The rebuilding of the LSU program is nearing completion under John Brady. Now the task is to sustain the success and plan for the future of the program under the coach in his eighth season at the helm of the Tigers.

Unfortunate circumstances cost the Tigers a chance to shine in the post-season last year. After starting 17-4, the Tiger squad found itself having to play three, four and at times five freshmen on the floor against SEC squads much more experienced. But through it all, some hard lessons were learned and the freshmen are now experienced sophomores ready to blend with a couple of veteran seniors who have seen just about everything in their three years. Throw in another highly talented and anticipated recruiting class and some changes made in the coaching staff and Brady is ready to take the next step in sustaining the winning cycle that is building at LSU.

It's all be part of Brady's plan of rebuilding the LSU program since he came to Baton Rouge. He didn't come here with a plan that just looked good on paper. It was a practical and sensible plan that gave the LSU program the direction to go and the chance to shine again.

When Brady arrived on campus

in March 1997 and was given the job of rebuilding the program, he knew he would have the chance to mold the program from the ground up and build a foundation based on responsibility and accountability. There were dreams of building a program where the players would take responsibility for their actions and make people proud of what they were trying to accomplish, both on and off the floor.

Brady's plan isn't just taking place on a hard wood floor in the Maravich Center. He has worked hard to show the public that the athletic and academic pursuits of the LSU players should be challenged to the fullest. All the while, he was also making sure the players understood that the methods and rules of the program would make them not only better, but better students able to adapt to the outside world once school was completed.

That's part of the reason that LSU basketball is not only a success on the court, but in the classroom as well. Last spring, every scholarship players passed every course hour taken and the team GPA was just over 3.0, the highest in years. Three student-athletes made the Dean's List, six had 3.0 averages or above and the five members of the freshman class averaged 35 hours

and completed their first year with an average GPA of 2.87.

In his first seven seasons, besides the 20 players who have qualified for the SEC Academic Honor Roll and the 11 graduates, Brady has coached the SEC Player of the Year (Stromile Swift-2000), two SEC Freshmen of the Year (Torrin Bright - 2000; Brandon Bass - 2004), plus 10 selections on the All-SEC teams.

All that has been a part of the foundation of LSU basketball under John Brady. The 50-year-old Brady enters his eighth season having taken the Tigers a long way both on and off the court.

What has been the result? The Tigers program is solid both athletically and academically. The top athletes in the country are seriously putting LSU at the top of their lists and Brady is earning the respect of his peers in the league. The plan to bring back the success of the LSU program has now shifted to the future of keeping the program at the top of the SEC for years to come.

Prior to becoming the head coach at LSU, Brady served six years as the head coach at Samford. He also served as assistant coach at Mississippi State and UNO prior to taking the head position at the Birmingham school.

For the second straight game, the Tigers were able to stay with an opponent for a half before the inability to stop the Tide's run and muster any offense of its own proved too much to overcome. LSU was down one, 35-34, at the half and LSU had a 40-39 lead with 18:21 to play on a Hudson field goal that would be LSU's last until the 7:35 mark which by then Alabama had a 60-45 lead ... The Tigers shot 42.6 percent from the field (20-47), while Alabama posted a 44.6 field goal percentage (25-56). LSU shot 50 percent from the three-point arc, 8-of-16, compared to 3-of-16 for Alabama ... The Tigers were out rebounded, 31-29, and had 18 turnovers compared to nine for Alabama.

Starting Out in the SEC

The Tigers will be trying Wednesday night to avoid the first 0-2 start in the SEC since the 2001 season when they face South Carolina ... In that year, the Tigers lost two players to ACLs, including one in the first half of the conference opener, and played the last 15 games with just five scholarship players.

Finally Coming Home

It's been since Dec. 13 when the Tigers played McNeese State that LSU last hosted a game at the Pete Maravich Center ... It means that when the horn blows for Dan Borne' to introduce the starting lineups, it will have been 30 days since the last time the Tigers played a game in the building ... It is the longest time between home games for an LSU team since the 1968-69 team was away from home for 35 days between games ... That year, LSU played Georgia at the old John Parker Ag Center on Dec. 21, 1968 and did not play another home game until meeting Kentucky on Jan. 25, 1969.

