SU Storylines

1. SU is 18-0 for the third time in the last four years and the fourth time during Coach Boeheim's tenure.
2. Tyler Ennis is fourth in assist turnover ratio (4.13) through games of Jan. 19.
3. Syracuse is one of three unbeaten teams in the Division I ranks.
4. Coach Jim Boeheim ranks second in Division I coaching wins with 938.
5. SU has been ranked in 87 straight Associated Press Polls (Jan. 20 Poll)

SU And Miami -- Round 2

#2/2 Syracuse (18-0, 5-0) completes its home-and-home series with Miami (10-8, 2-4) when in plays the Hurricanes at the Bank United Center on January 25. It is Syracuse's first game at Miami since the 2003-04 season.

The Orange have a 15-5 advantage, including a 49-44 win on January 4, in the series with Miami. SU has won the last three meetings and four of the last five.

SU is 4-0 and Miami 2-2 since the earlier matchup. The Orange defeated #22/21 Pittsburgh in its most recent contest, 59-54. The Hurricanes lost to Duke on January 22, 67-46. The Blue Devils had a 42-28 rebound advantage in the game and outscored Miami on second-chance points, 22-7.

Syracuse and Miami rank 1-2 in scoring defense in the ACC (league games only). The Orange have yielded just 50.8 points and the Hurricanes 56.5 in league play.

Jim Larranaga is in his third season at the Miami helm. He has led the Hurricanes to a 59-28 record during his tenure and has an overall head-coaching mark of 529-362.

Senior guard Rion Brown leads Miami in scoring average (13.4 ppg.) and ranks second in rebound average (6.2). Forward Donnavan Kirk, a graduate student, is averaging 10.0 points and a squad-best 6.4 boards.

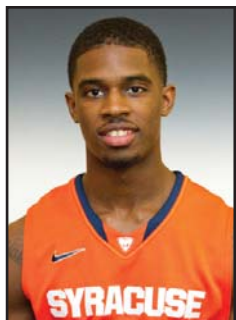

- ✓ **Jan. 20: Tyler Ennis** was named ACC Rookie of the Week. He averaged 14.0 points and 4.0 assists in two wins.
- ✓ **Jan. 18:** Down by three with under three minutes remaining, Syracuse rallied to outscore Pittsburgh, 10-2 the rest of the way and win, 59-54. Tyler Ennis had three straight baskets for SU in the final 1:48 and ended up with 16 points.
- ✓ **C.J. Fair** had 13 points and **Jerami Grant** 12 in front of 30,046 at the Dome.
- ✓ **Jan. 13:** Trailing by eight with 14:40 left in the contest, the Orange used a 21-4 run to take the lead and eventually defeat Boston College, 69-59. **Trevor Cooney** had seven of his game-high 21 points during the stretch.
- ✓ **Jerami Grant** had 16 points and **Tyler Ennis** had 12 points, five assists and six steals in the win at BC.
- ✓ **Jan. 11:** Syracuse held North Carolina to its lowest point total since 1997 and defeated the Tar Heels, 57-45. The game was played in front of the season's top crowd -- 32,121.
- ✓ **Jan. 11: C.J. Fair** had 20 points and **Jerami Grant** had a career-best 12 rebounds to go with 12 points for his third double-double of the season.
- ✓ **Jan. 7:** The Orange used a 16-0, second-half run to win at Virginia Tech, 72-52. **Jerami Grant** had 12 points and 10 rebounds for his second double-double.
- ✓ **C.J. Fair** led four double-digit scorers with 17 against the Hokies.
- ✓ **Jan. 4:** Syracuse defeated Miami, 49-44, in the first ACC game in program history. The Orange closed the game with a 14-4 run to beat the Hurricanes.
- ✓ **C.J. Fair** had a game-high 15 points and SU won a regulation game in which it scored in the 40s for the first time since the 1962-63 season.

