Hog Call: LSU returns home to face SEC West rival Arkansas in a key three-game series.

- The Tigers take a break from a stretch that finds them playing four of five series against the SEC East.
- LSU is 4-4 against the SEC West with a series against Alabama to close the season.
- The Tigers broke a two-game losing streak Tuesday with a 10-3 victory at Louisiana-Monroe, collecting a season high 16 hits in the process.
- The Tigers have now won five consecutive midweek games after losing four of their first five such contests.
- LSU has won its last six games at Alex Box Stadium, outscoring its foes 63-16 in the process.

Scouting the Razorbacks: Arkansas comes in at 7-8 in the league, fighting to make the SEC Tournament for the first time since its league championship in 1999.

- The Razorbacks dropped a tough 3-2 decision to nationally ranked Wichita St. on Tuesday in their lone midweek contest.
- Arkansas took two of three from Tennessee last weekend at home, winning the final two games after a 14-9 loss in the opener.
- The Razorbacks have struggled on the road in the league, going 2-5 away from Fayetteville compared to 5-3 at home in SEC play.
- Arkansas has held its own against the league's top teams, shutting out Alabama 10-0 to hand the Tide their first conference loss, then going 2-0 earlier this month against South Carolina.
- Arkansas has had three SEC games canceled by rain, losing two at Vanderbilt and the final game of the South Carolina series.
- Razorback coach Norm DeBriyn will be looking for his 1,150th win this weekend and stands ninth among active coaches in victories.
- The Hogs are hitting .279 as a team and are 10th in the SEC, but are fifth in the SEC in pitching with a 3.96 ERA.
- Arkansas has suffered from back-to-back losing seasons in 2000 and 2001 after having only one losing season (1976) in DeBriyn's first 30 years.

About the Series: The series has been dominated by the home team in recent years, with LSU holding a 30-14 all-time edge.

- Arkansas has won six of the last seven meetings at Fayetteville, including a three-game sweep last year that knocked the Tigers out of the top spot in the ESPN/Baseball Weekly poll.
- Arkansas has also won the last three meetings on neutral fields, winning in the 1998 Winn-Dixie Showdown at the Superdome and in the 1998 and 1999 SEC Tournament in Birmingham.
- The Razorbacks have lost eight straight games in Baton Rouge, with their last victory coming by a 3-2 count on Apr. 19, 1996.
- LSU swept the Hogs in 2000 at Alex Box Stadium, winning 12-3, 12-5 and 17-11.
- The Tigers have scored 68 runs in their last four home games against Arkansas, starting with a 27-6 victory in 1998.
- LSU won the first 10 meetings in the series after the Hogs joined the SEC in 1992, including a pair of SEC Tournament wins.
- The teams' last meeting prior to 1992 was in the 1987 College World Series, with LSU taking a 6-3 victory.

Tonight's Starting Pitcher

#46 Soph. LH Lane Mestepey (6-0, 187, Zachary–Central Private)

Last year, Lane Mestepey struggled in losing to Arkansas at Fayetteville. Tonight, he's out to avenge that defeat and win his sixth consecutive start. The pitcher who defeated him last year in the Ozarks, senior right-hander Charlie Isaacson (2-5, 3.38) gets the start for the Razorbacks tonight.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

2002: Has won his last five decisions and sports an 8-2 record with a 3.31 ERA.

- Did not allow a walk over a span of 33.0 innings from Feb. 23 to Mar. 23.
- Allowing just 1.39 walks per nine innings.
- Going for his 20th career victory tonight against Arkansas.
- Gave up a career high 12 hits in 8.2 innings at South Carolina (4/19), but still earned the win.
- Pitched third complete game of the season and the seventh of his career to defeat Georgia (4/12). Gave up just two runs and struck out five.
- Earned third straight victory with 6.2 innings at Auburn (4/5), allowing just two earned runs and striking out four.
- Walked none in 6.1 innings to improve to 5-2 with win over Mississippi St. (3/30).
- Picked up second complete game victory at Ole Miss (3/23) despite walking a career-high five batters.
- Gave up five runs (four earned) on nine hits in last outing vs. Vanderbilt (3/16).
- Earned second consecutive LSWA Pitcher of the Week honor for effort vs. UL-Monroe (3/9), giving up one run in eight innings.
- Earned complete-game victory at Houston (2/23), giving up just one run on six hits in the final 7.0 innings.
- Followed up Houston game with brilliant 8.0 inning stint vs. Long Beach St. (3/2, Game 2), striking out a career-best eight to improve to 2-0 to earn LSWA Pitcher of the Week honors.
- Struck out six in 7.0-plus innings against Birmingham-Southern (2/9). Carried a shutout into the eighth inning.
- Has 10 quality starts (6.0+ IP, <4 ER) out of 12 this season.

