Coach Matt McMahon has built his

LSU Coach Matt McMahon has built his program around five core values that define his approach both on and off the court: hard work, unselfishness, toughness, accountability and joy.

Those values were among the first principles he shared when introduced as the 25th head coach in program history on March 22, 2022, and they continue to guide every aspect of LSU Basketball today.

Now entering his fourth season at the helm, Coach McMahon leads a Tigers team energized by a strong recruiting class that blends proven transfers with talented freshmen. The 2025-26 squad is poised to build on the foundation laid in recent years, with an emphasis on chemistry, relentless effort, and steady progress.

This current group thrives on its chemistry, playing for each other with toughness, accountability, and an unselfish spirit. Their joy for the game is evident every time they take the floor, uniting players, coaches, and fans alike.

Guided by those five core principles, the Tigers have continued to strengthen the program's foundation, setting the stage for growth in 2025-26. With added talent and depth at all positions, this year's roster is built to take the next step forward.

Player development remains a cornerstone in the Matt McMahon LSU basketball program.

Robert Miller III enters his sophomore season ready to build on flashes of promise from his freshman year. Over the summer, Miller has committed himself to individual skill development and strength training to add both power and polish his game.

Jalen Reed returns for his redshirt junior season after an early December ACL injury cut short what had been a breakout year. Known for his drive and work ethic, Reed attacked his rehab this summer showing steady progress toward a full return.

The summer has given new players valuable time to work closely with the coaching staff and strength and conditioning coach Mike Chatman, focusing on improving their skills and physical readiness for the long season ahead.

The program has already shown it can take measurable steps forward under Matt McMahon's leadership. In 2024, LSU advanced to postseason play after back-to-back wins over No. 11 South Carolina, 64-63, in Columbia and then a 75-74 win over No. 17 Kentucky in BR.

Last season, LSU showed what it was capable of, beating Florida State in its SEC/ACC Challenge game, winning a triple-overtime win at the Greenbrier over UCF, a road victory at Kansas State, and an amazing rally in the final

minute to win at Oklahoma.

McMahon's track record of building winning cultures was firmly established during his seven seasons at Murray State. Coach McMahon led the Racers to a record of 154-67 (.697) including: 93 OVC regular season wins, winning 75 percent of league games.

During his tenure, he has also coached multiple all-Americans and all-conference players. The most notable was Ja Morant, who went on to become the 2020 NBA Rookie of the Year.

Under McMahon the Racers won regular season league titles in 2018, 2019, 2020 and 2022 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2018, 2019 and 2022.

In his final season at Murray State in 2021-22, McMahon coached OVC Player of the Year KJ Williams and two other first-teamers (Tevin Brown, Justice Hill). In addition, McMahon was named the league's Coach of the Year.

McMahon's Racers, in 2021-22, were just the sixth team in league history to go undefeated. Murray State then won the league tournament to advance to the NCAA Tournament where the Racers defeated San Francisco in the opening round.

The 2021-22 team was one of seven teams to win 30 or more games that season and led the nation in win percentage at 91.2 percent.

The 2018-19 team won 28 games and made its mark in the NCAA Tournament when the 12th-seeded Racers won their fourth all-time tourney game over No. 5 seed Marquette.

Morant that year was named the OVC POY, leading Division I in assists and earning first-team All-America honors. In the NCAA Tournament win over Marquette, Morant posted a triple double of 17 points, 11 rebounds and 16 assists as he became the eighth player to record a triple double in the tournament.

He was drafted second overall in the 2019 NBA draft by the Memphis Grizzlies.

Prior to being named head coach, he was a key part of Coach Steve Prohm's staff as assistant at Murray State as the Racers won a pair of Ohio

Valley Conference championships, a CollegelInsider.com Tournament championship and an appearance in the NIT. He was part of a staff that won 104 games from 2011-15.

PRIOR TO MURRAY STATE
Coach
McMahon has had

success in college basketball since his days as a player at Appalachian State.

Known as an excellent shooter and tough competitor, he played on three Southern Conference regular season title teams in 1998, 1999 and 2000. He earned All-Tournament honors in 1999. The Mountaineers won the SoCon Tournament in 2000 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

He played in 117 career games under coach Buzz Peterson and made 135 three-pointers, graduating in 2000.

