Tigers Go After 3-0 Start Against Western Illinois

LSU looks to go 3-0 for the first time since 1998 when the 11th-ranked Tigers host I-AA national power Western Illinois tonight in Tiger Stadium. LSU enters the contest coming off a 59-13 road win over Arizona, while Western Illinois posted a 34-12 road victory over I-A foe Eastern Michigan last Thursday. This will be the first meeting between the two teams. The Western Illinois contest will serve as LSU's final tuneup before opening Southeastern Conference play on Sept. 20 against Georgia at 2:30 p.m. in Tiger Stadium on CBS. The Tigers enter the Western Illinois contest averaging an SEC-leading 54 points a contest. LSU is allowing only 10.0 points a game and the Tiger defense ranks first in the SEC and sixth nationally yielding just 211 yards per contest (75.0 rushing, 136.0 passing). LSU has won seven straight home games against non-conference foes dating back to 2000. Overall, the Tigers have won two straight in Tiger Stadium.

LSU Storms Past Arizona, 59-13, In The Desert

LSU scored on seven of its first eight possessions, including a 15-play, 80-yard drive to open the contest, as the Tigers had little trouble with Arizona, posting a 59-13 win over the Wildcats in Tucson, Ariz. Quarterbacks **Matt Mauck** and **Marcus Randall** combined to connect on 19 of 25 passes for 299 yards and two TDs and **Joseph Addai** rushed for 86 yards and a pair of scores to lead the Tigers. **Michael Clayton** led all receivers with six catches for 109 yards and a 48-yard TD reception. Addai opened the scoring for LSU with a 1-yard run midway through the first quarter. **Ryan Gaudet** nailed a 47-yard field goal three minutes later and then Addai added an 8-yard TD run less than a minute after Gaudet's field goal to give the Tigers a 17-0 lead. LSU stretched the advantage to 38-0 at halftime, as the Tigers were never threatened in the contest. In all the Tigers, had five rushing TDs, two passing TDs and **Skyler Green** returned a punt 65 yards for a TD. Arizona scored its first points with 10 minutes left in the contest on a 1-yard fumble return. Defensively, LSU limited the Wildcats to only 182 yards of offense, including just 85 yards in the three quarters. The Tigers also held Arizona to only 1 of 13 on third-down conversion attempts. The LSU offense racked up 481 yards of offense, 227 on the ground and 299 through the air.

LSU VS. WESTERN ILLINOIS

Nick Saban

HEAD COACH • FOURTH YEAR

For years outsiders viewed the LSU football program as an unpolished gem, a potential giant waiting to be reborn in the world of college football. With the wealth of resources LSU has to offer, its tradition and the available talent within the state of Louisiana, all the program needed was the right leader to lead it. Entering his fourth year as head coach of the Tigers, Nick Saban is that leader.

Since taking over in Baton Rouge in 2000, Saban has transformed the LSU football program into one that wins championships, while graduating players at the same time.

Equipped with a plan that gives his players the best chance to be successful on the field as well as in the classroom, Saban's impact on the program has been immediate and it's been powerful.

In just three years as LSU's head coach, Saban's on-field success has been nothing short of remarkable, as he's guided the Tigers to 26 victories, a pair of bowl wins, including one in the Bowl Championship Series, and the 2001 Southeastern Conference title. The Tigers have also played in back-to-back New Year's Day bowls for the first time since the 1960s.

On top of LSU's success on the gridiron, the Tigers are being recognized for their efforts in the classroom. Currently, all 22 of the Tiger seniors from the 2002 team are on pace to graduate within the next 12 months, while Rodney Reed earned First Team Academic All-America honors and Bradie James was awarded an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship from the National Football Foundation last year.

