The rebuilding of the LSU program is nearing completion under John Brady. Now the task is to sustain the success and plan for the future of the program under the coach in his eighth season at the helm of the Tigers.

Unfortunate circumstances cost the Tigers a chance to shine in the postseason last year. After starting 17-4, the Tiger squad found itself having to play three, four and at times five freshmen on the floor against SEC squads much more experienced. But through it all, some hard lessons were learned and the freshmen are now experienced sophomores ready to blend with a couple of veteran seniors who have seen just about everything in their three years. Throw in another highly talented and anticipated recruiting class and some changes made in the coaching staff and Brady is ready to take the next step in sustaining the winning cycle that is building at LSU.

It's all be part of Brady's plan of rebuilding the LSU program since he came to Baton Rouge. He didn't come here with a plan that just looked good on paper. It was a practical and sensible plan that gave the LSU program the direction to go and the chance to shine again.

When Brady arrived on campus in March 1997 and was given the job of rebuilding the program, he knew he would have the chance to mold the program from the ground up and build a foundation based on responsibility and accountability. There were dreams of building a program where the players would take responsibility for their actions and make people proud of what they were trying to accomplish, both on and off the floor.

Brady's plan isn't just taking place on a hard wood floor in the Maravich Center. He has worked hard to show the public that the athletic and academic pursuits of the LSU players should be challenged to the fullest. All the while, he was also making sure the players understood that the methods and rules of the program would make them not only better, but better students able to adapt to the outside world once school was completed.

That's part of the reason that LSU basketball is not only a success on the court, but in the classroom as well. Last spring, every scholarship players passed every course hour taken and the team GPA was just over 3.0, the highest in years. Three student-athletes made the Dean's List, six had 3.0 averages or above and the five members of the freshman class averaged 35 hours and completed their first year with an average GPA of 2.87.

In his first seven seasons, besides the 20 players who have qualified for the SEC Academic Honor Roll and the 11 graduates, Brady has coached the SEC Player of the Year (Stromile Swift-2000), two SEC Freshmen of the Year (Torriss Bright - 2000; Brandon Bass - 2004), plus 10 selections on the All-SEC teams.

All that has been a part of the foundation of LSU basketball under John Brady. The 50-year-old Brady enters his eighth season having taken the Tigers a long way both on and off the court.

What has been the result? The Tigers program is solid both athletically and academically. The top athletes in the country are seriously putting LSU at the top of their lists and Brady is earning the respect of his peers in the league. The plan to bring back the success of the LSU program has now shifted to the future of keeping the program at the top of the SEC for years to come.

Prior to becoming the head coach at LSU, Brady served six years as the head coach at Samford. He also served as assistant coach at Mississippi State and UNO prior to taking the head position at the Birmingham school.

The Tigers shot 57.0% from the field (45-of-79) and 15-of-30 from three point range in a dominating performance over the Houston Sports Group ... The Tigers scored 62 points in each half, making 22-of-34 first half shots ... LSU had 32 assists and just nine turnovers in the contest ... Twelve Tigers played in the contest and 11 scored as only one player, Darrel Mitchell, played more than 23 minutes ... Mitchell was 10-of-16 from the field, 5-of-10 from three-point range.

The Tigers were able to get out quickly on the visiting EA Sports team, rushing to an 11-0 lead

and a 19-5 advantage with 10 minutes gone in the first half and although the visitors were able to cut the game to as close as three in the opening minute of the second half, the Tigers opened it back up to as much as 17 in the second half with LSU Coach John Brady playing several combinations.

LSU did not shoot the ball particularly well for the game, hitting 23-of-55, but rallied to hit 14-of-27 in the second half after hitting just 9-of-28 in the first 20 minutes. The Tigers were 7-of-15 from the arc and 9-of-14 at the free throw line with 15 assists and 14 turnovers. The rebounds were even at 36 apiece.

LSU in Tournaments

The Tigers are opening at home in a tournament for the second time in three seasons, having hosted the Hispanic College Fund Classic here to open the 2002-03 season, winning the tournament over Nicholls State and South Alabama.

