Jeanne -

I talked to Gail Gendler this afternoon - 11/20/79 - and she did not discourage us from going for more money but if we do, we must do it right away. It would have to be approved by their Citizens Board, meeting the last Tuesday of each month--so the next one would be December. Then it goes to EPA AND would take about 2 months.

The main thing is that she feels the budget must be in more final form and it would be good if you three could do this on the 29th or whenever you are meeting. It should not be too hard, but involves making some basic decisions on each of the items in the basic budget I drew up. Then we will know whether or not to bother about going for more money.

Areas to decide:

- 1. Is registration fee high enough? She implied it could be more and that could help our income side. But keeping it low also endourages people to attend, she agreed.
- 2. Honoraria how many speakers and what will they cost? Can that be firmed up now?
- 3. Travel for speakers maybe there can be a closer estimate now based on three potential out of state speakers.

- 4. Maybe something should be addadxfor long distrance phone calls account (\$50) and you should make some during your meeting about these speakers and also find out what they will charge, who covers their plane fare, whether they want overnight lodging--presumably they all will, etc.
- 5. Facilities rental can now be adjusted down.
- 6. Will you use a film--if not that can be eliminated
- 7. Mailing out kits now eliminated?
- 8. Under administration—it's a lot of work and a lot of hours, we have learned through sad experience of not charging enough. I think we can justify all the money in this category. If Gail is concerned about how the budget looks and too much for administration—which she implied to me also—the planning committee expenses could be listed separately or under program. You all need to decide how and how many members of the committee will be collecting mileage—that number may be too high.
- 9. Promotion--Gail implied the committee needed to think through more about how many flyers and how they would be distributed.
- 10. Back to administration: Gail said some of the larger committee said that these costs could be cut by their volunteer organizations doing some of the work. You need to decide about that. It's okay if they are dependable and if a lot of League staff time isn't needed to supervise and follow through on them.

11. Scholarships--Gail said that she felt they were unnecessary with such a low registration fee. Possibly there could be scholarships for travel or for overnight costs--but she didn't seem too concerned about that. But it should be decided one way or ther other. Maybe this is an area to cut out.

If we stay within the \$5000 we have to submit a detailed budget but it can be approved without much hassle. If we apply for more, it is time-consuming and may be more questioned, but she felt we could get the extra money. Either way, MPCA is audited and must defend the expenditures. There is no extra audit over \$5000.

Good luck--I'm really sorry that I will be out of the office for your meeting.

FOLLOW-UP to the WASTE ALERT! CONFERENCE in Madison Wisconsin, July 26-28, 1979

TO: All Minnesotans who attended the Madison Conference

RE: Consideration of plans for a Minnesota Waste Alert! Conference in 1980.

As a starter, let us fill you in on what has happened (or not happened) since we left you in Madison over a month ago. First, there was NO training session for state conference planners in Chicago, as was suggested in Madison. Secondly, we did not receive the full list of Minnesota attendees at the Madison meetings until this week. Hence there has been some delay in getting out this communication. Now, however, we are ready to "take off!" We are calling a meeting to talk about our plans for our own Minnesota WASTE ALERT! conference on MONDAY EVENING, SEPTEMBER 24, at 7:30 P.M.

We hope very much that all of you will make a real effort to attend this important meeting. Some topics for consideration that have occured to us are:-

- 1. Alternative dates and places for state conference.
- 2. Establishment of an over-all Coalition Citizens Committee to direct Conference planning (election of committee, officers, special assignments, and so on).
- 3. Fiscal arrangements (grant money available, citizen scholarships, application preparation, etc.).
- 4. Preliminary program suggestions, length of conference.
- 5. Questions of staffing, promotion, group involvement, etc.

The Minnesota Waste Alert Conference will be held April 11 and 12 at North Hennepin Community College, 7411 85th Street North, Brooklyn Park. The conference will be organized on the same lines as the regional Waste Alert Conference held in the summer of 1979 in Madison, Wisconsin. The general purpose of the conference will be to educate the participants to the problems and solutions in the disposal of solid and hazardous waste in Minnesota.

The conference will be organized by the League of Women Voters of Minnesota (LWVMN) working with a committee of people from other concerned organizations and agencies who attended the Madison conference. LWVMN has been in touch with the federal Environmental Protection Agency headquarters in Washington D.C. and expects to have a top official as keynote speaker on Friday night, April 11. The topic will probably be the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) and its impact on Minnesota. Terry Hoffman, Executive Director of the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency, has been asked to open the conference and to welcome participants.

The tentative schedule for Saturday, April 12, includes: James Truchan, Supervisor of Litigation Branch, Environmental Enforcement Division, Michigan Department of Natural Resources, speaking on the impact of improper waste management, and Dale Wickre, MPCA, speaking on the same situation in Minnesota. Presentations will follow, covering the specific topics of source separation, waste reduction, and mixed waste recovery. At noon, the conference will hear Sandra Gardebring, former MPCA Executive Director, now with EPA in Chicago, speak on the siting process.

The afternoon session will focus on hazardous waste problems and solutions. Jim Kinsey, formerly with the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency, has been asked to give an overview of the Minnesota situation. A panel discussion will follow on the specific topics of chemical fixation, incineration, and waste exchange. A session is also scheduled on the problems of industry from the viewpoints of small and large companies. Dr. Russell Susag, Director of Environmental Regulatory Activites for 3M will represent large industry and Mr. Cort Platt, President of Precious Metal Platers, will represent small companies.

After a short break, the conference will hear the legislative overview with Tom Todd and Steve Chapman, Clean Air, Clean Water, speaking to that issue. At four o'clock, the conference will be concluded with a summary and short statement covering what needs doing, who should do it, and how citizens can affect the process.

