

Directions to Workshops

West Metro Alliance: Central Middle School (old Wayzata High School), 305 Vicksburg Lane, Plymouth. Take 494 to 55 west. Go south on Vicksburg Lane. After passing the Luc Line Bike Trail, go 5-6 blocks. Central Middle School is on the right. Parking is on the South side of the buildings. Use East doors and follow signs to the cafeteria.

Woodbury/Cottage Grove: From 494 take the Valley Creek Road exit 1 ½ miles east to the Woodbury City Hall at 8301 Valley Creek Road.

From 94 east of 494 take Radio Drive exit. Go south several miles to Valley Creek Road. Woodbury City Hall is on the left at 8301 Valley Creek Road

Red River Valley - Fargo:

Directions From the West:

I-94 east to I-29. Head north on I-29. Take Main Avenue exit and head east. Fryin' Pan is quite a ways down (directly to the east of Wells Fargo Bank) on the left side of the road in a strip mall facility and right before you cross the river into Minnesota.

Directions From the East:

I-94 west to 8th Avenue (Hwy 75) exit in Moorhead, MN and head north to Main Avenue. Turn west onto Main Avenue, cross over river into North Dakota. Fryin Pan is on your right side in a strip mall facility.

Directions From the North:

I-29 south to Main Avenue (Fargo) exit. Head east on Main Avenue. Fryin'Pan is quite a ways down (directly to the east of Wells Fargo Bank) on the left side of the road in a strip mall facility and right before you cross the river into Minnesota.

Directions From the South:

I-29 north to Main Avenue (Fargo) exit. Head east on Main Avenue. Fryin'Pan is quite a ways down (directly to the east of Wells Fargo Bank) on the left side of the road in a strip mall facility and right before you cross the river into Minnesota.

Northfield: From Interstate 35W: take Minnesota Highway 19 (Exit 69) and go east seven miles to the traffic light on Minnesota Highway 3; turn left (north) on 30 and proceed to the next traffic light at 2nd Street, turn right on 2nd, cross the river, cross Division Street, go up the hill and turn left on College Street. Go one block to the College entrance on 1st and College Street. It is only about a 45-minute drive from Minneapolis and 60 minutes from Rochester.

As you enter the campus start counting buildings on your left. The first is Scoville, then Burton (set way back), Willis...the building with the clock tower, then comes Severance...set way back. THAT is the building where you will find GREAT HALL and the League meeting. There is a walk leading up to the door....but we will have signs.

Parking is all along that street on your right.