This will mark the ninth time since the 1975-76 season that LSU has opened the season in some kind of a tournament and the Tigers record in those tournaments is 11-6 ... This is the fourth time LSU has opened up the season with an LSU hosted tournament as LSU hosted the Hispanic event to open the 2002-03 season, the LSU invitational to open the 1987-88 season and the Louisiana Classic to open the 1975-76 season ... LSU was a perfect 6-0 in those three events ... LSU has played three pre-season NIT games at home with a 2-1 record ... LSU was also 2-1 in the 1980 Great Alaskan Shootout and played in season opening tournaments at the University of Hawaii in 1982 and 1995 ... LSU's overall regular season tournament record is 56-50 with 10 tournament titles:

About the Teams and Series Records

Tulane -- Opening Round Opponent, Nov. 19, 8 p.m.

Although there was a nearly 20 year break in the series, the Tigers and Green Wave will meet for the third straight season and for the 205th time since the teams first met in Baton Rouge at some gym/arena in January 1911 ... LSU leads the overall series 121-83 and Coach John Brady is 2-0 against the Green Wave, winning 74-62 in the New Orleans Arena in the 2002 Nokia Sugar Bowl Classic and 67-48 last season at the Maravich Center ... Tulane's last win in the series came in the post-season NIT first round in 1982 when Tulane won an 83-72 decision ... The Wave's last regular season win in the series came in February 1971 when the Wave won in New Orleans, 93-86 ... Tulane is coached by Shawn Finney, in his fifth season at the helm of Tulane ... Finney is 50-68 at the New Orleans school ... His team had a 94-51 win over VASDA on Nov. 4 at Fogleman Arena ... Quincy Davis had 15 points and 10 rebounds off the bench to lead Tulane with Ivan Pjevcevic and Matt Wheaton each scoring 10 ... Louisiana Tech -- Potential Opponent, Nov. 21, 12:30/3 p.m.

The last time Louisiana Tech and LSU met was on the floor of this arena and it marked the last time a Louisiana school has beaten the Tigers at the Maravich Center in a regular season game ... Louisiana Tech beat LSU on Dec. 6, 1988, 111-109, in overtime in a game that was tied at 45-45 at the half and 90-90 at the end of regulation play ... It was just the third collegiate game for a young freshman from Gulfport, Miss., Chris Jackson, and he would begin to make a name for himself by scoring 48 points. Randy White and Byron Newton both topped 30 points for Tech and a now New Orleans Hornet named P. J. Brown was on the court for the Bulldogs ... Louisiana Tech is coached by Keith Richard ... Richard is in his seventh year at the school with a record of 106-69 ... Last year, Louisiana Tech was 15-15 and 8-10 in the WAC ... In exhibition play, the Bulldogs were winners over Ouachita Baptist, 83-76, and VASDA, 97-67 ... LSU leads the all-time record with the Bulldogs, 9-1 ... The 1988 game was the first since 1946.

Louisiana Lafayette -- Possible Opponent, Nov. 21, 12:30/3 p.m.

The Cajuns and Tigers last met on the court on Dec. 4, 2001, with LSU scoring an 83-65 decision ... It was the first meeting for the teams since 1945 ... The Cajuns were for many years in the 1920s and 1930s, the opening game on the LSU schedule ... Louisiana Lafayette won its lone exhibition contest, 71-48, against Arkansas Tech on November 10 ... From the Sun Belt Conference, the Cajuns are coming off a 20-9 season a year ago and a 12-3 record in the SBC, advancing to the 2004 NCAA Tournament ... The new coach of the Cajuns is Robert Lee, a Nicholls State graduate, who served as an assistant coach at UL-Lafayette from 1996 until taking the head coaching position.

The Pete Maravich Center - Under New Management 53-Game Regular Season Non-Conference Win Streak Still There

On July 1, 2004, the management of the Maravich Center came under the direction of the LSU Athletics Department as the building's control was transferred from the University. The building, preparing to host its 34th season of men's basketball, is now under going a multi-year refurbishing to continue it as one of the great basketball venues in the South.

It's a renovation that began two years ago with new television lights that can be turned on and off to allow more freedom with player introductions and special ceremonies.

It continued last season with a brand new roof surface that will serve for many years in the future. Also the outside concourse windows of the building now feature the Tiger mascot running around the building that can be seen for miles as people enter the city on the Mississippi River Bridge.

This year, basketball fans will see a completely redesigned concourse with video and graphic displays, renovated concession stands and video kiosks showcasing the best of the sports that play in the building - men's and women's basketball, volleyball and gymnastics.

The concourse is divided into four quadrants - Pete Maravich Pass, The Walk of Champions, Heroes Hall and Midway of Memories.

