As the "Dean of Coaches" at LSU, head gymnastics coach D-D Breaux has represented the University at the highest level both in the gym and, most importantly, in the classroom for 28 years. Her dedication to the student-athlete on an individual basis has transcended into academic success, community involvement, Coach of the Year honors, SEC Championships and top-10 national rankings throughout her tenure.

Now entering her 29th season as the mastermind of the LSU gymnastics program, the fire in Breaux's eyes burns as bright today as it did on her first day on the job.

For her dedication, Breaux has been recognized by her peers time and time again, having been named SEC Coach of the Year on five occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 2000 and 2005) and NCAA Central Regional Coach of the Year three times (1999, 2002 and 2005), in addition to being named a finalist for National Coach of the Year honors in 1988 when she guided the Tigers to a fourth-place finish at the NCAA Championships.

In 2005, the LSU program reached new heights under Breaux's direction as the Tigers made their 17th appearance at the NCAA

Championships, won their third regional title in the last four years and achieved the program's first ever No. 1 national ranking. Named both the SEC and NCAA Central Coach of the Year for her team's efforts, Breaux also coached All-American April Burkholder to SEC and NCAA Central Region Gymnast of the Year honors for the second straight season and helped Annie Gagnon, Lisa Rennie and Terin Martinjak to All-America honors and Nicki Butler and Burkholder to All-SEC accolades.

2004 was a banner year for the LSU program as it won the NCAA Central Regional title for the second time in the three years, before finishing seventh at the NCAA Championships, the Tigers' best finish at the national meet since the 1993 season. Individually, Breaux guided the efforts of SEC and NCAA Central Region Gymnast of the Year April Burkholder and All-American Annie Gagnon. Burkholder became LSU's all-time top performer at the NCAA Championships, finishing second in the all-around to better Jennifer Wood's third-place effort at the 1996 championships.

2003 saw Breaux mold a young and inexperienced Tiger squad into one of the finest teams in the nation, as LSU recorded a second-place finish at the NCAA West Regionals and a top-10 showing at the

NCAA Championships.

In 2002, Breaux guided her team to the NCAA Central Regional title. The Tigers continued their success at the NCAA Championships where they finished eighth overall, LSU's best finish at the national championships in over five years. In addition, Breaux guided Nicki Arnstad to LSU's first individual NCAA Championship in modern history, as Arnstad won the floor exercise with a stunning 9.950 performance.

Aside from athletic honors, Breaux excels in recruiting quality student-athletes from Louisiana as well as across the continent, having recruited some of the top Canadian athletes of all time. A Louisianan through and through, Breaux concentrates her recruiting efforts right here in her native state, as well as at the national and international levels.

Outside of the gym, Breaux has taken an active role in the academic success her program has achieved in her 28 seasons at LSU. By making academic success her team's No. 1 priority, Breaux's teams have reached the highest scholastic goals she has established over the past decade. Throughout the country, she is acknowledged as having one of the finest academic teams year in and year out. LSU gymnasts

have been named Academic All-Americans 77 times and members of the SEC Academic Honor Roll on 98 occasions since 1991. During the 2003 season, a school-record 13 of Breaux's student-athletes were named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll, an honor reserved for sophomores, juniors and seniors. In 1999, the Tigers posted the third-highest GPA in the nation and the highest of any team in the NCAA Championship field.

Also active members of the local community, Breaux and her team continually participate in volunteer activities throughout the Baton Rouge area. In 2005, the team was awarded LSU's CHAMPS Community Service Award after logging over 400 hours of community service. Breaux, who is serving as the 2005 Chairman of the YWCA's Pink Ribbon Campaign for Breast Cancer, and her team have also volunteered their time to benefit the Muscular Dystrophy Association, St. Jude's Hospital and the Red Cross among others.

