LSU ranks No. 20 in the ESPN/USA Softball Poll and NFCA/GoRoute Division I Softball Poll.

LSU comes in at No. 15 in the latest RPI rankings and has the No. 8 strength of schedule in the country.

Entering the weekend, the Tigers have four ranked wins (one against then-No. 23 Oklahoma State in the USA Softball Poll).

Head Coach Beth Torina enters her 15th season at the helm of LSU softball and has coached the Tigers to four Women's College World Series appearances.

Coach Torina is the program's all-time wins leader and just won her 600th game at LSU in the 9-0 run-rule victory against Louisiana Tech (March 24). Torina claimed her 700th career victory as a head coach versus LA Tech on April 9, 2025. Torina averages 41 wins per season and has logged 40 or more wins in the last three consecutive seasons.

LSU has won four of its last five games and is currently on a three-game winning streak, including two wins for its first SEC series win this season vs. South Carolina.

The Tigers lead the SEC with 15 triples and is second with 48 stolen bases.

The LSU pitching staff has a 2.80 ERA with 162 strikeouts and has six shutouts on the season.

LSU is batting .262 on the season behind 213 hits and has drawn 159 walks, ranking No. 5 in DI Softball.

The Tigers have outscored their opponents 98-41 in the first three innings and is 17-2 when scoring first.

The defense has a .973 fielding percentage and has turned 20 double plays, the second-most in the SEC and No. 6 in the NCAA. LSU has had four consecutive games without an error.

LSU is 8-12 all-time against Oklahoma, but is 3-2 in games played in Baton Rouge.

This will be the first three-game series between LSU and Oklahoma since the Sooners joined the SEC.

The Tigers return 12 players from the 2025 roster, including seven starters, highlighted by 2025 NFCA All-Americans, catcher Maci Bergeron and utility player Tori Edwards.

Other notable returners include 2025 NFCA All-Region selections in utility player Sierra Daniel, utility pitcher Jayden Heavener and outfielder Jalia Lassiter.

Pitcher Jayden Heavener is 7-6 in the circle with a 2.79 ERA and a team-high 68 strikeouts in 77.2 innings. Heavener has two shutouts and a save this season.

Pitcher Tatum Clopton holds a 6-1 record with a 2.10 ERA behind 23 strikeouts and has held opposing batters to a .220 clip over 36.2 innings.

Outfielder Jalia Lassiter leads the team with 31 hits and 28 runs and 12 extra-base hits. She has a .313 batting average and 20 RBI.

Utility player Sierra Daniel leads LSU with a .337 batting average and also has 31 hits. She boasts a .990 fielding percentage and has turned 12 double plays this season.

Since Clearwater, infielder Kylee Edwards leads LSU with a .362 batting average, 21 hits 12 RBI.

Utility player Tori Edwards leads the Tigers with six home runs, 24 RBI and 24 walks.

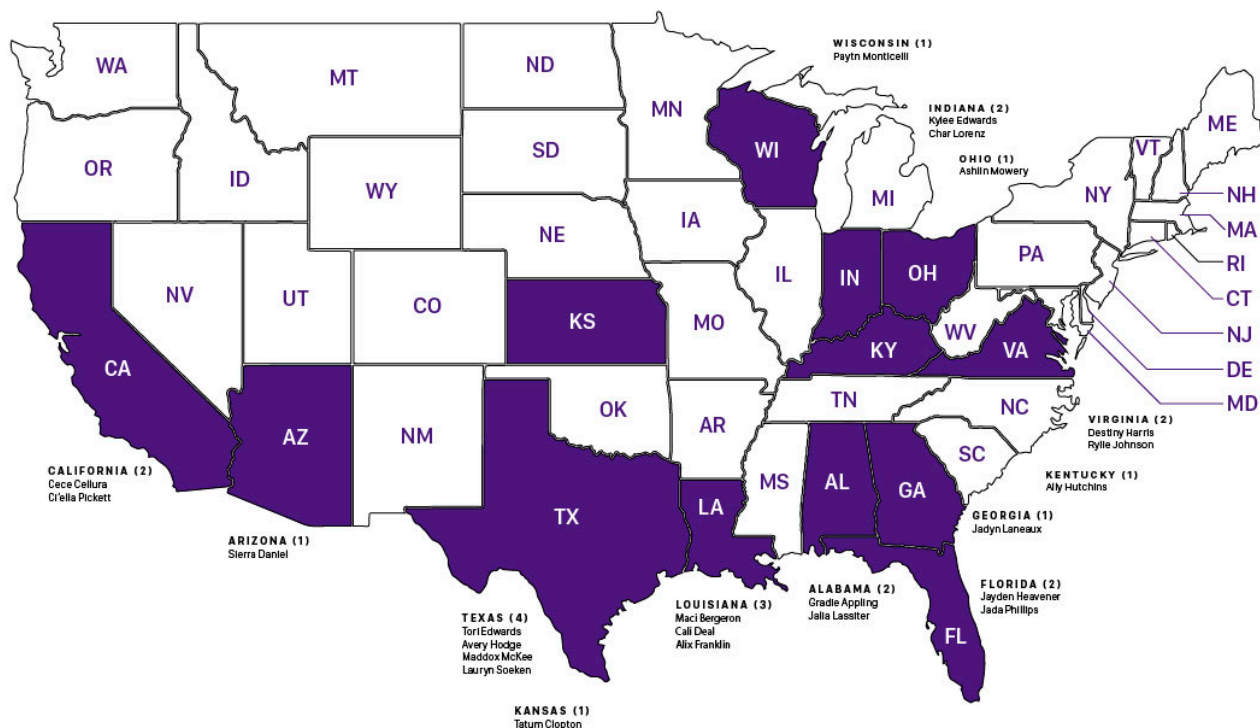

Head Coach • 19th Season Overall • 15th Season at LSU • Career Record: 729-374

Beth Torina heads into her 15th season at the helm of the LSU softball program after she returned the Tigers to national prominence with two 50-win seasons, eight 40-win seasons and four trips to the Women's College World Series in 2012, 2015, 2016 and 2017.

