Bounce back weekend: LSU travels to Ole Miss for the second weekend of Southeastern Conference play.

- LSU is on its first three-game losing streak of 2002 after a 7-0 loss Tuesday at Louisiana-Lafayette.
- The Tigers are looking to get back in the SEC West race after losing two of three last weekend to Vanderbilt at home.
- This weekend marks the first of three consecutive series against SEC West foes, as LSU will host Mississippi St. next weekend before traveling to Auburn in April.

Scouting the Rebels: Ole Miss was a preseason favorite in the SEC West along with LSU, but the Rebels come in as one of only two 0-3 teams in the league.

- The Rebels were swept at Florida last weekend, but bounced back to defeat Southern Miss 7-2 on Tuesday.
- Ole Miss is under the leadership of second-year coach Mike Bianco, a former LSU player and assistant coach under Skip Bertman.
 - Bianco also coached three years at McNeese St. before leaving Lake Charles for Oxford.
- Right-hander Pete Montrenes, who will start Saturday's game, also faced the Tigers in the 2000 College World Series while pitching for USC.
- For the second straight weekend, LSU will face a 2001 first-round draft pick. Sunday's starter, right-hander Alan Horne, was the 27th overall pick by the Cleveland Indians. Last weekend, the Tigers faced the 19th overall pick of the Cincinnati Reds, Vanderbilt southpaw Jeremy Sowers.
- The Rebels have not won the SEC title since 1977 under former coach and star catcher Jake Gibbs.
- LSU coach Smoke Laval was 3-2 against the Rebels as coach at UL-Monroe.

About the Series: LSU has a 147-124 lead in the series that dates back to 1906.

- The Tigers won four of five last year, taking two of three at Baton Rouge and two more meetings at the SEC Tournament in Birmingham.
- LSU has taken two of three in the last three regular season series, in 1999 and 2001 in Baton Rouge and in 2000 at Oxford.
- The Rebels' last series win came in the final regular season series of 1998 at Oxford, denying LSU the overall SEC championship.
- Skip Bertman had a sterling 49-14 career record in his 18-year tenure at LSU against the Rebels, and never lost a home series to Ole Miss.
 - The Rebels' last series win in Baton Rouge came in the final weekend of 1982.
 - Ole Miss' only series wins over Bertman-coached teams came in 1987, 1995 and 1998 at Oxford.

Tonight's Starting Pitcher

#34 Jr. RHP Bo Pettit (6-0, 200, Houston–Sharpstown HS)

Bo Pettit takes the mound in Oxford tonight after the greatest performance of his baseball life, pitching a four-hit shutout of Vanderbilt last Friday. Pettit goes for his first back-to-back wins since 2000 tonight against Ole Miss junior right-hander J.R. Pickens (3-1, 2.68).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

2002: Has a 2-2 record with a team-best 3.21 ERA, striking out 50 in 42.0 innings.

- Has struck out 10 or more three times this year.
- Fired complete game, four-hit shutout vs. Vanderbilt (Mar. 15), tying a career high with 12 strikeouts.
 - Became the first LSU pitcher since Brian Tallet (Kentucky in 2000) to throw a nine-inning shutout.
- Tied a career high with 12 strikeouts in the Tigers' Feb. 15 victory over Mercer.
- Struck out 10 in 6.1 innings and got no decision vs. UL-Monroe (Mar. 8).
- Went a career high 7.2 innings in Mercer game, not yielding an earned run and carrying a shutout into the eighth inning.
- Started season opener vs. Birmingham-Southern on Feb. 8 and struck out eight in 6.0 innings.

2001: Posted 4-0 mark with a 2.42 ERA, but only appeared in 7 games (4 starts) due to continuing shoulder ailments.

- Struck out five in two innings in his first appearance of 2001 vs. Nicholls St. on Feb. 27
- Earned his first win of the season against Southern on Mar. 13, going five innings and allowing two runs on two hits.
- Best outing of season came Mar. 23 at Mississippi St., as he allowed no earned runs in 6.1 innings to pick up the victory.
- Did not return to action again until May 1 at New Orleans, when he went three innings and allowed just one hit and no earned runs while striking out five.

