FAST FACTS

- LSU enters the second week of the season ranked No. 10 in the ESPN/USA Softball Poll, and No. 12 in the NFCA/GoRoute Division I Softball Poll.
Head Coach Beth Torina enters her 15th season at the helm of LSU softball and has coached the Tigers to four Women's College World Series appearances.
Coach Torina is the program's all-time wins leader at 584 wins, 16 shy of 600 at LSU. She claimed her 700th career victory versus LA Tech on April 9, 2025. Torina averages 41 wins per season and has logged 40 or more wins in the last three consecutive seasons.
LSU was the No. 10 overall seed in the 2025 NCAA Tournament, marking its 19th consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance.
The Tigers return 12 players from the 2025 roster, including seven starters, highlighted by 2025 NFCA All-Americans, catcher Maci Bergeron and utility player Tori Edwards.
Other notable returners include 2025 NFCA All-Region selections in utility player Sierra Daniel, utility pitcher Jayden Heavener and outfielder Jalia Lassiter.
Bergeron, T. Edwards and Heavener have been tabbed to USA Softball's Top 50 Watch List for the 2026 USA Softball Player of the Year Award.
LSU welcomes 11 newcomers, its largest batch of newcomers in program history.
Included in those newcomers are five transfers: Cece Cellura (San Diego State), Kylee Edwards (Mississippi State), Ally Hutchins (Kentucky), Char Lorenz (Louisville) and Paytn Monticelli (Oklahoma/Wisconsin).
The Bayou Bengals 2026 schedule featured 30 games against 14 teams who appeared in the 2025 NCAA Tournament, including four WCWS participants.
LSU posted a 6-0 record during opening weekend, featuring four run-rules, two shutouts, and a come-from-behind walk-off home run by Lassiter.
LSU is 21-16 all-time against the Clearwater Invitational field, and 8-5 in three appearances at the Clearwater Invitational. LSU is 1-0 vs. UCF, 0-1 vs. Duke, 3-2 vs. Nebraska, 13-5 vs. Oklahoma State, and 4-8 vs. UCLA.





Beth Torina

Head Coach • 19th Season Overall • 15th Season at LSU • Career Record: 713-364

Beth Torina heads into her 15th season at the helm of the LSU softball program after she returned the Tigers to national prominence with two 50-win seasons, eight 40-win seasons and four trips to the Women's College World Series in 2012, 2015, 2016 and 2017.

Since taking the reins of the program prior to the 2012 season, Torina has led the Tigers to the pinnacle of the sport more than any other LSU head coach. Torina is the program's all-time wins leader with 578 victories entering the 2026 season and is the first skipper to lead the team to Oklahoma City in consecutive seasons in program history (2015-17). She is averaging 41 wins per season in Baton Rouge and had a streak of 123 consecutive weeks ranked in the Top 25 (2014-2022). Under Torina, the Tigers have played a Top 10 strength of schedule every year.

In the 2025 campaign, LSU earned the No. 10 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament, marking its 19th consecutive tournament appearance and 26th appearance overall. The Tigers boasted a 42-16 record for the program's third consecutive 40-win season and eighth over an 11-year span. LSU claimed 18 Top 25 victories, and Coach Torina won her 700th career game as a head coach with a 9-1 win over Louisiana Tech on April 9, 2025.

The 2025 offense finished with seven single season marks ranking in the top five of the program's record book, including a program record .438 on-base percentage. LSU's .332 batting average ranked No. 3, and the club's .484 slugging percentage sits at No. 5. In the circle, the Tigers recorded a 2.74 ERA with 322 strikeouts in 363.1 innings. LSU totaled 14 shutouts, including the program's sixth perfect game in the season opener

against Charlotte on Feb. 7, 2025. The pitching staff allowed 287 hits, marking the sixth-lowest total in a season.

LSU will return two NFCA All-Americans and All-SEC selections from the 2025 roster in catcher Maci Bergeron and utility player Tori Edwards. Edwards was named the 2025 SEC Freshman of the Year, becoming the third player in program history to be the league's top freshman, and first since 2013. In addition to Bergeron and Edwards, LSU returns three NFCA All-Region selections; infielder Sierra Daniel, pitcher Jayden Heavener, who threw the perfect game against Charlotte, and outfielder Jalia Lassiter.

Torina earned her B.S. in health sciences and occupational therapy from Florida in 2000. During her playing career with the Gators, she was a member of the 1998 Southeastern Conference regular season championship team as the squad's top pitcher. In the classroom, Torina was a GTE Academic All-American and a finalist for the 2000 H. Boyd McWhorter SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

Before joining the LSU program in June 2011, Torina took Florida International of the Sun Belt Conference to new heights. The two-time SBC Coach of the Year led the Golden Panthers to a 129-111 record in four seasons and directed FIU to its first NCAA Tournament victory in 2010.

