LWVMN POLICIES

Policies adopted by the League of Women Voters of Minnesota, hereinafter referred to as LWVMN, will be reviewed annually by the Board of Directors.

Suggestions for policies may be made by any member of LWVMN, its staff, its officers or Board of Directors. The Board of Directors shall adopt all policies.

Following a policy's adoption by the Board of Directors, the Executive Director will prepare procedures for review by the Office Management Committee to be sure that the procedures conform with the intent of the Board of Directors.

1. Nonpartisan

LWVMN Board members and the Executive Director shall consult with the appropriate local League president and the state president to determine the possible impact of active involvement of LWVMN Board members in party politics.

2. Use of Membership Lists

The President and the Executive Director may sell or exchange our mailing lists with other organizations on a selected basis using the following guidelines:

- a. The sale of the list has the capability of producing revenue, attracting members or participants for the League.
- b. The policies and public positions of the organization receiving the LWWMN list <u>must be compatible</u> with League purposes or positions.
- c. The LWVMN list cannot be traded or sold to be used for partisan or commercial purposes. (January, 1987)

Telemarketing is an approved fundraising tool. The exchange of our membership lists with other organizations for this purpose is permissible providing that the above criteria established for direct mail exchanges are met. (August 1987)

3. Office Staff Work Outside Office

Requests for paid LWV staff to work outside the office should be cleared with the appropriate portfolio chair and authorized by the President. (Examples: staff member help in Legislature, staff member consultation with local League, or staff member work at conference or workshop.)

4. Reimbursement of Board Member Expenses

Board members must submit monthly expense vouchers whether they wish to be reimbursed or not. Expenses should be listed for all functions state Board members are required to attend. The voucher form defines categories and allowable amounts. Board members will be reimbursed for Board meetings, committee meetings, etc. required by their job description. Mileage will be reimbursed at 15 per mile (January, 1983 Board Meeting).

LWVMN POLICIES (page 2)

5. Nondiscrimination

No LWVMN meeting will be held in a place which is known to discriminate on the basis of race, religion or sex or is not handicapped accessible.

6. Consensus Questions

When a consensus or concurrence is planned, the state Program Committee submits questions to an ad hoc study review and consensus/concurrence committee consisting of program and action Board representatives and local League representatives well in advance of publication for comment and revision. The resource materials should be used to pre-test the questions on a representative sample of local League members before the questions are submitted to the Board. Materials and consensus/concurrence questions will be submitted to the Board for its approval.

7. Editing of Written Material

All written official information or communication should be reviewed by the President and Executive Director prior to mailing.

8. Publications

Name of writers and contributors to a publication should be included. All publications are reviewed by the President.

All state Program publications are submitted to an editor and to two reading committees (one made up of on-Board and off-Board members and another composed of "experts,") before the final draft is approved and prepared for publication.

9. Statewide Meetings

Registration cost is to be approved by the meeting planners in consultation with the Executive Director. All meetings are designed to be self-supporting. Costs of attendance by Board members, or those persons designated by the Board, material distributed, staff time, etc. are figured into the registration cost.

10. Board Member Participation at State Convention and Council

The League's Articles of Incorporation state: "They (the officers and Board of Directors) shall hold office until the conclusion of the next regular biennial Convention, or until their successors have been elected and qualified." Therefore, members who are up for election to state Board and are not local League Convention or Council delegates cannot vote and may have the privilege of the floor only if granted by the Chair.

Board members are encouraged to attend Convention and Council caucuses but must not lead or dominate the discussion.

LWVMN POLICIES (page 3)

11. Action

- A. Most action decisions are made by the IWMN Board during their regular board meetings. If the need arises between Board meetings, IWMN action at the state level is authorized by a committee which includes the President, Legislative Coordinator and Program Chair. Copies of letters and testimony will be distributed to Board.
- B. Local Leagues may take action on the local level under a state position if the membership is informed on the issue, LWV position and the action being taken.
- C. Local Leagues may take action on the state level under a local position if all three of these conditions are met:
 - 1. The legislation must not be statewide in scope;
 - Every affected local League must be notified of the proposal prior to any action;
 - 3. Such action must be reported to the President and the Legislative Coordinator prior to any action.

12. Approval of Testimony

Any formal statement made in the name of LWVMN must be approved by the Legislative Coordinator, Program Director and President. Testimony must be written, with copies for office files and Board members. It is preferable that approval for testimony not be given over the telephone.

