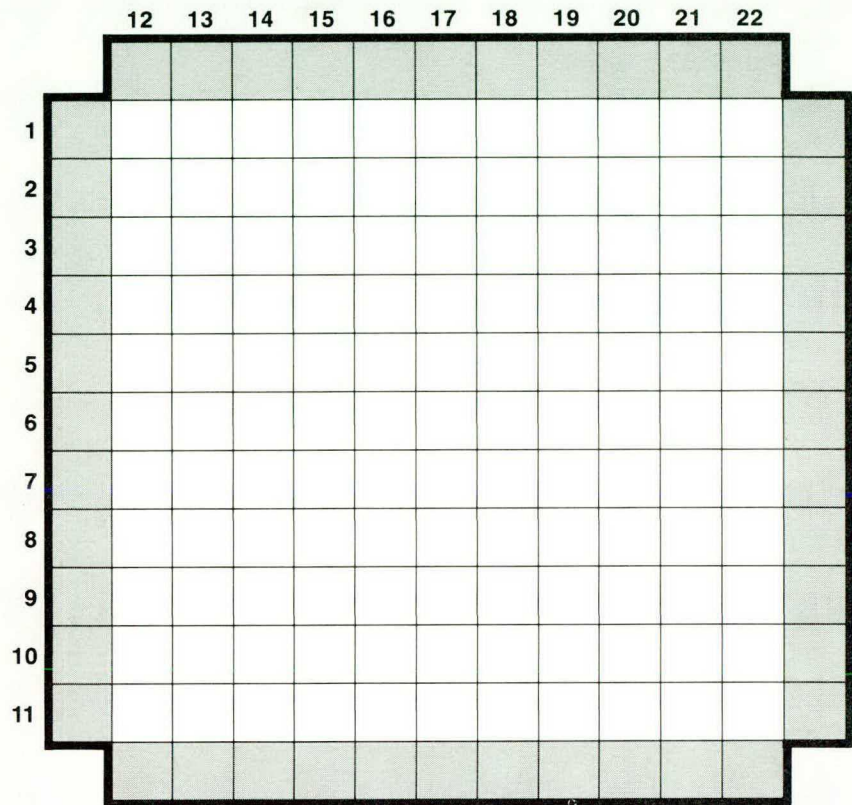


# THE PUZZLER

## SLIDE SHOW

The clues for each row or column yield answers totaling 11 letters. In some cases this sequence of letters may be placed entirely in the unshaded portion of the diagram; in other cases the sequence must be shifted intact so that it starts or ends in a shaded square, leaving one unshaded square to be filled by the intersecting row or column. The “projectors” (letters that slide into the shaded frame), when viewed clockwise from a spot to be determined, will display some surprising (we hope) camerawork. Answers to clues include nine proper nouns. The words clued second in row 4 and column 15 are not common.
