4th Year at LSU · 11th Year as a Head Coach

LSU Coach Matt McMahon has built his program around five core values that define his approach both on and off the court: hard work, unselfishness, toughness, accountability and joy.

Those values were among the first principles he shared when introduced as the 25th head coach in program history on March 22, 2022, and they continue to guide every aspect of LSU Basketball today.

Now entering his fourth season at the helm, Coach McMahon leads a Tigers team energized by a strong recruiting class that blends proven transfers with talented freshmen. The 2025-26 squad is poised to build on the foundation laid in recent years, with an emphasis on chemistry, relentless effort, and steady progress.

This current group thrives on its chemistry, playing for each other with toughness, accountability, and an unselfish spirit. Their joy for the game is evident every time they take the floor, uniting players, coaches, and fans alike.

Guided by those five core principles, the Tigers have continued to strengthen the program's foundation, setting the stage for growth in 2025-26. With added talent and depth at all positions, this year's roster is built to take the next step forward.

Player development remains a cornerstone in the Matt McMahon LSU basketball program.

Robert Miller III enters his sophomore season ready to build on flashes of promise from his freshman year. Over the summer, Miller has committed himself to individual skill development and strength training to add both power and polish his game.

Jalen Reed returns for his redshirt junior season after an early December ACL injury cut short what had been a breakout year. Known for his drive and work ethic, Reed attacked his rehab this summer showing steady progress toward a full return.

The summer has given new players valuable time to work closely with the coaching staff and strength and conditioning coach Mike Chatman, focusing on improving their skills and physical readiness for the long season ahead.

The program has already shown it can take measurable steps forward under Matt McMahon's leadership. In 2024, LSU advanced to postseason play after back-to-back wins over No. 11 South Carolina, 64-63, in Columbia and then a 75-74 win over No. 17 Kentucky in BR.

Last season, LSU showed what it was capable of, beating Florida State in its SEC/ACC Challenge game, winning a triple-overtime win at the Greenbrier over UCF, a road victory at Kansas State, and an amazing rally in the final minute to win at Oklahoma.

McMahon's track record of building winning cultures was firmly established during his seven seasons at Murray State. Coach McMahon led the Racers to a record of 154-67 (.697) including: 93 OVC regular season wins, winning 75 percent of league games.

During his tenure, he has also coached multiple all-Americans and all-conference players. The most notable was Ja Morant, who went on to become the 2020 NBA Rookie of the Year.

Under McMahon the Racers won regular season league titles in 2018, 2019, 2020 and 2022 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2018, 2019 and 2022.

In his final season at Murray State in 2021-22, McMahon coached OVC Player of the Year KJ Williams and two other first-teamers (Tevin Brown, Justice Hill). In addition, McMahon was named the league's Coach of the Year.

McMahon's Racers, in 2021-22, were just the sixth team in league history to go undefeated. Murray State then won the league tournament to advance to the NCAA Tournament where the Racers defeated San Francisco in the opening round.

The 2021-22 team was one of seven teams to win 30 or more games that season and led the nation in win percentage at 91.2 percent.

The 2018-19 team won 28 games and made its mark in the NCAA Tournament when the 12th-seeded Racers won their fourth all-time tourney game over No. 5 seed Marquette.

Morant that year was named the OVC POY, leading Division I in assists and earning first-team All-America honors. In the NCAA Tournament win over Marquette, Morant posted a triple double of 17 points, 11 rebounds and 16 assists as he became the eighth player to record a triple double in the tournament.

He was drafted second overall in the 2019 NBA draft by the Memphis Grizzlies.

Prior to being named head coach, he was a key part of Coach Steve Prohm's staff as assistant at Murray State as the Racers won a pair of Ohio Valley Conference championships, a CollegelInsider.

com Tournament championship and an appearance in the NIT. He was part of a staff that won 104 games from 2011-15.

PRIOR TO MURRAY STATE

Coach McMahon has had success in college basketball since his days as a player at

Appalachian State.

Known as an excellent shooter and tough competitor, he played on three Southern Conference regular season title teams in 1998, 1999 and 2000. He earned All-Tournament honors in 1999. The Mountaineers won the SoCon Tournament in 2000 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

He played in 117 career games under coach Buzz Peterson and made 135 three-pointers, graduating in 2000.

