- No. 6 LSU and No. 13 Oklahoma will meet in Norman, Okla., at the Lloyd Noble Center at 2 p.m. CT on ESPN2 with Courtney Lyle (pxp) and Andraya Carter (analyst) on the call. The Tigers and Sooners will face off for the third time in series history with both matchups occurring in the last seven years. LSU won the most recent contest, 107-100, in Baton Rouge for the first meeting between each team as SEC foes on Jan. 30, 2025. Oklahoma downed the Tigers in the first game on Dec. 7, 2019, 90-68 in Norman during the Big 12/SEC Challenge.
 - Junior Mikaylah Williams, a Bossier City, La. native, displayed her clutch gene in the Tigers' 70-65 victory over No. 2 Texas, knocking down big shots all game. The 6-0 guard finished with 20 points, seven rebounds, four assists and five steals. Williams' five steals were a career high as she had previously recorded four steals in six career games. Williams shot 7-of-13 from the field, knocked home two important three-pointers and went 4-of-6 from the charity stripe. As the final minute waned down in the fourth quarter, Williams hit her toughest shot of the contest, as she drained a three with one second left on the shot clock and 1:20 left in the ballgame, giving LSU the 66-59 advantage.
 - LSU's victory over No. 2 Texas marks the program's first AP Top 2 win since 2008 when the Tigers defeated No. 2 North Carolina, 56-50, in the NCAA Elite Eight. LSU's win over the Longhorns snapped a 17-game losing streak against teams in the Top 2. The last time LSU defeated an AP Top 5 opponent was in the 2023 National Championship where the Tigers downed Iowa by a score of 102-85 to claim its first national title.
 - Going into the contest versus No. 13 Oklahoma, No. 6 LSU is seeking to win back-to-back games against ranked opponents for the first time since the Tigers defeated No. 4 Virginia Tech and No. 3 Iowa in the 2023 NCAA Final Four and 2023 NCAA National Championship, respectively. LSU downed the Hokies 79-72 to punch its ticket to the national title, where it defeated the Hawkeyes, 102-85, claiming the program's first championship.
 - In a stretch that started with No. 11 Kentucky, LSU will take on seven SEC teams currently ranked in the AP Top 25 (vs. Kentucky, at Vanderbilt, home/away vs. Texas, at Oklahoma, vs. South Carolina, at Ole Miss, and vs. Tennessee). In Coach Kim Mulkey's time at LSU, the Tigers are 21-14 against opponents ranked in the Top 25 poll at the time the teams played each other. LSU's five-game opening stretch features four ranked opponents, all of which are currently ranked in the Top 13 (No. 11 Kentucky, at No. 12 Vanderbilt, at Georgia, No. 2 Texas, at No. 13 Oklahoma).
 - Junior MiLaysia Fulwiley ranks 2nd in the SEC and 7th nationally in steals with 63. LSU's single season leader in steals, Raigyne Moncrief Louis finished the 2016-17 season with 107 steals in 32 games played. Jumping into the program's single-season top 10 would require Fulwiley to match Elaine Powell's 81 steals from the 1995-96 campaign.
 - LSU leads the country in 6 statistical categories: bench points per game (43.8), field goal percentage (53.3), rebound margin (19.6), offensive rebounds per game (18.6), scoring margin (44.2), and scoring offense (100.1).

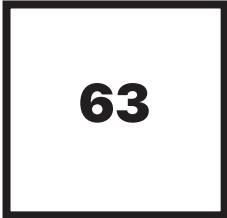

No. 6 LSU Heads To Norman For Top-15 Tilt Versus No. 13 Oklahoma

No. 6 LSU, which earned a second-straight SEC victory against No. 2 Texas on January 11, will head to Norman for the second time to face Oklahoma for the third time in series history. At the Lloyd Noble Center, the Tigers and Sooners will play at 2 p.m. CT on ESPN2 with Courtney Lyle (ppx) and Andraya Carter (analyst) on the call for the Top 15 matchup. Fans can also listen to the action on the LSU Sports Radio Network with Patrick Wright and Shaeeta Williams calling the game.

Oklahoma downed the Tigers in the first game on Dec. 7, 2019, 90-68 in Norman for the Big 12/SEC Challenge. Here is a look at brief recaps of the first two matchups between the Tigers and Sooners:

Jan. 30, 2025 – LSU won, 107-100

In a battle between two of the top offensive teams in the country, No. 7 LSU (22-1, 7-1) defeated No. 13 Oklahoma (16-5, 4-4), 107-100, as Flau'jae Johnson, Aneesah Morrow and Mikaylah Williams combined to score 83 points. The 107 points scored by LSU marked the most points in a SEC game in program history, surpassing the 106 scored by the Tigers last season against Florida. It marked the fourth game in program history where both teams scored 100 points – the other three all went to overtime as Thursday marked the first time in SEC history both team surpassed 100 points in regulation. The Tigers led by as many as 24 in the third quarter, but Oklahoma's press and LSU's turnovers allowed the Sooners back in the game. LSU took a timeout with 55-seconds remaining and a one-point lead. The Tigers got two offensive rebounds and Williams nailed a three and then Aalyah Del Rosario blocked a shot on the other end to secure the win. LSU's big three of Johnson, Morrow and Williams were scoring the ball at an elite level. Williams led the way with 37 points to go with 7 rebounds, 5 assists and three steals. Johnson scored 25 points with 5 assists. Morrow recorded her 20th double-double of the season with 21 points and 12 rebounds.

Dec. 7, 2019 – OU won, 90-68

The No. 25 LSU women's basketball team dropped its first contest since November 9, on the road against Oklahoma, 90-68. With the win, the Sooners improved to 5-4 and the Tigers fell to 8-2 with the loss. The game was a part of the 2019 Big 12/SEC Challenge. Khayla Pointer and Ayana Mitchell led the way for the Tigers. Pointer dropped 24 points, notched three assists, and grabbed two rebounds. Mitchell shot 100 percent from the field for the second game in a row to finish with 20 points. Pointer kicked off the game with a jump shot, helping LSU to an early 6-0 lead, but Oklahoma soon surged ahead, taking a 23-16 lead by the end of the first quarter with a 9-0 run. Though Pointer had eight points in the first, the Sooners dominated the second quarter, outscoring the Tigers 28-16 for a 51-32 halftime lead, with Pointer leading all scorers with 17 points. Mitchell grabbed her 800th career rebound in the third quarter, but Oklahoma maintained control, finishing the period with a 71-49 lead. Both teams scored 19 points in the fourth, but LSU fell short, losing 90-68. Pointer scored 24 points, while Mitchell went a perfect 10-10 for 20 points.

