From 1948-1957, the Commodores were three of five games played in the series.

VANDERBILT EXPERIENCES TURNAROUND IN TURNOVER MARGIN

The Commodores have reversed an early season negative trend regarding turnovers.

Commodores were minus-6 in turnover margin, and ranked last in the statistical category in the SEC.

Limiting turnovers in its last three games, the Commodores have moved up to fifth in the SEC in the category. Vanderbilt has now committed three less turnovers (10) than they have forced (13).

Vanderbilt did not make a turnover against Eastern Kentucky for the second consecutive game. The team's last turnover was a fourth-quarter fumble against Rutgers.

VANDERBILT AGAINST DEFENDING NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

Though it hasn't happened often, Vanderbilt has defeated a defending national championship squad.

A search of NCAA record books reveals that 1929 is the last time a Vanderbilt squad defeated a team that was the consensus #1 from the previous year. That season, Dan McGugin's Commodores beat Georgia Tech 23-7 in Nashville.

Two years earlier, the Commodores beat defending national champion Alabama, 14-7, in Birmingham.

OSEMWEGIE CONTINUES TO PACE COMMODORE DEFENSE

Linebacker **Moses Osemwegie** (Jr., Nashville, Tenn.) continues to post All-Southeastern Conference numbers.

For the sixth time this season, Osemwegie reached double digits in tackles, posting nine solo stops and two assists, leading the Commodores with 11 total tackles.

Osemwegie also contributed a tackle for loss and two defended passes for the Commodore defense.

Recognized by *Sports Illustrated* two weeks ago as one of the nation's top performers for teams under .500, Osemwegie has at least 10 tackles in 12 of his last 13 career starts. He left due to a concession against Navy this

season, the only game he has not reached double digits.

KWANE DOSTER RESPONDS IN STARTING TAILBACK ROLE

Elevated in the depth chart prior to the game, **Kwane Doster** (Jr., Tampa, Fla.) responded with his most productive rushing game in nearly two seasons.

Making his second start of the season - and first as the featured tailback - Doster surpassed 100 yards for the fifth time in his Vanderbilt career.

Doster had 117 yards on 15 carries, narrowly missing his career best of 118 (at Georgia, 10/19/02).

Doster also moved closer to Corey Harris (1988-91) on the Commodore all-time kickoff return list. Doster had one return for 18 yards, giving him 1,572 career yards, just 42 behind Harris for fourth place all-time.

KEOWN SETTLING IN AS PUNTER

Kyle Keown (R.-Fr., Jesup, Ga.) appears to be settling in as the Commodore punter following a second consecutive start.

Keown averaged 42.5 yards on four attempts, including a career long of 62 yards in the first quarter. According to SEC statistics, the effort is the league's second longest punt this season.

Two of Keown's punts were downed inside the Eastern Kentucky 20-yard line.

Vanderbilt's punting game did experience trouble. The blocking mixup allowed ECU standout safety Pierre Wright to block a punt for the second consecutive game.

COMMODORES COMMIT NO PENALTIES IN ECU WIN

did not commit an infraction against Eastern Kentucky.

Through seven games, Vanderbilt leads the SEC in fewest penalties (31) and fewest penalty yards (38.4 ypg).

The lack of penalties is typical for Johnson's Commodores. During four previous games under Johnson - the last against Georgia in 2003 - Vanderbilt has been flagged just twice.

Last week at Georgia, the Commodores were flagged for just 13 yards in penalties.

DINWIDDIE POSTS CAREER HIGHS VERSUS EASTERN KENTUCKY

One week after netting just one tackle at Georgia, defensive tackle **Robert Dinwiddie** (Sr., Hendersonville, Tenn.) likely played the best game of his Commodore career against Eastern Kentucky.

Dinwiddie was credited with seven tackles - all solo stops - against the Colonels, bettering his previous best of five tackles earlier this year versus South Carolina.

The senior also contributed three tackles for loss - another career high. He moves into the team lead with 4.5 tackles for loss.

CUTLER - FIVE GAMES WITHOUT AN INTERCEPTION

Quarterback **Jay Cutler** (Jr., Santa Claus, Ind.) has gone more than five games without throwing an interception, a streak that spans 103 consecutive passes.

Cutler, 15 of 21 for 156 yards against Eastern Kentucky, is hitting on 64.7% of his attempts. Only Jason Campbell of Auburn, connecting on 68.2%, has a higher percentage in the SEC. Only two Vanderbilt quarterbacks in the last 50 years - Eric Jones in 1987 and Watson Brown in 1969 - have connected on 60% of their passes during an entire season.