2001: Led the SEC in victories (11) and ERA (3.75), going 11-3 in 22 games (19 starts), pitching 139.1 innings.

- Named the national Freshman of the Year by Collegiate Baseball and was a third team All-American by the same publication.
- Named the 2001 SEC Freshman of the Year and was a first team All-SEC selection.
- Allowed two or fewer earned runs in 11 of 19 starts.
- Yielded only 2.39 walks per nine innings.
- Went 7.1 or more innings in his first eight SEC starts.
- Named SEC Pitcher of the Week on Apr. 16 for sterling Easter Sunday effort vs. Ole Miss. In complete-game victory, Mestepey walked none and scattered nine hits. Was 2-0 with a 1.20 ERA in two outings in 2001 against the Rebels.
- Four days before the Ole Miss victory, he allowed only one earned run over 7.2 innings against Tulane at Zephyr Field.
- Got victory in first career start vs. Kansas St. on Feb. 11, giving up six hits in 6.0 innings.
- Had superb effort in no-decision at Georgia on Mar. 10, giving up one earned run and striking out six in 7.2 innings.
- Fell just short of shutout on Mar. 24 at Mississippi St., allowing one run and no walks while fanning six over 8.1 innings.
- First complete-game came vs. Kentucky on Mar. 30, giving up one earned run and striking out five.
- Did not lose until Apr. 20 vs. Vanderbilt, and even in that loss, he threw a complete game.
- Turned in spectacular complete-game effort at Alabama on Apr. 27, giving up one earned run and fanning six to start LSU on its way to a three-game sweep in Tuscaloosa. He retired 18 of 19 batters faced in the fourth through eighth innings.
- Allowed no earned runs over 6.0 innings of victory vs. Ole Miss at SEC Tournament May 17.
- Made last effort of the year his best, going 10.0 innings and striking out six in Super Regional at Tulane, a game LSU won in 13 innings.

Tigers looking to continue home cooking

For the season, LSU is actually hitting three points higher away from Alex Box Stadium than it is at home (.302 to .299). But in the last month, the Tigers have been hammering the ball in their own lair.

The Tigers enter tonight's series opener with Arkansas on a six-game home winning streak, and a big reason for the success is a 63-16 scoring margin in those games. LSU has scored at least seven runs in each game during the streak, including 40 runs in the last three games in two wins over Georgia and one over Southern.

The Tigers are hitting .348 during the home streak, as five players are at .400 or better during the streak. Leading the way is J.C. Holt, who had four hits on Apr. 13 against Georgia and is 7-for-11 during the streak. For the year, Holt is the Tigers' leading hitter at home, batting .383, one point ahead of Wally Pontiff at .382.

Meanwhile, the pitching has been just as stingy during this home streak, posting a head-spinning 2.00 ERA and giving up just a .237 opponents' batting average. This trend is consistent with the full season, as LSU pitchers' ERA is much lower at home (3.55 to 4.45 away), and opponents are hitting only .265 at The Box compared to .313 on the road.

The revenge factor?

Last year's sweep by Arkansas marked just the fourth time since 1990 that the Tigers had been swept in a three-game series. If recent history is any indication, LSU should come back strong this weekend against the Razorbacks.

Prior to last year, LSU was last swept in a three-game series in 2000 by Houston at Alex Box Stadium. The next year, LSU recovered to sweep the Cougars at home. The same thing happened against Florida earlier in the 1990s, as LSU lost all three games at Gainesville in 1996 before bouncing back to sweep the Gators in Baton Rouge the next year. However, Florida beat the Tigers a fourth time at the 1996 SEC Tournament before LSU downed the Gators twice at the College World Series en route to a national championship.

Arkansas is bidding to win back-to-back series from the Tigers, something only Georgia has done since 1998, as the Bulldogs won in two of three in 2000 and 2001 before being swept this year. The last SEC West team to win consecutive series from LSU was Alabama, who won three in a row from 1995-97.



Barker's big night

Sean Barker has been LSU's most consistent hitter throughout the 2002 season, but other than for a 4-for-6 outing in the season opener, he had not posted a breakout-type game.

That is, until Tuesday night. Against UL-Monroe, Barker put up the best numbers of his career going 4-for-5 with 5 RBI in the Tigers' 10-3 triumph. Barker's big hit was a two-run single in the eighth that gave him his career highs.

Barker leads the Tigers with 42 RBI, but prior to Tuesday, he had just four games with three RBI and one game with four RBI, and that came way back on Feb. 10 against Birmingham-Southern.

The big night was a welcome sight for the senior right fielder from California, as he was just 2-for-16 with one RBI in the Tigers' four games last week, including an 0-for-8 slide in the final two games of the South Carolina series.