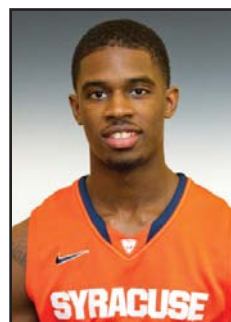

- ✓ **Dec. 31:** SU finished an unblemished non-conference schedule by defeating Eastern Michigan, 70-48. It marked the program's 51st consecutive non-conference victory in the Dome.
- ✓ **Jerami Grant** made his first start of the season and scored nine of his 15 points in the first 4:24 of play against the Eagles. **Rakeem Christmas** tied his career-high with 15 points.
- ✓ **Dec. 28:** In a battle of unbeaten teams, SU defeated Villanova, 78-62, in front of the season's largest on-campus crowd at the Dome (28,135).
- ✓ The Orange rebounded from a 25-7 deficit by tallying 20 unanswered points. **Trevor Cooney** had a squad-best 21 points, including five 3-pointers for the second straight outing. **Tyler Ennis** added 20 points.
- ✓ **Dec. 20:** Syracuse used a 28-3, second-half run to put away High Point and eventually win, 75-54. **Trevor Cooney** had 17 points, including five 3-pointers.
- ✓ **C.J. Fair** had 15 points against the Panthers and **Tyler Ennis** added 10 points, nine assists and five steals
- ✓ **Dec. 15:** **Tyler Ennis** and **C.J. Fair** each scored 21 points to lead Syracuse past St. John's, 68-63. Ennis had 15 of his points in the first half and finished 10-of-10 from the foul line.
- ✓ Syracuse scored 10 of the last 13 points to overcome a two-point, second-half deficit and beat the Red Storm.
- ✓ **Dec. 7:** Five players scored in double digits and SU had an 18-0, first-half stretch, which helped the Orange beat Binghamton, 93-65. **DaJuan Coleman** had 13 points and 10 boards and **C.J. Fair** had 19 points.
- ✓ **Dec. 3:** Syracuse used a 12-0, second-half run, to pull away from a 33-33 tie and eventually defeat rv/23 Indiana in the Big 10/ACC Challenge, 69-52.
- ✓ **Trevor Cooney** had a game-high 21 points and had five three-pointers and four steals. **Tyler Ennis** contributed 17 points, a team-best seven rebounds and eight assists, and four steals.

