

## Workplace Safety and Security - Storyboard

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**Target Audience:** All employees of Lakes Hospital. Training provided on a yearly basis.

**Estimated Seat Time:** 30 – 35-minute eLearning course.

### Business Purpose

- Lakes Hospital has experienced a 20% increase in the number of reported workplace violence incidents this year.
- By providing workplace safety training and development for all employees, Lakes Hospital aims to decrease the incident rate of workplace violence and better prepare all employees to help prevent and effectively respond to a workplace violence situation.
- This training will provide Lakes Hospital employees with a toolkit of knowledge and skills to help them to recognize escalating situations, de-escalate escalating situations, take general security measures to prevent workplace violence and security breaches, and how to respond in an active shooter situation.

### Learning Objectives:








1. Identify the physical and verbal signs of an escalating situation.

Checking your own emotions and remaining calm is the best first step.

By taking a moment to evaluate where you are emotionally gives you time to take a breath and calm yourself before you respond to the incident.

## How You Can Help Law Enforcement in an Active Shooter Situation



1

Remain calm and follow  
officers' instructions.

2

Put down any items in your  
hands and spread your fingers.

3

Keep hands visible at all times.

4

Avoid making quick movements  
towards officers such as attempting  
to hold them for safety.

5

Avoid pointing, screaming  
or yelling.

6

Do not stop to ask officers for help  
or direction when evacuating.



# YOUR SAFETY IS OUR PRIORITY

When responding to a potentially violent situation, it is best to mentally prepare yourself for how you might respond.

*Consider the following actions:*

## TAKE ACTION

Taking any action to confront the perpetrator is very dangerous and must only be considered when your life is in imminent danger.



## EVACUATE

Before you rush to an exit, you must consider the location of the threat.

## HIDE OUT

If you choose to hide out, you must choose your location carefully to ensure your safety.

## Safety is Everyone's Responsibility

- If you see something, say something.
- Contact the Security Services Team at #00 if you see something suspicious or suspect a suspicious person.



## General Security Procedures

- Never open a door let someone in.
- Never duplicate hospital-issued keys.
- Have your keys out and ready to enter your vehicle.
- Call the Security Team at #00 if you see or suspect something suspicious.



## Escalating Situations

- Look for physical and verbal signs of an escalating situation.
- Apply the LOWLINE Approach to de-escalate a situation.



## Active Shooter Situation

You have three main options to respond in an active shooter situation. Consider your options carefully.

- Evacuate
- Hide Out
- Take Action
