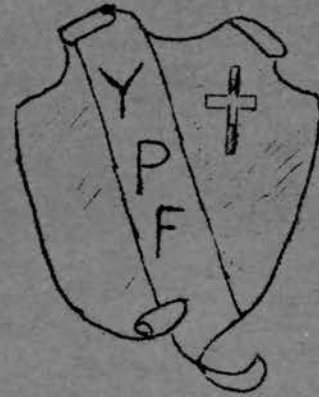

The Constitution of the Young People's Fellowship  
of the Episcopal Church in the Diocese of Minn.

PREAMBLE

We are persuaded that the work of the Church which it is our purpose to extend and stimulate rests on the basis of eternal truth. We purpose to seek Jesus who is in the world and through a growing companionship of worship and service with Him to follow Him bravely in an adventure of Christ-like living which of its own joy, and truth, and grace shall bring others to him.

ARTICLE I Name

The name shall be the Young People's Fellowship of the Episcopal Church in the Diocese of Minnesota.

ARTICLE II Purpose

The purpose of the Young Peoples Fellowship shall be to encourage its members to follow Christ and to share with others their experience with Him that Christian leadership and character may be developed within them. The organization shall establish, unify, and stimulate the activity of the youth of the diocese through a definite program of worship, service, study, and fellowship.

ARTICLE III Membership

Section 1

Any young people's group functioning as a unit of the Episcopal church in the Diocese shall be eligible to membership when it obtains the consent of its rector, its president and vice-president are communicants of the Episcopal church, it accepts this constitution with its by-laws as a basis for its activity, and it makes written application to the Executive Council of the Diocesan Young Peoples Fellowship.

Section 2

Members-at-large where no parochial group is established, may be admitted to the Young People's Fellowship of this diocese upon payment of diocesan dues.

ARTICLE IV Officers.

Section 1

The officers of the organization shall be president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, youth advisor, lay advisor and clergy advisor.

Section 2

All officers of the diocesan organization shall be communicants of the Episcopal Church, and the president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, and youth advisor shall hold membership cards of the current year, and shall be members in good standing.

Section 3.

The president shall have had at least one year active experience in a district or diocesan office prior to the election.

The vice president shall have the same qualifications as the president.

The youth advisor shall have been a diocesan officer within the previous five years.

The clergy advisor shall be appointed by the Bishop within one month of the close of the annual convention, or as soon thereafter as possible. He shall be the official connection between the church in the diocese and the Executive Council of the Young People's Fellowship.

#### Section 4

No officer shall serve for more than two consecutive terms in the same office.

The vice president shall succeed to the presidency in the event that office becomes vacant.

### ARTICLE V Districts

The districts shall be responsible to the Executive Council for the activity in their territories, and such other duties as may be delegated to them by the Executive Council. All district officers shall be communicants of the Episcopal Church and they shall be president, clergy advisor, district representative, and such others as the districts may choose. The districts shall initiate such legislation as their members shall deem advisable. Districts and their component groups may adopt constitutions and by-laws providing they do not conflict with the statutes of any higher division.

### ARTICLE VI Annual Convention

An annual convention shall be held each year at such time and place as may be designated by the Executive Council.

### ARTICLE VII Constitution

This constitution may be amended at any annual convention provided that the proposed amendment shall be submitted to the executive council in writing at least two months prior to the date of the convention and they shall incorporate it in written notices sent to each parochial group at least one month prior to the convention. A three-fourths vote (a quorum being present) shall be necessary to adopt the amendment. A majority of active parochial groups must have voting representation before voting can be accomplished.

## BY-LAWS

### ARTICLE I Membership

A member in good standing shall be a person who has paid dues for the current year and who has in the opinion of his parish officers been reasonably active during the year.

### ARTICLE II Election of Officers

A committee on nominations appointed by the president with the approval of an advisor shall meet prior to the day of the elections and nominate at least two candidates for each office.

The report of the committee on nominations as presented at the annual convention shall summarize the youth leadership experience of the candidates. Nominations from the floor shall include a brief summary of the nominee's youth leadership experience.

Consent of the nominees to their candidacy shall be sought previous to the submission of the report of the committee on nominations.

Election of all officers shall be by majority vote.

All officers with the exception of the advisors shall be installed at the concluding service of the convention.

The term of office of all officers and advisors, except the clergy advisor, shall begin at the termination of the service of installation and shall expire at the same service the following year.

### ARTICLE III Duties of Officers

The officers shall perform the duties pertaining to their respective offices.

