THE GAME

- Coming off a 20-6 loss last time out at NC State, the Miami Hurricanes continue their second season under the direction of head coach **Mario Cristobal** on Sat., November 11 with their annual rivalry showdown with Florida State. Kickoff for the game is set for 3:30 p.m. from Tallahassee, Fla.
- The game will be broadcast on **ABC** with Sean McDonough (pxp), Greg McElroy (color) & Molly McGrath (sideline) on the call. Joe Zagacki (pxp) & Don Bailey, Jr. (color) are in the **560 WQAM** booth for the 22nd season. **AMERICANRADIO 1260 AM** will also broadcast from Doak Campbell Stadium.

THE SERIES

- The Hurricanes lead the all-time series against the Seminoles, 35-32, but have lost the last two head-to-head matchups vs. FSU in 2021 and 2022
- Florida State's win in the 2021 game in Tallahassee - 31-28, in UM's last trip to Doak Campbell - snapped Miami's four-game win streak in the series.
- Miami and Florida State have met every year since 1969 - the longest consecutive series for any UM opponent. Miami is 16-11 all-time in Tallahassee.

THE HURRICANES

- Miami continues Year 2 of the **Mario Cristobal** Era on Nov. 11 when it travels to Florida State for its sixth of eight straight ACC games to close 2023.
- The Hurricanes are coming off a 20-6 loss to NC State in Raleigh, N.C., on Nov. 4. Miami is 1-2 on the road this season and 0-2 in road conference play.
- RB **Mark Fletcher, Jr.** was named ACC Rookie of the Week on Nov. 6 after rushing for a career-best 115 yards on a career-high 23 carries at NC State.
- Another freshman - DL **Rueben Bain, Jr.** - ranks first on Miami in sacks with 6.5 and is tied for fourth in the Atlantic Coast Conference in the category.
- The Hurricanes picked up an impressive win over #23/#22 Texas A&M, 48-33, on Sept. 9. Miami's win was its first ranked win during Cristobal's tenure.
- Cristobal, a double alum of the University, was named the 26th head coach in program history by school president Dr. Julio Frenk on Dec. 6, 2021.
- Cristobal returned home after spending the previous four seasons as head coach at Oregon, where he won two Pac-12 titles and captured a Rose Bowl.
- Cristobal is regarded as one of the nations top recruiters, and in his first recruiting cycle as Miami head coach, the Hurricanes signed the best class in program history according to the 247Sports Composite; it was the top-ranked class in the Atlantic Coast Conference and the top class in the state.
- The second-year Miami head coach hired **Shannon Dawson** from the University of Houston as the team's new offensive coordinator and **Lance Guidry** from Marshall as the team's new defensive coordinator entering 2023. In total, there are new faces in seven of 10 assistant coach roles; in addition to Dawson and Guidry, Cristobal hired **Derek Nicholson** (from Louisville) to coach linebackers, **Tim Harris, Jr.**, (UCF) to coach running backs, **Kevin Beard** (Toledo) to coach wide receivers and elevated both **Jason Taylor** (defensive line) and **Cody Woodiel** (tight ends) from analyst roles.
- QB **Tyler Van Dyke** entered his second full year as a starter with high expectations after an injury-riddled 2022 season. Van Dyke, named to the watch list for the Johnny Unitas Award, earned ACC Rookie of the Year and ACC Offensive Rookie of the Year honors as a second-year freshman in 2021.
- After a breakout season where he earned All-America honors, **Kam Kinchens** was named to the watch list for nearly every major defensive award, including the Bednarik Award, the Nagurski Trophy and the Thorpe Award. He was also named a Preseason All-American by the Associated Press.
- TE **Elijah Arroyo** (Mackey Award), K **Andy Borregales** (Lou Groza Award), OL **Javion Cohen** (Outland Trophy), OL **Matt Lee** (Rimington Award) and DL **Leonard Taylor** (Bednarik) were also among those recognized with preseason watch list selections for major awards entering 2023.
- The Canes feature a 2023 transfer portal class that ranked among the best in FBS; it includes starters OL **Javion Cohen** (Alabama), **Matt Lee** (UCF) and LB **Francisco Mauigoa** (Washington State), DB **Jaden Davis** (Oklahoma) & others like DB **Davonte Brown** (UCF) and RB **Ajay Allen** (Nebraska).

QUICK HITS

HURRICANES TO FACE RIVAL SEMINOLES

- Following a 20-6 loss on the road at NC State last time out, Miami continues its second season under **Mario Cristobal** on Nov. 11 with a rivalry game at Florida State.
- The Hurricanes have won four of the last six matchups overall in the series but have dropped two straight. In Miami's last trip to Doak Campbell in 2021, Florida State emerged victorious, 31-28, to snap UM's four-game win streak in the series.
- The rivalry is UM's longest running series, with Saturday's matchup making it 55 straight years with at least one game between the two programs (1969).

FLETCHER IMPRESSES IN FIRST UM START

- RB **Mark Fletcher, Jr.** was recognized as ACC Rookie of the Week after an impressive first start of his career at NC State on Nov. 4.
- Fletcher recorded 115 rushing yards, 5.0 yards per rush and three receptions in the game. The last Miami freshman to match or surpass those numbers in a game was **Duke Johnson** in 2012 against Boston College (135, 19.3, three).
- The last Miami Hurricane freshman running back to eclipse the century mark in a game before Fletcher was **Joe Yearby** vs. North Carolina on Nov. 1, 2014.