His coaching career began immediately at Appalachian State as assistant under Houston Fancher in 2000-01. He would rejoin Peterson's staff as a graduate assistant coach at Tennessee before returning to ASU in 2002 as assistant and later associate head coach, where he stayed until the end of the 2009-10 season. A year at UNC Wilmington (2010-11) as assistant coach set the stage for his journey to Murray State, starting first as an assistant in the 2011-12 season and then as head coach prior to the 2015-16 season.

Coach McMahon and his wife Mary, a former standout for the Furman women's basketball team, have three children – Maris, Mason and Mabry.

NOTABLES

*LSU has scored 90-plus points in each of the first three games – 96 versus Tarleton State, 93 versus New Orleans, 98 vs. FIU and 107 against Alcorn State. The last time the Tigers started with four straight 90-points games was the 1990-91 season when Shaquille O'Neal was a sophomore and LSU scored 90-plus in the first nine games.

*LSU through three games is averaging 45.3 rebounds a game compared to 29.3 for opponents. LSU has a +64 combined rebound advantage in those four games and a rebound margin of +16.00, which as of Wednesday morning was fourth in the SEC.

*LSU has three players averaging at least 6.0 rebounds a game through the first four games – Marquel Sutton 9.8, Pablo Tamba 6.5 and Mike Nwoko 6.0. Sutton is ranked second in the league in rebound average.

*Sutton is the first player at LSU to put together three consecutive double doubles since Ben Simmons ran off four straight in February-March 2016.

*Mike Nwoko's 12 baskets in Tuesday night's game ties the superlative mark for most field goals by an SEC player so far this season, as of Wednesday AM.

*Tuesday marked the 400th non-conference game LSU men's basketball has played in the 55 years of the Maravich Center. LSU is 351-49 in non-conference games.

*Max Mackinnon is expected to play his 100th career game Friday night for LSU. Mackinnon played 63 games at Elon in 2022-23 and 2023-24, 32 games at Portland in 2024-25 and four to start the season here at LSU. He has 93 starts in his first 99 games going into tonight.

OMAHA SERIES

Although LSU baseball fans know the city of Omaha well enough, this will be the first basketball meeting between the Tigers and Omaha on Friday evening.

OMAHA UPDATES

LSU's Marquel Sutton knows all about the Omaha Mavericks as he played three years for the school, leading them last year to the regular season Summit League championship, the tournament championship and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament.

Omaha was 22-13 a year ago, 13-3 in the Summit, winning the tournament championship and the NCAA automatic berth, 85-75, against St. Thomas. Sutton had 22 points and 18 rebounds in the contest. Omaha faced No. 2 seed St. John's in the opening round.

Omaha is 2-3 on the season with wins in its last two ball games against Southern Utah, 90-85, on Saturday and Wednesday night against Concordia (96-80).

Chris Crutchfield, is in his fourth year as head coach at Omaha. The former player for Omaha in the early 90s, has served as assistant coach for several schools including eight years on Lon Krueger's staff at Oklahoma.

PETE MARAVICH ASSEMBLY CENTER

The Tigers opened their 55th season of play in the building in 2025-26 with four wins after going 11-7 in the venue last season. LSU is 642-222 in the building. LSU is 351-49 (87.7 percent) in non-conference games.

LSU was 9-0 in non-conference games in the Maravich Center in the 2024-25 season.

The building was originally known as the LSU Assembly Center from its opening in late 1971 until August 1988 when the building was renamed by government legislation following the untimely death of star LSU player, "Pistol" Pete Maravich.

The Maravich Center is the fourth oldest continuous use basketball arena in the league having hosted its first game in January 1972. Memorial Gym at Vanderbilt opened in 1952, Stegeman Coliseum at UGA in 1964 and Coleman Coliseum at Alabama opened in 1968.

THIRD TIME MCMAHON'S TIGERS HOLD OPPONENTS SHOOTING UNDER 30 PERCENT

LSU's defensive ability was on display against New Orleans (11/10) as the Tigers held UNO to just 29.9 percent from the field (20-of-67), the third time in Matt McMahon's tenure at LSU, that the Tiger defense kept a team from reaching the 30.0 percent mark from the field.

The three games in the McMahon era:

- 1 25.4% (15-59) by Texas A&M (at College Station), 1/6/24
- 2 25.9% (14-54) by Akron (at Cayman Islands), 11/22/22
- 3 29.9% (20-67) by UNO (at Baton Rouge), 11/10/25

LSU is 26-5 in the McMahon era when opponents shoot under 40 percent.