2000: Went 5-3 with a 4.15 ERA in 16 games (7 starts), but season ended early due to tendonitis in his shoulder.

- Best effort came in Apr. 30 win at Ole Miss in first career SEC start. In that game, Pettit allowed one run on five hits and struck out a career-high 12 in seven innings.
- Earned his first career win in second game of doubleheader vs. Virginia on Feb. 12, starting and throwing six scoreless innings, striking out six and allowing just two hits.
- Threw two scoreless innings and allowed just one hit in relief stint vs. McNeese St. on Feb. 22.
- Hurlled four scoreless and hitless innings in start vs. New Orleans on Mar. 22, picking up victory with six strikeouts.
- Final outing of season came on May 6 at Kentucky, where he earned win with six strikeouts over 6.2 innings.

1999: Was granted a medical redshirt after pitching in only three early-season games.

- Made his first career appearance on Feb. 27 against Central Florida, going 1.1 innings and giving up two runs on four hits, walking one and striking out one.

Can the Tigers bounce back again?

For the third straight year, the Tigers enter the second weekend of SEC play at 1-2 after dropping two of three to Vanderbilt.

If history is an indicator, LSU might be in for a good weekend in Oxford. In 2000, the Tigers went on the road and won two games at Vanderbilt before the third game was canceled by rain, and in 2001, the Tigers swept Florida at home.

In both 2000 and 2001, Ron Polk's Georgia Bulldogs won two of three from LSU to start conference play.

The last time LSU was under .500 after two SEC weekends was in Skip Bertman's first year of 1984, as LSU took two of three from Auburn on the first weekend, then went to Tuscaloosa and got swept by Alabama. LSU was 3-3 after two weekends in 1999 after taking two from Florida, then dropping two at Arkansas.

LSU hasn't lost two consecutive series to open conference play since 1978, when the Tigers dropped two of three to Mississippi St. and Alabama.

Tigers looking to break skid

LSU needs a win tonight in Oxford, or the Tigers will do something they didn't do in all of 2001, and that's lose four straight ballgames.

In fact, only once since 1995 has LSU lost more than three games in a row, and that was in 2000, when the Tigers dropped five straight (one each to Arizona St. and McNeese St. and three to Houston). In that time, the Tigers have had eight three-game losing streaks.

In Skip Bertman's 18-year tenure at LSU, the Tigers' longest losing streak was five, done in 1985 in addition to the aforementioned skein in 2000. To find a losing streak you need two hands to count, you'll have to go back to 1981 when the Tigers dropped eight straight.

As has been the case, the current streak has been a product of poor defense and lack of timely hitting. In the last three games, LSU is hitting just .219, while committing seven errors that have led to nine unearned runs.



Firing blanks

It had been a decade since a team from outside the SEC hung a complete line of zeros next to LSU's name on the scoreboard, but UL-Lafayette pulled off the feat Tuesday night.

The last time it had happened was on May 23, 1992, when Cal St. Fullerton blitzed the Tigers, 11-0, to eliminate LSU from its own South I Regional at Alex Box Stadium. It was one of three shutouts suffered by the Tigers at home that May, as the Ragin Cajuns (then known as USL) blanked the Tigers 5-0, then Ohio State won by the same score in the South I a little more than 30 hours before Fullerton ended LSU's season.

The last time LSU was shut out at home was on Apr. 28, 1995, when Alabama took a 4-0 decision.

Between 1993 and 2001, LSU had been shut out only four times, and all by SEC opponents, most recently suffering a 13-0 setback at Mississippi St. last year. In addition to the aforementioned loss to Alabama, LSU lost 2-0 at South Carolina in 1996 and 9-0 at Ole Miss in 1998

Pontiff's new streak

Wally Pontiff waited until the ninth inning again to do it, but he extended his hitting streak Tuesday in Lafayette to a new career high of 15 games. His previous high of 14 was set in the final 14 games of 2001.

The Tigers' captain has struggled a bit at the plate along with the rest of the team lately, although 4-for-14 isn't that bad. His average remains at an even .500 (28-for-56) for the streak, leaving his season mark at .407 and his career mark at .356.