BAIN DOMINATING IN FRESHMAN SEASON

- One of the biggest reasons for Miami's strong start to 2023 has been the dominance of freshman DL **Rueben Bain, Jr.**, who was named ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week for the second straight week on Oct. 30.
- Bain leads Miami in sacks (6.5) and is tied for fourth in the ACC in the category.
- Bain was named ACC DL of the Week and ACC Rookie of the Week on Oct. 23. He was named a Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year semifinalist on Oct. 31.
- The freshman standout, who was a top-ranked recruit, has an older brother on staff who serves as a graduate assistant (Reggie).

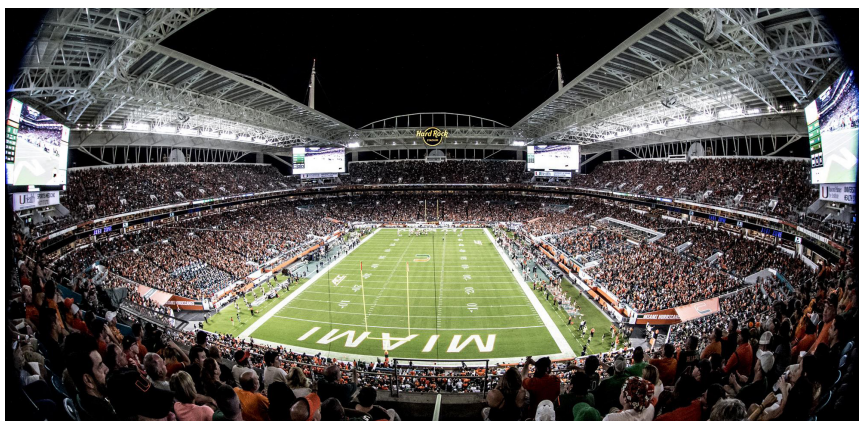

LB Francisco Mauigoa ranks No. 11 in the nation and No. 1 in the ACC with an average of 1.4 tackles for loss per contest so far this year; he leads the Hurricanes with 12.5 tackles for loss this season.

Miami is one of just 11 teams in FBS to have started the same five players on the offensive line in all of its games this season; the Hurricanes are the only such team in the ACC.

The Hurricanes have recorded 30 sacks on defense and have been sacked only 11 times this season on offense. The +19 sack differential is tied for the fourth highest in the FBS (with SMU), behind only Penn State (+26), Oregon (+24) and Toledo (+20).

Mark Fletcher, Jr. rushed for a career-best 115 yards in the first start of his Miami career last time out at NC State; it marked the first 100-yard game by a true freshman running back at Miami since Joe Yearby did so in 2014 vs. North Carolina (104 yards).

Fletcher recorded 115 rushing yards, 5.0 yards per rush and three receptions in his last game against NC State. The last UM freshman to match or surpass those numbers was Duke Johnson in 2012 at BC (135, 19.3, three).

HURRICANES TRAVEL TO STATE CAPITAL FOR RIVALRY GAME VS. NOLES

- Miami continues its second season under the direction of head coach **Mario Cristobal** on Sat., Nov. 11 with its sixth of eight straight ACC games to close 2023 - this one at rival Florida State at 3:30 p.m. ET.
- Coming off a 20-6 loss at NC State last time out, the Hurricanes are looking for their first win over the Seminoles since 2020 on Saturday. FSU has captured wins in back-to-back years (2021, 2022) vs. UM.
- Miami leads the all-time series against Florida State, 35-32, including a 16-11 mark in Tallahassee.
- The Hurricanes had won four in a row in the series (2017, 2018, 2019, 2020) before falling in 2021.
- Joining Cristobal on the sidelines in 2023 are seven new faces in full-time assistant coach roles, including both coordinators - offensive coordinator **Shannon Dawson** from the University of Houston and defensive coordinator **Lance Guidry** from Marshall - who are both in their first seasons at The U.
- Miami's game vs. the Seminoles is also slated for broadcast on 560 WQAM and americaradio 1260 AM.

MIAMI ONE OF ONLY TEN FBS TEAMS WITH TOP-35 OFFENSE & DEFENSE

- The Hurricanes are currently one of only 10 groups in all of FBS - and one of only eight in Power-5 - to feature units that rank in the top 35 in both "total offense" and "total defense" entering Week 11.
- Miami currently ranks No. 19 in the nation in total defense (311.4 yards per game) and No. 31 in total offense (437.9). Florida State and Louisville are the other ACC teams ranked top 35 in both categories.

NEW FACES ABOUND IN 2023, BOTH ON THE FIELD AND ON SIDELINES

- Among the many storylines of the offseason was the revamping of the Hurricanes roster entering Year 2 under **Mario Cristobal** - both on the sideline with assistant coaches and on the field with players.
- Cristobal's first full recruiting class was the best-ranked class in program history according to the 247Sports Composite; UM's class was the top-rated group in both the ACC and in the state of Florida.
- The Hurricanes also brought in several transfers who started UM's first eight games; OL **Javion Cohen** (Alabama), OL **Matt Lee** (UCF) and LB **Francisco Mauigoa** (Wazzu) are included in the group.
- In total, the Hurricanes have 40 scholarship players who were not on the team in 2022, including a recruiting class featuring 24 true freshman, headlined by five-star offensive lineman **Francis Mauigoa**.
- The Hurricanes new look coaching staff includes seven faces who were not on the full-time staff as assistants a season ago; offensive coordinator **Shannon Dawson**, defensive coordinator **Lance Guidry**, wide receivers coach **Kevin Beard**, running backs coach **Tim Harris, Jr.**, defensive line coach **Jason Taylor**, linebackers coach **Derek Nicholson** and tight ends coach **Cody Woodiel**. Taylor and Woodiel spent the 2022 season as analysts on the Hurricanes staff, while both Beard and Harris are UM alumni.

