MISCELLANEOUS AND SERIES NOTES

- Miami leads the series against Arkansas State 2-0. The Canes beat the Red Wolves 42-10 on Nov. 1, 1997 in Miami.

TEAM NOTES

- The Hurricanes' defensive starters were Thurston Armbrister, Artie Burns, Deon Bush, Anthony Chickillo, Dallas Crawford, Ladarius Gunter, Calvin Heurtelou, Raphael Kirby, Tyriq McCord, Denzel Perryman and Olsen Pierre.
- Miami's offensive starters were Braxton Berrios, Phillip Dorsett, Jon Feliciano, Ereck Flowers, Taylor Gadbois, Danny Isidora, Duke Johnson, Brad Kaaya, Malcolm Lewis, Shane McDermott and Clive Walford.
- The first Canes touchdown drive was a 37-second drive completed by Brad Kaaya's 63-yard pass to Phillip Dorsett. It was Miami's quickest offensive scoring drive since a 32-second drive on Nov. 16, 2013.
- Miami went 2 for 2 in the red zone.
- The Hurricanes forced two fumbles. It was the first time Miami forced multiple fumbles in a game since Nov. 9, 2013 (vs. Virginia Tech) and the first time the team had done so in a non-conference game since Sep. 7, 2013 (vs. Florida).
- This is the second game in a row that the Hurricanes scored 40+ points. The last time the Canes scored 40+ in back-to-back games was against Virginia on November 23, 2013 and then Pittsburgh on November 29, 2013.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Brad Kaaya passed for a career-high 342 yards (previous high: 179 yards at Louisville on Sept. 1). It was the most passing yards for a Miami true freshman quarterback in a single game in Hurricanes history.
- Phillip Dorsett recorded 201 receiving yards. It was the third time in program history that a player had over 200 receiving yards. Wesley Carroll had 208 yards at California on Sep. 15, 1990 and Eddie Brown had 220 yards vs. Boston College on November 23, 1984.
- Duke Johnson moved past Willis McGahee for eighth place in program history in career rushing yards with a 33-yard touchdown run in the first quarter. Duke Johnson's career total is currently 2,144 and is 18 yards away from Javarris James' career total of 2,162.
- Duke Johnson's first quarter touchdown tied him for 10th in program history in career rushing touchdowns.
- Brad Kaaya was the first freshman quarterback to record four passing touchdowns since Jacory Harris (at Duke, Oct. 18, 2008). Kaaya was the first Canes quarterback to pass for four touchdowns since Stephen Morris (NC State, Sep. 29, 2012, who had five that game).
- Brad Kaaya is one of seven quarterbacks in school history with at least four passing touchdowns in a single game. There have been a total of 15 instances.
- Phillip Dorsett's 201 receiving yards were the second-most by any ACC player in a single game this season (most: Pitt's James Conner 214 yards at Boston College on Sep. 5, 2014).
- It was Dorsett's fifth-career 100-yard receiving game (previous: at Georgia Tech on Sep. 22, 2012, NC State on Sep. 29, 2012, at Virginia on Nov. 10, 2012 and USF on Nov. 17, 2012).
- Brad Kaaya threw a pair of 63-yard touchdowns to Phillip Dorsett. The touchdown passes were the longest passes of Kaaya's career (previous high: 32-yard pass to Dorsett vs. Florida A&M on Sep. 6).
- Raphael Kirby recorded his first career interception, in the 2nd quarter.
- Olsen Pierre recorded his first career fumble recovery.
- Darrion Owens recorded the first three tackles and the first pass breakup of his career.
- Braxton Berrios caught his first career touchdown pass, a six-yard reception.
- Braxton Berrios caught a career-long 33-yard pass.
- Clive Walford scored his second touchdown of the season and his ninth touchdown of his career.
- Thurston Armbrister recorded a career-best and a team-high nine tackles.
- Jamal Carter tied a career-high with six tackles. (Last six-tackle performance: FAU on August 30, 2013)