His coaching career began immediately at Appalachian State as assistant under Houston Fancher in 2000-01. He would rejoin Peterson's staff as a graduate assistant coach at Tennessee before returning to ASU in 2002 as assistant and later associate head coach, where he stayed until the end of the 2009-10 season. A year at UNC Wilmington (2010-11) as assistant coach set the stage for his journey to Murray State, starting first as an assistant in the 2011-12 season and then as head coach prior to the 2015-16 season.

Coach McMahon and his wife Mary, a former standout for the Furman women's basketball team, have three children – Maris, Mason and Mabry.

NOTABLES

* LSU's 28 days between home games (Nov. 21 to Dec. 19) was the longest in-season time between home games since 30 days (played games Dec. 13 to Jan. 12) in 2005; prior to that, 29 in 1988.

* LSU is 28-0 under Coach McMahon when four or more different players score in double figures. LSU had four in double figures after Saturday's win versus SMU.

* Tigers went 4-1 on the swing away from the Maravich Center. Two wins at the Emerald Coast Championship, the win in the ACC/SEC Challenge game at Boston College, the loss to Texas Tech in Fort Worth and the win versus SMU in New Orleans.

* Against SMU, Tigers had three with double doubles – Marquel Sutton and Pablo Tamba with points-rebound doubles, while DJ Thomas Jr., had a points-assist double. It marked the first time an LSU team recorded three players with doubles since the first round of the NCAA championship on March 20, 2021 against St. Bonaventure.

* Dedan (DJ) Thomas Jr., upped his career high in assists to 12 against SMU, the first LSU player to record 12 assists in a game since Dec. 7, 2002 when Torris Bright had 12 for the Tigers against McNeese.

* For Matt McMahon the overtime win at BC makes the Tigers 3-0 in OT under his watch. Sixth straight OT win for LSU, dating back to 2020-21 season.

* After shooting 62.1 percent against SMU (12/13), the Tigers have now posted three games over 60.0 percent shooting this season. Overall, the Tigers have shot 50 percent or better in six games this season.

* LSU was also over 60 percent in the championship game of the Emerald Coast Classic (68.6 percent, 35-51). It was the second-best shooting percentage ever in a game away from Baton Rouge dating back to 1956-57 topped only by the 71.4 percent vs. Clemson on Dec. 20, 1969. LSU shot its all-time best percentage of 71.7 percent in the opener against Tarleton State (11/5).

* Monday's game with Prairie View starts an hour earlier than normal (6 p.m.) because it will be over the air on the SEC Network.

SOUTHEASTERN SERIES

This will be the 16th meeting of the schools with LSU having a 14-1 advantage. The game Southeastern won was actually the first one the teams played in 1966 in Baton Rouge with the Lions winning, 89-88.

The teams started playing again in 1985 and have played off-and-on since then with the most recent meetings in 2021 (96-43) and 2023 (73-66).

SOUTHEASTERN UPDATES

The Lions suffered a tough loss on Monday night at the University Center in Hammond, falling to East Texas A&M, 70-69. Southeastern scored with 14 sec-

onds left to take a 69-68 lead, but A&M hit a jumper outside the paint with five seconds on the clock.

Southeastern is 4-7 overall and 1-2 in the Southland Conference. Fifth-year senior Isaiah Gaines had a season-high 17 points, seven rebounds, three assists and three blocks for Southeastern. Jeremy Elyzee added 15 points and nine rebounds. Peter Hemschemeier added 13 points and C. J. Booker scored 10. Both had four assists.

Southeastern shot 41.4 percent for the game (24-of-58) with eight made three-pointers and made 13-of-17 at the line. Rebounds were even on the game and Southeastern turned the ball over just seven times.

The Lions have played Ole Miss, losing 88-58, and Mississippi State, falling 75-68.

For the season, Elyzee leads the team with 12.4 points a game and 4.7 rebounds, while Gaines is at 10.5 points and 5.9 rebounds.

David Kiefer is in his seventh year as the head coach of the Lions after serving for four years on the Southeastern staff.