13. Attending Conferences or Meetings

Board members who attend meetings or conferences related to their portfolios should ask Board approval for expenses beforehand, if not covered by the budget.

14. Speakers' Bureau

It is the policy of the LWVMN to request that an honorarium be paid to a speaker who appears before a non-LWV group. A suggested figure is \$50, to be adjusted up or down depending on the financial circumstances of the group and the expenses of the speaker. The only exception would be a request to talk about the League, which we will do without charge.

The speaker is expected to contribute the honorarium to the LWVMN; however, any expenses (such as mileage, food, lodging or child care) will be reimbursed by the LWVMN.

15. Resignations

A Board member who wants to resign should do so by a letter to the President. The letter will be read at the next scheduled Board meeting for acceptance by the Board.

16. Stipends for Project Directors

Board members cannot be paid project directors for a League of Women Voters of Minnesota project. (Office Management Committee, November 4, 1982.)

17. Guidelines for News Conferences

When any Board member determines that an issue or topic warrants a news conference, the Board member must contact the following people in order:

- . President
- . PR Director
- . Legislative Coordinator
- . Executive Director
- . PR/Development staff person

If the idea is approved, the responsibilities would be divided as follows:

Board member - identify key people who will make statements at news conference; prepare statement and get approval; define contents of press kit and get approval.

President and Legislative Coordinator - approve materials and procedures defined by Board member.

PR Director - assist Board member in planning and drafting all materials; arrange facility for conference; provide guidelines on quality of press kits; contact assignment editors at TV stations; prepare media memo announcing conference; attend news conference; serve as press liaison.

Executive Director - determine office timeline and staff availability; review all materials.

PR/Development staff - review materials; implement required distribution of media memo (invitation to cover) and news release (news conference statement).

18. Joining Coalitions

In joining a coalition League should determine if the coalition's purpose is consistent with the League's position and goals: meeting our requirements for taking action, for priority, and for nonpartisanship. Can League accomplish its goals better alone or with the coalition?

League should be comfortable working with the individuals and organizations and be aware of how they and the coalition are funded.

League should be aware of any required financial commitment, as well as requirements of time, staff, and expertise.

League should be knowledgeable of the coalition's structure and decision making process.

Each League must join a coalition at the appropriate level. This means that the State League joins state-level coalitions, while local Leagues join coalitions dealing with local issues. When a local League wishes to join a coalition promoting a local issue, it should check with other Leagues in the area to make sure the various positions do not conflict.

Background: Barbara Flanigan has suggested a focus on the MN's delivery of mental health services to children.

Also Barbara Sykora, Chair of the IR party, has urged LWWMN to do a "study" of the caucus system - exploring either a modification of the present system or going to a primary election system altogether, since the Legislature has set a Presidential primary for 1992. Burkhalter thinks Spring Focus of 1991 would be an excellent opportunity. She points out that it would put us back in touch with leadership in both parties; the issue is a long-standing interest of LWW, which we haven't examined for some time.

7. Mental Health Project Approval: MOTION: that IWVMN subcontract with the Mental Health Division of the Department of Human Services to carry out a mental health consumer education/leadership training project for three years.

Background: See attached letter of intent to NIMH from McKinnell and Flanigan. IWVMN would receive about \$90,000 a year for three years to implement this project. It would involve hiring of two FTEs (full time equivalents) and would begin in January of 1991. This is contingent upon MN DHS receiving the grant from the National Institute of Mental Health. We should hear in September of 1990.

LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT: Takkunen is available for advice on how to use the book. The book is free to LLs - one each - and to the regional reps.

CONVENTION: Questions were raised about the Illinois concurrence. Can US handle two studies? A national position would be much more effective, but the study would be hard to fund. Illinois had planned to get on the spot concurrence at Convention, but the parliamentarian will rule that out of order, so there will be cost involved if it's adopted. Delegates were asked to use the term Firearms not Gun Control. Concern was expressed about the lack of interest in military spending, arms control, etc. It may show up on the Convention floor. The Electoral College will be a MN thrust at Convention.

PMP - everyone seemed satisfied with the proposal or even increasing it.

Ad Hoc Committee report - much time will be given over to this. Florida is opposed to the entire report. National collection of these.

Bylaws - the MN recommendation had no support and was not recommended. Our delegates will let it die.

1990 SESSION: It was a good year for the League. The lack of money in the state is getting serious.

LWVMN is losing some good lobbyists in the next year. They will be hard to replace. Should we be thinking about paid lobbying?