GUIDRY'S 'D' IMPRESSING, IN YEAR 1 AS MIAMI'S DEF. COORDINATOR

- **Lance Guidry**, who was named defensive coordinator at Miami in February 2023, spent the previous two seasons as the defensive coordinator and safeties coach at Marshall University in 2021 and 2022.
- Guidry has already made his impact felt in a short amount of time in Coral Gables. Among ACC teams, Miami ranks No. 4 in scoring defense (20.0 points per game), No. 3 in total defense (311.4 yards per game) and No. 2 in rushing defense (89.2 yards per game). Among FBS teams nationwide, the Hurricanes also rank No. 8 in rushing defense, No. 29 in scoring defense and No. 19 in total defense.
- The Canes are one of just 21 teams in all of FBS allowing fewer than 320.0 yards per game in 2023.
- Miami had held its opponents under 100 rushing yards its first five games of the season - a streak that ended at North Carolina Oct. 14. It was the Hurricanes' longest such streak to begin a year since 2006.
- The Hurricanes were one of only three Power-5 teams to have held opponents to fewer than 100 rushing yards in six of their first seven games of 2023. The other two were Nebraska and Penn State.

BAIN SHINING IN YEAR 1, IS FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR SEMIFINALIST

- One of Miami's most impressive breakout players of the season has been true freshman DL **Rueben Bain, Jr.** Bain was named ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week and Rookie of the Week on Oct. 23 after a dominant game vs. Clemson. He repeated as ACC DL of the Week honoree on Oct. 30.
- Bain was named a semifinalist for the Shaun Alexander National Freshman of the Year Award.
- A Miami native, Bain leads all UM players and ranks fourth in the ACC with 6.5 sacks. He's second on the team in tackles for loss (8.5) and has totaled 29 tackles, which is tops among defensive linemen.
- In a 2OT win over Clemson, Bain had the best performance of his young career - eight tackles, two sacks and one forced fumble. Bain was also named 247Sports True Freshman of the Week and hauled in Shaun Alexander Award Freshman of the Week recognition for his dominant game vs. Clemson.
- He outdid himself against Virginia, finishing with 2.5 tackles for loss, two sacks and seven tackles.
- According to PFF, Bain has more credited quarterback pressures this year than most of the players considered to be the top defensive line prospects in college football ahead of the 2024 NFL Draft.

JOE MOORE-RECOGNIZED OL ONE OF 11 TO HAVE STARTED SAME FIVE

- One of the most important components to Miami's start has been the impressive play of its offensive line. The Hurricanes have started LT **Jalen Rivers**, LG **Javion Cohen**, C **Matt Lee**, RG **Anez Cooper** and RT **Francis Mauigoa** for all nine of its games, and the group has been pivotal to UM's success so far.
- The group was recognized for its outstanding play when it was selected to the midseason honor roll for the Joe Moore Award, which annually honors the top-performing offensive unit in college football.
- Entering Week 11, the Hurricanes were one of only 11 FBS groups to have started the same five players.
- Miami's entire interior line (Cohen, Lee, Cooper) was named to the PFF Team of the Week on Oct. 30.
- In a win vs. Clemson, the group had perhaps its best performance yet. With a freshman QB making his first start, the group did not allow a sack and helped 211 rushing yards against an elite defense.
- Cooper was named ACC Co-Offensive Lineman of the Week as well as Outland Trophy National Player of the Week after a dominant game vs. Texas A&M, where he graded out as Miami's top lineman.
- Lee was named a candidate for the Rimington Trophy, honoring the top center, after a standout career at UCF. Cohen transferred from Alabama and was named an Outland Trophy candidate.

DAWSON'S OFFENSE RANKS NO. 25 IN FBS IN YARDS PER PLAY AT 6.48

- **Shannon Dawson**, who was named offensive coordinator / quarterbacks coach at Miami in February 2023, spent the past four seasons at the University of Houston (2019-2022) before joining The U.
- He has made his impact felt in Year 1, with Miami one of just 38 teams in the nation averaging 6.0 yards per play vs. FBS competition. The Hurricanes ranked No. 104 in FBS last season in yards per play.
- Miami rushed for 211 yards in a 2OT win over Clemson on Oct. 21, marking only the 30th time a Dabo Swinney-led Tigers defense had surrendered 200 or more rushing yards in more than 200 games.
- Among other categories where Dawson's work has been clear: Miami ranks No. 15 in FBS and No. 1 in the ACC in completion percentage (68.7), and No. 31 in FBS and No. 5 in ACC in total offense (437.9). Miami is averaging 70.8 more yards per game of offense compared to last year's average (367.1).
- In Dawson's three seasons as quarterbacks coach with the Cougars (2020-22), Houston quarterbacks combined to throw 87 touchdown passes (13th nationally) behind a 65.3 completion percentage (19th) and 10,008 passing yards (21st). Dawson tutored signal caller Clayton Tune to a record-setting career. In 2022, Tune set the American Athletic Conference single-season TD passes record (40).
- Dawson's Cougars ranked eighth nationally in passing offense (314.0) in 2022, while Houston wide receiver Nathaniel Dell led the nation in receiving touchdowns (17) and receiving yards (1,398).
- Other impressive numbers: Houston ranked 15th nationally in scoring offense (35.6), 22nd in first downs offense (314), 23rd in passing offense (271.6) and 25th in red zone offense (.891) in 2022.