Off the field, Saban and his players are active in the community, promoting goodwill by participating in such things as community service projects and visiting hospitals and schools in the Baton Rouge area on a regular basis. Saban has also worn the hat of fundraiser during his stay in Baton Rouge as he spearheaded an effort that raised more than \$15 million for a state-of-the-art academic center for student-athletes. The new Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes is part of Saban's plan to give his players the best opportunity to be successful when they finish their football careers. The center, which spans 54,000 square feet, is the best of its kind and features 100 computers, a 1,000-seat auditorium, a library and a communications center for training student-athletes.

Saban became the 31st head coach of the LSU Tigers on November 30, 1999, after five years as head coach at Michigan State.

He didn't waste anytime making his impact felt as he guided a team coming off back-to-back losing seasons to an 8-4 mark and a win over 15th-ranked Georgia Tech in the Peach Bowl in 2000 to rekindle the fire of a proud football tradition in Baton Rouge.

A year later in 2001, Saban guided the Tigers to their first outright SEC title since 1986 with a 31-20 win over second-ranked Tennessee in the SEC Championship game. LSU followed that with a 47-34 victory over Illinois in the Sugar Bowl to cap a 10-3 season for the Tigers.

Last year, Saban guided the Tigers to an 8-5 overall mark and a share of the SEC Western Division title. The Tigers also played in a New Year's Day bowl game for the second consecutive year, a first for LSU since the 1960's, with an appearance in the Cotton Bowl.

Prior to LSU, Saban spent five years as the head coach at Michigan State, where he built the Spartans into a perennial Big Ten contender after going to four bowl games in five seasons.

The Tigers host 1-AA national power Western Illinois tonight at 7 o'clock in Tiger Stadium. The game will mark the first meeting between the teams. LSU is 3-0 all-time against 1-AA foes. The Western Illinois contest will mark LSU's final tuneup before opening Southeastern Conference action on Sept. 20 in Tiger Stadium against Georgia. LSU has one more non-league game on the slate, as the Tigers will host Louisiana Tech for Homecoming at 7 p.m. on Nov. 1.

About Western Illinois

The Leathernecks enter the contest with a 2-0 mark as they have recorded wins over Wayne State and Eastern Michigan ... Tonight's game marks the second-straight 1A road game for Western Illinois ... The Leathernecks beat Eastern Michigan, 34-12, on Sept. 4 ... Western Illinois has never faced a member of the Southeastern Conference ... The Leathernecks are 6-14 all-time vs. Division 1A teams ... Member of the Gateway Conference ... Reached the second round of the 1-AA playoffs last year before being eliminated by eventual champion Western Kentucky ... Western Illinois features one of the top quarterbacks in 1-AA in senior Russ Michna.

In The Polls

LSU jumped to two spots to No. 11 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll following its 46-point victory over Arizona last week. The Tigers moved one spot to No. 12 in the Associated Press poll. The No. 11 ranking in the coaches poll is the highest spot for the Tigers since holding down the No. 10 spot in both polls last Oct. 20.

Who's In and Who's Out for The Tigers

The Tigers enter tonight's contest without the services of cornerback **Randall Gay** (broken left arm), wide receiver **Amp Hill** (knee), linebacker **Philip Maxwell** (broken foot), offensive guard **Terrell McGill** (bruised kidney) and defensive end **Kirston Pittman** (knee). Tight end **Kory Hebert** (ankle) and wide receiver **Craig Davis** (elbow) are expected to return to action tonight. Davis dressed out, but did not play vs. Arizona.

Looking Ahead To Next Week

The Tigers entertain eighth-ranked Georgia at 2:30 p.m. in a game televised to a national audience by CBS. The game will mark the SEC opener for LSU and will also serve as the first game between the teams since 1999 when Georgia beat the Tigers, 23-22, in Athens.

LSU's Offense On Fast Track; Leads SEC With 54.0 Points A Contest

Through two games, the Tigers scored a total of 108 points (49 vs. UL-Monroe and 59 vs. Arizona). The Tigers currently stand atop the SEC and rank third in the nation in scoring average with 54.0 points a contest. The 108 points over the first two games of a season are the most in modern day LSU football. You have to go all the way back to 1930 to find an LSU team that has scored more points over the first two games of a season than this year's squad. In 1930, LSU opened the year by scoring 76 vs. S.D. Wesleyan and then 71 vs. Louisiana Tech. In week 3 in 1930, the Tigers registered an 85-0 win over then Southwestern Louisiana.

