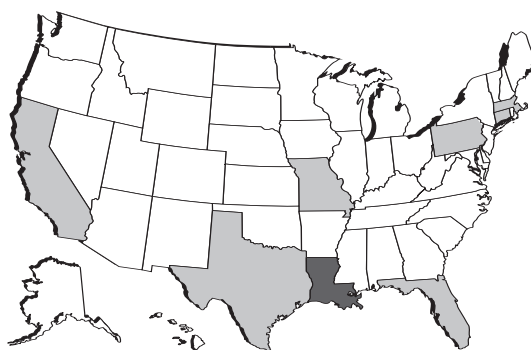

2008 SEASON PREVIEW

With the departure of three accolade-laden seniors, the 2008 LSU gymnastics team will be one that is extremely talented, but young. This year's roster features ten underclassmen - five sophomores and five freshmen - among its 14 members. It is because of that youth that head coach D-D Breaux expects some growing pains early on, but is willing to ride the wave because she believes the end product has limitless potential.

"I really feel this is a very, very good team," said Breaux. "We are just going to have to be patient. I believe that what you see early from this team, if we stay healthy, will be very different than what you see later in the year."

Early on Breaux will depend heavily upon her core of upperclassmen that she believes provides a solid base upon which to build around.

"The thing is we have Ashleigh Clare-Kearney, Lauren Klein, Kristi Esposito and Susan Jackson who are four decorated veterans," said Breaux. "Then we've got a whole core of really young people behind

them that are eager, anxious and working hard. I think the veterans are pushing the freshmen, the freshmen are pushing the veterans and in the process everyone is getting better."

Breaux expects that that hard work and internal push to excel will translate to the floor of competition where her team's expectations have not wavered from years past. The Tigers again expect to contend for a spot among the nation's elite as the team aims for the program's 24th trip to the national championships and a shot at the meet's Super Six Finals.

The Seniors

Helping steer the ship towards the NCAA Championships will be LSU's lone senior Kristi Esposito. The most decorated athlete on the LSU roster, Esposito is a four-time All-American who made an immediate impact on the Tigers' lineup last season after transferring from the University of Nebraska.

"Kristi is key to the success of this team because of her maturity," said Breaux. "She just goes out and competes and competes well. She is not over the top with anything, but everything she does, she does extremely well and with consistency and great execution."

Esposito, who competed primarily on the beam and floor last year, is again expected to be a mainstay in those events this season. Breaux also expects her to be a more consistent contributor on the bars this year, an event she competed on just six times in 2007.

The Juniors

The junior class is overflowing with talent as the three-member class includes All-SEC selections Ashleigh Clare-Kearney, Lauren Klein and Amanda Morales.

Clare-Kearney, who will return as a junior once again in 2008 after being granted a medical redshirt year for the 2006 season, was the backbone of the Tigers' squad last year. She won a team-leading six all-around titles and 26 individual event crowns en route to first-team All-SEC honors.

Clare-Kearney is expected to be just as impressive, if not more so, this season as she has increased her difficulty on each of the four events

in the off season and should again be among the nation's leaders in the all-around.

"Ashleigh's quality of work, maturity of work and intense competitive spirit is second to none," said Breaux. "She has worked hard in this off season and I would expect that we'll see the results of that work in the competitive arena."

Klein emerged as a star on the floor exercise in 2007, winning the NCAA Southeast Regional title and earning second-team All-SEC honors. She should again be a dominate force on that event, as well as the vault and beam this season, two events in which she saw limited action a year ago.

"Lauren does beautiful gymnastics," said Breaux. "Last year we had some more experienced athletes in the lineup so it was harder to go with someone we weren't as sure of, but this year she has really upped her difficulty and I think she's ready to step up into those events like she did for us on the floor last year."

Morales will be eased back into the Tigers' lineup while continuing to rehab a torn ACL suffered prior to last year's NCAA Championships.

"We are holding Amanda back right now," said Breaux. "She's just a little more than six months post-op and I want to make sure we give her every chance to be successful.

"Amanda made some huge contributions on vault last year and we'd like her to have the opportunity to do that again," added Breaux.

For Morales, who was a solid 9.850 vaulter a year ago, it will likely be a few meets into the season before her knee allows her to crack the vault lineup, but Breaux expects to use her on the bars come January and beam later in the year.

The Sophomores

Despite being in just their second year at LSU, the Tigers' 2008 sophomore class boasts a group of proven competitors in Susan Jackson, Sabrina Franceschelli, Summer Hubbard, Kayla Rogers and Yvette Triay.

Jackson, who developed into a force in the all-around late last year, headlines the group after earning All-America honors on the floor during her inaugural campaign. She proved to be a legitimate 9.900 competitor on each of the four events and is expected to provide a solid 1-2 punch in the all-around alongside Clare-Kearney.

"When you talk about student-athletes that have it, Susan's got it," said Breaux. "She's powerful, she's got pizzazz, she's got floor presence and she's confident in her gymnastics. We'll feel she is ready to go in the all-around and believe she will be a great contributor at the end of our lineup."

Franceschelli saw action primarily on the vault and beam a year ago, but has upgraded her difficulty in the off season and could also break into the floor and bar lineups.

"Sabrina has improved on every event," said Breaux. "She settled into that leadoff spot on beam as a freshman and I expect she'll find herself back in that role this year. She's also improved her vault and the consistency on her tumbling from a year ago so she could see time on those events as well."

Rogers provided the Tigers' with a solid leadoff performer on the vault last year, but will be asked to make much bigger contributions in 2008.

"We need for Kayla to be an all-arounder for us," said Breaux. "If her gymnastics continues to improve the way it has over the last few months I think she can be a solid all-arounder for us in the middle of our lineup."

Hubbard was a standout on the bars for the Tigers a year ago, winning three meet titles and posting scores of 9.900 on the event, but has been battling a back injury since that will slow her return to the lineup in 2008.

"She's definitely someone we'd like to see doing more than one event, but right now we are focused on just getting her back on bars," said Breaux.

Triay saw limited action on the floor last season, competing mostly in exhibition, but Breaux believes those experiences are something the Tigers could call upon this year.

"Yvette has worked really hard," said Breaux. "I think she is ready to go for us."

The Freshmen

The Tigers' will add five fresh faces to the mix in 2008, in Nicole Lyons (Mountaintop, Pa.), Staci Schwitkis (San Diego, Calif.), Samantha Engle (Plano, Texas), Paige Cipolloni (Macungie, Pa.) and Kristin Fiorello (Mandeville, La.).

Lyons competed three years as an elite, including one year at the international elite level, before dropping down to Level 10 for her junior and senior seasons. She has been hampered by nagging injuries late in the fall, but is expected to make immediate contributions on the vault and bars.

Schwitkis is a three-time Level 10 national qualifier that won both the state and regional all-around titles in 2005 and 2006. Breaux believes she is ready to help the Tigers on all four events, but will probably see her first action of the season on the vault and bars.

Engle is another Level 10 gymnast that comes to Baton Rouge with impressive credentials. A multiple-time national qualifier, Engle won the national floor title in 2007 and picked up the all-around and beam titles in 2005. She could see action on bars, beam and floor this year.

Cipolloni trained as a national elite for four years before moving to Level 10 for her junior and senior seasons where she earned trips to the J.O. National Championships both years. She came to LSU with a lingering hip injury from club that has limited her training this fall. Breaux expects her to recover fully and be a late bloomer in the Tigers' lineup.

Fiorello is a local product from nearby Mandeville that trained as a Level 10 in high school. She qualified to the national championships in 2005 and won the state all-around title that same year. She is expected to add quality depth to the Tigers' beam lineup.