Flau'jae Johnson Bounces Back at Georgia

Senior Flau'jae Johnson paced the 12th-ranked LSU women's basketball team with 25 points as she led the Tigers to an 80-59 victory against the Georgia Bulldogs. Johnson, a Georgia native from Savannah, bounced back from her scoreless night at Vanderbilt on January 4, putting up 25 points, four rebounds, two assists and two blocks. She surpassed 1,800 career points at LSU, becoming the ninth Tiger to score at least 1,800 points in their career. Johnson shot 9-of-13 from the field and drained all six free throw attempts. Johnson's 25 points was a season high for the 5-10 guard. Despite her sprained ankle as Coach Kim Mulkey described it, Johnson stepped up for her team when they needed a leader in the face of adversity.

LSU Enters The SEC Grind on New Year's Day

Kim Mulkey Coaches 150th Game at LSU vs. Washington State

Coach Kim Mulkey, who was hired in April of 2021 at LSU, coached the 150th game during her time in Baton Rouge against Washington State on Nov. 29. The Tigers won the contest, 112-35, and took home the 2025 Paradise Jam Reef Division Championship. Through four-plus seasons coaching at LSU, Mulkey has won 138 games and only lost 22. In her second season at the helm of the program, she led LSU women's basketball to the national championship, where the Tigers defeated the Iowa Hawkeyes, 102-85. Mulkey's winning percentage of 86.2% is the highest of any LSU coach that has coached in at least 160 games. LSU legend Sue Gunter coached the women's basketball program for 22 seasons and closed her time in Red Stick with a record of 442-221 (.667). Nikki Fargas led LSU for 10 seasons, which culminated with a record of 168-116 (.592). Here is a look at Coach Mulkey's win-loss record during her time at LSU:

LSU's Bench Making A Huge Impact

LSU, which has started 8 of the 13 players in its rotation, has seen the Tigers coming off the bench making an impact on winning and scoring the basketball. Through 18 games, LSU leads the country in bench scoring with 43.8 points per contest from players coming in off the bench. Louisville ranks second behind LSU with 36.3 bench points per game, while the next best SEC team in Arkansas ranks 11th in the nation with 30.2 points per game from its non-starters. The Tigers coming into the Oklahoma game has five players averaging 20 or minutes per game (Flau'jae Johnson, Mikaylah Williams, Jada Richard, MiLaysia Fulwiley, and Amiya Joyner). Williams leads the team with 482:26 minutes played, while junior MiLaysia Fulwiley leads all LSU players coming off the bench with 383:54 minutes played. The LSU bench has accumulated 789 bench points through 18 games, 100 points better than the next best team. Here is a breakdown of minutes played and the average of each player's minutes played:

LSU's High-Powered Offense

Through 18 games, LSU's fast-paced offense under head coach Kim Mulkey, has been just that. LSU has scored 100 points in 11 games thus far including contests against Houston Christian (108), Southeastern Louisiana (115), Georgia Southern (118), Charlotte (117), Tulane (101), Alcorn State (112), Marist (113), Washington State (112), New Orleans (126), Texas-Arlington (110), and Alabama State (109). The eight consecutive games reaching the 100-point mark to start the season is an NCAA record that was established by the Tigers against Washington State on Nov. 28. The current record surpassed Mulkey's 1982 Louisiana Tech team she played on, which recorded six straight games with 100 points. LSU has averaged 100.1 points in its 18 games this season, which leads the country. The next best team, Oklahoma, has averaged 90.8 in 17 games played. LSU leads the country in 6 statistical categories: bench points per game (43.8), field goal percentage (53.3), rebound margin (19.6), offensive rebounds per game (18.6), scoring margin (44.2), and scoring offense (100.1).

LSU Ties Program Record For Steals In A Game (27) vs. Alabama State; Ranks 6th In The Nation In Steals

LSU, which forced 36 turnovers against Alabama State in the final non-conference game, tied the program mark for steals in a game with 27 versus the Lady Hornets in the Maravich Center. LSU also tallied 27 steals against Southern Miss on Nov. 11, 2004, when the Tigers and Golden Eagles met in the State Farm HOF Tipoff Classic in Austin, Texas. En route to its second-straight NCAA Final Four appearance, LSU defeated Southern Miss, 80-35. LSU last recorded 20-plus steals against Marist (22) this season in the 2025 Paradise Jam tournament in the U.S. Virgin Islands. LSU ranks 7th nationally with 253 steals.

Amiya Joyner Reaches 1,000 Career Rebound Milestone

Senior Amiya Joyner, who is in her final season of collegiate women's basketball, reached the 1,000 career rebound milestone on Dec. 21 against UT-Arlington. She went into the contest with 990 total rebounds across her three seasons at East Carolina and her current season at LSU. She tallied 11 against the Mavericks with her 14 points to account for her 4th double-double of the year and 45th of her three-plus year career.

Grace Knox Named SEC Freshman of the Week on Dec. 23

LSU's Grace Knox was named SEC Freshman of the Week Tuesday for her performances against Morgan State and Texas-Arlington. Knox, a native of Las Vegas, Nev., paced LSU to its two home victories, improving the team's overall record to 13-0. The Tigers' leading scorer over those two games, Knox averaged 17.5 points and 9.5 rebounds per game. The 6-2 forward's standout performance came against UTA, as Knox finished with her second career double-double, recording two career highs of 25 points and 12 rebounds in her best outing at LSU thus far. Her 25 points is the highest point total by any Tiger through 13 games, and she has reached double figures in 11 of 13 games played. In addition to career highs in points and rebounds, Knox set career highs in field goals made (10), blocks (3) and steals (3). Knox tallied 10 points and seven rebounds in LSU's win over Morgan State at the Tigers' annual field trip game. Knox is the first LSU freshman to garner this honor since junior Mikaylah Williams earned three in the 2023-24 season. She shared the honor with Auburn's Harissoum Coulibaly.

