MISCELLANEOUS AND SERIES NOTES

- The University of Miami 1989 National Championship team was honored at halftime.
- Miami is 13-2 over its last 15 home games and 6-2 over its last eight home ACC games.

TEAM NOTES

- The Hurricanes' defensive starters were Anthony Chickillo, Olsen Pierre, Calvin Heurtelou, Tyriq McCord, Raphael Kirby, Denzel Perryman, Thurston Armbrister, Ladarius Gunter, Artie Burns, Nantambu-Akil Fentress, Deon Bush.
- Miami's offensive starters were Ereck Flowers, Jon Feliciano, Shane McDermott, Danny Isidora, Trevor Darling, Standish Dobard, Clive Walford, Duke Johnson, Stacy Coley, Phillip Dorsett.
- In the first quarter, Miami outgained Florida State 183-14 (150-10 passing and 33-4 rushing). The Canes had six first downs, while the Noles had none. UM was 5-for-5 on third downs, while FSU was 0-for-3.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES - OFFENSE

- Running back Duke Johnson rushed for 130 yards and in the process surpassed 100 yards rushing for the 13th time in his career. His 13 career 100 yard games is tied for third all-time with Ottis Anderson. The 100-yard game is his sixth-consecutive this season.
- Johnson's first quarter score tied him for fifth all-time in rushing touchdowns (26) with Melvin Bratton and Tyrone Moss. It also tied him for fifth all-time in total touchdowns with Willis McGahee.
- Johnson recorded 167 all-purpose yards to become the first Miami Hurricane ever to surpass 5,000 career all-purpose yards. He moved into fifth place on the single-season all-purpose yardage list.
- Brad Kaaya's two touchdown passes moved him into a tie for eighth in single-season with 22 passing touchdowns.
- Kaaya finished the game with 316 yards passing, the third time in his career he has thrown for more than 300 yards.
- Wide Receiver Phillip Dorsett recorded 90 receiving yards to pass Allen Hurns for seventh on the Hurricanes' all-time list.
- Phillip Dorsett's first quarter touchdown tied him for eighth with Allen Hurns in all-time receiving touchdowns.
- Tight end Clive Walford surpassed 1,500 career receiving yards with a 22-yard first quarter reception.
- Clive Walford recorded his first 100-yard game of the season and the second of his career (135 receiving yards vs. USF on Nov. 17, 2012).
- The Hurricanes did not punt in the first half.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES - DEFENSE

- Linebacker Raphael Kirby recorded his first career forced fumble in the third quarter. He also recorded his second career pass breakup (previous at Pittsburgh on Nov. 29, 2013).
- Defensive lineman Calvin Huertelou recorded his first career fumble recovery in the third quarter.
- Safety Deon Bush's second-quarter interception was the third pick of his career. Two of Bush's interceptions have come against Heisman Trophy winner Jameis Winston.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES - SPECIAL TEAMS

- Michael Badgley kicked a career-long 45-yard field goal in the second quarter. Then, in the fourth quarter Badgley extended his career-long with a 46-yard field goal (previous long: 42 yards vs. Cincinnati on Oct. 11).