Torina and her husband, Nick, were married in January 2010. The couple has three daughters: Taryn, Tatum, and Tenley. They currently reside in Baton Rouge.

NEWS AND NOTES

Rooted in Tigers

LSU softball's theme for the 2026 season is Rooted in Tigers. Rooted in Tigers represents the foundation, resilience, and legacy of LSU softball. Like the oaks that define LSU's campus, this program is built on deep roots planted by generations before. This team embraces the responsibility to grow those roots through daily work, unity, and resilience—weathering every storm together. Honoring the past while building the future, LSU softball is strong as oak and rooted in Tigers.

The Series

LSU is 21-16 all-time against the 2026 Shriners Children's Clearwater Invitational field, including a 1-0 record versus UCF, an 0-1 record against Duke, a 3-2 record against Nebraska, a 13-5 mark against Oklahoma State, and a 4-8 record against UCLA.

LSU defeated UCF 6-5 in the 2016 Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic in Cathedral City, Calif., on Feb. 20, 2016, and fell to Duke 8-4 in the 2021 Tiger Classic on Feb. 12, 2021, in the lone games against each program.

The Tigers have won the last two games against Nebraska, including a 3-2 victory in Tiger Park in 2015. LSU has defeated Nebraska in three of the last four meetings, and are 2-2 at neutral locations.

LSU is on a two-game winning streak against Oklahoma State and has won 10 of the last 12. The Tigers are 6-2 all-time in neutral locations matchups against the Cowgirls, including the last two games that have been played at the Clearwater Invitational (2022 and 2024).

LSU and UCLA has only played at neutral sites. LSU has won three of the last five meetings, highlighted by a 2-1 victory last season (Feb. 27, 2025) thanks to Sierra Daniel's RBI single in the sixth inning.

Clearwater Invitational History

LSU will make its fourth appearance at the Clearwater Invitational (2019, 2022, 2022A). The Tigers are 8-5 all-time in the tournament and has outscored their opponents 78-72.

Family Ties

Five former LSU Tigers, who are now head coaches, return to Tiger Park this season, including three during opening weekend.

NC State's Head Coach Lindsay Leftwich returns to Tiger Park for the first time since her 12-year stint as an assistant coach for LSU from 2012-2023. Leftwich spent a total of 16 seasons as a top assistant for Coach Torina, including four seasons at Florida International (2008-2011).

Illinois' Head Coach Tyra Perry is a two-time letterwinner for LSU from 1997-1998. Perry, a 1997 NFCA All-Region selection, had a career batting average of .334 on 116 hits and 16 home runs. Her .545 slugging percentage ranks No. 9 all-time in program history.

Nevada's Head Coach Victoria Hayward was a graduate assistant under Coach Torina in 2015. That staff, which included Leftwich, was tabbed the 2015 NFCA Division I South Region Staff of the Year.

Michigan State's Head Coach Sharonda McDonald-Kelly was a volunteer assistant at LSU from 2013-2014, where the team reached the NCAA Tournament in each of those two seasons. McDonald-Kelly coached the outfielders and had a role in developing 2013 NFCA All-American A.J. Andrews.

Memphis' Head Coach Trena (Peel) Prater is a three-time All-American and the 2002 SEC Player of the Year. Peel-Prater has her name scattered throughout the LSU record book. She is the program's all-time leader with 27 triples and ranks in the top 10 in runs (173), hits (269), doubles (45) and stolen bases (79).

Tigers in the Polls

LSU ranks inside the top 15 in all four major preseason polls. LSU sits at No. 10 in the ESPN.com/USA Softball Top 25 Poll and the Softball America Poll, and No. 12 in the NFCA/GoRoute Division I Top 25 Poll and D1Softball Poll.

SEC - Softball Elite Conference

The SEC has 12 teams ranked in the NFCA Top 25 poll and 11 in the USA Softball. Both polls have four SEC teams in the top 10. The USA Softball Poll has six teams in the top 10, including LSU, and the NFCA poll has seven teams in the top 10.

In 2025, 14 of the SEC's 15 member schools reached the 2025 NCAA Tournament. Seven were seeded in the top eight, and nine were among the top 16 national seeds.

The 2024 season saw members of the then 13 member league reach the NCAA Tournament, marking the fourth time the league had a 100 percent rate in league history. The other three times came in 2017-2019.

