The rebuilding of the LSU program is nearing completion under John Brady. Now the task is to sustain the success and plan for the future of the program under the coach in his eighth season at the helm of the Tigers.

Unfortunate circumstances cost the Tigers a chance to shine in the post-season last year. After starting 17-4, the Tiger squad found itself having to play three, four and at times five freshmen on the floor against SEC squads much more experienced. But through it all, some hard lessons were learned and the freshmen are now experienced sophomores ready to blend with a couple of veteran seniors who have seen just about everything in their three years. Throw in another highly talented and anticipated recruiting class and some changes made in the coaching staff and Brady is ready to take the next step in sustaining the winning cycle that is building at LSU.

It's all be part of Brady's plan of rebuilding the LSU program since he came to Baton Rouge. He didn't come here with a plan that just looked good on paper. It was a practical and sensible plan that gave the LSU program the direction to go and the chance to shine again.

When Brady arrived on campus

in March 1997 and was given the job of rebuilding the program, he knew he would have the chance to mold the program from the ground up and build a foundation based on responsibility and accountability. There were dreams of building a program where the players would take responsibility for their actions and make people proud of what they were trying to accomplish, both on and off the floor.

Brady's plan isn't just taking place on a hard wood floor in the Maravich Center. He has worked hard to show the public that the athletic and academic pursuits of the LSU players should be challenged to the fullest. All the while, he was also making sure the players understood that the methods and rules of the program would make them not only better, but better students able to adapt to the outside world once school was completed.

That's part of the reason that LSU basketball is not only a success on the court, but in the classroom as well. Last spring, every scholarship players passed every course hour taken and the team GPA was just over 3.0, the highest in years. Three student-athletes made the Dean's List, six had 3.0 averages or above and the five members of the freshman class averaged 35 hours

and completed their first year with an average GPA of 2.87.

In his first seven seasons, besides the 20 players who have qualified for the SEC Academic Honor Roll and the 11 graduates, Brady has coached the SEC Player of the Year (Stromile Swift-2000), two SEC Freshmen of the Year (Torriss Bright - 2000; Brandon Bass - 2004), plus 10 selections on the All-SEC teams.

All that has been a part of the foundation of LSU basketball under John Brady. The 50-year-old Brady enters his eighth season having taken the Tigers a long way both on and off the court.

What has been the result? The Tigers program is solid both athletically and academically. The top athletes in the country are seriously putting LSU at the top of their lists and Brady is earning the respect of his peers in the league. The plan to bring back the success of the LSU program has now shifted to the future of keeping the program at the top of the SEC for years to come.

Prior to becoming the head coach at LSU, Brady served six years as the head coach at Samford. He also served as assistant coach at Mississippi State and UNO prior to taking the head position at the Birmingham school.

Tigers were able to stay with the Utes Monday at the Huntsman Center for a half, but the dominance of Andrew Bogut (24-17) proved too much for LSU to overcome in the second half ... LSU was forced to shoot 31 threes over the defense of the Utes and made 11 with Brandon Bass making all three -of-his attempts ... LSU shot 38 percent for the game (19-50) and 35.5 percent from the three-point arc (11-of-31) ... LSU shot over 80 percent again from the line (6-of-7), but for the second straight game didn't get to the line very much ... LSU was out rebounded, 39-21 ... The Tigers had 13 assists and just six turnovers.

## Opening Night In The Southeastern Conference

If it is opening game of the season for the Tigers in the Southeastern Conference, it must be a road game as the Tigers are on the road for its first conference games for the fourth consecutive year ... Last year, LSU opened at Arkansas and came away with a 66-55 decision, while losing to Georgia in the 2003 opening, 89-63. The 2002 opening was at Alabama with the Tigers losing a close one to the 18-ranked Tide, 76-74 ... The Tigers are 2-5 in SEC openers in the Brady era ... Overall, the Tigers are 42-29 in SEC openers.

The Tigers are the fifth winningest team in SEC games with 560 wins in 72 years of league play (Kentucky 809, Alabama 662, Tennessee 592, Vanderbilt 566, LSU 560) ... LSU's eight conference championships is tied with Tennessee for the second most in the league behind Kentucky's 42.

## About Alabama

The Crimson Tide comes into the game with an 11-3 marked and ranked in both national polls ... The Tide lost its conference opener on the road Wednesday night to Vanderbilt in Nashville, 70-56 ... Jermareo Davidson with 21 points and eight rebounds led the Crimson Tide in scoring, with Kennedy Winston adding 16 points and four assists ... Vanderbilt jumped out to a 41-29 halftime advantage in the game as the Commodores shot 45.2 percent for the game and 12-of-25 from the trey arc ... Alabama was at 38.8 percent from the field (19-49) and 4-of-15 from the arc ... Alabama was out rebounded in the game, 41-25 ... Mark Gottfried is in his seventh season as the head coach at the Capstone with a record of 130-78, taking his team to the NIT finals in 2001 and to three straight NCAA Tournaments, including the Elite 8 a year ago ... The former Alabama playing star also coached for three years at Murray State and has career wins totaling 298 ... The probable Alabama starters based on the previous game:

## The Pete Maravich Center - Under New Management

On July 1, 2004, the management of the Maravich Center came under the direction of the LSU Athletics Department as the building's control was transferred from the University. The building, now hosting its 34th season of men's basketball, is undergoing a multi-year refurbishing to continue it as one of the great basketball venues in the South.

