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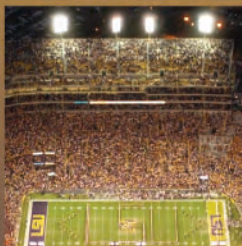

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New in 2006!



This summer the lower bowl seats on the west side of Tiger Stadium were replaced. The seats add additional width and capabilities to fold up, allowing easier access in the walk way of each row. Along with last season's east side refurbishment both projects have affected around 25,000 seats.

New Tiger Stadium Seat Numbers

LSU is introducing a new numbering system for Tiger Stadium. You are encouraged to make yourself familiar with the numbering system on **Page 3**, and the entire seating chart on **page 23** of this Fan Guide. The numbering system is designed to give fans a better idea of where their seats are located by simply referring to their section number, rather than having to refer to a seating chart. Some areas of the stadium (east sideline and west upper deck) began using this numbering system last season when those areas were renovated.

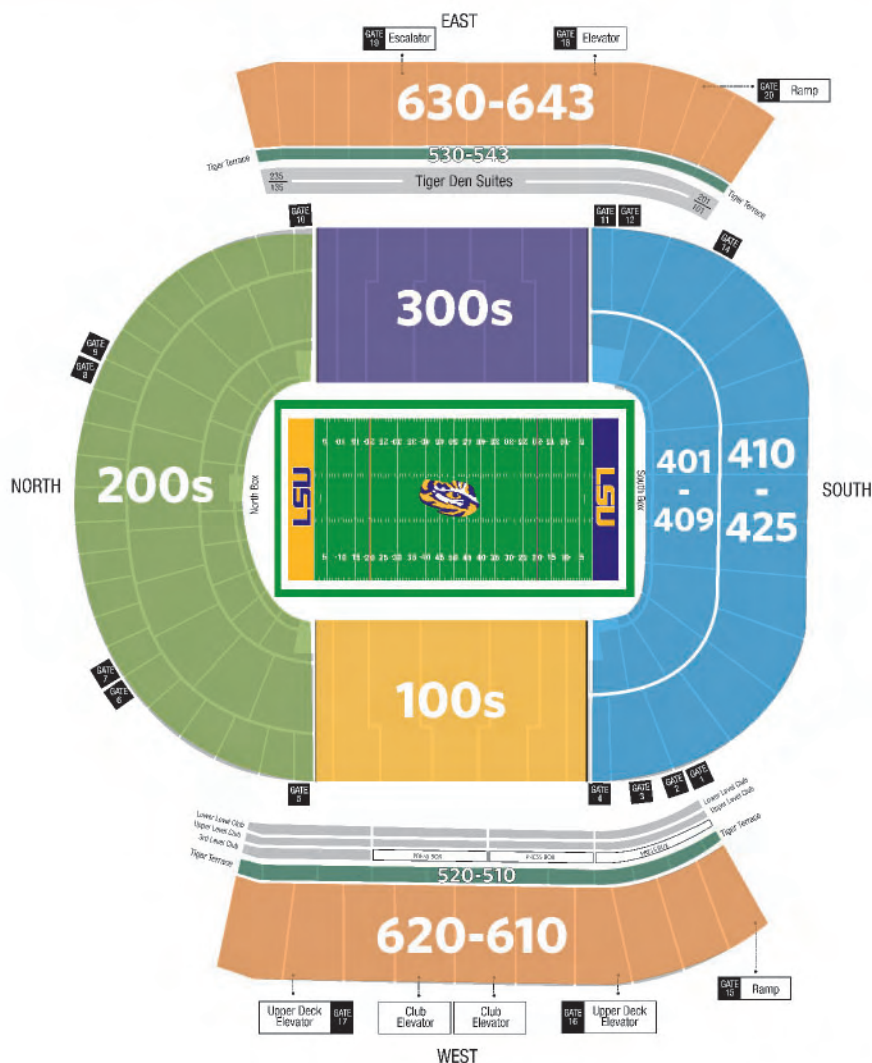

2006 Post-Season Tickets

NEW LSU PRIORITY POINT SYSTEM

There have been some important adjustments made to the procedure by which LSU will distribute tickets to post-season football games. Beginning with the 2006 football post-season games, LSU is introducing a unified point system to determine distribution of tickets and allocation of seat locations to season ticket holders for road events and new season ticket purchases, giving point credit for the first time to Tradition Fund contributors and other donors to the University. This LSU Priority Point System will be used to determine distribution of post-season tickets. **See page 27 for complete details.**

The 2006 SEC Championship Game in Atlanta, Ga. is December 2.