Since taking the reins of the program prior to the 2012 season, Torina has led the Tigers to the pinnacle of the sport more than any other LSU head coach. Torina is the program's all-time wins leader with 578 victories entering the 2026 season and is the first skipper to lead the team to Oklahoma City in consecutive seasons in program history (2015-17). She is averaging 41 wins per season in Baton Rouge and had a streak of 123 consecutive weeks ranked in the Top 25 (2014-2022). Under Torina, the Tigers have played a Top 10 strength of schedule every year.

In the 2025 campaign, LSU earned the No. 10 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament, marking its 19th consecutive tournament appearance and 26th appearance overall. The Tigers boasted a 42-16 record for the program's third consecutive 40-win season and eighth over an 11-year span. LSU claimed 18 Top 25 victories, and Coach Torina won her 700th career game as a head coach with a 9-1 win over Louisiana Tech on April 9, 2025.

The 2025 offense finished with seven single season marks ranking in the top five of the program's record book, including a program record .438 on-base percentage. LSU's .332 batting average ranked No. 3, and the club's .484 slugging percentage sits at No. 5. In the circle, the Tigers recorded a 2.74 ERA with 322 strikeouts in 363.1 innings. LSU totaled 14 shutouts, including the program's sixth perfect game in the season opener

against Charlotte on Feb. 7, 2025. The pitching staff allowed 287 hits, marking the sixth-lowest total in a season.

LSU will return two NFCA All-Americans and All-SEC selections from the 2025 roster in catcher Maci Bergeron and utility player Tori Edwards. Edwards was named the 2025 SEC Freshman of the Year, becoming the third player in program history to be the league's top freshman, and first since 2013. In addition to Bergeron and Edwards, LSU returns three NFCA All-Region selections; infielder Sierra Daniel, pitcher Jayden Heavener, who threw the perfect game against Charlotte, and outfielder Jalia Lassiter.

Torina earned her B.S. in health sciences and occupational therapy from Florida in 2000. During her playing career with the Gators, she was a member of the 1998 Southeastern Conference regular season championship team as the squad's top pitcher. In the classroom, Torina was a GTE Academic All-American and a finalist for the 2000 H. Boyd McWhorter SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

Before joining the LSU program in June 2011, Torina took Florida International of the Sun Belt Conference to new heights. The two-time SBC Coach of the Year led the Golden Panthers to a 129-111 record in four seasons and directed FIU to its first NCAA Tournament victory in 2010.

Torina and her husband, Nick, were married in January 2010. The couple has three daughters: Taryn, Tatum, and Tenley. They currently reside in Baton Rouge.

Rooted in Tigers

LSU softball's theme for the 2026 season is Rooted in Tigers. Rooted in Tigers represents the foundation, resilience, and legacy of LSU softball. Like the oaks that define LSU's campus, this program is built on deep roots planted by generations before. This team embraces the responsibility to grow those roots through daily work, unity, and resilience—weathering every storm together. Honoring the past while building the future, LSU softball is strong as oak and rooted in Tigers.

The Series

LSU trails Oklahomma in the all-time series 8-12, but holds a 3-2 advantage in games played at in Baton Rouge.

LSU is currently on a three-game losing streak in the series after falling to Oklahoma in the 2025 SEC Tournament, 4-1, in Athens, Ga. This weekend will be the first series between the clubs as SEC members

The last time the Tigers defeated the Sooners at home was a 10-2 run-rule victory in 2015.

LSU's last top 5 victory was the 6-1 decision over then No. 3 Texas on April 18, 2025.

Tigers in the Polls

LSU ranks No. 20 in both the NFCA/GoRoute Division I Top 25 Poll and the ESPN.com/USA Softball Top 25 Poll. The Tigers also rank No. 20 in the Softball America Poll and remain at No. 22 in the D1Softball Poll.

SEC - Softball Elite Conference

The SEC has 11 teams in both the NFCA Top 25 poll and the USA Softball poll, with four teams in the top five and six teams in the top 10. Both polls have Texas as the top-ranked team in the country.

In 2025, 14 of the SEC's 15 member schools reached the 2025 NCAA Tournament. Seven were seeded in the top eight, and nine were among the top 16 national seeds.

The 2024 season saw members of the then 13 member league reach the NCAA Tournament, marking the fourth time the league had a 100 percent rate in league history. The other three times came in 2017-2019.

Strength of Schedule

The Tigers have played a Top 10 strength of schedule every year under Coach Torina. LSU currently has the No. 8 toughest schedule in the country and is ranked No. 15 in the RPI.

Last Time Out

LSU logged its eighth run-rule victory and sixth shutout of the season with a 9-0 five inning win against Louisiana Tech on Tuesday night. In the win, LSU had eight hits highlighted by three home run, and landed 10 strikeouts between three pitchers.

In conference play, LSU picked up its first SEC series win rallying back for a 2-1 series win after dropping the first game in 12 innings. The Tigers batted .218 on 22 hits at South Carolina. Half of the hits were extra-base hits, including eight doubles. In the circle, the pitching staff had a 2.18 ERA, 16 strikeouts and walked only four batters in 25.2 frames. South Carolina was held to a .255 batting average, and LSU's defense had 77 putouts and 25 assists with no errors.

It's A Marathon

LSU's first game against South Carolina (March 20) lasted four hours and five minutes. It was the fifth game under Head Coach Beth Torina that the Tigers played in a game four hours or longer. LSU is 4-1 in four-hour games in Torina's tenure.

On the Contrary...

LSU defeated LA Tech on Tuesday night at Tiger Park in one hour and 22 minutes. It was the 40th game in program history that had a duration of 1:22 or less. LSU is 39-1 in those games, and 31-0 in those contests that were played at Tiger Park.

Last season, LSU played a game at Tiger Park that lasted 1:16. It was a 6-0 seven-inning victory against Central Arkansas (Feb. 8).

The shortest game in program history for LSU was at Tiger Park against Grambling State on Feb. 15, 2006. LSU won 11-0 in five innings in one hour and two minutes (1:02).

NEWS AND NOTES

Leading the Way

LSU leads the SEC with 15 triples (No. 5 in the NCAA), including 0.47 triples per game (No. 7 in the NCAA). Alix Franklin leads the league and ranks No. 3 in the nation with five triples.