Inside the gym, Breaux's Tigers have placed among the nation's top-12 teams 20 times in her 28 seasons, finishing fourth in 1988, sixth in '80, '83, and '90, seventh in '87, '91, '93, and '04, eighth in '94 and '02, ninth in '78, '86, '95, '98, '99, '00 and '05, 10th in '03, 11th in '79 and '81, and 12th in 1997.

LSU has also placed among the top three in regional competition on 20 separate occasions, winning regional titles in 1978, 1979, 1980, 1986, 2002, 2004 and 2005. Her teams have included two national champions, 27 All-Americans and 27 All-SEC selections.

Breaux's Tigers earned the SEC Championship title in 1981, finished second in '90, '95, '00 and '05, and third in '82, '83, '97, '98 and '04.

It is this delicate balance between exceptional academics and athletic excellence that has allowed Breaux to keep her team at the top of the national scene year in and year out.

Breaux is a native of Donaldsonville, La. She earned both her bachelor's and master's degrees from LSU. She has two daughters, Jewel (23) and Sara (19), a member of the LSU soccer team.

Long-time Southeastern Conference assistant Bob Moore begins his seventh season with the LSU gymnastics program. Moore's presence has been undeniable in the last six years as he has helped the Tigers maintain their status as one of the nation's premier programs.

The Tigers' vaulting team has flourished under Moore's watch, recording nine of the top 10 event scores in school history, including four of those in 2005 alone. Individually, Moore has also guided the efforts of Annie Gagnon and April Burkholder. Gagnon earned All-American status on the vault in 2004, while Burkholder has earned the distinction on the event each of the last two seasons.

Recognized for his work by his peers, Moore was named the NCAA Central Region Co-Assistant Coach of the Year in 2005.

Moore joined the LSU coaching staff in 2000 after a six-year stint at the University of Florida where he served as the program's top assistant. To his credit, Moore coached two national champions on the vault while at Florida, in addition to numerous All-Americans and SEC champions.

"Bob provides us with experience at the highest level, not only within the SEC, but the NCAA," said Breau. "He knows exactly how tough this conference is and what it takes to take a program like ours that is an established top-10 team and bring it to the next level."

LSU is Moore's third stop within the SEC, as the 2006 season will be his 18th within the league. Prior to his tenure at Florida, Moore spent five seasons as an assistant at Auburn.

In addition to strengthening the Tigers on the vault and with their uneven bar routines, Moore plays a significant role with LSU's Bengal Gymnastics program, a highly successful youth age group program that practices in the Lady Tigers' gymnastics training facility.

A native of Birmingham, Ala., Moore graduated from Samford University in 1976 with a degree in general studies with an emphasis in music. He is married to the former Sandra Ballard.

Philip Ogletree begins his sixth year with the LSU gymnastics program after five already highly successful seasons at the collegiate level. In just five years, Ogletree has proved to be a tremendous asset to the LSU program, working primarily with the athletes on the uneven bars.

Ogletree has guided the Tigers to nine of the top 11 bar scores in school history, including a school-record 49.650 in 2002. In addition, Ogletree helped Sharene Mamby to a rare 10.00 during the 2001 season and Annie Gagnon to All-America honors in 2003.

In 2005, Ogletree's athletes flourished under his watch as Gagnon earned All-America status on the bars for a second straight year and April Burkholder and Lisa Rennie each earned the distinction for the first time.

For his efforts, Ogletree has been recognized by his peers on several occasions, as he was named the NCAA Central Region Assistant

Coach of the Year in 2004 and then shared that same honor a year later with fellow assistant Bob Moore.

"Philip has done a tremendous job for us," said Breaux. "He has been a great addition to our staff, both as a coach and as an administrator. Our team and staff have blended very well with Philip in the mix."

Ogletree came to LSU after spending the previous season at the Georgia Gymnastics Academy.

Ogletree arrived at LSU with 18 years of coaching experience, including 11 with Level 10 gymnasts in Georgia. While his stop at LSU was his first collegiate stop, he was no stranger to LSU athletics. During his time, he tutored future LSU greats Abbey Burns, Kim and Kerry Descalopoulos, all natives of Georgia, during a stint with the Atlanta School of Gymnastics.