PETE MARAVICH ASSEMBLY CENTER

The Tigers opened their 55th season of play in the building in 2025-26 with five wins after going 11-7 in the venue last season. LSU is 643-222 in the building. LSU is 352-49 (87.7 percent) in non-conference games. LSU was 9-0 in non-conference games in the Maravich Center in the 2024-25 season.

The building was originally known as the LSU Assembly Center from its opening in late 1971 until August 1988 when the building was renamed by government legislation following the untimely death of star LSU player, "Pistol" Pete Maravich.

The Maravich Center is the fourth oldest continuous use basketball arena in the league having hosted its first game in January 1972. Memorial Gym at Vanderbilt opened in 1952, Stegeman Coliseum at UGA in 1964 and Coleman Coliseum at Alabama opened in 1968.

NEUTRAL GAMES

LSU is 3-1 this year after two neutral site contests at the Emerald Coast Classic and splitting the games at the Coast to Coast Challenge in Fort Worth against Texas Tech and the Compete 4 Cause Classic in New Orleans against SMU.

The Tigers, all-time, are 173-186 on neutral courts (48.2 percent) and Coach Matt McMahon in his LSU tenure is 10-9.

RECAP: LSU scored on 13 of its first 14 possessions and never let DePaul in the game as the Tigers won the Emerald Coast Classic titles for the second time (2021, 2025). The Tigers shot 68.6 percent from the floor (35-of-51), missing just 16 total shots, and made 21-of-26 at the free throw line. LSU led 50-22 at the half and finished the deal in the second half. LSU had 54 points in the paint, to 16 for DePaul. LSU had 22 assists on 35 made field goals.

Seven total players were in double figures for the Tigers with Pable Tamba getting 14 points and seven rebounds ... Michael Nwoko, Max Mackinnon and Jalen Reece had 13 each with DeDan Thomas Jr., and Robert Miller III adding 12 each and Rashad King 11. Mackinnon was named all-tournament and Thomas was named the event MVP.

SHOOTING FROM THE FIELD

The Tigers have now had three games shooting over 60 percent so far this season:

71.7 percent – vs. Tarleton State, 11/5/25

68.6 percent – vs. DePaul, 11/29/25

62.1 percent – vs. SMU, 12/13/25

The 71.7 percent game against Tarleton State is now the all-time best field goal percentage in LSU history, topping a 71.4 percentage against Clemson on Dec. 20, 1969. LSU was 33-of-46 in the contest, sparked by the 16-of-21 in the first half of the game.

It marked the third time that an LSU basketball team has shot 70 percent or better in a basketball game:

71.7% -- vs. Tarleton State (in Baton Rouge) – 11/5/25

71.4% -- vs. Clemson (in Charlotte) – 12/20/69

70.3% -- vs. Centenary (in Baton Rouge) – 1/15/03

The game also set a record for best two-point field goal percentage (making 25-of-28), topping the mark of a game just the previous season:

89.3% -- vs. Tarleton State (in Baton Rouge) – 11/5/25
87.2% -- vs. Mississippi Valley (in Baton Rouge) – 12/29/24
75.8% – vs. Memphis (in Lake Buena Vista, Florida) – 11/29/13

LSU has also had three other games shooting over 50 percent overall, giving LSU six-of-its-first 10 games over 50 percent for the game, all LSU wins. The Tigers are 33-2 in the last 35 games in which LSU has shot at least 50 percent from the floor. LSU is third in the league and 17th NCAA in overall field goal percentage at 51.6 percent (311-of-603). LSU has made 57 more field goals than opponents this season. LSU is third in the league and 38th in NCAA in effective field goal percentage at 57.1 percent.

THREE POINT SHOOTING

After two games of shooting less than 17 percent from the arc, the Tigers got some of their shooting game together against SMU, hitting 7-of-15 for 46.7 percent. Of course, most of that came from Max Mackinnon, who after going 0-of-5 from distance against Texas Tech, hit 6-of-7 against the Mustangs.

LSU was just 7-of-43 in the combined games at BC and against Texas Tech.

The SMU game was the third game the Tigers had shot over 44 percent and now the Tigers have five total games shooting over 37 percent. LSU shot 44.4 percent (8-18) versus Tarleton State (Nov. 5) and 45.5 percent (15-33) against Omaha (Nov. 21).