The LSU Athletics Ticket Office is located on the first floor of the LSU Athletic Administration Building. The Athletic Administration Building is on the corner of Nicholson Drive and North Stadium Drive, in the west parking lot of Tiger Stadium.

The LSU Athletic Ticket Office is open from 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. CT, Monday-Friday, except on university-observed holidays. On game days the ticket office opens at noon for games that kickoff at 6 p.m. or later, and 8 a.m. for games that kickoff before 6 p.m.

Season Tickets

Tradition Fund Tickets

Approximately 45,000 football season tickets require a donation to LSU's Tradition Fund for the right to purchase those tickets. Invoices for the Tradition Fund Contribution are mailed in January of each year. Tradition Fund Contributions are due in full by March 31 of each year, prior to the mailing of season ticket renewal forms.

Season Ticket Renewals

Season ticket renewals for football are mailed in April each year. The deadline for renewal is usually May 31. Season ticket holders are notified of exact dates each year. If you have not received a renewal form by the first week of May, please call the ticket office. Full payment is due in the ticket office by the deadline date on the renewal form.

New Season Tickets

LSU has introduced a waiting list for football season tickets. To register for the waiting list, log on to LSUsports.net, go to "Tickets" and then "Buy Tickets Online." A \$10 fee is required to register for the wait list. Cash, check, Visa, MasterCard or American Express are acceptable forms of payment for season tickets.

Individual Game Tickets

Home Game Tickets

Individual game football tickets go on sale each August. The cost of a home game football ticket is \$36 for bleacher seats (except for one SEC game each year that costs \$45) and \$50 for any available east side upper deck chair-backed seats. All phone and internet orders are subject to applicable service fees.

Away Game Tickets

Season ticket holders may apply for away game tickets in the spring of each year. Remaining away game tickets go on sale to the general public in August. The host school sets the price of away game tickets, and that cost varies. All phone and internet orders are subject to applicable service fees.

Preserve the Oaks

Join LSU in preserving its beautiful campus by parking only in designated areas. It is especially important to avoid parking on the roots of LSU's historic oak trees.

Carpool

Motorists are encouraged to carpool and to arrive early in order to easily find parking and walk to the stadium.

Saving Spaces

Saving parking spaces for other motorists is not permitted.

Traffic Direction from Police

Motorists should remember the policemen along the routes and at parking lots are there to direct motorists to the best routes for closest available parking.

Neutral Grounds

Parking of vehicles on the neutral ground (islands) on Nicholson Drive is prohibited due to the dangers presented for pedestrians and motorists.

North and South Stadium Drives

For safety reasons, North Stadium Drive and South Stadium Drive will be closed to all vehicular traffic on game days.

Bus Parking

Charter buses will park in Lot W on Skip Bertman Drive, just west of the Charles McClendon Practice Fields (see map inside back cover).

Limousines

Due to limited parking spaces, the use of limousines as transportation to the football games is discouraged. Limousines that do travel to LSU for the football games will be directed to park in Lot W on Skip Bertman Drive. A \$100.00 parking fee will be required to park in this lot.



Spaces for Vehicles Only

Reserved parking spaces are for vehicles only. The purchase and use of a parking pass for other reasons, such as port-o-lets, tents, chairs, etc., is not permitted.

Travel Lanes

For your safety and for the courtesy of other drivers, please don't tailgate in travel lanes.

How do I get a Parking Pass?

Reserved season parking passes are sold out. Fans can get on a waiting list for passes at www.LSUsports.net under "Ticketing".