The Tigers' had five triples in the first six games, tying for the most through the first six games of a season (1999).

A Problem on the Base Pads

LSU set the tone with a perfect 19-of-19 in stolen bases during its opening weekend. The Tigers are now 48-of-52 in stolen bases this season. The Tigers total number of stolen bases, and their average of 1.50 steals per game ranks No. 2 in the SEC.

Against Illinois (Feb. 8), The Tigers stole nine bases, tying the program's second most stolen bases in a game. Kylee Edwards, Tori Edwards and Alix Franklin each had two steals in the contest. It was the most stolen bases since LSU had 10 against Nicholls on Feb. 16, 2008.

Don't Forget the Defense

The Tigers' have a .973 fielding percentage and has turned 20 double plays, which is the second most in the SEC and the sixth most in the country.

Tiger Trends

LSU has outscored its opponents by 57 runs (98-41) in the first three innings, including a 41-20 margin in the third. The Tigers are 17-2 when scoring first, 15-1 when scoring six or more runs, and 16-0 when keeping its opponents to 0-2 runs scored this season.

Building Momentum

The Bayou Bengals enter the weekend winners of four of their last five games after recording its eighth run-rule victory of the season, sixth shutout, and fourth shutout in run-rule fashion with the 9-0 victory over Louisiana Tech (March 24).

So Far In SEC Play

LSU has a .207 batting average on 52 hits in conference games alone.

Kylee Edwards leads the team with a .308 average on eight hits, a .538 slugging percentage and a .400 on-base percentage. She also has five runs and four RBI.

In LSU's first SEC series win at South Carolina, 10 of 12 Tigers who had an at-bat recorded a hit. As a unit, the team batted .218 on 22 hits with half of them being extra-base hits, including eight doubles. In the circle the staff had a 2.18 ERA in that series with 16 strikeouts and walked only four batters in 25.2 innings.

The Coaching Staff

Head Coach Beth Torina enters her 15th season at the helm of LSU softball and is the program's all-time leader in wins. The next longest tenured coach on staff is former LSU standout player and Assistant Coach Sandra [Simmons] Moton, who is in her eighth season overall, including her stint as a volunteer coach from 2019-23. Moton oversees outfielders and base running, and will coach at third base on offense.

Assistant Coach Bryce Neal enters his third season leading LSU's hitting game, and Taylor Pleasants joins the coaching staff as an assistant coach. Pleasants will coach the infielders and first base on offense.

Zach Jermain, the Director of Player Performance and Analytics is in his second year with the program in this role. Jermain earned his PhD in mathematics from LSU in 2024, specializing in material science and plasmonic metamaterials.

A Living Legend

Coach Torina has a 600-263 record at LSU and is 729-374 overall in her 19 seasons as a head coach.

Torina claimed her 600th victory at LSU in th 9-0 decision against Louisiana Tech on March 24, 2026. She is now one of three coaches in head-to-head team sports, to achieve 600 wins at LSU . Torina is the only active coach at LSU with 600 wins.

Torina won her 700th career game as a head coach in a 9-1 run-rule victory against Louisiana Tech on April 9, 2025.

Torina won her 527th game at LSU to become the program's all-time leader in wins in the 1-0 shutout at No. 4 Tennessee on April 20, 2024. She surpassed LSU Hall of Fame Coach Yvette Girouard (2001-2011) who has 526 wins in 11 seasons.

The LSU 2026 Pitching Staff

The LSU Tigers 2026 pitching staff will take a pitching by committee approach. All six of the pitchers that have made an appearance for LSU this season has a winning record.

The staff is made up by returners in Tatum Clopton and Jayden Heavener, two transfers in Cece Cellura and Paytn Monticelli, and then a pair of freshmen in Cali Deal and Lauryn Soeken. Utility player Ashlin Mowery has a background in pitching as well.

Taking Over as Ace

Jayden Heavener is 7-6 on the season with a staff-best 68 strikeouts in 77.2 innings. She has a 2.79 ERA and has two complete game shutouts, and nine complete games this season.

In two appearances at South Carolina, Heavener went 1-1 with 11 strikeouts in 14.1 innings. She had a 0.98 ERA by only allowing two runs, and held opposing batters to a .163 average.

Heavener recorded a season-high 11 strikeouts at McNeese (Feb. 24), marking her second double-digit strikeout performance of the year. For the second consecutive season, Heavener threw double-digit strikeouts in a season opener after fanning 10 in a complete-game 11-3 victory over NC State (Feb. 5).

Heavener's nine complete games ranks No. 2 in the SEC and No. 15 in the nation. Her two shutouts sits at No. 10 in the league, and her 77.2 innings pitched are the seventh-most in the SEC.

HEAVE HO!

Heavener looks to build off a solid freshman season that placed her on the 2025 NFCA Gulf All-Region Second Team.

In 21 starts and 25 appearances, Heavener was 13-5 in the circle and had a 2.75 ERA behind 152 strikeouts in 119.2 innings pitched. She tossed 11 complete games and five shutouts, including a perfect game.

Heavener allowed 68 hits, setting a program record for fewest hits allowed in a season, and her .164 opposing batting average is the seventh-lowest average allowed in the club's single season record book.

A Perfect Start

Heavener began her college career by throwing the program's sixth perfect game in the 2025 season opener against Charlotte (Feb. 7, 2025). She had 13 strikeouts in 6.0 innings of work. Heavener is the third pitcher under Coach Torina to throw a perfect game, the second to throw a complete game as a freshman, and the first in program history to throw a perfect game in their collegiate debut.

An LSU Lefty?

Heavener is in rare air as she is the first left-handed pitcher with considerable innings pitched for LSU since Julie Stashko (1997-2000). Stashko had a 29-6 career record with a 1.68 ERA in 274.1 innings pitched. The Tigers will add another lefty to the fold this season in freshman pitcher Cali Deal.

Two other players in program history logged a few innings as a left-handed pitcher, but were utility players who played more in the field rather than pitched.

Two-time All-American outfielder Kirsten Shortridge (2009-2010) made 23 appearances in the circle and was 8-5 with 64 strikeouts in 81.1 innings pitched. Leslie Barron spent one season with LSU in 2002, and mostly played at first base. She threw 2.0 innings in two appearances and never was the pitcher of record.