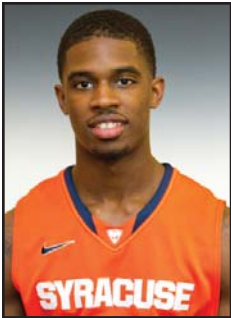

- ✓ **C.J. Fair** was named MVP of the EA Sports Maui Invitational. Over the three games, he averaged 18.0 points, 6.3 rebounds and 2.0 steals per contest. **Jerami Grant** was selected to the all-tournament team.
- ✓ **Nov. 27:** Syracuse captured its third EA Sports Maui Invitational in three tries when it defeated Baylor, 74-67. The Orange improved its record to 10-0 in the event.
- ✓ **C.J. Fair** had 14 of his 24 points in the second half and **Jerami Grant** added 19 off the bench for the Orange.
- ✓ **Nov. 26:** **Tyler Ennis** had a career-high 28 points and Trevor Cooney added 23 points to help SU defeat California, 92-81, in the EA Sports Maui Invitational semifinals.
- ✓ **Jerami Grant** had a career-best 19 points and the Orange took advantage of a 13-2, second-half run. SU was 23-of-24 (.958) from the line.
- ✓ **Nov. 25:** **C.J. Fair** tallied his first double-double of the season with 16 points and 10 boards to lead SU past Minnesota in the EA Sports Maui Invitational, 75-67.
- ✓ **Trevor Cooney** had 15 points on five 3-pointers and Tyler Ennis contributed 12 points, five assists and five steals without committing a turnover.
- ✓ **Nov. 18:** Trailing by four with 4:10 left, the Orange went on a 10-0 run to edge St. Francis Brooklyn, 56-50. **Jerami Grant** scored four of SU's last eight points.
- ✓ The Syracuse win against St. Francis Brooklyn was the first game in the EA Sports Maui Invitational. **Dajuan Coleman** tied his career-best effort with 14 points. He was 5-of-5 from the field and 4-of-4 from the line.
- ✓ **Nov. 16:** Syracuse defeated Colgate for the 48th straight time, beating the Raiders, 69-50. It represents the longest active win streak versus one school in Division I.
- ✓ **C.J. Fair** had 20 points against Colgate.
- ✓ **Nov. 12:** **C.J. Fair** had a career-high 26 points to lead Syracuse past Fordham, 89-74. SU led by as many as 27 and never trailed in the contest.
- ✓ **Jerami Grant** posted the first double-double of his career with 16 points and 10 rebounds versus the Rams. **Dajuan Coleman** had 10 points and 10 boards.
- ✓ **Nov. 11:** **Trevor Cooney** was named the season's first ACC Player of the Week. He had 27 points, three rebounds, two assists and four steals against Cornell.
- ✓ **Nov. 8:** The Orange opened the regular season by beating Cornell, 82-60. It was SU's 34th straight victory versus Cornell.
- ✓ SU trailed by 14 in the first half by **Trevor Cooney** keyed a comeback with a career-high 27 points. He had a personal-best seven 3-pointers.
- ✓ **Nov. 5:** Syracuse defeated Ryerson from Canada, 81-46. The Orange used a 16-0, second-half run to tame the Tigers in the second exhibition game.
- ✓ **C.J. Fair** had a game-high 18 points. **Dajuan Coleman** had 11 points and 10 rebounds and **Rakeem Christmas** contributed 10 points and eight boards.

Joseph, McCullough Sign NLI With Syracuse

Guard Kaleb Joseph from Cushing Academy (Mass.) and forward Chris McCullough from IMG Academy (Fla.) have signed national letters of intent with Syracuse.

Cushing Academy is off to a 6-2 start his season under Coach Barry Connors. Joseph has been a steady contributor and had a season-high 37 points in a contest against Canarias Basketball Academy in Spain. A season ago, Joseph helped the Penguins to a 24-5 record and victory in the New England Class AA Championship game.

The 6-3 Joseph is a four-star recruit rated as the number 10 point guard and 47th overall in the Class of 2014 by *ESPN Scout.com* has him ranked 16th among point guards and 65th overall while *Rivals.com* has Joseph 55th overall.

McCullough enrolled in IMG Academy this winter. He already owns a 26-point performance.

The 6-10 McCullough played at Brewster Academy (N.H.) a season ago. He helped the squad to a 32-6 overall record, which included a loss in the National Prep School Championship game.

Brewster Academy won the New Hampshire Prep Classic, the Brewster Invitational, the New Hampton School Tournament and the NEPSAC Class AAA title. McCullough was first team All-NEPSAC Class AAA.

The National Letter-of-Intent program was started in 1964. Administered by the Collegiate Commissioners Association (CCA), the program was designed with prospective student-athletes in mind. A signed letter-of-intent indicates a prospective student-athlete agrees to attend the designated college or university for one academic year. Institutions agree to provide athletics financial aid for one academic year to the student-athlete, provided the student-athlete is admitted to the institution and is eligible for financial aid under NCAA rules.

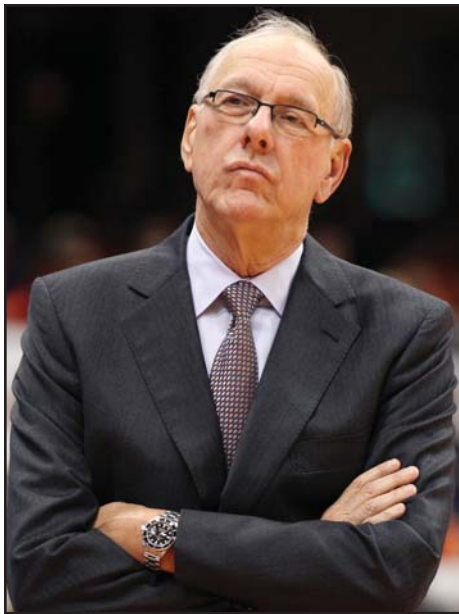

Boeheim Second All-Time In Wins

Jim Boeheim earned the 938th win of his coaching career when Syracuse defeated #22/21 Pittsburgh on January 18, 59-54.