About South Carolina

The Gamecocks are coming into Baton Rouge with a 9-4 record and a 1-1 mark in the Southeastern Conference after an impressive win, 74-54, Saturday at the Colonial Center in Columbia over Georgia ... In the win, Carolina had a 34-6 first-half run on the way to a 20-point halftime lead ... Carlos Powell led the Gamecocks with 19 points, hitting 8-of-12 field goals with Tre Kelley adding 11 and Josh Gonner 10 ... The Gamecocks lost their first conference game at Lexington, 79-75, to Kentucky on Jan. 5 ... Dave Odom is the head coach of the Gamecocks and the 2004 SEC Coach of the Year after taking his team to the NCAA Tournament a year ago, finishing 23-11 ... Odom is 66-46 in his four seasons at Carolina with other tenures at Wake Forest and East Carolina, giving him a head coaching record of 344-220 ... The probable Carolina starters:

The Pete Maravich Center -- Under New Management

On July 1, 2004, the management of the Maravich Center came under the direction of the LSU Athletics Department as the building's control was transferred from the University. The building, now hosting its 34th season of men's basketball, is undergoing a multi-year refurbishing to continue it as one of the great basketball venues in the South.

It's a renovation that began two years ago with new television lights that can be turned on and off to allow more freedom with player introductions and special ceremonies.

It continued last season with a brand new roof surface that will serve for many years in the future. Also, the outside concourse windows of the building now feature the Tiger mascot running around the building that can be seen for miles as people enter the city on the Mississippi River Bridge.

This year, basketball fans will see a completely redesigned concourse with video and graphic displays, renovated concession stands and video kiosks showcasing the best of the sports that

play in the building - men's and women's basketball, volleyball and gymnastics.

The concourse is designed into four quadrants -- Pete Maravich Pass, The Walk of Champions, Heroes Hall and Midway of Memories.

There is still more to come. At the close of the basketball season, the seats in the arena will be replaced, the acoustical paneling around the top of the arena will be replaced and handicap accessible seating is added at new locations. Also planned are upgraded restroom facilities and updates to the heating and air conditioning systems.

The Tigers, who played their 500th game in the building last season, are 377-133 (.739) in the building, 5-1 this year, and LSU has won at least 12 games five of the last six seasons ... In SEC games, the Tigers are 180-106 (62.9 percent) in the building ... LSU was 5-3 last year in league games, 6-2 in 2003 and 4-4 in 2002.

Non-Conference Streak Busted, But Has Started Again

The West Virginia loss (11-27) was only the 27th in 224 non-conference games in the 30-plus year history of the building and it was the first loss in a regular season non-conference home game since Dec. 1, 1987 against Lamar, a span of 56 games ... The Tigers are 60-4 in the John Brady era in home non-conference games ... That streak includes two wins over Arizona, including a win when the Wildcats were No. 1 and last year's win over Utah ... Since the West Virginia game, LSU won non-conference games against Northwestern State and McNeese State.

More Number Crunching

The loss to Houston (12-21) was only the eighth loss in 48 games in the month of December in the John Brady era ... The losses to Southern Miss (12-18) and Houston (12-21) marked the first time LSU had lost consecutive non-conference games in the Brady era ... The Tigers in the last three games has made 29 three-pointers compared to 25 free throws and the 29 three-pointers is only two less than the number of free throws (31) LSU has attempted as the Tigers have struggled to get to the charity stripe.

Home Wins

The Tigers are 5-1 this season at home and has 33 wins in the last two-plus seasons dating back to the start of the 2002-03 season. That led the SEC until last week when Vanderbilt won its 34th home game during the period, giving LSU (tied with Florida after the Gators win Saturday), the second most home victories of any team in the Southeastern Conference over that same period (2002-03 to Jan. 10):

Road Games

The Tigers are 0-3 on the road this season, having lost on opponent's courts at Houston (81-72, Dec. 21), Jan. 3 at Utah (69-55) and Jan. 8 at Alabama (73-58) ... John Brady is 18-34 over the last five years on the road ... LSU has now lost four straight SEC road games dating back to last year ... Last year, the SEC road teams won just 32 of 96 contests.

LSU Fails to Win When Scoring 80

The number 80 had been a good one for the Tigers in John Brady's eight seasons as the Tigers coach as they entered the Dec. 18 game with Southern Miss, 48-0, in the Brady era when scoring at least 80 points, including 5-0 this season ... But when Southern Miss prevailed in an 88-

84 win, it marked the first time in the Brady era the Tigers were not the winners when scoring 80 points or more.

LSU Scoring Early, Giving Up Points

LSU made a decision early this season to play a more up-tempo offense. But in return, this season, opponents were also scoring more points and players consistently having big games scoring against the Tigers.

