QUICK HITS

LUCAS ERA BEGINS

The Jai Lucas era gets underway Monday as the Hurricanes open the 2025-26 season at home against Jacksonville at 8 p.m.

Lucas was named the program's 14th head coach on March 5 after spending the last three seasons at Duke where he played a pivotal role in helping the Blue Devils secure the nation's top recruiting class in both 2024 and 2025. As associate head coach, he served as the program's defensive coordinator where Duke finished the 2024-25 season ranked seventh in the nation in scoring defense and fourth nationally in field goal percentage defense.

SEASON OPENER

The Hurricanes will open their season at home for the 62nd time in program history, boasting a 51-10 record when playing the first game of the year on their home court. Miami is 60-14 all-time in season openers and 35-5 since the program rebirth in 1985-86.

BRAND NEW TEAM

Lucas complete revamped the Hurricanes roster with 13 new players and zero newcomers. The first-year head coach hit the recruiting trail with a combination of key transfers in Tre Donaldson, Malik Reneau and Ernest Udeh Jr., freshmen Dante Allen and Shelton Henderson and Europeans Salih Altuntas, Noam Dovrat and Timo Malovec.

THE NUMBERS

- Monday's game is the **first** game of Jai Lucas' head coaching career after being named the HC on March 6.
- Seven** players on the 2025-26 roster hail from the stat of Florida including four from the city of Miami.
- The Hurricanes were selected to finish **eighth** in the ACC Preseason Poll.
- Jai Lucas was named the **14th** head coach in Miami history after spending the last three seasons at Duke.
- This year's schedule features **18** home games inside the Watsco Center.

THE MATCHUP

• The Hurricanes open the 2025-26 season inside the Watsco Center against in-state foe Jacksonville. Tipoff is set for 8 p.m. and the game will air on ACC Network Extra with Kyle Sielaff and Jack McClinton on the call. Fans can also listen to the game on 560 WQAM.

• Miami holds a 27-6 advantage over Jacksonville in series history including a 5-0 ledger since the rebirth of the program in 1985.

• When playing in Coral Gables, the Hurricanes are 16-2 overall and 4-0 in the last four contests.

• The two teams last met on Dec. 19, 2020, in which the Hurricanes came away with a 73-64 victory.

SCOUTING THE DOLPHINS

• Jacksonville enters the new season coming off their first postseason trip since 2017. The Dolphins finished the campaign with a 19-14 record and a 12-6 record in ASUN play. Jacksonville earned a berth in the College Basketball Invitational.

• The Dolphins look to replace four starters from last year's team and welcome in 10 newcomers.

• Chris Arias leads the way for Jacksonville as he was named to the All-ASUN Preseason Team in October. As a freshman, Arias averaged 6.3 points and 2.2 rebounds while shooting 39.7% from the floor.

RENEAU NAMED TO MALONE AWARD WATCH LIST

• Malik Reneau was named to the Karl Malone Award Watch List, the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame announced on Oct 31. The award is presented annually to the nation's best power forward in Division I men's basketball.

• The Miami native joins the Hurricanes after spending the last three seasons at Indiana where he earned to All-Big Ten honorable mention recognitions in 2024 and 2025.

• Last season, Reneau started in 19 games and averaged a team-best 13.3 points per game to go along with 5.5 rebounds and 2.0 assists.

• He reached double figures in scoring on 19 occasions and shot 55.2-percent from the floor. When Reneau scored at least 15 points, the Hoosiers compiled a 10-3 record.

UDEH JR. LANDS ON ABDUL-JABBAR AWARD LIST

• Ernest Udeh Jr. was one of 20 players named to the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame's Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award Watch List, presented annually to the nation's best center.

• A transfer from TCU, Udeh earned All-Big 12 honorable mention last season and was also named to the NABC Second Team All-Gulf District after averaging 6.6 points and 7.5 rebounds per game.

• A presence in the paint, the Orlando, Florida, native averaged 1.3 blocks and was third in the Big 12 with 3.1 offensive rebounds per game.

• Udeh Jr. led the Horned Frogs in rebounding 16 times and had 10-or-more rebounds in nine games including a season-high 15 rebounds and a season-high four blocks at Baylor.

TRE'S WAY

• Tre Donaldson returns to his home state for his final collegiate season after transferring to Miami from Michigan.

• A year ago, Donaldson helped the Wolverines to the Big Ten Tournament title and was one of four players to start all 37 games.

• Donaldson averaged 11.3 points, 4.1 assists and 3.5 rebounds per game and had 26 games in which he scored 10-or-more points.

• The 6-foot-3 guard shot 43.3 percent from the field and 37.5 percent from the 3-point range.



SHELTON'S STAGE

• Jai Lucas quickly showed South Florida his recruiting prowess, signing the second-highest recruit in program history by 247Sports Composite in Shelton Henderson.

• A Houston native that attended the same high school and Coach Lucas, Bellaire, Henderson was named the Houston Chronicle All-Great Houston Player of the Year.

• Henderson was a five-star recruit and was ranked as the No. 14 overall recruit by 247Sports. He earned a composite ranking of 0.9920.

• As a senior at Bellaire, Henderson averaged 22.3 points, 7.5 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 3.0 steals per game helping Bellaire to the UIL Class 6A Division I state championship game.

• Henderson took home a gold medal with USA Basketball at the 2024 FIBA U18 AmeriCup where he averaged 8.0 points and 4.5 rebounds per game.

WHOLE NEW STAFF

• Lucas's first coaching staff is full of new faces but features a wealth of experience and roots to South Florida.

• All four on-court coaches in Erik Pastrana, Charlton 'C.Y.' Young, Andrew Moran and Russell Springmann bring head coaching experience from all levels of basketball while Pastrana, Young and Moran hail from South Florida.