Boeheim, Mike Krzyzewski and Bob Knight are the only three Division I coaches who have accumulated 900 triumphs. Boeheim is the only one of the three to reach the milestone at one school. He is second on the all-time Division I list, having moved past Bob Knight during the 2012-13 season.

On December 17, 2012 he picked up the 900th triumph in a 72-68 victory against Detroit. He moved past Knight and into second when SU defeated Rutgers, 78-53, on January 2, 2013.

The Book On Boeheim

Boeheim owns a career record of 938-314 (.749). He is second among active Division I coaches in wins, trailing only Mike Krzyzewski (Duke). Boeheim is second on the all-time Division I victory list and is 10th among active Division I coaches in winning percentage.

Only Jim Phelan (Mt. St. Mary's, 1,354 games) has logged more than Boeheim's 1,252 games for coaches who have served at only one institution.

The 2013 NCAA berth gave SU 36 post-season appearances under Boeheim, including 30 NCAA Tournaments. His SU teams have claimed 21-or-more games in 32 seasons and 30-or-more six times. He has guided his alma mater to the NCAA title game three times, winning it for the first time in 2003.

Boeheim And Montgomery Set NCAA Tournament Standard

An NCAA Tournament standard was set when long-time colleagues Jim Boeheim and Mike Montgomery matched coaching moves on March 23 in the third round of the event. The duo combined for the most wins by two mentors in an NCAA Tournament game. At tip-off Boeheim had 917 career wins and Montgomery 656 for 1,573 total.

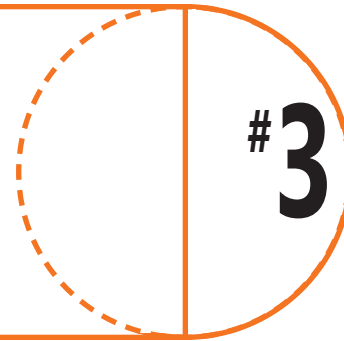

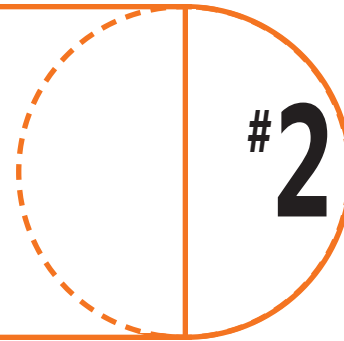

SYRACUSE, N.Y. – Syracuse outscored Cornell 32-10 over the first 10 minutes of the second half and the No. 8/7 Orange opened the 2013-14 campaign with an 82-60 victory over Cornell.

"I thought we did a good job of finding Trevor (Cooney). He bailed us out when we really needed him in the first half, when we really had nothing. He hit those two threes to get us close at halftime" – Coach Boeheim

Redshirt sophomore Trevor Cooney led all players with a career-high 27 points. He was a blistering 7-of-8 from behind the arc and added a game-best four steals.

MAUI, HAWAII – Syracuse defeated Baylor 74-67 to claim the school's third EA Sports Maui Invitational title.

The Orange improved to 10-0 all-time in the Maui Invitational, last winning the tournament in 1990 and 1998. Senior C.J. Fair scored 24 and was named the Most Valuable Player while sophomore Jerami Grant earned all-tournament honors following a 19-point effort.

SU started the game with 10 of the first 12 points, including consecutive threes by Ennis and Fair. Baylor hit its next four trifectas to give the Bears a 16-14 cushion. It would be Baylor's last lead as the Orange responded with a 19-4 run over the next six minutes for a 33-20 lead.