There is still more to come. At the close of this basketball season, the seats in the arena will be replaced, the acoustical paneling around the top of the arena will be replaced and handicap accessible seating is added at new locations. Also planned are upgraded restroom facilities and updates to the heating and air conditioning systems.

The Tigers, who played their 500th game in the building last season, are 372-132 in the building and have won 40 games the last three seasons in the building and at least 12 games five of the last six seasons. LSU is 192-26 in non-conference games and has not lost a regular season

non-conference home game since Dec. 1, 1997 against Lamar, a streak of 53 games. The Tigers are 55-3 in the John Brady era in non-conference contests. That streak includes two wins over Arizona, including a win when the Wildcats were No. 1 and last year's win over Utah.

LSU Still Perfect for Brady When Scoring 80

The Tigers enter the season still perfect for the Brady tenure when LSU scores 80 points or more ... LSU is now 42-0 when scoring 80 or above, 3-0 last year ... On another scoring note, the Tigers are 40-16 in the Brady era when scoring 70-79 points in a game.

The Number 60

The Tigers had much better success last year when scoring in the 60s, a number that for many years dating back to the late 1980s had been a stumbling block for LSU ... LSU was 9-5 last year when scoring between 60-69 points and the Tigers are now much closer to even in the Brady era at 31-34.

Paid Attendance

The Tigers have recorded an upswing in paid attendance at the Maravich Center the last three seasons, averaging 9,355. That represents an increase of 15.4 percent since the 2000-01 season when LSU's paid average was 8,106. LSU's paid average was 8,534 in 2002 and 8,687 in 2003 ... The 9,355 is the second best average of the John Brady era behind the 10,549 average paid crowd during the 2000 NCAA Sweet 16 season ... The Tigers had three home game paid crowds over 12,000 in SEC play against Mississippi State, Auburn and Kentucky.

Losing, Winning Last Year -- On the Perimeter

It became obvious last year that LSU's perimeter shooting was a vital factor in the team's wins and losses in the January-February period prior to the Jaime Lloreda defection. In losses to Mississippi State, Ole Miss and South Carolina (Jan. 17-24), the Tigers were just 30-of-88 from the perimeter (34.1 percent) and just 13-of-53 (24.5 percent) from three-point range.

But in LSU's five-game winning streak last year against Georgia, Alabama, Tennessee, Arkansas and Florida (Jan. 28 to Feb. 14), the Tigers were 111-of-229 on the perimeter (48.5 percent) and 29-of-73 from three-point range (39.7 percent).

As a team last year, the Tigers hit 44.1 percent from the field (656-1487) and 33.6 percent (168-500) from the arc. It was the second lowest three-point percentage of the Brady era.

Looking Back at Some Brady Era Stats That Staff Wants to Improve

One thing Coach Brady has noted is that he wants his Tigers to be able to take more shots of quality than the LSU team did a year ago. Last year, LSU averaged 51.3 shot attempts a game, compared to the 2003 season when LSU averaged 55.2 a game, 2002 -- 54.8 a game and 2000 - 55.3 a game.

In the two LSU exhibition games, the Tiger team averaged 67 shots a game.

The Tigers assists and steals were down last year, with 346 assists and 176 steals compared to 2003 -- 515 assists, 255 steals; 2002 -- 467 assists, 280 steals; 2000 -- 503 assists, 313 steals.

Through the exhibition the numbers turned the right way with LSU having a strong assist to turnover ratio of 47 assists to 23 turnovers. That number was helped significantly by the second exhibition when the Tigers had 32 assists and just nine turnovers. LSU had 17 assists in the exhibition affairs.

As a team last year, LSU shot just 33.6 percent from three-point range, making 168 treys after making the past four years 215, 204, 194 and 196 treys. LSU was 22-of-45 in the exhibitions.

The Louisiana Streak

The earlier talked about Louisiana Tech game on March 6, 1988, was the last time a Louisiana school beat the Tigers on the home hardwood of the Maravich Center. The present streak started two nights later as LSU was able to sneak out a two-point win over McNeese State on Dec. 8, 1988. Now just short of 16 years later, the streak against Louisiana schools is at 47 games and it will be tested early and often this year with two games guaranteed against state competition to be followed by next Wednesday's pre-Thanksgiving clash with UNO ... Before the year is out, LSU will also face Northwestern State (Dec. 11) and McNeese State (Dec. 13).