USA Softball Top 50 Watch List

Catcher Maci Bergeron, utility player Tori Edwards and utility pitcher Jayden Heavener have been placed on USA Softball's Top 50 Watch List for the 2026 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year award. The SEC leads all conferences with 24 athletes on the watch list.

LSU has had multiple members on the Top 50 Watch List in each of the past four seasons, with three selections tied for the most entering a season (2016 and 2024). The Tigers have been represented on the watch list with at least one player in 14 consecutive seasons.

The Top 25 Finalists will be announced on Wednesday, April 29. While an athlete does not have to be on the watch list to be considered for the Top 25, the eventual recipient will be selected from the list of finalists. The Top 10 Finalists will be revealed on Wednesday, May 13, and the Top 3 released on Monday, May 18. The 2026 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year will be announced prior to the 2026 NCAA Women's College World Series, which is May 28 through June 5, in Oklahoma City.

Last Time Out

LSU opened the 2026 season 6-0 at the 2026 Tiger Classic, featuring four run-rule victories, including two shutouts, and a walk-off home run.

The offense tallied a .313 batting average on 42 hits and outscored their opponents 49-11. LSU recorded 21 extra-base hits with 11 doubles, five triples and five home runs, and finished with 42 RBI. LSU is also 19-of-19 in stolen bases.

The pitching staff had a 2.00 ERA behind 34 strikeouts in 35.0 innings. LSU's six hurlers held its opening weekend opponents to a .250 batting average and allowed 33 hits and 12 walks.

Bringing the Power

LSU, who has not been a huge power school in recent years, opened the season showcasing more power in its lineup.

Five Tigers recorded three extra-base hits over the six-game weekend, including Maci Bergeron, Sierra Daniel, Tori Edwards, Alix Franklin and Jalia Lassiter. More about the offense on page 10.

Leading the Way

LSU leads the country with five triples and 39 walks. The Tigers' five triples ties a record for the most through the first six games of the season first set in 1999.

A Problem on the Base Pads

LSU was a perfect 19-of-19 in stolen bases during its opening weekend, which leads the SEC and ranks No. 3 in Division I softball. Against Illinois (Feb. 8), The Tigers stole nine bases, tying the program's second most stolen bases in a game. It was the most stolen bases since LSU had 10 against Nicholls on Feb. 16, 2008.

In that game, Kylee Edwards, Tori Edwards and Alix Franklin each had two steals.

A Deep Pitching Staff

LSU's pitching staff registered a 2.00 ERA and had two shutouts (one solo, one combined).

Six pitchers entered the circle for the Tigers during opening weekend, led by Tatum Clopton and Jayden Heavener, who were both 2-0 on the weekend.

Don't Forget the Defense

The Tigers turned three double plays last season, which leads the SE and ranks No. 20 in the nation.

LSU had a .986 fielding percentage with 105 putouts, 34 assists and two errors.

Built From Within

The LSU 2026 softball roster features a blend of proven experience and new talent. Although the Tigers return 12 players, including seven starters, they also welcome 11 newcomers, the most newcomers in program history. With a smaller roster size of 23 athletes, it has bred a ton of internal competition.

Portal Pickups

Of the 11 newcomers, five are transfers, making up Coach Torina's largest portal haul.

LSU picked up a pair of transfer pitchers in Cece Cellura (San Diego State) and Paytn Monticelli (Wisconsin/Oklahoma), two infielders in Kylee Edwards (Mississippi State) and Ally Hutchins (Kentucky), and utility player Char Lorenz (Louisville).

True Freshmen

For the second consecutive season, LSU welcomes six true freshmen to the family, including utility player Gradie Appling (Juliette, Ga.), pitcher Cali Deal (Quitman, La.), outfielder Rylie Johnson (Spotsylvania, Va.), utility player Ashlin Mowery (Lancaster, Ohio), utility player Ci'ella Pickett (Mentone, Calif.), and pitcher Lauryn Soeken (Katy, Texas).

The Coaching Staff

Head Coach Beth Torina enters her 15th season at the helm of LSU softball and is the program's all-time leader in wins. The next longest tenured coach on staff is former LSU standout player and Assistant Coach Sandra [Simmons] Moton, who is in her eighth season overall, including her stint as a volunteer coach from 2019-23. Moton oversees outfielders and base running, and will coach at third base on offense.

Assistant Coach Bryce Neal enters his third season leading LSU's hitting game, and Taylor Pleasants joins the coaching staff as an assistant coach. Pleasants will coach the infielders and first base on offense.

Zach Jermain, the Director of Player Performance and Analytics is in his second year with the program in this role. Jermain earned his PhD in mathematics from LSU in 2024, specializing in material science and plasmonic metamaterials.

