## TRACKING THE TIGERS

Following the official ITA preseason rankings, LSU boasts a program-best No. 5 ranking heading into the season. Last season, the Tigers rose as high as No. 6 in the dual season rankings.

LSU enters the weekend looking to build on the momentum of a program-best season a year ago, highlighted by a 24-8 overall record and the program's first-ever appearance in the NCAA Elite Eight.

Head coach Taylor Fogleman enters his fourth season at the helm in Baton Rouge after leading LSU to three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and a school-record 10 SEC regular-season victories last spring.

### 2025-26 Team Highlights

LSU returns a strong foundation led by sophomore standouts Cadence Brace and Kayla Cross, who both earned All-SEC and All-Freshman honors a season ago. Brace was named SEC Freshman of the Year and ITA National Rookie of the Year after climbing to a career-high ITA singles ranking of No. 8. Furthermore, Brace also earned a selection to the All-SEC first team, while Cross featured on the All-SEC second team. At the same time, the Canadian pairing rose as high as No. 3 nationally in doubles.

Brace and Cross were nationally recognized following the season, with the pair earning All-American doubles honors, while Brace also gained an All-American singles selection.

In addition to its returning core, LSU welcomes a highly touted freshman class poised to make an immediate impact in Baton Rouge. The group is headlined by German standout Carolina Kuhl, who has reached a career high WTA ranking of No. 391 in singles and No. 617 in doubles, to the Tigers' lineup.

The Tigers also feature their newest signing, British native Ella McDonald, a rising talent who has success on the professional tour, with career-high rankings of No. 352 in singles and No. 161 in doubles, according to the WTA.

LSU also features freshman Addison Lanton, Romanian newcomer Alexia Marginean, and fellow Romanian Ioana Sava entering the spring. Lanton concluded the fall campaign ranked No. 78 in singles, while Marginean ranked No. 41 in doubles with junior Kinna Graham, according to the ITA.

Likewise, junior returners Graham and Kenna Erickson provide more firepower to the Tigers' lineup.

Last season, Graham earned six singles victories behind three ranked results and captured six overall doubles victories with four different partners.

Erickson posted 12 overall victories dating back to Fall 2024 and earned six singles victories in conference play in the dual season. The Austin native concluded the season ranked No. 74 in doubles play with Tiger alumni Anita Sahdiieva.

The Tigers finished last season with an 11-2 home record and secured the doubles point in 21 of their matches.

### Match Outlook

The Tigers hold a 23-1 all-time record in the matchup and will face Northwestern State for the first time since 2020.

Against San Diego, LSU holds an all-time winning record of 5-1 and earned a 5-2 victory over the squad last season.

## 2026 HONORS & AWARDS

### BRACE FOR IMPACT

Consensus top option for the Tigers in her debut season. Was named SEC Freshman of the Year with three SEC Freshman of the Week awards with a first-team All-SEC and All-Freshman team honors. Concluded her season with 14 singles wins in the top spot behind 11 ranked victories. Brace ended the campaign on a seven-match winning streak. She earned a final ITA singles ranking of No. 8. Following the season, she was named an ITA singles and doubles All-American after the season. Brace was active on the pro tour following the season, concluding her freshman year with a WTA No. 296 ranking in singles and WTA No. 374 in doubles. Furthermore, she won the doubles title at the W35 Le Lamentin, as well as reached the semifinals in the W75 Rome, W35 Le Lamentin, W75 Calgary, and the W75 Templeton in singles. Over the summer, she qualified for the U.S. Open.

### CANADIAN DYNAMIC DUO

Brace teamed up with Kayla Cross in doubles as one of the top pairings in the country with a No. 6 ITA ranking, ranking as high as No. 3. As a duo, they finished with a 12-4 record with nine ranked victories.

### CROSSING THE COMPETITION

Following the season, Cross was named to the All-SEC second team and All-Freshman team. Earned SEC Freshman of the Week (Jan. 22) and Co-Freshman of the Week (March 12). Cross earned a 11-2 mark on the No. 2 spot while also earning a victory on the top court. The Canadian native also secured four ranked victories on the campaign. Cross was ranked No. 53 in the final ITA singles rankings. Cross was named an ITA doubles All-American following the season. She spent plenty of time on the pro scene, including representing Canada at the Billie Jean King Cup tournament, earning her first national victory against Romania...Following her freshman season, holds a WTA ranking of No. 217 in singles and No. 159 in doubles. Cross made the doubles final at the W100 Charlottesville and the semifinal at the W35 Arcadia while winning the W35 Arcadia and reaching the semifinals at the W50 Santo Domingo for singles. The sophomore qualified and competed in the 2025 French and U.S. Open as well as Wimbledon

### ANOTHER POINT FOR KENNA

Kenna posted 12 overall singles wins dating back to Fall 2024. The junior earned six singles wins in conference play in the 2025 dual season. Picked up wins on the No. 3, No. 5, and No. 6 courts with a 7-3 mark in the sixth spot. In doubles play, Erickson captured 16 overall results. Teamed with Tiger alumni Anita Sahdiieva to earn seven overall victories and a 4-1 mark in the dual season. As a result, she concluded the season with an ITA doubles ranking of No. 74.