LSU THREE TIMES OVER 50 PERCENT FROM FIELD

The Tigers were over 50 percent from the field for the third time this year, all wins, as LSU shot 55.6 percent (35-of-63) in the win over Alcorn State (11/18).

The Tigers are 131-of-240 for the season or 54.6 percent, which ranks second in the league.

LSU is 18-4 in the Matt McMahon era when shooting 50 percent or better in a game.

It was a record opener when LSU finished with a shooting percentage school mark of 71.7 percent for the game against Tarleton State (11/5) on Nov.

5. LSU was 33-of-46 in the contest, sparked by the 16-of-21 in the first half of the game.
It marked the third time that an LSU basketball team has shot 70 percent or better in a basketball game:

71.7% -- vs. Tarleton State (in Baton Rouge) – 11/5/25

71.4% -- vs. Clemson (in Charlotte) – 12/20/69

70.3% -- vs. Centenary (in Baton Rouge) – 1/15/03

According to our content manager Todd Politz, the game also set a record for best two-point field goal percentage (making 25-of-28), topping the mark of a game just the previous season:

89.3% -- vs. Tarleton State (in Baton Rouge) – 11/5/25

87.2% -- vs. Mississippi Valley (in Baton Rouge) – 12/29/24

75.8 -- vs. Memphis (in Lake Buena Vista, Florida) – 11/29/13

ON THE REBOUND SIDE

The New Orleans game (11/10) was the third time in the Matt McMahon era that LSU has pulled down 50 plus rebounds:

Also unusual, was that both Marquel Sutton and Pablo Tamba's double doubles were unique in that they both each had the same number of points and rebounds – Sutton 15-15, Tamba 10-10. That was the fourth time in the Coach McMahon era that two players had 10 or more rebounds in the same game:

JALEN REED CONTINUES STRONG COMEBACK

Through four games, Tiger redshirt junior Jalen Reed, has continued to become more and more comfortable on the floor.

So far, he has played 71:41, scored 44 points with 23 rebounds. He has three double figure games of 11, 15 and 10 points with Reed shooting 16-of-25 from the field (64.0%) and making 3-of-5 three-point field goals.

Reed is returning from ACL surgery, an injury suffered in early December 2024 against Florida State.

Ahead of projections, he has been able to see the floor in a minutes restricted basis, playing 18:29 against Tarleton State (11/5), after a similar amount in the exhibition with UCF. As of now, the game minutes that trainer Grant Smith and strength and conditioning coach Mike Chatman allow Reed are expected to continue to slowly increase.

His first points came in the opener at the 14:49 mark of the first half of the Nov. 5 game on a fast break layup in the paint off a pass from Dedan Thomas Jr. Reed finished with 11 points on 3-of-4 shootings, with one trey, an assist and two steals.

MIKE NWOKO LIVING UP TO WHAT HAS BEEN SEEN IN PRACTICE

The number are stacking up and junior Mississippi State transfer Mike Nwoko is showing the consistency and ability that he showed during the summer and preseason practice in the fall that excited those that were able to watch the Tigers practice.

In his first four games, Nwoko has averaged 20.3 points per game and 6.0 rebounds, leading the league in field goal percentage (32-of-41, 78.0 percent) and third in scoring percentage.

Against New Orleans (11/10), Nwoko made 9-of-13 attempts and 4-of-5 at the line for a career number of 22 points. This past Monday, he came very close to breaking the 30-point barrier, with 29 points on 12-of-15 field goal shooting and 5-of-6 at the line. He just missed a double double with nine boards (six offensive) in 19:52 of playing time.

The 12 field goals made tied a league best through play on Tuesday night.

Of Nwoko, Coach Matt McMahon said on Tuesday night: "Mike has been fantastic on the offensive end; six offensive rebounds tonight really stood out. As we've talked in here in the last couple of months, I've been really pleased with his skill level. He's more skilled down in the post than we had anticipated coming in. He's worked hard in the player development program. You see him scoring jump hooks with each hand. At the end of the day, he's 6-10, 260 (pounds). I think he's using his physicality in a great fashion."

MARQUEL SUTTON

It has been since February-March of 2016 that an LSU player has posted three consecutive double doubles for the Tigers and Marquel Sutton has a chance to equal Ben Simmons' streak of double doubles from that time period. Simmons had four consecutive in February-March 2016, after having a seven-game consecutive double double streak in November-December 2015.