For the first 10 games, LSU is at 67-of-205 (32.7 percent) with opponents having made 17 more (84-of-252, 33.3 percent).

LSU is making an average of 6.7 three-pointers a game compared to 7.8 a year ago. The Tigers made the third most three-pointers in school history (250), while shooting just 30 percent from the field in 2024-25.

PAINT BY NUMBERS

When LSU has had its most success early, the Tigers have been able to score plenty of points in the paint. This season, LSU has had at least 40 points in the paint on eight total games, including four over 50 points in the paint. LSU is averaging 44.6 points in the paint over 10 games.

LSU is presently eighth in the NCAA in points in the paint. Gonzaga is No. 1 at 48.0 with Arizona at 47.8 and Georgia the top SEC team in third at 46.4 percent. Also the McNeese Cowboys are tied for fifth at 45.5 percent.

LSU's four 50-point games for Points in the Paint this season:

58 – vs. Alcorn State, 11/18/25

54 – vs. DePaul, 11/29/25

50 – vs. SMU, 12/13/25

50 – vs. FIU, 11/13/25

The best in recent times came last year when LSU had 60 points in the paint on Dec. 29, 2024. LSU had four 50-points in the paint games in 2021-22, but the last team to have more than four such games came in the 2019-20 season when the Tigers had five 50 points in the paint games.

SHOOTING WELL INSIDE THE ARC

LSU's two-point percentage for the season remains good at 61.3 percent, after posting 67.4 percent in the last game against SMU.

LSU is 244-of-398 inside the arc and that percentage is 14th in the country. LSU is 6.1 percent better than last season when LSU was 55.2 percent inside the arc.

Mike Nwoko is 34th in the NCAA, according to Teamrankings.com, at 73.3 percent inside the arc. That is the fourth best two-point percentage in the SEC.

FREE THROWS GOOD

Although LSU had its worst game at the line against Texas Tech (12/7) making 12-of-19 for 63.2 percent, the Tigers rebounded with 10-of-12 against SMU (83.3 percent).

LSU is at a very good 77.5 percent for the season (196-of-253) for the first 10 games. LSU is getting to the line an average of 25.3 free throws per game.

LSU is the league leader as of Tuesday in free throw percentage and 28th in the NCAA. LSU is sixth in the league and 28th in the nation in free throw attempt average.

Although it is not an official stat, LSU opponents may have one of the lowest percentages in the country at 62.0 percent (114-of-184).

LSU is at the moment handling things at the line much better than a year ago when the Tigers shot 71.6 percent at the line.

Max Mackinnon is 28-of-30 at the line or 93.3 percent, second in the league and 17th in the NCAA. Three other Tigers come in over 80 percent at the line with DJ Thomas Jr., at 84.0 percent (42-of-50), Robert Miller III at 81.1 percent (30-of-37) and Marquel Sutton is at 80 percent (24-of-30).

As a team, LSU has made 82 more free throws than opponents and its 196 makes is 12 more than the 184 opponent attempts. The 10 LSU opponents are 196-of-253 (62.0 percent).

BETTER REBOUNDING

LSU is better on the boards this season so far at 41.20 per game, well above last year's rebound average of 35.7 a game. The Tigers are only seventh in the league in rebounds, but they are first in the league and 14th in the NCAA in defensive rebounds at 30.10 a game.

Marquel Sutton is second in the league and 33rd in NCAA at 9.2 a game. Pablo Tamba is sixth in the league at 7.6 a game. Both Robert Miller III and Mike Nwoko are averaging over five boards a game.

LSU's rebound margin is +8.6, fifth in the league. LSU opponents are averaging 32.6 a game.

DOUBLE DOUBLES GALORE

The Tigers had three players with double doubles on Saturday against SMU:

Marquel Sutton – 23 points, 12 rebounds

Pablo Tamba – 14 points, 10 rebounds

Dedan Thomas Jr. – 16 points, 12 assists

For Sutton it was his fifth double double of the year (including three straight earlier in the year) and the second for both Tamba (third career) and Thomas (also third career).