MiLaysia Fulwiley Collects Career High 8 Steals vs. Tulane & Alabama State; Ranks 4th Nationally In Steals

LSU junior MiLaysia Fulwiley, who joined the Tigers' program over the summer from South Carolina, has continued to shine on the defensive side of the ball. Against Tulane, she finished with 20 points, 6 assists and 3 rebounds. Fulwiley using her speed and quickness to record 8 steals in the contest. She matched her career high against Alabama State on Dec. 28. Against Tulane, she became the first Tiger to record at least 8 steals in a single game since Raigyne Moncrief Louis tallied 10 steals against Florida on Jan. 5, 2017. Fulwiley also became the 7th Tiger to record at least 8 steals in a game. She is just the third player since 2017 to record 8-plus steals in a game joining Moncrief Louis and Aneesah Morrow. Fulwiley was the Tigers' second leading scorer (20) against the Green Wave. Fulwiley also ranks 7th nationally in steals recorded with 63 through 18 games. She eclipsed 1,500 points against San Diego State in the first round of the 2025 NCAA Tournament. LSU legends Joyce Walker (2,906) and Seimone Augustus (2,702) hold the top two spots in program history. Johnson jumped into the top 10 on LSU's all-time list, which is listed below.

LSU Wins Season Opener Versus Houston Christian, 108-55

LSU opened its fifth season under Coach Kim Mulkey with a 108-55 victory over Houston Christian inside the Pete Maravich Assembly Center. Freshman ZaKiyah Johnson led the Tigers against HCU picking up her first double-double with 11 points and 11 rebounds. LSU was able to spread the ball around throughout the contest with three more Tigers scoring in double figures. Junior MiLaysia Fulwiley paced the offense with 21 points, while Mikaylah Williams had 14, Flau'jae Johnson had 12, and freshman Grace Knox had 10. LSU shot 42-of-79 (53.2%) from the floor, as opposed to Houston Christian's 19-of-50 (38.5%). LSU was a solid 17-of-23 (73.9%) from the free throw line and nearly 7-of-13 (53.8%) from three-point range, as they would go into the half with a 26-point lead, 53-27. The Tigers tallied 23 steals in the contest, while forcing 33 turnovers overall. Fulwiley collected seven steals alone, marking the 22nd time an LSU player has recorded at least seven steals in a single game.

Complementary Effort Pushes LSU to Victory Over Southeastern La., 115-26

LSU played complementary basketball all night, matching the needed intensity on both sides of the court against Southeaster Louisiana on Nov. 6. On offense, LSU scored 100 points in consecutive contests for the first time since last season's March Madness matchups against San Diego State (103) and Florida State (101) in the first and second rounds. LSU's margin of victory (89) matched the program record also accomplished versus McNeese on Dec. 12, 2023. Additionally, the Tigers shot 67.6% from the field, which ranks fourth in LSU history (70.0% at Alabama - Jan. 5, 1978; 69.6% vs. North Carolina A&T - Jan. 1, 2006; 67.8% vs. McNeese - Jan. 30, 1980). On the defensive front, the Tiger defenders locked down the Lady Lions throughout the contest, holding SLU to 4, 2, 7 and 13 points in each quarter. Through the first half, LSU held SLU to six points, marking the lowest point total in a half for an LSU opponent. The previous low came in 2011 against Arkansas Pine-Bluff (8) and 2001 against Prairie View (8). The Tigers shot 50-of-74 (67.6%) from the floor while the Lions were 10-of-52 (19.2%). LSU was 7-of-13 (53.8%) from the free throw line and 8-of-18 (44.4%) from three-point range. Additionally, they tallied 25 assists, 55 rebounds and 19 steals. Flau'jae Johnson led the Tigers, finishing with 17 points on seven of 10 shooting. LSU showed strong scoring depth as four other Tigers finished in double figures including ZaKiyah Johnson (16), Kate Koval (16), Bella Hines (14) and Grace Knox (11). LSU also tied a program record for FGs made (50), previously accomplished Jan. 16, 1981 at UNLV.

Tigers Win 118-70 In Johnson's Homecoming Versus Georgia Southern

Most recently versus Georgia Southern, LSU shot 46-of-87 (53%) from the field and 9-of-20 (45%) from behind the three-point arc. LSU's 118 points was a season high. The Tigers scored 108 against Houston Christian and 115 versus Southeastern Louisiana. LSU had 31 offensive rebounds, which tied for second-most in a single game in program history (32 on Dec. 21, 1993 vs. Jackson St.). LSU had a plus-22 margin in offensive rebounds (31) than its opponent (9), which is the largest margin in program history. Senior Flau'jae Johnson, in her return to her home state, led the Tigers in scoring against the Eagles with 19 points. She finished with six assists, four rebounds, and a steal. LSU junior MiLaysia Fulwiley also accounted for 19 points with one assist and seven rebounds. Sophomore Kate Koval, who transferred in from Notre Dame, collected her first double-double during her short stint in Baton Rouge so far. Koval had 12 points, 14 rebounds and two blocked shots. In addition to Flau'jae Johnson, Fulwiley, and Koval, three other Tigers finished in double figures including ZaKiyah Johnson (17), Mikaylah Williams (15), and Grace Knox (13), contributing to the team's season high in points. The homecoming game for Johnson drew a Georgia Southern women's basketball record crowd of 5,322 fans. Following the contest, Johnson and her teammates spent time with the fans at the Hill Convocation Center signing autographs and taking photos. LSU eclipsed 100 points in its first three games and began a season with three-straight games scoring 100-plus points for the second time in program history joining 2022-23 national championship season.

