NBA title.

Jalen Courtney-Williams -- Assistant Coach -- Second year on LSU staff ... Three-year letterman at LSU (2010-13); played in 61 games ... Came to LSU from Creighton where he served for three seasons, including a Sweet 16 year in 2024 ... Hosts the popular podcast "No Timeouts" on LSU+ and various podcast locations.

Tasmin Mitchell -- Assistant Coach/Director of Personnel -- In his ninth year as member of the LSU staff; second stint as Assistant Coach beginning in 2025-26 season ... One of the most popular former LSU Basketball stars; member of 2006 NCAA Final Four team ... Third all-time in scoring at LSU with 1,989 points (14.5 ppg average); sixth in rebounds (950), school record 4,692 minutes; 136 career starts ... One of three Tigers with 1,000 points, 500 rebounds, 200 assists and 100 steals.

David Patrick, the Associate Head Coach, is also familiar to Tiger fans in the second year of his second stint in the program. He served as Assistant/Associate Coach from 2012-16 during the Johnny Jones head coaching tenure. **Vince Walden**, who was at Texas A&M last year, and fourth year assistant, **Casey Long**, completes the on floor coaching staff. Long, who has been with Coach McMahon for nine years at Murray State and LSU, is originally from Leesville, Louisiana

IMPORTANT WORDS

Coach Matt McMahon has had his five core value words since he arrived at LSU: hard work, unselfishness, toughness, accountability and joy.

All five of those are a vital part of this program's DNA, but this year the players as a team have picked out three words that they want to be the standard for the LSU program. Those words are on a lot of the team shooting shirts and coaching shirts the team wears. Those words are:

**Brotherhood
Relentless
Consistency**

THINGS TO WATCH

Some points to watch in the non-conference:

TURNOVERS -- LSU averaged 13.1 turnovers a game last season and will be looking to try to lower that number this season ... LSU had just five games with single digit miscues in 2024-25. LSU turned the ball over 419 times compared to 409 assists. The Tigers were 14th in turnover margin at -1.47 and 15th in assist-to-turnover ratio at 0.98.

So far two games in single digits this season, averaging 11.38 a contest.

THREE POINT SHOOTING -- A season ago, LSU made the third most three-point field goals in school history (250), but took 50 more shots than any LSU team had attempted to make those 250 (820) for a percentage of just 30.5 percent. The Tigers were 16th in the league in three-point percentage in 2024-25. LSU made the second most three-pointers in 2023-24 (256), but needed 103 less shots to achieve those makes.

LSU is streaky in three-point shooting, averaging 7.0 three-pointers and 33.7 percent.

FREE THROWS -- The Tigers had their first game since 2022 last year when they failed to convert at least 50 percent of their free throw attempts and that was kind of how the free throw shooting went in 2024-25 as it was up and down, culminating in a 13-of-26 performance in the SEC Tournament game. LSU was 437-of-612 or 71.4 percent.

Tigers have made 174-of-222 for 78.4 percent so far this season.

WHAT MAKES THIS YEAR'S TEAM DIFFERENT?

There are several factors that offer the potential for this year's team to be a different LSU team in 2025-

AGE, MATURITY – In 2023-24, the average age of the players was just over 19 ... In 2025-26, the average age is right around 22. In fact, as Coach McMahon said to some media, he had never celebrated a player's 24th birthday before. The roster has four freshmen (three from high school, one from the Israeli pro league), one sophomore, three juniors, two seniors, three 5th year seniors and a grad student.

ROSTER MANAGEMENT – The Tigers put together the players that it feels will help them make the necessary strikes during this season. A larger, more physical frontcourt, wings that can shoot the three and a point guard that can be trusted to run the team, score the ball and distribute the basketball.

CONNECTIVITY AND CHEMISTRY – This group of players that were good at their respective schools has blended together and understood the mission. Do what is necessary to make LSU relevant again in the SEC. They've accepted that mission that they have to work together and the chemistry shown is something that coaches and attendees at practice have noticed quite quickly.

SONS OF THE FATHER

Two Tigers have fathers who also did well in the college basketball game in the past.

Jalen Reed's late father, Justin, starred at Ole Miss, where he was an All-America and the SEC Freshman of the Year in 2001. Justin Reed was an All-SEC selection in each of his four years at Ole Miss, guiding the Rebels to two NCAA Tournament wins en route to a first ever "Sweet 16" appearance for the Rebels. He was a second-round pick in the 2004 NBA Draft by the Boston Celtics and played for Boston and Minnesota in his NBA days. He passed away from cancer in 2017.

Point guard DJ Thomas Jr., is the son of UNLV star Dedan Thomas Sr. Senior played from 1991-94 at UNLV. He would earn honorable mention All-America honors and has his name throughout the UNLV record book.

Also, Robert Miller III is the son of a couple of former athletes. His dad, Robert Miller II, was an LSU defensive lineman in college, while his mom, Teana, earned All-America basketball honors at Tulane, also playing four years in the WNBA.

Ranked 92 in the 247sports.com rankings.

Kevin Thomas – Coral Springs, Florida (6-7 wing) – Has a near 6-10 wingspan and ranked 56 by ESPN.com and 71 by 247sports.com. Part of 2025-26 Montverde team that was preseason No.5 by MaxPreps. Played 2024-25 at Sagemont Prep where he averaged 17.3 points, 6.7 rebounds, 2.1 assists. He was part of USA Basketball Training Camp in Colorado Springs.

EXAMS, THEN A FINAL NEUTRAL COURT TEST

Monday starts final exam week at LSU and that will be followed by a final neutral court game as part of the Compete 4 Cause Classic in the Smoothie King Center in New Orleans. The Tigers will play SMU for a second straight year in a 7:30 p.m. game televised by the SEC Network.

The teams met a year ago in Frisco, Texas in this same Classic with SMU winning, 74-64.

The game is part of a doubleheader of interest as the LSU women will play Kim Mulkey's alma mater, Louisiana Tech, at 5 p.m. in the SKC.

LSU will then return home for the final three non-conference games, beginning on Dec. 19.

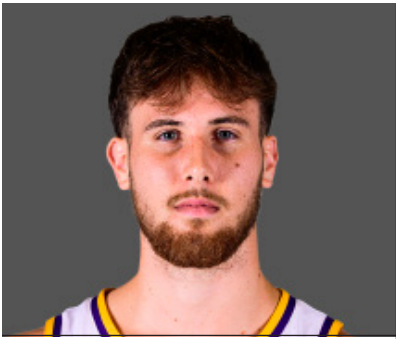

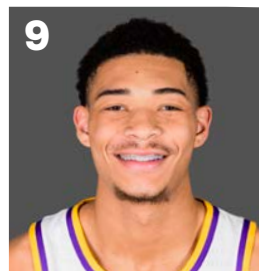