The last time LSU had three players with double doubles in the same game was against St. Bonaventure in the first round of the 2021 NCAA Tournament in Bloomington, Indiana:

TURNOVERS

LSU has improved its turnover numbers by almost two full points from last season – 11.2 in 10 games to 13.1 for the 2024-25 season. Last season, LSU turned the ball over 419 times compared to 409 assists. The Tigers were 14th in turnover margin at -1.47 and 15th in assist-to-turnover ratio at 0.98.

So far with three games in single digits this season, LSU has a positive assist-to-turnover mark of 1.42 (159-112). LSU is ninth in the SEC in turnovers per game.

POINT GUARD DEDAN THOMAS JR., PILING UP THE ASSIST NUMBERS

For the second time this season, Dedan Thomas Jr., piled up double figure assists and for the first time in his UNLV-LSU career, he has posted 12 assists in a single game against SMU (12/13). Seven of the assists came in the second half of the game.

Thomas posted 11 assists in the Omaha game (11/21), one of two games this year with no turnovers. Thomas had just two in 36 minutes in the SMU game.

So far this season, Thomas has 69 assists (6.90 a game). Only one game, the loss to Texas Tech, has Thomas had less than five turnovers in a contest.

Thomas has scored in double figures in nine of 10 games, including the last eight, dating back to the third game of the season. He also has the two highest assist games in the league to date.

Highlighting that was the game at Boston College when he scored 23 points, including the last two baskets in the final minute that got LSU even and forced overtime, and then the first four points (bucket and two free throws) that got LSU off to a good start in winning the game, 78-69.

He has posted less than 15 points on just three occasions this year.

JALEN REED OUT FOR SEASON AGAIN

Jalen Reed left the Drake game in Niceville, Florida (11/28) just before the eight-minute second half media timeout with what turned out to be a season-ending left Achilles tendon injury. He had surgery on Dec. 2. He was with the Tigers for a game for the first time since Nov. 29 in New Orleans when the Tigers faced SMU.

Ironically, the injury came just under a year from Dec. 3, 2024 in the opening minutes of the ACC/SEC Challenge game against Florida State when Reed injured his right ACL and his subsequent surgery ended his 2024-25 season after eight games.

He averaged 9.5 points per game, 5.7 rebounds a game in 18.0 minutes per game.

MIKE NWOKO LIVING UP TO WHAT HAS BEEN SEEN IN PRACTICE

He had up and down moments in his single seasons at Miami and Mississippi State, but the junior from Toronto, Canada has so far lived up to the ability and talent that those who watched practice all summer and fall believed to be available for the Tigers.

The point numbers are stacking up after as he has a co-team high nine double figure scoring games at an average of 15.2 points a contest.

He has already scored 75 points more than he did in 29 games at Miami as a freshman (152/77) and he is 57 points away from the points total he scored (209) in his 34 games at Mississippi State.

Nwoko has games of 22 against New Orleans (11/10) and 29 against Alcorn (11/18). He is also averaging 5.3 rebounds and shooting 63-of-89 from the field (70.8 percent).

He is first in the league in field goal percentage and fifth in the NCAA.

Against Alcorn (11/18), he came very close to a double double with nine rebounds (six offensive). The 12 field goals made against Alcorn still remains tied for league best as of Tuesday.

MARQUEL SUTTON

Marquel Sutton had his game going against SMU, scoring a season high 23 points with 12 boards against the Mustangs.

Sutton made 8-of-15 field goal attempts, including a trey and 6-of-6 at the line on a night when foul trouble to Mike Nwoko and Robert Miller III pushed him back down to the 4-5 with Pablo Tamba in a setup that they hadn't practice much of this season.

For Sutton the total was just outside his top 10 career single game totals, but he posted his fifth double double of the year with his 12 rebounds.

Sutton's five doubles are tied for the league lead and is ranked T10 in the NCAA in double ups.

Sutton is now averaging 13.6 points a game and 9.2 rebounds. He is second in the league in boards.

It was a good night for Marquel Sutton who saw many of the coaches and players he played with in 2025 from Omaha (11/21) as the Mavericks with Sutton won the Summit League regular season and tournament titles and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

Prior to the game, Omaha Coach Chris Crutchfield presented Sutton, the Summit Player of the Year, his championship rings and NCAA Tournament watch.

Sutton has posted six double figure scoring games this season.