In the six games prior to the Florida State game on Dec. 30, the opponents were shooting over 40 percent from three-point range, 40-of-95 (42.1 percent) ... In that period, two players scored over 30 points and five others this season posted at least 22 points ... Last season in 29 games, no player scored over 30 and only three scored as much as 24 points on LSU.

But Things Changed Against Florida State

Against Florida State (Dec. 30), the LSU up-tempo offense took on a new look -- call it the "patient" up-tempo offense as LSU looked to go hard in transition, but the Tigers weren't afraid to pull it up and work the ball around in the offense, finding several holes in the Florida State Seminoles in a 67-50 win for the Tigers.

The decision to play a more patient style was part of a decision by the LSU coaching staff to develop a renewed emphasis on rebounding and defending by the Tigers, something that has long been a staple of the John Brady era at LSU.

The Tigers held Florida State in both halves under 30 points and held an opponent to 60 points or less for the 77th time in the Brady era and LSU has a 66-11 record in those games ... LSU also out rebounded the Seminoles, 42-30, holding FSU to 10 less offensive rebounds than Houston had against the Tigers the week before.

Against Utah And Alabama

In both games, the Tigers were able to stay with the opposition through the first 20 minutes, trailing by just one point ... But in both games, the opponents dominated the Tigers in the second half ... Against Utah (1-3), Andrew Bogut became the eighth opponent player to score at least 22 points against LSU this year and helped the Utes dominate the Tigers on the boards ... Alabama had the big scoring run after LSU took a one-point lead that saw LSU fall down by 15 by the time LSU scored another field goal.

The Points Against Turnovers

Alabama (1-8) had another good night converting the LSU turnovers into points as the Tide got 19 points off LSU's 18 turnovers. It just added to some of the previous totals from earlier this season as Florida State (12-30) got 20 points off turnovers, Houston (12-21) 20, Southern Miss (12-18) 13, McNeese (12-23) getting 20 (many of them in their late comeback that fell just short), Northwestern State (12-11) 19 and West Virginia (11-27) 24.

The Stats -- Breaking Down The Wins and Losses

There is a definite difference in what has been happening to LSU in regard to the games won and the games lost -- here how it breaks down with a caveat that in the McNeese win, the stats are skewed for the opponents in that particular game after LSU had to hang on with a 21-point lead to win.

Wins -- FG%-48.1%; 3FG%-40%; FT-73.6%; Assists to turnovers: 111-87; Rebounds 38.2 rpg; Points -- 82.2 ppg; Scoring Margin -- +14.0; Rebound Margin -- +5.7.

Losses -- FG%-43.5%; 3FG%-36.2%; FT-71.9%; Assists to turnovers: 70-71; Rebounds: 31.6; Points -- 67.6 ppg; Scoring Margin -- --11.4; Rebound Margin -- -- 3.4.

It should be noted that in LSU's wins, opponents shot 42.1 percent from the field, compared to 48.8 percent in the LSU losses.

Overtime

The game against Southern Miss (12-18) was the first LSU game to go to overtime since Feb. 13 2002, when LSU rallied to force overtime against Mississippi State and won, 68-65 ... With the

game in Biloxi, LSU is now 1-7 in overtime games on the neutral court ... LSU's overall overtime record is 25-41 ... This was the seventh time in the John Brady era that the Tigers have played overtime, including a three-overtime game at Alabama in 1999 ... LSU is 3-4 in the Brady era in overtime.

With the overtime, two players, Brandon Bass and Tack Minor played 40 total minutes and Darrel Mitchell was on the floor for all 45 minutes ... That marked the first time a player had played that long in a game since Torris Bright and Antonio Hudson played 42 minutes against Mississippi State on Feb. 13, 2002.

Paid Attendance

The Tigers average paid attendance for the pre-January non-conference portion of the season was 8,867 paid for six games ... The total paid attendance for the six home games is 53,324, compared to 48,561 for the first six games of the 2003-04 season, an increase of 12.6 percent at the box office.

Also up this season is the actual attendance numbers through the first six games ... This season, the actual crowd total is 29,440 for the six games, compared to 25,005 for the first six games of the 2003-04 season, an increase of 15 percent for this season.

The Tigers have record an upswing in paid attendance at the Pete Maravich Center the last three seasons, averaging 9,355 at the end of last season ... That represents an increase of 15.4 percent since the 2000-01 season when LSU's paid average was 8,106. LSU's paid average was 8,534 in 2002 and 8,687 in 2003 ... The 9,355 is the second best average of the John Brady era behind the 10,549 average paid crowd during the 2000 NCAA Sweet 16 season ... The Tigers had three home game paid crowds over 12,000 in SEC play against Mississippi State, Auburn and Kentucky.