LSU Scores 100 Points Again & Defeats Charlotte, 117-59

With sophomore Kate Koval's second-straight double-double and seven LSU players scoring in double figures, the fifth-ranked Tigers were able to dominate the visiting Charlotte 49ers, 117-59, on Nov. 12. The Tigers ran their streak of 100-point games to four, joining the Houston Christian (108), Southeastern Louisiana (115) and Georgia Southern (118) contests. On the night, LSU shot 35-of-71 (49.3%) from the field and 10-of-20 (50%) from behind the three-point arc. The Tigers reeled in 54 rebounds, while the 49ers recorded 37. LSU shared the ball throughout the contest, accounting for 14 assists compared to Charlotte's five. With seven players scoring in double figures, LSU's offense was ultimately paced by junior MiLaysia Fulwiley, leading the Tigers with 22 points on 8-of-11 shooting, five three-pointers and three steals. Junior Mikaylah Williams earned a season high 18 points along with six defensive boards and two assists. Other Tigers with double figures included senior Flau'jae Johnson (16), senior Amiya Joyner (15), freshman Grace Knox (10) and ZaKiyah Johnson (10). Koval's double-double consisted of 10 points and 12 rebounds.

LSU Sees 100-Point Streak Continue Against Tulane With 101-71 Victory

LSU's dynamic trio of Flau'jae Johnson, Mikaylah Williams and MiLaysia Fulwiley finished as the top three scorers against Tulane on Nov. 17, as they led the fifth-ranked Tigers to a 101-71 victory inside the Avron B. Fogelman Arena in New Orleans. With the win, LSU picked up its fifth straight victory to start the season, moving to 5-0. The Tigers ran their streak of 100-point games to five. LSU's five-straight 100-point outputs matched the Southeastern Conference record for consecutive 100-point games. The other team to accomplish the feat was Coach Kim Mulkey's 2022-23 LSU team that went on to claim the program's first national championship. In addition to another 100-point game, LSU's 559 points through five games this season marks the most across five games in Division I over the last 25 years. The Tigers shot 38-of-69 (55.1%) from the floor, while Tulane went 28-of-81 (34.6%). LSU's active defense turned Tulane over 22 times and converted those into 31 points on the night. LSU, which led the country coming into the game in bench scoring, had its bench account for 42 points. Senior Flau'jae Johnson led the Tigers in scoring against the Green Wave, scoring 22 points on 9-of-13 shooting. In addition to Flau'jae Johnson, four other Tigers finished in double figures including MiLaysia Fulwiley (20), Mikaylah Williams (16), ZaKiyah Johnson (14) and Amiya Joyner (12). Fulwiley finished with a career high eight steals, surpassing her seven steals from the season opener against Houston Christian.

LSU Sets SEC Record With Sixth Straight 100 Point Output vs. Alcorn State

As the LSU women's basketball team crossed the century mark on the score board, the fifth-ranked Tigers made Southeastern Conference history with a sixth-straight 100-point output in their 112-49 victory over Alcorn State. With the win, LSU secured its sixth straight victory to start the season, moving its overall record to 6-0. The Tigers ran their streak of 100-point games to six, joining the Houston Christian (108), Southeastern Louisiana (115), Georgia Southern (118), Charlotte (117), and Tulane (101) contests. LSU's six-straight 100-point outputs established the SEC record for consecutive 100-point games, previously set by Coach Kim Mulkey's 2022-23 squad that scored 100 points in five consecutive games. LSU matched the NCAA record set by Mulkey's 1982 Louisiana Tech team with its performance against the Lady Braves. The Tigers shot 41-of-71 (57.7%) from the floor, while Alcorn State went 18-of-48 (37.5%). LSU was 24-of-30 (80%) from the free throw line and 6-of-16 (37.5%) from the 3-point range. Additionally, they tallied 19 assists, 50 rebounds and 17 steals. Junior MiLaysia Fulwiley and senior Flau'jae Johnson led the Tigers in scoring, each recording 18 points. In addition, three other Tigers finished in double figures including Mikaylah Williams (15), Kate Koval (15), and Grace Knox (12).

LSU Earns 2025 Paradise Jam Reef Championship With Wins Over Marist & Washington State

On the beautiful island of St. Thomas in the United States Virgin Islands, the fifth-ranked LSU women's basketball team collected two wins against Marist and Washington State in the 2025 Paradise Jam. With its victories over Marist (W, 113-53) and Washington State (W, 112-35), LSU earned the Reef Division Championship, which culminated in an MVP honor for senior forward Amiya Joyner and two All-Tournament selections with senior Flau'jae Johnson and freshman ZaKiyah Johnson. LSU extended its winning streak to begin the season to eight in addition to the Tigers' NCAA record for consecutive games scoring 100-plus points.

LSU Wins Third-Straight ACC/SEC Challenge Contest Against Duke, 93-77

Despite the fifth-ranked LSU women's basketball team's slowest offensive start up to this point, the Tigers responded emphatically in a 93-77 win over Duke in the ACC/SEC Challenge at Cameron Indoor Stadium in Durham. With its victory, LSU extended its winning streak to nine to start the season, moving its overall record to 9-0. The Tigers have eclipsed 90 points in all nine games this season, even with LSU's 100-point streak being snapped. LSU had eight 100-point outputs in a row, which was an NCAA record previously set by the 1981-82 Louisiana Tech squad (6). Six Tigers scored in the double digits against Duke. Senior Flau'jae Johnson led the scoring attack with 18 points, five rebounds and three assists. In addition to Johnson, other LSU players that scored double digits included junior MiLaysia Fulwiley (16), senior Amiya Joyner (14), junior Mikaylah Williams (14), sophomore Kate Koval (13), and freshman Grace Knox (12).

LSU Wins 10th Straight Contest, 126-62, Against New Orleans

The fifth-ranked LSU women's basketball traveled to New Orleans for the second time out of three appearances and collected a 126-62 victory against the University of New Orleans inside the Lakefront Arena on Sunday afternoon. With the win, LSU secured its 10th consecutive victory since the start of the season, moving its overall record to 10-0. With the loss, UNO dropped to 0-8 on the season. Sophomore Kate Koval led the LSU scoring attack against the Privateers, accounting for a career high 22 points and two rebounds. Koval went a perfect 9-for-9 from the field and converted on four of her five free throw attempts. Alongside Koval's best scoring output of her career, freshman Grace Knox earned the first double-double of her career. In the Tigers' season-high output of 126 points, Knox put together a 12-point, 12 rebound performance. Knox has scored in double digits in nine of 10 victories thus far and in five straight contests since LSU's win over Alcorn State. Junior MiLaysia Fulwiley posted 18 points to go with eight assists. Other Tigers that scored in double figures were freshman ZaKiyah Johnson (17), senior Amiya Joyner (14), sophomore Jada Richard (12), and Knox (12).