The slide is now over, as Barker's big night Tuesday raised his season batting average by 13 points to .373, as he still leads the team in RBI and stolen bases with 18 in 21 tries. Barker also has a career .361 batting average, good for fifth on the LSU all-time list.

Barker's big night is just the third game of 5 or more RBI by an LSU player this year. Matt Heath drove in a season best six runs against Mercer on Feb. 17, and Blake Gill duplicated the feat on Apr. 14 vs. Georgia.

Holt finds homer power

For a left-handed hitter standing all of 5-foot-8, 160 pounds, left field would be the last place you would expect a home run to be hit. But LSU second baseman J. C. Holt has defied logic three times this year by going the other way out of the park.

The latest blast came Tuesday at UL-Monroe, a three-run shot that broke a 2-2 tie and propelled LSU to a 10-3 triumph. It was Holt's second home run in as many games, as he hit a pinch hit shot in the ninth inning on Sunday at South Carolina. Holt's first home run was on April 7 at Auburn over the 30-foot "Green Monster".

Holt hasn't been able to show off his new found power, but it isn't his fault. The Tigers have faced left-handed starters in seven of their last nine games, giving Rocky Scelfo the nod at second and putting Holt on the bench. But Holt is 7-for-12 (.583) in his last three appearances to raise his season batting average to .321. Holt was 2-for-6 on Tuesday after a 4-for-5 effort in his last start on Apr. 13 against Georgia.

Pontiff back in double figures

All hitters go through their valleys in the course of a long season; the good ones find ways to make the valleys short.

LSU third baseman Wally Pontiff certainly has recovered from a short slump, and he's back hitting the ball with abandon as he did earlier in the year.

Pontiff enters the weekend with an 11-game hitting streak, as he is batting .452 (19-for-42) with 10 runs scored and 7 RBI during the streak. During the current streak, Pontiff has seven multi-hit games, including a 3-for-4 outing on Apr. 7 at Auburn.

Pontiff earlier had a 19-game hitting streak (Feb. 22-Mar. 26), and has hit safely in 30 of his last 32 games, missing only on Mar. 29 against Mississippi St. and Apr. 5 at Auburn.

For the year, Pontiff still leads the Tigers with a .386 batting average, and is also the leader in doubles (16), home runs (5), walks (36) and on-base percentage (.492). Pontiff is hitting .439 (25-for-57) with 16 RBI with two out, and is batting .444 (8-for-18) with runners in scoring position in SEC play.

Pontiff currently stands sixth on the LSU career batting average list at .356, and his first inning double on Tuesday moved him into sole possession of eighth place on the career doubles list at 45. If Pontiff can get five hits this weekend, he will tie Trey McClure for 10th place on the career hit list at 234.

Tigers tie season high for hits

Sean Barker wasn't the only Tiger with his hitting shoes on Tuesday night, as six other Tigers contributed to a season high 16 hits by collecting two hits apiece.

The 16 hits tied the mark set first on Feb. 23 at Houston and again on Apr. 13 against Georgia. The last time LSU had more than 16 hits in a game was 18 in a 20-5 win last year over Auburn.

The Tigers' top four hitters of J.C. Holt, Aaron Hill, Wally Pontiff and Barker combined to go 10-for-22 with five runs scored and nine RBI. Meanwhile, David Raymer and Chris Phillips combined to go 4-for-7 at the bottom of the order.

LSU has now collected 10 or more hits in 13 of its last 16 games, and Tuesday's outing got the Tigers back to the .300 mark in team batting average.



Harris hurls a gem

Back-to-back home runs can rattle any pitcher's confidence, especially that of a 19-year old true freshman.

Instead of folding on Tuesday, Clay Harris simply went out and took care of business, as the Slidell native spotted UL-Monroe a 2-1 lead, then proceeded to handcuff the Indians over the next five innings to improve to 3-0.

Andy Chance got ULM's third hit of the second inning two batters after the home runs, but Harris then would face the minimum number of Indians through the fifth innings, and finished the night with a career high 7.0 innings pitched, allowing three runs and no walks. Harris has not allowed a walk in his last 15.0 innings pitched, dating back to Apr. 6 at Auburn.

Harris' ERA has fallen from 6.15 to 4.93 in his last two starts, as he has walked just four batters in 38.1 innings on the year.

Bullpen rested and ready

LSU's bullpen hasn't been seeing a lot of time as of late, and that's thanks to a string of solid starting performances.

Tiger relievers have logged just 6.1 innings in the last four games, as Tiger starters have worked into the sixth inning in each of those games. In fact, no Tiger reliever has come in before the start of the sixth inning since Apr. 7 at Auburn, when Brian Wilson relieved Jason Vargas in the second inning and went on to pick up the win.