It's a renovation that began two years ago with new television lights that can be turned on and off to allow more freedom with player introductions and special ceremonies.

It continued last season with a brand new roof surface that will serve for many years in the future. Also the outside concourse windows of the building now feature the Tiger mascot running around the building that can be seen for miles as people enter the city on the Mississippi River Bridge.

This year, basketball fans will see a completely redesigned concourse with video and graphic displays, renovated concession stands and video kiosks showcasing the best of the sports that play in the building - men's and women's basketball, volleyball and gymnastics.

The concourse is divided into four quadrants - Pete Maravich Pass, The Walk of Champions, Heroes Hall and Midway of Memories.

There is still more to come. At the close of this basketball season, the seats in the arena will be replaced, the acoustical paneling around the top of the arena will be replaced and handicap accessible seating is added at new locations. Also planned are upgraded restroom facilities and updates to the heating and air conditioning systems.

The Tigers, who played their 500th game in the building last season, are 377-133 (.739) in the building, 5-1 this year, and LSU has won at least 12 games five of the last six seasons.

### Non-Conference Streak Busted But Starts Again

The West Virginia loss (11-27) was only the 27th in 224 non-conference games in the 30-plus year history of the building and it was the first loss in a regular season non-conference home game since Dec. 1, 1997 against Lamar, a span of 56 games ... The Tigers are 60-4 in the John Brady era in home non-conference contests. That streak includes two wins over Arizona, including a win when the Wildcats were No. 1 and last year's win over Utah.

### More Number Crunching

The loss to Houston (12-21) was only the eighth loss in 48 games in the month of December in the John Brady era ... The Tigers loss to Southern Miss (12-18) while leading with 10 minutes to go was only the 15th time in 118 games that LSU lost with the lead and 10 minutes to play in the Brady era ... Losing the game with the lead and five minutes to play was the 12th time in 118 games ... The 81 points by Houston represented the 30th time in the Brady era that the Tigers had allowed 80 or more points in a game ... The losses to Southern Miss (12-18) and Houston (12-21) marked the first time LSU has lost consecutive non-conference games in the Brady era.

### Home Wins

The Tigers are 5-1 this season at home and have 33 wins in the last two-plus seasons dating back to the start of the 2002-03 season. That led the SEC until Wednesday night when Vanderbilt won its 34th home game during that period, giving LSU the second most home victories of any team in the Southeastern Conference over that same period (2002-03 to Jan. 6):

### Speaking Of, When Will I See Home Again?

The Dec. 13 contest against McNeese State was the last time the Tigers played in the Pete Maravich Center until the Tigers come home to play South Carolina on Jan. 12, 2005, a span of 30 days ... It is the longest the team has been away from home since the 1968-69 season when the Tigers were away from home for 35 days between games. That year, LSU played Georgia at the old John Parker Ag Center on Dec. 21, 1968 and did not play another home game until meeting Kentucky on Jan. 25, 1969

The Tigers swing has included the Southern Miss game in Biloxi (Dec. 18) and the Houston game (Dec. 21) prior to Christmas, the game against Florida State in the Nokia Sugar Bowl Classic (Dec.30), this trip to Salt Lake City on Jan. 3 to face Utah and tonight's opening of Southeastern Conference play Saturday in Tuscaloosa against Alabama.

## Road Games

The Tigers are 0-2 on the road this season, having lost on opponent's courts at Houston (81-72, Dec. 21) and Jan. 3 at Utah (69-55) ... LSU was 5-7 last year on road courts and in its history, LSU has won 40 percent of the time on road courts (378-550) ... John Brady at LSU is 18-33 over the last five years on the road ... LSU comes into the SEC road opener with a three-game league losing streak on the road dating back to last season ... Last year, the SEC road teams won just 32 of 96 contests with a 14-38 record in weekend conference tilts.

## LSU Fails to Win When Scoring 80

The number 80 had been a good one for the Tigers in John Brady's eight seasons as the Tigers as they entered the Dec. 18 game with Southern Miss 48-0 in the Brady era when scoring at least 80 points ... This season, LSU had posted five games in the 80s and won ... But when Southern Miss prevailed in an 88-84 win, it marked the first time in the Brady era the Tigers were not the winners when scoring 80 points or more.

## LSU Scoring Well, But Opponents Are Scoring More As Well

LSU made a decision this season to play a more up-tempo offense in an attempt to score more points in transition. But in return this season, opponents are also scoring more points and players are consistently having big games scoring against the Tigers ...