Sutton is averaging 15.8 points a game and 9.8 rebounds, this despite having just two rebounds in the opening game of the season against Tarleton State (11/5).

Sutton is shooting 21-of-43 from the field (48.8 percent). He has made multiple three-pointers in each of the four games, having made 11-of-26 (42.3 percent).

The Tulsa, Oklahoma product is averaging just under 30 minutes a game at 29.8 minutes per game (119:17).

PABLO TAMBA

The UC-Davis transfer has started all four games and is averaging 6.0 points and 6.5 rebounds a game. He has played an average of 19.8 minutes per game and is shooting 10-of-15 from the field.

But as Tamba only contributed four points against Alcorn, it was his overall play that earned the praise of Coach McMahon after the game as he had a +/- total of 25 after the game.

"He plays every possession like it's his last, all he cares about is winning, he's an unbelievable teammate, and he can guard every position on the floor. He's just a joy to coach every day because he's going to give you everything he's got."

Tamba had a 10-10 double double in the second game of the season against New Orleans (11/10).

THE TIGERS AT THE POINT

LSU has found itself a strong start point guard in UNLV transfer Dedan Thomas Jr., who has 28 assists and just six turnovers in the first four games of the season. Thomas had eight assists against both Tarleton State and New Orleans and six assists in each of the last two games. Against Alcorn, he had six assists and no turnovers.

Thomas has made 17-of-32 from the field (53.1 percent) and 21-of-23 from three throw line (91.3 percent).

Thomas has three double figure games to date, scoring 16 versus Tarleton State (11/5) and 16 in the most recent contest against Alcorn.

Thomas is also averaging 3.8 rebounds a game.

For his career, Thomas is 75 points shy of 1,000 career points. He has 324 career assists and just 130 turnovers, a 2.49 assist-to-turnover ratio.

Jalen Reece, a freshman, handles the backup point guard role and has played almost 53 minutes this season in four games with nine assists. He is averaging 3.8 points a game.

ROBERT MILLER III MAKING CONTRIBUTIONS AGAIN FOR TIGERS

Sophomore Robert Miller III, one of the two returnees on this team along with Jalen Reed, has played a good role for LSU off the bench, averaging 21.3 minutes and scoring at 8.0 points a game with 4.0 rebounds.

He has made 7-of-11 field goals, but he has also found himself getting to the free throw line, making 18-of-22 through the opening four contests. For the entire season a year ago, Miller made 21-of-33 free throw attempts (63.6 percent).

THE LSU COACHING TIES

As Coach Matt McMahon enters his fourth season at LSU, there are a lot of familiar faces on the LSU coaching staff, including some of those who donned the purple and gold during their college careers.

Ronald Dupree -- General Manager -- a first time position for LSU basketball ... Dupree, recently inducted to the LSU Athletics Hall of Fame, was an 11-year pro and longtime NBA scout, executive with the Milwaukee Bucks ... Played at LSU (1999-03), member Sweet 16 team in 2000 and is ninth in career scoring (1,726 points) ... Scouting work contributed to 2021 Bucks NBA title.

Jalen Courtney-Williams -- Assistant Coach -- Second year on the LSU staff ... Three-year letterman at LSU (2010-13); played in 61 games ... Came to LSU from Creighton where he served for three seasons, including a Sweet 16 year in 2024 ... Hosts the popular podcast "No Timeouts" on LSU+ and various podcast locations.

Tasmin Mitchell -- Assistant Coach/Director of Personnel -- In his ninth year as member of the LSU staff; second stint as Assistant Coach beginning in 2025-26 season ... One of the most popular former LSU Basketball stars; member of 2006 NCAA Final Four team ... Third all-time in scoring at LSU with 1,989 points (14.5 ppg average); sixth in rebounds (950), school record 4,692 minutes; 136 career starts ... One of three Tigers with 1,000 points, 500 rebounds, 200 assists and 100 steals.

David Patrick, the Associate Head Coach, is also familiar to Tiger fans in the second year of his second stint in the program. He served as Assistant/Associate Coach from 2012-16 during the Johnny Jones head coaching tenure. **Vince Walden**, who was at Texas A&M last year, and fourth year assistant, **Casey Long**, completes the on floor coaching staff.