Efficient Offense

One thing is for certain, LSU made the most of its opportunities on offense against Arizona. The Tiger offense scored each of the first six times they touched the ball on Saturday against the Wildcats. LSU opened the scoring with 15-play, 80-yard drive that resulted in a 1-yard TD run by **Joseph Addai**. Following a 47-yard field goal by **Ryan Gaudet**, the Tigers then scored TDs on their next four possessions for a 38-0 halftime lead. The 38 points were the most in a half for LSU since scoring 43 in the second half against Kentucky in a 63-28 victory in 1997.

Jones Only One Being Victimized By LSU's Potent Offense

The only person that seems to be affected adversely by the potent LSU offense is that of Tiger punter **Donnie Jones**. On Saturday vs. Arizona, Jones was one of the last Tigers on the field, as he didn't get a chance to punt until there was less than eight minutes left in the contest when LSU finally had a drive stalled. Jones ended up punting twice vs. Arizona, and he averaged 47.0 yards on those kicks. When asked after the game how many times he warmed up and punted into the net on the sidelines waiting for a chance to get into the game, Jones replied "at least 50." Through two games, Jones has punted six times with an average of 42.0 per punt. Jones currently ranks third in the SEC in punting average.

The Long Ball

The Tigers seem to be more of a deep threat in 2003. Four of LSU's six touchdown passes have been from 40 yards or longer in the first two games of the season. **Matt Mauck** and **Marcus Randall** have each tossed two long touchdown passes, while **Michael Clayton** has been on the receiving end of three and **Devery Henderson** has caught one. Mauck and Clayton connected on a 48-yard strike against UL-Monroe, and a 40-yarder against Arizona, while Randall hit Clayton for a 66-yard bomb against ULM and Henderson for a 55-

yarder against Arizona. Last year LSU has just three touchdown passes from over 40 yards.

More on the 46-Point Win Over Arizona

LSU's 59-13 win over Arizona in Tucson marked the largest road win for the Tigers since a 47-0 victory over Mississippi State in Jackson in 1986. It also marked the largest win by the Tigers in an opponent's home stadium since 1958 when LSU beat Tulane, 62-0, in New Orleans. The loss also marked the third-largest margin of defeat for Arizona in its own stadium. In addition, the 59 points were the most by an LSU team since scoring 63 in a road victory over Kentucky in 1997.

Saban Gets Win No. 28 at LSU and No. 71 Overall

LSU coach **Nick Saban** moved past Mike Archer into sole possession of sixth place in school history in wins with 28 after the Tiger victory over Arizona. In just over three years with LSU, Saban has posted a 28-12 overall mark. Saban also won the 71st game of his career. In his 10th season overall, Saban has put together an overall record of 71-38-1. Charles McClendon holds the school-record with 137 victories in 19 years as LSU's head coach.

Tigers Are 12-3 In Non-Conference Games Under Saban

LSU will take a 12-3 non-conference record under Nick Saban into the Western Illinois contest. The Tigers were 3-1 in non-league games in 2000, followed by a 4-0 mark in 2001 and a 3-2 record last year. Included in the 12 non-SEC wins over the last three-plus years for the Tigers are bowl victories over Georgia Tech and Illinois.

Taking Notes On The Tigers Under Saban

Here's a look at some notable LSU trends during its first 40 games under Nick Saban ... LSU is 23-2 when leading at halftime and 21-2 when leading after three quarters ... The Tigers are 27-3 when scoring 20 or more points and 26-0 when scoring 25 or more points ... On the other hand, LSU is 1-9 when failing to reach the 20-point mark ... LSU is 7-2 in games decided by 7 points or less and 3-1 in games decided by 3 points or less ... LSU is 9-4 in September under Saban ... LSU is 16-0 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing and the Tigers are 11-0 when having a 100-yard rusher.