Handicap Parking

Free Handicap Parking

Free individual handicap parking is conveniently located in Lot M between the Pete Maravich Assembly Center and the Dub Robinson Tennis Courts, north of Tiger Stadium. There are a limited number of spaces available. This area is available on a first come, first served basis beginning at 7 a.m. on game days. The lot is accessible by presenting a valid state issued handicap parking permit and/or valid handicap drivers' license to the traffic officers on site. The handicapped individual must be in the vehicle when entering the lot.

Paid Handicap Parking

Paid Handicap Parking is sold out. Persons interested in purchasing a paid reserved parking permit can register for a waiting list at www.LSUsports.net under "Ticketing". Reserved handicap parking permits cost \$300 for the entire season. To purchase a season handicap-parking permit, you must have a state issued handicap parking permit or letter from your doctor stating the reason you need to park near the stadium, and a valid ID. Contact the LSU Athletics Ticket Office at (225) 578-2184 for more information.

Tailgating

Tailgating has become a part of college football all across the South, but at LSU, Tiger fans have turned it into an art form. Over two-thirds of Tiger fans tailgate for five or more hours before every game, and many begin celebrating the great Tiger football experience more than 24 hours before kickoff.

LSU encourages its fans to come to campus early and enjoy the great tradition of tailgating. LSU also encourages its fans to tailgate in a responsible manner, respectful of the campus and respectful of other Tiger fans and fans from visiting schools.

Help us keep your campus clean by bagging your trash and using recycling containers. LSU's Facility Services Department distributes trash bags throughout campus on game days for your convenience. If you need more trash bags on game day, call (225) 578-3186.

For the safety and enjoyment of all fans, please keep the following guidelines in mind when tailgating at LSU football games:

Companies

Companies may not issue sample products without being properly licensed by the University. Food, drink, and other items may neither be sold nor given to the general public. This is a matter of legal liability for everyone involved.

Industrial Cookers

Cookers on trailers are not allowed in reserved lots, and no cooker may be larger than a 55-gallon drum for safety reasons.

Portable Generators

Portable generators are not allowed for safety and noise reasons, except for medical purposes.

Banners and Signage

Banners and signage recognizing businesses may not be displayed nor may promotional or political materials be distributed without prior approval by LSU. Only companies that have corporate sponsor agreements with LSU Sports Properties may display their signage. Companies interested in more information on this subject should contact LSU Sports Properties at (225) 578-7571.

Caterers

Caterers must have proper parking permits to be admitted to private tailgate areas.

Music

As a courtesy to other fans, music must be confined to your tailgate area. Bands are not permitted. All music must be turned off by midnight the night before games and by 2 a.m. after games.

Utility Trailers

Utility trailers are not allowed in reserved parking lots, but may be used in the Fairway Parking Lot, located at the corner of Nicholson Drive and Gourrier Lane (see map) and other non-reserved areas. Please be advised that construction on a new baseball stadium may begin in the Fairway Parking Lot during the 2006 football season.

Public Restrooms

LSU provides port-o-lets and restrooms in many buildings throughout campus for the convenience of fans. Individuals may not arrange to bring portable restrooms onto campus.

Tailgating Safety

Please protect your tailgate area and keep the campus safe. Secure your tailgating area prior to entering the stadium by doing the following: lock food, beverages and valuables out of sight in your vehicle; extinguish all fires or flames; unplug electrical outlets; secure barbecue pits, chairs, and ice chests; and store alcoholic beverages in locked containers. LSU will not be responsible for the security of items left at tailgating sites.

Tents

When erecting tents for tailgating on game day, please be aware of the following guidelines:

How big can my tent be?

Tents should be no larger than 10' by 10'. Limited space is available near the Alex Box parking lot for larger tents. Please call LSU Sports Properties at (225) 578-7530 to reserve a space.

When can I put up my tent?

Tents may be erected beginning at 7 a.m. on game day and space is available on a first-come, first-served basis.

Tents during the Game

Please remember to take down your tent before you enter the game.

Tents under Oak Trees

Tents may not be erected under the oak trees on South Stadium Drive or along Nicholson Drive.

