Personalize

Make sure you personally address each letter "Dear Mr. Smith" not Dear Buyer

Include Pictures

"Tell your parents you got this!" Buyers can tell if the letter is written by a parent.

List your parents' names.

Punctuation/Spelling

Neatness

Be CREATIVE

HOW TO WRITE THE PERFECT "BUYERS LETTER"

Today we know that Woods-Claeyssens Foundation will not be attending this year's Fair. **Buyer outreach is critically important**.

Please create a professionally written buyer letter and send to potential buyers. Below is a sample format you can utilize to craft your letter:

Dear Mr./Mrs./Ms. ₋	 	,		

Paragraph One: In this paragraph, introduce yourself, your family and identify the organization you are affiliated with. Explain that you will be exhibiting your Supervised Agricultural Experience Project at the California Mid-State Fair.

Paragraph Two: In this paragraph, describe your project, i.e. what you raised, how many hours you have invested in your project, special facts about your project (examples: type of feed, exercise program, breeding information.) Share with the reader what you have learned from undertaking this project and how their support will help you in your future endeavors.

Paragraph Three: In this paragraph, describe for the reader what you get out of being an 4-H/FFA member. Inform the reader of other 4-H/FFA activities you participate in.

Paragraph Four: In this paragraph, thank the reader for his/her consideration. Let the reader know how he/she can reach you for more information about the fair and/or your project.

Uploading Photo

- -Choose you have "Previously Registered this Year" and enter password
- -Verify your contact information.
- -Click the "View/Print transactions" button.
- -Click the "Upload Media" button.
- -Upload your media.

Congratulations to the 2021 Scholarship Recipient, Donielle Harpster

The James W. Brabeck Youth Legacy Fund (JWBYLF) selected Donielle Harpster of the Cerro Alto 4-H Club as their 2021 scholarship recipient. She is an experienced public speaker and youth leader who has spent the past 13 years as an active participant in her local 4-H program. Harpster credits 4-H with teaching her "respect, responsibility, dedication, and drive," and hopes to bring awareness to 4-H's many amazing qualities through her ongoing endeavors. Harpster is a Mission College Preparatory senior and will be using the scholarship to support her education to become a large animal veterinarian.

The JWBYLF was established in 2016 in honor of James Brabeck, former CEO of the San Luis Obispo Farm Supply Company. The fund's goal is to serve agriculture-interested and at-risk youth in San Luis Obispo and northern Santa Barbara counties through a scholarship available to exhibitors at the California Mid-State Fair.

The recipient is chosen during a blind application process and is awarded up to \$20,000 to support post-secondary education. Awardees are also expected to act as an ambassador for the Youth Legacy Project and are recognized for the leadership qualities they share. "The previous two JWBYLF scholarship recipients, Ashley Rosilez and Isaac Lopez, were active participants of their local 4- H programs and continue to pursue promising careers paths in agriculture. This is one of the most impactful scholarships currently available to San Luis Obispo County students; this fund helps to foster future leaders in agriculture, an industry that plays a key role throughout our region.