A Living Legend

Coach Torina has a 584-253 record at LSU and is 713-364 overall in her 19 seasons as a head coach. Torina won her 700th career game as a head coach in a 9-1 run-rule victory against Louisiana Tech on April 9, 2025. Torina won her 527th game at LSU to become the program's all-time leader in wins in the 1-0 shutout at No. 4 Tennessee on April 20, 2024. She surpassed LSU Hall of Fame Coach Yvette Girouard (2001-2011) who has 526 wins in 11 seasons.

Coach Torina won game No. 500 at LSU in the 7-6 walk-off victory against then No. 6/8 Oklahoma State (Feb. 17, 2024). Torina is the second LSU Softball Head Coach to reach 500 wins and is one of five coaches in LSU history who have reached 500 career wins. Torina is the only active coach at LSU with 500 wins.

Coach Torina is 16 wins shy from 600 as the head coach at LSU.

Zero's Looking Good

For the second year in-a-row, utility pitcher Jayden Heavener opened LSU's season with double-digit strikeout performances after fanning 10 in a complete-game 11-3 victory over NC State (Feb. 5).

Heavener closed her weekend with a n 8-0 shutout against Nevada (Feb. 7), concluding the weekend with a 1.91 ERA with 17 strikeouts, relinquishing nine hits, three runs and six walks.

HEAVE HO!

Heavener looks to build off a solid freshman season that placed her on the 2025 NFCA Gulf All-Region Second Team.

In 21 starts and 25 appearances, Heavener was 13-5 in the circle and had a 2.75 ERA behind 152 strikeouts in 119.2 innings pitched. She tossed 11 complete games and five shutouts, including a perfect gme.

Heavener allowed 68 hits, setting a program record for fewest hits allowed in a season, and her .164 opposing batting average is the seventh-lowest average allowed in the club's single season record book.

A Perfect Start

Heavener began her college career by throwing the program's sixth perfect game in the 2025 season opener against Charlotte (Feb. 7, 2025). She had 13 strikeouts in 6.0 innings of work. Heavener is the third pitcher under Coach Torina to throw a perfect game, the second to throw a complete game as a freshman, and the first in program history to throw a perfect game in their collegiate debut.

An LSU Lefty?

Heavener is in rare air as she is the first left-handed pitcher with considerable innings pitched for LSU since Julie Stashko (1997-2000). Stashko had a 29-6 career record with a 1.68 ERA in 274.1 innings pitched. The Tigers will add another lefty to the fold this season in freshman pitcher Cali Deal.

Two other players in program history logged a few innings as a left-handed pitcher, but were utility players who played more in the field rather than pitched.

Two-time All-American outfielder Kirsten Shortridge (2009-2010) made 23 appearances in the circle and was 8-5 with 64 strikeouts in 81.1 innings pitched. Leslie Barron spent one season with LSU in 2002, and mostly played at first base. She threw 2.0 innings in two appearances and never was the pitcher of record.

Clopton Clamp

Pitcher Tatum Clopton had a phenominal start to the 2026 season. Clopton's first appearance came in relief trailing 5-0 to NC State (Feb. 6) before dealing six strikeouts, and giving up one hit and no runs over 4.2 innings in what was LSU's walkoff victory. She then started in the weekend finale against Lamar (Feb. 8), where she retired 12 of the 13 batters she faced with three strikeouts, one hit, no runs and no walks in 4.0 innings.

In 8.2 innings, Clopton has a 0.00 ERA and is holding opposing batters to a .074 average with nine strikeouts.

The Clopton Comeback

Clopton returned to the circle in 2025 for the first time since 2022 at Oklahoma State due to injuries. Clopton finished the season with a 7-2 record and 3.14 ERA with 45 strikeouts in 58.0 innings pitched.

Clopton started in eight games, appeared in 15, and threw three complete games and one shutout. Clopton held opposing batters to a .186 average, and allowed 39 hits.

Clopton threw a career-high 10 strikeouts in 7.0 innings against UT Arlington (Feb. 14, 2025). She is 8-2 all-time in the circle entering the season.

One Thousand and Fifty-Seven Days

Clopton was sidelined for the 2023 and 2024 seasons, approximately 1,057 days, due to a shoulder injury. She was part of two WCWS teams at Oklahoma State before transferring to LSU after the 2023 season. In her return, Clopton earned a win against Charlotte (Feb. 8, 2025), where she combined for a shutout, throwing four strikeouts and gave up only one hit and one walk in her LSU debut.

As a freshman in 2022, Clopton was 1-0 in the circle with two appearances. She had eight strikeouts and joined in on one shutout. She logged five strikeouts and no earned runs on two hits in her lone career start, capturing her first win against Cal Baptist (Feb. 12, 2022).