Three of his five doubles came in consecutive November games and it had been since February-March of 2016 that an LSU player posted three consecutive double doubles for the Tigers (Ben Simmons).

Sutton is shooting 49-of-99 from the field (49.5 percent). The Tulsa, Oklahoma product is averaging 29.7 minutes a game.

PABLO TAMBA

Pablo Tamba seems to be a little bit of everywhere and he proved that against SMU (12/13) with having to play out of position because of inside foul trouble and he responded with 14 points and 10 rebounds for his second double double of the season.

The UC-Davis transfer has started all 10 games and is averaging 6.6 points and 7.6 rebounds. His ability to do several things has been noticed by the Tigers coaching staff. Against DePaul in the ECC championship game, he was 4-of-4 from the field and 6-of-6 from the line to score 14 points with seven rebounds. He is making 19-of-28 from the field (67.9 percent).

The DePaul game (12/29) was another contest where he had a huge +/- total of 25. Coach McMahon has talked about him on several media opportunities.

"He plays every possession like it's his last, all he cares about is winning, he's an unbelievable teammate, and he can guard every position on the floor. He's just a joy to coach every day because he's going to give you everything he's got."

Tamba had a 10-10 double double in the second game of the season against New Orleans (11/10) and then against Omaha, he pulled down 13 boards in the contest. He was +25 against Alcorn State and +22 in the Omaha

JALEN REECE

The freshman from Orlando has shown his chops as backup point guard behind Dedan Thomas, averaging 11.6 minutes, 3.0 points and 1.90 assists a game.

Against DePaul (11/29), Reece was given the keys for 20 minutes and he responded with a 6-of-6 night from the field with an additional free throw to score 13 points. More impressively, he posted a game-high six assists with no turnovers.

In 10 games he has only turned it over six times with 19 assists.

Reed had eight points against Alcorn (11/18), hitting 3-of-5 from the field with a three-pointer.

MAX MACKINNON

For the second time this season, Max Mackinnon made six three-pointers, this time against SMU (12/13) in the SKC in New Orleans.

Mackinnon was 6-of-7 from deep, as part of an 8-of-9 game shooting as he scored 22 points with two assists. It was his second 22-point game of the season to go with his 6-of-8 three-point shooting against Omaha (11/21).

The SMU game was a nice comeback after a Texas Tech game (12/7) in which he missed all nine field goals he attempted.

He has made at least two three-pointers in half of the team's 10 games so far. He is 21-of-46 from deep for 45.7 percent.

Mackinnon has posted double figure scoring in seven games this season.

Mackinnon, who transferred to LSU after two years at Elon and a season at Portland, is also 28-of-30 from the free throw line (93.3 percent).

The six three pointers are one off his career mark of seven, last season for Portland against San Diego on Jan. 23, 2025.

Only once in the Matt McMahon era has someone made more three-pointers in a single game and that was seven by K. J. Williams against Wake Forest on Dec. 10, 2022.

Mackinnon has also been good distributing the basketball with 24 assists through 10 games (2.40 apg). Mackinnon is averaging 12.7 points a game and 2.9 rebounds.

ROBERT MILLER III MAKING CONTRIBUTIONS AGAIN FOR TIGERS

Sophomore Robert Miller III, now the lone active returnee on the team after the injury to Jalen Reed, will probably be asked to do a little more with the absence of Reed and he responded with a 28-minute performance against BC (12/3) as he scored eight points on 4-of-5 shooting with five boards.

Against Texas Tech (12/7), he was 2-of-3 from the field and 2-of-4 from the free throw line to score six points.

Off the bench, he is averaging 19.4 minutes a game, 6.8 points and 3.4 rebounds a contest.

Miller had 12 points in the ECC finals against DePaul (11/29) where he was 3-of-3 from the field and 6-of-7 from the free throw line.

He has made 19-of-28 field goals (67.9 percent), but he has also found himself getting to the free throw line, making 30-of-37 so far. For the entire season a year ago, Miller made 21-of-33 free throw attempts (63.6 percent).

Miller's effort against DePaul was his sixth career double figure scoring game.