With the increased scoring for the offense has come a dilemma for LSU's players running in transition offense to come back and play transition defense ... In the six games prior to the Florida State game on Dec. 30, the opponents were shooting over 40 percent from three-point range, 40-of-95 (42.1) ... In that period, two players have scored over 30 points and five others this season have posted at least 22 points ... Last season in 29 games, no player scored over 30 and only three scored as much as 24 points on LSU ... The opponents are also collecting points off LSU turnovers in recent games, with Florida State (12-30) getting 20, Houston (12-21) getting 20, Southern Miss (12-18) getting 13, McNeese (12-13) getting 20, Northwestern St. (12-11) 19 and West Virginia (11-27) 24.

## But Things Changed Against FSU

Against Florida State (Dec. 30), the LSU up-tempo offense took on a new look -- call it the "patient" up-tempo offense as LSU looked to go hard in transition, but the Tigers weren't afraid to pull it up and work the ball around in the offense, finding several holes in the Florida State Seminoles.

The decision to play a more patient style was part of a decision by the LSU coaching staff to develop a renewed emphasis on rebounding and defending by the Tigers, something that has long been a staple of the John Brady era at LSU.

The Tigers held Florida State in both halves under 30 points and held an opponent to 60 points or less for the 77th time in the Brady era and LSU has a 66-11 record in those games ... LSU also out rebounded the Seminoles, 42-30, holding FSU to 10 less offensive rebounds than Houston had against the Tigers the week before.

## Against Utah

The Utes took advantage of weakness on the boards with 12 offensive rebounds and a plus-18 rebound margin ... Andrew Bogut became the eighth opponent player to score at least 22 points against LSU this year.

## The Stats -- Breaking Down The Wins and Losses

There is a definite difference in what has been happening to LSU in regard to the games won and the games lost -- here how it breaks down with a caveat that in the McNeese win, the stats are skewed for the opponents in that particular game after LSU had to hang on with a 21-point lead to win.

It should be noted that in LSU's win, opponents shot 42.1 percent from the field, compared to 48.8 percent in the LSU losses.

### **Overtime**

The game against Southern Miss (12-18) was the first LSU game to go to overtime since Feb. 13, 2002, when LSU rallied to force overtime against Mississippi State and won, 68-65 ... With the game in Biloxi, LSU is now 1-7 in overtime games on the neutral court ... LSU's overall overtime record is 25-41 ... This was the seventh time in the John Brady era that the Tigers have played overtime, including a three overtime game at Alabama in 1999 ... LSU is 3-4 in the Brady era in overtime.

With the overtime, two players, Brandon Bass and Tack Minor played 40 total minutes and Darrel Mitchell was on the floor for all 45 minutes ... That marked the first time a player had played that long in a game since Torris Bright and Antonio Hudson played 42 minutes against Mississippi State on Feb. 13, 2002.

### **Paid Attendance**

The Tigers average paid attendance for the pre-January non-conference portion of the season was 8,887 paid for six games ... The total paid attendance for the six home games is 53,324, compared to 46,561 for the first six games of the 2003-04 season, an increase of 12.6 percent at the box office.

Also up this season is the actual attendance numbers through the first six games ... This season, the actual crowd total is 29,440 for the six games, compared to 25,005 for the first six games of the 2003-04 season, an increase of 15 percent for this season.

The Tigers have recorded an upswing in paid attendance at the Pete Maravich Center the last three seasons, averaging 9,355 at the end of last season. That represents an increase of 15.4 percent since the 2000-01 season when LSU's paid average was 8,106. LSU's paid average was 8,534 in 2002 and 8,687 in 2003 ... The 9,355 is the second best average of the John Brady era behind the 10,549 average paid crowd during the 2000 NCAA Sweet 16 season ... The Tigers had three home game paid crowds over 12,000 in SEC play against Mississippi State, Auburn and Kentucky.

### **Free Throws**

As documented earlier, in the beginning of the season, the Tigers were red-hot at the free throw line, making nearly 78 percent at the stripe in the first five games, but struggling to hit 2/3 of the attempts in the next three games:

LSU's free throw percentage has been over 80 percent in the last two games against Florida State and Utah (15-of-18, 83.3 percent), but the Tigers were unable to get to the line with the regularity that LSU did in early games ... For the season, LSU is shooting one of its strongest percentages in years, 72.8 percent (163-of-224) ... Last year, LSU got to the line 678 times (23.4 a game, compared to 22.4 a game this year), the second most in the Brady era, making 65.5 percent ... The best percentage season at the line for a Brady team prior to this year was the 2000-01 team that made 69.2 percent of its attempts ... The school record for an LSU team was in the

1988-89 season when LSU posted 77.0 percent at the charity stripe on a team led by the strong free throw shooting of Chris Jackson, then a freshman at LSU. .

Four members of LSU's rotation are over 70 percent individually for the season, led by Brandon Bass, who has made 40-of-47 attempts (85.1 percent) after starting the season with a 24-make streak with two of the charity tosses dating back to last season ... Darrel Mitchell is 23-of-28 for 82.1 percent, Darnell Lazare is 8-of-11 for 72.7 percent and Glen Davis is 45-of-61 for 73.8 percent.