Skyler Has Memorable Debut As Punt Returner

Skyler Green's first career punt return will go down as one that will be hard to forget. Green returned his first career punt 65 yards for a touchdown in LSU's win over Arizona on Saturday. The 65-yard return is the longest by a Tiger since Domanick Davis had a 78-yard punt return for a TD vs. Mississippi State last season.

Tiger Special Teams Are Clicking On All Cylinders

First year special teams coordinator **Derek Dooley** has the Tiger specialist clicking on all cylinders after two games. Heading into week 3 of the season, LSU currently ranks first in the SEC in net punting (41.3 per punt), kickoff returns (28.2 avg.) and PAT kicking (15-of-15), the Tigers are third in the SEC in kickoff coverage (17.7 avg.) and they are fourth in punt return average (16.8). LSU and Alabama are the only teams in the SEC that have returned a punt for a TD this year.

Mauck Is An Accountable Starting QB

Since taking over as LSU's starting quarterback at the beginning of last season, **Matt Mauck** has led the Tigers to a 7-1 mark. What Mauck has also done is be directly involved in 16 of LSU's 33 offensive touchdowns over that 8-game span. In 8 games as a starter, the Tigers have scored 33 offensive touchdowns (these numbers take in to account whether Mauck was in the game or not), and he's either passed or rushed for 16 of those. Of the 33 offensive TDs that LSU has scored in his eight starts, Mauck has passed for 13 TDs and rushed for another three.

Mauck and Randall... A Nice 1-2 Punch At Quarterback

LSU's **Matt Mauck** and **Marcus Randall** have proven to be a nice 1-2 punch for LSU at quarterback. Mauck, the starter, has completed 23 of 39 passes for 303 yards and 4 TDs in the first two games, while Randall has hit on 14 of 21 passes for 302 yards and a pair of TDs. Both quarterbacks have only thrown one interception.

Mauck Moves To 7-1 As A Starter

Matt Mauck ran his record as LSU's starting quarterback to 7-1 with the Tiger win over Arizona. The 7-1 start by Mauck is the best by an LSU quarterback since Herb Tyler won his first eight games as a starter from 1995-96. In addition, Mauck has played in 11 games in his LSU career and the Tigers are 9-2 in those contests.

Jimbo Keeps Spreading It Around In The Passing Game

In week one, the Tigers had seven different players catch passes. LSU did one better in week two as eight different players were on the receiving end of at least one pass against Arizona. To date, the Tigers have nine players with at least one catch. In two games, LSU has completed 37 passes with the wide receivers account-

One week after setting a career-high with 152 yards receiving, LSU's **Michael Clayton** came back with another outstanding performance in the win over Arizona. Clayton caught six passes for 109 yards and one TD against Arizona despite sitting out most of the second half. All six of Clayton's receptions came in the first half, including a 48-yarder for a TD. Through two games, Clayton has now caught TD passes of 40, 48, and 66-yards. Clayton currently ranks first in the SEC and eighth nationally with 130.5 yards receiving a contest. Through two games, Clayton has caught 12 passes for 261 yards and three TDs.

Add Another True Frosh to The List
Barrington Edwards added his name to the list of true freshman that have seen action for the Tigers this season, running the total to 12 through two games. LSU opened the season by playing 11 true freshmen against UL-Monroe. The Tigers had 12 play against Arizona. Tigers Have Experience on the O-Line
The LSU offensive line has been touted as one of the best in the nation. The Tiger offensive line may be one of the most experienced as the LSU front five have 101 career starts between them. **Rodney Reed** leads the way with 36, followed by **Stephen Peterman** with 27, **Ben Wilkerson** with 21 and **Andrew Whitworth** 15. **Nate Livings** has started both games this season. LSU is 16-4 when Reed, Peterman and Wilkerson start on the offensive line together (8-0 in 2001, 6-4 in 2002, 2-0 in 2003).