IMPORTANT WORDS

Coach Matt McMahon has had his five core value words since he arrived at LSU: hard work, unselfishness, toughness, accountability and joy.

All five of those are a vital part of this program's DNA, but this year the players as a team have picked out three words that they want to be the standard for the LSU program. Those words are on a lot of the team shooting shirts and coaching shirts the team wears. Those words are:

THINGS TO WATCH

Some points to watch in the non-conference:

TURNOVERS -- LSU averaged 13.1 turnovers a game last season and will be looking to try to lower that number this season ... LSU had just five games with single digit miscues in 2024-25. LSU turned the ball over 419 times compared to 409 assists. The Tigers were 14th in turnover margin at -1.47 and 15th in assist-to-turnover ratio at 0.98.

So far one game in single digits for LSU, but turnovers are down one full point to 12.0.

THREE POINT SHOOTING -- A season ago, LSU made the third most three-point field goals in school history (250), but took 50 more shots than any LSU team had attempted to make those 250 (820) for a percentage of just 30.5 percent. The Tigers were 16th in the league in three-point percentage in 2024-25. LSU made the second most three-pointers in 2023-24 (256), but needed 103 less shots to achieve those makes.

LSU is making only seven a game, but averaging 34.1 percent after four games.

FREE THROWS -- The Tigers had their first game since 2022 when they failed to convert at least 50 percent of their free throw attempts and that was kind of how the free throw shooting went in 2024-25 as it was up and down, culminating in a 13-of-26 performance in the SEC Tournament game. LSU was 437-of-612 or 71.4 percent.

Tigers have made 104-of-130 free throws or 80 percent after four games.

WHAT MAKES THIS YEAR'S TEAM DIFFERENT?

There are several factors that offer the potential for this year's team to be a different LSU team in 2025-26:

AGE, MATURITY -- In 2023-24, the average age of the players was just over 19 ... In 2025-26, the average age is right around 22. In fact, as Coach McMahon said to some media, he had never celebrated a player's 24th birthday before. The roster has four freshmen (three from high school, one from the Israeli pro league), one sophomore, three juniors, two seniors, three 5th year seniors and a grad student.

ROSTER MANAGEMENT -- The Tigers put together the players that it feels will help them make the necessary strikes during this season. A larger, more physical frontcourt, wings that can shoot the three and a point guard that can be trusted to run the team, score the ball and distribute the basketball.

CONNECTIVITY AND CHEMISTRY -- This group of players that were good at their respective schools has blended together and understood the mission. Do what is necessary to make LSU relevant again in the SEC. They've accepted that mission that they have to work together and the chemistry shown in practice over the summer and preseason is something that coaches and attendees at practice have noticed quite quickly.

SONS OF THE FATHER

Two Tigers have fathers who also did well in the college basketball game in the past.

Jalen Reed's late father, Justin, starred at Ole Miss, where he was an All-America and the SEC Freshman of the Year in 2001. Justin Reed was an All-SEC selection in each of his four years at Ole Miss, guiding the Rebels to two NCAA Tournament wins en route to a first ever "Sweet 16" appearance for the Rebels. He was a second-round pick in the 2004 NBA Draft by the Boston Celtics and played for Boston and Minnesota in his NBA days. He passed away from cancer in 2017.

Point guard DJ Thomas Jr., is the son of UNLV star Dedan Thomas Sr. Senior played from 1991-94 at UNLV, He would earn honorable mention All-America honors and has his name throughout the UNLV record book.

Also, Robert Miller III is the son of a couple of former athletes. His dad, Robert Miller II, was an LSU defensive lineman in college, while his mom, Teana, earned All-America basketball honors at Tulane, also playing four years in the WNBA.

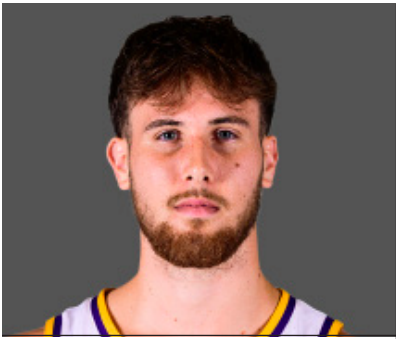

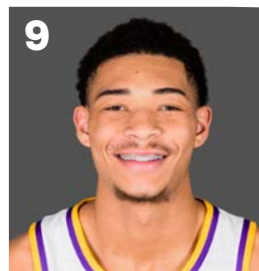