Clopton Clamp

Tatum Clopton looks to have returned to form after a long layoff prior to the 2025 season. In 36.2 innings pitched, Clopton, who is 6-1 in the circle has a 2.10 ERA, has held opposing batters to a .220 average and has 23 strikeouts. Clopton has combined for two shutouts this season and has one save.

Most recently, Clopton shined in the series finale against Texas A&M (March 16) where she matched a season-high six strikeouts and picked up the win in her first complete game of the season.

Clopton had a phenomenal start to the 2026 season. Clopton's first appearance came in relief trailing 5-0 to NC State (Feb. 6) before dealing six strikeouts, and giving up one hit and no runs over 4.2 innings in what was LSU's walkoff victory. She then started in the weekend finale against Lamar (Feb. 8), where she retired 12 of the 13 batters she faced with three strikeouts, one hit, no runs and no walks in 4.0 innings.

The Comeback

Clopton returned to the circle in 2025 for the first time since 2022 at Oklahoma State due to injuries. Clopton finished the season with a 7-2 record and 3.14 ERA with 45 strikeouts in 58.0 innings pitched.

Clopton started in eight games, appeared in 15, and threw three complete games and one shutout. Clopton held opposing batters to a .186 average, and allowed 39 hits. Clopton threw a career-high 10 strikeouts in 7.0 innings against UT Arlington (Feb. 14, 2025).

The fifth-year senior is 14-3 all-time in the circle with a 2.69 ERA behind 75 strikeouts in 101.2 innings pitched.

One Thousand and Fifty-Seven Days

Clopton was sidelined for the 2023 and 2024 seasons, approximately 1,057 days, due to a shoulder injury. She was part of two WCWS teams at Oklahoma State before transferring to LSU after the 2023 season. In her return, Clopton earned a win against Charlotte (Feb. 8, 2025), where she combined for a shutout, throwing four strikeouts and gave up only one hit and one walk in her LSU debut.

As a freshman in 2022, Clopton was 1-0 in the circle with two appearances. She had eight strikeouts and joined in on one shutout. She logged five strikeouts and no earned runs on two hits in her lone career start, capturing her first win against Cal Baptist (Feb. 12, 2022).

Clopton is a two-time Kansas Gatorade Player of the Year.

21 Savage

Pitcher Cece Cellura is 4-2 this season and has pitched the second-most innings at 46.1. She has 20 strikeouts and a 3.32 ERA this season.

Cellura threw her second consecutive complete game of the 2026 season, both in game two against South Carolina (March 21) and Texas A&M (March 15).

Against South Carolina, Cellura had two strikeouts and allowed only one run on eight hits, and handed out no walks. Against A&M, she fanned six batters and allowed three runs on three hits and no walks.

Cellura pitched a career-high 8.0 innings in the 10-inning classic against UL Lafayette (Feb. 21). In that game, Cellura struck out three batters and gave up five hits and one unearned run.

The Legend of Cellura

Cellura, the most experienced arm in the bullpen in terms of innings pitched, earned her first win in the 9-1 victory over Illinois (Feb. 8).

Cellura is a two-time Mountain West Conference Tournament Champion at San Diego State and came to LSU with a 27-14 career record in the circle with a 2.48 ERA and 139 strikeouts in 262.0 innings.

Cellura, a 2025 All-Mountain West First Team selection who led SDSU to the NCAA Tournament last season, posted a 19-9 record, a 2.28 ERA and 94 strikeouts in 153.2 innings pitched. She threw four shutouts, led the Mountain West with a 4.70 strikeout-to-walk ratio, and ranked No. 3 in NCAA Division I softball with 0.91 walks per seven innings.

Stuntin' Like Her Daddy

Cece's father Mike, played professional men's slow pitch softball and was inducted into the United States Specialty Sports Association's Hall of Fame in 1988.

He is a two-time World Champion and was named to the All-World Team six times. A true slugger, he hit over 1,000 home runs in tournament play and batted over .600 at the World Series seven different times.

Monticelli for the Win

Pitcher Paytn Monticelli is coming off a dominant midweek performance, where the first seven outs of the game against Louisiana Tech were strikeouts (March 24). In 3.0 innings, she allowed one hit and one walk in her second combined shutout of the season.

Monticelli's first combined shutout was against Memphis (Feb. 28), where she struckout a season-high nine batters and held the opposing offense to a .100 clip over 6.0 inings.

Monticelli is 3-1 this season with 36 strikeouts in 31.1 innings.

The senior earned her first win in the circle as a Tiger in a complete game against Nevada (Feb. 6). Monticelli struck out five batters and gave up eight hits, two runs and two walks. It was her 10th career win in the circle.

Lady Whistledown in Louisiana

Dearest gentle readers,

It would seem that Paytn Monticelli has arrived in Baton Rouge with both reputation and results firmly in tow. Born in Lakenheath, England, this globally seasoned right-hander has long carried an air of distinction about her game. A two-time Wisconsin Gatorade Player of the Year, Monticelli first announced herself at Wisconsin before polishing her craft under the brightest of spotlights at Oklahoma, where she played a hand in the Sooners' 2024 Women's College World Series championship.

Her international ties proved no mere novelty, as she claimed a bronze medal with Great Britain at the 2025 European Championships. In that tournament, she was nothing short of ruthless in the circle—posting a pristine 0.00 ERA, striking out 33 over 16.1 innings, and holding opposing batters to a paltry .073 average. One suspects this Tiger's presence will not go unnoticed... or unanswered.

The Newbies

The freshmen hurlers are Cali Deal (Quitman, La.), Lauryn Soeken (Katy, Texas) and potentially, utility player Ashlin Mowery (Lancaster, Ohio).

Deal is a three-time Louisiana Sports Writers Association First Team selection, and a finalist for the 2024 Louisiana Gatorade Player of the Year.

Soeken was selected to the 19-6A All-District First team and won the USSSA State Gold Glove Award, and Mowery is a four-time Ohio Capital Conference First Team selection and was named the 2025 Central District Division I Player of the Year.

Money Mowery

Mowery earned her first decision after striking out four and allowed one hit, one walk and no runs in 5.1 innings against Howard in her first career start (Feb. 22).