Free Throws

In the beginning of the season, the Tigers were red-hot at the free throw line, making nearly 78 percent at the stripe in the first five games:

Tulane (W, 83-58) -- 23-of-30 -- 76.7 percent
UL-Lafayette (W, 83-69) -- 18-of-24 -- 75.0 percent
New Orleans (W, 95-79) -- 14-of-17 -- 82.4 percent
West Virginia (L, 69-84) -- 16-of-19 -- 84.2 percent
Northwestern St. (W, 83-74) -- 30-of-40 -- 75.0 percent

But then in the next three games, the Tigers were struggling to hit 2/3 of the attempts in the next three games:

McNeese State (W, 82-79) -- 15-of-26 -- 57.7 percent
Southern Miss (L, 84-88 ot) -- 16-of-24 -- 66.7 percent
Houston (L, 72-81) -- 16-of-26 -- 61.5 percent

Now ironically, LSU is over 80 percent in the last three games at the line, but the Tigers are struggling to get to the line, averaging just 10.3 attempts the last three contests:

Florida State (W, 67-50) -- 9-of-11 -- 81.8 percent
Utah (L, 55-69) -- 6-of-7 -- 85.7 percent
Alabama (L, 58-73) -- 10-of-13 -- 76.9 percent

For the season, LSU is shooting one of its strongest percentages in years, 73.0 percent (163-of-224) ... It would presently stand as fourth best percentage for an LSU team in history behind the school record 77.0 percent shot in 1988-89, the 75.0 percent in 1985-86 and the 73.7 percent by the 1963-64 team.

Last year, LSU got to the line 678 times, 23.4 a game, compared to the present average of 20.4 attempts a game ... The best percentage season at the line for a Brady team prior to this year was the 2000-01 team that made 69.2 percent of its attempts.

The Tigers have four players making at least 72 percent of their attempts -- Brandon Bass 86.3 percent (44-of-51); Darrel Mitchell 82.1 percent (23-of-28) and, at 72.7 percent Glen Davis (48-of-66) and Darnell Lazare (8-of-11).

Three-Point Field Goals

In looking back at last year's effort at the three-point arc, one has to go back to the first year of the John Brady era to find a year when the Tigers had less success at making three-pointers in regard to total and percentage. Last year, LSU made 168 treys, down 47 from the 2002-03 season with a percentage of 33.6 percent for the 2003-04 year, compared to 37.7 percent for 2002-03.

So far in 11 games this year, LSU's three-point abilities have improved, making 86-of-225 attempts or 38.2 percent. The Tigers are averaging 7.8 treys a game, compared with just 5.8 a game last year ... The Tigers are on pace to make over 190 three-pointers this season, something done by only five LSU teams ... Antonio Hudson continued his strong play outside the arc, making 27-of-60 or 45 percent, while Darrel Mitchell has his percentage back at 37.7 percent (26-of-69) after making 3-of-5 against Alabama Saturday.

Five different players made threes against Utah when LSU had 11 treys, one of two games the Tigers have made double figure threes ... In the last three games, the Tigers are 29-of-71 from the arc, or 40.1 percent.

Assists and Turnover Numbers

The Tigers assists and steals were down last year, with 346 assists and 176 steals compared to 2003 -- 515 assists, 255 steals; 2002 -- 467 assists, 280 steals; 2000 -- 503 assists, 313 steals.

Last year, LSU averaged 11.9 assists and 6.1 steals a game ... Through the first 11 games, the Tigers numbers in assists are up, averaging 16.5 a game, but LSU struggles to get steals from the opponents, averaging just 6.8 a game.

LSU has kept the assist to turnover ratio positive so far with 181 assists and 158 turnovers with more assists than turnovers in seven games. For the last five years, LSU's primary point guard has had a positive assist-to-turnover ratio ... Through the first 11 games this year, Tack Minor has 62 assists to 43 turnovers and Xavier Whipple has 26 assists to nine turnovers ... LSU opponents have dished out 114 assists to 181 for LSU, while the Tigers have forced 142 turnovers.

LSU's other two guards, Antonio Hudson and Darrel Mitchell also have good assist and turnover numbers with Hudson having 25 assists and 16 turnovers, while Mitchell is at 31 assists and 22 turnovers.