Pontiff is only one of three Tigers over .500 in slugging percentage, posting a team-best .593 mark, and has by far the best on-base percentage at .519.

Lineup Watch

It's now 23 games, 23 different lineups for the Tigers in 2002. Tuesday's game at UL-Lafayette marked Jason Vargas' first start on the mound, and also saw Rocky Scelfo bat leadoff for the first time since March 2. The only constant in the lineup is Sean Barker has started every game in right field.

The only sign of consistency is the fact that Wally Pontiff has hit third in the last eight games.

Best in the West

LSU begins SEC West play tonight at Ole Miss, and the Tigers have navigated the waters quite well in what may be college baseball's toughest division in its toughest conference.

The Tigers enter the weekend as the only team in the West post a winning record within the division in each of the last six years. LSU went 8-7 against the West last year in posting an 18-12 overall mark.

LSU's only losing mark in the West since the league returned to division play was a 9-11 mark in 1995, which included a 3-2 mark in the SEC West Division tournament, which counted in the overall standings.

Wilson can't get a break

Yes, LSU reliever Brian Wilson has struggled quite a bit recently, giving up six runs on eight hits in his last two outings. But all of it is not his fault.

Of those six runs, five have been unearned, as LSU errors have contributed to his troubles. Wilson has yielded 14 runs in 14.1 innings this year, but only four have been earned. In his two losses this year, Wilson has not yielded an earned run, as four errors led to seven unearned runs in setbacks to Houston and Vanderbilt.

LSU has now yielded 38 unearned runs this year, and the Tigers are now back on pace to set the school record for unearned runs allowed in a season, which is 91 back in 1994.

The Tigers' error count is up to 46, giving LSU exactly two errors per game this year. The record for errors in a season is 125 in 71 games in 1993, but no Tiger team has averaged two errors per game for an entire season.

Heath gets early shower

Matt Heath wasn't around for the end of Tuesday's loss in Lafayette, as he was ejected in the seventh inning for arguing a called third strike.

Heath has actually been one of the steadier Tiger hitters this year, batting .394 (13-for-33) in the last 10 games to raise his season mark to .325, third best on the team behind Wally Pontiff (.407) and Sean Barker (.359).



Tigers not loaded

It hasn't been noticed much in the Tigers' turbulent season, but LSU has gone nearly one month without a hit with the bases loaded.

In fact, LSU has had only seven at-bats with the bases loaded in the month of March, and the Tigers have failed to get a single hit. The Tigers' last bases-loaded hit came in the sixth inning of the Feb. 24 game at Houston. On the year, LSU is 9-for-26 with the sacks full.

LSU has gone five of the last six games without a bases loaded at-bat. The Tigers had two opportunities last Sunday at Vanderbilt, but J.C. Holt flew out to end the eighth, and Jason Vargas grounded into a game-ending double play.

Ironically, Vargas is only one of two players who has more than one hit with the bases loaded, as he is 2-for-6, including his Feb. 16 grand slam against Mercer. Wally Pontiff is 2-for-3 with the bases loaded, while Clay Harris has the other Tiger grand slam on Feb. 17, also vs. Mercer.

No Walking

The Tigers yielded three walks to UL-Lafayette on Tuesday, marking the first time LSU had given up more than two bases on balls in one game since the first game of the Mar. 2 doubleheader with Long Beach St.

During that 10-game stretch, LSU hurlers had given up only 13 walks, including a couple of games with no walks. The biggest reason for this, of course, is the streak that sophomore left-hander Lane Mestephey has, as he hasn't walked a batter in 32 consecutive innings, dating back to the third inning of the Feb. 23 game at Houston.

Only one LSU pitcher has given up more than eight walks this season, and that's Bo Petit, whose 14 in 50 innings still gives him a solid ratio of three walks per nine innings. As a team, the Tigers have issued just 53 walks in 210.2 innings pitched, an average of just 2.26 per nine innings. The low mark for a complete season since Skip Bertman took over in 1984 was 2.89 per nine in 1992 (185 in 574.2 IP).