Mowery made her debut against Lamar on Feb. 8, where she retired three of the four batters she faced, capped by her first collegiate strikeout.

Overall this season, Mowery has a 0.66 ERA, has combined for four shutouts and has seven strikeouts in 10.2 innings.

The Real Deal

In her first career start, Cali Deal picked up her first decision, a win, after striking out three and surrendered one run, two hits and one walk in 4.0 innings at Nicholls (March 10).

She made her first SEC appearance against Texas A&M (March 14), where she struck out two batters in 3.0 innings in relief.

Deal slammed the door in the run-rule victory over Memphis (Feb. 27). Deal struck out the first two batters she faced, marking her first two collegiate strikeouts.

Deal entered the circle during opening weekend in relief for the final inning against Illinois on Feb. 8. Deal surrendered two hits and one unearned run against the Fighting Illini.

Maestro Neal

Bryce Neal, the conductor of this LSU offense, put together an explosive unit in 2025 behind a philosophy based off efficiency, quality plate decision-making within at-bats, and sustained pressure. Power was not the foundation of the unit, which had just 42 home runs, yet still ranked in the top five of the program's single-season record book, including a program record .438 on-base percentage, a .332 batting average that ranked No. 3, and a .484 slugging percentage that sits at No. 5. The Tigers 398 runs ranked No. 6 in the SEC and had 359 RBI, both of which ranks No. 3 in the program's record book.

Keep Building

It has been a slow start offensively in 2026, but the offense will look to continue to build on its efficiency from a year ago, but also add more power.

We saw a taste of that power with five home runs in the SEC opening series at Tennessee (March 6-8), and 11 hits against South Carolina (March 20), marking a season-high against SEC competition. The Tigers have continued to show great plate discipline, drawing 159 walks, which ranks No. 4 in Division I Softball.

LSU has tallied 213 hits this season on a .262 batting average. The Tigers logged a season-high 14 hits at Nicholls (March 10) and have reached double-digit hits five times this season.

LassitHER

Jalia Lassiter, one of the team captains for the 2026 season, is batting .313 and has a team-high 31 hits. She also paces the team with 30 runs, 12 extra-base hits, and eight stolen bases. Her extra-base hits are comprised of six doubles, four home runs and two triples and she has 20 RBI, the second-most on the team.

Lassiter hit her fourth home run of the season against LA Tech (March 24), where she went 2-for-3 at the plate for her eighth multi-hit game of the season.

Two of Lassiter's home runs came in the SEC opening series at No. 1 Tennessee.

During opening weekend, Lassiter smacked a two-run home run to walk-off NC State (Feb. 6) after overcoming a 5-0 deficit.

Home Run Walk-Off History

Lassiter's walk-off home run was the program's first since Karli Petty did it on April 10, 2024 versus Southeastern Louisiana.

Lassiter's was the first walk-off in regulation since Taylor Pleasants launched one against Utah on Feb. 17, 2023.

Outfield U Continues with 7 at the Center

Lassiter became a three-time NFCA All-Region selection after batting .330 with 61 hits, including 15 doubles, one triple and three homers, highlighted by one grand slam in her first season with the Tigers. She also scored 51 runs and had 41 RBI.

Lassiter locked down the centerfield position in all 58 games last season, turning in a perfect fielding percentage with 57 putouts and two assists.

Don't Sleep on 23

Infielder Sierra Daniel is a consistent presence for LSU on both sides of the field.

Daniel leads the club with a .337 batting and matches a team-high 31 hits, including 10 extra base hits, featuring six doubles and four triples (No. 3 in the SEC and No. 13 in the NCAA). Daniel also has 22 runs and 15 RBI. Daniel has earned 22 walks and is 7-for-7 in stolen bases.

The junior infielder also has a .990 fielding percentage with 53 putouts, 46 assists and one error, and has turned 12 double plays this year.

Miss Consistent

Daniel's numbers are nothing new for LSU fans. The 2025 NFCA All-Region selection is a career .300 hitter inside or outside of SEC play for most of her career (working on in-conference average right now).

Last season, Daniel registered a .381 average on 40 hits, including two home runs, and had a .460 on-base percentage last season. She also scored 32 runs and drove in 19.

The veteran second baseman had a .970 fielding percentage in 2025 with 74 assists, 56 putouts and four errors. She had a 17-game and 13-game stretch without an error last season.

A True Overcomer

In August 2023 during a physical, it was discovered that Daniel had Wolff Parkinson White Syndrome, a heart condition that causes the heart to beat abnormally fast for periods of time.

With the help of our partners at Our Lady of the Lake, Daniel was able to have a procedure to address this issue. She missed roughly one week of practice in the fall of 2023 before being fully cleared to return with no complications.

Six Seven

Over the last 21 games since the Clearwater Invitational, infielder Kylee Edwards leads the team with a .362 batting average, 21 hits, seven extra-base hits, and 12 RBI. During that stretch she also had four three-hit games, three of which were done against Louisiana schools (ULL, McNeese, Nicholls).

On the season, K. Edwards is batting .295 with 26 hits, has scored 20 runs and is 7-for-7 in stolen bases.

NEWS AND NOTES

The Kylee Show

K. Edwards has strung together a few good outings now, but none better than at South Carolina (March 20-22). K. Edwards led LSU with a .455 batting average, a 1.000 slugging percentage and a .538 on-base percentage in the series win. She had a team-high five hits, four RBI and added three runs. She totaled 11 bases and hit her second home run and triple of the season.

K. Edwards has matched her single-game high of three hits for a fourth time in game one at South Carolina (March 20), where she was a double shy of hitting the cycle.

The junior infielder kept the good times rolling with her third home run of the season, a two-run shot against LA Tech (March 24).

K. Edwards had three hits twice over a four-game stretch, and capped a three-game hitting streak with her first home run as an LSU Tiger (vs. Memphis, Feb. 27) - the 15th of her career.

K. Edwards hit a walk-off triple as part of a 3-for-4 performance and two RBI outing against UL Lafayette (Feb. 21).

In the field, the shortstop has 59 assists (No. 6 in the SEC), 47 putouts and five errors. She has also turned six double plays.

