MISCELLANEOUS AND SERIES NOTES

- Miami's victory over Cincinnati kept the Hurricanes' perfect record at home this season intact. This win also helped the Hurricanes improve to 12-1 in its last 13 home games.
- Since moving to Sun Life Stadium in 2008, Miami owns a 15-2 mark at home against non-conference opponents.
- With the win over Cincinnati, Miami improved to 11-1 all-time against the Bearcats. The Hurricanes have never lost to the Bearcats in Miami.
- The win over the Bearcats also gave Miami its ninth-consecutive win at home over non-conference opponents.
- The Hurricanes only loss to Cincinnati occurred in 1947.

TEAM NOTES

- The Hurricanes' defensive starters were Anthony Chickillo, Calvin Heurtelou, Olsen Pierre, Tyriq McCord, Thurston Armbrister, Denzel Perryman, Raphael Kirby, Artie Burns, Ladarius Gunter, Nantambu-Akil Fentress and Deon Bush.
- Miami's offensive starters were Ereck Flowers, Nick Linder, Shane McDermott, Danny Isidora, Jonathan Feliciano, Clive Walford, Brad Kaaya, Phillip Dorsett, Braxton Berrios and Malcolm Lewis.
- Miami led Cincinnati 24-10 at the half. Miami outgained Cincinnati 353-192 at the half.
- Miami outgained Cincinnati 621-422 at the end of the game.
- The Canes were held scoreless on their first offensive series for the first time five games. The Canes have scored first in 11 of their last 12 games.
- It was Miami's highest-scoring game since Sept. 21, 2013 when the Canes scored 77 points against Savannah State. It is the most points UM has scored against an FBS opponent since Dec. 7, 2002 (56 vs. Virginia Tech).

INDIVIDUAL NOTES - OFFENSE

Quarterbacks

- Quarterback Brad Kaaya finished the game with 286 yards passing, going 17-of-24 through the air. He also threw for three scores.
- Kaaya has thrown for multiple touchdowns in each of his four games this season at Sun Life Stadium.
- Kaaya surpassed 200 yards passing for the fifth-consecutive week.
- Kaaya completed passes to eight different receivers for the third straight week.

Running Backs

- Duke Johnson passed Ottis Anderson (4,265) and Santana Moss (4,394) today for the most career all-purpose yards in Hurricanes history. Johnson now has 4,427 (178 today) all-purpose yards.
- Johnson's 80-yard touchdown run moved him past Clinton Portis for fourth on the all-time rushing list. It also moved him past Portis for career touchdowns. Johnson currently has 22 career touchdowns.
- Duke Johnson's 80-yard touchdown run is tied for the eighth longest rush from scrimmage in school history. It is the longest rush since Clinton Portis had an 82-yard run against McNeese State on Aug. 31, 2000.
- Johnson finished the game with 162 yards on the ground and in the process posted 100 yards rushing-or-more for the 10th time in career.
- Duke Johnson (162) and Joe Yearby (113) each rushed for over 100 yards. It is the first time that two Hurricanes have done so in the same game since Nov. 29, 2003 (Pittsburgh). Leonard Conley (120), Melvin Bratton (118) and Warren Williams (104) are the only three players to have 100 or more rushing yards in a single game. They did so against Cincinnati on Oct. 24, 1987.
- The two 100-yard rushers marks the 10th time that a pair of Miami players have done so since 1980.
- Joe Yearby rushed for a career-high 113 yards.

Wide Receivers

- Senior wide receiver Phillip Dorsett caught three passes for a team-best 143 yards.
- Dorsett two touchdowns marked the fourth time in his career in which he has tallied multiple touchdown receptions.
- With today's performance, Phillip Dorsett now has 1,811 career receiving yards, which places him ninth place all-time. Dorsett passed Wesley Carroll (1,722) and Eddie Brown (1,754).

Tight Ends

- Clive Walford scored his fourth touchdown of the season on a 14-yard reception. This was the 11th touchdown of his career.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES - DEFENSE

Linebackers

- Tyriq McCord recorded his first career touchdown with a 46-yard interception return in the third quarter. It was the third interception of McCord's career.
- Raphael Kirby recorded his second interception of the season.

Defensive Backs

- Jermaine Grace had a career-high eight tackles.
- Ladarius Gunter recorded his sixth career interception.
- Artie Burns had a career-high 3 pass breakups (previous high: 1, five times, last vs. Duke on Sept. 24, 2014).
- Artie Burns recorded his first career sack.
- Nantambu-Akil Fentress totaled a career-high seven tackles.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES - SPECIAL TEAMS

- Kicker Michael Badgley's connected on a career-long 42-yard field goal in the second quarter.
- Badgley finished the game with a career high two field goals and seven PATs. He totaled 13 points.
