LSU teams are accustomed to BCS Bowl bids, regional NCAA and SEC championships and visits to national championships. Gymnastics is no exception to this tradition as it has achieved all of these accomplishments many times in D-D Breaux's tenure as Head Coach of the Tigers. What made 2008 special is that the Tigers made it to the Super Six after losing a spot in the elite final by hundredths of a point multiple times.

After taking the Tigers so close in the previous years, LSU gymnastics head coach D-D Breaux broke through into the six-team field for the first time in program history to compete for college gymnastics' national championship in 2008. The Tigers finished fifth, beating out rival Alabama, for the best finish since the current NCAA format was implemented in 1993.

As the "Dean of Coaches" at LSU, Breaux has represented the University at the highest level both in the gym and, most importantly, in the classroom for more than 30 years. Her dedication to the student-athlete on an individual basis has transcended into academic success, community involvement, Coach of the Year honors, SEC Championships, NCAA Regional Championships and top-10 national rankings throughout her tenure.

Now entering season No. 32 as the mastermind of the LSU gymnastics program, the fire in Breaux's eyes burns as brightly today as it did on her first day on the job.

Maintaining Excellence

What is so impressive about Breaux's success at LSU is the level of consistency she has maintained in the face of all of the adversity she has faced over the years.

During her tenure Breaux has established and maintained LSU's reputation as one of the premier collegiate gymnastics programs in the country. Under her tutelage, the Tigers have placed among the nation's top-10 teams 20

times in 31 seasons, finishing a program-best fourth in 1988 and sixth on three separate occasions.

LSU has also placed among the top three in regional competition on 23 separate occasions, winning regional titles eight times in three different decades, including last year. Her teams have included four national champions, 85 All-America honorees and 40 All-SEC selections. Additionally, Breaux's Tigers won the inaugural SEC Championship title in 1981 and have gone on to finish second four times and third five other times.

For her dedication to the sport and her teams' numerous accomplishments, Breaux has been recognized by her peers time and time again. She has been named the SEC Coach of the Year on six occasions (1990, 1993, 1994, 1995, 2000 and 2005), NCAA Central Regional Coach of the Year four times (1999, 2002, 2005 and 2006) and was a finalist for National Coach of the Year honors in 1988 when she guided the Tigers to a fourth-place finish at the NCAA Championships.

To this day, the accolades continue to roll in for Breaux and LSU as the program has seemed to reach its zenith in recent years.

Last season, in addition to the team's berth into the Super Six, both Ashleigh Clare-Kearney and Susan Jackson racked up numerous individual accolades. Jackson was the NCAA Champion on vault -- the fourth individual champion from LSU and first on vault. She also was a first-team All-American in the all-around and on vault, beam and floor. Clare-Kearney -- also a first-team All-American on bars and floor -- was named the SEC Gymnast of the Year and also won the SEC All-Around title, the first Tiger gymnast to do so since 1991. LSU earned a total of seven All-America honors and produced two All-SEC selections in 2008.

In all it has been a very productive decade for LSU gymnastics, as the Tigers have finished in the top 10 every year but one since 2000 with seven NCAA appearances. The Tigers also reached all the way to a No. 1 ranking in 2005 and boasted a school-record first-team All-Americans in 2007 -- the same year in which the legendary Breaux picked up career victory No. 500. Three of LSU's four individual national championships have come in since 2000, with Nicki Arnstad on floor in 2002, April Burkholder on beam in 2006 and Susan Jackson on vault in 2008.



An All-Around Coach

Aside from athletic honors, Breaux excels in recruiting quality student-athletes. A Louisianian through and through, Breaux concentrates her recruiting efforts in her native state, but her reach extends to the national and international levels as well where she has been responsible for recruiting some of Canada's top athletes of all time.

Outside of the gym, Breaux has taken an active role in the academic success her program has achieved in her 30-plus seasons at LSU. By making academic success her team's No. 1 priority, Breaux's teams have reached the highest scholastic goals she has established over the years. Throughout the country, she is acknowledged as having one of the finest academic teams year in and year out. LSU gymnasts have been named Academic All-Americans 91 times and members of the SEC Academic Honor Roll on 122 occasions since 1991. During the 2003 season, a school-record 13 of Breaux's student-athletes were named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll, an honor reserved for sophomores, juniors and seniors. In 1999, the Tigers posted the third-highest GPA in the nation and the highest of any team in the NCAA Championship field. Breaux's team won the Tiger Award for 2008 given to the team with the most community service hours, the highest GPA and national placement in postseason competition.