The Glove Transfer

K. Edwards has been spotted wearing LSU All-American and now assistant coach Taylor Pleasants' old glove.

K. Edwards' began to wear Pleasants' glove in the fall when the former standout shortstop offered the newcomer to practice with it due to her glove being in a terrible condition.

Although she eventually got a new glove K. Edwards stated about Pleasants' glove "I found that it had the best pocket I've ever seen in my life."

"I know she [Pleasants] did good with it so I decided to keep it and it's worked pretty good for me so far."

K. Edwards plans to use the glove for the remainder of the season.

Staying in the South

K. Edwards, a 2025 NFCA South All-Region selection from Mississippi State, joined LSU with two years of eligibility remaining.

K. Edwards started in 111 games of the 112 appearances she has made in her collegiate career prior to 2026.

Last season, K. Edwards started all 58 games at shortstop and batted .290 with 47 hits, 34 runs and 37 ribbies. She had 18 extra-base hits, including nine homers, and had a .945 fielding percentage with 87 assists, 69 putouts and nine errors.

In two seasons at State, K. Edwards put together a .290 batting average with 83 hits and has 14 home runs.

Super Char

Utility player Char Lorenz has also had a big turnaround after the first two weekends of the season. In the next 17 games after the Clearwater Invitational, Lorenz led the Tigers with a .333 batting average, three home runs, 14 runs and 15 walks.

Lorenz is batting .269 on the season and has 21 hits, including four home runs, with 19 runs, 14 RBI and has drawn 21 walks.

In the field, she has seen time in left field and behind the plate, tallying 80 putouts, four assists and three errors.

Lorenz had two hits, including her fourth homer of the season in the SEC opening series at Tennessee, and recorded her fourth multi-hit game of the season at Nicholls.

A Breakout Weekend

Lorenz turned in a big weekend prior to the start of SEC play, where she batted .400 with all four of her hits being extra-base hits, including two solo home runs at McNeese (Feb. 24). It was the second time Lorenz had two homers in a game in her career (first at LSU).

She then had two doubles and four RBI against Iowa (Feb. 28), bringing her total for the week to seven ribbies and scored a team-high five runs. She also drew seven walks.

Lorenz hit the first home run for LSU in the 2026 season, a two-run shot in the 6-2 win over Nevada (Feb. 6).

She Has Promise

Lorenz came out and established herself quickly in college softball after being named a 2025 All-ACC selection as a freshman at Louisville.

Lorenz produced a .368 batting average and a .677 slugging percentage with 25 extra-base that included 11 doubles, five triples and nine home runs last season. Overall, Lorenz had 57 hits, scored 32 runs and had 13 stolen bases. Last season in the outfield, Lorenz had a .967 fielding percentage with 87 putouts, two assists and three errors.

Reunited

K. Edwards and Lorenz grew up near each other in Indiana and played club ball for the Indiana Magic Gold.

Franklin Is A Gamer

Head Coach Beth Torina has called utility player Alix Franklin a gamer and she was not lying.

Franklin has a 10 extra-base hits this season, five of which are triples, which leads the SEC and ranks No. 3 in the country. She also has two home runs after belting her second homer of the season against Texas A&M (March 17).

Overall, Franklin has a .262 batting average with 22 hits, 15 runs and 16 RBI. She also has assisted in two double plays from the outfield, a new position for the sophomore.

Franklin had a career-high three-hit game at Nicholls, where she was a home run shy of hitting for the cycle.

Slow Start, But Coming On

Tori Edwards leads the Tigers with six home runs after hitting a solo shot against LA Tech (March 24) and her first home run against an SEC opponent in the Texas A&M series. She also leads the team with 24 RBI and 24 walks this season. She is 7-for-7 in stolen bases and is batting .259 with 22 hits. She has five multi-hit and multi-RBI games this season.

Just Keep Swinging

Although drawing four walks in game one at South Carolina - the most walks in a game since Savannah Jaquish in 2017 - T. Edwards was 0-for-8 in the series before hitting the series-clinching two-run double in the series finale at South Carolina.

Tori Tanks

After putting up one of the greatest freshman campaigns in program history highlighted by 18 home runs, T. Edwards' second homer of the 2026 season made her the fastest player to reach 20 career home runs, taking just 68 games.

The Report Card

T. Edwards was selected as a 2025 NFCA All-American, and the 2025 SEC Freshman of the Year. She is the program's third SEC Freshman of the Year and first since Bianka Bell in 2013.

T. Edwards set a single-season program record with a .802 slugging percentage and tied for a program-best 18 home runs. She also ranked inside the top 10 with 73 RBI (No. 3) and an .495 on-base percentage (No. 9). Overall, T. Edwards led LSU with a .375 batting average behind 62 hits, scored 52 runs and drew 37 walks.

In the field, T. Edwards had 346 putouts at first base and tallied eight assists.

Louisiana's Finest

Catcher Maci Bergeron is batting .187 on 17 hits, including two home runs and six doubles. The senior has 17 RBI this season.

In the SEC home opening series against Texas A&M, Bergeron hit a two-run double for her 20th career multi-RBI game.

Bergeron is a 2025 NFCA All-American and All-SEC selection after a career season at the plate last season. She batted .364 behind 60 hits, had a .498 on-base percentage, tallied 49 RBI, 37 runs and drew 45 walks. Bergeron had 19 extra-base hits last season, including nine home runs. Bergeron's numbers in 2025 showed displayed her improvement compared to her numbers in her first two seasons.

The Cajun Cannon

Bergeron has been an asset behind the plate for the Tigers. She is the program's all-time leader with a career .995 fielding percentage with a minimum of 800 chances.

Last season, Bergeron recorded a .994 fielding percentage with 312 putouts, 13 assists and had two errors. The backstop threw out five runners trying to steal and participated in two double plays.

So far in 2026, Bergeron has thrown out four runners and has been apart of one double play. She has 125 putouts and eight assists with one error.

Smash Sisters and Company

The power of the Smash Sisters return in Bergeron and T. Edwards, who hit 27 of LSU's 42 home runs last season season and combined for 227 total bases.