Clopton is a two-time Kansas Gatorade Player of the Year.

Monticelli for the Win

Pitcher Paytn Monticelli earned her first win in the circle as an LSU Tiger, tossing a complete 7.0 inning game against Nevada (Feb. 6), where she struck out five batters and gave up eight hits, two runs and two walks. It was Monticelli's 10th career win in the circle. She is now 10-4 all-time.

Lady Whistledown in Louisiana

Dearest gentle readers,

It would seem that Paytn Monticelli has arrived in Baton Rouge with both reputation and results firmly in tow. Born in Lakenheath, England, this globally seasoned right-hander has long carried an air of distinction about her game. A two-time Wisconsin Gatorade Player of the Year, Monticelli first announced herself at Wisconsin before polishing her craft under the brightest of spotlights at Oklahoma, where she played a hand in the Sooners' 2024 Women's College World Series championship.

Her international ties proved no mere novelty, as she claimed a bronze medal with Great Britain at the 2025 European Championships. In that tournament, she was nothing short of ruthless in the circle—posting a pristine 0.00 ERA, striking out 33 over 16.1 innings, and holding opposing batters to a paltry .073 average. One suspects this Tiger's presence will not go unnoticed... or unanswered.

21 Savage

Pitcher Cece Cellura, the most experienced arm in the bullpen in terms of innings pitched, gained a win in one of her two appearances in the 9-1 victory over Illinois (Feb. 8).

Cellura is a two-time Mountain West Conference Tournament Champion at San Diego State and came to LSU with a 27-14 career record in the circle with a 2.48 ERA and 139 strikeouts in 262.0 innings.

Cellura, a 2025 All-Mountain West First Team selection who led SDSU to the NCAA Tournament last season, posted a 19-9 record, a 2.28 ERA and 94 strikeouts in 153.2 innings pitched. She threw four shutouts, led the Mountain West with a 4.70 strikeout-to-walk ratio, and ranked No. 3 in NCAA Division I softball with 0.91 walks per seven innings.

Stuntin' Like Her Daddy

Cece's father Mike, played professional men's slow pitch softball and was inducted into the United States Specialty Sports Association's Hall of Fame in 1988.

He is a two-time World Champion and was named to the All-World Team six times. A true slugger, he hit over 1,000 home runs in tournament play and batted over .600 at the World Series seven different times.

The Newbies

The freshmen hurlers are Cali Deal (Quitman, La.), Lauryn Soeken (Katy, Texas) and potentially, utility player Ashlin Mowery (Lancaster, Ohio).

Deal is a three-time Louisiana Sports Writers Association First Team selection, and a finalist for the 2024 Louisiana Gatorade Player of the Year.

Soeken was selected to the 19-6A All-District First team and won the USSSA State Gold Glove Award, and Mowery is a four-time Ohio Capital Conference First Team selection and was named the 2025 Central District Division I Player of the Year.

Deal and Mowery Make Debuts

Deal and Mowery entered the circle during opening weekend, in relief for the final inning against Illinois and Lamar, respectively, on Feb. 8.

Deal surrendered two hits and one unearned run against the Fighting Illini, while Mowery retired three of the four Cardinals' batters she faced, capped by her first collegiate strikeout.

Maestro Neal

Bryce Neal, the conductor of this LSU offense, put together an explosive offensive unit in 2025 behind a philosophy based off efficiency, quality plate decision-making within at-bats, and sustained pressure. Power was not the foundation of the unit, which had just 42 home runs, yet still ranked in the top five of the program's single-season record book, including a program record .438 on-base percentage, a .332 batting average that ranked No. 3, and a .484 slugging percentage that sits at No. 5. The Tigers 398 runs ranked No. 6 in the SEC and had 359 RBI, both of which ranks No. 3 in the program's record book.

Keep Building

In 2026, the offense will look to continue to build on its efficient offense, but also add more power, highlighted by the addition of transfers in Kylee Edwards, Ally Hutchins and Char Lorenz.

Slow Start, Strong Finish

Tori Edwards had a slow start to the season, but finished the weekend strong with back-to-back games with three-run home runs, and hit her first career triple against NC State (Feb. 6).

Edwards is batting .385 in the young season on five hits, including a team-high two home runs and nine RBI. She has a 1.000 slugging percentage and .600 on-base percentage to lead the team.

Tori Tanks

T. Edwards put together one of the greatest freshmen seasons at LSU and was selected as a 2025 NFCA All-American, and the 2025 SEC Freshman of the Year. She is the program's third SEC Freshman of the Year and first since Bianka Bell in 2013.