Also active members of the community, Breaux and her team continually participate in volunteer activities throughout the Baton Rouge area. The last four years Breaux's teams have been awarded the LSU CHAMPS Community Service Award after logging hundreds of hours of community service work. Breaux, who has served as the Chairman of the YWCA's Pink Ribbon Campaign for Breast Cancer, and her team have also volunteered their time to benefit the Muscular Dystrophy Association, St. Jude's Hospital and the Alzheimer's Association, among others. The Tigers coach also has taken on a new role this year as the chair for LSU's United Way campaign. Just recently, she received the McMain's Community Service Award from the McMain's Children's Development Center, a great honor for the coach.

Last year, the Tigers joined forces with Foundation56 – established by former LSU standout linebacker and current Dallas Cowboys defensive star, Bradie James. James' mother, Etta, succumbed to breast cancer in February 2002. Their Etta James Memorial Meet against Alabama successfully raised \$30,000 to promote breast cancer awareness in the Baton Rouge area.

It is this delicate balance between exceptional academics, athletic excellence and exemplary community service efforts, that has allowed Breaux to keep her team at the top of the national scene year in and year out.

Behind Breaux

The foundation for Breaux's coaching career developed long before her arrival at LSU. An excellent athlete in her own right Breaux's affiliation with the sport began at the club level where she was a nationally ranked gymnast by both the A.A.U. and the U.S.G.F. She was also a Junior Olympic National Champion that earned the S.A.A.U.'s Outstanding Gymnast award. By virtue of her accomplishments Breaux qualified as one of the top-15 athletes in the country to compete at the World Games Trials and was set to compete at the 1972 Olympic Trials before a career-ending knee injury forced her to retire. Breaux, a native of Donaldsonville, La., attended Southeastern Louisiana University where she competed for the Lady Lions gymnastics team for two seasons (1972-73) and helped SLU to a second-place finish at the 1972 AIAW Championships.

Breaux then served as an assistant coach for the Lady Lions for three seasons, where she also became a national level judge and served as the first state director for the Louisiana USA gymnastics program. She later transferred to LSU in 1976 where she earned both her bachelor's and master's degrees.

Breaux is one of eight children and comes from a great family tradition. Her parents, brothers, sisters and their spouses and children have supported the program since the coach's arrival at LSU. D-D has two daughters. Sara, her youngest child, played Soccer at LSU and will graduate in May of 2009. Jewel, also a graduate of LSU and a proud volunteer Coach for the Gymnastic's team, married Beau Fourrier and they are the proud parents of Porter Thomas, D-D's ("Doo-Dah's") two year old grandson.

For nearly a decade, Bob Moore has consistently coached the Tigers to be one of the top vaulting lineups in the nation. And in 2008, he led sophomore Susan Jackson to claim the first NCAA individual vaulting title for LSU.

"It's always nice to have a talented athlete, and Susan Jackson is just that," D-D Breaux said. "But Bob did an excellent job of coaching her and preparing her, and he had her ready to go at a very critical time."

A longtime Southeastern Conference assistant, Moore begins his 10th season with the LSU gymnastics program. Moore's presence has been undeniable. He has helped the Tigers maintain their status as one of the nation's premier programs.

Moore's primary responsibility with the Tigers is the vault where the team has flourished under his watch. In the last nine years, Moore has tutored his athletes to eight All-America honors, including Jackson's first-team honors, and now a national championship after Jackson's a year ago. Additionally, the Tigers' final RQS on vault for 2008 was second in the nation behind only Utah and Ashleigh Clare-Kearney finished the regular season as the country's second-ranked vaulter.

As well as strengthening the Tigers on the vault, Moore plays a significant role with LSU's Bengal Gymnastics program, a highly successful youth age group program that practices in the Lady Tigers' gymnastics training facility.

Recognized for his exceptional work, Moore has twice been named the NCAA Central Region Assistant Coach of the Year, first picking up the honors in 2005 and then again in 2007.

"Bob provides us with experience at the highest level, not only within the SEC, but the NCAA," said Breaux. "He knows exactly how tough this conference is and what it takes to take a program like ours to the next level."