LSU Downs Coach Mulkey's Alma Mater Louisiana Tech, 87-61 in the Complete 4 Cause Classic

For just the second time in her head coaching career, LSU coach Kim Mulkey was on the other bench from her alma mater, where the fifth-ranked Tigers downed Louisiana Tech, 87-61, in the Complete 4 Cause Classic at the New Orleans Pelicans Smoothie King Center. With the win, LSU secured its 11th straight victory, improving its overall record to 11-0. The dynamic duo of senior Flau'jae Johnson and junior Mikaylah Williams shined against Louisiana Tech. In spurts of offensive struggles, Johnson and Williams were able to get the Tigers through them. Johnson collected her first double-double of the season with 13 points and 10 rebounds. It marked the 11th double-double in the senior's four-year career at LSU. Williams, who finished with a team and season high of 19 points, broke through for LSU in several spots in the game. In addition to her scoring output, she tallied five rebounds and four assists. As a combination, Johnson and Williams went 12-of-21 from the field, while knocking down 2-of-7 three-pointers and 6-of-8 free throws. Sophomore Kate Koval (13) and junior MiLaysia Fulwiley (10) were the only other LSU players to score in double figures. Koval blocked a season-high four shots from Tech players. Sophomore Jada Richard finished with a career high in assists with eight matching her performance against New Orleans on Dec. 7.

LSU Defeats Morgan State, 91-33, In Field Trip Game

As nearly 9,000 schoolchildren packed the stands at the PMAC, they were treated to a show from the fifth-ranked LSU women's basketball team in its 91-33 victory over Morgan State in the program's annual field trip game. With the win, LSU picked up its 12th straight victory, improving its overall record to 12-0. The official attendance of 8,743 announced at the LSU-MSU contest consisted of students from the greater Baton Rouge area. The collective had the opportunity to take in a game as classmates. Senior Flau'jae Johnson and junior Mikaylah Williams led the Tigers' scoring attack against MSU. Both finished with 14 points, but Johnson contributed four rebounds and two steals, while Williams had four rebounds and three assists. Freshmen post players ZaKiyah Johnson and Grace Knox provided some valuable minutes throughout as the majority of LSU's rotation had between 17 and 21 minutes played. Despite the near even distribution, ZaKiyah and Knox made an impact in the post. Knox finished with 10 points and seven rebounds, while ZaKiyah tallied eight points and seven rebounds. Sophomore Jada Richard (10) and junior MiLaysia Fulwiley (11) were the other Tigers to reach double figures in scoring.

Tigers Take Down Texas-Arlington, 110-45

In its final game before the holiday break, the fifth-ranked LSU women's basketball team was paced by freshman Grace Knox and junior MiLaysia Fulwiley with 20-plus points each en route to a 110-45 victory over Texas-Arlington. With the victory, LSU secured its 13th straight win since the start of the season, improving its overall record to 13-0. Knox was the Tigers' leading scorer with a career high 25 points and 12 rebounds, finishing with her second career double-double. Her 25 points is the highest point total by any Tiger through 13 games. Fulwiley, who has scored in double digits in 11 straight games, had a season-high 23 points and seven rebounds with two assists and five steals. Knox knocked down a career high 10 shots out of 18 attempts from the floor. Senior Amiya Joyner, who came into Sunday's contest with 990 career rebounds, grabbed 11 boards to surpass the 1,000 career rebounds milestone. Joyner recorded 14 points and 11 rebounds for the 45th double-double of her career spanning three seasons at East Carolina and one season at LSU. Other Tigers that scored in double figures were senior Flau'jae Johnson (14) and sophomore Jada Richard (10). LSU's defense forced a season-high 34 turnovers and blocked 11 shots put up by the Mavericks. It was the first instance LSU blocked 10 or more shots since Nov. 12, 2025, when the Tigers recorded 12 against Mississippi Valley State. Fulwiley tallied the most blocked shots with four, matching her career high.

LSU Defeats Alabama State, 109-41 To Finish Undefeated In Non-Conference Play

In its final non-conference bout before opening up Southeastern Conference action, the fifth-ranked LSU women's basketball team defeated Alabama State, 109-41. With the victory, LSU finished its non-conference slate with an undefeated 14-0 record and improved its current winning streak to 14. LSU's unblemished record in the non-conference marked the third time under Coach Kim Mulkey finished undefeated against non-SEC opponents in the regular season. The Tigers shot 52.4% (44-of-84) from the field and converted on 19-of-27 free throw attempts on the afternoon. LSU scored 100-plus points for the 10th time out of 14 contests in the non-conference slate. Sophomore forward Kate Koval led the LSU scoring attack against the Lady Hornets, finishing with a double-double that consisted of 23 points and 11 points. Koval went 8-of-15 from the field and 7-of-9 from the charity stripe, as she drew a team-high nine fouls. Her performance culminated in the seventh double-double of her career and her fifth this season. Junior MiLaysia Fulwiley was all over the court for the Tigers, recording five points and six rebounds. The 6-2 guard, however, nearly garnered her first double-double with a career high of 11 assists and eight steals, which matched her career high from the Tigers' win at Tulane. The last time an LSU player had 10-plus assists was on Jan. 1, 2023, when Alexis Morris tallied 12 against Vanderbilt. LSU forced the Lady Hornets into 36 turnovers, which signaled the first time the Tigers have forced at least 35 turnovers since LSU's win over McNeese State on Dec. 12, 2023. LSU also forced 36 turnovers on that day. LSU's back-to-back contests with 30-plus turnovers forced was the first instance it recorded 30-plus turnovers in consecutive games since the Tigers' wins against Texas Southern and Niagara on Nov. 20 and Nov. 24, respectively, in 2023.

LSU Drops SEC Opener to No. 11 Kentucky, 80-78

Kentucky guard Tonie Morgan knocked down a three-pointer with 0.5 seconds remaining in the game to lift the 11th-ranked Wildcats over fifth-ranked LSU, 80-78, on New Year's Day. With the loss, LSU suffered its first defeat of the season, dropping to 14-1 overall and 0-1 in league play. Morgan and forward Teonni Key paced the Wildcats with a double-double each as Morgan had 24 points and 12 assists, and Key recorded 17 points and 16 rebounds. LSU shot 49.2% (30-61) throughout the contest compared to Kentucky's 43.5% (30-69) from the field. The Wildcats outrebounded the Tigers by 16 and tallied 17 offensive boards to LSU's four. Junior Mikaylah Williams led the Tigers with 26 points, eight rebounds, and five assists. Williams' points and rebounds marked a season high for the 6-0 guard. Sophomore Jada Richard matched her career high in points with 14, while senior Flau'jae Johnson (15) and senior Amiya Joyner (14) also finished with double digits in scoring.