Cutler's efficiency rating of 140.5 ranks 24th nationally. He ranks third in the SEC - behind Matt Jones of Arkansas and Chris Leak of Florida - in total offense with a 213.3-yd. average.

The junior, who has accounted for 11 of Vanderbilt's 18 TDs (six passing TDs, five rushing TDs), has not thrown an interception since late in the fourth quarter of the Ole Miss game.

The only SEC quarterbacks with more than 100 passing attempts to throw less interceptions than Cutler are Campbell (2) and Georgia's David Greene (1).

OTHER COMMODORE NOTES FOLLOWING EKU

- Vanderbilt moves to 10-1 all-time against I-AA opponents, and 5-0 in the last six years.
 - The Commodores are also 79-66-1 against non-Southeastern Conference opponents since 1970. In the last decade, the squad's non-conference record is 18-14.
 - Cornerback **Sean Dixon** (So., Tampa, Fla.) made his first career start in the Commodore secondary against Eastern Kentucky, replacing senior Bill Alford, who could return this Saturday at LSU. Dixon performed well in the role, making seven tackles.
 - Defensive end **Theo Horrocks** (Fr., Fayetteville, Tenn.) saw substantial action at defensive end, contributing two solo tackles. Horrocks is one of three Commodore true freshmen to play defensive end this season, though he was the only one that saw action Saturday.
- A fourth true freshman on the defensive front, **Gabe Hall** (Virginia Beach, Va.), played in a reserve role at defensive tackle.

THIRTEEN COMMODORES HAVE STARTED EVERY GAME OF SEASON

Thirteen Commodores - seven on defense and six on offense - have started every game this season.

Defensive players to start every game include DE **Jovan Haye**, DT/DE **Robert Dinwiddie**, linebackers **Herdley Harrison**, **Moses Osemwegie** and **Otis Washington**, cornerback **Dominique Morris** and safety **Andrew Pace**. Offensive players in every starting lineup are QB **Jay Cutler**, FB **Matthew Tant**, WR **Brandon Smith** and linemen **Brian Kovalisky**, **Trey Holloway** and **Brian Stamper**.

JAY CUTLER - ALL-TIME RANK AMONG VU QUARTERBACKS

JUNIOR SIGNAL CALLER APPROACHING FORMER STANDOUTS IN TWO OFFENSIVE CATEGORIES

Quarterback **Jay Cutler** (Jr., Santa Claus, Ind.) is approaching a pair of former quarterback greats in career total offense and career passing yardage.

Cutler is currently fifth all-time in both total offense and career passing yardage.

Cutler needs 44 yards in total offense to overtake Kurt Page (6,008 yards, 1981-84) for fourth place in the all-time list. He is 276 yards in total offense shy of replacing Eric Jones (6,240 yards, 1986-88).

Cutler also needs 33 passing yards to become fourth in career passing yards.

He is also fourth all-time with 33 TD passes.

NOTES ON THE SEASON

- In the only two games that Vanderbilt has outscored its opponent in the second half (Miss. State and Eastern Kentucky), the Commodores have captured victories.

- The defensive front versus ECU (DE **Jovan Haye**, DT **Robert Dinwiddie**, DT **Matt Clay** and DE **Aaron Carter**) was the first to duplicate an earlier game this season. The same four started in the opener versus South Carolina.

The Commodores have started five different defensive fronts this season.

- The Vanderbilt defense has allowed its last three opponents to pass for more than 250 yards: Eastern Kentucky (276), Georgia (254) and Rutgers (344).

FOUR COMMODORES CALL LOUISIANA HOME

Four current Commodores, including a starter at wide receiver, hail from Louisiana.

Brandon Smith (Sr., New Orleans, La.) has

24 career starts as a Commodore wide receiver. The team leader in receptions (27) attended St.

Augustine H.S. The quarterback for St. Augustine was Commodore junior **Jason Burns**, a reserve wide receiver and special teams member.

Sophomore reserve running back **Ron Bullock** prepped at Brother Martin H.S. in New Orleans.

A fourth player from the state, fullback **David Whittington** (St. Thomas More H.S. in Lafayette) is expected to redshirt during his freshman season.

A fifth player practicing with the Commodores, **Chris Williams** of Glynn, La., is expected to contribute on the offensive line next season.

VANDERBILT'S KENNY CARTER SERVED AT LSU

Kenny Carter, the Commodores' first year running backs coach who served with Joe Paterno at Penn State, previously worked on the LSU staff.