Enclosed are details about the "Minnesota Waste Alert!" conference scheduled for April 11 and 12, 1980. The League of Women Voters of Minnesota has been asked to put on the conference on behalf of the coalition of organizations which have concerns in the area of solid and hazardous waste and which were represented at the regional conference in Madison, Wisconsin last summer. Attached are plans for the program, worked out in conjunction with the other organizations and agencies. We also enclose a tentative schedule giving the list of speakers and a proposed budget. The speakers have all agreed to participate, with the exception of the keynote speaker from the EPA on April 11.

Request for Authorization for Contract with the League of Women Voters of Minnesota for a Conference on Solid and Hazardous Waste

February 26, 1980

ISSUE STATEMENT

Approval is requested for a contract with the League of Women Voters of Minnesota for a public information conference on solid and hazardous waste titled "Minnesota Waste Alert!" to be held April 11 - 12 at North Hennepin Community College, Brooklyn Park. This contract will be for an amount not to exceed \$5,000.

I. BACKGROUND

In August 1979 a regional conference on solid and hazardous waste was held in Madison, WI, called "Waste Alert!" It was co-sponsored by the League of Women Voters, the Izaak Walton League, the American Public Health Association, and other groups. As a follow-up to that successful conference, Leagues of Women Voters and other groups in U.S. EPA Region V have been encouraged by EPA and state agencies to conduct similar conferences on a state level.

MPCA Board members, MPCA staff, citizens, and industry representatives have expressed a desire for strong public information and education efforts. "Minnesota Waste Alert!" will aim at increasing public awareness of solid and hazardous waste problems and solutions.

II. DISCUSSION

The League of Women Voters has a well-established record of organizing successful conferences, and in generating citizen participation in the decision-making process. The League and members of several other citizen groups already have completed some of the preparatory work for "Minnesota Waste Alert!"

II. DISCUSSION (cont.)

The conference is planned for April 11-12 at North Hennepin Community College in Brooklyn Park. It is scheduled for a weekend to allow maximum opportunity for attendance. The program will feature solid and hazardous waste experts from federal, state and local governments, industry representatives, legislators, and citizen groups.

About 200 people are expected to attend the conference, which the organizers estimate will cost about \$8,000. The League of Women Voters is requesting \$5,000 from the MPCA, and the balance (\$3,000) is expected to come from registration fees for attendees. A tentative agenda is attached (Attachment A).

Funds for the conference will come from the U.S. EPA's annual program grant to the Solid Waste Division. EPA has strongly encouraged use of grant funds for public education/participation purposes.

III. CONCLUSIONS

Solid and hazardous waste disposal issues are among the most challenging issues facing the state and country. "Minnesota Waste Alert!" will contribute to increased public awareness of these issues and ways to address them. A more knowledgeable body of citizens will be better prepared to make the difficult decisions that lie ahead in these areas. The League of Women Voters of Minnesota is highly qualified to organize this much-needed information effort.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

The Agency staff recommends that the Agency Board authorize the Executive Director and Chairman to sign a contract agreement with the League of Women Voters of Minnesota to conduct the "Minnesota Waste Alert!" conference, April 11-12, 1980, at a cost to the MPCA not to exceed \$5,000. A suggested resolution is attached.

SUGGESTED STAFF RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Agency Board authorizes the Executive Director and Chairman to sign a contract agreement between the Agency and the League of Women Voters of Minnesota which provides for a conference on solid and hazardous waste issues, the total cost of which will not exceed \$5,000.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chairman and Executive Director are hereby authorized to execute the contract on behalf of the Agency.

Attachments

The Minnesota Waste Alert Conference will be held April 11 and 12 at North Hennepin Community College, 7411 85th Street North, Brooklyn Park. The conference will be organized on the same lines as the regional Waste Alert Conference held in the summer of 1979 in Madison, Wisconsin. The general purpose of the conference will be to educate the participants to the problems and solutions in the disposal of solid and hazardous waste in Minnesota.

The conference will be organized by the League of Women Voters of Minnesota (LWVMN) working with a committee of people from other concerned organizations and agencies who attended the Madison conference. LWVMN has been in touch with the federal Environmental Protection Agency headquarters in Washington D.C. and expects to have a top official as keynote speaker on Friday night, April 11. The topic will probably be the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) and its impact on Minnesota. Terry Hoffman, Executive Director of the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency, has been asked to open the conference and to welcome participants.

The tentative schedule for Saturday, April 12, includes: James Truchan, Supervisor of Litigation Branch, Environmental Enforcement Division, Michigan Department of Natural Resources, speaking on the impact of improper waste management, and Dale Wickre, MPCA, speaking on the same situation in Minnesota. Presentations will follow, covering the specific topics of source separation, waste reduction, and mixed waste recovery. At noon, the conference will hear Sandra Gardebring, former MPCA Executive Director, now with EPA in Chicago, speak on the siting process.

The afternoon session will focus on hazardous waste probelms and solutions. Jim Minsey, formerly with the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency, has been asked to give an overview of the Minnesota situation. A panel discussion will follow on the specific topics of chemical fixation, incineration, and waste exchange. A session is also scheduled on the problems of industry from the viewpoints of small and large companies. Dr. Russell Susag. Director of Environmental Regulatory Activities for 3M will represent large industry and Mr. Cort Platt, President of Frecious Metal Platers, will represent small companies.

After a short break, the conference will hear the legislative overview with Tom Toid and Steve Chapman, Clean Air, Clean Water, speaking to that issue. At four o'clock, the conference will be concluded with a summary and short statement coverint what needs doing, who should do it, and how citizens can affect the process.