### Three-Point Field Goals

In looking back at last year's effort at the three-point arc, one has to go back to the first year of the John Brady era to find a year when the Tigers had less success at making three-pointers in regard to total and percentage. Last year, LSU made 168 treys, down 47 from the 2002-03 season with a percentage of 33.6 percent for 2003-04 compared to 37.7 percent for 2002-03.

The Tigers averaged 5.7 treys a game last year, compared to 7.8 this season ... This year, LSU is 78-of-209 from the arc, 37.3 percent ... The Tigers are on pace to make over 190 three-pointers this season, something done by only five LSU teams ... Antonio Hudson remains over 40 percent at 42.9 percent for the season, 24-of-56, but junior Darrel Mitchell, consistently at 42 percent after his first two seasons at LSU is at 35.9 percent this season (23-of-64), just 6-of-24 in the last four games.

Against Utah, the Tigers shot 31 threes and made 11, the most for the team this season ... Five different players contributed made threes.

### Trying to Improve Statistical Numbers

The Tigers assists and steals were down last year, with 346 assists and 176 steals compared to 2003 -- 515 assists, 255 steals; 2002 -- 467 assists, 280 steals; 2000 -- 503 assists, 313 steals.

Last year, LSU averaged 11.9 assists and 6.1 steals a game ... Through the 10 games, the numbers show LSU averaging 16.8 assists a game and 7.0 steals a contest.

So far the assist-turnover match up is positive to date for LSU with 168 assists and 140 turnovers, with LSU having more assists than turnovers in seven contests. For the last five years, LSU's primary point guard has had a positive assist-to-turnover ratio ... Through the first 10 games this year, Tack Minor shows 57 assists to 37 turnovers and Xavier Whipple has 21 assists and seven turnovers ... LSU opponents have dished out 105 assists to 168 for LSU, while LSU has forced 133 turnovers ... LSU has scored 160 points off those turnovers.

Antonio Hudson and Darrel Mitchell have also done a good job of making plays count with Hudson showing 25 assists and Mitchell 31.

### "Assisted" Basket

The term first came to attention when Coach Brady noted it during the end of the 2002-03 season when LSU had back-to-back games against Auburn and Tennessee in which the number of assists to the number of made field goals was in close proximity ... That year, LSU had 26 assists to 32 baskets against Auburn and in the very next game at Tennessee, the Tigers has 27 assisted baskets out of 30 potential field goals made (90 percent of the LSU field goals were assisted). In those two games, LSU has 53 assisted baskets out of possible 62 field goals made (85 percent).

LSU had four games last year with an assisted basket percentage of 80 percent or better ... Against Northwestern State (12-11), the Tigers had 19 assisted baskets out of a potential 22 made field goals (86 percent) ... There have been 12 such games in which the "assisted" basket percentage is 80 percent or better since 1985 ... LSU was just under 80 percent at 79.2 percent against Florida State the other night with 19 assists of a possible 24 baskets.

### The Louisiana Streak Still Alive For Another Season

The McNeese game, as close and as crazy as it was at the end, kept alive for the Tigers their 16-year win streak over Louisiana schools, now at 52 games ... The last time a Louisiana school beat the Tigers in the Maravich Center was when Louisiana Tech beat LSU, 111-109, in overtime (Dec. 6, 1988). The present streak started two nights later as LSU was able to sneak out a two-point win over McNeese State on Dec. 8, 1988 ... LSU was 5-0 this year against Louisiana schools.

### 97 and Counting

Over one-third of LSU's basketball seasons have been played in the Maravich Center as men's

basketball goes into its 97th season ... LSU's record entering the season is 1,287-977 on court, needing just 13 wins to become the 55th school in Division I to win 1,300 games in its history.

### Field Goal Percentage

The Tigers loss to Southern Miss (12-18) marked a rare occasion when LSU shot 50 percent from the field but couldn't win the contest ... LSU has won 116 of its last 134 games in which it has shot 50 percent or more from the field and only the 11th time in 72 games in which LSU has lost in the Brady era ... LSU is now 108-23 in the Brady era when out shooting its opponents ... LSU is 5-2 this season when out shooting the opponent from the field, however the Florida State game stopped a two-game streak of LSU shooting better, but losing ... Last year, LSU was 17-3 when out shooting the opponents ... LSU has out shot seven of the first 10 opponents this year.

The Tigers are 1-2 when shooting less than the opponent this season and when LSU won over Northwestern State (12-11) while being out shot, it marked only the 18th time in 90 games in the Brady era that the Tigers won when out shot from the field.

### More on Three-Pointers

The Tigers enter the game having made at least one three pointer in every game of the John Brady era, 222 games ... The streak actually runs back seven more games of the 1996-97 season to Feb. 7, 1997, a total of 229 games where LSU has made at least one three-pointer ... Seven times in the 228 games, LSU has kept the streak alive by making just one three pointer in the game ... The closest streak-buster came last year in the March 3 Ole Miss game when it took 34 minutes for LSU to make a three-pointer.