Tents in Parking Lots

Fans using a tent or canopy over the tailgate of a vehicle should keep travel lanes open for vehicle traffic and should not take up space in other parking spaces.

Best Routes to and from Tiger Stadium



City Police and LSU Police have listed the best traffic routes for motorists driving to Tiger Stadium for LSU football games. To report traffic problems, call LSU Police at (225) 578-3231.

Approaching Campus From the North

If approaching the stadium from the north, use either River Road, Nicholson Drive, Highland Road or Dalrymple Drive. From these routes, parking will be available north of the stadium, on Nicholson Drive near the Carl Maddox Fieldhouse, at Kirby Smith dormitory lots off Aster and Roosevelt Streets, and at the Pleasant Hall lots on Dalrymple Drive.

From the East or South

If approaching the stadium from east or south, use either College Drive, Acadian/Stanford exit, Highland Road or Burbank Drive and Nicholson Drive. Parking for those using these routes is available on Nicholson Drive Extension south of the stadium, off Nicholson Drive by the baseball stadium, on Skip Bertman Drive near the Mississippi River and at lots in the vicinity of the John M. Parker Coliseum.

From South on Nicholson/Burbank

Fans coming from the south on Nicholson Drive or Burbank will be routed to Gourrier Lane, then River Road and onto Skip Bertman Drive. Approximately ninety minutes prior to kickoff, police will direct one-way traffic only toward Tiger Stadium on Highland Road from Lee Drive, on West Lakeshore Drive from Stanford, on Nicholson Drive Extension from Parker Boulevard and on Dalrymple Drive from the I-10 overpass.

Exiting Campus Going South

After the game, southbound traffic from the stadium will be directed onto Nicholson Drive, Burbank Drive or to River Road. Fans going south on Burbank Drive from the stadium after the game will be able to get to Highland Road or Nicholson Drive at Gardere Lane only. Fans going south on Nicholson Drive from the campus are advised by authorities that two-lane, one-way traffic will converge into one lane south of Jennifer Jean.

Going North

After the game, northbound traffic west of Tiger Stadium will be directed onto Nicholson Drive or to River Road. Northbound traffic east of Tiger Stadium will be directed onto Highland Road.

Announcements

Due to the many requests, public address announcements are restricted to emergency situations only and must be requested through LSU Police at (225) 578-3231 or during games at (225) 578-HELP.

Artificial Noise-makers

Southeastern Conference rules do not permit artificial noise-makers to be brought into or used in the stadium. Anyone found violating this policy is subject to ejection.

Beverage Policy (Alcohol)

The possession or consumption of alcohol in Tiger Stadium is expressly prohibited by University policy. Stadium personnel and law enforcement officials will enforce this policy. In an effort to encourage an enjoyable experience for all fans in Tiger Stadium, persons who are intoxicated or who are in possession of alcohol will be removed from the stadium.

Buses (Tiger Transit)

For the convenience of fans and in an effort to enhance traffic flow on campus, LSU provides free parking for buses that bring fans to Tiger Stadium. Buses may park free of charge on Skip Bertman Drive (see parking map). Fans in the Baton Rouge area may consult their local media or LSUsports.net for locations to catch shuttle buses to Tiger Stadium on game day. For pickup times and locations, you may also call Capital Area Transit System (CATS) at (225) 389-8920 or log onto www.BRCats.com.

First-Aid

For the safety of fans in Tiger Stadium, first-aid stations are staffed throughout the stadium. If you need assistance or are with someone who does, contact the nearest aid station, law enforcement officer or stadium marshal. Each station has a trained first-aid staff and doctors to provide assistance, and advanced emergency assistance is immediately available. Fans can also call (225) 578-HELP for in-stadium assistance.

Flammables

Some of the best food in America can be found among the tail-gate parties outside Tiger Stadium on a Saturday night. But please remember that charcoal must be disposed of properly to prevent fires. Please do not place charcoal or other flammables in trashcans, under trees or leave it in the parking areas.

Gameday Programs

Programs are available for sale in and around Tiger Stadium beginning about 4 hours before game time. Game programs provide information on LSU and its opponent, as well as interesting feature stories on the LSU Athletics program. If you are interested in advertising in LSU's Gameday programs in any sport, contact LSU Sports Properties at (225) 578-7571.