Carter served as a defensive assistant in 1999, the last year of Gerry Dinardo's tenure at LSU. Dinardo served as head coach at Vanderbilt from 1991-1994, leaving the Commodore job to accept the head coaching position in Baton Rouge.

COMMODORES ACTIVE IN THE NFL

Nine former Commodores, led by 2003 All-Pro safety **Corey Chavous**, are on National Football League rosters.

Two pro squads - Atlanta and San Francisco - feature two former Commodores on their rosters: Atlanta has LB **Jamie Duncan** and LB **Matt Stewart**; San Francisco has LB **Jamie Winborn** and CB **Jimmy Williams**.

Other Commodores on NFL rosters include Chavous, Minnesota; LB **Shelton Quarles**, Tampa Bay; TE **Todd Yoder**, Jacksonville; LB **Hunter Hillenmeyer**, Chicago; and safety **Ainsley Battles**, Pittsburgh.

VANDERBILT TO OPEN 2005 SEASON AT WAKE FOREST ON THURSDAY NIGHT

The Commodores will open the season next year with a Thursday night encounter at Wake Forest of the Atlantic Coast Conference.

The game is scheduled for Sept. 1, 2005, in Winston-Salem, N.C. Barring changes due to television, the game will kickoff at 7:00 p.m., EST.

Vanderbilt and Wake Forest have played nine previous games, with the Commodores holding a 6-3 series advantage. In the most recent game played, Vanderbilt earned a 17-10 victory in Winston-Salem.

The 2005 schedule also includes a resumption of the Vanderbilt-Middle Tennessee series. The teams will play on Saturday, Oct. 1.

FORMER 'DORE M.J. GARRETT ON 'THE REAL WORLD'

Former Vanderbilt wide receiver M.J. Garrett debuted recently as a cast member in MTV's popular *'The Real World-Philadelphia'* series.

Garrett, a 2002 graduate who started two years for the Commodores, is a cast member for the 15th year of the *'The Real World 15,'* the longest running reality series on television.

Garrett, a native of Old Hickory, Tenn., concluded his career with 59 receptions for 1,046 yards and 10 touchdowns. His 219-yard receiving total versus Middle Tennessee (8/30/01) is the second highest single-game total in Vanderbilt history.

GIRDIRON TIDBITS: VANDERBILT-LSU THROUGH HISTORY

1902 In one of the most bizarre roadtrips in Vanderbilt football history, the Commodores beat Tulane 23-5 on Saturday, then drove to Baton Rouge and defeated LSU 27-5 on Monday. One of the Vanderbilt star running backs was John Tigert, a future Rhodes Scholar and U.S. Secretary of Education.

1933 In a game that ended 7-7, Vanderbilt missed a last-second field goal attempt in Baton Rouge. It also was the first night game in Commodore history.

1937 LSU came to Nashville as two-time SEC champions and riding a 13-game regular season win streak. Early in the first quarter, Vanderbilt tackle Greer Ricketson, after appearing to fall while blocking, picked up the ball left by teammate Dutch Reinschmidt and rammed 50 yards without LSU defenders taking notice for the deciding touchdown in a 7-6 victory. The "hidden ball" trick play remains one of the most famous plays in Vanderbilt history.

1951 Commodore quarterback Bill Wade threw for three touchdowns to lead Vanderbilt to a 20-13 win at Baton Rouge. Earlier in the season, Wade, a Nashville native, was a coverboy on *Life* magazine.

1991 One week after losing badly to SMU in Texas, Vanderbilt topped LSU 24-21 as QB Marcus Wilson rushed for 136 yards, earning SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors.

The scoring summary never tells the full story. In this game, it couldn't possibly explain the Commodores' narrow 7-6 home loss to the Tigers.

The explosive Tigers entered the game ranked 14th nationally, featuring the rushing of tailback Kevin Faulk. Vanderbilt, coming off a loss at Ole Miss, had a dominant defense led by future NFL standouts Jamie Duncan at linebacker and Corey Chavous at cornerback.

The Commodore defense played superbly, holding LSU scoreless in the first half. After a third quarter touchdown gave LSU a 7-0 lead, Vanderbilt rallied in the final minutes, eventually scoring on an Allen-to-Hogans' 12-yard pass.

After the touchdown, the Commodores first considered a two-point conversion attempt only to be flagged for a pair of five-yard penalties. Eventually, John Markham's extra point attempt from 30 yards out was wide.