T. Edwards set a single-season program record with a .802 slugging percentage and tied for a program-best 18 home runs. She also ranked inside the top 10 with 73 RBI (No. 3) and an .495 on-base percentage (No. 9). Overall, T. Edwards led LSU with a .375 batting average behind 62 hits, scored 52 runs and drew 37 walks.

In the field, T. Edwards had 346 putouts at first base, and tallied eight assists.

Multi Grand Slams in Single Season

LSU hit seven grand slams in 2025, marking a program record. Tori hit four alone, which is a program record as well. LSU has had four consecutive seasons with a player hitting multiple grand slams.

LassitHER

Jalia Lassiter smacked a two-run home run to walkoff NC State (Feb. 6) after overcoming a 5-0 deficit.

Over the opening weekend, Lassiter batted .375 on six hits and totaled nine RBI. Lassiter hit one double, triple and home run, turning out a .750 slugging percentage, and is 4-of-4 in stolen bases.

The senior is on a 14-game reach base streak dating back to the 2025 season. She is one of four players to reach in all six games last weekend.

Home Run Walkoff History

Lassiter's walkoff home run was the program's first since Karli Petty did it on April 10, 2024 versus Southeastern Louisiana.

Lassiter's was the first walk-off in regulation since Taylor Pleasants launched one against Utah on Feb. 17, 2023.

Outfield U Continues with 7 at the Center

Lassiter became a three-time NFCA All-Region selection after batting .330 with 61 hits including 15 doubles, one triple and three homers, highlighted by one grand slam in her first season with the Tigers. She also scored 51 runs and had 41 RBI.

Lassiter locked down the centerfield position in all 58 games last season, turning in a perfect fielding percentage with 57 putouts and two assists.

Miss Consistent

Infielder Sierra Daniel was a consistent presence for LSU last weekend as she led the team with a .471 batting average on eight hits, including three extra-base hits, and scored eight runs and added six RBI. Daniel also had a .545 on-base percentage and is on a 20-game reach streak dating back to last season.

Coming in Clutch

Daniel came up big multiple times during the opening weekend. From a pair of RBI doubles in the season opener against NC State, driving in the first run of the game in the fifth inning against Nevada, and a weekend capping 2-for-2 outing highlighted by her second career triple against Lamar.

This is nothing new to the 2025 NFCA All-Region selection, as she is a career .300 hitter inside or outside of SEC play.

Last season, Daniel registered a .381 average on 40 hits, including two home runs, and had a .460 on-base percentage last season. She also scored 32 runs and drove in 19.

The veteran second baseman had a .970 fielding percentage in 2025 with 74 assists, 56 putouts and four errors. She had a 17-game and 13-game stretch without an error last season.

A True Overcomer

In August 2023 during a physical, it was discovered that Daniel had Wolff Parkinson White Syndrome, a heart condition that causes the heart to beat abnormally fast for periods of time.

With the help of our partners at Our Lady of the Lake, Daniel was able to have a procedure to address this issue. She missed roughly one week of practice in the fall of 2023 before being fully cleared to return with no complications.

She's A Gammer

Head Coach Beth Torina has called utility player Alix Franklin a gamer and she wasn't lying.

Franklin, who is learning a new position in the outfield, came out of the gates hot offensively. In just her second career start, Franklin matched a single-game program record with two triples and had two RBI and scored one run in the season opener against NC State (Feb. 5).

After LSU was shutout for four innings against Nevada (Feb. 7), Franklin broke up the no-hitter, which led to LSU's first shutout victory of the season.

Overall, Franklin has a .375 batting average with six hits, four runs and three RBI. Franklin also has a .688 slugging percentage, a .444 on-base percentage and is 3-for-3 in stolen bases.

Louisiana's Finest

Catcher Maci Bergeron batted .235 during the opening weekend with four hits, three of which were doubles. The highlight of her weekend was a two-BI double to give LSU a 3-0 lead over Nevada on Feb. 7.

Bergeron is a 2025 NFCA All-American and All-SEC selection after a career season at the plate last season. She batted .364 behind 60 hits, had a .498 on-base percentage, tallied 49 RBI, 37 runs and drew 45 walks. Bergeron had 19 extra-base hits last season, including nine home runs. Bergeron's numbers in 2025 showed displayed her improvement compared to her numbers in her first two seasons.

The Cajun Cannon

Bergeron has been an asset behind the plate for the Tigers. She enters her senior season as the program's all-time leader with a career .996 fielding percentage with a minimum of 800 chances.

Last season, Bergeron recorded a .994 fielding percentage with 312 putouts, 13 assists and had two errors. The backstop threw out five runners trying to steal and participated in two double plays.

