


- Hong Kong is an archipelago with a very long coastline:

Locations of 4 new marinas




Skytopia: 500 berths

SKYTOPIA

Invest**K** 25

- Unveiled in January 2025, SKYTOPIA is the new brand for Hong Kong International Airport (HKIA)'s enlarged Airport City.
- SKYTOPIA will be a destination for residents and visitors.
- 60 ha of land, surrounded by 200 ha of water.
- Target to invite for tender by end 2025/ early 2026.



The Airport Bay Marina:

- Hong Kong's largest yachtberthing facility - With around 500 short- and long-term berths
- Diverse range of yacht charters with local & visiting yachts of various sizes
- Air-ocean tourism hub
- Hong Kong as a center for the yacht industry


Hung Hom Waterfront Areas

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- Around 14 ha of land and around 10 ha of water body.
- Set to integrate a marina with hotel and commercial components.
- Enlivening Hung Hom Harbourfront, enriching visitor experience.

Hung Hom Marina Club:

- Positioned as a "Monaco-style" marina
- Between 150-200 berths, yachts up to 50-metres in length
- City's urban core: offer both yachting access and lifestyle appeal in a single, strategically located development

Marina Development at the Expansion Area of Aberdeen Typhoon Shelter (ATS)

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- Two distinct components: (1) the upgrade of the existing public mooring area, spanning approximately 14 hectares, and (2) the development of a brand-new marina.
- The HKSAR Government to carry out technical assessments and necessary statutory procedures; and invite
 developer to apply for construction and operation of the marina.
- Target to invite for land tender in 2027, subject to completion of expansion works and market views.

Expansion of Aberdeen Typhoon Shelter:


- Around 10 ha water body
- Up to 200 benths, accommodate yachts of up to 50-metres in length
- Nearby attractions and bluegreen resources: Deep Water Bay, Repulse Bay, Ocean Park Water World
- Promote island tourism

Development of the Ex-Lamma Quarry Area Invest K 25

- Three development elements: (1) Tourism and Recreation; (2) Marina; (3) Low-density housing.
- Aims to transform a disused quarry site into a high-end coastal destination.
- Single Developer Approach, target for estimated land disposal in late 2026.



- The proposal covers approximately 20 hectares of
- Around 10 ha water body
- About 150 200 berths, size of yachts ranging from 10m 50m
- Urban design features: use of iconic art and flora