FLETCHER NAMED ACC ROOKIE OF THE WEEK AFTER FIRST START AT UM

- Running back **Mark Fletcher, Jr.** delivered a strong showing in the first start of his Miami career at NC State on Nov. 4. He rushed for a career-best 115 yards on a career-high 23 carries in Raleigh, N.C.
- For his efforts, Fletcher was announce as ACC Rookie of the Week by the conference on Nov. 7.
- Fletcher recorded 115 rushing yards, 5.0 yards per rush and three receptions vs. the Wolfpack. The last UM freshman to match or surpass those numbers was Duke Johnson in 2012 at BC (135, 19.3, three).
- It marked the first 100-yard game by a true freshman at UM since Joe Yearby in 2014 vs. UNC (104).

"FOURTH QUARTER PROGRAM" EFFECT: UM AMONG TOP IN 4Q SCORING

- When Mario Cristobal arrived to Miami in 2021, one of his first hires was strength & conditioning coordinator **Aaron Feld**. The duo's "fourth quarter" spring workout program has become a staple.
- In games involving only FBS teams across the country, the Hurricanes rank No. 20 in the nation in fourth quarter scoring at 9.3 points per game in 2023. Through its first two games in wins over the Aggies and the RedHawks, Miami outscored its opponents by a 31-7 margin in the final frame.

RESTREPO ENJOYING BREAKOUT SEASON AS GO-TO WR IN OFFENSE

- While Miami's offense has impressed under OC Shannon Dawson, WR **Xavier Restrepo** has emerged as one of the nation's top wide receivers this season. He leads the Hurricanes with 60 receptions - including a career-high 12 catches in a start against Georgia Tech and 11 more vs. North Carolina. Restrepo ranks No. 14 in FBS in receptions per game (6.7) and No. 14 in FBS in total receptions (60).
- In UM's game with Georgia Tech, Restrepo (123 yards) recorded his third game of the season with at least 120 receiving yards. He became the only Hurricane over the past 25 years to record three such games within the first five games of a season - he also managed to do so vs. Texas A&M and Temple.
- It was the first game to feature 10 catches since Mike Harley had 13 vs. Duke on Nov. 27, 2021. Restrepo is only the third Cane in the last five years to have 10 in a game, joining Harley and Charleston Rambo.
- Restrepo, who also paces the Hurricanes in receiving yards with 683, struggled through an injury-marred 2022 where he caught only 21 passes for 240 yards total, seeing action in just seven games.
- Restrepo and former roommate **Tyler Van Dyke** have a special connection; Restrepo learned how to play golf based on TVD's love for the sport, and the duo is ultra competitive in everything they do.
- The fourth-year junior surpassed the 1,000 career yard mark at Miami vs. Georgia Tech- he has 106 career catches for 1,308 yards with eight career touchdowns. He has started all nine games so far.

BACK-TO-BACK OVERTIME Ws A RARITY IN COLLEGE FOOTBALL, AT UM

- Miami won back-to-back games in overtime the last two weeks, emerging victorious over Clemson in two overtimes on Oct. 21 and beating Virginia in OT on Oct. 28. It marked the first time in the history of Miami where the Canes played two overtime games in the same season - let alone back-to-back.
- UM became the first team since Georgia Southern in 2019 to win overtime games in back-to-back outings. UM was the first Power-5 team to do it since Northwestern won three such games in 2017.

BORREGALES LOOKING TO CARRY ON FAMILY'S GROZA LEGACY AT UM

- Junior K **Andy Borregales** has delivered another dominant season for the Hurricanes in 2023. Ranked as a preseason candidate for the Lou Groza Award, Borregales has tallied 51 career field goals on 60 attempts (85.0%), which ranks him as the second-most accurate among those with 50 attempts, trailing only Jonah Dalmás of Boise State, who has converted 69 of 79 career attempts (87.3%).
- Borregales was named ACC Specialist of the Week on Oct. 30 for a dominant game vs. Virginia. Borregales hit on three field goals of at least 45 yards - connecting from 47, 50 and 48 - and went 6-for-6 on touchbacks. He is the only kicker in 2023 with a game to have three field goals of at least 45 yards.
- Borregales, whose older brother Jose is the lone Lou Groza Award winner in Miami history (2020), is 17-for-19 on field goals this year. His lone misses came on a 54-yard attempt and a 45-yard attempt.
- Borregales is one of 17 kickers in FBS with a 89%-or-better success rate this year - he is 17th in FBS (89.8) in the category. He is one of only 10 kickers in the country with at least 17 made field goals.

GEORGE ENJOYING IMPRESSIVE SEASON AS STARTER AT WIDE RECEIVER

- Entering Miami's Sept. 9 matchup with Texas A&M, **Jacoby George** had just one career touchdown catch. He had three alone vs. the Aggies, becoming the first Cane to have three touchdown catches in the same game since former WR **Leonard Hankerson** did so against at Clemson on Oct. 2, 2010.
- George had a career-best 125 yards in Miami's loss at North Carolina, totaling six catches and one TD.
- George is one of nine players in the ACC to have at least five touchdowns catches entering Week 11.
- George put together only the third game of three receiving touchdowns by an ACC player this year.
- For his efforts, the third-year player was named ACC Offensive Receiver of the Week on Sept. 11. He had just 13 catches in all of 2022 and already has 41 - second-most on the team - through nine games.