PJ CARTER

PJ Carter, a fifth-year senior transfer from Memphis, found his shooting touch against Omaha (11/21) as he hit 4-of-7 three-pointers in nine minutes of play as he finished with 12 points in the contest.

Carter is averaging 3.6 points a game and he is 10-of-27 from distance this season (37.0%).

RASHAD KING

The senior transfer from Northeastern had his best game as a Tiger, scoring 11 points with three assists in 26 minutes against DePaul.

King is averaging 15.3 minutes a game with five made treys. He is at 4.1 points and 2.4 boards a contest.

RON ZIPPER

The freshman from Israel played the last six minutes of the game against Texas Tech (12/7), his sixth appearance of the season, and he helped LSU's shooting percentage, making 2-of-4 from distance. That makes him 4-of-9 from three in the 20 total minutes he has played this season.

He is averaging 2.1 points a game and averaging 3.5 minutes a game in seven total appearances.

THIRD TIME MCMAHON'S TIGERS HOLD OPPONENTS SHOOTING UNDER 30 PERCENT

LSU's defensive ability was on display against New Orleans (11/10) as the Tigers held UNO to just 29.9 percent from the field (20-of-67), the third time in Matt McMahon's tenure at LSU, that the Tiger defense kept a team from reaching the 30.0 percent mark from the field. The three games in the McMahon era:

- 25.4% (15-59) by Texas A&M (at College Station), 1/6/24
- 25.9% (14-54) by Akron (at Cayman Islands), 11/22/22
- 29.9% (20-67) by UNO (at Baton Rouge), 11/10/25

LSU is 29-6 in the McMahon era when opponents shoot under 40 percent.

LSU GETS WITHIN SITE OF THREE-POINT RECORD AGAINST OMAHA

The Tigers for the second time this season, hit double digits from distance against Omaha (11/21) and this time they were within distance of the school mark.

The Tigers were 15-of-33 from the three-point arc, making nine in the first half and six in the second half. The 15 makes were tied for the fourth most in a single game in LSU history.

17 – vs. Vanderbilt, Dec. 29, 2016

17 – vs. Tennessee, March 1, 2003

16 – vs. Auburn, Feb. 26, 2003

15 – vs. Omaha, Nov. 21, 2025

15 – vs. Arkansas, Feb. 3, 2018

It was the most three-point makes in the Matt McMahon era at LSU, topping three games of 14 makes.

THE LSU COACHING TIES

In his fourth season at LSU, there are familiar faces on the LSU coaching staff, including some of those who donned the purple and gold during their college careers.

Ronald Dupree -- General Manager -- a first time position for LSU basketball ... Dupree, recently inducted to the LSU Athletics Hall of Fame, was an 11-year pro and longtime NBA scout, executive with the Milwaukee Bucks ... Played at LSU (1999-03), member Sweet 16 team in 2000 and is ninth in career scoring (1,726 points) ... Scouting work contributed to 2021 Bucks NBA title.

Jalen Courtney-Williams -- Assistant Coach -- Second year on LSU staff ... Three-year letterman at LSU (2010-13); played in 61 games ... Came to LSU from Creighton where he served for three seasons, including a Sweet 16 year in 2024 ... Hosts the popular podcast "No Timeouts" on LSU+ and various podcast locations.

Tasmin Mitchell -- Assistant Coach/Director of Personnel -- In his ninth year as member of the LSU staff; second stint as Assistant Coach beginning in 2025-26 season ... One of the most popular former LSU Basketball stars; member of 2006 NCAA Final Four team ... Third all-time in scoring at LSU with 1,989 points (14.5 ppg average); sixth in rebounds (950), school record 4,692 minutes; 136 career starts ... One of three Tigers with 1,000 points, 500 rebounds, 200 assists and 100 steals.

Keith Hornsby and Marcus Thornton -- The two support staff members are also former Tiger stars. Hornsby's made three at the buzzer of the regular season finale at Arkansas in 2015 solidified the Tigers NCAA berth that year. Thornton, after two JC years, came in and helped LSU to the 2009 SEC regular season title and an NCAA berth, while winning SEC POY honors.

