MISCELLANEOUS AND SERIES NOTES

- With the loss, Miami dropped to 9-11 all-time against Georgia Tech.
- Miami fell to Georgia Tech for the first time since 2008. The Hurricanes had won their last five meetings against the Yellow Jackets.
- The Hurricanes fell to 4-9 all-time against the Yellow Jackets in Atlanta.

TEAM NOTES

- The Hurricanes' defensive starters were Ladarius Gunter, Denzel Perryman, Anthony Chickillo, Tyriq McCord, Thurston Armbrister, Raphael Kirby, Ufomba Kamalu, Olsen Pierre, Corn Elder, Deon Bush, Nantambu-Akil Fentress.
- Miami's offensive starters were Ereck Flowers, Nick Linder, Shane McDermott, Danny Isidora, Jon Feliciano, Brad Kaaya, 8 Duke Johnson, Malcolm Lewis, Phillip Dorsett, Braxton Berrios, Clive Walford.
- Miami was outgained 371-352, but the Hurricanes held Georgia Tech to just 53 yards passing.
- Miami and Georgia Tech were tied at 14 at the half. Miami outgained Georgia Tech 193-188 at the half.
- The Canes scored on their first offensive series for the fourth-consecutive game as they engineered a six-play, 75-yard drive, which was capped by a 21-yard touchdown pass from QB Brad Kaaya to WR Braxton Berrios.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES - OFFENSE

- Running back Duke Johnson's 24-yard touchdown run in the first quarter was his 21st career rushing touchdown, which tied him for eighth all-time with former Hurricane great Clinton Portis.
- Johnson also tallied 100 yards rushing-or-more for the ninth time in career. He finished the game with 100 yards rushing.
- Quarterback Brad Kaaya finished the game with 245 yards passing, going 16-of-25 through the air. He also threw for a score.
- Kaaya surpassed 200 yards passing for the fourth-consecutive week.
- Kaaya completed passes to eight different receivers for the third straight week.
- Senior wide receiver Phillip Dorsett caught three passes for a team-best 75 yards.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES - DEFENSE

- Deon Bush set a single game career high with seven total tackles, surpassing his previous career high of six.
- Olsen Pierre set a single-game career high with 10 total tackles. His 10 total tackles were a game-high.
- Thurston Armbrister tallied his team-leading fifth sack on the year.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES - SPECIAL TEAMS

- Kick returner Stacy Coley's 39-yard kickoff return in the first quarter was a season-best.
- Kicker Michael Badgley's connected on a 27-yard field goal in the third quarter to trim Georgia Tech's lead to four at 21-17.