"Assisted" Baskets

The term first came to attention when Coach Brady noted it during the end of the 2002-03 season when LSU had back-to-back games against Auburn and Tennessee in which the number of assists to the number of made field goals was in close proximity ... That year, LSU had 26 assists to 32 baskets against Auburn and in the very next game at Tennessee, the Tigers has 27 assisted baskets out of 30 potential field goals made (90 percent of the LSU field goals were assisted). In those two games, LSU had 53 assisted baskets out of possible 62 field goals made (85 percent).

LSU had four games last year with an assisted basket percentage of 80 percent or better ... Against Northwestern State (12-11), the Tigers had 19 assisted baskets out of a potential 22 made field goals (86 percent) ... There have been 12 such games in which the "assisted" basket percentage is 80 percent or better since 1985 ... LSU was just under 80 percent at 79.2 percent against Florida State (Dec. 30) with 19 assists of a possible 24 baskets.

The Louisiana Streak Still Alive For Another Season

The McNeese game, as close and as crazy as it was at the end, kept alive for the Tigers their 16-year win streak over Louisiana schools, now at 52 games ... The last time a Louisiana school beat the Tigers in the Maravich Center was when Louisiana Tech beat LSU, 111-109, in overtime (Dec. 6, 1988). The present streak started two nights later as LSU was able to sneak out a two-point win over McNeese State on Dec. 8, 1988 ... LSU was 5-0 this year against Louisiana schools.

97 and Counting

Over one-third of LSU's basketball seasons have been played in the Maravich Center as men's basketball goes into its 97th season ... LSU's record entering the season is 1,288-981 on court, needing just 12 wins to become the 55th school in Division I to win 1,300 games in its history.

Field Goal Percentage

shot 50 percent or more from the field and only the 11th time in 72 games in which LSU has lost in the Brady era ... LSU is now 108-23 in the Brady era when out shooting its opponents ... LSU is 5-2 this season when out shooting the opponent from the field, however the Florida State game (Dec. 30) stopped a two-game streak of LSU shooting better, but losing ... Last year, LSU was 17-3 when out shooting the opponents ... LSU has out shot seven of the first 11 opponents this year.

The Tigers are 1-3 when shooting less than the opponent this season and when LSU won over Northwestern State (12-11) while being out shot, it marked only the 18th time in 91 games in the Brady era that the Tigers won when out shot from the field.

More on Three-Pointers

The Tigers enter the game having made at least one three pointer in every game of the John Brady era, 223 games ... The streak actually runs back seven more games of the 1996-97 season to Feb. 7, 1997, a total of 230 games where LSU has made at least one three-pointer ... Seven times in the 230 games, LSU has kept the streak alive by making just one three pointer in the game ... The closest streak-buster came last year in the March 3 Ole Miss game when it took 34 minutes for LSU to make a three-pointer.

The Baton Rouge native enters the week ranked as the 11th-best forward in the nation, according to the CBS Sportsline Player Productivity Ratings. Bass is listed as the 16th best player in the nation when all positions are accounted for. The rankings are a total player-rating system based on various offensive and defensive statistics. Players increase their scores with every contribution they make to the game.

The list of the 10 forwards ahead of Bass on the list are: Ryan Gomes, Providence (81.44 rating); Michael Harris, Rice (79.67); Andrew Bogut, Utah (77.40); Ike Diogu, Arizona State (76.96); Taylor Copenrath, Vermont (76.26); Quemont Greer, DePaul (75.44); Craig Smith, BC (74.45); Joey Graham, Oklahoma State (74.44); Adam Morrison, Gonzaga (74.28); and, Carl Landry, Purdue (74.12). Bass' rating is at 74.10.

Bass enters the SEC home opener averaging 16.6 points per game, 8.6 rebounds per game, shooting 61.5 percent from the field, 86.3 percent at the free throw line, while averaging 1.6 blocks a game.

In the SEC rankings, Bass is near the top in several categories: Scoring -- 6th; Rebounding -- 3rd; Field Goal Percentage -- 1st; Free Throw Percentage -- 3rd; Blocked Shots -- 7th; Offensive Rebounds -- 3rd; Defensive Rebounds -- 2nd.

The last LSU player to win the SEC field goal percentage title was Stromile Swift in 2000, when he shot right at 61 percent from the field ... Bass' 61.5 percent field goal percentage presently represents the seventh best single season field goal percentage in LSU history.