The president shall preside at all meetings. He shall be responsible for the activity and extension of the Young Peoples Fellowship in the diocese. He shall have power to call meetings as herein provided. He shall make an annual report at the convention. He shall be a member ex officio of all committees.

The vice president shall preside at all meetings in the absence of the president. He shall be responsible to the president for any duties delegated to him.

The secretary shall keep a permanent and accurate record of all official activities of the organization. He, with the treasurer, shall be in charge of the duty of keeping a duplicate file of the members and officers of all groups, districts, and members-at-large. He shall conduct the correspondence of the organization.

The treasurer shall be responsible for keeping a permanent and accurate record of all monetary transactions of this organization. He shall, with the secretary, keep a duplicate file of the members and officers of all groups, districts, and members-at-large, with a complete record of their standing.

The district representative shall represent his district council on the executive council of the diocesan organization. He shall keep his district council and the diocesan executive council informed of pertinent actions of the other body.

The advisors shall act in an advisory capacity to the officers and the executive council.

An admission service shall be conducted by the diocesan officers for all new groups and members-at-large as soon as possible after they have been recognized. This duty may be specifically delegated to the district officers.

#### ARTICLE IV Executive Council

The executive council shall consist of diocesan officers as herein provided by this constitution. It shall also include district presidents, district representatives and district clergy advisors. Each member shall be entitled to one vote.

A quorum for the transaction of business at a regular meeting shall consist of two-thirds of the members entitled to vote with a majority of districts represented, and at least three diocesan officers present, one of whom shall be the president or vice president, one the secretary or treasurer, and one advisor.

The executive council shall:- have power to fill all vacancies in the diocesan offices by a three-fourths majority vote, except that the vice president shall succeed to the presidency:- have power to call or sanction any meeting it shall deem advisable to the interest of the Young Peoples Fellowship; meet at least six times a year; have power to determine matters of policy not herein provided for, provided, however, that they shall hold only until the following annual convention.

Districts may be established by the executive council.

Notice of regular meetings shall be given at least ten days in advance. When less than ten days notice can be given, the meeting shall be considered a special meeting and the quorum shall consist of three-fourths of the members.

#### ARTICLE V Finances

The annual dues and assessments of the organizations shall not exceed fifty cents (50¢) per capita. Dues shall be due and payable on or before March 15th of each year, the number of voting delegates to the annual convention shall be apportioned according to the paid dues of that date. Membership cards shall be issued in receipt of dues.

Unauthorized expenditures made between consecutive council meetings shall not total over ten dollars (\$10.) and shall be reported in full at the next council meeting.

Money shall be deposited in a bank designated by the executive council at its first meeting. The account shall be registered under the signatures of the president, treasurer, and one of the advisors to be designated by the council. Provision shall be made so that any two signatures shall be necessary to withdraw.

The fiscal year shall run from March 16th to March 15th the following year, at which time the books shall be audited.

#### ARTICLE VI Committees

An auditing committee appointed by the president shall audit the books of the treasurer at the end of the fiscal year.

A program committee shall be appointed by the president with the approval of the executive council, to assemble and compile material for group use. They shall assemble this material on the basis of the four-fold ideals of worship, study, fellowship, and service.

A credentials committee shall be appointed by the president with the approval of an advisor to decide questions of representation at the convention.

## ARTICLE VII Convention

The secretary shall prepare a report blank with the approval of the executive council to be sent out thirty days prior to the annual convention to each parochial group in the diocese. These reports shall be returned to him at least ten days before the convention for compilation and presentation to the convention.

Parishes and missions with one or more parochial groups shall be entitled to two delegates for the first 25 members or part thereof over ten, and one additional delegate for each 15 members over 25 whose current dues are paid.

Parochial groups with less than ten members who have paid dues for the current year shall have conventions privileges as provided for members-at-large, unless recognized as groups by the credentials committee of the convention with the advice of the president. In the case that they are recognized as groups they shall have one vote for each group.

Members-at-large shall have the privilege of the floor with the privilege of serving on committees.

Voting delegates and visiting delegates shall hold membership cards for the current year to be eligible to attend the convention. Dues of voting delegates shall have been paid before March 15th

A quorum for the transaction of business at the annual convention shall be two-thirds of the registered voting delegates. In case of tie votes, the president shall cast a ballot.

## ARTICLE VIII By-Laws

A revised copy of these by-laws shall be sent along with any amendments to the constitutions to each parochial group following the convention.

These by-laws may be amended at any annual convention by a two-thirds vote of the registered voting delegates provided that a majority of groups have representation.

Roberts Rules of Order shall be the guide for all parliamentary practice except as where inconsistent with this constitution or its by-laws.