Smash Sisters and Company

The power of the Smash Sisters return in Bergeron and T. Edwards, who hit 27 of LSU's 42 home runs last season season and combined for 227 total bases.

The Smash Sisters will receive some additional help from three of their transfers in infielders Kylee Edwards (Mississippi State) and Ally Hutchins (Kentucky), and utility player Char Lorenz (Louisville). The trio brings a collective 35 home runs, 218 hits, 158 RBI and 376 total bases to Baton Rouge. More on them later.

Hutchins Dons the Purple & Gold

Infielder Ally Hutchins adds another dynamic to the LSU lineup. Through the first three games, Hutchins had a .571 batting average and a 1.143 slugging percentage highlighted by a solo shot in the rally walkoff win over NC State (Feb. 6). Overall, Hutchins logged a .333 batting average on four hits, had five RBI and drew six walks in her first weekend with the Tigers.

A Proven Vet

Over the past two seasons, Hutchins has made 102 starts and played in 112 games at Kentucky. Entering 2026, she had a .267 career batting average on 78 hits, 59 runs, 45 RBI and 12 home runs. She also had a .900 career fielding percentage with 74 assists and 34 putouts entering the 2026 season.

Hutchins started in all 58 games last season, where she batted .285, recorded 45 hits, including six home runs, and scored 41 runs. She also showed great plate discipline with 46 walks, turning in a .451 on-base percentage.

Lorenz's Debut as an LSU Tiger

It was utility player Char Lorenz who hit the first home run for LSU in the 2026 season, a two-run blast in the 6-2 win over Nevada (Feb. 6). Lorenz rounded out the six LSU batters that ended opening weekend with a .300 batting average, hitting .308 with four hits, two extra-base hits, and three RBI.

She Has Promise

Lorenz came out and established herself quickly in college softball after being named a 2025 All-ACC selection as a freshman at Louisville.

Lorenz, who will hold down the left field primarily, produced a .368 batting average and a .677 slugging percentage with 25 extra-base that included 11 doubles, five triples and nine home runs last season. Overall, Lorenz had 57 hits, scored 32 runs and had 13 stolen bases. Last season in the outfield, Lorenz had a .967 fielding percentage with 87 putouts, two assists and three errors.

Staying in the South

Infielder Kylee Edwards, a 2025 NFCA South All-Region selection from Mississippi State, joins the Purple & Gold with two years of eligibility remaining.

K. Edwards looks to take over at shortstop after starting at the position in 111 games of the 112 appearances she has made in her collegiate career.

Last season, K. Edwards started all 58 games at shortstop and batted .290 with 47 hits, 34 runs and 37 ribbies. She had 18 extra-base hits, including nine homers, and had a .945 fielding percentage with 87 assists, 69 putouts and nine errors.

In two seasons at State, K. Edwards has put together a .290 batting average with 83 hits and has 14 home runs.

Reunited

K. Edwards and Lorenz grew up near each other in Indiana and played club ball for the Indiana Magic Gold.

Geaux Hodge!

Infielder Avery Hodge moves over to the hot corner, and is feeling comfortable already as her diving catch in foul territory against NC State (Feb. 6) came in at No. 8 on Sportcenter's Top 10 Plays.

Hodge played all 58 games at shortstop last season, where she shined with 110 assists and 69 putouts. She turned six double plays and recorded a career-high six assists in the NCAA Tournament victory against UConn (May 17, 2025).

Offensively, Hodge had a .319 batting average with 46 hits, 34 runs and 30 RBI. She also had seven extra-base hits, including four doubles, two triples, and one home run. Also led the team with 11 stolen bases on 13 attempts.

Championship Pedigree

Hodge transferred to LSU last season after winning two National Championships at Oklahoma. In 2024 she had 21 hits, 28 runs and nine RBI and totaled six extra-base hits. In the 2024 Women's College World Series, Hodge tallied four hits, including two doubles and scored four runs to help the Sooners win the title.

Kee Kee!

Utility player Maddox McKee will live up to her position title as she displays the flexibility to be placed anywhere on the field. After making 37 starts last season, mostly as the designated player and some time in the infield throughout her first two seasons, McKee made an appearance in the outfield during the 2026 opening weekend, where she had one putout and has one RBI.

Last season, McKee had a .284 batting average behind 29 hits, scored 21 runs and had 14 RBI. She also drew 15 walks and was 10-for-12 in stolen bases. McKee is charged with being the Tigers best baserunner on the roster.

La-YES!!

Outfielder Jadyn Laneaux made 52 starts and played in 56 games last season in left field.

Laneaux had a .313 batting average with 45 hits, including eight doubles and a triple. She also had 33 runs, 24 RBI and 27 walks.