The Smash Sisters will receive some additional help from three of their transfers in infielders Kylee Edwards (Mississippi State) and Ally Hutchins (Kentucky), and utility player Char Lorenz (Louisville). The trio brought a collective 35 home runs, 218 hits, 158 RBI and 376 total bases to Baton Rouge entering the 2026 season.

Geaux Hodge!

Infielder Avery Hodge hit her first home run of the season at Nicholls (March 10), accompanying a season-high three RBI.

Hodge led the Tigers at the plate in the SEC opening series at Tennessee with a .429 batting average on three hits. She also drew one walk to pace the team with a .500 on-base percentage.

Won't Be Denied

Hodge, who has played the hot corner mostly this season, has been solid defensively and has 36 assists and 34 putouts with four errors and has turned seven double plays in 21 starts. She had two double plays in the series at South Carolina (March 20-22).

Hodge earned the No. 8 top play on SportsCenter's Top 10 Plays with her diving catch in foul territory against NC State (Feb. 6). She has seven games this season with three assists, including a season-high five at No. 1 Tennessee (March 7).

Hodge played all 58 games at shortstop last season, where she shined with 110 assists and 69 putouts. She turned six double plays and recorded a career-high six assists in the NCAA Tournament victory against UConn (May 17, 2025).

Championship Pedigree

Hodge transferred to LSU last season after winning two National Championships at Oklahoma. In 2024 she had 21 hits, 28 runs and nine RBI and totaled six extra-base hits. In the 2024 Women's College World Series, Hodge tallied four hits, including two doubles and scored four runs to help the Sooners win the title.

This Was Always Destiny

Destiny Harris is making the most of her opportunities. In 10 starts and 25 games played, Harris has two two-run home runs as part of her nine hits, has 15 runs, and six RBI.

At South Carolina, Harris batted .750 in the series (3-for-4), scored a team-high four runs, drew a walk and stole a base.

Harris made her first collegiate start as a designated player, where she went 2-for-2 with two runs, two RBI and a walk against Michigan State (Feb. 21). Harris' first at-bat was a two-run shot before singleing later in the game for her first multi-hit game. Harris hit her second two-run homer in the run rule victory against Memphis (Feb. 27).

Kee Kee!

Utility player Maddox McKee is also taking advantage of whatever chance she gets to play. In game two against South Carolina (March 21), McKee went 2-for-2 at the dish, highlighted by a two-run triple.

Overall, McKee has a .261 batting average behind six hits, has six RBI and five runs in just six starts and 20 appearances.

McKee had a three-game hitting streak that included a 2-for-3 performance against Nicholls (Feb. 27), marking her 10th career multi-hit game.

McKee's first hit of the season was a double at McNeese on Feb. 24. Against the Cowgirls in her career, McKee has at least one single, double, triple and home run.

Staying Versatile

McKee is living up to her position title as she displays the flexibility to be placed anywhere on the field. After making 37 starts last season, mostly as the designated player, and had some time in the infield throughout her first two seasons, McKee has made 20 appearances and six starts this season in left and right field, or as the designated player.

Last season, McKee had a .284 batting average behind 29 hits, scored 21 runs and had 14 RBI. She also drew 15 walks and was 10-for-12 in stolen bases.

Easy to Root For

A locker room favorite, freshman Ci'ella Pickett tallied three hits and had an RBI in six at-bats in her two starts against Texas A&M as a designated player.

Pickett got her first collegiate start in the shutout against Memphis (Feb. 28), where she hit a double, had two RBI and scored a run offensively, while also recording four putouts and one assists at third base.

Pickett made a start at first base versus Nicholls (March 10), where she hit her second double of the season, driving in another run.

Overall, the California native is batting .300 with six hits, has two runs and four RBI in six starts and 12 appearances.

Welcome to the SEC

In her first SEC start, which was the series finale at Tennessee, freshman Rylie Johnson hit her first collegiate home run, a leadoff solo shot, sparking a four-run third inning.

On the season, Johnson has three hits, two RBI and four runs in eight starts and 14 appearances.

Gradie Gets the Hit

Freshman infielder Gradie Appling's first career hit was an RBI double against LA Tech (March 24) in the fourth inning to cap the 9-0 run-rule victory. She has also scored one run in five appearances as a pinch hitter or pinch runner.

Hutchins Dons the Purple & Gold

Infielder Ally Hutchins adds another dynamic to the LSU lineup. Through the first three games, Hutchins had a .571 batting average and a 1.143 slugging percentage highlighted by a solo shot in the rally walk-off win over NC State (Feb. 6).

In totality, Hutchins has a .189 batting average on 10 hits, eight RBI and has drawn 11 walks this season, including a career-high three walks at McNeese (Feb. 24).

Hutchins also has scored nine runs, and when she plays the hot corner, she has eight putouts with 13 assists and no errors.

A Proven Vet

Over the past two seasons, Hutchins has made 102 starts and played in 112 games at Kentucky. Entering 2026, she had a .267 career batting average on 78 hits, 59 runs, 45 RBI and 12 home runs. She also had a .900 career fielding percentage with 74 assists and 34 putouts entering the 2026 season.

Hutchins started in all 58 games last season, where she batted .285, recorded 45 hits, including six home runs, and scored 41 runs. She also showed great plate discipline with 46 walks, turning in a .451 on-base percentage.

NEWS AND NOTES

La-YES!!

Outfielder Jadyn Laneaux made 52 starts and played in 56 games last season in left field.

Laneaux had a .313 batting average with 45 hits, including eight doubles and a triple. She also had 33 runs, 24 RBI and 27 walks.

Laneaux registered a .989 fielding percentage as she led the outfield with 89 putouts and had one assist and one error.

USA Softball Top 50 Watch List

Catcher Maci Bergeron, utility player Tori Edwards and utility pitcher Jayden Heavener have been placed on USA Softball's Top 50 Watch List for the 2026 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year award. The SEC leads all conferences with 24 athletes on the watch list.

LSU has had multiple members on the Top 50 Watch List in each of the past four seasons, with three selections tied for the most entering a season (2016 and 2024). The Tigers have been represented on the watch list with at least one player in 14 consecutive seasons.

