The rebuilding of the LSU program is nearing completion under John Brady. Now the task is to sustain the success and plan for the future of the program under the coach in his eighth season at the helm of the Tigers.

Unfortunate circumstances cost the Tigers a chance to shine in the postseason last year. After starting 17-4, the Tiger squad found itself having to play three, four and at times five freshmen on the floor against SEC squads much more experienced. But through it all, some hard lessons were learned and the freshmen are now experienced sophomores ready to blend with a couple of veteran seniors who have seen just about everything in their three years. Throw in another highly talented and anticipated recruiting class and some changes made in the coaching staff and Brady is ready to take the next step in sustaining the winning cycle that is building at LSU.

It's all be part of Brady's plan of rebuilding the LSU program since he came to Baton Rouge. He didn't come here with a plan that just looked good on paper. It was a practical and sensible plan that gave the LSU program the direction to go and the chance to shine again.

When Brady arrived on campus in March 1997 and was given the job of rebuilding the program, he knew he would have the chance to mold the program from the ground up and build a foundation based on responsibility and accountability. There were dreams of building a program where the players would take responsibility for their actions and make people proud of what they were trying to accomplish, both on and off the floor.

Brady's plan isn't just taking place on a hard wood floor in the Maravich Center. He has worked hard to show the public that the athletic and academic pursuits of the LSU players should be challenged to the fullest. All the while, he was also making sure the players understood that the methods and rules of the program would make them not only better, but better students able to adapt to the outside world once school was completed.

That's part of the reason that LSU basketball is not only a success on the court, but in the classroom as well. Last spring, every scholarship players passed every course hour taken and the team GPA was just over 3.0, the highest in years. Three student-athletes made the Dean's List, six had 3.0 averages or above and the five members of the freshman class averaged 35 hours and completed their first year with an average GPA of 2.87.

In his first seven seasons, besides the 20 players who have qualified for the SEC Academic Honor Roll and the 11 graduates, Brady has coached the SEC Player of the Year (Stromile Swift-2000), two SEC Freshmen of the Year (Torriss Bright - 2000; Brandon Bass - 2004), plus 10 selections on the All-SEC teams.

All that has been a part of the foundation of LSU basketball under John Brady. The 50-year-old Brady enters his eighth season having taken the Tigers a long way both on and off the court.

What has been the result? The Tigers program is solid both athletically and academically. The top athletes in the country are seriously putting LSU at the top of their lists and Brady is earning the respect of his peers in the league. The plan to bring back the success of the LSU program has now shifted to the future of keeping the program at the top of the SEC for years to come.

Prior to becoming the head coach at LSU, Brady served six years as the head coach at Samford. He also served as assistant coach at Mississippi State and UNO prior to taking the head position at the Birmingham school.

About EA Sports

EA Sports has lost its first two exhibition contests, 71-59, to Kansas State and, 69-62 to Providence. Against Kansas State, Daniel Watts led EA Sports with 13 points, seven rebounds and three assists on six-of-12 shooting. In the game, EA Sports shot 44.9 percent, 22.2 from the arc and 13-of-15 free throws with 17 assists and 23 turnovers. Against Providence, Mark Green had a team high 19 points and five steals, while Watts had 16 points, 13 rebounds and four assists. Chuck Roberts had 12 points. EA Sports shot 42.6 percent from the floor, 36.4 from the arc and 6-of-9 free throws with 18 assists and 16 turnovers.

The Pete Maravich Center - Under New Management

On July 1, 2004, the management of the Maravich Center came under the direction of the LSU Athletics Department as the building's control was transferred from the University. The building, preparing to host its 34th season of men's basketball, is now under going a multi-year refurbishing to continue it as one of the great basketball venues in the South.

It's a renovation that began two years ago with new television lights that can be turned on and off to allow more freedom with player introductions and special ceremonies.

It continued last season with a brand new roof surface that will serve for many years in the future. Also the outside concourse windows of the building now feature the Tiger mascot running

around the building that can be seen for miles as people enter the city on the Mississippi River Bridge.

This year, basketball fans will see a completely redesigned concourse with video and graphic displays, renovated concession stands and video kiosks showcasing the best of the sports that play in the building - men's and women's basketball, volleyball and gymnastics.

The concourse is divided into four quadrants - Pete Maravich Pass, The Walk of Champions, Heroes Hall and Midway of Memories.

There is still more to come. At the close of this basketball season, the seats in the arena will be replaced, the acoustical paneling around the top of the arena will be replaced and handicap accessible seating is added at new locations. Also planned are upgraded restroom facilities and updates to the heating and air conditioning systems.

The Tigers, who played their 500th game in the building last season, are 372-132 in the building and has won 40 games the last three seasons in the building and at least 12 games five of the last six seasons. LSU is 192-26 in non-conference games and has not lost a regular season non-conference home game since Dec. 1, 1997 against Lamar, a streak of 53 games. The Tigers are 55-3 in the John Brady era in non-conference contests. That streak includes two wins over Arizona, including a win when the Wildcats were No. 1 and last year's win over Utah.

LSU Still Perfect for Brady When Scoring 80

The Tigers enter the season still perfect for the Brady tenure when the Tigers score 80 points or more ... LSU is now 42-0 when scoring 80 or above, 3-0 last year ... On another scoring note, the Tigers are 40-16 in the Brady era when scoring 70-79 points in a game.

The Number 60

The Tigers had much better success last year when scoring in the 60s last season, a number that for many years dating back to the late 1980s had been a stumbling block for LSU ... LSU was 9-5 last year when scoring between 60-69 points and the Tigers are now much closer to even in the Brady era at 31-34.