### Brandon Bass

**\*2004 Pre-Season Coaches All-SEC First Team**

The Baton Rouge native rebounded nicely from his struggle and foul trouble against Florida State, scoring 17 points with nine boards at Utah. In the game, Bass hit 6-of-11 field goals including all three three-point attempts.

According to the latest CBS Sportsline Player Productivity Ratings, Bass is listed as the 12th-best forward in the nation and the 17th best player in the nation when all positions are accounted for. The rankings are a total player-rating system based on various offensive and defensive statistics. Players increase their scores with every contribution they make to the game.

Bass enters the SEC opener averaging 17.3 points per game, 9.1 rebounds per game, shooting 64.0 percent from the field, 85.1 percent at the free throw line, averaging 1.6 blocks a game.

In the SEC rankings, Bass is near the top in several categories: Scoring -- 4th; Rebounding -- 3rd; Field Goal Percentage -- 1st; Free Throw Percentage -- 3rd; Blocked Shots -- 7th; Offensive Rebounds -- 3rd; Defensive Rebounds -- 2nd.

The last LSU player to win the SEC field goal percentage title was Stromile Swift in 2000, when he shot right at 61 percent from the field ... Bass' 64 percent field goal percentage presently represents the second best single season percentage in LSU history.

Bass enters January off some big December games which included three double-doubles:

**Northwestern State (12-11) -- 6-10 FG, 10-11 FTs, 1 ast, 2 blk, 22 pts, 14 rebounds**

**McNeese State (12-13) -- 10-13 FG, 7-10 FTs, 2 ast, 2 blk, 27 pts, 7 rebounds**

**Southern Miss (12-18) -- 6-7 FG, 1-2 FT, 4 ast, 1 blk, 13 pts, 11 rebounds**

**Houston (12-21) -- 8-13 FG, 5-7 FT, 2 ast, 6 blk, 22 pts, 15 rebounds (career high boards)**

**4-game totals: 30-43 FG (69.8%), 23-30 FT (76.7%), 7 ast, 11 blk, 21.0 ppg, 11.7 rpg**

The sophomore from Baton Rouge now has 10 double-doubles in his one season and 10 games at LSU ... While Bass has had strong games of late, it's not his best scoring game of the season ... The only shot Brandon Bass took that didn't go in the basket in the championship game of the LSU Louisiana Classic (11-21) against UL-Lafayette came with 1:37 to go in the first half. Other than that, he was perfect, hitting 11-of-12 from the field and eight-of-eight at the free throw line in a 30-point performance that helped him solidify Most Valuable Player honors in the tournament.

Ironically, it was in the same game (second of the season) a year ago that an LSU player last

hit the 30-point barrier as Jaime Lloreda had 30 against McNeese State in the second game of the 2003-04 campaign. Bass became the 33rd LSU player to go for 30 points or more since 1967. It is the fifth highest scoring game in the SEC as of Christmas.

For Bass, it appeared to complete his return after he underwent arthroscopic left knee surgery Oct. 1 to repair a lateral meniscus tear. The surgery was performed following an MRI on the knee after Bass disclosed discomfort in the knee.

Bass was the SEC Freshman of the Year after the 2003-04 season in which he averaged 12.8 points and 7.4 rebounds a game. He was also on the Collegeinsider.com All-Freshman team, a second team Freshman All-America pick by Rivals.com and the 2004 Dick Vitale SEC Diaper Dandy. The Baton Rouge product also had good success in the classroom, earning a spot on the SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll.

Bass has a good chance to advance his position from the freshman honor roll to the overall SEC academic honors list after making 4A's and 1B in his 15 hours of class work over the fall semester.

The Houston game marked the sixth 20-point game of Bass' career:

Bass continues to be one of the best big men in the league in free throw shooting. Last season, Bass hit 78.3 of his attempts and made his first 22 attempts this year before missing and ending a streak of 24 straight dating back to last year.

Bass also moved into a tie for eighth in the school's top 10 career shot block list (72) and his present career shooting percentage of 54.4 percent (185-of-340), presently is tied for the 10th best career percentage in LSU history.

## Darrel Mitchell

### \*LSU Louisiana Classic All-Tournament

The junior from St. Martinville in his first two years was one of the most consistent three-point shooters in the game ... As a freshman in 2003, Mitchell was 42-of-99 for 42.4 percent and last year, Mitchell upped the makes and attempts, hitting 67-of-160 for a very consistent 41.9 percent ... Mitchell was working that way until struggling the last four games, but he is still 23-of-64 for 35.9 percent from the arc and a career percentage after 71 games of 40.9 percent (132-of-323), good enough for fifth on LSU's three-point percentage list.

His 132 career treys puts him eighth on the LSU makes list.