97 and Counting

Over one-third of LSU's basketball seasons have been played in the Maravich Center as men's basketball goes into its 97th season ... LSU's record entering the season is 1,282-976 on court, needing just 18 wins to become the 55th school in Division I to win 1,300 games in its history.

Field Goal Percentage

LSU has won 113 of its last 130 games in which it has shot 50 percent or more from the field, 58-of-68 in the Brady era. LSU is 103-21 in the Brady era when out shooting its opponents ... The Tigers were 17-3 last season out shooting the opponents.

Three-Pointers

The Tigers enter the 2004-05 season having made at least one three pointer in every game of the John Brady era, 212 games ... The streak actually runs back seven more games of the 1996-97 season to Feb. 7, 1997, a total of 219 games where LSU has made at least one three-pointer ... Seven times in the 219 games, LSU has kept the streak alive by making just one three pointer in the game ... The closest streak-buster came last year in the March 3 Ole Miss game when it took 34 minutes for LSU to make a three-pointer.

Brandon Bass

*2004 Pre-Season Coaches All-SEC First Team

*2004-05 Naismith Award Pre-Season Candidate

LSU sophomore forward Brandon Bass underwent arthroscopic left knee surgery Oct. 1 to repair a lateral meniscus tear. The surgery was performed following an MRI on the knee after Bass disclosed discomfort in the knee.

Bass was the SEC Freshman of the Year after the 2003-04 season in which he averaged 12.8 points and 7.4 rebounds a game. He was also on the Collegeinsider.com All-Freshman team, a second team Freshman All-America pick by Rivals.com and the 2004 Dick Vitale SEC Diaper Dandy. The Baton Rouge product also had good success in the classroom, earning a spot on the SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll.

Bass showed more of a return to form in Monday's second exhibition game, hitting 6-of-7 field goal attempts in a 20-point, nine-rebound effort in just 20 minutes.

One thing Bass has been good for LSU at is shooting free throws. As a freshman, the Baton Rouge native made 78.3 of his attempts and Monday night he was a perfect 8-of-8 at the line.

Darrel Mitchell

The junior from St. Martinville may well be, at least for his first two years, one of the most consistent three-point shooters in the country. In two seasons, Mitchell is 109-of-259 from the arc, 42.1 percent, after making 42.4 percent of his attempts in 2003 and 41.9 percent in 2004.

The difference in the attempts by year and the lack of difference in the percentage is remarkable as Mitchell made 42-of-99 attempts his first year and last year, 67-of-160.

Mitchell averaged 11.9 points per game as he started 17-of-29 games, including the last 12.

In two exhibitions, Mitchell continues to have a good eye from the arc, hitting four against EA Sports and then hitting 5-of-10 Monday against the Houston Sports Group in a 27-point, nine assist performance.

“Tack” Minor

The point guard position appears to belong to Tack Minor after the exhibition contests ... Minor in two games scored 27 points (13.5 average) with 10 assists ... The sophomore from Houston also hit 4-of-6 three-point attempts ... Minor a year ago, while still learning the college system and the control needed to be a college point guard, averaged 15.5 minutes per game, 7.2 points and 1.7 assists ... He had 11 games in double figures and was fourth among league freshmen in scoring average and three-point percentage (33.7%).

Antonio Hudson

LSU fans are hoping the senior can continue to play like he finished the 2003-04 campaign, hitting a career high 25 vs. South Carolina in the SEC Tournament and 16 at Oklahoma in the NIT to get his final average back to double figures (10.2 ppg) ... Hudson is working to become the next LSU player to join the 1,000-point career scoring list, needing 124 points to become the 34th LSU player over that figure ... Hudson, one of two seniors on the team, had 15 double figure scoring games last season and goes into the season with 42 career games in double figures ... Hudson, along with Mitchell, are two of just 10 players to have made more than 100 treys in their LSU career (110).

Glen Davis

The Baton Rouge freshman has been learning the ropes as the prep All-American makes the jump from University High basketball to Division I college hoops ... In the two exhibition games, Davis averaged 20.5 minutes, making 7-of-10 shots and 6-of-9 free throws to averaged 10.0 points per game and 4.5 rebounds ... Davis was Mr. Basketball as chosen by the Louisiana Sports Writers Association as he led University High to its second state championship in Class 2A in three seasons.