Paid Attendance

The Tigers have recorded an upswing in paid attendance at the Maravich Center the last three seasons, averaging 9,355. That represents an increase of 15.4 percent since the 2000-01 season when LSU's paid average was 8,106. LSU's paid average was 8,534 in 2002 and 8,687 in 2003 ... The 9,355 is the second best average of the John Brady era behind the 10,549 average paid crowd during the 2000 NCAA Sweet 16 season ... The Tigers had three home game paid crowds over 12,000 in SEC play against Mississippi State, Auburn and Kentucky.

Losing, Winning Last Year -- On the Perimeter

It became obvious last year that LSU's perimeter shooting was a vital factor in the team's wins and losses in the January-February period prior to the Jaime Lloreda defection. In losses to Mississippi State, Ole Miss and South Carolina (Jan. 17-24), the Tigers were just 30-of-88 from the perimeter (34.1 percent) and just 13-of-53 (24.5 percent) from three-point range.

But in LSU's five-game winning streak last year against Georgia, Alabama, Tennessee, Arkansas and Florida (Jan. 28 to Feb. 14), the Tigers were 111-of-229 on the perimeter (48.5 percent) and 29-of-73 from three-point range (39.7 percent).

As a team last year, the Tigers hit 44.1 percent from the field (656-1487) and 33.6 percent (168-500) from the arc. It was the second lowest three-point percentage of the Brady era.

Looking Back at Some Brady Era Stats That Staff Wants to Improve

One thing Coach Brady has noted is that he wants his Tigers to be able to take more shots of quality than the LSU team did a year ago. Last year, LSU averaged 51.3 shot attempts a game,

The Tigers assists and steals were down last year, with 346 assists and 176 steals compared to 2003 -- 515 assists, 255 steals; 2002 -- 467 assists, 280 steals; 2000 -- 503 assists, 313 steals.

As a team last year, LSU shot just 33.6 percent from three-point range, making 168 treys after making the past four years 215, 204, 194 and 196 treys.

Brandon Bass

*2004 Pre-Season Coaches All-SEC First Team

LSU sophomore forward Brandon Bass underwent arthroscopic left knee surgery Oct. 1 to repair a lateral meniscus tear. The surgery was performed following an MRI on the knee after Bass disclosed discomfort in the knee.

Bass was the SEC Freshman of the Year after the 2003-04 season in which he averaged 12.8 points and 7.4 rebounds a game. He was also on the Collegeinsider.com All-Freshman team, a second team Freshman All-America pick by Rivals.com and the 2004 Dick Vitale SEC Diaper Dandy. The Baton Rouge product also had good success in the classroom, earning a spot on the SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll.

Bass returned to practice this past week and practiced all week in 90 percent of the drills and participated in the 36-minute scrimmage on Saturday morning in the auxiliary gymnasium. His status remains questionable for the Tuesday exhibition game pending how the knee reacts after the scrimmage and consultation with team doctors. Bass may be held out pending the Tigers' second exhibition game on Nov. 15.

Darrel Mitchell

The junior from St. Martinville may well be, at least for his first two years, one of the most consistent three-point shooters in the country. In two seasons, Mitchell is 109-of-259 from the arc, 42.1 percent, after making 42.4 percent of his attempts in 2003 and 41.9 percent in 2004.

The difference in the attempts by year and the lack of difference in the percentage is remarkable as Mitchell made 42-of-99 attempts his first year and last year, 67-of-160.

Mitchell averaged 11.9 points per game as he started 17-of-29 games, including the last 12.

Streak at Home vs. Louisiana Schools at 47; Will Go on Line Early

The streak of home wins against Louisiana schools is almost 16 years old and it will be put to the test in LSU's first three games, including the two in the LSU Louisiana Classic Nov. 19 and 21. The last time LSU lost to a Louisiana school at the Maravich Center goes all the way back to Dec. 6, 1988, when Louisiana Tech beat LSU, 111-109, in overtime ... Two nights later, LSU narrowly defeated McNeese State, 91-89, to start the present streak.

This year LSU will play Tulane, either Louisiana Tech or Louisiana Lafayette, UNO, Northwestern State and McNeese State in the Maravich Center.

LSU Players Featured in Local Billboard Campaign

Members of the LSU men's basketball team are featured on a city-wide billboard advertising campaign to let fans know that the 2004-05 season is just around the corner.

As part of LSU's "It's Hoops Time" marketing campaign for the new season, LSU players Xavier Whipple, Antonio Hudson, Darrel Mitchell and Brandon Bass are featured on 10 Lamar Advertising billboards across Baton Rouge. The players are pictured individually in shots in which the players were allowed to show their personality matched up with slogans created by the LSU Promotions and Marketing Office and LSU Director of Publications Jason Feirman.

Whipple, the Tigers' senior point guard is making a no look pass with the slogan "cool whip," while forward and 2004 SEC Freshman of the Year Bass is squeezing the air out of a basketball with a net draped over his neck with the slogan, "get hooked on BASSketball." Hudson, LSU's

senior guard is featured smiling, holding the basketball toward the camera urging fans to "have a ball ..." with Mitchell, who was one of the league leaders in three-point shooting last season, in his billboard asking the fans "you wanna geaux?"

"We believe that when fans come to know the personalities on this team," said LSU Associate Athletic Director for External Affairs Herb Vincent, "they will come to the Maravich Center and see them play. This is just one way we are reaching out to bring new fans to LSU basketball."

While this is not the first time that billboards have been used to promote LSU basketball, it is the first time the men's basketball players have been prominently featured.

"This is just another example of the great support we are getting from our administration in promoting men's basketball this season," said LSU coach John Brady.
