- Sophomore TE Clive Walford's 56-yard catch and run in the first quarter was the longest reception of his career. It was the longest pass play of the season for the Canes. He also recorded his second career touchdown on a two-yard reception in the fourth quarter.
- Sophomore DE Anthony Chickillo ended the first quarter with a sack of Collin Klein. It was the Hurricanes' first sack of the 2012 season.
- Senior K Jake Wieclaw is now a perfect 4-for-4 on season after putting the Canes on the board with a 32-yard FG in the first quarter and adding a 27-yarder to close out the half.
- Redshirt freshman LB Eddie Johnson started his first game for the Hurricanes and recorded a career high in tackles with seven stops (three solo, four assist).
- Senior CB Brandon McGee's third-quarter interception of Collin Klein was the second of his career and the first since picking one off against USF in 2011.
- Sophomore WR Rayshawn Scott collected career high in catches and receiving yards with four and 39, respectively.
- Freshman RB Duke Johnson racked up a career-high 77-yard kickoff return in the fourth quarter to help setup a touchdown.
- Sophomore QB Ryan Williams recorded his first touchdown pass as a Hurricane in the fourth quarter. He now has 14 career passing touchdowns.
- Junior DL Shayon Green led the Hurricanes with a career-high eight tackles, including one 19-yard tackle for loss.
- Sophomore DL Olsen Pierre made a career-high seven stops on defense. He also forced a fumble.
- In his second career game, freshman DB Deon Bush made six tackles and forced a fumble.