During his time in the state of Georgia, he coached six Level 10 national champions on the floor exercise and helped place five athletes on the national team. Ogletree has also coached at the American Classic and U.S. Classic national meets.

From 1980-82, Ogletree was a gymnast at the University of Georgia. He later graduated from Georgia State with a bachelor of science degree in education in 1992.

Ogletree is married to the former Jill Hickok. The couple has two children, Bridget, 12, and Jake, 10.

2005 SEASON REVIEW

LSU Finishes Ninth at the NCAA Championships

The Tiger gymnastics team maintained its presence among the nation's top-10, placing ninth at the NCAA Championships in Auburn, Ala., with a score of 195.800. The finish marked the fourth straight year, and the 17th time in program history, that LSU has finished among the nation's top 10.

Four Earn All-America Honors

LSU ran its streak of consecutive years with at least one All-America performer to 13, as the four Tigers earned All-America honors at the 2005 NCAA Championships. April Burkholder led all Tiger performers earning All-America status on each of the four events and in the all-around. She was named a first-team selection on the vault, floor and in the all-around and was a second-team honoree on the bars and beam. Annie Gagnon and Lisa Rennie were each recognized as first-team selections on the bars, while Terin Martinjak was named a second-team honoree on the beam.

Rennie, Burkholder Post Top-10 Finishes During Individual Event Finals

By virtue of earning first-team All-America honors April Burkholder (vault and floor), Lisa Rennie (bars) and Annie Gagnon (bars) each qualified to compete in the individual event finals at the NCAA Championships. Burkholder turned in the top finish of the evening, placing third on the vault with a 9.8875 average. She also placed 13th on the floor after scoring a 9.2625. Rennie posted the Tigers' other top-10 finish, placing ninth on the bars with a 9.8250. Gagnon scored a 9.3375 on the event to finish 11th overall.

Tigers win NCAA Northeast Regional Title

A sweep of the meet's team and individual honors catapulted the Tigers to the 2005 NCAA Northeast Regional Championship in Durham, N.H. LSU tallied a 197.125 to knock off No. 10 Oklahoma, No. 15 Arkansas, New Hampshire, Pittsburgh and Rutgers and secure its third regional title in the last four years and the ninth in program history. The Tigers turned in meet-best marks of 49.475 on the vault, 49.450 on the floor, 49.150 on the beam and 49.050 on the bars. Top individual honors went to April Burkholder, Nicki Butler and Ashleigh Clare-Kearney on the vault (9.950), Annie Gagnon on the bars (9.950), Burkholder, Kelly Phelan and Lisa Rennie on the beam (9.850) and Burkholder on the floor (9.975) and in the all-around (39.575).

LSU Staff Sweeps Region Coaching Awards

LSU's coaching staff swept the 2005 NCAA Central Region awards as D-D Breaux was named the Coach of the Year and assistants Bob Moore and Philip Ogletree were named the Co-Assistant Coaches of the Year. In 2005, Breaux saw her Tigers win the NCAA Northeast Regional title, earn their first-ever No. 1 national ranking and record their best finish at the SEC Championships (second) in 10 years, all while posting 26-7 overall record. Moore, primarily responsible for the vault, guided LSU to four of the top-10 vault scores in school history. Individually, he coached April Burkholder to both All-SEC and All-America honors on the event while Burkholder, Nicki Butler and Ashleigh Clare-Kearney each won a share of the regional crown. Ogletree, the Tigers' bar coach, led a trio of athletes, in Burkholder, Annie Gagnon and Lisa Rennie, to All-America honors on the event, while Rennie was also named an All-SEC selection and Gagnon won the NCAA Northeast Regional crown.