Mitchell hit four treys and 8-of-9 free throws for 20 points against Northwestern State (12-11), the third time Mitchell has hit the 20-point mark in his career and the second this year. Mitchell enters the SEC play averaging 12.0 points per game, 2.2 rebounds per game, 3.1 assists per game and he is 23-of-28 at the free throw line, although looking for go to the line for the first time since the Dec. 13 McNeese game.

## Tack Minor

For the first time since Torris Bright did it against Houston in January 2003, an LSU player dished out assists in double figures as Tack Minor had 10 assists against UNO (11-24) ... Minor also had 10 points in the game to record his first college double-double.

Minor has started every game this season and has 57 assists (5.7 avg) and 37 turnovers (3.7 avg) ... However, in the last two games, Minor has had 13 assists and three turnovers, compared to the three games previous against McNeese, Southern Miss and Houston when he had even assists and turnovers in all three games totaling 13 assists and 13 turnovers.

He has been in double figures in seven games, including against Florida State, when he scored a career high of 23 points on 8-of-18 shooting, including 5-of-9 from three point range ... Minor has dished out at least five assists in six of the games so far.

This year, Minor is averaging 27.6 minutes a game and 12.9 points ... Entering league play, Minor is second in the SEC in assists behind only Gary Ervin of Mississippi State who is averag-

### \*LSU Louisiana Classic All-Tournament

The Grambling, native, ended last season by hitting a career-high 25 versus South Carolina in the SEC Tournament and 16 at Oklahoma in the NIT to get his final average back to double figures (10.2 ppg) ... In the opener against Tulane (11-19), he scored 11 points and then in the championship game against UL-Lafayette, Hudson was a perfect 6-of-6 from three-point range as he recorded his seventh career 20-plus point game with 22 against the Cajuns. Against UNO on 11/24, he was 8-of-15 from the field with two treys in an 18-point effort.

That gave Hudson five consecutive double figure scoring dating back to last year, the longest string of consecutive double-figure games in his career ... During his freshman year, Hudson had two streaks of four consecutive double-figure scoring games.

Speaking of Hudson's 6-of-6 perfect night at the three-point line, he became just the fourth LSU player to be perfect outside the arc when taking at least five attempts:

**Torris Bright, at Arizona (5-of-5), 12-20-00**  
**Collis Temple, vs. Nicholls State (5-of-5), 12-22-00**  
**Darrel Mitchell, vs. Auburn (5-of-5), 2-26-03**  
**Antonio Hudson, vs. UL Lafayette (6-of-6), 11-21-04**

The streak did end at five, as he was held to just five points on 2-of-8 shooting against West Virginia ... For the 10 games, Hudson is averaging 13.9 points per game, 3.1 rebounds and 2.5 assists while averaging a team-high 37.7 minutes a game ... For Hudson, trying to find the consistency that he has been striving for his entire career, the seven games in double figures is more than any of his other years at this point of the season.

In the last three games, Hudson has scored 49 points, hitting 17-of-34 field goals, 8-of-20 treys with 15 rebounds ... Against Florida State he became the 34th player in LSU history to score 1,000 career points ... His career total entering his final season of SEC play stands at 1,015.

## Glen Davis

For the second straight year, a Baton Rouge freshman opened his career at LSU with a double-double ... Last year, it was Brandon Bass who opened his career with 15 points and 11 rebounds in a win over Southern University ... This year, Glen Davis, came off the bench early against Tulane (11-19) and played 24 minutes, scoring 16 points with 13 rebounds ... Davis was 4-of-6 from the field and 8-of-11 from the free throw line to help the LSU percentage of 76.7 percent for the evening.

Davis has started the last nine games and had five total games in double figures -- 16 vs. Tulane (11-19) and UNO (11-24), 10 vs. Northwestern St. (12-11), 15 vs. McNeese State (12-13) and 27 vs. Southern Miss (12-18).

Against Southern Miss, Davis hit 9-of-19 field goal attempts and 9-of-11 free throw attempts in his early LSU career scoring high ... He is averaging 11.5 points per game and 6.8 rebounds a game.

As SEC play begins, Davis will be looking to get his numbers back up, having scored just 20 points in the last three games with 12 rebounds, shooting 5-of-13 from the field.

## Ross Neltner

LSU sophomore Ross Neltner made his first career start in the season opener against Tulane and played 20 minutes with a career high of seven points on 3-of-6 shooting and five rebounds ... Neltner's playing time as a freshman grew as the season wound down, gaining more and more confidence scoring his previous career high of five points against Kentucky and Ole Miss in back-to-back games.

Neltner was a big factor in the Florida State game (12-30), coming off the bench with foul trouble looming for LSU's starting forwards and played 30 solid minutes, hitting both field goal attempts and both free throw attempts to go with two assists and two blocked shots ... Twice he has had seven points, his career high and he is averaging 2.7 points and 3.6 rebounds a game, while averaging 14.5 minutes a contest.