LSU Falls to No. 12 Vanderbilt, 65-61, In Nashville

Vanderbilt's Mikayla Blakes paced the home team's efforts with 32 points as she lifted the 12th-ranked Commodores to a 65-61 victory. LSU dropped to 14-2 on the year and 0-2 in league play. Junior MiLaysia Fulwiley and sophomore Jada Richard led the Tigers in scoring 13 apiece. Fulwiley, who made her first start at LSU, had seven rebounds, six assists, and two steals to accompany her scoring. Richard finished with two rebounds, one assist and two steals. Junior Mikaylah Williams (12) and freshman ZaKiyah Johnson (10) had double-digit scoring totals joining Fulwiley and Richard.

LSU Defeats Georgia, 80-59, Earning First SEC Win

Senior Flau'jae Johnson paced the 12th-ranked LSU women's basketball team with 25 points as she led the Tigers to an 80-59 victory against the Georgia Bulldogs. With the victory, LSU secured its first conference win of the SEC slate, improving its record to 15-2 overall and 1-2 in SEC play. Johnson, a native of Savannah, Ga., bounced back from her scoreless night at Vanderbilt, putting up 25 points, four rebounds, two assists and two blocks. She surpassed 1,800 career points at LSU, becoming the ninth Tiger to score at least 1,800 points in their career. Johnson shot 9-of-13 from the field and drained all six free throw attempts. Johnson's 25 points was a season high for the 5-10 guard. Junior MiLaysia Fulwiley joined Johnson as LSU's second leading scorer with 18 points, four rebounds, three assists, four blocks and two steals. Johnson and Fulwiley were joined by senior Amiya Joyner (12) and freshman ZaKiyah Johnson (12) with double digits in scoring. Joyner brought down 11 rebounds with her 12 points, which marked her fifth double-double of the season and the 46th of her collegiate career.

No. 12 LSU Takes Down No. 2 Texas, 70-65, Inside Sold Out PMAC

In front of 13,200 rabid fans in attendance, the 12th-ranked LSU women's basketball team took down the second-ranked Texas Longhorns, 70-65, behind junior Mikaylah Williams' clutch performance Sunday afternoon inside the Pete Maravich Assembly Center. With the victory, LSU picked up its second-straight SEC win and improved its record to 16-2 overall and 2-2 in league play. LSU's victory over the No. 2 team in the Associated Press poll marks the program's first AP Top 2 win since 2008 when the Tigers defeated No. 2 North Carolina, 56-50, in the NCAA Elite Eight. LSU's win over the Longhorns snapped a 17-game losing streak against teams in the Top 2. The last time LSU defeated an AP Top 5 opponent was in the 2023 National Championship where the Tigers downed Iowa by a score of 102-85 to claim its first national title. LSU's victory in front of 13,200 fans signaled the ninth-largest crowd in program history. Williams, a Bossier City, La. native, displayed her clutch gene all day, knocking down big shots and defending the Longhorns top player in Madison Booker. The 6-0 guard finished with 20 points, seven rebounds, four assists and five steals. Williams' five steals were a career high as she had previously recorded four steals in six career games. Williams shot 7-of-13 from the field, knocked home two important three-pointers and went 4-of-6 from the charity stripe. Joining Williams, four other Tigers finished with double digits in scoring including senior Flau'jae Johnson (10), sophomore Jada Richard (10), junior MiLaysia Fulwiley (10), and freshman ZaKiyah Johnson (10). LSU's defense was able to hold the Longhorns to 25-of-57 shooting, 4-of-12 from behind the arc, and 11-of-18 from the free throw line. LSU's ability to garner second chances at a high clip led to the Tigers ability to get up extra shots, as the Longhorns allowed the most second chance points this season (13) against LSU. In addition, LSU forced 17 turnovers, the most by the Longhorns this year.

51 Seasons of LSU Women's Basketball

The start of the 2025-26 season marks the 51st season of LSU Women's Basketball. Here are some noteworthy points throughout the program's history:

- In just its second season, LSU played for the 1977 AIAW National Championship
- From 2004-2008 LSU reached 5 consecutive Final Fours. LSU and UConn are the only programs in women's basketball history to ever make at least five straight Final Fours.
- When LSU won its first National Championship in 2023, the Tigers did so by scoring a NCAA Championship Game record 102 points
- LSU is the only WBB program in which three of its head coaches are in the Basketball Hall of Fame (also the only program with three in women's basketball HOF): Kim Mulkey, Van Chancellor and Sue Gunter. Former LSU star and first-year assistant coach Seimone Augustus went in to both Halls of Fame most recently on staff and former LSU player Sylvia Fowles was enshrined into both in 2025.

Flau'jae Johnson's Multifaceted Stardom

Entering her senior season at LSU, Flau'Jae Johnson has seen her profile grow astronomically since she came to Baton Rouge. One of the few players to stay at an institution for all four years in the transfer portal era, Johnson's talent on the basketball court isn't the only facet of her life that is commendable. Along with showing talent in sport, she is also a talented rapper. The 2023 SEC Freshman of the Year, 2023 National Champion, 2024 Second Team All-SEC, and 2025 First-Team All-SEC hooper saw her music brand pop over the summer of 2024, in which she featured Lil Wayne on one of her songs. The video for "Come Out A Beast" has over 3-million views on YouTube and it was featured as one of the NFL's songs of the season which can be heard on Sundays leading games into commercial breaks. She was also named the BET's inaugural Culture Class last year, which features prominent figures across entertainment. Prior to this season, Johnson released a few new singles including "Remember When" and "Courtside" featuring well-known rapper Waka Flaka Flame on the song.