Moore's expertise was fine tuned at two other SEC programs. Before joining the Tigers, Moore spent six years at the University of Florida where

he served as the program's top assistant. To his credit, Moore coached two national champions on the vault, in addition to numerous All-Americans and SEC champions. And prior to his stint in Gainesville, Moore coached for five seasons as an assistant at Auburn.

A native of Birmingham, Ala., Moore graduated from Samford University in 1976 with a degree in general studies with an emphasis in music. Bob is married to Sandra Ballard and they are the proud grandparents to Isabella. "Pops" and Sandra are expecting two more grandchildren in May of 2009.

Philip Ogletree begins his ninth season as an assistant coach with the LSU gymnastics program. He has played a major role in the success the Tigers have achieved during his tenure at LSU.

Working primarily with the Tigers on uneven bars, Ogletree has guided LSU to 11 of the top 13 bar scores in school history, including a school-record 49.650 in 2002. Individually, Ogletree's athletes have flourished under his watch, earning 10 All-America honors on the bars, including a school record three athletes - April Burkholder, Annie Gagnon and Lisa Rennie - in 2005. He produced two more in 2008, as Ashleigh Clare-Kearney and Summer Hubbard were both first-teamers, with Clare-Kearney finishing fourth in the NCAA Individual Event Finals. In addition, Ogletree helped Sharene Mamby to a rare 10.0 on the bars during the 2001 season. The performance marked just the second perfect score on the event in school history.

For his efforts, Ogletree has been recognized by his peers on several occasions, as he was named the NCAA Central Region Assistant Coach of the Year in 2004 and then shared that same honor a year later with fellow assistant Bob Moore.

"Philip does a tremendous job for us," said Breaux. "He is an asset to our staff, both as a coach and an administrator. Our team and staff blend well with Philip in the mix."

Ogletree came to LSU after spending the previous season at the Georgia Gymnastics Academy. He arrived at LSU with 18 years of coaching experience, including 11 with Level 10 gymnasts in Georgia.

While his stop at LSU was his first collegiate stop, he was no stranger to LSU athletics. During his time at the Atlanta School of Gymnastics, he tutored future LSU greats Abbey Burns and Kim and Kerry Descalopoulos, all natives of Georgia.

During his time in the state of Georgia, he coached six Level 10 national champions on the floor exercise and helped place five athletes on

the Level 10 Junior Olympic national team. Ogletree has also coached at the American Classic and U.S. Classic national meets.

In his time as an athlete, Ogletree was a gymnast at the University of Georgia from 1980-82. He later graduated from Georgia State with a Bachelor of Science degree in education in 1992.

Ogletree is married to Jill Hickok and they have two children. Bridget is now 15 and Jake is 13. The family is active in their church and community.

REACHING NEW HEIGHTS
2008 SUPER SIX FINALISTS

BREAKTHROUGH

The 2008 Tigers gymnastics team began the season with many expectations, among them, making the Super Six – something several previous squads had so narrowly missed. They wanted to be the team to finally break through.

LSU's NCAA Prelims session also consisted of Alabama, Arkansas, Florida Oklahoma and Oregon State. The Tigers opened on floor with a solid 49.250 led by a pair of 9.90s from Susan Jackson and Ashleigh Clare-Kearney. On to vaulting. A 49.050. After a bye, LSU was on to bars, nailing routine after routine. A 9.925 by Summer Hubbard and a 9.950 by Clare-Kearney paced the Tigers to a season-high 49.450 on the event – all but sealing a coveted spot in the Super Six.

But the Tigers had one more event, the infamous balance beam. The event that tends to make or break teams in pressure meets. And despite one fall, the remaining five scores were enough for a 48.825 and to secure LSU's spot in the Super Six with a third-place 196.575.

LSU then wrapped up its season with a fifth-place finish in Super Six, beating out three-time NCAA Champion Alabama. Clare-Kearney competed a stellar meet, with a trio of 9.90s on bars, beam and floor and a 9.925 on vault. Overall it was a solid meet by the Tigers, scoring above a 49.00 on three of four events and coming close on beam. But the 196.350 was not enough to challenge host Georgia, which won its fourth straight title.

JACKSON WINS NCAA VAULT TITLE

Susan Jackson followed up her stellar performance in the team competition at NCAAs by claiming an individual title of her own on vault in the individual event finals. Her two scores of 9.900 and 9.8125 averaged a 9.8563, beating out the field for first place. It was the fourth individual title for LSU and the first ever on vault.