## Xavier Whipple

The senior point guard has been a steadying influence coming off the bench to average 17 minutes a game ... That's what he has become known for in the last 1 1/2 years when he was the starting point guard for the Tigers ... Whipple had a strong game off the bench play-making against McNeese State (12-13), with six assists and just one turnover ... Whipple had his second scoring high of eight points against Houston (12-21), playing 28 minutes, hitting 3-of-5 field goals, including a trey, while dishing out four assists to just one turnover ... Whipple has an assist-to-turnover ratio of 3.0 with 21 assists and just seven turnovers so far this season ... Whipple doesn't shoot often, but this season he is 5-of-10 from three-point range, including his lone attempt against Utah to give him 23 career three-point makes ... Whipple is averaging 2.3 points per game and 1.7 rebounds per game ... Whipple's best was the six assist-one turnover effort in the Dec. 13 McNeese State game.

## Darnell Lazare

In 10 games, he is averaging 2.8 points per game and 2.0 rebounds, averaging 7.7 minutes of playing time per game ... Lazare has hit 10-of-17 field goal attempts and an equally strong 8-of-11 free throws ... His best scoring and rebounding game came against UNO with nine points (the fourth highest scoring game of his career) and seven rebounds ... Lazare started eight games a year ago at forward for the Tigers.

LSU was 10-8 on television last year, the first winning record on TV since the 1999-2000 season when LSU recorded a 13-4 mark ... LSU opened up 3-2 on TV this year with its next regional game on FSN in the SEC opener Jan. 8 at Alabama.

### **25 Years of Hawthorne**

LSU Sports Network play-by-play voice Jim Hawthorne is in his 25th year as the voice of the LSU men's basketball team ... Hawthorne began calling the LSU games at the start of the 1979-80 season, traveling from Shreveport where he then worked at KWKH Radio in Shreveport. At that time he was the voice of the Centenary Gents and had become known for his work with the Gents on the 50,000-watt clear-channel station at a time when future star Robert Parish played for Centenary.

Hawthorne called the games through the NCAA Final Four season of 1980-81, missing the 1981-82 season, before the rights holder at the time brought Jim back to the microphone and when the 1982-83 season began, Hawthorne was now a Baton Rouge resident. He was later hired from the affiliate by the LSU Athletic Department in 1986 and today serves as Assistant Athletic Director in charge of radio.

As the "Voice of the Tigers" for football, basketball and baseball, Hawthorne has called 10 football Bowl games (including the recent national title), two Final Fours in men's basketball and five College World Series championship games.

### **LSU Players Featured in Local Billboard Campaign**

Members of the LSU men's basketball team are featured on a citywide billboard advertising campaign to let fans know that the 2004-05 season is just around the corner.

As part of LSU's "It's Hoops Time" marketing campaign for the new season, LSU players Xavier Whipple, Antonio Hudson, Darrel Mitchell and Brandon Bass are featured on 10 Lamar Advertising billboards across Baton Rouge. The players are pictured individually in shots in which the players were allowed to show their personality matched up with slogans created by the LSU Promotions and Marketing Office and LSU Director of Publications Jason Feirman.

Whipple, the Tigers' senior point guard is making a no look pass with the slogan "cool whip," while forward and 2004 SEC Freshman of the Year Bass is squeezing the air out of a basketball with a net draped over his neck with the slogan, "get hooked on BASSketball." Hudson, LSU's senior guard is featured smiling, holding the basketball toward the camera urging fans to "have a ball ..." with Mitchell, who was one of the league leaders in three-point shooting last season, in his billboard asking the fans "you wanna geaux?"

"We believe that when fans come to know the personalities on this team," said LSU Associate Athletic Director for External Affairs Herb Vincent, "they will come to the Maravich Center and see them play. This is just one way we are reaching out to bring new fans to LSU basketball."

While this is not the first time that billboards have been used to promote LSU basketball, it is the first time the men's basketball players have been prominently featured.

"This is just another example of the great support we are getting from our administration in promoting men's basketball this season," said LSU coach John Brady.

The Tigers posted an easy win Friday night in the semifinals of The LSU Louisiana Classic to advance to the championship game ... The Tigers pushed the lead to 34-21 at the half and then outscored Tulane 12-1 to open the second half and eventually opened as much as a 37-point lead ... Tigers shot 43.5 percent from the field (27-of-62), 6-of-18 from three-point range and a very strong 23-of-30 at the free throw line (76.7 percent) ... The Tigers out rebounded Tulane, 45-30, and had 16 assists to 12 turnovers.

### **Game 2 -- LSU 83, Louisiana-Lafayette 69 (11-21-04, Maravich Center)**

The Tigers won the LSU Louisiana Classic, pulling away in the second half to defeat Louisiana-Lafayette at the Maravich Center ... Brandon Bass had a career-high 30 points, hitting 11-of-12 field goal attempts to earn tournament MVP honors ... In Hudson's 22-point effort, he hit 6-of-6 three-pointers and the senior joined Darrel Mitchell on the all-tournament team ... LSU shot 50.9 percent from the field (28-of-55), 9-of-18 from three-point range.