LSU To Play 18 Nationally Televised Women's Basketball Games

The makeup of LSU's TV schedule consists of showings on SEC Network (8), ESPN (7), ESPNU (2) and ABC (1). LSU's matchup against South Carolina will be the featured game on February 14 on ABC at 7:30 p.m. CT inside the Pete Maravich Assembly Center. The game will occur on a Saturday, marking the first time the Tigers have played on a Saturday since January 8, 2005, when LSU defeated No. 17 Georgia, 76-52, as the top-ranked team in the country. LSU's non-conference slate features five nationally televised games including the Tulane, Duke, Louisiana Tech, Texas-Arlington and Alabama State contests. Duke and Louisiana Tech are set to be shown on ESPN and ESPNU, respectively. The UT-Arlington and Alabama State games are slated to be televised on SEC Network. The SEC/ACC Challenge games will all be televised on December 3 and 4 including LSU's trip to Duke. In addition, the We Back Pat Week games will be held from January 11-18. LSU will host Texas at 2 p.m. CT on Jan. 11. For conference games, LSU will first be featured on the ESPN family of networks when the Tigers travel to Vanderbilt on Jan. 4 to play Vanderbilt. Starting with a home game against Texas on Jan. 11, LSU will play 12 on national television out of 13 final contests down the stretch. Highlights include the five matchups on the main ESPN network against conference opponents in Texas twice, Oklahoma, Ole Miss and Tennessee. Every LSU home and conference game will also be available to stream on ESPN+ and SEC+, including both exhibitions. All of LSU's game times are set except the Tigers' second matchup at Paradise Jam in the U.S. Virgin Islands. The final game in that event will be based on the first-round results with the Tigers playing at 4 or 6:30 p.m. CT. Both games can be streamed on ESPN+.

International Success for Preseason All-SEC Trio

The Preseason All-SEC trio in Flau'jae Johnson, Mikaylah Williams, and MiLaysia Fulwiley each competed for the United States in international basketball competitions throughout the summer.

Johnson earned her first gold medal on the international stage Sunday as the United States basketball team defeated Brazil, 92-84, at the FIBA Women's AmeriCup in Santiago, Chile. She made her debut in USA Basketball competition and was a part of a squad consisting of 12 collegiate players. Team USA went a perfect 7-0, and Johnson averaged 4.3 points, 3.3 rebounds, and one assist per game. Johnson's top performance occurred in the quarterfinal round against the Dominican Republic on July 4. She finished with 22 points, seven rebounds, and two assists. Johnson became the ninth USA player to record 20-plus points in an AmeriCup game with her defining performance the key to advancing the United States to the semifinal round.

Williams, a mainstay on the summer 3x3 circuit, was announced Wednesday on the USA Basketball 3x3 Women's Series roster which will begin May 23-24 in Marseille, France. Williams helped USA earn three straight FIBA 3x3 U18 gold medals from 2021-23. The 2022 USA Basketball 3x3 Athlete of the Year and 2023 USA Basketball 3x3 Female Athlete of the Year, Williams has continually made an impact for her home country. Last summer, Williams competed in the FIBA 3x3 Nations League Americas Conference, a series of qualifying tournaments for the 2024 FIBA 3x3 U23 World Cup. She and the U23 team also played in a 3x3 exhibition game at the 2024 WNBA All-Star Game against the USA 3x3 Olympic team.

Fulwiley helped Team USA to the FIBA 3x3 Nations League Championship Sunday in Punta Arenas, Chile. Fulwiley, a game-changing 5-10 guard, competed in the 2025 FIBA 3x3 Nations League Americas Conference. Team USA claimed victory in the week-long event on July 27. Fulwiley played in five of the six stops with the United States winning four of the six over the course of the event. She participated in 14 games and averaged 4.1 points per contest.

Assistant Coach Seimone Augustus

In May of 2024, Coach Kim Mulkey announced the addition of Seimone Augustus as an assistant coach at LSU. Augustus led LSU to national relevance as one of the best teams in the nation during her playing days at LSU. She brought the Tigers to three consecutive Final Fours – beginning a stretch of five consecutive LSU Final Four appearances – before becoming the No. 1 overall pick in the 2006 WNBA Draft. She went on to win four WNBA titles and three Olympic Gold Medals with Team USA. In 2010, Augustus became the first female student-athlete in LSU to have her jersey retired and in 2023 she became the first female student-athlete in school history to receive a statue on campus.

Fifth Straight Season LSU Ranked Inside Top-10

LSU enters the 2025-26 season ranked No. 5 in the AP Poll. It will mark the fifth consecutive season in which the Tigers have been ranked inside the top-10 at any point. The Tigers' highest ranking a season ago was No. 4 against UL-Lafayette after defeating Stanford in a dramatic OT comeback, 94-88, for the ACC/SEC Challenge. LSU peaked at the No. 1 spot to end the 2022-23 season and to begin the 2023-24 season. In Mulkey's first season leading LSU in 2021-22 the Tigers' best ranking was No. 6. The streak of five consecutive seasons with time spent inside the top-10 is the second longest in program history. LSU had six straight seasons from 2002-08 that LSU spent time in the top-10.

20 Win Seasons For Kim Mulkey

In Coach Mulkey's 25 seasons as a head coach, her teams have won 20+ games every year of her career. Spending 15 seasons as an assistant at LA Tech, she has won 20+ games in all but one season in her 40-year coaching career. Mulkey won 30+ games in all four seasons that she was a player at Louisiana Tech. She has 12 30+ win seasons, including one 40-0 season. She has only lost 10+ games twice in her 25-year head coaching career.

The PMAC Is The Place to Be

In each of Coach Mulkey's first three seasons as LSU's head coach, a season-long attendance record has been set in the PMAC for women's basketball: 2021-22: 112,983 2022-23: 148,468 2023-24: 220,932 The final home regular season game in the 2022-23 season against Mississippi had an attendance of 15,721, setting the record for the largest PMAC crowd ever, regardless of sport. In the 2024-25 season, LSU amassed 212,144 fans in attendance at games in the Maravich Center. LSU ranked second in the country for overall attendance behind South Carolina.