ACC DB OF THE WEEK KINCHEMS, WILLIAMS COMBINE AS TALENTED PAIR

- Two of Miami's closest teammates on and off the field are two of its best players in safety pairing **Kam Kinchens** and **James Williams**. The two third-year players make up a highly talented duo.
- Williams delivered a dominant outing in UM's win over Virginia totaling a team-high and career-high 13 tackles in Miami's overtime win over Virginia. He leads the Hurricanes with 51 total tackles this season.
- Kinchens was similarly dominant against the Cavaliers; the standout was named ACC Defensive Back of the Week after recording the second pick-six of his career. Kinchens returned the pick 29 yards for a TD.
- Kinchens recorded the 10th pick of his career at NC State - just the 12th UM player to reach the mark.
- Kinchens, an All-American a season ago, was named to the All-ACC First Team in 2022 after having 59 total tackles and a team-high six interceptions. He is a member of UM's leadership council.
- Kinchens average interceptions-per-game mark (0.30) is the fourth-best career mark in all of FBS.
- The Miami native is one of only 11 players in all of FBS to have recorded 9 career interceptions.
- Another impactful player in his own right, the 6-foot-5 Williams made 10 starts and ranked second on the team with 58 tackles a season ago. Both players are South Florida natives and best friends.

BRASHARD ONE OF NATION'S MOST DANGEROUS, LEADS FBS IN KOR AVG

- Though he has only had 14 returns in his nine games, WR **Brashard Smith** has made them count, ranking first in the nation in kickoff return average averaging 32.9 yards per return so far this year.
- Smith's 98-yard kickoff return TD vs. Texas A&M was his first kickoff return for a touchdown of his career.
- Smith had an 80-yard run that resulted in a touchdown in Miami's 2OT win over Clemson on Oct. 21.
- The junior speedster ranks No. 1 on Miami in all-purpose yards this season, including a season-high 168 at North Carolina. He totaled 150 yards in Miami's 2OT win vs. Clemson and 66 last time vs. NC State.

UM DOMINANT VS. CLEMSON IN TRENCHES: RUSHED >200, ALLOWED <50

- Trailing 17-7 in the fourth quarter, the Hurricanes orchestrated an impressive comeback to top visiting Clemson, 28-20, in 2OT on Oct. 21. It was UM's first overtime win since a 4OT win at Virginia in 2022.
- The Hurricanes held Clemson to just 31 rushing yards on 34 attempts, while Miami gained 211 on 38 attempts (5.6 yard average). A suffocating defense also turned the Tigers over three times in the win.
- Clemson allowed 200 rushing yards for just the 30th time under the direction of Dabo Swinney.
- DL **Rueben Bain, Jr.** led the defensive front with eight total tackles, two sacks and one forced fumble. He was named ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week and ACC Rookie of the Week for his efforts.
- Starting in place of QB Tyler Van Dyke, QB **Emory Williams** delivered an impressive second half to help direct the comeback effort. Williams finished 24-for-33 for 151 yards with one touchdown.
- WR **Brashard Smith** had an 80-yard run that resulted in a TD, while RB **Ajay Allen** had 54 yards and the decisive touchdown in the second overtime period. WR **Xavier Restrepo** had seven catches.
- After Allen's touchdown run, Clemson featured a 1st & Goal on the 2-yard line in the second overtime but could not capitalize. LB **Corey Flagg, Jr.**, came up with the game-ending tackle on 4th and Goal.

TVD HAS COMPILED PROLIFIC MIAMI CAREER, LOOKING TO REBOUND

- QB **Tyler Van Dyke** put together an ACC Rookie of the Year campaign at Miami in 2021. Van Dyke's 2022 season was marred by injury, forcing him to miss significant action during the second half of the year. He missed Miami's last game vs. Clemson Oct. 21 but returned in the Hurricanes' OT win over Virginia.
- Van Dyke struggled in Miami's win against UVA, throwing for a season-low 163 yards with two picks.
- Van Dyke has already surpassed last season's touchdown pass total despite playing in just eight games.
- Van Dyke ranks No. 1 in ACC (No. 17 in FBS) in completion percentage (67.7), No. 5 in ACC (No. 41 in FBS) in passing efficiency (148.8) as well as No. 4 in ACC (No. 37 in FBS) in passing touchdowns (16).
- In Miami's win against Bethune-Cookman, Van Dyke became the first Hurricane to record multiple pass touchdowns, a rush touchdown and complete 80 percent of his passes in a single game.
- over the past 25 seasons. He finished 19-for-23 for 247 yards with two touchdowns and no picks.
- Van Dyke entered Week 4 ranked 10th on UM's career completions list with 419. He's now No. 6 with 532, having passed Craig Erickson (420), Ryan Clement (427), Bernie Kosar (463) & Kyle Wright (478).
- Van Dyke's five touchdown passes vs. Texas A&M marked a new career high. The performance was TVD's eighth career start with multiple TDs and zero picks. He had his ninth such start vs. Bethune.
- Van Dyke became the third Miami Hurricane to win ACC Rookie of the Year and ACC Offensive Rookie of the Year honors in 2021, joining QB Brad Kaaya (2014) and RB Duke Johnson (2012) to do so.
- Van Dyke has throw multiple interceptions in a game just seven times in his 26 career starts at The U.
- Van Dyke took over starting duties three games into the season in 2021 and ended the year with 2,931 yards, 25 passing touchdowns and just six interceptions. He completed 62% of passes that season.

KINCHENS JOINS ELITE COMPANY WITH 10TH CAREER PICK LAST TIME OUT

- DB **Kam Kinchens** became only the 12th player in Miami Football history to reach double-digit interceptions for a career when he recorded a pick in Miami's 20-6 loss at NC State in Raleigh, N.C. on Nov. 4.
- Kinchens is the first Hurricane since the iconic Sean Taylor (2001-03) to record at least 10 picks in a career. Taylor finished his career with 14. Before Sean Taylor reached 10, the previous player to reach the plateau was Ed Reed, who had 21 interceptions from 1998-2001. Reed's mark of 21 stands as UM's all-time standard.