Accolades Abound for Burkholder

For the second straight season April Burkholder has been named both the SEC and NCAA Central Region Gymnast of the Year. The Houston native won a total of seven all-around crowns and 21 individual event titles throughout the year, including her second straight regional all-around title. In addition, Burkholder posted perfect 10.00's on three of the four events (vault, beam and floor) and turned in 27 scores of 9.900 or higher.

LSU Finishes Second at SEC Championships

The Tigers tallied an impressive 196.975 at the SEC Championships, but it wasn't enough to hold off eventual champion, Georgia, who used a 49.325 on the beam in the final rotation to secure the victory with a 197.250. Despite the narrow defeat, LSU's second-place finish marked the team's highest at the conference championships since the 1995 season, when they also finished second overall.

Breaux Named SEC Coach of the Year

After guiding the Tigers to one of the most successful regular seasons in school history, head coach D-D Breaux was named the SEC Coach of the Year in a vote by her peers. Breaux guided LSU to a 24-4 regular season record, a mark that included a 10-meet win streak as well as 15 wins over top-25 opponents. The conference honor marks the sixth of Breaux's career.

Burkholder Named SEC Gymnast of the Year, Again

For the second consecutive season April Burkholder was named the SEC's Gymnast of the Year in a vote by league coaches. Burkholder is just the second athlete in conference history to ever win the award on more than one occasion.

Trio Earns All-SEC Accolades

A trio of Tigers, in April Burkholder, Nicki Butler and Lisa Rennie, each earned All-SEC honors for their performances at the 2005 conference championships in Duluth, Ga. Burkholder landed on the conference team for the third straight year, garnering first-team accolades for her third-place finish in the all-around (39.525), second-place showing on the vault (9.900) and third-place effort on the bars (9.900). Butler and Rennie were each named to the conference's second team as Butler finished fourth in the all-around and Rennie tied for third on the bars (9.900).

Tigers Earn First Ever No. 1 National Ranking

Head coach D-D Breaux guided the Tigers to their first-ever No. 1 national ranking in 2005, a position they held for two separate weeks over the course of the year. The Tigers first topped the charts during the week of Feb. 21, posting a regional qualifying score (RQS) of 196.575. They then slipped to second and fourth, respectively, in successive weeks before regaining the No. 1 position during the week of March 15 with a RQS of 196.990.

LSU Wraps Up Regular Season Ranked No. 1 on Floor

The Tigers wrapped up the regular season as the nation's top-ranked floor team, posting a RQS of 49.410. LSU also concluded the regular season ranked among the nation's top-4 on each of the other three events, finishing at No. 2 on the beam (49.335), No. 3 on the bars (49.265) and No. 4 on the vault (49.325).

Tigers Post School Record and NCAA-Best 197.850

LSU was unstoppable in its win over No. 9 Oklahoma on March 11, recording four event scores of 49.325 or higher en route to a school record 197.850. The mark bettered the Tigers' previous record of 197.675 set March 14, 2003, against Centenary and Rhode Island in Baton Rouge. It also tied the Tigers with Utah and UCLA for the top score in the nation in 2005.

LSU Shatters Beam Record

Behind five scores of 9.925 or better LSU also shattered the school record on the beam against Oklahoma, scoring a 2005 NCAA-best 49.725. The mark was a .250 improvement on the previous school record of 49.475 set first on March 6, 1999 and later matched on Feb. 28, 2003. Counting towards the team total was April Burkholder's 10.00, Terin Martinjak's 9.950 and a trio of 9.925's by Annie Gagnon, Kelly Phelan and Lisa Rennie.

Tigers Tally Top Marks on the Bars

LSU was a tough act to beat on the bars in 2005. In 12 of the Tigers' 16 meets a LSU athlete either won outright or shared top honors on the event with a teammate. Topping the wins list for the Tigers was Lisa Rennie with five individual titles. Annie Gagnon followed with four titles, twice sharing the honors with teammate April Burkholder. In addition, Nicki Butler won two titles and senior Katherine Hilton won one.

