MISCELLANEOUS AND SERIES NOTES

- Miami's appearance in the 2014 Duck Commander Independence Bowl marked its 38th bowl game in school history.
- The Hurricanes own a 19-19 overall record in bowl games.
- Miami's appearance in the Duck Commander Independence Bowl marked the second-consecutive season in which it has competed in the postseason.
- Miami's visit to the Duck Commander Independence Bowl marked the Canes' fifth trip to the state of Louisiana for a bowl game.
- Miami's matchup against South Carolina marked the first time the two teams have faced off against one another since 1987.

- Miami outgained South Carolina 422-354 in total offense.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES - OFFENSE

- Junior running back Duke Johnson has tied Miami's record for career 100-yard games with 14. He also tied former Hurricane running backs Clinton Portis and Edgerrin James.
- Johnson finished the game with 132 yards on the ground and ended the year with 1,652 rushing yards.
- Johnson finished the year with 2,070 all-purpose yards and in the process has passed himself and is now second in single season all-purpose yardage.
- Johnson finished the season with 242 rushing attempts, tying Edgerrin James for second on the all-time single season list. His 499 career attempts ranks him fourth at Miami.
- Freshman quarterback Brad Kaaya surpassed 3,000 yards passing on the year. He finished the year with 3,194 yards through the air, which ranks seventh all-time on the single season list.
- Kaaya finished the game with 27 attempts to end the season with 378, which ranks eighth all-time amongst Hurricanes for a single season.
- Kaaya tied Vinny Testaverde for third place at Miami with 26 passing touchdowns in a single season.
- Kaaya surpassed Stephen Morris and Gino Torretta to move into ninth on the single season total offense list (3,067).
- Kaaya finished the year with 221 completions, passing Gino Torretta, Brock Berlin and Vinny Testaverde for seventh in a single season (221).
- Senior wide receiver Phillip Dorsett had five receptions to pass Willie Brown and Kellen Winslow, Jr. on the career receptions list and move into a tie with Allen Hurns and Clive Walford for seventh place (121).
- Dorsett also passed Michael Irvin, himself, Willie Smith, and Michael Irvin again for seventh in single season receiving yardage (871).
- Dorsett also moved into a tie with Lamar Thomas, Reggie Wayne and Andre Johnson for third in single season touchdown receptions (10).
- Sophomore wide receiver Malcolm Lewis finished with a single game career-high 56 yards receiving.
- Senior offensive lineman Jonathan Feliciano moves into sole possession of sixth most starts (46).

INDIVIDUAL NOTES - DEFENSE

- Senior linebacker Denzel Perryman led th team with eight tackles. He finished the year with 110 tackles.
- Senior defensive lineman Anthony Chickillo ties former Hurricane Jason Fox for the fourth most total starts (47).
- Chickillo tied William Joseph and Matt Walters for second most consecutive games played (50). He also ties six players for fourth most total games played (50).

INDIVIDUAL NOTES - SPECIAL TEAMS

- Kicker Michael Badgley drilled a pair of field goals in the first half, connecting from 27 and 26 yards out.