### GRAHAM AND GRIT

Kinaa returned to the courts for the 2025 dual season after suffering an injury in her freshman season. Throughout the season, she earned six victories in the dual season behind three ranked victories. Graham captured six overall doubles victories with four different partners throughout the campaign. Following the season, she was named an ITA Scholar Athlete and placed on the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

### TOO KUHL FOR THE COURTS

German native joins the Tigers for the 2025-26 season. Kuhl is currently ranked No. 608 in WTA singles and No. 681 in doubles, reaching career-high marks of No. 391 in singles and No. 617 in doubles. She is also ranked No. 53 nationally in Germany. On the junior circuit, she competed in all four Junior Grand Slams, highlighted by a singles quarterfinal run at the Junior Australian Open and a doubles final appearance at the Junior U.S. Open. A former world No. 31 in the ITF Junior Rankings, she captured six junior singles titles and three doubles titles. Kuhl earned three consecutive ITF singles titles in 2023 at the W15 Gdansk, W25 Troisdorf, and the W15 Poertschach, and a doubles crown in 2022 at the W15 Cairo. Most recently, she advanced to the singles final at the W35 Mohammedia and doubles semifinals at W15 Alaminos and W35 Darmstadt in 2025.

### ADDI'S WORLD

Blue-chip prospect from Elgin, Illinois, will join LSU for the 2025-26 season. Lanton was ranked among the nation's top 25 recruits. She has been one of the most dominant players in the Midwest region as a two-time Illinois State Singles Champion and was recognized as the USTA Chicago District's 2023 Junior Female Player of the Year. Lanton placed fourth at the 2024 USTA Spring National Championships and won the 2023 Illinois State Singles Tennis Championship. In high school play, Lanton has not lost a set in the IHSA competition since 2021. The freshman competed at the 2024 ITA National Summer Championships in Memphis, TN, and placed as a quarterfinalist, highlighted by taking down the No. 2 seed in the tournament, Duke's Emma Jackson. Most recently, she won the 2025 ITA Summer Masters Series.

### FROM ENGLAND TO THE BAYOU

Hailing from Great Britain, McDonald joins the Tigers for the 2026 dual season. Currently ranked No. 522 in WTA singles, with a career-high ranking of No. 352 achieved on May 26, 2025. She holds a current career-best WTA doubles ranking of No. 161. A former standout on the junior circuit, reaching an ITF Junior ranking of No. 8 in 2023. Between 2019 and 2023, collected six singles and 10 doubles titles at the junior level. On the professional tour, earned three singles and 13 doubles titles. In 2025, captured a singles crown at the W15 Monastir. Enjoyed a breakout year in doubles, claiming titles at the W35 Helsinki and W50 Santo Domingo in March, followed by victories at the W35 Santa Margherita di Pula and the Wrexham Open, and later adding a fifth doubles title of the year at the W50 Funchal in November. In junior play, earned singles victories at the U.S. Open, Roland Garros, and Wimbledon, while reaching the quarterfinals in doubles at the Australian Open, Roland Garros, and Wimbledon. On the professional tour, received wild cards into Wimbledon Singles qualifying in 2022 and 2025... Most recently at Wimbledon, earned a first-round doubles victory, defeating the team of WTA No. 13 Linda Noskova and WTA No. 72 Rebecca Sramkova.

Taylor Fogleman, who led the Tigers back to the NCAA Tournament for three consecutive seasons and 26th overall, as well as the program's first NCAA Team Championship appearance, while also adding three new All-American honors to the program, enters his fourth year as the LSU women's tennis team's head coach ahead of the 2025-26 season.