Reed Among Nation's Elite In Starts on Offensive Line
Senior offensive tackle **Rodney Reed** will start his 37th straight game tonight against Western Illinois. Reed's 36 career starts ranks as the fifth-highest total among active Division I players. Marshall's Nate McPeek leads the way with 40 career starts.

Pancakes Are Breakfast of Choice For LSU O-Line
A new wrinkle to this year's offensive grade sheet is the tracking of both pancakes and knockdowns for the LSU offensive line. Through two games **Andrew Whitworth** leads the Tigers with 8 pancakes after picking up 2 more against Arizona. Whitworth also added 6 knockdowns against Arizona to run his season total to 19. **Nate Livings** led LSU with 12 knockdowns against Arizona, while **Rodney Reed** added 10.

Addai Gives Tiger Versatile Running Back
Joseph Addai gives the Tigers some versatility in the backfield as the sophomore can be effective both running with and catching the football. In two games this year, Addai is averaging 83.5 yards rushing per contest to go along with three receptions for 20 yards. In 33 rushing attempts this season, Addai has yet to lose a yard. He's rushed for 167 yards on those 33 attempts for an average of 5.1 yards per carry. Addai has also rushed for a pair of TDs and added another receiving touchdown.

Carey Fills In Nicely For Domanick

A concern for LSU heading into the season was how to replace the departed Domanick Davis, the school's all-time leader in both punt return and kickoff return yards. **Shyrone Carey** has put some of that concern to rest as he's averaging 15.6 yards on nine punt returns this season. Against Arizona, Carey returned returned five punts for 58 yards, including a 35-yard return that setup LSU's first quarter field goal that put the lead at 10-0. In all, LSU is averaging 16.8 yards on 12 punt returns, a figure that ranks fourth in the league and 18th nationally.

Tiger "D" Keeps First Quarter Streak Alive

By holding Arizona scoreless, the LSU defense ran its streak of scoreless first quarters to six straight dating back to last season. The last time an opposing offense scored on the Tigers in the first quarter came against Kentucky in week 9 of last year. Texas scored a first quarter TD against the Tigers in the Cotton Bowl, but that was on a return of a **Marcus Randall** fumble. Dating back to last year's season-opener, the LSU defense has allowed on 4 first quarter touchdowns.

Tiger Defense Has Been Stingy

Through eight quarters this season, LSU's defense has held the opponent out of the endzone in six of those. In week 1, Louisiana-Monroe didn't score until the fourth quarter and the same was true in week 2 as Arizona's offense didn't score until there was only four minutes left in the contest. LSU currently ranks first in the SEC and sixth nationally by allowing only 211 yards per game (75 rushing, 136 passing).

Cap and Gown Tigers

LSU has two players on this year's roster who have already earned their bachelor's degree - offensive tackle **Rodney Reed** and center **Jimmy Courtenay**. Reed and Courtenay both graduated last May. Reed, who earned First Team Academic All-America honors last year, graduated with a 3.9 grade point average in accounting. He is currently pursuing his Master's in accounting.

Clayton Has Teams Seeing Double (Triple, really)

Michael Clayton finally had his much-anticipated debut on defense on Saturday vs. Arizona as the two-way player saw action on three plays at safety. Clayton did not record any statistics on defense, however he did make a tackle from his wide receiver position after an intercepted pass on offense. Clayton is actually playing three ways for the Tigers as he also serves as the Tiger holder on all placekicks as well as being on the kickoff coverage team. The Arizona contest marked the second time in Clayton's career that he has seen action on both sides of the ball. He did it for the first time last year vs. Texas in the Cotton Bowl.