THREE TIGERS EARN ALL-AMERICA HONORS

Ashleigh Clare-Kearney, Summer Hubbard and Susan Jackson all scored well enough in the NCAA Prelims to earn first-team All-America honors. Clare-Kearney's came on bars and floor while Hubbard's also was on bars. Jackson earned a team-best four first-team honors, claiming them in the all-around and on vault, beam and floor.

TIGERS HAVE FOUR ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

Five Tigers matched their athletic performance in the classroom and earned Academic All-America status. Ashleigh Clare-Kearney, Kristi Esposito, Sabrina Franceschelli, Lauren Klein and Kayla Rogers all earned that distinction. It was the fifth straight year for Esposito.

LSU CAPTURES NCAA REGIONAL TITLE

The No. 7 LSU gymnastics squad captured its ninth Regional team championship title at the 2008 NCAA Central Regional Championships in Baton Rouge, La. on Saturday, April 12. The team posted a season-high score of 197.625, good enough for the fifth highest score in school history. Stanford finished second with a 197.525, followed by Ohio State (195.125), Missouri (195.100), Kentucky (194.950) and Kent State (193.700). The team posted season-high scores on the vault (49.625) and on the beam (49.325), as well as meet highs on the bars (49.275) and on the floor (49.400).

TIGERS PLACE FOURTH AT SEC CHAMPIONSHIPS

The No. 5 gymnastics squad placed fourth in the 2008 SEC Championships in Duluth, Ga. on March 29 in one of the closest SEC Championship meets in recent history. The Tigers opened the afternoon on the bars with a 48.975. Ashleigh Clare-Kearney led the way with a 9.875. LSU scored a 48.900 on the beam in the second rotation, paced by Kristi Esposito's 9.825 and Clare-Kearney's 9.875. On floor the Tigers notched a 49.275 as Clare-Kearney's 9.950 tied for a share of the event title. The Tigers continued their strong season on the vault, notching a 49.350. Paige Cipolloni, who hadn't competed since early March because of an ankle injury, scored a 9.775 to open things up, and Jackson and Clare-Kearney closed out the rotation with a 9.950 and a 9.925, respectively. Jackson tied with four others for the event title. Clare-Kearney won the all-around title with a 39.600.

CLARE-KEARNEY WINS ALL-AROUND AT SEC'S, NAMED SEC CO-GYMNAST OF THE YEAR

After winning the all-around event title at the SEC Championships, Ashleigh Clare-Kearney was given another award to add to her trophy case. The junior from Manchester, Conn., was named the SEC Co-Gymnast of the Year, sharing the award with Auburn's Lindsey Puckett. The award, which is voted on by the SEC coaches, was given to her after the SEC Championships on Saturday, March 29. It marks only the third time in school history that a gymnast has been given the honor. April Burkholder won the SEC Gymnast of the Year award in 2004 and 2005. Clare-



Kearney won the all-around title, posting a 39.600. She is only the second LSU gymnast to win the SEC all-around title (Rachelle Fruge', 1991).

CLARE-KEARNEY HITS TRIO OF 10.0S

Ashleigh Clare-Kearney joined an elite list in 2008 by scoring three Perfect 10s – two on vault and one on floor. Now with four career 10.0s, only two LSU gymnasts have achieved perfection more – Jennifer Wood (9) and April Burkholder (8). And by scoring two 10.0s in the same meet against Michigan State, she became just the second LSU gymnast to accomplish that feat, as Burkholder posted perfect marks on vault and beam at Oklahoma in 2005.

FINAL RQS RANKS TIGERS IN TOP 10 IN THREE EVENTS

The Tigers' Regional Qualifying Scores were good enough to place them in the top 10 on three of four events in the final rankings. LSU was second on vault with a 49.415, fifth on floor with a 49.325 and seventh on bars with a 49.255. The Tigers were 13th on beam with a 49.065 to rank in the top 15 on all events. Their overall RQS of 196.730 was good enough for seventh place heading into the NCAA postseason.

