The Lady Tigers opened the 2004-05 season with three of the best rounds in school history, including an even par opening round of 288 to win by three shots over Tennessee ... The Lady Tigers followed with a second round 295, falling to second behind the Lady Vols ... But in a face-to-face final round, LSU posted a two-over 290 to Tennessee's 295 to finish at nine-over 873, three shots the victor ... It was the 28th team victory by LSU in its history and the first round even par marked only the fifth time in school history the team had posted an even par or better round ... The 873 round marked the second best 54-aggregate total in school history ... Two LSU golfers, Vicky Meyer and Brooke Shelton, finished in the top 10 ... Meyer had rounds of 71-71-72 to finish in a tie for third at two-under 214, while Shelton posted a 217 (71-76-70) to finish in a tie for seventh.

Auburn built a nine-stroke lead at the turn as LSU and Georgia struggled on the front nine, but Arkansas posted a seven-over 295 round and waited nearly an hour for the final wave to finish ... The lead dropped for Auburn in the final holes and in the end, the Tigers had to come back and win it in a two-hole playoff over Georgia ... Arkansas finished one shot out of the playoff, with LSU and Tennessee one more shot back ... Melissa Eaton, Kim Meck and Brooke Shelton all finished in the top seven for LSU.

A Day With Vijay



Wednesdays on the PGA Tour is normally the time when the Tour and its players take part in weekly pro-am activities prior to the start of the 72-hole tournament the next day.

But when the PGA Tour's Zurich Classic of New Orleans held its Pro-Am day in Avondale at the TPC of Louisiana in May 2005, a couple of the game's top players and some of the country's top executives found special caddies waiting for them - members of the LSU women's golf team.

By the end of the day, the Lady Tigers had turned into some of the stars of the event.

Some of those in the groups the team caddied and walked with included Tom Ridge, the former Secretary of U.S. Homeland Security, football quarterback brothers Eli and Peyton Manning, Robert Lawless (CEO of McCormick and Sons) and Jim Schiro of tournament title sponsor Zurich Financial. Also playing in the pro-am group and having a wonderful time with the LSU team was the defending champion, Vijay Singh.



"They are fun. A great bunch of girls," Singh said later to the media. "It's one of the best times I've had on the pro-am. I'm sure my caddy (Paul Tesori) enjoyed it more than anyone else. But they (the LSU team) are a great bunch of girls. It's good to see them out here."



Throughout its 73-year history, the Southeastern Conference has been a leader in the integration of athletic competition and higher education.

Since its formation in 1933, the SEC has achieved both stature and stability by designating governing/voting power to the presidents of the member institutions. They have determined the policies of the conference and

through the years this involvement has been the principal source of strength in the evolution of the SEC.

Intercollegiate athletics has encountered many challenges in the 1990s and again the SEC provided guidance. In 1993, the member institutions adopted The Principles of Gender Equity. Committed to increasing the quantity and quality of women's athletic opportunities, each school provides at least two more women's intercollegiate programs than the number of men's.

SEC schools began athletic competition with one another over 100 years ago as members of the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Association. The 13 members west and south of the Appalachian Mountains reorganized as the Southeastern Conference at the annual Southern Conference meeting in 1932. Charter members of the new conference were Alabama, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, Georgia Tech, Kentucky, LSU, Ole Miss, Mississippi State, Sewanee, Tennessee, Tulane and Vanderbilt.

The first SEC champions were crowned in 1933 in four sports. The league's inaugural championship event was a basketball tournament in Atlanta, Feb. 24-28, 1933. In the 1979-80 academic year, SEC championships for women were recognized in basketball, tennis and volleyball. The following year golf, gymnastics, swimming and track and field were added. The administration of women's athletics officially came under the auspices of the conference office in 1984.

The SEC currently regulates nine men's sports and 11 women's sports. The women's sports are basketball, golf, gymnastics, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis, track (cross country, indoor, outdoor) and volleyball.

The LSU Lady Tigers will try to get back to the NCAA Division I Women's Golf Championships after a four-year absence in 2006, while attempting to make the NCAA Regionals for the 11th time in the last 12 years.

Last year, LSU missed advancing to the Division I Championships by two shots in the Regionals, but senior Brooke Shelton advanced in a one-hole playoff to advance as an individual to the finals in Sunriver, Ore.

There, Shelton became just the fourth women's golfer in LSU history to finish in the top 10 in the NCAA Women's Championships, shooting rounds of 71-75-72-73 over the par 71 Meadows Course to finish in a tie for eighth at seven-over 291.

This year again, 63 teams and nine individuals will be selected and set to one of three regional sites in early May, 2006. The top eight teams and two individuals will advance to the national championships in Columbus, Ohio later in the month.

A total of 20 of the 63 teams qualify as automatic invitees through conference championship tournaments, including the winner of the SEC Tournament in April to be held in Nashville.

LSU has participated in seven NCAA Division I Championships: 1982, 1986, 1996, 1998, 1999, 2000 and 2001, finishing no worse than 12th in the last six appearances with five top 10s.

The LSU Tigers won its spring tournament for the seventh time and for the third time since the tournament moved to the University Club in 2005 with a wire-to-wire victory.

The Lady Tigers dominated the field with one of their best 54-hole totals in school history—296-290-293-879 (15-over par). Chris Brady of Vanderbilt won the individual title with a five-under par of 211, tying the second lowest women's 54-hole score shot at the University Club. LSU freshman Rebecca Kuhn had her best tournament of the year with a two-under 214 (72-70-72) as she battled to become the eighth Lady Tiger to win the title in the first 24 years of the tournament.

This year's LSU/Cleveland Golf Classic will mark the 25th consecutive spring that the LSU women's golf team has hosted a tournament that has grown to be one of the most prestigious events of the spring women's golf schedule. The Classic, since its move to the LSU home course in 2000, has become one of the few women's collegiate tournaments with corporate backing from one of the country's top club manufacturers.

But the tournament roots go back to Fairwood Country Club and its unique membership that not only hosted and ran the tournament, but served as uncles and aunts for many of the teams that came back year-after-year. Club members hosted teams at their houses in the neighborhood every year, allowing teams to save money in the days when women's college golf wasn't funded as it is today. Dinners were provided by the club along with member entertainment and some of the

nation's top golf teams and players came to participate. Jenny Lidback, who would go on to win a major championship on the LPGA tour, lost the tournament title in a playoff while at TCU and in 1986 would win the title as an LSU Lady Tiger. Arizona's Marisa Baena had her coming out party as a freshman dominating the competition. In the final LSU-Fairwood event in 1999, Duke put on the course a lineup that would become one of the most dominating in the nation.

As LSU celebrates 25 years of hosting a major college golf event, Fairwood is on the verge of being sold and its future as a golf club remains unknown. In salute of 25 years of LSU Tournaments, here's thanks to people like Lou Besson, Rod Myserall and many more of the Fairwood membership who gave women's college golf in Baton Rouge an early home. Also, thanks to sponsor Cleveland Golf and the University Club for being a special home for LSU Golf.