Peterman's Pulling Double-Duty Too

As of Tuesday, Aug. 26, senior offensive lineman **Stephen Peterman** began pulling double-duty as well, only his is as a player and daddy. Peterman's wife Colleen gave birth to a 6-pound, 10-ounce baby boy in Metairie, La. Peterman missed two days of practice to be with his wife during the birth, but he returned to the squad on Thursday and started on Saturday against UL-Monroe. The newest Peterman, Stephen Frederick, Jr., checked in at some 318 pounds lighter than his daddy. Upon LSU's arrival in Baton Rouge at 5:30 a.m. on Sunday following the Arizona game, Peterman replied that he was heading home to help with the morning feeding of the baby.

Rookie Kickers Come Up Big

The departure of John Corbello left the Tigers with some pretty big shoes to fill in the kicking game in 2003. LSU may have just found the solution in a pair of freshmen in **Chris Jackson** and **Ryan Gaudet**. Through two games, the duo has combined to hit all 15 of LSU's extra-point attempts with Gaudet making nine and Jackson six. In addition, Gaudet drilled his first career-field goal vs. Arizona, a 47-yarder. Jackson continues to handle the kickoff duties for LSU and the Tigers currently rank third in the SEC by allowing only 17.7 yards per return.

Gaudet Joins Elite List With 47-Yard FG

Ryan Gaudet added his name to a very short list of LSU kickers last week with his 47-yard field goal against Arizona. Gaudet's 47-yard field goal marked the first of his career and it marked the third-longest at LSU for a kicker on his first career make. Juan Roca holds the record as he connected on a 52-yard field goal vs. Wisconsin for hiscareer make, while Wade Richey's first career make was a 48-yarder vs. Michigan State in 1995.

Give Devery An ESPY

LSU wide receiver **Devery Henderson** became the second Tiger to win an ESPY when he claimed the honor for Best Play in July in Hollywood for his part in the Bluegrass Miracle. Henderson beat out Barry Bonds, Kobe Bryant, LeBron James and Michael Vick to win the award. Henderson joined Warren Morris as the two LSU athletes to be named winners of an ESPY. Morris was honored in 1997 with the Showstopper of the Year

Among the SEC's Best

LSU was selected to finished second in the SEC West by the media at the annual SEC Media Days in Birmingham in late July. The Tigers received 162 points and 13 first-place votes. Auburn was picked to win the West and the overall title, while Georgia was tabbed as East champions.

Preseason All-SEC

LSU was well represented on the preseason All-SEC teams selected by the media at the 2003 SEC Media Days. Junior center **Ben Wilkerson**, junior wide receiver **Michael Clayton**, senior defensive tackle **Chad Lavalais** and junior cornerback **Corey Webster** were all selected to the first-team, while senior offensive guard **Stephen Peterman** and senior punter **Donnie Jones** were named to the second-team.

Wilkerson Named to Rimington Watch List

Junior center **Ben Wilkerson** is one of 38 players named to the watch list for the Rimington Trophy. The award, established in 2000, is named for Nebraska's Dave Rimington, one of college football's most decorated offensive linemen. This is the second straight season Wilkerson has made the preseason watch list for the award. Wilkerson has started 20 games in his career and LSU is 15-5 in those games.

Webster on Thorpe and Nagurski Watch List

Junior cornerback **Corey Webster**, who led the Southeastern Conference last season with seven interceptions, has been named to the Jim Thorpe Award and the Bronko Nagurski watch lists. The Thorpe award, presented annually to the nation's top defensive back, is named after history's greatest all-around athlete who excelled on both defense and offense during his football career. The Nagurski award is presented to the nation's top all-around defensive player.

Peterman on Lombardi Watch List

Senior offensive guard **Stephen Peterman**, a 2002 first-team All-SEC selection, has been named to the preliminary watch list for the Rotary Lombardi Award. Peterman is one of 41 players on the list for the award that is presented annually to the nation's top offensive or defensive lineman.

Turner on Butkus Watch List

Junior linebacker **Lionel Turner** has been named to the preseason Butkus Award watch list. The Walker, La., native finished third on the team is tackles last season with 71 and recorded three sacks. The award is presented annually to the nation's top linebacker.

