



Embroidery & Personalization Best Practices

It's best practice to use a thread color for your embroidery that contrasts with the color of the fabric that it will be sewed on. For example, if your logo is navy and your uniform program has navy scrubs, we would recommend altering your logo embroidery color to a lighter thread to contrast on the color of the darker navy scrubs.



For personalization, we recommend allowing employees to enter free-form text with a relevant prompt entered to provide suggested formatting