And for the most part, Tiger relievers are doing the job when they are called upon. It was Jason Vargas' turn on Tuesday night, and he relieved Clay Harris with two shutout innings of relief to end the 10-3 Tiger victory.

LSU starting pitchers have a solid 3.60 ERA this season, and have now logged a total of 22 quality starts (6.0 IP, <4 ER) in 42 outings.

Error free=victory

LSU played error free baseball at UL-Monroe on Tuesday, just the eighth time in 42 games that the Tigers have gone a game without committing an error. The Tigers are now a perfect 8-0 when they do not commit an error, as Tuesday's contests was the first errorless game since Apr. 7 at Auburn. LSU has played back-to-back errorless games just once this year, and that was on Mar. 8 and 9 against ULM at home.

Double vision II

After two games with fewer than 10 hits, LSU collected a season high 16 hits on Tuesday against UL-Monroe. But that isn't the only double vision LSU has been experiencing as of late.

After struggling to get extra base hits most of the season, the Tigers are now starting to hit their stride, as LSU has collected 50 doubles in the last 17 games, an average of nearly three per contest, compared to just 36 doubles in the first 25 games this year. The Tigers have collected at least one double in each of the last 17 games, and in all but two of those games, they have picked up at least two two-baggers.

LSU tied another season high on Tuesday with five doubles against the Indians, with two coming from Aaron Hill, who was joined by Wally Pontiff, Sean Barker and David Raymer in the double your pleasure category. The Tigers also collected five doubles in a Mar. 30 win over Mississippi St. During this current double binge, Hill has 11 of his 13 doubles on the year, while Pontiff has 10 of his 16 on the season.

LSU has collected a total of 77 extra base hits (including three triples and 24 home runs) to raise its season slugging percentage to .458.

Rising RISP

For much of the year, LSU has struggled driving in runners in scoring position, but it seems that problem is correcting itself quite nicely.

LSU was 9-for-21 on Tuesday with RBI opportunities, giving the Tigers a solid .336 mark (43-for-128) with RISP. The nine hits and 21 at-bats in RBI situations tie a team high both set on Feb. 24 at Houston.

The Tigers have been doing well all year in the SEC with RISP, batting .315, including a .359 mark (23-for-64) in the last two weekends against Georgia and South Carolina. For the entire season, LSU's average with RISP has risen to .291, still 36 points lower than 2001's mark of .327, but 25 points higher than it was on Mar. 24 after the Ole Miss series.

Aaron Hill (.395) and Sean Barker (.385) have been the steadiest Tigers in RBI situations this year, but Jason Columbus (.417) and J.C. Holt (.345) have been among the surprisingly strong players with RISP.

In an interesting side note, LSU is hitting higher with runners on base than with the bases empty (.304 to .296).

LSU coach Smoke Laval

Ray "Smoke" Laval may be following a legend at LSU in Skip Bertman, but Laval is no stranger to the LSU program, having served 10 years (1984-93) under Bertman as his top assistant and as a graduate assistant to Jack Lamabe (1979) before that.

Laval, who was named Bertman's successor on July 18, 2000, came back to Baton Rouge after seven successful seasons at Louisiana-Monroe. Laval guided the Indians to a 241-159 record from 1994-2000 and led ULM to three NCAA regional appearances, including the regional final in 2000 against LSU. He was named the Southland Conference Coach of the year in 1999 and led the Indians to the SLC crown in 1999 and 2000.

During Laval's tenure as Bertman's top assistant, LSU won 483 games, reached the College World Series five times, and won the national championship in 1991 and 1993. Laval worked with 24 future major league players during that time and recruited nine first-team All-Americans.

On deck for next week

The Tigers should adopt Willie Nelson's anthem "On the Road Again", as the Tigers will pound the pavement for the next seven games following this weekend's series against Arkansas.

First up is a visit to Zephyr Field in Metairie for the final non-conference game of 2002 against New Orleans. The Tigers have dominated the Privateers in recent years, as an 8-1 victory on April 2 extended LSU's winning streak over UNO to nine games. The Tigers are also 4-0 against UNO at Zephyr Field, including a 12-1 victory last year that was called after seven innings by the 10-run rule. LSU is 18-7 against non-conference competition, including a 7-4 mark against in-state foes.

LSU returns to SEC play over the weekend, but it's against a very unfamiliar foe in Tennessee. The Tigers and Volunteers have not met on the diamond since 1999 thanks to the SEC's schedule of rotating one team from the opposite division off the schedule every two years; this year, Tennessee replaced Kentucky after a two-year hiatus. The Volunteers took two of three in Knoxville when the teams last met, but LSU won 14 in a row from 1996 through the first game of the 1999 series and holds a 31-9 all-time series edge.