• Pastrana, who was instrument in Oklahoma State signing the No. 4 recruiting class in 2020, served as the head coach at Daytona State College and compiled a 19-12 record. Four of his players were named to the Mid-Florida All-Conference Team.

• A staple in city's basketball community Young played high school at Carrol City before playing collegiately at Georgia Southern where he ranks 14th all-time in program history in career points and still holds the

school's 3-point field goal percentage record, shooting 40.9 percent in his four-year career. Young spent four seasons as the Eagles head coach and helped Georgia Southern to a second-place finish in his third season.

• Moran, who was recently named the 2025 Naismith National High School boys basketball coach of the year, comes to The U after serving as the head coach at Miami's Christopher Columbus High School for the past six years where he led the Explorers to four state championships and a 145-34 record.

• Moran founded the Miami Hoop School, a basketball skills training program in 2012 and was the first I'm Possible trainer to be introduced to the State of Florida. He has trained athletes of all levels from high school to NBA players, including Tim Hardaway Jr, Tyler Herro and James Johnson, among others.

• Springmann brings over 20 years of coaching experience to the Miami program having progressively moved up the ranks from being a graduate assistant at Florida in 1996 to the head coach at Oral Roberts the past two seasons.

• Throughout his time coaching, Springmann has worked with 18 NBA draft picks, including the likes of Kevin Durant, LaMarcus Aldridge and Tristan Thompson. He was also an assistant coach at Texas during Lucas' two years as a Longhorn (2008-11).

Jai Lucas was named the 14th head coach of the University of Miami men's basketball program on March 6, 2024.

Lucas took over the reins of the Miami men's basketball program after spending the past three seasons at Duke, where he served as an assistant coach for one campaign before being elevated to associate head coach in 2023.

One of the nation's most respected assistant coaches and recruiters, Lucas has spent 12 overall seasons on the staffs at Duke, Kentucky and Texas, helping those programs to seven NCAA Tournament appearances.

While at Duke, Lucas played a pivotal role in helping the Blue Devils secure the nation's top recruiting class in both 2024 and 2025. As associate head coach, he served as the program's defensive coordinator. The Blue Devils finished the 2024-25 season ranked seventh in the nation in scoring defense (62.8 points per game) and fourth nationally in field goal percentage defense (38.4). KenPom rated Duke as the fifth-best defense in the country with an adjusted defense efficiency rating of 90.8.

In 2023-24, Duke's defense held opponents to 66.3 points per game, which ranked 28th nationally and second in the ACC, while the team posted records of 27-9 overall and 15-5 in conference to advance to the NCAA Elite Eight. In Lucas' first season in Durham, the Blue Devils yielded just 63.6 points per game, a .406 field goal percentage and .305 three-point percentage – each top 30 nationally and each top two in the ACC, en route to capturing the ACC Tournament championship.

Before arriving in Durham, Lucas was on staff at Kentucky for two seasons, joining the Wildcats as recruiting coordinator in August 2020 before a promotion to assistant coach/recruiting coordinator for the 2020-21 season. In two seasons in Lexington, he helped UK sign five players who played in either the McDonald's All-American or Jordan Brand Classic games and was instrumental in landing three student-athletes ranked in ESPN 100's class of 2021 rankings and two in the 2002 class.

Lucas began his coaching career at his alma mater Texas, where he spent seven seasons on staff. The Houston native began as a special assistant with the program from 2013-15 before serving as director of basketball operations in the 2015-16 season. He was promoted to assistant coach in June 2016 and, in his first year, helped the Longhorns win 20 games and earn a spot in the NCAA Tournament.

In his first two recruiting cycles as an assistant coach, Lucas helped the Longhorns ink two Top-10 signing classes. The 2017 class was rated No. 5 nationally by Rivals while the 2018 class was tapped No. 8 in the country by ESPN and 247Sports. His debut season as an assistant also helped spark a three-year streak in which a Texas freshman was selected in the first round of the NBA Draft -- Jarrett Allen (No. 22 to Brooklyn in 2017), Mohamed Bamba (No. 6 to Orlando in 2018) and Jaxson Hayes (No. 8 to Atlanta in 2019). was named before going No. 8 overall in 2019. The selection of Hayes -- the Big 12 Freshman of the Year -- meant Texas joined Duke and Kentucky as the only programs with a lottery pick in consecutive drafts.

Lucas played two seasons at Texas, helping the Longhorns earn back-to-back NCAA Tournament bids. He played at Florida as a freshman in 2007-08 and was named to the SEC All-Freshman Team. Lucas later spent three seasons in the professional ranks, including one in Latvia with BK Valmiera of the Baltic Basketball League (2011-12) and two in the NBA Development League with the Idaho Stampede (2012-13) and Canton Charge (2013).

Lucas was a McDonald's All-American, a Jordan Brand Classic selection and a Parade All-America Second Team honoree as a senior at Bellaire (TX) High School in the Houston area. He started for three seasons and was a three-time District Player of the Year while leading Bellaire to three consecutive district titles.

Lucas graduated from Texas in 2011 with a degree in corporate communication. He and his wife Kori have two sons, Jaxin and Kalib, and he has a son, Xavier. His father, John II, is a former head coach of the San Antonio Spurs, Philadelphia 76ers and Cleveland Cavaliers who most recently served as an assistant coach for the Houston Rockets. The elder Lucas played 14 seasons in the NBA after earning All-America honors in both basketball and tennis at Maryland.

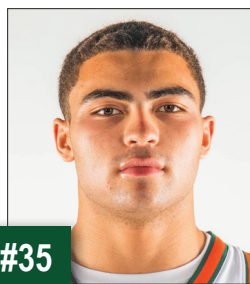