Jones Punting to the Top

Donnie Jones, a senior punter, ranks in the top three of all three of LSU's career punting stats. The Baton Rouge native ranks second in punting average at 41.9 yards per kick, just one yard behind career leader Chad Kessler's 42.9. Jones ranks third in punting yardage with 7,293 in his career, 11 behind Clay Parker for second place and 683 behind Chad Kessler's top spot. Jones is also third in total punts with 174, 8 behind Parker for second and 12 behind Kessler.

Clayton on the Move

Michael Clayton, a junior wide receiver, is moving up the LSU career record books. The Baton Rouge native enters the Western Illinois game ranked tied for seventh in career receiving touchdowns with 14. Clayton also ranks 10th in career reception with 116 and he's ninth in career receiving yards with 1,764. Clayton also ranks tied for seventh in school history in career 100-yard games with five.

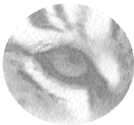

- LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 80th year in the venerable stadium on **SATURDAY NIGHT**.

- Under **Nick Saban**, the Tigers have posted a **18-4 HOME RECORD**, including a 4-2 mark against ranked opponents. Against conference foes, Saban is 8-3 in Death Valley. In home games at night, LSU is 14-3 since Saban took over.

- LSU has won **NINE OF ITS LAST 10** games at home, including an eight-game win streak during the stretch. That was the longest home streak for the Tigers since winning eight straight from 1995-96.

- More than **85,000 FANS** have attended each of LSU's last 20 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 13 times, including a school-record 92,141 for the 2001 Auburn contest, which LSU won 27-14.

- Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has ranked in the top 20 all 45 seasons. The Tigers have been in the top 15 for 43 of the 45 years and in the top 10 on 37 occasions, including 32 straight from 1957-88. Fourteen times, LSU has ranked in the **TOP FIVE IN THE NATION**, including the last three.

- Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar **183-61-4 (.745)** record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. On the other hand, the Tigers are just 14-20-3 (.419) at home during the day in that span.

- Death Valley is the **SIXTH LARGEST** on-campus stadium in the nation holding 91,600 fans.

Earthquake Game

October 8, 1988. Tommy Hodson connected with Eddie Fuller on 4-and-10 with 1:41 to play for the game-winning touchdown as LSU upset No. 4 Auburn. The play caused such a thunderous explosion from the crowd of 79,341 that the tremor caused by the vibrations measured on the seismograph across campus.

Halloween Night

October 31, 1959. No. 1 LSU trailed No. 3 Ole Miss, 3-0, late in the fourth quarter when Billy Cannon fielded a punt off the bounce at the 11-yard line. He raced 89 yards, careening off seven Rebel defenders, to paydirt to give the Tigers victory and all but clinch the 1959 Heisman Trophy.