Smile To Those TV Cameras

LSU was 10-8 on television last year, the first winning record on TV since the 1999-2000 season when LSU recorded a 13-4 mark ... The Tigers will be featured on regional television three times in the first four games as the LSU Louisiana Classic will be televised Friday and Sunday and then the Saturday, Nov. 27 contest with West Virginia in the Maravich Center will be the first of four LSU appearances this year on Fox Sports Net (FSN) ... FSN will also televise the Nokia Sugar Bowl, and SEC road games at Alabama and Tennessee.

Put Another Diploma On the Mantle

25 Years of Hawthorne

LSU Sports Network play-by-play voice Jim Hawthorne will begin his 25th year as the voice of the LSU men's basketball team with tonight's game with Tulane. Hawthorne began calling the LSU games at the start of the 1979-80 season, traveling from Shreveport where he then worked at KWKH Radio in Shreveport. At that time he was the voice of the Centenary Gents and had become known for his work with the Gents on the 50,000-watt clear-channel station at a time when future star Robert Parish played for Centenary.

Hawthorne called the games through the NCAA Final Four season of 1980-81, missing the 1981-82 season, before the rights holder at the time brought Jim back to the microphone and when the 1982-83 season began, Hawthorne was now a Baton Rouge resident. He was later hired from the affiliate by the LSU Athletic Department in 1986 and today serves as Assistant Athletic Director in charge of radio.

As the "Voice" of the Tigers for football, basketball and baseball, Hawthorne has called nine football Bowl games (including the recent national title), two Final Fours in men's basketball and five College World Series championship games.

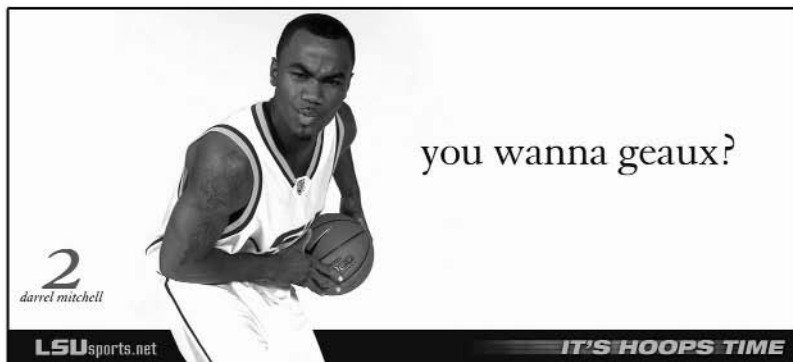
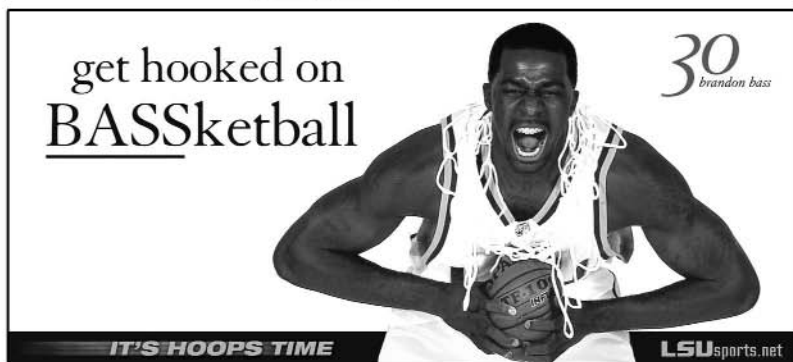
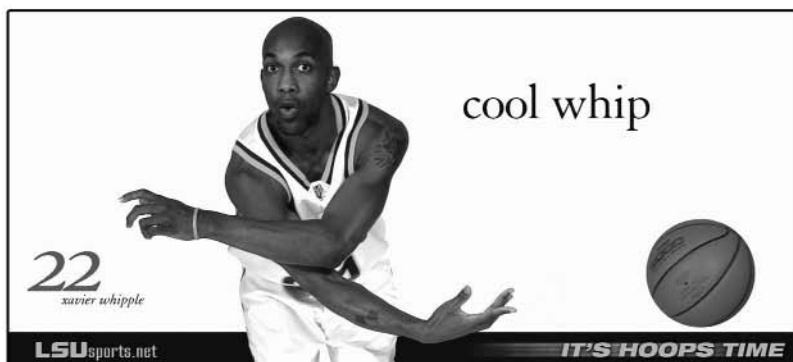