CANES HADN'T STARTED WITH THREE IN A ROW AT HOME SINCE 2013

- The Hurricanes had not started the season with a 3-0 mark at home since 2013. Coincidentally, during that early stretch, they also played a ranked SEC team (No. 12 Florida) and won in Week 2.

BROTHERLY LOVE IN CORAL GABLES, SEVERAL WITH UM FAMILY TIES

- The Miami Hurricanes will feature a number of family ties on the sideline this fall across the roster.
- Newcomer OL **Francis Mauigoo** and older brother LB **Francisco Mauigoo** will feature prominently for Miami this season. Another set of newcomers have lined up on the same side of the ball, in freshman DB **Damari Brown** and junior DB **Davonte Brown**. The elder Mauigoo arrived from Washington State via the transfer portal, as did the elder Brown, who came to Miami from UCF. Both arrived in January.
- Two sets of twins populate the freshmen ranks, as well; Miami natives WR **Robby Washington** and LB **Bobby Washington, Jr.**, as well as QB **Riply Luna** and WR **Kolby Luna**, who are from Idaho.
- The older brother of freshman DL **Rueben Bain, Jr.**, one of the top-ranked freshman defensive lineman, is offensive graduate assistant **Reggie Bain**. In addition, the nephew of head coach **Mario Cristobal - Luis Cristobal, Jr.** - transferred to Miami from Georgia State prior to the season.

HOME SWEET HOME OPENERS: UM CONTINUES RUN OF SUCCESS AT HRS

- The Miami Hurricanes opened their 16th season at world-class Hard Rock Stadium on Sept. 1 vs. Miami-Ohio with a 38-3 win; UM holds a 16-0 all-time mark in home openers at the stadium, having outscored opponents 727-122 for an average margin of victory of 37.8 points in those 16 games.
- The Hurricanes have not lost a home opener since 2006, when they fell to Florida State 13-10 at the Orange Bowl on Sept. 4, 2006. Miami has won 17 straight home openers since - each one since 2007.
- Since joining the ACC prior to the 2004 season, Miami has played a conference opponent in only three of its 20 home openers: Florida State twice (in 2004 and 2006) and Georgia Tech once (2009).
- In the modern era of Miami Hurricanes football (since 1979), UM has opened the season at home 19 times and is 17-2 in those games. The Hurricanes are 33-12 in regular season openers dating to 1979.

CANES HAVE TALENT, EXPERIENCE ON DEFENSIVE LINE RETURNING IN '23

- If the Hurricanes are looking to cause havoc under defensive coordinator Lance Guidry, two defensive linemen that will play an important role are **Leonard Taylor III** and **Akheem Mesidor**, who ranked among the most disruptive defensive linemen in the ACC a season ago in 2022. Mesidor has missed most of 2023.
- Mesidor, who transferred to Miami after two seasons at West Virginia, has 25 career tackles for loss in three seasons in college to go along with 16.5 sacks. Mesidor was an All-ACC Honorable Mention pick after he finished with a team high-tying 10.5 tackles for loss & a team-best seven sacks. He has a lower body injury.
- Taylor III had a productive year for the Hurricanes en route to 2022 All-ACC Honorable Mention honors; Taylor, a third-year player, tied Mesidor with 10.5 tackles for loss. He added three sacks last season.
- Miami will also benefit from strong edge play from second-year defensive end **Nyjalik Kelly** (4.5 sacks in 2022). DL **Jahfari Harvey** recorded his first sack of the season against the RedHawks.

MIAMI'S SIGNING CLASS, RANKED AS THE BEST IN HISTORY, MAKES DEBUT

- Miami's 2023 recruiting class included 15 players ranked in the ESPN 300, including one of the top five, two in the top 20 and six in the top 100. The Hurricanes signed two players who were considered consensus "five-star" players by every recruiting service - Miami had three five-star signees in the last eight classes.
- 15 players in the class made their debut, headlined by **Francis Mauigoo**, who started at right tackle.
- **Mauigoo** (#7) and **Samson Okunlola** (#18) represent two of the top 20 players that Miami has ever signed since 247Sports began their rankings in the year 2000. The Hurricanes signed five players who earned All-American Bowl invitations and five players who earned Under-Armour All-America Bowl invitations
- 15 of Miami's freshmen joined the program for the spring and competed in spring practice/

THREE SELECTED IN DRAFT, MIAMI'S NFL STREAK CONTINUES IN 2023

- The selections of Miami defensive back Tyrique Stevenson (Chicago Bears, second round), tight end Will Mallory (Indianapolis Colts, fifth) and DJ Ivey (Cincinnati Bengals, seventh) extended the Hurricanes' streak of having at least one player picked in every NFL Draft since 1975; the fourth-longest streak of any program.

GAME SIX: SECOND-HALF SURGE PUSHES #12 TAR HEELS PAST HURRICANES

- Miami took a lead into the halftime locker room, but a dominant third quarter by the #12/#12 North Carolina Tar Heels propelled the hosts to a 41-31 win at a sold-out Kenan Stadium on Oct. 14.
- QB **Tyler Van Dyke** threw for 391 yards with four touchdowns and two interceptions in the loss. RB **Henry Parrish, Jr.** had a 74 yards on 13 carries, while WR **Xavier Restrepo** had 11 catches totaling 96 yards and two touchdowns. WR **Jacoby George** had a career-high 125 yards on six catches with a touchdown.
- UNC QB **Drake Maye** tossed for 273 passing yards with four touchdowns - three to WR **Tez Walker**.
- Defensively, Miami was led by DB **Kam Kinchens** (nine tackles, two tackles for loss, one sack), LB **Francisco Mauigoa** (six tackles, 2.5 TFLs, 10-yard sack) and DL **Rueben Bain, Jr.** (1.5 TFLs, one sack).