Laneaux registered a .989 fielding percentage as she led the outfield with 89 putouts and had one assist and one error.

Preseason All-SEC Rankings

The LSU Tigers have been picked to finish seventh in the 2026 SEC Softball Preseason Coaches Poll with 119 points, and has two players in 2025 NFCA All-Americans, Maci Bergeron and, Tori Edwards listed on the 2026 Preseason All-SEC Team.

Texas, the reigning National Champions is favored to win the SEC, totaling 189 points and nine first-place votes. Oklahoma, the 2025 regular season SEC Champions, come in at No. 2 with 186 votes and six first-place votes, and Tennessee rounds out the top three with 166 points. The full rankings are on page 12.

LSU's 2026 53-game regular season schedule will featured 30 games against 14 participants in the 2025 NCAA Tournament, including four WCWS participants (Ole Miss, Oklahoma, Tennessee and UCLA).

The Tigers will play in four tournaments, hosting three of them, participate in seven midweek games, and host a three-game series against Arizona (April 10-12) at Tiger Park.

LSU opens its SEC schedule with a three-game series at Tennessee on March 6-8 before its home opening conference series against Texas A&M on March 14-16 at Tiger Park. Other SEC series hosted by the Bayou Bengals will be Oklahoma (March 27-29), Ole Miss (April 17-19) and Auburn (April 30-May 2).

LSU's other SEC road series will be at South Carolina (March 20-22), Missouri (April 2-4) and Mississippi State (April 24-26).

The 2026 SEC Tournament will be May 5-9 at John Cropp Stadium in Lexington, Ky.

Four of LSU's five games at the 2026 Shriners Children's Clearwater Invitational (Feb. 12-15) in Clearwater, Fla., will be televised,

The series finale at Tennessee to conclude the league's opening weekend (March 8) will air on SEC Network, and two of the games in LSU's SEC home opening series against Texas A&M (March 15-16) will be shown on SEC Network.

LSU and Oklahoma will have a pair of morning games at Tiger Park televised. The first on SEC Network on March 28, and the other on ESPN on March 29.

The Tigers last tv matchup on the road will be at Missouri on April 4 on SEC Network. LSU will make its second appearance on ESPN with the series finale against Arizona on April 12, and then conclude the regular season on SEC Network with a contest against Auburn on May 2 in Baton Rouge.

Softball Signed Seven to the 2027 Roster

Head coach Beth Torina announced in the fall the signing of seven players to the 2027 roster.

The 2026 signing class ranks No. 3 in the nation according to D1Softball and Rivals/Softball America. Rivals/Softball America has the class comprised of two five-stars, four four-stars, and one three-star athlete.

The Tigers signed catcher Samantha Alekman (El Dorado Hills, Calif.), infielder Giselle De Casas (Hayward, Calif.), pitcher Addie Rackley (Buford, Ga.), outfielder Adelynn Siegel (Shiner, Texas), pitcher Ayla Tuua (Murietta, Calif.), catcher Karmen Vazquez (Hanford, Calif.), and outfielder Sydnee Williams (Phoenix, Ariz).

Tigers in the AUSL

After a successful inaugural season, the Athletes Unlimited Softball League (AUSL) has expanded to six teams and has selected host cities for each team: Chicago Bandits (Rosemont, Ill.), Carolina Blaze (Durham, N.C.), Portland Cascade (Hillsboro, Ore.), Oklahoma City Spark (Oklahoma City, Okla.), Utah Talons (Salt Lake City, Utah), and Texas Volts (Austin, Texas).

LSU will have six former athletes in the AUSL this season. Pitcher Carley Hoover and utility player Ali Newland will be on the Portland Cascade, outfielder Aliyah Andrew joins utility player Savannah Jaquish on the Utah Talons, who are the defending 2025 AUSL Champions coached by former LSU Assistant Coach Howard Dobson (2012-2024), and outfielder Ciara Briggs and utility player Danieca Coffey remain with the Texas Volts.

D1Softball All-Quarter Century Team

With 25 college softball seasons this century in the books, head coaches Beth Torina and Yvette Girouard, and four-time All-American Savannah Jaquish were named to D1Softball's All-Quarter Century Team.

Coach Torina has brought four LSU teams to the Women's College World Series (2012, 2015-2017), and Coach Girouard has brought five teams across two programs (LSU and ULL) to the WCWS. Girouard, who has an all-time record of 1,285-421-1 over 31 seasons, is one of three coaches to take multiple programs to the WCWS.

Jaquish played from 2014-2017 and is the program's all-time leader with 268 RBI, and ranks No. 2 all-time with 56 home runs, a .632 slugging percentage and 472 total bases.


