The LSU and Auburn women's golf teams battled almost stroke-for-stroke over the final 18 holes of the LSU/Cleveland Golf Classic and when the final round was done, both teams had posted one-under par team totals and the teams still had to look over their shoulders at another onrushing SEC team.

Auburn and LSU both shot one-under 287, allowing Auburn to retain their two-stroke advantage for the win. Auburn posted a nine-over 873, ahead of LSU's 11-over 875 (298-290-287). It was the fourth sub-par round by an LSU women's golf team.

Vanderbilt posted an amazing nine-under par course record round of 279 in the perfect conditions to finish at 878, 14-over par (307-292-279).

Melissa Eaton set the tournament course record for the Lady Tigers with a six-under 66 in the second round and finished in second place with a five-under score of 211 (73-66-72). Rebecca Kuhn and Caroline Martens tied for eighth at two-over 218. Vandy's Jacqui Concolino won the individual crown by one shot with a six-under 210 (75-68-67).

Melissa Eaton moved up 25 spots through the field from 30th to a tie for fifth place after a four-under 68 in the final round of the SEC Championships, equaling her fifth-place finish a year ago in the championships in Tunica, Miss. The 68 was a tremendous rebound after suffering a triple bogey eight on the final hole in the second round. Eaton had rounds of 76-76-68 for a total of 220, four-over par.

LSU turned at even par in the final round, but shot a 10-over 298 for the final day, still improving its score each day of the event. LSU finished at even par 900 (36 over) with rounds of 302-300-298. It was the third best 54-hole total of the season for the Lady Tigers as LSU finished seventh. Auburn won the title for the second straight year.

LSU played almost the perfect tournament at the exact right time to advance back to the NCAA Division I Women's Championships for the first time since 2001.

The growth of the team from September showed as a team of a junior, three sophomores and a freshman posted back-to-back even par rounds of 288 and a 294 for a 54-hole total of six-over 870, finishing a strong second behind the even par score of Tennessee. It was the second lowest 54-hole total in school history (since 1979) and the lowest total away from LSU's home course, the University Club. It also was LSU's best finish in an NCAA regional and 23 shots better than LSU ever shot in a regional tournament.

Freshman Caroline Martens led the Lady Tigers with a score of two-under 214 (73-68-73), finishing in fifth place.

But the Lady Tigers all return for the 2006-07 season and look forward to another chance to show what they can do in a repeat performance if they can get back again.

LSU posted opening rounds of 298 and 307 and stood ninth after the first two rounds of the tournament, but a 319 moved LSU back in the field. In that round, Alexis Rather had to be taken off the course after 13 holes due to illness and dehydration.

Duke successfully defended its title, coasting home in a rain-delayed final round at 15-over par 1,167.

Throughout its 73-year history, the Southeastern Conference has been a leader in the integration of athletic competition and higher education.

Since its formation in 1933, the SEC has achieved both stature and stability by designating governing/voting power to the presidents of the member institutions. They have determined the policies of the conference and through the years this involvement has been the principal source of

strength in the evolution of the SEC.

Intercollegiate athletics has encountered many challenges in the 1990s and again the SEC provided guidance. In 1993, the member institutions adopted The Principles of Gender Equity. Committed to increasing the quantity and quality of women's athletic opportunities, each school provides at least two more women's intercollegiate programs than the number of men's.

SEC schools began athletic competition with one another over 100 years ago as members of the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Association. The 13 members west and south of the Appalachian Mountains reorganized as the Southeastern Conference at the annual Southern Conference meeting in 1932. Charter members of the new conference were Alabama, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, Georgia Tech, Kentucky, LSU, Ole Miss, Mississippi State, Sewanee, Tennessee, Tulane and Vanderbilt.

The first SEC champions were crowned in 1933 in four sports. The league's inaugural championship event was a basketball tournament in Atlanta, Feb. 24-28, 1933. In the 1979-80 academic year, SEC championships for women were recognized in basketball, tennis and volleyball. The following year golf, gymnastics, swimming and track and field were added. The administration of women's athletics officially came under the auspices of the conference office in 1984.

The SEC currently regulates nine men's sports and 11 women's sports. The women's sports are basketball, golf, gymnastics, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis, track (cross country, indoor, outdoor) and volleyball.