GAME FIVE: GEORGIA TECH TOPPLES CANES ON LAST MINUTE DRIVE

- Georgia Tech staged a fourth-quarter comeback to top Miami, 23-20, in the Hurricanes' ACC opener.
- QB **Tyler Van Dyke** threw for 288 yards on 24-for-36 passing but tossed three interceptions in the loss. RB **Don Chaney, Jr.** had the first 100-yard game of his career (106 yards, 24 carries), while WR **Xavier Restrepo** posted a career-best 12 catches totaling 123 yards. WR **Colbie Young** had 56 yards.
- Miami's defense impressed for most of the night, holding Georgia Tech to 99 yards rushing and 250 yards total in the loss. The Jackets averaged just 3.7 yards per rush and threw two interceptions.
- LB **Francisco Mauigoa** delivered a strong performance, totaling four tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss, one interception and one forced fumble. DB **James Williams** also returned an interception 44 yards.

GAME FOUR: UM MOVES TO 4-0 WITH DOMINANT 'W' IN ROAD OPENER

- Miami took care of business in its first road trip of the season, enjoying a 41-7 win over host Temple at Lincoln Financial Field. The Hurricanes rushed for 323 yards and totaled 543 yards in the victory.
- RB **Henry Parrish, Jr.**, led the Hurricanes with a career-high 139 yards and two touchdowns, becoming the first Miami running back to total that many yards and multiple scores in a road game since Duke Johnson did so at Duke in 2012 (176). **Don Chaney** added 61 rushing yards and **Mark Fletcher** had 51.
- QB **Tyler Van Dyke** threw for 220 yards on 17-of-24 passing with three touchdowns and zero interceptions. • Defensively, Miami held TU to just 11 yards rushing and added two interceptions by DB **Te'Cory Couch**.
- Lincoln Financial Field marked Miami's fifth NFL stadium in the last six years; in addition to their home venue (Hard Rock Stadium), UM has also played at Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta (vs. Alabama, 2021), Heinz Field in Pittsburgh (vs. Pitt, 2019 / 2021) and AT&T Stadium in Arlington (vs. LSU, 2018)

GAME THREE: HURRICANES POWER PAST WILDCATS ON SHORT REST

- The Hurricanes opened their season with three straight home games for the first time since 2013, and ensured a perfect September at home thanks to a 48-7 win over Bethune-Cookman on Sept. 14.
- Miami overpowered the Wildcats, recording 589 yards of offense. QB **Tyler Van Dyke** completed 82% of his passes (19-for-23) with 247 yards and two touchdowns, while Miami finished with 240 rushing yards and five rushing touchdowns - including two scores from redshirt freshman transfer **Ajay Allen**.
- WR **Xavier Restrepo** was Van Dyke's favorite target, finishing with an impressive 120 yards on six catches.
- Despite missing four defensive starters due to injury - including three on the defensive line - the Hurricanes finished with 10 tackles for loss and four sacks. DL **Rueben Bain** had his first college sack.

GAME TWO: MIAMI KNOCKS OFF #23 AGGIES, 48-33, FOR RANKED WIN

- Miami showed resiliency in its Game 2 victory, a 48-33 decision over a top-25 Texas A&M team that took two separate 10-point leads in the first half. A 27-point second half sealed the hosts' win.
- The victory was Miami's first over a team ranked in the top 25 since a 38-34 win over No. 17/19 Pitt in 2021, while head coach **Mario Cristobal** picked up his eighth win against top-25 teams since 2018.
- Four Hurricanes were honored by the ACC for standout performances last time out; **Anez Cooper** (Co-Offensive Lineman of the Week), **Jaden Davis** (Defensive Back), **Jacoby George** (offensive receiver) and **Tyler Van Dyke** (quarterback). TVD's five TD passes marked a new career high. The performance was TVD's eighth career start with multiple touchdown passes and no interceptions thrown. George became the first Hurricane receiver since **Leonard Hankerson** in 2010 to haul in three touchdown passes in one game.

GAME ONE: MIAMI TROUNCES REDHAWKS, 38-3, IN SEASON OPENER

- The Hurricanes delivered a strong season debut on Sept. 1, toppling the visiting RedHawks of Miami University, 38-3. Miami piled up 493 yards in a well-balanced offensive attack, and held MU to just 215.
- Behind a dominant offensive line, the Canes finished with 243 passing yards and 250 rushing yards.
- Miami was one of only 16 teams in FBS to rush for 250 yards or more in their 2023 season opener.
- The Hurricanes had four running backs with at least eight carries, with RB **Henry Parrish, Jr.**, leading the way at 90 rushing yards and one score. RB **Mark Fletcher** added 76 yards and one TD in his debut.

SEVERAL CANES EARN PRESEASON RECOGNITION ENTERING 2023

MIAMI PLACES THREE ON PRESEASON ALL-ACC FOOTBALL TEAM

- Among Miami’s preseason honorees were DB **Kam Kinchens**, OL **Javion Cohen** and K **Andy Borregales**, who were all selected to the All-ACC Preseason Team in a poll of conference media. Kinchens enjoyed a breakout 2022, where he was selected to the All-ACC First Team and earned several All-America honors.
- During his time with the Crimson Tide, Cohen started 24 games and earned 2022 All-SEC second-team honors. Cohen started 14 games as a sophomore in 2021 and spent 10 games as a starter on 2022. Cohen was ranked as one of the top players in the transfer portal before arriving in Miami. Cohen was named to the Outland watch list.
- A semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award in 2022, Borregales delivered another strong campaign for his his hometown Hurricanes a season ago. The junior kicker converted on all 32 extra point attempts and went 17 for 20 on field goals, including a season-long 49-yard boot against Florida State. Borregales’ older brother, Jose, is the lone Groza Award winner in UM history, winning it in 2020 in his lone season with the Hurricanes.