Kim Mulkey Became Quickest Coach To 750 Wins vs. Kentucky Last Season

LSU trailed Kentucky by as many as 16 points in the second quarter and were down by 12 points at halftime, but the Tigers rallied in the second half with a 65-58 win. LSU outscored Kentucky by 17 in the third quarter to surge ahead and claim the lead. The fourth quarter was tight and LSU held a one-point lead with under a minute remaining when Mikaylah Williams knocked down a three that helped clinch the victory. The win marked the 750th victory for Coach Kim Mulkey, doing so in 870 games with a .862 winning percentage at the time. She was the fastest coach in NCAA DI history - men's or women's - to reach both 600 and 700 victories. She is on track to be the quickest to 800 too.

A Position Focused On NIL

As the era of Name, Image, and Likeness continues to evolve within collegiate athletics, head coach Kim Mulkey announced on the one-year anniversary of NIL that Jennifer Roberts would take on a first-of-its-kind role in women's college basketball as LSU Women's Basketball's Director of Player Personnel and Influence. In this role, Roberts helps players within the program develop their personal brands, make informed decisions, and maximize their NIL opportunities. Roberts works closely with the NILSU staff to enhance branding opportunities and to ensure each women's basketball player at LSU has the opportunity to grow their brands to the fullest potential.

A LSU Collection Of Hall of Fame Coaches

LSU is the only women's basketball program with three coaches in the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame. Sue Gunter was inducted in the Class of 2005, Van Chancellor in the Class of 2007 and Kim Mulkey in the Class of 2020. Gunter coached for 22 seasons (1982-2004) at LSU and put together a 442-221 record. She led LSU to 14 NCAA Tournaments, including its first Final Four in her final season. Chancellor coached at LSU from 2007-11 and compiled a 90-40 record. He was also the head coach of the first WNBA Dynasty in the Houston Comets where he earned three WNBA Coach of the Year honors and won the league's first four titles. Although she was a part of the 2020 class, Mulkey was not inducted into the Naismith Hall of Fame until May 2021 (due to COVID), just a month after being named the head coach at LSU. In her first season in Baton Rouge, she led the greatest turnaround by a first-year head coach in SEC history and earned her third AP National Coach of the Year award. Mulkey led her second team at LSU to a national championship, the first in program history. Through four seasons, she has compiled a 122-20 record in Baton Rouge and her career record has ballooned to 754-124 – a winning percentage of 85.9%. Geno Auriemma, Muffet McGraw and Mulkey are the only three coaches with three AP National Coach of the Year honors.

The Dream Team

The Dream Team is the LSU Women's Basketball practice team that is comprised of male students at LSU. The Dream Team is designed to go up against the Tigers every day in practice to help push the team while allowing practices to run efficiently.

Fast Break Club

The Fast Break Club is the LSU Women's Basketball Booster Club that is designed to help the Tigers achieve both on and off the court. It gives fans an opportunity to feel like they are a part of the program with monthly luncheons during the season that Coach Mulkey speaks at. The Fast Break Club has had over 500 members at its peak.

Coach Kim Mulkey's 10 Steps to Victory

Coach Kim Mulkey's success throughout her coaching career has not come without a consistency in mindset and performance. At the Tigers' Welcome Back Event, Mulkey revealed to the Fast Break Club, the Official Booster Club of LSU Women's Basketball, the 10 steps to victory. The first 7 have never changed in Mulkey's 25 years coaching, while the last three always apply differently to each Mulkey-coached team.

- 2. Be on time**
- 3. Tell the truth**
- 4. You must excel at playing defense**
- 5. Emphasize rebounding and defense**
- 6. Attend class and perform in class**

Kim Mulkey Is A Champion



Kim Mulkey

In four seasons since returning to Louisiana, Kim Mulkey has brought LSU back to national prominence as one of the premier programs in the country.

Mulkey and the Tigers have recorded three consecutive 30-win seasons and three straight Elite Eight appearances, including the National Championship in 2023. It has become one of the most exciting programs across America, with top notch attendance records, driven by an energetic fan base.

Less than two years after Mulkey returned to Louisiana to do good and be a positive figure in her home state as the head coach for the LSU Women's Basketball team, the Hall-of-Famer Mulkey delivered the program's first National Championship to Baton Rouge in 2023.

The Tigers were dominant en route to their first national championship, compiling a 34-2 record, including a perfect 17-0 record at home in the PMAC. LSU defeated Iowa in Dallas for the national championship, 102-85, setting the record for points in a championship game. The championship game drew 9.9 million viewers across ABC and ESPN networks to set the record for the most watched women's college basketball game of all-time.

The Tigers averaged 82.3 points per game throughout the championship season to rank No. 5 in the nation. Scoring 100 points in each of the first five games of the season, LSU tied the NCAA record. The only other team to score 100+ points in five straight games was the 1981-82 Louisiana Tech team that featured Mulkey leading the team as the point guard. LSU set the program record for 100-point games in a season with their sixth in the final game of the season.

Mulkey, the most successful player-turned-coach in college basketball history, was named head coach of the LSU women's basketball team on April 25, 2021.

It did not take Coach Mulkey long to have success at LSU, winning the AP National Coach of the Year award after leading the greatest turnaround in SEC history by a first-year head coach. Coach Mulkey joined Geno Auriemma and Muffet McGraw as the only coaches to earn the AP Coach of the Year award three times. Taking over a team that had won nine games the previous season, Mulkey's first LSU team finished 26-6, in second place in the SEC and the Tigers hosted first- and second-round games in the NCAA Tournament as a No. 3 seed.

Mulkey, who also won an Olympic Gold Medal in 1984, is the only person in college basketball history – men's or women's – to win national championships as a head coach, assistant coach and a player. She's one of just three coaches (Bobby Knight and Dean Smith) in college basketball history to win national titles as a player and a coach.

A native of Tickfaw, La., Mulkey came to Baton Rouge as the most accomplished head coaching hire in LSU history. She returned to Louisiana as a six-time national champion and nine-time Hall of Famer and most recently was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in May of 2021.

Mulkey is fastest coach in Division I history to reach 750 wins, doing so in 869 games. It took Adolph Rupp 902 games and Geno Auriemma 873 games. Mulkey, Rupp and Auriemma are the only three coaches ever to reach 700 wins in less than 900 games.

Mulkey eclipsed 750 wins in her 25th season as a DI head coach, while Auriemma did so in his 26th season and Rupp accomplished it in his 36th season.