David Patrick, the Associate Head Coach, is also familiar to Tiger fans in the second year of his second stint in the program. He served as Assistant/Associate Coach from 2012-16 during the Johnny Jones head coaching tenure. **Vince Walden**, who was at Texas A&M last year, and fourth year assistant, **Casey Long**, completes the on floor coaching staff. Long, who has been with Coach McMahon for nine years at Murray State and LSU, is originally from Leesville, Louisiana

IMPORTANT WORDS

Coach Matt McMahon has had his five core value words since he arrived at LSU: hard work, unselfishness, toughness, accountability and joy.

All five of those are a vital part of this program's DNA, but this year the players as a team have picked out three words that they want to be the standard for the LSU program. Those words are on a lot of the team shooting shirts and coaching shirts the team wears. Those words are:

Brotherhood
Relentless
Consistency

WHAT MAKES THIS YEAR'S TEAM DIFFERENT?

Despite the game last Sunday, there are three factors that offer the potential for this year's team to be a different LSU team in 2025-26:

AGE, MATURITY -- In 2023-24, the average age of the players was just over 19 ... In 2025-26, the average age is right around 22. In fact, as Coach McMahon said to some media, he had never celebrated a player's 24th birthday before. The roster has four freshmen (three from high school, one from the Israeli pro league), one sophomore, three juniors, two seniors, three 5th year seniors and a grad student.

ROSTER MANAGEMENT -- The Tigers put together the players that it feels will help them make the necessary strikes during this season. A larger, more physical frontcourt, wings that can shoot the three and a point guard that can be trusted to run the team, score the ball and distribute the basketball.

CONNECTIVITY AND CHEMISTRY -- This group of players that were good at their respective schools has blended together and understood the mission. Do what is necessary to make LSU relevant again in the SEC. They've accepted that mission that they have to work together and the chemistry shown is something that coaches and attendees at practice have noticed quite quickly.

SONS OF THE FATHER

Two Tigers have fathers who also did well in the college basketball game in the past.

Jalen Reed's late father, Justin, starred at Ole Miss, where he was an All-America and the SEC Freshman of the Year in 2001. Justin Reed was an All-SEC selection in each of his four years at Ole Miss, guiding the Rebels to two NCAA Tournament wins en route to a first ever "Sweet 16" appearance for the Rebels. He was a second-round pick in the 2004 NBA Draft by the Boston Celtics and played for Boston and Minnesota in his NBA days. He passed away from cancer in 2017.

Point guard DJ Thomas Jr., is the son of UNLV star Dedan Thomas Sr. Senior played from 1991-94 at UNLV. He would earn honorable mention All-America honors and has his name throughout the UNLV record book.

Also, Robert Miller III is the son of a couple of former athletes. His dad, Robert Miller II, was an LSU defensive lineman in college, while his mom, Teana, earned All-America basketball honors at Tulane, also playing four years in the WNBA.

COUPLE OF NUMBER NOTES TO CONSIDER

Against Texas Tech (12/7), DJ Thomas Jr. went over the 1,000 career points with his 13 for the game and he now has 1,022 for his two years at UNLV and his nine games at LSU.

Thomas is now 35 assists away from 400 career total.

Marquel Sutton's seven points against Texas Tech pushed him past the 1,500 career points mark and he is now at 1,524. He is currently on a 109-game streak as a starter, dating back to three years at Omaha and nine games at LSU.

Rashad King needs 27 points for his 1,000th career point.

TIGERS SIGN THREE IN THE EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

The Tigers signed three high school players in the early November signing period and LSU is ranked 12th in the Nov. 8 last update of the ESPN class rankings.

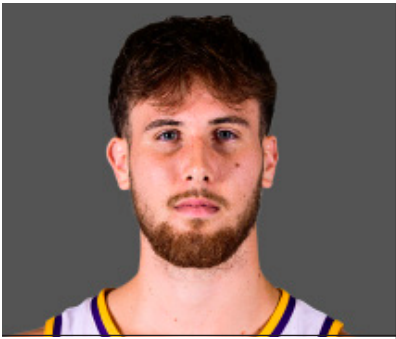

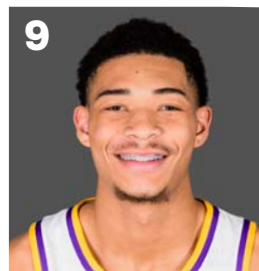