MARIO CRISTOBAL

HEAD COACH | SECOND SEASON AT MIAMI (12TH OVERALL) | 11-10 | 72-69

Mario Cristobal has returned home to Miami.

Cristobal, who helped lead the University of Miami to two national championships in 1989 and 1991 as a standout offensive lineman, was named the University's 26th football head coach on December 6, 2021.

One of college football's most highly regarded coaches, Cristobal returned to his alma mater after leading the University of Oregon to three straight Pac-12 Conference championship game appearances and two Pac-12 titles. He is the only coach in the nation whose team has played in a Power Five conference championship game in each of the past three seasons.

"We are incredibly excited to welcome Mario, his wife, Jessica, and their sons Mario Mateo and Rocco home to Miami," UM President Julio Frenk said. "Mario's legacy as a student-athlete at the U is well established. And the standard for competitive excellence that he and his teammates helped establish is one to which we continue to aspire. Our selection, however, was not one based in nostalgia for a proud past, but rather in a bold vision for a promising future."

"The characteristics that helped Mario excel as a national championship-winning player—drive, determination, and discipline—continue to propel his success as a coach. In Mario we have found a head coach who shares our belief in providing student-athletes with the very best opportunities to succeed on and off the field, and our commitment to winning at the highest level."

"My family and I are excited to return home to the University of Miami, which has been so instrumental in shaping me as a person, player, and coach," Cristobal said. "This program has an unparalleled tradition and an exciting future ahead of it. I can't wait to compete for championships and help mold our student-athletes into leaders on and off the field who will make our University, our community, and our loyal fan base proud."

Cristobal brings more than 20 years of FBS coaching experience to Coral Gables, including 10 as a head coach. He compiled a 35-13 record at Oregon, leading the Ducks to consecutive Pac-12 titles in 2019 and 2020. Oregon advanced to three straight conference championship games from 2019 to 2021 and earned bowl-game appearances in each of Cristobal's seasons in Eugene, highlighted by a Rose Bowl victory that capped a 12-win season and No. 5 ranking in the final Associated Press and AFCA Coaches polls in 2019. Cristobal was named the Associated Press Pac-12 Coach of the Year for his efforts that season.

Over Cristobal's first three seasons in Eugene, Oregon players earned 44 all-conference selections and 14 players were selected in the NFL Draft, including first-round selections in each of the past three drafts. With the selections of Kayvon Thibodeaux (2022), Penei Sewell (2021) and Justin Herbert (2020), Cristobal is one of only two active head coaches to produce top-10 picks in each of the last three drafts.

During his tenure as both an assistant and head coach at Oregon, two players—Noah Sewell and Thibodeaux—earned Pac-12 Defensive Freshman of the Year honors, and three players—Thibodeaux, Penei Sewell, and Tyrell Crosby—earned the Morris Trophy, awarded to the Pac-12's best offensive and defensive linemen.

Cristobal served as Oregon's co-offensive coordinator, run-game coordinator, and offensive line coach during the 2017 season before being elevated to head coach.

Cristobal's national title-winning pedigree isn't limited to his time as a player. At Alabama, where he served as assistant head coach, offensive line coach, and recruiting coordinator, he helped lead the Crimson Tide to the national championship in 2015 and a runner-up finish the following season.

During his four years in Tuscaloosa, from 2013 to 2016, five Alabama offensive linemen were selected in the NFL Draft and, with Cristobal's tutelage, the 2015 offensive line unit won the inaugural Joe Moore Award, given to the most outstanding offensive line unit in the nation.

Considered one of the country's elite recruiters and evaluators of talent, Cristobal, during his tenures at both Alabama and Oregon, helped assemble national top-15 recruiting classes eight straight years, with seven of those classes rated in the top 10. The 2018 class at Alabama produced three NFL first-round draft picks. At Oregon, he constructed the Pac-12's top-rated recruiting classes in 2019, 2020, and 2021.

Cristobal's move to Miami brings his coaching career full circle. A son of South Florida who played prep football at nearby Christopher Columbus High School, he launched his coaching career as a graduate assistant coach at Miami from 1998 to 2000 under head coach Butch Davis. He served as an assistant coach at Rutgers from 2001 to 2003 and then returned to Miami as an assistant coach from 2004 to 2006 under head coach Larry Coker.

In 2007, Cristobal was named head coach at Florida International University, becoming the first Cuban American head coach in FBS history. He inherited a struggling FIU program that had been winless the year before his arrival and, in just his fourth season, led it to the Sun Belt Conference title and a bowl-game victory. That season, 2010, he was named Sun Belt Coach of the Year. In total, he coached six seasons at FIU, from 2007 to 2012.

Cristobal, who played his Hurricanes career under coaches Jimmy Johnson and Dennis Erickson, was an All-Big East selection in 1992. He is a double-alumnus of the University of Miami, earning a bachelor's degree in business administration and a master's degree from the University. Cristobal was born in Miami on Sept. 24, 1970. He and his wife, Jessica, married in June 2006 and are the parents of two sons, Mario Mateo and Rocco.