A 10-3 spurt from Baylor closed the gap to 36-30 and SU took a 38-30 edge into the break.

SU's lead bounced between four and 14 for the entire second half. Leading 56-50 with 8:34 remaining in the game, Grant converted a pair of three-point plays to help Syracuse match its largest margin at 66-52.

The Bears followed that up with eight unanswered points to get back within 66-60 with 3:07 to go, but never got closer than five down the stretch.

Free throw shooting proved to be crucial for the Orange in the third straight contest. Syracuse went 10-of-11 from the charity stripe and made all four of its free throws in the final 30 seconds.

Redshirt sophomore Trevor Cooney scored a game-high 21 points, including 12 during the Orange's decisive run. Freshman Tyler Ennis contributed 17 points and game highs of eight assists, seven rebounds and four steals.

SU's big run started on a layup by sophomore DaJuan Coleman, 2:31 into the second half, and was capped by a Cooney dunk with 7:26 to go – a span of 10:03 – to give SU its largest lead at 58-37. The Orange advantage never dipped below 17 points for the remainder of the game.

Syracuse came out of the gate by scoring the contest's first 10 points behind two three's from Cooney. With SU ahead 23-14, Indiana stormed back with 13 of the next 16 points to take its only lead of the night at 27-26 with 3:28 left in the half. The Orange answered with the next four points and a Cooney three-ball with 38 seconds left had SU ahead at the half, 33-29.

Indiana tied the score at 33-33 just over two minutes into the second, but Syracuse opened the game up with 12 unanswered points to spark the 25-4 spurt. During the stretch, SU held the Hoosiers without a basket for 12:43.

The victory extended SU's home, non-conference winning streak to 48 games while the 93 points was a season-high. Syracuse held a commanding 28-13 advantage in second-chance points and 34-4 edge in points off turnovers.

Senior C.J. Fair led all SU players with 19 points and tied with redshirt sophomore Trevor Cooney for a game-high four steals. Cooney was right behind Fair with 17 points while going 5-of-9 from behind the arc. DaJuan Coleman had 13 points and 10 rebounds.

After a layup by Miami cut the deficit to one, freshman Tyler Ennis made a layup then he and redshirt sophomore Trevor Cooney sealed the victory with two free throws each in the final minute.

Senior C.J. Fair posted a game-high 15 points, to go along with six rebounds. Ennis added 10 points, seven assists and three steals.

The teams traded the lead six times in the opening six minutes until a 10-2 run put the Orange ahead 17-11 with 11:32 left in the half. After consecutive Hurricane layups, a Fair basket and Cooney three gave Syracuse its largest lead of the game at 22-15.

SU went 7-of-8 from the free throw line in the last 65 seconds to secure the victory.

SU outscored the Panthers 11-5 over the final 5:59 of play. With Syracuse trailing 52-51, Ennis sliced through the lane for a score to put the Orange on top for good. He added a layup and SU sealed the win with four free throws.

Ennis finished with a team-high 16 points, with 14 of those coming after the intermission. Senior C.J. Fair added 13 points and squad bests of six rebounds and three blocks.

After Pitt scored seven of the game's first nine points, Syracuse recorded seven straight points to go ahead for the first time at 9-7. The teams traded the advantage twice over the next three minutes with SU ultimately grabbing the lead for the remainder of the half after another seven-point run that pushed the score to 15-12.

Pitt was able to get within two at 23-21 with three minutes left in the half, but a pair of free throws by SU set the halftime score at 25-21.

SU took its largest lead of the game at 37-27 following an Ennis trifecta that capped a 10-2 run. Pittsburgh's Lamar Patterson responded by hitting a three-pointer on three consecutive trips to get the Panthers back within 39-36.

Over the next six minutes, both squads continued to go back and forth until Pitt scored six straight to pull even at 46-46. Fair made a jumper to put SU back on top, but Patterson nailed his fourth three of the half to give the Panthers a 49-48 edge.