The Top 25 Finalists will be announced on Wednesday, April 29. While an athlete does not have to be on the watch list to be considered for the Top 25, the eventual recipient will be selected from the list of finalists. The Top 10 Finalists will be revealed on Wednesday, May 13, and the Top 3 released on Monday, May 18. The 2026 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year will be announced prior to the 2026 NCAA Women's College World Series, which is May 28 through June 5, in Oklahoma City.

Preseason All-SEC Rankings

The LSU Tigers have been picked to finish seventh in the 2026 SEC Softball Preseason Coaches Poll with 119 points, and has two players in 2025 NFCA All-Americans, Maci Bergeron and, Tori Edwards listed on the 2026 Preseason All-SEC Team.

Texas, the reigning National Champions is favored to win the SEC, totaling 189 points and nine first-place votes. Oklahoma, the 2025 regular season SEC Champions, come in at No. 2 with 186 votes and six first-place votes, and Tennessee rounds out the top three with 166 points. The full rankings are on page 13.

The 2026 Schedule Notes

LSU's 2026 53-game regular season schedule will featured 30 games against 14 participants in the 2025 NCAA Tournament, including four WCWS participants (Ole Miss, Oklahoma, Tennessee and UCLA).

The Tigers will play in four tournaments, hosting three of them, participate in seven midweek games, and host a three-game series against Arizona (April 10-12) at Tiger Park.

LSU opens its SEC schedule with a three-game series at Tennessee on March 6-8 before its home opening conference series against Texas A&M on March 14-16 at Tiger Park. Other SEC series hosted by the Bayou Bengals will be Oklahoma (March 27-29), Ole Miss (April 17-19) and Auburn (April 30-May 2).

LSU's other SEC road series will be at South Carolina (March 20-22), Missouri (April 2-4) and Mississippi State (April 24-26).

The 2026 SEC Tournament will be May 5-9 at John Cropp Stadium in Lexington, Ky.

Tigers on TV

LSU will be featured in 12 nationally televised games during the 2026 season. Seven of the televised games will be broadcasted on SEC Network, three on ESPN2, and two on ESPN. Six of the broadcasts will come from Tiger Park.

Four of LSU's five games at the 2026 Shriners Children's Clearwater Invitational (Feb. 12-15) in Clearwater, Fla., will be televised.

The series finale at Tennessee to conclude the league's opening weekend (March 8) will air on SEC Network, and two of the games in LSU's SEC home opening series against Texas A&M (March 15-16) will be shown on SEC Network.

LSU and Oklahoma will have a pair of morning games at Tiger Park televised. The first on SEC Network on March 28, and the other on ESPN on March 29.

The Tigers last tv matchup on the road will be at Missouri on April 4 on SEC Network. LSU will make its second appearance on ESPN with the series finale against Arizona on April 12, and then conclude the regular season on SEC Network with a contest against Auburn on May 2 in Baton Rouge.

Built From Within

The LSU 2026 softball roster features a blend of proven experience and new talent. Although the Tigers return 12 players, including seven starters, they also welcome 11 newcomers, the most newcomers in program history. With a smaller roster size of 23 athletes, it has bred a ton of internal competition. Early in the season, multiple players have rotated in the outfield and at third base, specifically.

Portal Pickups

Of the 11 newcomers, five are transfers, making up Coach Torina's largest portal haul.

LSU picked up a pair of transfer pitchers in Cece Cellura (San Diego State) and Paytn Monticelli (Wisconsin/Oklahoma), two infielders in Kylee Edwards (Mississippi State) and Ally Hutchins (Kentucky), and utility player Char Lorenz (Louisville).

True Freshmen

For the second consecutive season, LSU welcomes six true freshmen to the family, including utility player Gradie Appling (Juliette, Ga.), pitcher Cali Deal (Quitman, La.), outfielder Rylie Johnson (Spotsylvania, Va.), utility player Ashlin Mowery (Lancaster, Ohio), utility player Ciella Pickett (Mentone, Calif.), and pitcher Lauryn Soeken (Katy, Texas).

Softball Signed Seven to the 2027 Roster

Head coach Beth Torina announced in the fall the signing of seven players to the 2027 roster.

The 2026 signing class ranks No. 3 in the nation according to D1Softball and Rivals/Softball America. Rivals/Softball America has the class comprised of two five-stars, four four-stars, and one three-star athlete.

The Tigers signed catcher Samantha Alekman (El Dorado Hills, Calif.), infielder Giselle De Casas (Hayward, Calif.), pitcher Addie Rackley (Buford, Ga.), outfielder Adelynn Siegel (Shiner, Texas), pitcher Ayla Tuua (Murietta, Calif.), catcher Karmen Vazquez (Hanford, Calif.), and outfielder Sydnee Williams (Phoenix, Ariz).

Tigers in the AUSL

After a successful inaugural season, the Athletes Unlimited Softball League (AUSL) has expanded to six teams and has selected host cities for each team: Chicago Bandits (Rosemont, Ill.), Carolina Blaze (Durham, N.C.), Portland Cascade (Hillsboro, Ore.), Oklahoma City Spark (Oklahoma City, Okla.), Utah Talons (Salt Lake City, Utah), and Texas Volts (Austin, Texas).

LSU will have six former athletes in the AUSL this season. Pitcher Carley Hoover and utility player Ali Newland will be on the Portland Cascade, outfielder Aliyah Andrew joins utility player Savannah Jaquish on the Utah Talons, who are the defending 2025 AUSL Champions coached by former LSU Assistant Coach Howard Dobson (2012-2024), and outfielder Ciara Briggs and utility player Danieca Coffey remain with the Texas Volts.

D1Softball All-Quarter Century Team

With 25 college softball seasons this century in the books, head coaches Beth Torina and Yvette Girouard, and four-time All-American Savannah Jaquish were named to D1Softball's All-Quarter Century Team.

Coach Torina has brought four LSU teams to the Women's College World Series (2012, 2015-2017), and Coach Girouard has brought five teams across two programs (LSU and ULL) to the WCWS. Girouard, who has an all-time record of 1,285-421-1 over 31 seasons, is one of three coaches to take multiple programs to the WCWS.

Jaquish played from 2014-2017 and is the program's all-time leader with 268 RBI, and ranks No. 2 all-time with 56 home runs, a .632 slugging percentage and 472 total bases.