For the second time this week, the Tigers are facing an ex-McNeese St. coach. On Tuesday, LSU lost at UL-Lafayette, coached by Tony Robichaux, who was in Lake Charles from 1988-94. Ole Miss coach Mike Bianco was the Cowboys' skipper from 1998-2000, going 2-2 against LSU there.

Clutch hitting still struggling

The Tigers continue to be stumped on how to get runners in scoring position home, as LSU's batting average with RISP has sunk to .267, a full 60 points lower than last year's final average of .327.

In the last five games, LSU is just 8 for 35 (.229) with RBI opportunities, including a 1-for-6 effort Tuesday night at UL-Lafayette. However, that one hit did not produce a run as David Raymer's single to center was too short to score Matt Heath from second. Heath was the only LSU runner to get past second the entire game.

LSU may not be hitting with RISP, but then again, the Tigers aren't getting as many opportunities. In the three-game series at Houston last month, the Tigers had 40 percent of their at-bats (48 of 119) with RISP, but in the last five games, only 22 percent of the Tigers' at-bats (35 of 159) have been in those situations. LSU was 6 of 23 (.261) with RISP in the series with Vanderbilt last weekend.

Heath's reversal of fortune

Matt Heath's .325 average may be a bit of surprise to LSU fans this year, but the way he's done it may be a bigger shock.

The Tigers' only switch hitter is batting a cool .432 (19-for-44) with 13 RBI from the left side of the plate, but is struggling with just a .182 mark (6-for-33) from the right side, driving in just one run as a right-handed hitter.

These numbers are a mirror inversion from 2001 for Heath, a natural right-handed hitter who did not switch hit at Florida under Andy Lopez. Heath hit .333 last year from the right side of the plate, compared to just .269 from the left.

Heath isn't the exception on the team, as only three players with at least 15 at-bats against both right- and left-handed pitching has a better average against southpaws. Two are right-handed hitters—Sean Barker (.431 to .309) and Aaron Hill (.280 to .227), but the third is left-handed hitting Wally Pontiff, who is over .400 against both left-handers (.419) and right-handers (.400), although Pontiff has 19 more at-bats against right-handed pitching.

LSU coach Smoke Laval
 Ray "Smoke" Laval may be following a legend at LSU in Skip Bertman, but Laval is no stranger to the LSU program, having served 10 years (1984-93) under Bertman as his top assistant and as a graduate assistant to Jack Lamabe (1979) before that.

Laval, who was named Bertman's successor on July 18, 2000, came back to Baton Rouge after seven successful seasons at Louisiana-Monroe. Laval guided the Indians to a 241-159 record from 1994-2000 and led ULM to three NCAA regional appearances, including the regional final in 2000 against LSU. He was named the Southland Conference Coach of the year in 1999 and led the Indians to the SLC crown in 1999 and 2000.

During Laval's tenure as Bertman's top assistant, LSU won 483 games, reached the College World Series five times, and won the national championship in 1991 and 1993. Laval worked with 24 future major league players during that time and recruited nine first-team All-Americans.

On deck

The Tigers have another four-game week planned to close out March, starting Tuesday with a road game against Southeastern Louisiana in Hammond. The Lions broke an 11-year, 16-game losing streak to the Tigers on Mardi Gras night with a 4-3 victory. SLU, whose last victory over LSU prior to this year came in 1991, hasn't defeated the Tigers in Hammond since 1988, the first year the series went to a "2 and 1" format, meaning LSU goes to Hammond only in even-numbered years. The Lions will be going for their first season sweep since 1969.

Ron Polk returns with his Mississippi St. Bulldogs next weekend for an SEC West series. Polk last was in Alex Box Stadium in 2000, leading Georgia to a 2-1 series victory to become the first SEC East team to win a series at Alex Box Stadium, with Vanderbilt becoming the second last weekend. The Bulldogs won two of three the last time they visited Baton Rouge in 2000, but the Tigers have won two of three on their last two visits to Starkville, including last year. However, MSU won the finale in Starkville last year 13-0, and won the SEC Tournament championship game, 4-1. Ironically, these two teams met on Easter Weekend in 2000, as State scored 40 runs in three games—the most against LSU in a three-game home series ever.