Coach Fogleman created a formidable and historic program in his third year, where the 2024-25 season saw the Tigers post a 24-8 overall record, tied for program-best, as well as a program-leading 10 conference regular season victories. Fogleman oversaw the development of the program and added more star power to the roster with freshmen Cadence Brace, Kayla Cross, Tilwith Di Girolami, and Indi Patel, and most recently, Carolina Kuhl, Addison Lanton, Alexia Marginean, and Ioana Sava. Fogleman's third season in Baton Rouge saw countless records being broken, such as, in February, the highest ranked victory against No. 3 Oklahoma State, 4-0, at the program's first ITA National Indoor Championship appearance since 2019. A month later, the Tigers improved to a program-best No. 6 ranking, according to the ITA. Fogleman concluded the season with six ranked singles players and three ranked doubles pairings, most notably with Brace ranking No. 8 in singles and No. 6 in doubles with Cross. Under Fogleman, the Tigers overcame No. 4 Ohio State, 4-2, to advance to the club's first NCAA Team Championship.

Following the season, countless Tigers were recognized for their achievements, including Brace earning ITA Singles and Doubles All-American honors, becoming the fourth Tiger in program history to earn both singles and doubles All-America honors in the same season, joining Bruna Colosio (2000), Joana Valle Costa (2017) and Anastasiya Komar (2023). Brace was also named the ITA Rookie of the Year and SEC Freshman of the Year, coupled with an All-SEC First Team Selection. Brace became the 10th player in program history to earn first-team All-SEC honors and joins Jade Lewis (2017) as the second Tiger to be named SEC Freshman of the Year. She joins Cross as the sixth and seventh Tigers named to All-Freshman teams for the SEC. Fogleman helped lead the Tigers to a final ITA team ranking of No. 11.

Year two saw Fogleman bring in nine newcomers and improve on the team records achieved in year one. He guided the Tigers to a 16-11 record in the 2024 dual season, three more wins than the 2023 season despite three-time ITA All-American Kylie Collins missing the entire season due to an injury. Under Fogleman, the Tigers earned their first Top 25 win since 2021 when they took down No. 14 South Carolina by a score of 4-1 at the LSU Tennis Complex. LSU returned to the NCAA Tournament for the second straight season, marking the first time in program history that a head coach led their first two teams to the tournament. In the Stanford Regional, the Tigers earned their first NCAA Tournament win since 2021 when they took down No. 34 Baylor by a score of 4-3 in the first round.

Both players and staff members received individual awards under Fogleman's coaching. Two Tigers earned All-SEC honors; Aran Teixidó Garcia earned a spot on the second team while Kenna Erickson became LSU's first freshman on the SEC All-Freshman team since 2018. In the ITA Southern Region's postseason awards, Erickson was named Rookie of the Year while assistant coach Chris Simpson was named the region's Assistant Coach of the Year.

In his first year in Baton Rouge, Fogleman led the Tigers to a 13-11 record, an eight game improvement from the 2021-22 season prior. LSU also picked up its first win in the SEC Tournament since 2019 after outlasting host-team Arkansas in a four hour match that finished 4-3. The Tigers then earned an at-large berth to the 2023 NCAA Tournament, marking the first time in program history that a first-year head coach led the program to the national stage. The Tigers were defeated in the first round of the NCAA Tournament and finished ranked No. 41 in the ITA national team rankings and No. 2 in the ITA Southern Regional rankings.

Under Fogleman, individuals also saw tremendous success. Redshirt freshman Anastasiya Komar had one of the best individual seasons in program history under Fogleman, posting a 33-8 singles record and a 32-10 doubles record. Komar earned individual glory in the form of claiming the ITA Southern Regional's single and doubles (with partner Nikita Vishwase) in October and rolled her good form into the spring season, where she posted a 19-2 record in singles playing primarily at the No. 1 singles court and a 16-4 doubles record with three different partners. Komar qualified as a national seed for both the NCAA Singles & Doubles Championship (with partner Kylie Collins), automatically earning her ITA Singles All-American honors as well as ITA Doubles All-American honors.

In addition to Collins' success in doubles with Komar, the junior enjoyed a strong first-year as a Tiger under Fogleman. Collins was invited to compete at the 2022 ITA All-American Championships in October, college tennis' most prestigious fall tournament featuring the top players across the nation. In the singles draw, Collins took down four strong opponents in straight sets to advance to the singles final, the furthest run for a Tiger at the prestigious tournament, where she finished as a runner-up. Collins spent the spring playing at the top singles and doubles spots for the Tigers and qualified as a national seed for the NCAA Doubles Championship and at-large for the NCAA Singles Championship. Collins was named an ITA Doubles All-American alongside Komar at the end of the season, the third All-American honor of her career dating back to her time as Texas under Fogleman.

Fogleman, the 2021 ITA National Assistant Coach of the Year and a Louisiana native, returned to his home state after spending five seasons in Austin, including his last four as associate head coach.