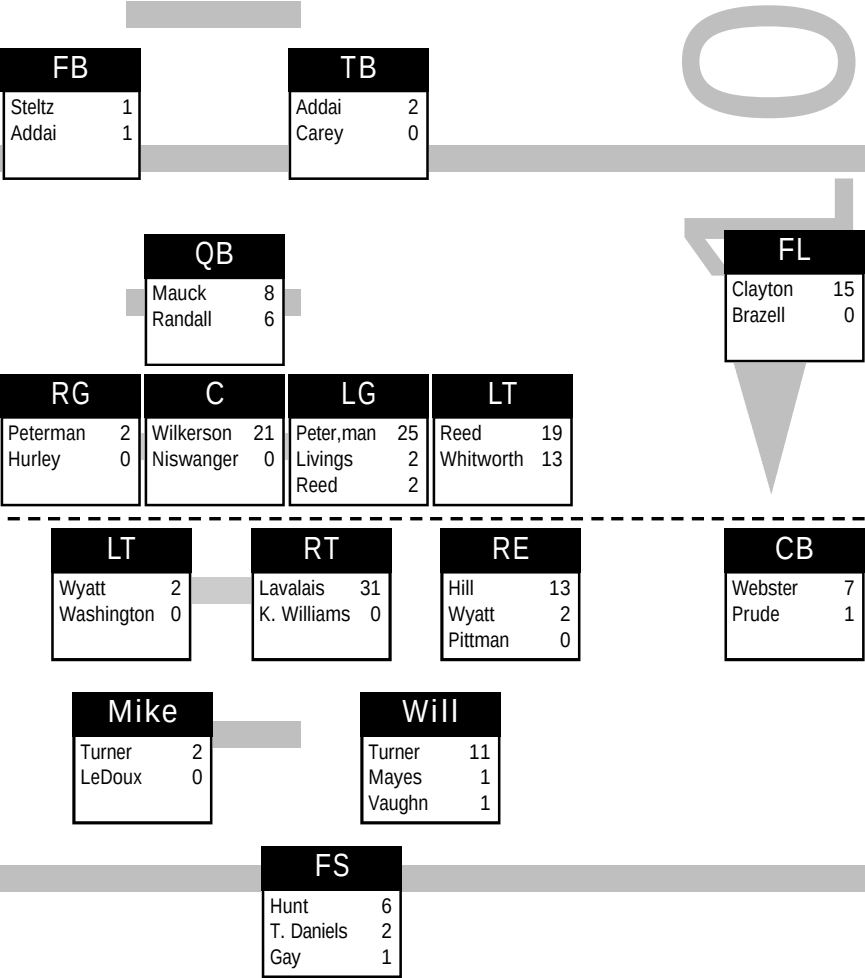

LSU's Rolls Past UL-Monroe, 49-7

Matt Mauck threw three touchdown passes, Joseph Addai rushed for 81 yards and Michael Clayton caught six passes for 152 yards and a pair of TD passes as LSU rolled to a 49-7 win over Louisiana-Monroe in the season-opener for both teams. The game was only four minutes old when a thunderstorm rolled into Baton Rouge and caused a 39-minute delay because of lightning. After a scoreless first quarter, Mauck then threw three TD passes over the final seven minutes of the second quarter to put the Tigers up 21-0 at halftime. Shyrone Carey added a 1-yard run midway through the third quarter to give LSU a 28-0 advantage and the Tigers stretched the margin to 35-0 with a 31-yard interception return just 16 seconds later. Louisiana-Monroe scored its only points of the contest on a 12-yard run by Kevin Payne with 14:10 left in the fourth quarter. Freshman Alley Broussard capped the scoring for the Tigers with a 1-yard run with 10:39 left in the contest. For the game, the Tigers racked up 474 yards of offense (306 passing, 168 rushing) compared to just 240 yard for the Indians (59 rushing, 181 passing).

LSU Storms Past Arizona, 59-13, In The Desert

LSU scored on its first seven possessions, including a 15-play, 80-yard drive to open the contest, as the Tigers had little trouble with Arizona, posting a 59-13 win over the Wildcats in Tucson, Ariz. Quarterbacks Matt Mauck and Marcus Randall combined to connect on 19 of 25 passes for 299 yards and two TDs and Joseph Addai rushed for 86 yards and a pair of scores to lead the Tigers. Michael Clayton led all receivers with six catches for 109 yards and a 48-yard TD reception. Addai opened the scoring for LSU with a 1-yard run midway through the first quarter. Ryan Gaudet nailed a 47-yard field goal three minutes later and then Addai added an 8-yard TD run less than a minute after Gaudet's field goal to give the Tigers a 17-0 lead. LSU stretched the advantage to 38-0 at halftime, as the Tigers were never threatened in the contest. In all the Tigers, had five rushing TDs, two passing TDs and Skyler Green returned a punt 65 yards for a TD. Arizona scored its first points with 10 minutes left in the contest on a 1-yard fumble return. Defensively, LSU limited the Wildcats to only 182 yards of offense.