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THIS IS LSU



The pinnacle of women's college golf is the NCAA Division I Women's Championships and in 2006, LSU's Lady Tigers returned to that pinnacle by advancing from the NCAA East Regionals.

It marked the first time since 2001 that LSU advanced to the championships.

LSU made its first NCAA Championships appearance in the first NCAA championships in 1982 in Palo Alto, Calif., when LSU finished 16th.

The Lady Tigers would return in 1986 when LSU, led by Player of the Year Jenny Lidback helped the Tigers to a ninth-place finish in the national event. Lidback finished tied for 17th.

The Tigers made its longest championship run starting in 1986, when the Three Amigas (Ashley Winn, Laura Moore and Michelle Louviere) took the Lady Tigers to top 10-finishes in 1996 (8th) and 1998 (5th). Louviere finished tied for 19th in 1986 and Ashley Winn tied for 15th.

The Tigers posted 10th-place finishes in 1999 and 2000 and a 12th place finish in 2001 on teams led by Katy Harris and Meredith Duncan. Duncan played the last 54 holes in two under par after opening with a 10-over 82 to finish in a tie for seventh place in 2000 and Harris shot a one-under 287 to finish in a tie for third in LSU's last appearance in 2001.

Harris and Kristi Coats, who competed as an individual competitor in 1991, have the best finishes in the championships for LSU, both finishing third in the individual competition. The only other top-10 finish for an individual golfer came in 2005 when Brooke Shelton posted a tie for eighth-place finish.

Harris and Duncan are the two players who have been to the championships all four years of their career. Harris made it on four teams from 1998 to 2001, while Duncan qualified on three teams and once individually from 1999-2002.

Since 1993 to get to the NCAA Division I Championships, teams and individuals had to go through the NCAA Regional Tournaments. LSU hosted one of the regional events in the inaugural year of regional tournaments in 1993 and in May 2007 will host the regional for the third time (1993, 2002, 2007). This will mark the second time the University Club has hosted the regional event.

A total of 63 teams and nine individuals will be selected and divided up into the three regional qualifying events. The top-eight teams and two individuals who are not part of the

top-eight teams will advance to the national championships scheduled for Daytona Beach, Fla., later in the month of May 2007.

There are 20 teams that will qualify as automatic invitees through conference championships tournament, including the Southeastern Conference Championships. LSU, if it qualifies either automatically or at-large, knows that it will play on its home course for the regional and the fields will be adjusted accordingly by the NCAA Women's Golf Committee.

LSU has advanced to the regional round of NCAA post-season play since that first tournament in 1993 every year but 1994 and 2003.

Individuals making qualifying contributions will receive 1 TAF priority point per every \$1,000 contributed to the Chip-In-Club.

The History of LSU's Fairwood Invitational/Cleveland Golf Classic

This year's LSU/Cleveland Golf Classic will mark the 26th consecutive spring that the LSU women's golf team has hosted a tournament that has grown to be one of the most prestigious events of the spring women's golf schedule. The Classic, since its move to the LSU Univeristy Club in 2000, has become one of the few women's collegiate tournaments with corporate backing from one of the country's top club manufacturers.

But the tournament roots go back to Fairwood Country Club and its unique membership that not only hosted and ran the tournament, but served as uncles and aunts for many of the teams that came back year-after-year. Club members hosted teams at their houses in the neighborhood every year, allowing teams to save money in the days when women's college golf wasn't funded as it is today. Dinners were provided by the club along with member entertainment and some of the nation's top golf teams and players came

to participate. Jenny Lidback, who would go on to win a major championship on the LPGA tour, lost the tournament title in a playoff while at TCU and in 1986 would win the title as an LSU Lady Tiger. Arizona's Marisa Baena had her coming out party as a freshman dominating the competition. In the final LSU-Fairwood event in 1999, Duke put on the course a lineup that would become one of the most dominating in the nation, a trend that continues to this day as Dan Brooks will bring his Duke team back for the 2007 renewal.

LSU's annual golf tournament has not only proven to be an important event on the women's collegiate circuit, but it has proven to be a community event as seen by the hundreds of volunteers who take part each year. It's to those volunteers that the LSU golf program salutes for their tireless efforts that make the LSU event the success it is.