TELECONFERENCE: The J.C. Penney Teleconference will take place June 23rd, 12:30-3:30, at NE Metro Technical College.

OUTLOOK: Get your revisions in fast.

The League of Women Voters of Minnesota would be very interested in managing the project funded by the National Institute of Mental Health to recruit, organize, educate and train consumers and family members for involvement in Local Mental Health Advisory Councils. We anticipate the approval of our full board of directors at its meeting on June 18th. We believe that our overall objectives and long experience in citizen information and education, our knowledge of the mental health system in Minnesota and our past experience in leadership development would all qualify us well to undertake this task. Local League chapters in various parts of Minnesota would help in meeting the objectives of the grant.

APPROPRIATENESS OF LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS FOR THIS PROJECT

Overall Goal and Policies

Since its founding 70 years ago the League of Women Voters of Minnesota has worked to empower citizens, achieve fundamental fairness in the political arena and address social problems through systems change. A successor to the Women's Suffrage Association, the League has concentrated on helping people become politically effective. Over the course of its history the League has obtained a reputation for fairness and objectivity in voter education. In addition to sponsoring hundreds of candidate forums in local communities, the League has for the last 12 years sponsored statewide candidate debates for gubernatorial and senatorial candidates. Local League activities have included working closely with groups which have been underrepresented in the political process. The state League has a long history as a major educator of the general public about issues affecting American Indians. The fourth edition of our book, Indians in Minnesota, was published by the University of Minnesota Press in 1985.

Competence on Mental Health Issues

In addition to voter education and public information, the League also studies and takes action on a wide variety of issues at the national, state and local levels. At the June, 1987 Convention, members of the League of Women Voters of Minnesota voted to study "the mental health system in Minnesota, with particular emphasis on the availability and quality of community services". This was followed by the publication in the spring of 1988 of Serving Minnesota's Mentally Ill: An Introduction. This report, widely distributed in the state, brought together in one place information on a wide variety of mental health service issues. Member study of the issues raised in the report was followed by the adoption of a League legislative position in January, 1989. The position emphasized the importance of building a comprehensive system of community services for persons with mental illness. In the spring of 1989 the League Mental Health Committee produced Monitoring Mental Health Services at the Local Level: A Workbook intended as a tool for evaluating mental health services at the local level and seeing to what extent the mandates of the 1987 Minnesota Comprehensive Mental Health Act were being implemented locally. Four monitoring workshops were held in different parts of Minnesota for League members and all other interested persons to acquaint them with the use of the monitoring tool. A major grant from the McKnight Foundation in 1989 enabled the League to begin a two year monitoring project in 11 Minnesota counties using the monitoring workbook.

The League plans to continue its strong mental health commitment.

Since its involvement with the mental health system, the League has cooperated closely with the Mental Health Division of the Minnesota Department of Human Services, the Alliance for the Mentally Ill of Minnesota and the Minnesota Mental Health Association and other organizations involved in mental health issues. Eight other statewide organizations cosponsored the 1989 monitoring workshops. In addition, members of the LWVMN Mental Health Committee have participated regularly in external reviews of county plans and grant proposals with Mental Health Division staff. A number of League members serve on local Mental Health Advisory Councils; several local Leagues serve as resources on mental health in the community.

Leadership Training Capability

The League of Women Voters of Minnesota's "Raising Minnesota's Leaders" project, funded by a major grant from the Minnesota Women's Fund, 1988-90, relates closely to the proposal for consumer empowerment. The goal of the project was to increase and diversify the pool of women leaders in communities throughout Minnesota, thereby enlarging the group of women elected or hired to positions to make the decisions that affect women's lives. The project attempted to enhance the identification and development of strong leaders who believe in consensus-based action. The training aimed to increase the self-confidence of participants through the acquisition of skills and through encouragement of peers and trainers. The project began with a two-day professional training session of a core group of designated leaders. The newly trained leaders then led a series of fifteen workshops. Participants in the original training sessions served on the planning and project committee to carry out future training.

LEAGUE UNDERSTANDING OF THE PROPOSED PROJECT

The League of Women Voters supports the objectives of the Minnesota grant proposal. We are prepared to conduct "a specific, focused effort on ensuring consumer and family participation in LAC activities". We understand that a major component of the project would be establishing and working with a consumer-run advisory committee.

We have participated in the formulation of the proposal and are prepared to implement it.