### **Game 3 -- LSU 95, UNO 79 (11-24-04, Maravich Center)**

The Tigers won the game against the University of New Orleans with a strong offensive performance in the first 16 minutes that gave LSU a 27-point lead ... Tack Minor had his first career double-double with 10 points and 10 assists as one of five LSU players to score in double figures ... LSU shot 57.1 percent from the field, including 64.3 percent in the second half ... The Tigers shot 45 percent from the arc (9-20) and again had another strong night at the free throw line, making 14-of-17.

### **Game 4 -- West Virginia 84, LSU 69 (11-27-04, Maravich Center)**

The Tigers' 56-game regular season non-conference home winning streak came to an end with the loss to West Virginia ... The Mountaineers shot 60 percent from the field (33-of-55) and made 11 three-pointers to get the win ... After trading the lead back and forth, West Virginia took the lead for good at 19-17 with 11:52 to play in the first half and led by as much as 13 in the second half, before LSU rallied to cut it to four with 7:40 left ... But the Tigers could get no closer ... LSU out rebounded West Virginia, 36-25, shooting 38.6 percent from the floor ... LSU's free throw percentage continued to be good, making 16-of-19.

### **Game 5 -- LSU 83, Northwestern St. 74 (12-11, Maravich Center)**

The Tigers continued their win streak against Louisiana schools, extending it to 51 games ... The Tigers broke a one-game losing streak with the win that came after a two-week break for dead week and final exams on the campus ... LSU jumped out to 5-0 lead and led eight at the intermission after giving up the lead twice in the final 10 minutes of the first half ... But the Demons couldn't be put away, cutting the lead to two in the final seven minutes ... All five starters were in double figures for the Tigers with Bass getting his first double-double of the year with a career high 14 rebounds ... Ross Neltner had a career rebound night (6) and three players equaled or bettered career marks at the free throw line ... LSU was out shot from the field, 44.0 to 46.0 percent, but out rebounded the Demons, 40-32 ... The Tigers had 19 assists for the 22 made baskets, 86 percent.

### **Game 6 - LSU 82, McNeese St. 79 (12-13, Maravich Center)**

A game of stark contrast as LSU apparently broke the game open, holding McNeese scoreless during the final 3:30 of the first half and the first five minutes of the second half to go from one point down to up 20, 55-35 ... LSU would have a 22-point lead, 65-43, with 10:12 to play only to see the whole thing evaporate and McNeese have two three-point attempts in the final 13 seconds to tie ... Brandon Bass had the second highest scoring game of the season and his LSU career and while LSU did shot 50 percent from the field, the Tigers were out rebounded, 42-33, and shot from 26 percent (5-19) from the arc ... Also after five strong games at the free throw line, the Tigers hit just 57.7 percent (15-26) from the free throw line.

### **Game 7 - Southern Miss 88, LSU 84 (OT) (12-18, Biloxi, Miss.)**

For the second straight game, the Tigers were full of ebbs and flows as an offense and a defense against the Golden Eagles, falling behind 16 points in the first half (down 11 at the half) to going up by seven points three times in the final nine minutes, the last at 71-64 with 3:07 to play ... But the Tigers were unable to hold the lead, and a Southern Miss bucket with 1.1 to play tied the game at 77-77 forcing overtime ... The Tigers made just 2-of-10 shots in OT and lost for the second time this season and for the first time in the Brady era when scoring 80 or more points ... LSU shot 50.8 percent from the field, but was out rebounded by the Golden Eagles, 38-33.

### **Game 8 - Houston 81, LSU 72 (12-21, Houston, Texas)**

Except for an early spurt with the lead, the Tigers were in trouble on a couple of fronts, most notably defensively, giving up at least 79 points for the third straight game ... LSU led, 14-7, with six minutes gone in the first half, but the Cougars came back through the rest of a see-saw first half to lead, 37-35, at the intermission ... In the second half, the Cougars were able to drive past the LSU defense for easy goals, opening up as much as a 19-point advantage ... LSU shot 46.4 percent from the field, but only 23 percent from three-point range ... The Tigers were out rebounded, 42-39, but Houston had 17 offensive rebounds ... Brandon Bass had his second-straight double-double, including a career high 15 rebounds and a career equalling best six blocks as LSU lost two-straight games against non-SEC teams for the first time in the John Brady era.

### **Game 9 - LSU 67, Florida State 50 (12-30, New Orleans, La)**

In the Nokia Sugar Bowl Classic, Tigers spurted early in the game and then used a "patient" up-tempo style of play on offense and increased attention to rebounding and defense to give the SEC a sweep of the doubleheader against the ACC ... Tigers jumped out to an 18-5 lead in the first five minutes and led by as much as 19, 31-12, in the first half before going to the dressing room up 35-27 ... The closest Florida State got was five with 6:26 to play, 49-49, but Antonio Hudson (twice) and Tack Minor hit threes to up the margin back to 58-44 with 4:53 to play ...