Bass had three double-doubles in December games:

Northwestern State (12-11) -- 6-10 FG, 10-11 FTs, 1 ast, 2 blk, 22 pts, 14 rebounds

Southern Miss (12-18) -- 6-7 FG, 1-2 FT, 4 ast, 1 blk, 13 pts, 11 rebounds

Houston (12-21) -- 8-13 FG, 5-7 FT, 2 ast, 6 blk, 22 pts, 15 rebounds (career high boards)

The sophomore now has 10 double-doubles in his one season and 11 games at LSU ... While Bass has had strong games of late, it's not his best scoring game of the season ... The only shot Brandon Bass took that didn't go in the basket in the championship game of the LSU Louisiana Classic (11-21) against UL-Lafayette came with 1:37 to go in the first half. Other than that, he was perfect, hitting 11-of-12 from the field and eight-of-eight at the free throw line in a 30-point performance that helped him solidify Most Valuable Player honors in the tournament.

Ironically, it was in the same game (second of the season) a year ago that an LSU player last hit the 30-point barrier as Jaime Lloreda had 30 against McNeese State in the second game of the 2003-04 campaign. Bass became the 33rd LSU player to go for 30 points or more since 1967. It is the fifth highest scoring game in the SEC as of Christmas.

For Bass, it appeared to complete his return after he underwent arthroscopic left knee surgery Oct. 1 to repair a lateral meniscus tear. The surgery was performed following an MRI on the knee

after Bass disclosed discomfort in the knee.

Bass was the SEC Freshman of the Year after the 2003-04 season in which he averaged 12.8 points and 7.4 rebounds a game. He was also on the Collegeinsider.com All-Freshman team, a second team Freshman All-America pick by Rivals.com and the 2004 Dick Vitale SEC Diaper Dandy. The Baton Rouge product also had good success in the classroom, earning a spot on the SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll.

Bass has a good chance to advance his position from the league freshman honor roll to the overall SEC academic honors list and possibly beyond after making 4A's and 1B in his 15 hours of class work over the fall semester.

The Houston game marked the sixth 20-point game of Bass' career:

Bass continues to be one of the best big men in the league in free throw shooting. Last season, Bass hit 78.3 of his attempts and made his first 22 attempts this year before missing and ending a streak of 24 straight dating back to last year.

Bass also moved into a tie for eighth in the school's top 10 career shot block list (72) and his present career shooting percentage of 53.9 percent (188-of-349), presently is just outside the school's career top 10 list.

Darrel Mitchell

*LSU Louisiana Classic All-Tournament

The junior from St. Martinville in his first two years was one of the most consistent three-point shooters in the game ... As a freshman in 2003, Mitchell was 42-of-99 for 42.4 percent and last year, Mitchell upped the makes and attempts, hitting 67-of-160 for a very consistent 41.9 percent ... After going through a four-game spell when his shot wasn't falling with the regularity Tiger fans were accustomed to, he put in 3-of-5 to make him 135-of-328 after 72 games of 41.2 percent for his career, good enough for fourth on LSU's career three-point percentage makes list.

His 135 career treys puts him eighth on the LSU makes list.

Mitchell hit four treys and 8-of-9 free throws for 20 points against Northwestern State (12-11), the third time Mitchell has hit the 20-point mark in his career and the second this year. Mitchell is averaging 11.9 points per game, 2.2 rebounds per game and 2.8 assists per game ... The Alabama game was the first he did not have an assist in this season ... He is also 23-of-28 at the free throw line, although still looking for go to the line for the first time since the Dec. 13 McNeese game.

Mitchell is eighth in the league in 3-point field goal percentage at 37.7 percent and in three-pointers per game at 2.36 ... He is tied for fifth in steals per game average at 2.00.

Tack Minor

For the first time since Torris Bright did it against Houston in January 2003, an LSU player dished out assists in double figures as Tack Minor had 10 assists against UNO (11-24) ... Minor also had 10 points in the game to record his first college double-double.

Minor has started every game this season and has 62 assists (5.6 avg) and 43 turnovers (3.9 avg) ... Minor has had more assists than turnovers in six games ... The Alabama game (1-8), was his first with more turnovers than assists since the second game of the season against Louisiana-Lafayette (11-21) ... He has been in double figures in seven games, including against Florida State (12-30), when he scored a career high of 23 points on 8-of-18 shooting, including 5-of-9 from three point range ... Minor has dished out at least five assists in six of the games so far.

This year, Minor is averaging 27.7 minutes a game and 12.5 points ... Minor is second in the SEC in assists behind only Gary Ervin of Mississippi State, who is averaging 6.19 assists a game.

Antonio Hudson

*LSU Louisiana Classic All-Tournament

Until the ankle injury slowed him in the Alabama game (1-8) and finally sent him to the bench in the final 10 minutes, Hudson was in the midst of his best and most consistent year as a Tiger and there is no reason to believe that won't continue Wednesday or at whatever point he is able to rejoin the team.