Home Sweet Home

The Tigers closed out the 2005 home schedule with a perfect 8-0 mark on March 18, defeating Centenary, 196.900-190.375. Throughout the season LSU recorded dual meet victories over Florida, Michigan State, Arkansas and Georgia, as well as a quad meet victory over Illinois-Chicago, New Hampshire and Western Michigan. The Tigers' perfect home slate marked their first since the 2002 season when they went 12-0 at the Pete Maravich Assembly Center.

Perfection

April Burkholder became the first athlete in LSU history to ever record two 10.00's in one meet, posting perfect marks on both the vault and beam in the Tigers' dual-meet victory over Oklahoma. The 10.00's marked her second and third of the season as she also posted a perfect score on the floor against Arkansas, on Feb. 4. Burkholder is the only Tiger athlete to ever record more than one 10.00 on the beam during her career as she notched her first during the 2004 season. She is also the only athlete in school history to have posted more than two perfect scores on the floor. The nine-time All-American has recorded a total of four in her time at LSU.

Rennie Perfecting the Balancing Act

Sophomore Lisa Rennie concluded the regular season ranked fourth nationally on the beam with a RQS of 9.930. The Las Vegas native was nearly unbeatable on the event during the regular season, winning five event titles while posting scores of 9.875 or better in each of those victories. In addition, she notched a career-high 9.975 in her win at Texas Woman's.

A Swinging Success

Once again, senior Annie Gagnon was exceptional on the bars of the Tigers in 2005. The Montreal, Quebec, native won a total of four bar titles during the season, including the NCAA Northeast Regional crown (9.950). She concluded the regular season ranked No. 9 nationally with an RQS of 9.895 before wrapping up her career by earning first-team All-America honors on the event.

Rennie Rocks the Bars

Lisa Rennie also saw tremendous success on the bars in 2005. The sophomore earned both All-SEC and All-America honors on the event after finishing the regular season tied with Gagnon at No. 9 nationally (9.895). In addition, Rennie won a team-best five bars titles during the season and notched scores of

9.850 or higher on 11 different occasions, including a career-high 9.950 against Oklahoma.

Counting on Clare-Kearney

In her inaugural season with the Tigers Ashleigh Clare-Kearney established herself as one of the Tigers' premier performers on both the vault and floor. The freshman from Manchester, Conn., won 11 individual event titles in 2005, claiming six on the vault and five on the floor. She finished the regular season ranked sixth in the country on floor and ninth on the vault with RQSs of 9.920 and 9.910, respectively. Clare-Kearney proved to be remarkably consistent after hitting her stride at the Michigan State meet on Jan. 28. From that point on, Clare-Kearney recorded scores of 9.800 or better on 29 of her 33 routines.

Phelan Claims First Career All-Around Title

Behind a then career-best 39.400 effort, Kelly Phelan won the first all-around title of her collegiate career against Arkansas on Feb. 4. In taking the all-around crown, the Orlando, Fla., native also finished among the top three on both the beam and floor, placing third on the beam with a 9.875 and tying teammate Ashleigh Clare-Kearney for third on the floor with a 9.900.

Dynamic Debut

Ashleigh Clare-Kearney couldn't have asked for a better collegiate debut in the all-around at Texas Woman's on March 13. as the Manchester, Conn., native won the individual overall title with an impressive 39.525 effort. The score ranked as the fourth-best by a Tiger and the seventh-best in the SEC in 2005. Clare-Kearney also posted event wins on the floor (9.900) and vault (9.875) against the Pioneers, and turned in career-highs of 9.875 on both the bars and beam.

Tigers Garner SEC Gymnst of the Week Honors

Four times during the season a LSU athlete earned SEC Gymnast of the Week honors from the conference office. All-American April Burkholder was selected three times, earning the distinction during the weeks of Jan. 25, March 15 and March 22, while sophomore Kelly Phelan was recognized during the week of Feb. 15.