T ALL-AROUND SCORE IN SCHOOL HISTORY

On Feb. 29, LSU scored a 197.775 against Michigan State for the second-highest score in school history. Thanks in part to Ashleigh Clare-Kearney's two perfect scores on the vault and floor, the Tigers posted season highs on each event. The team scored a 49.525 on the vault, which tied for the third-highest score in school history. On the floor, the Tigers posted a 49.550, tying for the fourth best score in school history. Their 49.425 on the bars was the season-high until it was eclipsed Sunday against Centenary when the team totaled a 49.475. On the beam against Michigan State, the Tigers scored a 49.275.

JACKSON POSTS BACK-TO-BACK-TO BACK 9.975 SCORES ON FLOOR

Susan Jackson just missed a Perfect 10 on floor in three straight meets this year. She scored identical 9.975s against Michigan State (2/29), Centenary (3/2) and Washington (3/7).

FIRST ANNUAL ETTA JAMES MEMORIAL MEET A HUGE SUCCESS

LSU's meet against Alabama on Friday, Feb. 22 marked the first annual Etta James Memorial Meet. LSU gymnastics, with the help of the Baton Rouge community, raised \$30,950 at the meet that will be donated to Foundation56, a breast cancer awareness foundation created by former LSU linebacker and current Dallas Cowboy Bradie James. The meet was named after his mother who succumbed to breast cancer in February 2002. A record crowd of 7,717 donated money for prizes, including pink ribbons, Foundation56 pink bracelets, Foundation56 t-shirts and purple and pink LSU boas.

LSU GYMNASTICS ATTENDANCE RECORD CRUSHED

For the first time in 11 years, LSU gymnastics has set a new attendance record. Thanks in part to the "Pink Meet" on Feb. 22, 7,717 fans attended the meet at the Pete Maravich Assembly Center against Alabama in which the Tigers fell, 196.300-196.125, to the Tide. The previous attendance record was set on Feb. 24, 1995, when 5,076 fans watched the Tigers fall to Georgia, 197.095-196.175.

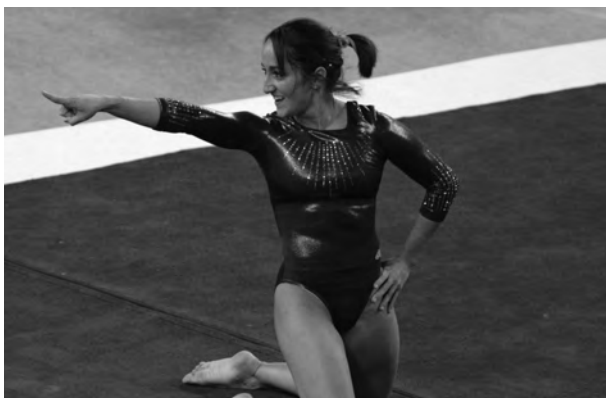

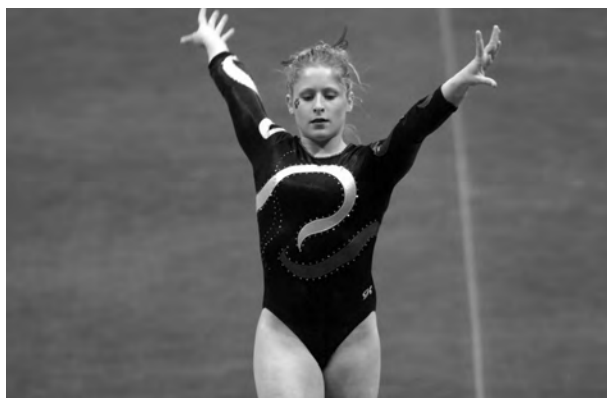

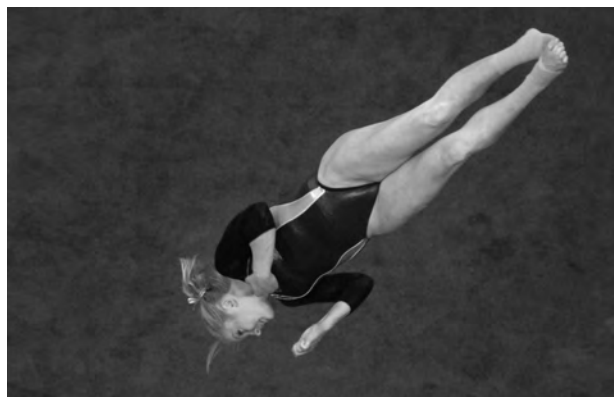