The Grambling, native, ended last season by hitting a career-high 25 versus South Carolina in the SEC Tournament and 16 at Oklahoma in the NIT to get his final average back to double figures (10.2 ppg) ... In the opener against Tulane (11-19), he scored 11 points and then in the championship game against UL-Lafayette, Hudson was a perfect 6-of-6 from three-point range as he recorded his seventh career 20-plus point game with 22 against the Cajuns. Against UNO on 11/24, he was 8-of-15 from the field with two treys in an 18-point effort.

That gave Hudson five consecutive double figure scoring dating back to last year, the longest string of consecutive double-figure games in his career ... During his freshman year, Hudson had two streaks of four consecutive double-figure scoring games.

Speaking of Hudson's 6-of-6 perfect night at the three-point line, he became just the fourth LSU player to be perfect outside the arc when taking at least five attempts:

Torris Bright, at Arizona (5-of-5), 12-20-00

Collis Temple, vs. Nicholls State (5-of-5), 12-22-00

Darrel Mitchell, vs. Auburn (5-of-5), 2-26-03

Antonio Hudson, vs. UL Lafayette (6-of-6), 11-21-04

The streak did end at five, as he was held to just five points on 2-of-8 shooting against West Virginia ... For the 11 games, Hudson is averaging 13.6 points per game, 2.9 rebounds and 2.3 assists while averaging a team-high 35.1 minutes a game (The Alabama game, playing just 29 minutes, snapped a string of 12 games dating back to last season in which Hudson had played at least 33 minutes) ... For Hudson, trying to find the consistency that he has been striving for his entire career, the nine games in double figures is more than any of his other years at this point of the season.

Another sign of the consistency has been Hudson's strong play on the arc. Hudson opened the season by hitting 19-of-36 outside the line and he has come back after hitting just 2-of-10 combined against Southern Miss (12-18) and Houston (12-21) to nail 10-of-19 in the last three games against Florida State (12-30), Utah (1-3) and Alabama (1-8) ... Against Florida State, Hudson was 4-of-8, 3-of-7 at Utah and 3-of-4 at Alabama.

In the last four games, Hudson has scored 60 points, hitting 21-of-40 field goals, 11-of-24 treys with 16 rebounds ... Against Florida State (12-30) he became the 34th player in LSU history to score 1,000 career points ... He now has 1,026 points and is at the point where he will now begin moving past people on the school scoring list ... For example, once he hits 1,100 points, he will have moved up to 27th place on the school list.

Glen Davis

Davis opened SEC play with good numbers, playing 32 minutes at Alabama, making 5-of-11 field goal attempts and three free throws with 13 points and seven rebounds to go with two blocks and a steal. Bass enters Wednesday's game averaging 11.6 points per game, 6.8 rebounds and 1.1 blocks per game.

For the second straight year, a Baton Rouge freshman opened his career at LSU with a double-double ... Last year, it was Brandon Bass who opened his career with 15 points and 11 rebounds in a win over Southern University ... This year, Davis came off the bench early against Tulane (11-19) and played 24 minutes, scoring 16 points with 13 rebounds ... Davis was 4-of-6 from the field and 8-of-11 from the free throw line to help the LSU percentage of 76.7 percent for the evening.

Davis has started the last 10 games and has had five other games in double figures prior to Alabama -- 16 vs. Tulane (11-19) and UNO (11-24), 10 vs. Northwestern St. (12-11), 15 vs. McNeese State (12-13) and 27 vs. Southern Miss (12-18).

Against Southern Miss, Davis hit 9-of-19 field goal attempts and 9-of-11 free throw attempts in his early LSU career scoring high.

Davis is sixth overall in rebound average (6.8 rpg) and among just freshman, Davis' 11.6 aver-

age is third and he is the league's leading freshman rebounder ahead of David Biles of Georgia at 6.0 a game.

Ross Neltner

LSU sophomore Ross Neltner made his first career start in the season opener against Tulane and played 20 minutes with a career high of seven points on 3-of-6 shooting and five rebounds ... Neltner's playing time as a freshman grew as the season wound down, gaining more and more confidence scoring his previous career high of five points against Kentucky and Ole Miss in back-to-back games.

Neltner was a big factor in the Florida State game (12-30), coming off the bench with foul trouble looming for LSU's starting forwards and played 30 solid minutes, hitting both field goal attempts and both free throw attempts to go with two assists and two blocked shots ... Twice he has had seven points, his career high and he is averaging 2.5 points and 3.5 rebounds a game, while averaging 14 minutes a contest.