Golf Carts, Mopeds, Scooters, ATVs, Go Carts

For the safety of all concerned, the use of these motorized vehicles (other than those authorized by LSU) will not be allowed by fans on campus, including all motor home areas.

Internet

The radio broadcast of LSU football games can be heard around the world at LSUsports.net in the GeauxZone. Tiger fans can hear veteran play-by-play man Jim Hawthorne and former All-American Doug Moreau describe all the action on a subscription basis. Go to LSUsports.net for more information and pricing.

Lost and Found

Items found during the game and during Sunday clean-up will be turned over to LSU Police, located in the Public Safety Building on South Stadium Drive. Call (225) 578-3231 to ask if your item has been turned in.

Limousines

Limousines will park in Lot W on Skip Bertman Drive. The charge will be \$100 for the day of the game. Limousines may not park overnight prior to the game. After the game, those traveling in limousines must meet their limousine at the Special Olympics Pool lot. There are a limited number of spaces available for limousines, so please contact the LSU Athletics Ticket Office at (225) 578-2184 in advance to purchase a permit for the game.

Merchandise

The Tiger Gift Center next to Mike the Tiger's habitat is open daily and on game days. See the parking and traffic map in this Fan Guide for other Gift Center locations. Fans can also order merchandise at LSUtigergifts.com, the official online web store of LSU Athletics.

Musical Bands

Live musical bands are not allowed at tailgating sites. A live band performs each Saturday in front of the Pete Maravich Assembly Center at Tiger One Village. The band at Tiger One Village will begin playing approximately five hours before kick-off.

Recycling

LSU has placed numerous collection containers throughout the LSU campus for recycling of glass, plastic and aluminum items. Please help LSU's recycling program by utilizing these containers.

Security Cameras

For the safety of all fans and for the enforcement of security personnel, security cameras are utilized in Tiger Stadium. These cameras will be used by our security team as another tool to help make your stadium experience safe and enjoyable.

PROHIBITED ITEMS

FOR THE COMFORT, ENJOYMENT AND SAFETY OF ALL TIGER FANS, PLEASE FOLLOW THESE GUIDELINES FOR ITEMS BROUGHT INTO TIGER STADIUM:

- Backpacks, coolers and containers of any kind are prohibited.
- Bags larger than 8.5" x 11" are not permitted for security reasons.
- Food and alcoholic beverages may not be brought into Tiger Stadium.
- Glass bottles, cans, poles, banners and ice chests are prohibited.
- SEC regulations prohibit any type of artificial noise makers.
- As a courtesy to all spectators, the use of umbrellas is prohibited inside Tiger Stadium.
- Smoking is not allowed in any seating area of Tiger Stadium. Patrons may go to designated smoking areas to smoke. Anyone refusing to comply with this policy will be asked to leave the stadium.
- Banners may not be hung in Tiger Stadium.
- Oversized stadium seats are prohibited (no larger than 16 inches wide).

Sportsmanship

Tiger Stadium has been home to many great LSU victories. As we celebrate our student-athletes and coaches, let's remember to be courteous to our fellow Tiger fans and visitors. Please remember that the throwing of objects from the stands is strictly prohibited and is cause for immediate ejection. Also, fans may not go onto the playing field at anytime before, during or after games.

Stadium Re-Entry

SEC rules prohibit "pass out checks" from being issued. Anyone leaving the stadium must have a full ticket to return to the stadium. Once a ticket has been scanned or the stub removed, it may not be used again for re-entry, unless otherwise directed by LSU officials in emergency situations.



Stadium Security

With heightened security now a way of life, LSU will do everything possible to provide a secure environment for its fans. We encourage fans to arrive early and to bring as few personal items into the stadium as possible. For security reasons, visitors to Tiger Stadium may be subject to search. Please be cooperative with our security officials during your visit to Tiger Stadium. They are there for your safety.