Xavier Whipple

The senior point guard has been a steadying influence coming off the bench to average 18.3 minutes a game ... That's what he has become known for in the last 1 1/2 years when he was the starting point guard for the Tigers ... Whipple had a strong game off the bench play-making against McNeese State (12-13), with six assists and just one turnover ... Whipple had his second scoring high of eight points against Houston (12-21), playing 28 minutes, hitting 3-of-5 field goals, including a trey, while dishing out four assists to just one turnover ... Whipple has an assist-to-turnover ratio of 2.9 with 26 assists and just nine turnovers so far this season ... Against Alabama (1-8), Whipple played a season high 30 minutes, hitting two-of-five field goal attempts for four points with five assists and two turnovers ...

Whipple doesn't shoot often, but this season he is 5-of-12 from three-point range, giving him 23 career three-point makes ... Whipple is averaging 2.5 points per game and 1.7 rebounds per game to go with 2.4 assists ... Whipple has averaged 23.7 minutes the last four games.

Darnell Lazare

In 11 games, he is averaging 2.5 points per game and 1.8 rebounds, averaging 7.3 minutes of playing time per game ... Lazare has hit 10-of-17 field goal attempts and an equally strong 8-of-11 free throws ... His best scoring and rebounding game came against UNO with nine points (the fourth highest scoring game of his career) and seven rebounds ... Lazare started eight games a year ago at forward for the Tigers ... Lazare will be looking for his first points since the Dec. 18 Southern Miss game.

Smile To Those TV Cameras

LSU was 10-8 on television last year, the first winning record on TV since the 1999-2000 season when LSU recorded a 13-4 mark ... LSU opened up 3-2 on TV this year with the Tigers on tape delay regional TV Wednesday against South Carolina.

Another Diploma On the Mantle

25 Years of Hawthorne

LSU Sports Network play-by-play voice Jim Hawthorne is in his 25th year as the voice of the LSU men's basketball team ... Hawthorne began calling the LSU games at the start of the 1979-80 season, traveling from Shreveport where he then worked at KWKH Radio in Shreveport. At that time he was the voice of the Centenary Gents and had become known for his work with the Gents on the 50,000-watt clear-channel station at a time when future star Robert Parish played for Centenary.

Hawthorne called the games through the NCAA Final Four season of 1980-81, missing the 1981-82 season, before the rights holder at the time brought Jim back to the microphone and when the 1982-83 season began, Hawthorne was now a Baton Rouge resident. He was later hired from the affiliate by the LSU Athletic Department in 1986 and today serves as Assistant Athletic Director in charge of radio.

As the "Voice of the Tigers" for football, basketball and baseball, Hawthorne has called 10 football Bowl games (including the recent national title), two Final Fours in men's basketball and five College World Series championship games.

In Hudson's 22-point effort, he hit 6-of-6 three-pointers and the senior joined Darrel Mitchell on the all-tournament team ... LSU shot 50.9 percent from the field (28-of-55), 9-of-18 from three-point range.

After trading the lead back and forth, West Virginia took the lead for good at 19-17 with 11:52 to play in the first half and led by as much as 13 in the second half, before LSU rallied to cut it to four with 7:40 left ... But the Tigers could get no closer ... LSU out rebounded West Virginia, 36-25, shooting 38.6 percent from the floor ... LSU's free throw percentage continued to be good, making 16-of-19.

But the Demons couldn't be put away, cutting the lead to two in the final seven minutes ... All five starters were in double figures for the Tigers with Bass getting his first double-double of the year with a career high 14 rebounds ... Ross Neltner had a career rebound night (6) and three players equaled or bettered career marks at the free throw line ... LSU was out shot from the field, 44.0 to 46.0 percent, but out rebounded the Demons, 40-32 ... The Tigers had 19 assists for the 22 made baskets, 86 percent.

Brandon Bass had the second highest scoring game of the season and his LSU career and while LSU did shot 50 percent from the field, the Tigers were out rebounded, 42-33, and shot from 26 percent (5-19) from the arc ... Also after five strong games at the free throw line, the Tigers hit just 57.7 percent (15-26) from the free throw line.

Brandon Bass had his second-straight double-double, including a career high 15 rebounds and a career equalling best six blocks as LSU lost two-straight games against non-SEC teams for the first time in the John Brady era.

The 23 points was a career high for Minor and Hudson became the 34th LSU player to go over 1,000 career points ...