Starting Times

All LSU home games are scheduled to begin at 7 p.m. Central time, however the starting times for all games are subject to change. Television rights as negotiated by the Southeastern Conference often dictate a change of starting time for a game. For further information, please visit the Official Web Site of LSU Athletics at LSUsports.net or check your local news media.

Ticket Office

The LSU Athletic Ticket Office is located on the first floor of the Athletic Administration Building on the corner of Nicholson Drive and North Stadium Drive, in the west parking lot of Tiger Stadium. The office is open weekdays from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The ticket office will open on the days of home football games at noon for games that kickoff at 6 p.m. or later, and at 8 a.m. for games that kickoff prior to 6 p.m.

Tickets

All persons, regardless of age, must present a ticket for admission to Tiger Stadium. For information on lost or stolen tickets, contact the LSU Athletic Ticket Office.

Trash

The University conveniently places receptacles for the disposal of trash and other items throughout the LSU campus. You can help keep your campus clean by disposing of your trash.

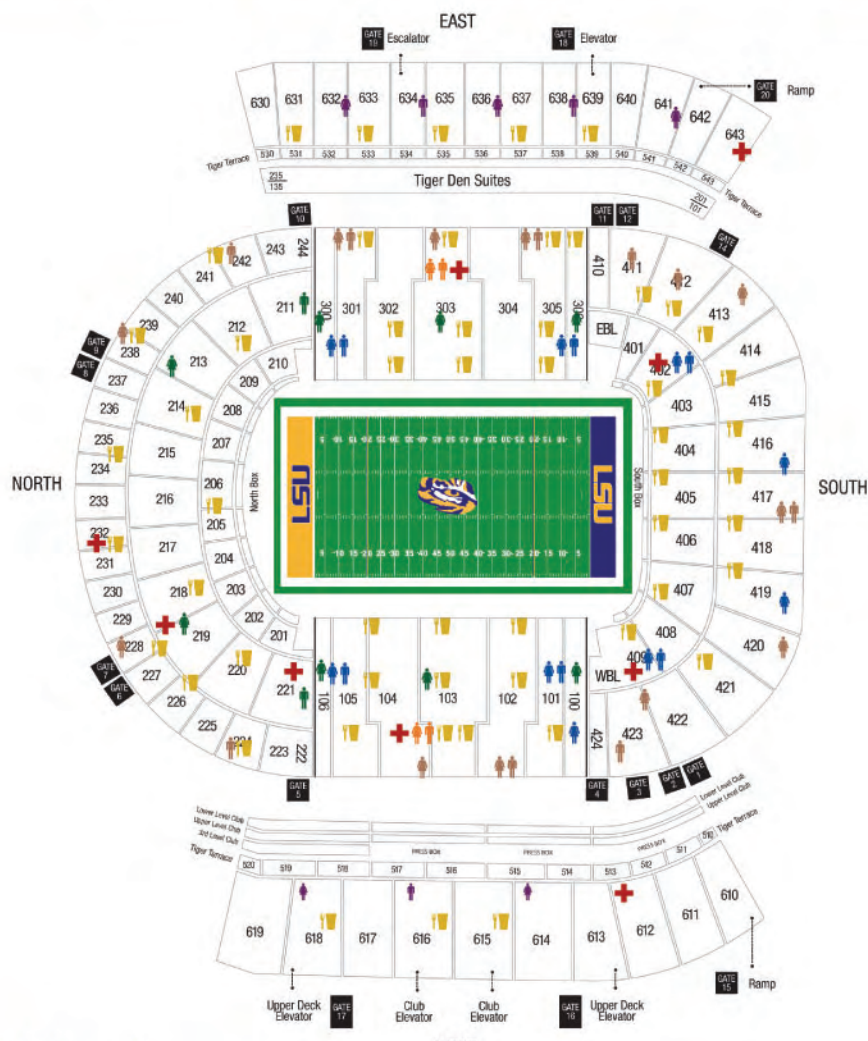
Video Cameras

Will-Call for Tickets

The will-call window for tickets is located in the LSU Ticket Office in the LSU Athletic Administration Building. Only the person whose name is on the ticket order may pick up the tickets. A photo ID is required for all will-call orders.
